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BREXIT TRIGGERED 'IN TWO WEEKS'

Theresa May plans to trigger Brexit in two weeks despite defeat by 'posturing' Lords over rights of EU citizens.

Theresa May has defiantly insisted her timetable for triggering Brexit will not be blown off course despite suffering her first Parliamentary defeat over the Article 50 bill.

The House of Lords voted this week to amend the Bill to force the Government to guarantee the rights of EU citizens living in the UK. Seven Tory peers—including the former pensions minister Baroness Altmann—backed the amendment.

But the Prime Minister is confident the amendment will be rejected by the Commons later this month, and Downing Street insisted the timetable for Brexit "remains unchanged".

Lords who voted to alter the Bill were accused of "playing with fire" and critics accused them of pointless "posturing" and "doing a disservice to the national interest".

The scale of the Government's defeat in the Lords on Monday night, where the proposal to amend the Bill was passed by 358

votes to 256, prompted speculation that Mrs May could face a fresh Tory rebellion when the Bill returns to the Commons.

Conservative whips are confident, however, that no more than a handful of Tory MPs will support the amendment.

Labour's amendment to the EU (Notification of Withdrawal) Bill, tabled with Liberal Democrat and crossbench support, calls for ministers to bring forward proposals ensuring the rights of EU citizens living here to continue post-Brexit, within three months of triggering Article 50.

Jeremy Corbyn, the Labour leader who ordered his MPs to support the Bill unamended when it went through the Commons, described the result of the Lords vote as "great news", raising

the possibility that he might tell his MPs to back the amendment in the Commons.

He said: "The Government must now do the decent thing and guarantee the rights of EU citizens living in the UK."

The Lords will vote next week on a further amendment which would give MPs a "meaningful vote" on the outcome of Mrs May's negotiations with the EU—a vote which could also go against the Government.

The Prime Minister could then come under pressure from her own MPs to agree to that amendment passing into law.

The amended Bill will return to the House of Commons on March 13 and March 14, when MPs will debate whether to

keep the changes.

Mrs May intends to notify the EU of Britain's intention to withdraw on March 15, triggering two years of negotiations that would end with Brexit in 2019.

The Prime Minister has already told MPs that she wants to protect the rights of the three million EU citizens living in the UK, but will only issue that guarantee once the EU has granted reciprocal rights to the 900,000 Britons living in EU member states.

Iain Duncan Smith, the former Tory leader who voted to leave the EU, said of Wednesday night's vote: "It is a bit of posturing by some people in the Lords who are beating their chests and puffing out their own sense of self-importance.

Cut the droning and moaning, Boris tells Brexit foes

Johnson takes thinly-disguised swipe at Major, who described vote as 'an historic mistake'

Boris Johnson had said he is fed up with people "droning and moaning" about the risks of Brexit, saying that he felt like telling those raising concerns such as Sir John Major to "Come off it, sunshine".

The foreign secretary did not name the former prime minister but made clear in a speech to the British Chambers of Commerce (BCC) that Major was among those who had been warning that "the sky was about to fall in".

"And I feel like saying: 'Come off it, sunshine.' Every generation hears its prognostications of gloom. And look at us today. We are living longer than ever before. We are healthier than ever before," said Johnson.

Asked specifically about Major – who accused the government of resorting to cheap rhetoric that had soured the atmosphere with the EU27 – Johnson said the outcome of Brexit would be "fantastic".

"It's very important as we set out on this journey that we are positive about the outcome," he said, insisting that was the spirit that the government was taking

into talks. He argued that the rest of the EU was also ready for a positive negotiation that would be good for both sides.

"I won't hide it from you: when I first went to other European capitals they were in a state of shock, of puzzlement; they hadn't expected the Brexit outcome. That mood has almost entirely vanished," he said, insisting that the UK would still be a key player in Europe on defence and aid as well as being a strong economic force in the region.

Asked if a trade deal could take longer than two years, Johnson said: "Time is [an issue.] You're right. It depends how our friends and partners choose to handle it. They can play it long, they have electoral considerations, as everybody knows. I think there's every reason why we [should] go at this full tilt and get it done within two years. But let's see how it goes."

On Monday night, Major angered senior figures in the government by hitting out at the language and approach that has been adopted so far. "In my

own experience, the most successful results are obtained when talks are conducted with goodwill," he said. "It is much easier to reach agreement with a friend than a quarrelsome neighbour," he said.

"Behind the diplomatic civilities, the atmosphere is already sour. A little more charm, and a lot less cheap rhetoric, would do much to protect the UK's interests."

