# Harry's Easter dash to see his Meghan

■ Engagement speculation rises as star abandons her personal blog

**Prince Harry has flown to Toronto to pay a secret visit and spend Easter with his girlfriend Meghan Markle.**

The 32-year-old royal was spotted by paparazzi arriving at Miss Markle's home on Wednesday evening, carrying a holdall with his face obscured by a baseball cap.

It is a few weeks since the pair last saw each other and the 35-year-old actress will no doubt be looking forward to spending a relaxing weekend together, having not seen one another since the end of March.

On that occasion the actress flew in to London at the last minute and enjoyed a late night private tour of the Natural History Museum with her royal beau, before staying for a few nights at Kensington Palace, where Harry has a cottage.

Last month they were seen together at a friend's wedding in Jamaica.

The couple have enjoyed a string of romantic holidays since announcing

their relationship last summer, and rumors have intensified in recent weeks that the Prince is about to pop the question.

In a further sign of the seriousness of their relationship, the actress announced on Saturday that she is to discontinue her lifestyle blog *The Tig*.

**'you are enough'**

Wrapping-up her blog, she wrote: "What began as a passion project (my little engine that could) evolved into an amazing community of inspiration, support, fun and frivolity. You've made my days brighter and filled this experience with so much joy.

"Keep finding those Tig moments of discovery, keep laughing and taking risks, and keep being "the change you wish to see in the world.

"Above all, don't ever forget your worth - as I've told you time and

time again: you, my sweet friend, you are enough."

The blog was named after the time Markle tried a wine called Tignanello and experienced "unbridled joy". It chronicled her life filming in Canada, travelling the world and even seemed to include a few thinly veiled references to her new relationship.

As well as playing the role of Rachel Zane on *Suits*, Markle spends a lot of time doing humanitarian work. She's a global ambassador for World Vision Canada and has also worked as an advocate for the UN Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women.

She says: "I've never wanted to be a lady who lunches - I've always wanted to be a woman who works. And this type of work is what feeds my soul, and fuels my purpose."

## May and Sturgeon in vote stand-off

Nicola Sturgeon has insisted her preferred timetable for a second Scottish independence referendum is necessary to allow voters to make an "informed choice" between Brexit and leaving the UK.

The First Minister is in a stand-off on the issue with Prime Minister Theresa May, who has made clear she believes "now is not the time" for a fresh ballot to be held.

The SNP leader wants there to be another vote on leaving the UK between autumn 2018 and spring 2019, when the terms of the UK's Brexit deal are clear.

While the First Minister has not yet set out how she intends to take the matter forward, as Scotland's devolution settlement reserves powers over the constitution to Westminster, she told an audience in Glasgow that people need to be able to "come to a considered judgment" on the issue.

She contrasted the 2014 independence referendum campaign with last year's vote for the UK to leave the European Union - a position not supported in Scotland where 62 per

cent of voters opted to remain part of the bloc.

But in that ballot she said "people were asked to vote for a change, without ever really being told what that change involved".

Ms Sturgeon said: "I don't pretend for one moment that the 2014 referendum was perfect. But I do think it was a far better process for debate and decision than the 2016 vote on the EU.

"And so we want to ensure that the next referendum on independence again gives people the information they need to come to an informed and considered judgment.

"That is why nobody wants the referendum to take place immediately. Instead, I believe it should happen once the details of the final Brexit agreement with the EU are known. Based on what the Prime Minister says currently that is likely to be in late 2018 or early 2019."

She said: "Scotland, despite the arguments that were made in 2014 and how we voted in 2016, faces being forced to leave the EU against our will.

"In my view, that is democratically unacceptable."

## A new blooming tribute to an English rose

### March heatwave brings riot of color to Diana tribute garden

A NEW tribute to Princess Diana in the 20th anniversary year of her death has suddenly sprung into full bloom in the sunken garden at Kensington Palace.

Staff at the late Princess's London home were not expecting to see the magnificent White Garden, one of several special royal tributes to Diana this year, in all its glory until May. But last weekend's mini-heatwave caused the glorious carpet of flowers to fill the garden where Diana once chatted amiably to the staff gardeners.

A palace spokeswoman said: "It's bloomed somewhat earlier than we were expecting because of the hot weather. "Gardens are always slightly unpredictable but it's in full bloom. It looks amazing."

