“We are not afraid and our resolve will never waver in the face of terrorism”

MAY DEFIANT AFTER NEW LONDON ATTACK

Prime Minister Theresa May has told MPs: “We will never waver in the face of terrorism.”

Paying tribute to the slain Pc Keith Palmer in the House on Thursday, she said: “He was every inch a hero and his actions will never be forgotten.”

Delivering a Commons statement she said Wednesday’s attacker was British born and known to police and MI5. The attack was related to “Islamist ideology”.

Labour leader Jeremy Corbyn described the attack as “an appalling atrocity”.

Five people died, including the attacker, with 40 more injured.

Mrs May said the victims included 12 Britons, three French children, two people from Romania, four from South Korea, one from Germany, one from Poland, one from Ireland, one from China, one from Italy, one from the US and two Greek people.

She told MPs: “Yesterday an act of terrorism tried to silence our democracy, but today we meet as normal, as generations have done

before us and as future generations will continue to do, to deliver a simple message: We are not afraid and our resolve will never waver in the face of terrorism.”

She said it was still believed that the attacker acted alone and there was “no reason to believe” further attacks on the public were planned.

“His identity is known to the police and MI5 and when operational considerations allow, he will be publicly identified,” she said.

“What I can confirm is that the man was British-born and that some years ago he was once investigated by MI5 in relation to concerns about violent extremism.

“He was a peripheral figure. The case is historic. He was not part of the current intelligence picture. There was no prior intelligence of his intent or of the plot.”

Describing it as an attack on free people all over the world, Mrs May thanked global allies

including US President Donald Trump for their support.

“We meet here in the oldest of all parliaments because we know that democracy and the values it entails will always prevail,” she said.

“Those values - free speech, liberty, human rights, and the rule of law - are embodied here in this place but they are shared by free people around the world.

“A terrorist came to the place where people of all nationalities and cultures gather to celebrate what it means to be free. And he took out his rage indiscriminately against innocent men, women and children.

“This was an attack on free people everywhere - and on behalf of the British people, I would like to thank our friends and allies around the world who have made it clear that they stand with us at this time.”

American tourist among the victims of terror attack

An American man has been named as one of the victims of Wednesday's deadly attack in London, Kurt Cochran, 54 and from Utah, died in the attack and his wife Melissa was seriously hurt, their family has said.

They were celebrating a 25th wedding anniversary and also visiting Melissa's parents, who work on a Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints mission.

They were struck when the attacker drove a car over Westminster Bridge, near the Houses of Parliament.

So-called Islamic State has said it was behind the attack, which left five people dead, including the attacker. Eight people have so far been arrested.

President Donald Trump tweeted: "A great American, Kurt Cochran, was killed in the London terror attack. My prayers and condolences are with his family and friends."

In a statement released by the church, Clint Payne, Melissa's brother and Kurt's brother-in-law, said the family was "heartbroken"

"Kurt was a good man and a loving husband to

our sister and daughter, Melissa," continued the statement.

"They were in Europe to celebrate their 25th wedding anniversary, and were scheduled to return to the United States on Thursday.

"Melissa also received serious injuries in the attack, and is being cared for in the hospital. "We express our gratitude to the emergency and medical personnel who have cared for them and ask for your prayers on behalf of Melissa and our family.

"Kurt will be greatly missed, and we ask for privacy as our family mourns and as Melissa recovers from her injuries."

Mr Cochran owned a sound recording studio in Utah called the Onion Street Studio.

His LinkedIn page lists him as an engineer involved in tracking, mixing and editing, and highlights his voluntary involvement in a benefit concert called Until the Violence Stops.

In an interview with a local website in 2014, he says he grew up in Maryland and lived in Texas before moving to Salt Lake City in 1983.

He says he got his first guitar at seven

but "didn't have much natural talent". He played in a band for a few years before deciding to build the studio.

A GoFundMe page administered by Mrs Cochran's brother to help cover her expenses, says the couple built the studio business from the ground up over the past decade.

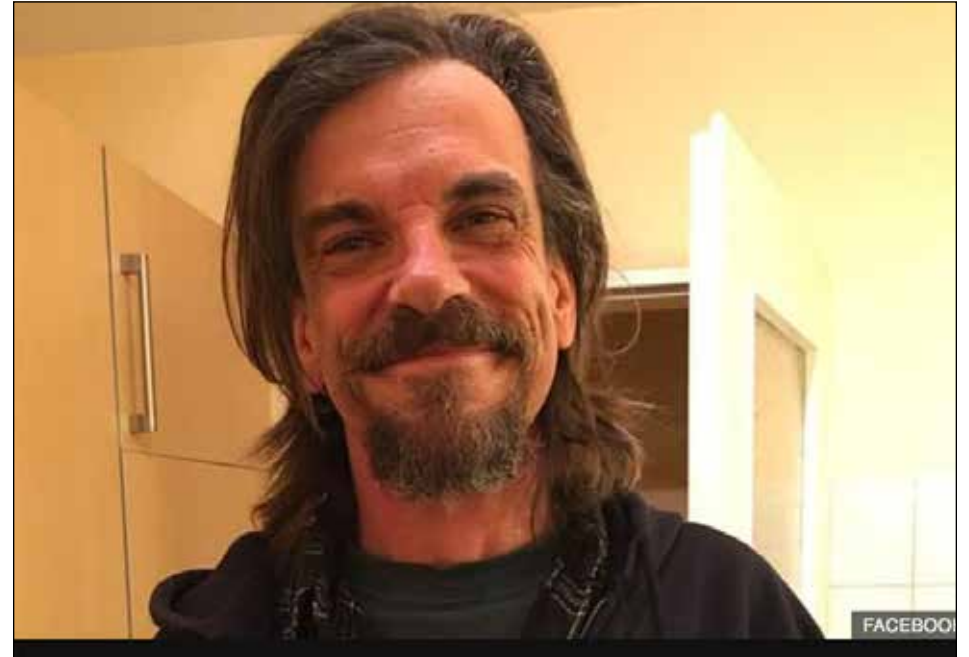
Melissa Cochran's sister, Sara Payne-Mcfarland, wrote on Facebook: "My sister, Melissa, has a broken leg, a broken rib, and a cut on her head.