He also accused Brexit supporters of being excessively optimistic about the expected gains from leaving and raised concerns that the UK could end up being far too dependent on the US.

"The British people have been led to expect a future that seems to be unreal and over-optimistic," he said.

"Obstacles are brushed aside as of no consequence, whilst opportunities are inflated beyond any reasonable expectation of delivery."

The Government could face a "backlash" from voters if reality failed to meet expectations, he said.

Sir John's pessimistic assessment of Britain's

prospects outside the EU came in a speech at the foreign affairs think tank Chatham House on Monday evening.

Britain's vote to quit the EU was "an historic mistake, but it was one - once asked - that the British nation had every right to make," the former prime minister said.

Without mentioning the former Prime Minister by name, Johnson (above right) shrugged off recent criticism from Sir John Major (below)

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Terror threat at 'worst levels since IRA'

Britain faces a level of terror threat not seen since the IRA bombings of the 1970s, according to a new watchdog.

Max Hill QC, the independent reviewer of terrorism laws, told the *Sunday Telegraph* that Islamist extremists were targeting UK cities.

He credited the effectiveness of the intelligence services in limiting the level of threat to Britain.

Home Secretary Amber Rudd told an ITV news show on Sunday that defending the UK was her "main priority".

Ms Rudd said she agreed with Mr Hill's assessment of the current terror threat facing the UK, adding that ensuring a country is well-defended is "the most important job a home secretary does".

Mr Hill also pledged to review anti-terror measures over concerns about any infringements of freedom.

Mr Hill said the so-called Islamic State was planning "indiscriminate attacks on innocent civilians of whatever race or colour" in UK cities, close to the scale of Provisional IRA attacks of the 1970s.

Speaking in his first interview since being appointed to his watchdog role, he said there were distinctions in the "mindset" of the IRA 40 years ago and those under IS now.

But he added: "I think the intensity and the potential frequency of serious plot planning... represents an enormous ongoing risk that none of us can ignore."

"So I think that there is undoubtedly significant ongoing risk which is at least as great as the threat to London in the 1970s when the IRA were active on the mainland."

Ukip civil war as Farage calls for Carswell to be thrown out after knighthood row

Ukip was in a state of open civil war on this week after Nigel Farage publicly warned that the party will collapse unless its sole MP Douglas Carswell is thrown out.

Mr Farage, the former UK Independence Party leader, said Mr Carswell had "sought to split and divide Ukip in every way imaginable" since defecting from the Conservatives to Ukip in 2014.

The two men have been at odds for years over the party's policies but their antipathy came to a head amid claims that Mr Carswell frustrated Mr Farage's chances of being awarded a knighthood.

Writing in The Telegraph, Mr Farage said: "As a party, how can we let a man represent us in the House of Commons who actively and transparently seeks to damage us?"

"I think there is little future for Ukip with him staying inside this party. The time for him to go is now."

However, Mr Carswell insisted the leaked email "confirms that I made every effort to make sure that Ukip got its fair share of peerages and honours".

Mr Nuttall declined to comment.

Lord Pearson then approached the Cabinet Office's Parliamentary and political service honours committee about a knighthood for Mr Farage. It turned down the application at the end of July.

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Embattled tycoon bows to pressure, chips in £363m to BHS pension pot

...but Green should still be stripped of knighthood, say critics

Sir Philip Green is paying £363 million to rescue the British Home Stores (BHS) pension scheme.

The billionaire retailer called it "a voluntary contribution" after "lengthy, complex discussions with the Pensions Regulator and the PPF [Pension Protection Fund], both of which are satisfied with the solution that has been offered."

Sir Philip's statement continues: "Once again I would like to apologise to the BHS pensioners for this last year of uncertainty, which was clearly never the intention when the business was sold in March 2015.

"I am also happy to confirm that any of the pensioners that have faced cuts over the last year will now be brought back to their original BHS starting level pension and will all be made whole.

"I hope that this solution puts their minds at rest and closes this sorry chapter for them," said Green.

enforcement

The UK's pensions regulator started an enforcement action against the retail tycoon last year. The regulator sent notices of more than 300 pages each to Green, his investment companies, and former BHS boss Dominic Chappell.

Sir Philip Green bought BHS in 2000 for £200 million (\$244.9 million) and his family

took more than £300 million in dividends out of the business shortly afterward. He sold it for £1 in 2015 and the department store collapsed into administration in April of this year. BHS had been struggling for years and a government report into its collapse blamed under-investment and excessive dividend payouts for sending it into a downward spiral.