Its white flowers and foliage have been inspired by memories of Diana's life, style and image, such as her white "Elvis" Catherine Walker dress, currently on display inside the palace. The garden also evokes memories of the carpet of flowers left outside the palace by thousands of shocked mourners after her death in a Paris car

crash on August 31, 1997.

At the palace, where her sons Prince Harry and the Duke of Cambridge, his wife Kate and their children Prince George and Princess Charlotte live, visitors can view the garden from a public walkway. The white carpet of forget-me-nots, roses, tulips and scented narcissi among others will be added to with summer planting that will include ornamental grasses, cosmos daisies, and gaura flowers that look like butterflies in a breeze.

Head gardener

Sean Harkin chose the sunken garden, first planted in 1908, as the memorial site after he learned the Princess would often stop to talk to the gardeners. "Kensington Palace was the home of Princess Diana for 15 years and there's gardeners who aren't here any more but remember, and told me stories, about when they were working here in the sunken garden," he said.

"And they remember Princess Diana coming by and she would stop and she would admire the changing floral displays in the garden.

And we change them over in springtime and in summer, so it can look quite different. She would have a chat with the gardeners and comment on all their hard work." He also told how a gardener fell over with an overweighted wheelbarrow.

He said: "Princess Diana was going by and turned around and said 'Bad luck, chaps', and kind of gave a smile. And they kind of smiled and found it really quite funny."

Later this year William and Harry will unveil a statue of her at the palace as a tribute.

## Tensions run high over Gib

An armed Spanish gunboat has been ordered to leave British waters off Gibraltar for a second time, officials in the territory say.

On Thursday morning, patrol boat Infanta Cristina was ordered to exit the area by the Royal Navy unit stationed in the small British overseas territory – home to just over 30,000 people.

A UK Government spokesman told reporters: "The Royal Navy challenges all unlawful maritime incursions into British Gibraltar Territorial Waters - and did so again on this occasion."

A tweet by the government of Gibraltar added: "Another Illegal incursion into British Gibraltar Territorial Waters by Spanish Navy ship Infanta Cristina today."

The Infanta Cristina was involved in a similar incident last Tuesday, amid heightened tensions over the Rock due to Brexit.

Tensions increased after an EU document suggested that Spain would be given a veto on post-Brexit agreements governing Gibraltar.

Since then Prime Minister Theresa May has offered reassurance that the UK remains "steadfastly committed" to the Rock.

Former Tory leader Michael Howard even suggested that Mrs May would go to war to defend the sovereignty of Gibraltar, leading Spanish foreign minister Alfonso Dastis to tell the UK not to "lose tempers" over the situation.

Spain has a long-standing territorial claim on Gibraltar, which has been held by the UK since 1713.

# Is stir on the menu for TV chef's father-in-law?

**CELEBRITY** chef Gordon Ramsay's father-in-law is facing a possible jail sentence after he admitted hacking the star's computer.

Chris Hutcheson, 68, and his two sons pleaded guilty to conspiracy to raid Ramsay's emails. His daughter Orlanda Butland, 45, who faced the same charge, walked free from the Old Bailey after Crown lawyers offered no evidence against her.

Hutcheson and his sons Adam, 46, and Chris, 37, were released on unconditional bail ahead of a sentencing hearing on June 2.

Judge Gerald Gordon said: "All options are open. It is clear, realistically, the judge is going to be considering only one other option to an immediate custodial sentence and it would be a suspended sentence."

The maximum sentence is two months in prison.

The charges stem from a legal battle between the star of Hell's Kitchen and Hutcheson in 2010 and 2011. Father-of-four Ramsay, 50, who married Hutcheson's daughter Tana, 42, in 1996, had once been close to his father-in-law and employed him as his chief executive.

But the two men fell out and Hutcheson was removed as a director and shareholder of Gordon Ramsay Holdings Ltd in 2010.

At an earlier hearing, Dan Suter, prosecuting, said: "At the time Chris Hutcheson senior had been dismissed by GRHL, he had previously held a senior position with GRHL."

The prosecution said that as a result of

that dismissal he was motivated to access, unlawfully, the computer system. A Scotland Yard expert later discovered almost 2,000 GRHL emails had been hacked.

Hutcheson and his son Adam used their Google Mail accounts to illegally download the messages, the court heard. Detectives discovered a 10-page document sent between the pair in which they discussed how to "crack codes" and "access passwords".