"While we are glad she survived, our hearts are broken and will never be the same after losing our dear uncle, brother-in-law, father. Kurt, you are a HERO, and we will never forget you."

The other victims of the attack have been named as police officer Keith Palmer and Aysha Frade, who worked at a London college.

The attacker was British-born and known to the police and intelligence services. He has been named as Khalid Masood, 52.

Leaders of countries affected by recent terror attacks, including France and Germany voiced solidarity with the UK after the attack.

On Twitter, former President Barack Obama wrote: "My heart goes

out to the victims and their families in London. No act of terror can

shake the strength and resilience of our British ally."

Foreign leaders voice solidarity with Britain

Leaders of countries affected by recent terror attacks have voiced solidarity with the UK after Wednesday's deadly attack near the Houses of Parliament.

Leaders of France and Germany, which suffered deadly vehicle attacks last year, offered the UK their support.

The US president offered condolences and praised UK security forces.

There is a mixture of nationalities among the dead, police say, and 29 people have been treated in hospital, of whom seven are critically injured.

Among those injured

by the car on Westminster Bridge are three French schoolchildren and two Romanians, while five South Koreans were hurt in the chaos that followed the attack.

In Paris, the lights of the Eiffel Tower went out from midnight in a tribute to the victims and President Francois Hollande expressed his "solidarity" with the British people, saying "terrorism concerns us all and France knows how the British people are suffering today".

In July last year, a man drove a lorry into pedestrians in the southern French city of Nice, killing 84 people.

The attack was claimed by the Islamic State (IS) group.

German Chancellor Angela Merkel, whose country saw a lorry attack in December that killed 12 people in Berlin and was also claimed by IS, said her thoughts were "with our British friends and all of the people of London".

"I want to say for Germany and its citizens: We stand firmly and resolutely by Great Britain's side in the fight against all forms of terrorism," she added.

US President Donald Trump spoke by phone to British Prime Minister

Police identify attacker

Police have identified Khalid Masood as the man who carried out the Westminster attack, as the death toll rose to five.

Kent-born Masood, who was shot dead by police, had not been the subject of any current police investigations, but had a range of previous convictions.

The 52-year-old was believed to have been living in the West Midlands.

PC Keith Palmer, 48, Aysha Frade and US tourist Kurt Cochran, 54, were killed on Wednesday, while a 75-year-old man died on Thursday evening.

The man had been receiving medical treatment in hospital but his life support was withdrawn.

The so-called Islamic State group has said it was behind the attack.

Three women and five men were arrested in London and Birmingham on suspicion of preparation of terrorist acts following Wednesday's attack.

A woman aged 39 was arrested in east London, a 21-year-old woman and a 23-year-old man were arrested in Birmingham and a 26-year-old woman and three men aged 28, 27 and 26 were arrested at another address in Birmingham.

A man aged 58 was arrested at a different address in Birmingham.

The Met Police says detectives are continuing to search a number of addresses, including one in Carmarthenshire, three in Birmingham and one in east London. Addresses in Brighton and south-east London have also been searched.

'We will defeat them'

Home Secretary Amber Rudd told those gathered for a candlelit vigil in London's Trafalgar Square on Thursday evening that

terrorists "will not win".

"We are all connected and today we showed that by coming together, by going to work, by getting about our normal business, because the terrorists will not defeat us. We will defeat them," she said.

Masood drove into pedestrians on Westminster Bridge before crashing his car into railings and then running into the grounds of Parliament, armed with a knife.

He stabbed PC Palmer before being shot dead.

The Metropolitan Police said there had been no prior intelligence about Masood's intention to carry out an attack.

But he was known to the police and his previous convictions included causing grievous bodily harm, possession of offensive weapons and public order offences.

His first conviction was in November 1983 for criminal damage and his last in December 2003 for possession of a knife.

He had not been convicted of any terrorism offences.

Scotland Yard said Khalid Masood "is not at this early stage believed to be his birth name" and that research into his aliases was being carried out.

Car hire company Enterprise said the vehicle used in the attack had been rented from its Spring Hill depot in Birmingham.

Early reports said Masood hired the Hyundai SUV in person, giving his profession as a teacher.

The Department for Education said it had no record of him having worked as a qualified teacher in English state schools.