Sir Philip was criticised for holidaying on his luxury superyacht in Greece while the estimated £275 million black hole in the BHS pension fund remained unresolved.

Around 50 MPs last month unanimously backed a motion in UK parliament calling for Sir Philip Green to be stripped of his knighthood in the wake

of the collapse.

But the payment does not wipe away the stains from Green's reputation, a senior MP has said.

Business committee chairman Iain Wright told the BBC that the payment does not necessarily safeguard his knighthood.

'flog it off cheap'

Mr Wright welcomed the pensions deal but said it "doesn't wipe the stains from his reputation clean" and the "devil is in the detail".

He told BBC Radio 5 live that Sir Philip had a moral duty to right some of the wrongs committed under his watch.

"It sends out a very powerful message. You might try to sell a business. You might try to flog it off on the cheap because you don't want to deal with the pension

deficit, but the pension regulator said we'll come after you and we'll make you pay big money in order to safeguard the interests of pensioners and that can only be a good thing," the MP said.

He said Sir Philip's knighthood was a separate issue and nothing had changed in his opinion since the House of Commons unanimously backed a non-binding motion to strip Sir Philip of his title last October.

And fellow Labour MP Frank Field said the BHS

saga was far from being fully resolved.

In a letter to the Times, Mr Field said: "Yesterday's out-of-court settlement will give BHS pensioners a better retirement than had previously looked likely.

"This marks a really important milestone on the road to justice, but we are far from reaching the end of that road."

The Pensions Regulator says anti-avoidance enforcement action against Sir Philip and his companies will cease in light of the settlement,

but action continues in respect of Mr Chappell and his firm, Retail Acquisitions.

Former BHS office manager Lin MacMillan who set up a petition urging Sir Philip to "sell the yachts, pay the pensions" welcomed the deal.

"I am glad to see a resolution after months of anxiety and worry for BHS pensioners. I would sum it up as saying it's not as bad as it might have been, but it's not as good as it should have been."



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Celtic hero battling dementia

■ Captain of the famous Lisbon Lions facing struggle with 'true bravery'

The family of former Celtic manager and player Billy McNeill have confirmed he has dementia.

Mr McNeill, who has been described as the club's "greatest ever captain", led the team which won the European Cup in 1967.

His family told a Sunday newspaper he was diagnosed with the illness seven years ago and is now unable to speak.

Celtic chief executive Peter Lawwell said Mr McNeill was facing his situation with "true bravery".

The former Hoops captain enjoyed a glittering career at the Parkhead club, where he became the first Briton to lift the European Cup after a 2-1 win over Inter Milan in Lisbon in 1967.

McNeill, 76, also led Celtic to nine successive league titles and won seven Scottish Cups and six League Cups, before having two spells as manager.

He also managed English clubs Manchester

City and Aston Villa in the 1980s.

He is currently being cared for by his wife Liz, 73, at their home in Newton Mearns, Glasgow.

She has spoken to the Sunday Mail and the Scottish Sun on Sunday about her husband's battle with the degenerative

'very difficult'

She said he relies mostly on hand gestures to communicate his feelings.

She told the Sun on Sunday: "His concentration is not as good as it was and he now can't communicate very well. It's affected his

speech over the last year or two.

"Sometimes, if something annoys him, he can still say a few words like 'don't do that'. But in general he finds it very difficult. It's not because he doesn't know how to speak. There's just a part of his brain that won't let him. I miss the conversation."

The McNeills decided to bring their experiences into the open as the 50th anniversary of the Lisbon Lions' historic victory in May 1967 approaches.

And they have backed a campaign by the Sunday Mail for more funding to further research links between dementia and

heading a football.

Mrs McNeill said: "I think it's the right time for us to talk about this now. Heading the ball and the possibilities of concussive effects on the brain needs more discussion.

'true stature'

"We don't know if Billy's dementia is linked to his football. More research needs to be done."

Celtic chief executive Peter Lawwell said a proportion of the proceeds of a forthcoming Celtic FC Foundation charity match will go towards supporting people with dementia.

He said: "Billy is a man

of true stature, someone who has given so much of his life to Celtic and at all times with such grace, humility and dignity.

"He is respected by all in football and someone who will always be loved dearly by all Celtic supporters."

'Very special man'
Mr Lawwell added: "We have always been in close contact with Billy and his family and have been well aware for some time of the challenges he has been facing, a situation he has met with true bravery, a quality synonymous with Billy McNeill."

