She's Queen of the Kelpies!

- Her Majesty presides over opening of namesake canal in Grangemouth
- "Transformative effect" of iconic horses praised by sculptor

IT'S NO secret that Her Majesty loves spending her summers north of the border.

But the Queen looked especially happy on Tuesday as she opened the Queen Elizabeth II Canal in the shadow of the stunning 30m-high Kelpies sculptures in Grangemouth, Falkirk.

The canal forms the eastern gateway to the Forth and Clyde Canal and flows right up to the acclaimed horse-head sculptures.

Cheered on by hundreds of onlookers, the Queen and Philip boarded a bunting-covered Seagull Trust boat named The Wooden Spoon, which took them along the canal for the final five minutes of their trip.

Upon arriving to music from a pipe band at the 30-metre high landmarks, the royal couple met Kelpies sculptor Andy Scott.

The Queen smiled as she was introduced to two horses, Duke and Dan, who, as Clydesdales, are the same breed of horse which inspired Mr Scott's landmark sculptures.

They then toured the inside of the "head down" Kelpie to view the engineering work involved in its construction and unveiled a plaque to open the canal section.

Large crowds of onlookers, including many children, waved Union flags as the royal party passed by, with an aerobic display from the Global Stars stunt flying team taking place above the sculptures.

Mr Scott said: "The Queen was asking me about the history of the project and the

relationship with the Clydesdale horses.

"The Duke was particularly interested in the internal structure, the engineering, the fabrication that went on."

'to-see lists'

Of the sculptures, inspired by the horse-drawn barges of the canal in the past, Mr Scott

said: "They've had an amazing transformative effect on the area with over 2.5 million visitors to see them (since opening in April 2014)."

Andrew Thin, chairman of Scottish Canals, said: "We are honoured that Her Majesty the Queen was able to join us to celebrate the naming of the Queen Elizabeth II

Canal in her honour.

"The Kelpies and the Queen Elizabeth II Canal are helping put Falkirk and Grangemouth on tourists' 'to see' lists the world over."

Later, the Queen visited Stirling Castle as she marked 70 years since being appointed Colonel-in-Chief of the Argyll and Sutherland regiment.

She was presented with the keys to the castle by the Earl of Mar and Kellie, who is the hereditary keeper of the keys.

The Queen is in Scotland for Holyrood week and was scheduled to later meet with Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau at the Palace of Holyroodhouse.

Don't launch SAS witch hunt, warns former minister

A FORMER defence minister has warned against a witch hunt after a Special Air Service unit was accused of going "rogue" while operating in Afghanistan.

A Sunday newspaper claimed SAS soldiers allegedly murdered Afghan civilians suspected of being Taliban commanders during night raids on their homes. In one case in 2011, suspects were believed to have been handcuffed and hooded before being shot dead, sources said.

Former defence minister Sir Gerald Howarth said "extreme caution" needed to be exercised before making such accusations against the SAS. He said: "We have to remember Afghanistan was a very dirty war.

"Our Special Forces are highly regarded and we need to be careful before we start launching a witch-hunt into their clandestine activities.

"In Afghanistan our Special Forces saved many civilian and military lives."

The allegations were reportedly uncovered over the past 18 months by Royal Military Police investigators working on an operation known as Northmoor.

Doubles joy for Andy as Kim reveals she is expecting second child

W I M B L E D O N champion Sir Andy Murray started his title defence this week buoyed by the news his wife is expecting their second child.

The world number one and Kim, who married in 2015, already have 17-month-old daughter, Sophia. And bookmakers reckon they will have mixed doubles, making it odds-on their second child is a boy – with Tim, Robert and William the

leading names. On the eve of his title defence Sir Andy, 30, said: "We're both obviously very happy and looking forward to it."

After pulling out of two warm-up matches due to ongoing hip problems, he assured fans he will be "fine to play". Asked if the excitement of his new child would affect his performance, he said: "No, I wouldn't have thought so," admitting his family had "known

for some time".

On Sunday his maternal grandmother Shirley Erskine, 82, said: "Naturally we are delighted." And paternal grandmother Ellen Murray, 84, said: "I'm very happy. Sophia is a lovely wee thing so it will be nice for her to have a little brother or sister."

There are signs fatherhood has softened the previously prickly sportsman. Speaking after the birth of Sophia,

Sir Andy said: "My child is more important to me and my wife is more important to me than a tennis match."

He revealed he missed Sophia's first steps while

playing overseas, also hinting the demands of travelling the world meant he missed her first words too. "Even when I'm away for a day I feel bad," he said.

Teen jihadist gets life for plot to kill fans at Elton John concert

A TEENAGE jihadist who plotted a nail bomb attack on an Elton John concert in London's Hyde Park was jailed for life this week.

Haroon Syed, who also planned to slaughter crowds outside Buckingham Palace and Oxford Street, was ready to target the star's gig last year on the 15th anniversary of the 9/11

attacks in New York.

An Old Bailey judge ordered the 19-year-old to serve at least 16 years in jail before he can be considered for release.

His older brother Nadir Syed, 24, was jailed for life last year for planning to behead a poppy-seller on Remembrance Sunday.