It appears that he styled himself as an English tutor at one point.

Tributes paid to slain PC

Tributes have been paid to Keith Palmer, the police officer killed in Wednesday's attack in Westminster.

His family have described the 48-year-old as a "wonderful dad and husband, a loving son, brother and uncle", and a chapel service was held in the House of Commons.

Prime Minister Theresa May said the PC, who was married with a five-year-old daughter, "was every inch a hero".

The Metropolitan Police Force called him "a fantastic member of staff".

A minute's silence was held at 09:33 GMT in the Palace of Westminster and at New Scotland Yard.

The Rev Rose Hudson-Wilkin led the prayer and vigil service at the House of Commons Chapel of St Mary Undercroft.

Offering prayers "for Keith, our brother and all others affected", the Rev Hudson-Wilkin urged dozens of attendees "to show mercy in the face of the hatred shown in the Westminster terror attack."

'true hero'

A statement released by PC Palmer's family went on to say he was "a long-time supporter of Charlton Athletic. Dedicated to his job and proud to be a police officer, brave and courageous. A friend to everyone who knew him.

"He will be deeply missed. We love him so much. His friends and family are shocked and devastated by his loss."

Charlton Athletic responded to the news by putting a football scarf on PC Palmer's season ticket seat at the Valley stadium and said it would remain there until the next home game on 4 April.

There are also plans to commemorate his life at the game itself.

"Keith was a familiar face at The Valley to many supporters and sat

in his same East Stand seat for many years," the club said.

"He was a true hero who will be greatly missed by all the Charlton family and everyone at the club would like to offer their sincere condolences to his family and friends at this extremely difficult time".

PC Palmer joined

the Parliamentary and Diplomatic Protection Command in April last year after serving in the Territorial Support Group (TSG) based in Catford but working across London. He had previously been based in Bromley borough between 2002 and 2009.

PC James Aitkenhead,

who worked alongside Keith in the TSG, said: "Keith was a genuinely nice person; nobody had a bad word to say about him. When I heard what had happened I knew it would be him because that's just the sort of guy he was, to step straight in when others might step back."

minister Tobias Ellwood, who tried to save the life of PC Palmer by giving him mouth-to-mouth resuscitation and attempting to stem the flow of blood from his stab wounds in New Palace Yard.

And she praised the police for "heroically" doing their job by

stopping the attacker getting access to Parliamentary buildings by shooting him dead "within 20 yards of the gate".

"If his intention was to gain access to this building, we should be clear that he did not succeed," she said.

She also said it was wrong to describe the attack as Islamic, claiming it was "Islamist terrorism - it's a perversion of a

great faith".

Mr Corbyn said MPs were "united by our humanity, by our democratic values and by that human impulse for solidarity to stand together in times of darkness and adversity".

"I express my condolences to the family and friends of PC Keith Palmer, who gave his life yesterday in defence of the public and our democracy."

Londoners honor the dead with candlelight vigil

LONDONERS have responded to Wednesday's terror attack with a candlelight vigil Thursday night at Trafalgar Square to mourn the dead and pledge their solidarity in the face of extremism.

The people gathered in the iconic location to stand together quietly, respectfully, flanked by police officers with the rumble of helicopters a constant presence above.

Reporters from around the world were there too, gently questioning some of those who came.

The word "solidarity" was heard over and over again.

Candles were laid on the ground and on the steps leading to the National Gallery, then lit in memory of those who died.

German-born Michaela Thomas, who has lived in Poplar for decades, came to take part in the vigil, but her husband did not feel safe enough to join her.

She said she was there because she did not want terrorism to stop her living her life.

Her view was echoed by many around the square.

Sister Petronia, a nun from Hackney, put on her London 2012 Gamesmaker jacket to attend.

"I feel everybody in London is the heart of London beating," she said.

"When something like

this happens, those of us who live here feel the pain.

"People want to come together and express solidarity, and express their desire for peace."

At the front of the crowd, Donnelly Devereaux and her daughter Mary-Katherine Caestecker, both from Chicago, waited for the ceremony to begin.

"We're visiting the city and we wanted to come tonight to show our support, particularly as one of the people who died, Kurt Cochran,

was from the US," Mrs

Devereaux said.

"It's so much more calm here than it would be at home. Everyone's so calm and collected on the tube, and here in the square tonight."

As the bells of St Martin-in-the-Fields chimed, the crowds fell silent.

Some filmed the scene on their phones, but the focus was on three candles on the steps leading up to the National Gallery, above which MPs, religious figures and others stood in a line to pay their respects.

As Met Police Acting

Commissioner Craig Mackey, Home Secretary Amber Rudd and London Mayor Sadiq Khan addressed the crowds, bursts of applause broke out and people around me cheered when Mr Khan told them: "Londoners will never be cowed by terrorism".

The minute's silence was impeccably observed - no chatter in the crowd, no phones going off, just people bowing their heads and closing their eyes to remember what happened about half a mile away.

As the ceremony ended people moved across the square to light candles, teacher Danny Lyne, from the East End of London, told a reporter: "What happened yesterday has been in my head ever since I found out. I remember what happened 12 years ago, on 7/7, and this has brought it all back.