"I know Liz has been an absolute tower of strength too for Billy. Her compassion and care for Billy has been crucial and I would like to pay tribute to her and the rest of the family."

"He is a very special man and everyone at Celtic will continue to give Billy and his family every support."

Football commentator Archie Macpherson told BBC Scotland Mr McNeill's diagnosis "underlines the importance of more research".

He said: "I saw him during the unveiling of his statue at Parkhead and he just about recognised me but wasn't able to converse too much. It was sad, enormously sad and I feel for Liz."

"I think the organisers and legislators of the game have got to look seriously into specific research in football - what effect heading the ball has on a footballer."

The commentator said research had been done into head injuries in rugby and American football but that football had been "a little bit too casual about this".

"I think it really has got to be specifically examined," he added.

Falkland Islands: Argentina protests to Brazil over RAF stops

■ Recent silence about disputed territory is broken as Mauricio Macri's government points out regional agreement forbidding UK military stopovers

Argentina has lodged a protest with Brazil for hosting British military aircraft flying to and from the Falkland Islands.

Argentina's government said the Royal Air Force made 18 flights between the Falklands and airports in Brazil over the last two years. Buenos Aires called them a breach of agreements among South American countries.

The Argentinian foreign ministry said in a statement it was

"concerned" about six flights last year and 12 in 2015. The ministry said it had requested an explanation from Brazil's government, reminding it of that country's commitment "to not allow British airplanes or warships based in the disputed archipelago".

"The Brazilian foreign ministry reaffirmed its support to our country on this issue and said that it was unaware of these flights," the Argentinian statement said.

Brazil's foreign ministry had no immediate comment on the issue.

Argentina lost a brief but bloody war with Britain after invading the South Atlantic archipelago in 1982.

The war over the islands known by Argentina as the Islas Malvinas claimed the lives of 649 Argentinian and 255 British servicemen.

During her eight years as Argentina's president, Cristina Fernandez tried to pressure Britain into

sovereignty talks by turning away British ships, encouraging companies to divest from Britain and raising other trade barriers. Tensions have eased since pro-business Mauricio Macri succeeded her as president in 2016 promising a less confrontational stance.

breakthrough

In the biggest breakthrough in decades, Britain and Argentina announced in 2016 that they would work to remove restrictions in the oil, fishing and shipping industries affecting the Falklands. They also agreed to increase the number of flights between the islands and Argentina.

The Falklands are internally self-governing but Britain is responsible for defence and foreign affairs. Argentina claims Britain has illegally occupied the islands since 1833. Britain disputes that and says Argentina is ignoring the wishes of its 3,000 residents who want to remain British.

Ten sure-fire ways to get the most from your workout

Here we are in March already, and for many of us the futility of those New Year's resolutions regarding exercise is plain to see. But with better weather here already and the promise of hot summer days around the corner, now is the perfect time to focus on daily habits and incorporating these into our daily lifestyles. It is with some pride that this week I unveil the ten best ways to lose body fat with weight training and body weight training.

With weight training and body weight training being the best way to turn your body into a fat burning machine, here are 10 ways to keep up the momentum in March and keep it exciting and sexy....

1. Variety is the spice of life. Confusing the muscles into action with different styles of exercise, including dumbbells, barbells, kettle bells and basic body weight training (push ups, squats etc.) really pushes the body into developing itself to handle the new imposed demands placed upon it - therefore growing new muscle and putting to the test the fatty areas of the body.

2. Increase the weight on each set When you are weight training and performing 10-20 reps, simply increase the weights you are using on each set. This way, the muscles simply have to learn to get stronger and the result is more toning and a sexier, sleek look.

3. Perform all reps strictly

with slow form. When using weights or your own body, slow down the reps and feel the burn. By performing all the exercises strictly, you will reduce the risk of injury and find yourself in more control of the movement.

4. Perform more reps with the same weight. By performing more reps with the same weight or body weight, you build a bigger base. This means that over the long term, you can handle more weight because your body quickly adapts to it and as a result you begin to burn more fat, even when resting.

5. Take less recovery time between sets. Between sets, begin to change the rest time. For example - if you usually perform one set of ten reps then rest for

one minute, the next time do ten reps take but take only thirty seconds rest instead of one minute.

6. Increase the number of exercises. If you normally do four exercises for chest (for example - chest press, push ups, incline barbell press and cable cross overs) do six instead (add dumbbell pull overs and flys) to ensure the muscles get the maximum workout possible.