An expert hired by Ramsay, who is worth about £100million, had discovered the restaurant tycoon's computer system had been hacked, the court heard.

Police were alerted and the case was passed to the Yard's Operation Tuleta squad. Hutcheson senior, of Southfields, south

London, his son Adam, of Wrotham Heath, Kent, and son Chris, of Welwyn Garden City, Herts, admitted conspiracy to unlawfully access a computer between October 23, 2010 and March 31, 2011.

Robert O'Sullivan, QC, prosecuting, told Judge

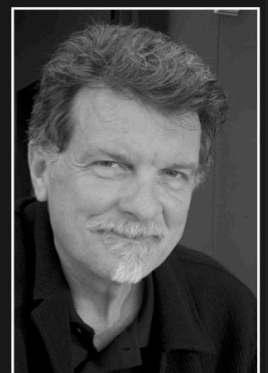
Gordon: "The Crown has been informed of these pleas in advance this morning and the pleas are acceptable to the prosecution. The Crown has concluded in light of the guilty pleas entered by the first three defendants, the public interest does not require a trial of the

fourth defendant." Judge Gordon recorded a not guilty verdict for Ms Butland, also of Southfields. As the three hackers left court, it emerged Hutcheson senior is due to go into hospital later this month for a hip replacement operation.

## News From Britain

**VLADIMIR Putin must choose between staying loyal to the "toxic tyrant" Bashar al-Assad, or working with the rest of the world to find a political solution in Syria, Boris Johnson made clear this week.**

The Foreign Secretary also warned that Russian military officers who help the Syrian president's bloody campaign against his own people could face international sanctions as part of US-led pressure on Moscow to change course.

Mr Johnson, who was in Italy to meet fellow foreign ministers from the G7 group of nations, said last week's cruise missile strike by America against a Syrian air base had "changed the game".

US President Donald Trump ordered the strike to punish the Assad regime for killing more than 80 people in a rebel-held town using the banned chemical weapon sarin.

**'political solution'**

Mr Johnson said Russia must now decide whether to keep supporting its ally Assad or join international efforts to end the six-year conflict.

"They have a choice. That choice is to stick like glue to the Assad regime – that toxic regime which poisons its own people and is indeed poisoning the reputation of Russia

– or to work with the rest of the world to find a political solution," said Mr Johnson.

The government's support for the US response was also confirmed in a phone conversation between Theresa May and the President last night.

A Downing Street spokesperson said: "The President thanked the Prime Minister for her support in the wake of last week's action against Assad.

"The Prime Minister and the President agreed that a window of opportunity now exists to persuade Russia that its alliance with Assad is no longer in its strategic interest.

"They also discussed the broader Middle East, including the threat posed by Iran throughout the region.

"And they also stressed the importance of the international community, including China, putting pressure on North Korea

to constrain its threat."

The Prime Minister, who is on a walking holiday in Wales had already discussed developments in a telephone call with Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau on Sunday.

The G7 gathering in Lucca, Tuscany, aimed to arm US Secretary of State Rex Tillerson with a strong message

to deliver when he flew to Moscow later in the week for talks.

**'appalling behaviour'**

Mr Johnson said the G7 wanted to give Mr Tillerson a clear mandate to tell Russia: "This is your choice – stick with that tyrant or work with us to find a better solution."

He said the G7 meeting would discuss "the possibility of further sanctions on some of the Syrian military figures and indeed on some of the Russian military figures who have been involved in co-ordinating the Syrian military efforts and are thereby contaminated by

the appalling behaviour of the Assad regime".

Senior Russian figures are already subject to international sanctions in retaliation for Moscow's previous annexation of Crimea from Ukraine, but not yet in regard to Syria.

Critics dispute Mr Putin's claim that his forces are focused on defeating Islamic State.

Ahead of Mr Johnson's recent comments, Theresa May's spokesman said the UK refused to be drawn on whether it would support further US action if Syria used chemical weapons again, saying it was a "hypothetical question".

## Tesco 'sorry' for good Friday ad

Tesco has apologised for any offence from a beer advertisement that claimed "Good Friday just got better".

The ad ran in some newspapers to promote "great offers on beer and cider" in the run-up to Easter.

The supermarket said it would not run the ad again after it attracted criticism from some religious figures.

Vicar and broadcaster, the Reverend Richard Coles, said the advert was "extraordinarily and unnecessarily ignorant".

Good Friday is when Christians commemorate the crucifixion of Jesus Christ.