"I think it's important to pay respect to those who lost their lives this time, and to give respect to the police - the Met Police in particular don't often get that."

Theresa May to offer his condolences and to praise the effective response of UK security services.

Mr Trump pledged the "full co-operation and support" of the US government in bringing those responsible for the attack to justice, the White House said in a statement.

Belgium's prime minister sent a message of support as his country marked the first anniversary of the suicide bomb attacks on the Brussels airport and underground system, which killed 32 people.

"Our condolences are with those who mourn and all who are affected in London," Charles Michel tweeted. "Belgium stands with UK in fight against terror."

European Commission President Jean-Claude Juncker said in a statement that the people of Brussels and Belgium had "suffered a similar pain and felt the support of your sympathy and solidarity".

"At this emotional time, we at the European Commission can only send that sympathy back twofold."

Russian President Vladimir Putin also sent condolences by telegram to Mrs May, expressing support for the bereaved and wounded.

"The forces of terror are acting more and more deviously and cynically. It is clear that, in order to counteract the terrorist threat, all members of the global community must combine forces," he said.

In other reaction:

Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau said in a statement that it was an "attack on democracies around the world" and Canadians stood "united with the British people in the fight against

terrorism"

Australian Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull said it was an "attack on parliaments, freedom and democracy everywhere" and offered his support and solidarity to the British government

Chinese Premier Li Keqiang said he and Mr Turnbull had discussed the attack as they met in Canberra. "Together, we send our condolences to the prime minister of the UK and together we condemn terrorism and we stand against all forms of terrorism."

Dutch Prime Minister Mark Rutte said: "Horrible images from London. The very heart of the city has been struck. Our thoughts are with the British people."

Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdogan emphasised that "Turkey feels and shares deeply in the United Kingdom's pain" and that it stood in "solidarity" with Britain

"in the fight against terrorism". It came just hours after his latest salvo in a fiery row with European allies, especially Germany and the Netherlands, over Turkish referendum campaigning in their countries. Mr Erdogan had warned that Europeans would not be able to walk safely on the world's streets if "Europe continues this way".

But not all international reaction was so reserved, with some right-wing politicians suggesting that controls on immigration - or even all Muslims - was the way forward. It has subsequently emerged that the attacker was born in Britain.

The leader of Australia's One Nation party, Pauline Hanson, announced her own personal hashtag.

"It's #Pray4Muslimban. Put a ban on it, that's how you solve the problem, and then let's deal with the issues here," she said.

Clinton urges all parties to complete McGuinness's work

Sinn Fein leader laid to rest in emotional service in Derry

Bill Clinton has urged the leaders of Northern Ireland's political parties, gathered at a funeral mass for Martin McGuinness, to complete his work and restore the power-sharing government.

Some mourners outside wept and many broke into spontaneous applause during the former US president's oration at the end of the service inside St Columba's church in Derry as he recalled his and the former IRA chief of staff's role in the peace process.

Clinton, who had earlier lightly touched the coffin draped in the Irish tricolour said McGuinness had "risks the wrath of his comrades and the rejection of his enemies".

Imploring the parties and the people who elect them to the Northern Ireland assembly to reach another compromise, Clinton told mourners: "If you want to continue his legacy, go and finish the work he has started."

Referring to McGuinness' once unthinkable friendship with the late unionist leader, Rev Ian Paisley, Clinton said: "It was great he got a word in edgeways. I never could".

He lightened a sombre atmosphere inside

the church and in the surrounding streets by referring to the deep bond between McGuinness and his close ally and Sinn Féin leader, Gerry Adams.

Clinton joked that Adams was "married" to McGuinness for nearly as long as his widow Bernie, which provoked laughter both inside and outside St Columba's.

He also referred to the presence of Arlene Foster, the Democratic Unionist leader and first minister in the last power-sharing coalition that fell apart in acrimony this year.

Praising her for attending the service despite criticism from some families of IRA victims, and recalling that she too had almost been killed as a schoolgirl in an IRA bomb attack, Clinton said: "First minister, thank you for being here. I know your life has been marked in painful ways by the Troubles."

In a symbolic scene as mourners filed out shortly after Clinton's speech, Foster and the new leader of Sinn Féin in Northern Ireland, Michelle O'Neill, reached across the church pews to shake hands.

Clinton remains popular not only in Derry but across Ireland for his role in hosting talks and

encouraging the leaders of Northern Ireland's parties to secure the 1998 Good Friday agreement. It took half an hour for him to get back into his car as he was mobbed outside the church by well-wishers wanting to shake his hand.

Before the funeral, Barack Obama had also issued a statement praising McGuinness as a "man who had the wisdom and courage to pursue reconciliation for his people".

Other political leaders in attendance included the current Irish president, Michael D Higgins, his predecessor, Mary McAleese, and the taoiseach, Enda Kenny.

McGuinness died surrounded by family in the early hours of Tuesday morning in Derry's Altnagelvin hospital. He was suffering from a rare genetic condition, amyloidosis, which affects vital organs including the heart.

During the requiem mass Father Michael Canny said in his homily that the presence of unionist leaders such as Foster and the outgoing Ulster Unionist chief, Mike Nesbitt, was the ultimate legacy for Martin McGuinness.