7. Use circuit training. Perform 30-60 seconds of weight training or bodyweight training and take small breaks of 30 seconds in between each set of exercises to make sure the muscles receive maximum blood flow and feel the

pump - thus increasing the chances of burning fat.

8. Use cardio in between body weight or weight training exercises. By performing a sprint on the spot for one minute, followed an exercise like push ups for one minute, you will be switching between the cardiovascular system and the muscular system within the body - a sure fire way to burn fat. In fact the latest studies suggest you burn fat 24-48 hours after this kind of training, compared to a normal jog (the burn lasts 6-8 hours for this)

9. Tri Drop sets. Whilst lifting weights, begin with performing less reps with more weight. Once

you can't do anymore, stop, reduce the weight but do more reps. When you can't do anymore, stop. Then the final time stop, reduce the weight and perform even more reps - what fun!


10. Go to failure. When performing a weight training or body weight exercise, perform as many reps as you can before you just simply...fail! It's extreme but when you do this once in a while, it takes you to the next level and helps reduce body fat by using up fatty deposits.

The entrepreneurial, extremely competitive environment allows those that have the rigor to become very successful in their field. In 2005 I started RMG News (with my two brothers) and we have since become one of the most-respected news gathering agencies in LA. We embed ourselves in the worst areas of town and capture the scenes left behind by gang violence, drug warfare and inner city life.

What do you miss most from home?

Of course my family, but also the peace and tranquility of the English countryside (I left when I was 18 because nothing exciting ever happened in the deepest, rural parts of Dorset - now I kind of long for those days!).

What was your first impression of LA and has it changed since? If

so why?

I came here as a news journalist (I grew up watching COPS) so I sort of knew what to expect - and LA certainly didn't disappoint. The local news headlines were full of gang warfare, police chases and other fascinating news stories - something I certainly wasn't used to growing up in the country. I soon realized that the news media here was more about ratings than the news itself, world news was almost non-existent and they would break into the daytime talk shows for live coverage of a police chase. With social media now playing such a critical part of daily life, this thirst for live, action-filled news footage is even more prevalent than before - every news incident now plays out on Twitter with updates by the second.


What do you find the biggest difference is living here versus Gillingham?

Quite clearly the crime is worse in LA but the career opportunities here, certainly in media, are by far superior. The outdoor opportunities (we are outdoor enthusiasts) here are so diverse and so different from Dorset - an LA triathlon consists of surfing in the early morning, a round of golf midday then skiing in the afternoon.

Do you have a hidden gem in LA that you want to share with us?

Not LA per se but a couple of hours east, in the San Bernardino Mountains, is a little town called Lake Arrowhead. It's a close-knit, welcoming community surrounding a lake with wonderful cabins for rent, great hikes and outdoor opportunities - a stark contrast to the inner city life. For a great meal, at a small, family owned restaurant I would certainly suggest a visit to the Old Country Coffee Shop in Running Springs, they have great food.

What would you suggest to others who are thinking about making

the move here?

Don't let everything you see on the news cloud your beliefs of what this town actually has to offer. The chance that you will see, let alone be involved in any of the stories you see on TV is very, very unlikely. Have a clear goal of what you want to achieve in this town and make sure you get out and meet people! It really is about who you know and not necessarily what you know.

Lots of our members join our group Brits in LA seeking out words of wisdom - what is the best piece of advice

you've been given?

Explore every opportunity but be wary of things that appear to be too good to be true. This is a huge city and people can easily fall for the LA hype, so know the dangers of life in an urban environment. Be street-smart.

Lastly, how can we find out more about you?

I am very happily married and have a gorgeous wife (also English!), we have two fantastic young boys (one is almost five, the other nine months) and we live in the mountains just east of LA. I own RMG News with my two

brothers, Howard (my identical twin) and Marc (five years younger). I am currently in a reality show filming for Netflix (due out this summer). I was the inspiration behind the movie *Nightcrawler* starring Jake Gyllenhaal and served as a technical consultant on the film. I also starred in a reality show called '*Stringers: LA*' on TruTV for two seasons in 2008/2009. I've appeared in dozens of magazines and newspapers and have been the subject of many documentaries around the world highlighting my escapades over the last 20 years.

"It's about the whole thing: training, eating, sleeping... all of those have a massive impact on how you feel. And I'm doing better at all those things, he said.


"Sly Stallone's got 20 years on me and still looks good so he's part of my inspiration."


He added: "Hollywood has a caustic effect on a lot of people. It's a cruel business. You can get a big head about things. But what goes up must come down."