Some choose to mark the day by fasting, which can include abstaining from eating meat or drinking alcohol.

There is some dispute about why it is called "good", with some suggesting the day is "good" in that it is holy, and others that the phrase is a corruption of "God's Friday".

A Tesco spokesperson told the BBC: "We know that Easter is an

important time of the year for our customers.

"It is never our intention to offend and we are sorry if any has been caused by this advert."

Tesco "got it badly wrong" with the "crass" advert, Michael Wakelin, from the faculty of divinity at Cambridge University said on Wednesday.

It was also a "decidedly poor way of treating such a holy day", said Mr Wakelin, a former head of BBC religious programmes.

## Stacey Giggs seeks quick divorce from straying husband

THE estranged wife of former Manchester United star Ryan Giggs wants their divorce fight over money to end as "swiftly and amicably as possible", it was revealed this week.

Stacey Giggs, 38, said she was "disappointed" to have needed the "assistance" of a judge to find a settlement. Mr Justice Cobb looked at the latest stage of the dispute at a private hearing in the High Court in London.

James Brown, part of Mrs Giggs's legal team, said she wanted to avoid "upset and distress to her family".

Mr Brown said: "Mrs Giggs's primary focus is wanting to bring this sensitive and difficult process to a close as swiftly and amicably as possible and enable her family to move on.

"She's disappointed that she has needed the assistance of the court but hopes that outstanding matters can be concluded soon."

Wales international Giggs, 43, said to be worth £48million, was not in court.

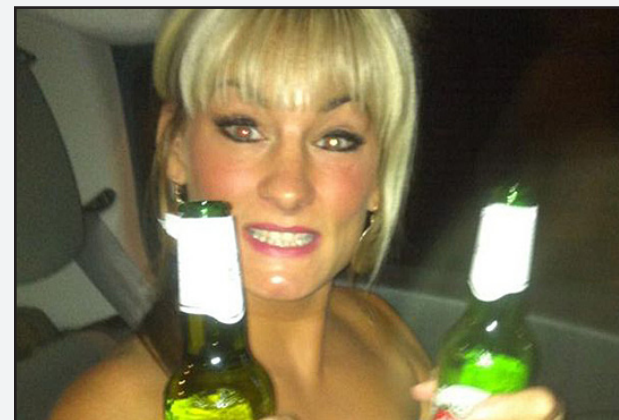

## Shameless mum jailed at last after let-offs for 11 attacks on the police

A SHAMELESS mother who dodged a jail sentence despite 11 attacks on police officers has finally gone to prison after stabbing her boyfriend.

Dawn Walker, 35, of Bacup, Lancashire, knifed Damien Taylor in a near-fatal attack after drinking as many as three bottles of white wine.

### 'good role model'

Jobless Walker has repeatedly avoided prison for attacking officers – beating four PCs last year alone – after convincing judges she was trying to be a "good role model" to her children.

But now Walker, who has a criminal record of 17 offences, has finally been jailed for five years and seven months for wounding.

Burnley Crown Court heard her boyfriend Mr Taylor was found last November lying in a pool of blood with Walker cradling his head pretending to be confused and asking: "What happened?"

She claimed a mystery delivery man had knifed him and fled. But the jury heard after the attack she washed the blade before going to his aid.

### Drunken stupor

Jailing her, Judge Ian Leeming pointed out Walker had committed the knifing while serving a suspended sentence for her 11th assault on a police officer.

Last year Walker sank her teeth into a policeman's face as she was being restrained on her car bonnet by several officers.

In a different incident she tried to bite and headbutt an officer's

face as she was quizzed for crashing her car in a drunken stupor.

Last October, Police Federation officials were furious when a court suspended her eight-week jail term despite her headbutting an officer and calling him a "fat \*\*\*\*".

Prosecutor Nigel Booth said of her knife attack: "It was carried out with coldness and callousness. She tried to wash the knife and the blood away and then returned to her victim and pretended to comfort him."

Despite stabbing her boyfriend, the pair are still in a relationship, the court heard.

## Arrested Foxes fans find pain in Spain

Spanish police have said eight Leicester City fans were arrested for "causing a mess" ahead of their Champions League tie against Atletico Madrid.

The fans remain in custody following clashes with police on Tuesday evening and were scheduled to appear in court on Thursday.

Police said six officers were also attacked in the disturbances.