"There are people in this church today whose presence would have been unthinkable only a generation ago," he said.

"They have forged working relationships with Martin McGuinness. They have built friendships with him. They have occupied Stormont's benches alongside him. Some have even sat in government with him. You are all very, very welcome.

"The presence of those political rivals and opponents among you, who have come to pay their respects this afternoon, is the most eloquent testimony to

the memory of Martin McGuinness."

At the republican plot in Derry's City cemetery, Adams delivered his own oration in praise of his co-strategist who helped guide the republican movement away from armed struggle toward democratic politics and compromise with unionists.

Adams's speech stressed McGuinness's adherence to his revolutionary republican principles right to the end of his life, and his outreach to the unionist community.

In the traditional part of his oration, Adams said:

"Martin McGuinness was not a terrorist. Martin McGuinness was a freedom fighter ... Martin believed that the British government's involvement in Ireland, and the partition of our island, are the roots of our divisions. He was absolutely right about that. The British government has no right whatsoever to have any involvement in Ireland."

He also told mourners that by meeting the Queen and shaking hands with her, his friend had shown how "to reach out beyond your own base" and in particular to the unionist community.

Trump junior weighs in, gets flamed

President Donald Trump's son has come under fire for criticizing London's mayor shortly after Wednesday's attack.

Donald Trump Jr tweeted an article written last year, in which Sadiq Khan said terror vigilance had become "part and parcel" of life in a global city.

Mr Trump quoted the headline and tweeted: "You have to be kidding me?!"

He angered many

Britons who accused him of exploiting the tragedy and implying the quotes were made after the attack.

Dozens were hurt in Wednesday's attack, when an assailant drove a car through pedestrians on Westminster Bridge and then fatally knifed a police officer who tried to stop him entering the Houses of Parliament. He was then shot dead.

Two hours later, Mr Trump tweeted an article from the Independent

newspaper in September 2016.

In the article, Mr Khan was speaking shortly before a meeting with New York Mayor Bill De Blasio, on the day after three bombs exploded in New York City and nearby towns, wounding 29 people.

The attacks had given him a sleepless night, he said, as he pondered the dangers faced by big Western cities like New York and London.

"Part and parcel of living in a great global city is you have to be prepared for these sorts of things, you have to be vigilant, you have to support the police doing an incredibly hard job, you have to support the security services," he said.

On Wednesday, after the attack in Westminster, the mayor said that Londoners "will never be cowed by terrorism" and that the city stood together in the face of those seeking it harm.

Mr Trump's tweet incensed many British people on Twitter, including MP Wes Streeting, who called him a "disgrace" for exploiting the tragedy.

Mr Khan, London's first Muslim mayor, has previously clashed with Mr Trump's father, in January denouncing the US president's travel ban as "shameful and cruel".

Teen nihilism erupts in L.A.

Los Angeles debut for acclaimed British play at the Odyssey Theatre

As seven teens at an English prep school tangle with the pressures of love, sex, bullying and college entrance exams, the confusion, disconnect and latent savagery simmering beneath the surface is revealed. They are intelligent, articulate and accomplished — the cream of the crop turning sour.

At least that is the premise of *Punk Rock*, a highly acclaimed play from Simon Stephens having its Los Angeles Premiere Odyssey Theatre Ensemble this weekend.

Based on Stephens'

experiences as a teacher and inspired by the 1999 Columbine shooting, *Punk Rock* premiered at London's Royal Exchange in 2009, then transferred to the Lyric Hammersmith. The play opened off-Broadway in 2014 at the Lucille Lortel Theatre in an MCC Theater production that Ben Brantley of *The New York Times* called "tender, ferocious and frightening."

Set in the library of a modern Stockport grammar school, it tells the story of various angsty adolescents as they flirt, bully and pontificate their way

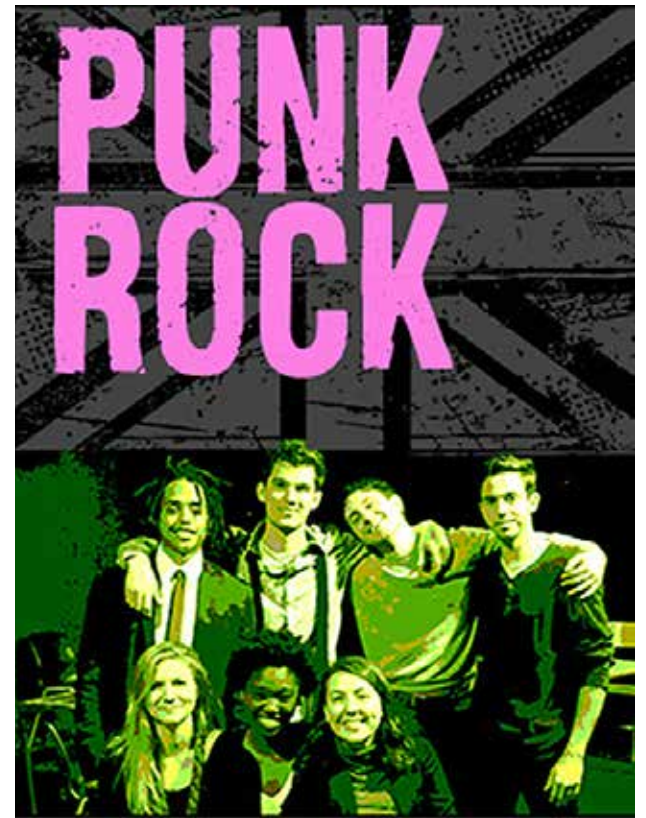
through their A-level mocks. The play was hugely well received when it made its London debut in 2009. The result is a play that is "powerful and compelling" according to the Independent's Michael Coveney, and which "evokes the twilight world of the teenager with scary vividness."