Agatha Raisin: Quirky murder mystery comes to KCET

THIS WEEK saw the debut of the popular British mystery series *Agatha Raisin* on KCET, the local PBS affiliate in Southern California.

Based on the beloved character created by M.C. Beaton, *Agatha Raisin* follows a public relations specialist who moves from London to the small Cotswolds village of Carsley hoping for a quieter life. But she soon finds her dreams dashed when she becomes a murder suspect after entering a quiche-making competition. In her efforts to clear her name, Agatha discovers she has a talent for crime solving.

Speaking to the British Weekly recently, Beaton, told us the transition from the printed page to the small screen could not have been smoother.

"Mammoth Television did invite me to every read-through," says Beaton. "They told me if I didn't like anything, they would change it. Actually they didn't, but

they were so nice to me I was out of the door before I realized it. Barry Ryan of Free@Last TV took out an option so long ago I've forgotten, and stuck with it. Suddenly, about three years ago, we were up and running."

"To cast and film the first pilot took about six months," says Beaton. "I had no input whatsoever in the casting. With actors like Ashley Jensen, I was just lucky. Yes, she's blonde and the Agatha of the books is not. And, she is younger. But, she is a marvelous actor and brought Agatha to life. I like the fact that Agatha is not politically correct. She smokes, drinks and wears mink."

In the series pilot, wittily titled *The Quiche of Death*, we meet Agatha (Ashley Jensen) as she decamps from the capital to the Cotswolds where she soon finds a new career as an amateur detective investigating mischief, mayhem and murder in her new deceptively quaint

town, after her entry in a quiche-baking contest kills the judge.

In the forthcoming episode *The Blood of an Englishman*, Agatha indulges her friend Mrs. Bloxby, the vicar's wife, and joins her to see some local amateur theater.

The baker, a menacing ogre on stage, vanishes in a puff of green smoke. He doesn't join the rest of the cast for the curtain call. On her drive home Agatha sees emergency vehicles rushing toward the theater. She turns her car around and goes back. The baker has been

murdered. But why?

The first season, airing every Thursday at 10pm, has a total of eight episodes, including *The Walkers of Dembley*, *Hell's Bells* and the *Wellspring of Death*. Certainly enough to keep British mystery fans happy well into May.

Beaton has published many romances, mysteries and crime novels including the *Hamish Macbeth* series and *Edwardian Murder Mysteries*. The *Hamish Macbeth* series and *The Poor Relation* historical romance series, have also

Koeman ready to bring United star back to Goodison

Ronald Koeman has admitted that Everton are ready to offer Wayne Rooney an emotional return to Goodison Park.

Koeman will step up his interest in the Manchester United striker at the end of the season, insisting the 31-year-old could become a crucial player in his ongoing revolution at the Toffees.

Rooney has snubbed offers from China to stay with United for the rest of the season but a future under Jose Mourinho appears unlikely.

And Everton are

weighing up a renewed move to bring the England star back to Merseyside, nearly 13 years after he left for United in a £27million deal.

"I believe that Wayne Rooney is still playing at a high level," said the Everton manager.

"I think he made a good choice to stay at Manchester United and in the Premier League because he has still two or three years in front of him to play on a high level."

"What will happen at the end of the season?

I don't know but in my opinion he is one of the players who can make Everton more stronger. It's all about what the player likes, what Manchester United needs to do, and we are not involved in that project.

"But every player that we at Everton think can make the team stronger is welcome to Everton."

Rooney came through the Everton academy to make his debut in 2002 at the age of 16, scoring his first league goal against Arsenal in just his tenth appearance.

Wenger: Ozil fit, and I'm not going to Barca

Mesut Ozil is likely to be fit for Arsenal's crucial Premier League clash with Liverpool at Anfield on Saturday, while Gunners manager Arsene Wenger has ruled himself out of the running for the Barcelona job.

Doubts were thrown over the Germany international's inclusion against the Reds after he was sent home from Gunners training on

Wednesday with a "minor bug," per a report in the Evening Standard.

However, Wenger said in his pre-match press conference on Thursday that Ozil should be ready for action come Saturday afternoon.

Frenchman Wenger also addressed rumours linking him with the manager's job at Barcelona—current boss Luis Enrique recently announced he will leave

at the end of the season. He insisted his priority remains to stay at Arsenal.

"My preference has always been Arsenal but I am objective enough to make the right decision for myself and the club itself."

"The club can also make their decision if it wants and I will respect that. I am not looking for jobs of other clubs or jobs of other people."