But one local BBC journalist said he witnessed what appeared to be an unprovoked attack from officers.

Phil Mackie said he met supporters who had

been left bruised after being hit on the head, arms and knees.

The correspondent told 5 live the trouble happened in the Plaza Mayor, where Foxes fans had been told they could gather.

He said he found a number of young Leicester fans with bruises, who had been hit on the head, arms and knees and while some were drunk, they seemed dazed as well.

He witnessed police charging a group of Leicester fans who seemed to be just walking past and three were pushed to the ground, hit with batons and bundled into the back of vans.

### It wasn't all bad...

Chris King, 57, from Rossington in Yorkshire, lost both his hands, except his thumbs, in a workplace accident four

But nine months since having his new hands attached, by Professor Simon Kay at Leeds General Infirmary, he says he can do almost everything he could before the accident. "It's been going fantastically," he said. "I can make a fist, I can hold a pen, I can do more or less the same functions as I could do with my original hands."

King (pictured) still can't tie his shoelaces, but says he is "not far off".

Populations of a sea duck that were devastated by one of the worst oil spills in shipping history have staged a remarkable recovery. When the Sea

Empress tanker ran aground in 1996, off the Pembrokeshire coast, it spilled 72,000 tonnes of crude oil and hundreds of tonnes of fuel – killing 1,700 common scooters. But recent surveys for Natural Resources Wales show that there were 36,000 of the ducks last winter, more than triple the number found before the spill.

Over the past 25 years, Britain has cut its carbon dioxide emissions more successfully than any other G7 nation, according to a new report. The study said the average British person's carbon footprint is now 33% smaller than it was in 1992. Among the explanations given for the fall are Britain's

embrace of gas and energy efficiency schemes, and efforts to reduce methane emissions from landfill sites. However, experts warned that the UK has shifted some of its emissions overseas by importing products from polluters such as China.

## Spirit of the Age

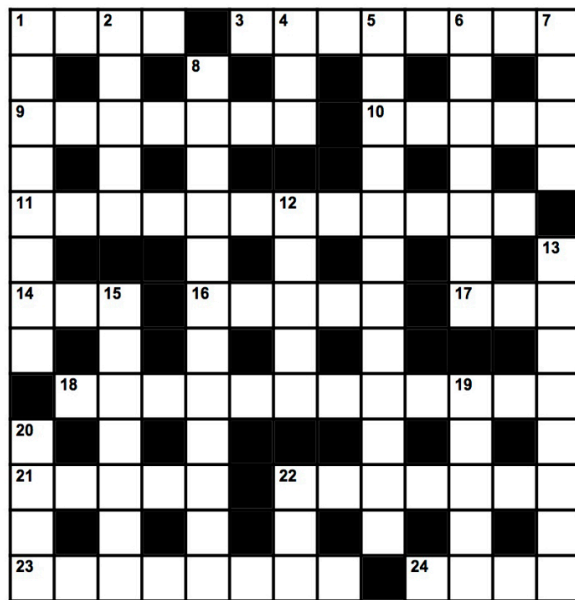
British "kidults" are buying children's toys in record numbers, giving the toy industry a welcome boost. Last year, one in every 11 toy purchases was made by an adult for his or her own use. Retailers report that they mainly buy building sets and action figures (accounting for 20% of that market) and shop disproportionately online – perhaps to avoid the embarrassment of buying their toys in person.

British people now live an average of 100 miles from where they were born. Although almost half of Britons do still live in their home town or village, the survey of British-born adults suggests a huge shift has taken place in a generation: 25 years ago, people lived only five miles, on average, from their birthplace.