Simon Stephens is an associate artist of the Lyric Hammersmith and the Royal Court Theatre in London. His many other plays include *Carmen*, *Disruption*; *Heisenberg*; *Birdland*; *Blindsided* and *Three*

Kingdoms. His version of *A Doll's House* for the Young Vic transferred to the West End and then New York. His new translation of *The Threepenny Opera* ran last fall at the National Theatre. His other plays for the NT include *Port*, *Harper Regan* and *On the Shore of the Wide World*, which received the Olivier Award for Best New Play. His stage adaptation of Mark Haddon's novel *The Curious Incident of the Dog in the Night-Time* received both the Olivier Award and the Tony Award for Best Play.

Punk Rock's cast of young newcomers features Jacob B. Gibson, Zachary Grant, Nick Marini, Raven Scott, Kenney Selvey, Story Slaughter and Miranda Wynne.

Performances of *Punk Rock* take place March 25 through May 14 on Fridays and Saturdays



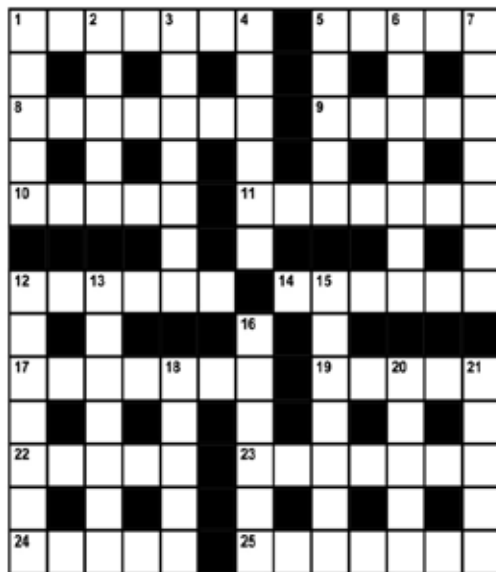

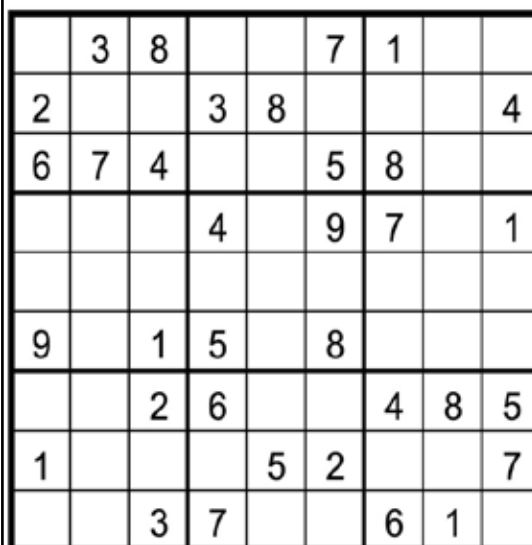

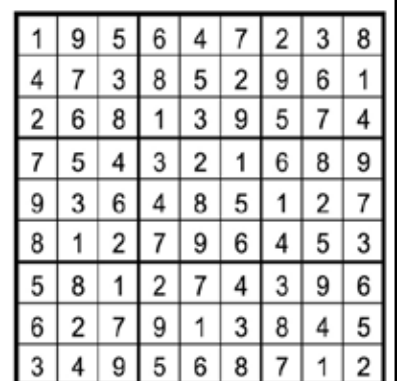

Keep vigilant and let's all try and be a bit kinder to one another by spreading a bit of love to counteract all the horrid stuff going on in the world.

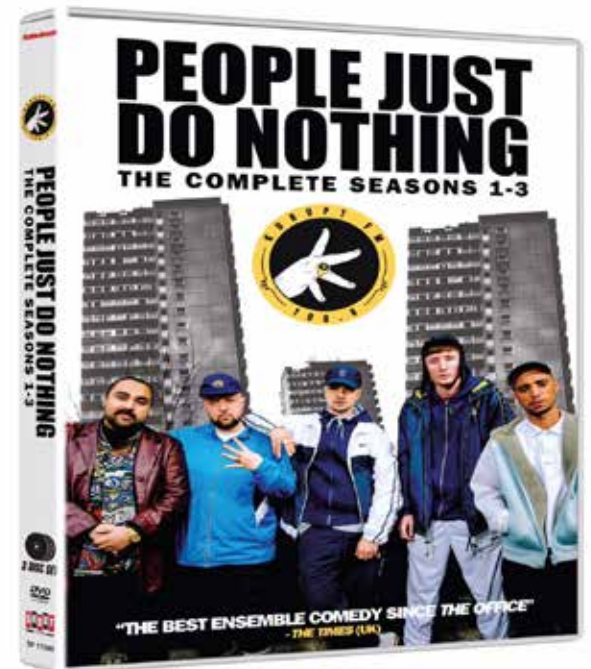

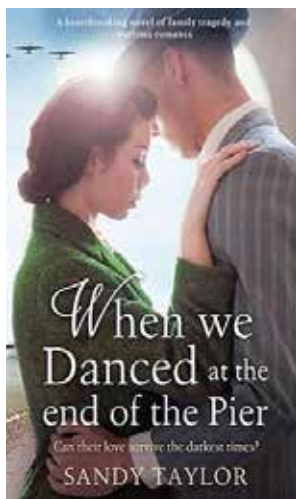
Romance, war and the pier: it's all here

■ Exclusive interview with author Sandy Taylor, discussing the Brighton Girls Trilogy

"I grew up in a close loving Irish family where there was a mental health problem," says *When We Danced at the End of the Pier* author Sandy Taylor.

"I think that I have always wanted to tell this story because those problems shaped my life, they gave me an understanding way beyond my years. To love someone so much and not truly understand why they were sometimes so unhappy and other times so normal was difficult for me as a child. When I was writing, it took me straight back to those times and I was able to recount it but with the wisdom of an adult."

When We Danced is set in 1930s Brighton. Maureen O'Connell is young carefree girl. The world is on the brink



of war that will change her family forever. Maureen's friends are Jack and Nelson. Maureen and Jack fall in love, but war tears them apart. Nelson is off fighting too. Will Jack and Nelson come back? Will she find her happily ever after?

This book is the third book in the *Brighton Girls Trilogy*. "Having written the first two, *The Girls from See Saw Lane*

and *Counting Chimneys*, my publishers asked me to do a prequel," says Taylor. "It made sense to take the book back in time to the 1930s and through the war years, telling the story of Dottie's parents."

"My books are very character driven," says Taylor. "I could deal with my characters emotions, fear and loss because that is the way I write. I wanted my readers to feel as if they are there with them, in time and place. I wanted them to cry with them and to laugh with them but within a framework of authenticity. This background is reflected in my novels as they are full of dialogue."

Taylor had to do a lot more research for this book than for the previous two. "To start with, I was worried about writing about a

period I knew nothing about. But, I found that the more I got into it, the more I learned. I am now an expert on the WW2 in Brighton. I knew that I had to get the facts right as far as the war went. I grew up in Brighton but didn't live through this time...unlike the world of the sixties that I had experienced."

"Thank heavens for the Internet because this was where I got a lot of my background information," says Taylor. "I was also loaned some amazing old books on the war in Brighton, which were invaluable, especially the photos of actual streets that were bombed. This made the whole thing very real. I also read personal accounts of people who had lived through these times. I read books about the evacuees, which helped with Gertie's

story."

Taylor, who started as a playwright, has won seven awards for her plays and three for television. She's been a singer and a stand-up comedian. *When We Danced* has yet to be optioned for film or television. She's written musicals, pantomimes and has two published books of sketches and monologues.

"There is a wonderfully emotional quality to Sandy's writing which is so distinctive," says Claire Bord, Taylor's editor at Bookcuture. "I guess that's what struck me first. I felt like I really knew the characters, that they were my friends or family."

"I think that to write this story without having lived through it would have been difficult," says Taylor.

"But, for me it was very cathartic. This was a story that I needed to write."

Taylor is currently writing two more books for a two book deal. She lives in the West country but born in Brighton.

Reds legend Moran dead at 83

Former Liverpool captain and coach Ronnie Moran has died at the age of 83.

Moran made 379 appearances for Liverpool between 1952 and 1966 and was the club's longest-serving employee when he retired in 1998.

He joined the coaching staff in 1966 and twice filled in as caretaker manager - after Kenny Dalglish's resignation in 1991 and following Graeme Souness' heart surgery in 1992.

His son confirmed he had passed away on

Wednesday after a short illness.

Moran worked under nine different managers during his time in the dugout.

The Crosby-born defender won 44 trophies during nearly five decades with the club.

A left-back in his playing days, Moran signed for Liverpool as a schoolboy in 1949 before turning professional in 1952 and making his debut in November that year. He was club captain when Bill Shankly was appointed

manager in December 1959.

Moran was a key part of the side that won the Football League First Division title in 1963-64 and made his final first-team appearance in the 1964-65 European Cup semi-final against Inter Milan.

After being offered a role on the backroom staff by Bill Shankly in the pre-season of the 1966-67 season, Moran was involved as the Reds won 11 league titles and four European Cups.

Hogg again wins 6 Nations award

Scotland full-back Stuart Hogg has been voted Six Nations player of the championship for the second year running.

The 24-year-old Glasgow Warriors star received the backing of 29,734 fans, almost 25% of the public vote.

He scored three tries in the tournament as Scotland picked up three wins for the first time since 2006.

Ireland flanker CJ Stander came second, with France number eight Louis Picamoles third.

Scotland fly-half Finn Russell was fifth in the voting, just ahead of Ireland scrum-half Conor Murray.

Jones shrugs off end to England's winning run

Eddie Jones said England will "have more setbacks" after his side's hopes of a second straight Grand Slam and a world-record 19th Test win were ended by Ireland on Saturday.