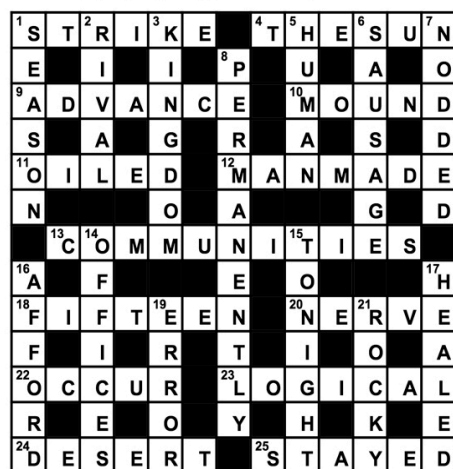

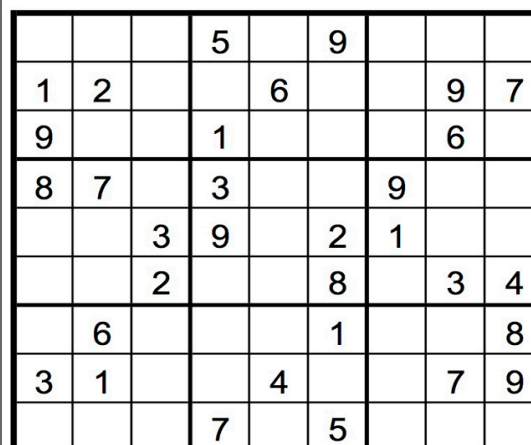

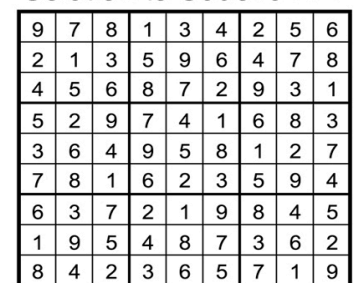

## It's worrying times for us all

### Welcome to California, USA.

San Bernadino to be precise, where yet again another unfortunate gun violence tragedy has occurred. Cedric Johnson, 53, flipped the switch and decided he was going to kill his wife, Karen Smith, also 53, a special needs teacher at a nearby elementary school. Two innocent children were also among the victims before he before he turned the gun on himself.

I don't have kids, but if I did I'd like to think when I dropped them at school that it would be a worry-free, safe place for them. 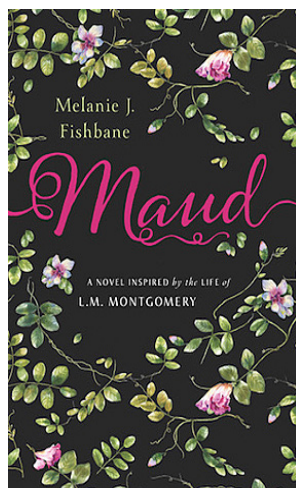

## Maud: a novel inspired by the life of LM Montgomery

### Interview with author Melanie J. Fishbane on her new novel

"I've always wanted to write historical fiction, particularly for young people," says *Maud* author Melanie J. Fishbane. "It is what I studied when I did my M.A. in History. I've also been reading and studying the life and work of L.M. Montgomery since I was in grade six, when I first read *Anne of Green Gables*. When the opportunity to write a young adult novel based on Maud's teen years (arose), it was the perfect symmetry of my favorite things. This part of her life has also rarely been explored, so it felt like I was stepping into new territory, which for me is very exciting."

Fourteen-year-old Lucy Maud Montgomery lives with her grandparents on Prince Edward Island in Canada. She has a dream to go to college. She wants to become a writer just like her idol,



Louisa May Alcott. But she worries that her dream will never come true. Her grandfather believes women should not go to college. But Maud has an a teacher who believes in her, as do her friends, including Nate, the local Baptist minister's stepson. Maud's father sends for her to go out West to join him and her new stepmother and step-sister. At her new school, Lucy meets another boy

who she could love.

"Once I embraced my interest in Montgomery, many opportunities presented themselves," says Fishbane. "To meet a community who studies and reads her... to give talks for a variety of organizations and at conferences." She also visited the set of *Anne of Green Gables* and interviewed the actors. She went to the world premiere of the CBC/Netflix ANNE TV show. Fishbane says she couldn't be happier to feel like the world is embracing Montgomery right now.

Montgomery has published over 20 novels, 530 short stories, 500 poems, and 30 essays. She's best known for her *Anne of Green Gables* series. The series centers on Anne Shirley, an orphan girl mistakenly sent to siblings Matthew and Marilla Cuthbert

to help on their farm. Matthew likes having the effervescent Anne around and convinces Marilla to keep the girl.

Fishbane visited the L.M. Montgomery Collection Archives and Special Collection at the University of Guelph in Ontario. She read Montgomery's journals, perused her photographs and personal library and artifacts, including Maud's mother's *Commonplace Book* and a photocopy of Maud's copy of *Little Women*.

"I traveled to the places where Maud (as Montgomery was commonly known) lived," says Fishbane. "Such as Prince Edward Island, Prince Albert, Saskatchewan, and the three places she lived in Ontario: Leaskdale, Norval, Toronto In Cavendish and Park Corner, PEI. I interviewed

Maud's relatives and explored the sites of the places where she once lived."

She also went to the L.M. Montgomery Institute where she read the original letters Maud had written to her best friend growing up, Pensie MacNeill.

"In Prince Albert, by using old homestead records at the University Archives Special Collection, University of Saskatchewan, a colleague and I found the original location of where Maud's friends, Laura and Will, had lived," says Fishbane. "We also drove around with a local historian who volunteers with the Prince Albert Historical Society, who pointed out the old parts of the town, such as where Maud lived with her father. Many of the houses are no longer standing, but it gave me a sense of the town. I read

every book I could find on Maud and her times, including a history of PEI, a local history of Prince Albert, and Saskatchewan, as well as a book on Indigenous peoples in Saskatchewan."

# United rue missed chances

Manchester United were left rueing missed chances as Anderlecht salvaged a late draw Thursday night to change the complexion of their Europa League quarter-final tie.

Leander Dendoncker got in front of Matteo Darmian to head an equaliser with the Belgian side's first effort on goal four minutes from time.

Until that moment United had subdued the hosts, and deservedly led when Henrikh Mkhitaryan tapped in from a tight angle after Marcus Rashford's shot was spilled in the first half.

But the Armenian side-footed wide when well placed after the break and Paul Pogba fired into the shins of goalkeeper Ruben to leave Jose Mourinho's side vulnerable to the

sucker punch landed by 21-year-old Dendoncker.

United's Europa League odyssey this term has taken in disappointing evenings away to Feyenoord, Fenerbahce and Rostov, and Mourinho's frustration in Brussels will centre on a decent performance undermined by lax finishing and a late defensive lapse.

Since his last foray into second-tier European competition in 2003, the Portuguese has become accustomed to the bright lights of the Champions League, winning it twice and disparaging predecessor Rafael Benitez's Europa League success after taking over at Chelsea in 2013.

But United's position in the Premier League - four points off the top four with games running out - has forced him to revise his attitude.

For most of the

match, his team seemed focused on the task. Just five games away from booking a return to the Champions League - Uefa's sweetener for winning the competition - they looked solid in defence and slick in attack.

For their part, Anderlecht's enterprising young team offered little, deprived of possession and restricted to efforts from distance - but all that changed with Dendoncker's late goal.

United will still fancy their chances of finishing the job back at Old Trafford, but with more dangerous opponents lurking elsewhere in the draw - notably Lyon and Schalke - similar mistakes could easily see their progress to the 24 May final derailed.

Mourinho claimed that his attackers let down their defensive colleagues in his post-match interview, but it

seemed harsh to burden Rashford with a share of the blame after one of his brightest performances of the season.

The 19-year-old - whose goal return was recently questioned by Mourinho - was heavily involved before being replaced by Marouane Fellaini in the

Heroomed dangerously from the left, tormenting full-back Dennis Appiah and threatening with a dipping shot from distance before creating the opener as Ruben failed to grasp his sweetly struck shot.

His industry in the

opposite direction also caught the eye as he diligently tracked Anderlecht's runners.

It was the sort of all-around performance that Mourinho usually demands of his attacking players but, publicly at least, the boss seemed nonplussed.

Replays showed contact was made outside the box but Griezmann duly stepped up to send Kasper Schmeichel the wrong way.

Robert Huth - who will be banned for the second leg after being booked - saw a shot blocked and Shinji Okazaki narrowly failed to make contact with a low cross in the best of Leicester's rare raids forward.

Despite giving up 68% of possession and failing to register a shot on target, Leicester will take heart from their previous encounter with La Liga opposition.

They were similarly dominated by Sevilla in the first leg of their last-16 tie, but turned round the visitors' 2-1 lead on a tumultuous night at the King Power Stadium.

Having reached the final in two of the last three years, however, Atletico are a team of

greater pedigree and expectations than their compatriots.

With the meanest defence in La Liga and Griezmann poised to counter, Atletico are also ideally suited to withstand whatever atmosphere the Foxes fans whip up next Tuesday.

The technical quality of Atletico's players was matched by a shrewd tactical plan from manager Diego Simeone that sought out the space Leicester tried to deny them.

Griezmann - reputedly a summer target for Manchester United - popped up between the lines, with midfielder anchorman Wilfred Ndidi and the two centre-backs uncertain who was best placed to pick him up.