Jones' side had already retained the Six Nations title before their campaign ended with a 13-9 defeat in Dublin.

The Australian said England are "14 months into a four-year project".

"It would have been great to be Grand Slam champions and world record holders but it wasn't our day," he added.

The defeat means England's winning run ends on 18 Tests, level with New Zealand, who saw their series of victories also ended by the Irish, in Chicago in November.

"To win the World Cup you've got to win seven in a row, you've got to cope with that pressure," added Jones.

"How many teams average a 90% win rate? Not many, only the All Blacks."

Jones said the hosts used the conditions "superbly", adding: "Full credit to Ireland, they were brilliantly coached and executed their plan well."

But he said England did not play to their potential and that he would take full responsibility for the defeat.

"We knew it was going to be a tough, physical game, we just weren't good enough today. I didn't prepare the team well," he said.

"We're all human beings, we're not perfect, and that's why world records finish at 18 games because it's hard to keep [winning]."

"The next Test we play I'll prepare them better. I'm human like everyone else, I make mistakes. Even [legendary Australia batsman] Don Bradman got a zero in his last Test."

England captain Dylan Hartley said his team had "big lessons to learn" from the defeat.

"We set out to win the tournament and we've done that. Obviously we're disappointed not to win this final game because we had high hopes, we had high expectations of ourselves," added the hooker.

"Credit to Ireland. We seemed to back up every error with another error. We are not the finished article. This will keep us grounded."

The British and Irish Lions will travel to New Zealand in June looking for a first Test series win there since 1971.

Podolski ends Southgate run

■ But plenty of good signs as England fall in friendly

Gareth Southgate suffered his first defeat in charge of England as Lukas Podolski's spectacular second-half winner provided a fitting farewell to his Germany career in Dortmund on Wednesday night.

Southgate had been undefeated in four games as interim manager following Sam Allardyce's abrupt departure from the England post after one match - and he will feel this 1-0 loss in his first match in permanent control was harsh on his side after a creditable performance against the World Cup holders.

Adam Lallana struck a post and Dele Alli saw a shot blocked at point-blank range by Germany keeper Marc-Andre ter Stegen in the first half as England were superior for spells.

It was almost inevitable, however, that former Arsenal striker Podolski, given a hero's reception

before, during and after the game, made the decisive contribution with a rising left-foot drive from outside the area after 69 minutes that gave England keeper Joe Hart no chance.

Germany's reshaped side had the same experimental appearance as England's but there was still plenty to satisfy manager Southgate in a losing cause.

The result will hurt because for a large portion of this game England were the more creative, threatening and energetic side.

Southgate, though, will reflect on a three-man defensive system that worked effectively - although it was not put to the test too often by a Germany team who rarely went through the gears.

Burnley's Michael Keane made an assured debut, almost scoring in the opening minutes,

and while the attacking system occasionally left Jamie Vardy isolated it did allow Alli and Lallana to flourish and advance into dangerous positions.

England looked effective in possession and nothing that happened here will damage the confidence Southgate is looking to rebuild and put in place after his appointment as permanent successor to Allardyce.

It was a qualified satisfaction because this was nowhere near a full-strength or full throttle Germany.

But Southgate will still have plenty of plus points to take forward into Sunday's World Cup qualifier against Lithuania at Wembley.

This friendly international carried the air of a testimonial for long periods - and in many ways it was as Germany striker Podolski bade farewell to the

international stage.

The 31-year-old striker was ending his career after 130 caps, 49 goals and a World Cup win in 2014, a goodbye said in some style even apart from his spectacular final goal.

Podolski was given a presentation and delivered a speech that

delayed the kick-off by several minutes while Germany fans unveiled a celebratory mosaic to a hugely popular figure in this country.

It may well have accounted for the flat atmosphere in the first half and a German performance to match on a night that almost seemed

more about paying tribute to one of their great sporting servants than learning lessons from playing England.

The match-winner exited the stage a few minutes before the end, accompanied by a standing ovation and dramatic music. This was a night dedicated to him.

...but a few fans spoil the show

THE behaviour of a section of England fans in Germany was "inappropriate, disrespectful and disappointing", says FA chairman Greg Clarke.

England lost 1-0 to Germany in Dortmund on Wednesday night, but a section of England supporters booed the German national anthem and sung chants referencing World War Two.

It is understood that the FA is trying to gather footage of the behaviour.

If found to be involved, supporters could be banned from attending games.

"The FA has consistently urged supporters to show respect and not to chant songs that could be regarded as insulting to others," said Clarke.

"Individuals who engage in such behaviour do not represent the overwhelming majority of England fans nor the values and identity we should aspire to as a football nation.

"We are working with the England Supporters Travel Club and speaking with the Football Supporters' Federation to come together to address this issue.

The FA part-fund the Football Supporters'

Federation (FSF). This includes funding for an annual supporters' summit to discuss fan issues.

An FSF spokesperson said: "Over the last 20 years, English football fans have built a worldwide reputation for our passionate support and the vocal backing we give to our teams.

"Unfortunately little of the wit and imagination that goes into our club football songs is reflected at England games.

"We don't want to regress to a situation where that reputation is tarnished by the actions of a minority."