Islamic State-inspired Haroon Syed dreamed of

causing carnage on the scale of the 2005 London bombings, which claimed the lives of 52 innocent victims, the court heard. He had initially wanted to launch a machine gun attack at Elton John's concert, which was attended by 50,000 fans.

But Syed failed to raise enough cash to buy the automatic weapons

so opted instead for a suicide vest and a homemade bomb stuffed with "lots of nails".

Syed sought help from a fellow jihadist called Abu Yusuf whom he met via the internet.

But Yusuf was an MI5 spy and Syed's plans were thwarted.

The computer technology student from Hounslow, in west London, admitted preparing an act of terrorism at a hearing in May.

At first, he claimed his plot was a fantasy linked to his addiction to violent video games and accused undercover officers of entrapping him. It later emerged he had fallen under the influence of members of Al-Muhajiroun, the banned group linked to jailed hate preacher Anjem Choudary.

Sentencing Syed yesterday, Judge Michael Topolski said: "You remained intent upon and committed to, carrying out an act

Stormont talks 'parked' till the Autumn

■ Deadlock continues as May is accused of setting back 'decades of work' with DUP pact

No deal has been reached to restore Northern Ireland's power-sharing agreement at Stormont and talks will continue over the summer, DUP leader Arlene Foster has said.

Negotiations had been due to expire last week but were extended by Northern Ireland Secretary James Brokenshire in an attempt to give the parties more time to reach a deal.

However, Ms Foster, who recently agreed to prop up Theresa May's minority Government in Westminster, said no agreement had been reached and suggested the issue may not be resolved until the autumn.

'monumental failure'

"We are disappointed we don't have an agreement this afternoon," Ms Foster said. "We are going to keep working at it through the summer and hopefully we can come to an agreement later on in the year.

"We are certainly up for an agreement, we are

up for devolution."

Talks will continue over the summer but at a reduced intensity, with full negotiations likely to resume in the autumn.

Both sides have blamed each other for the stalemate. DUP representatives have criticised what they call Sinn Fein's "excessive demands", while Sinn Fein's Stormont leader Michelle O'Neill claimed the Conservatives' deal with the DUP was one of the main reasons that efforts to establish a new administration have floundered.

"What this constitutes is a monumental failure

on behalf of Theresa May," she said.

"She has set back decades of work that has been done here throughout the years and it's a consequence, as we all know, of the DUP supporting the Prime Minister and the Prime Minister in turn supporting the DUP."

A number of sticking points between the DUP and Sinn Fein remain, including differences over a possible Irish language act that would protect the rights of Irish speakers in Northern Ireland. The DUP has also refused to support calls to legalize same-sex marriage in Northern Ireland.

The devolved institutions imploded in January when Mrs Foster was forced from office after Sinn Fein's then Deputy First Minister, the late Martin McGuinness, quit.

That was in protest at the DUP's handling of the renewable heat incentive (RHI), a botched scheme that left the administration facing a £490m overspend.

Teen who killed seven-year-old thought victim 'not human'

■ Accused killer has long history of psychiatric problems, court told

A TEENAGER suffocated a seven year-old schoolgirl then sliced open her body with a knife to check if she was a robot, a court was told this week.

The 15-year-old killed Katie Rough after becoming deluded and thinking the youngster was "not human", it was said. The unnamed girl, who thought some people "may be controlled by a higher and hostile force," spent a year receiving mental health care. Psychiatrists recommended she undergo a full assessment but no report was ever produced. Instead, just weeks before the killing, she received a fresh prescription of anti-depressants due to an escalation in her

"macabre" thoughts.

On January 9 the pair were on a playing field in the Woodthorpe area of York when the teenager lay on top of the young girl and covered her mouth with her gloved hand. After Katie had stopped breathing the killer hoisted up her victim's clothing and sliced open her torso with a Stanley knife she had stolen from her grandmother. She also slit the child's throat before dialling 999 to tell police Katie was dead.

Four minutes later Katie's mother called police to report her daughter missing only to be told by a shocked operator they had received reports of a dead child in the vicinity. Alison Rough, 38, and husband Paul, 34, raced to the scene – just

a mile from their home – where they discovered a policeman frantically trying to resuscitate Katie. The distraught mother sat cradling her daughter screaming: "She's killed her" before Katie was airlifted to hospital where she was pronounced dead on arrival.

A postmortem found her death was caused by asphyxiation.

On Tuesday the girl, now aged 16, appeared by video link at Leeds Crown Court where she failed to speak when asked to confirm her name by Judge Mr Justice Soole. She then wrote on paper that she pleaded not guilty to murder but guilty to manslaughter. Graham Reeds, prosecuting, said even though the killing was preplanned, psychiatric and psychological reports

concluded she was suffering from diminished responsibility.

Katie's parents sat in court with other relatives as Mr Reeds told how a friend of the killer described the girl as "nice but weird" to police. She said the

teenager had "dreamed of killing someone" and heard "voices in her head".

Nick Johnson, defending, said the teenager had been bullied at school and had thought some people "may not be human and may be

controlled by a higher and hostile force". Referring to the social media post, he added the girl "was clearly crying out for help and support".

The case was adjourned for further medical assessment until July 20.

'Godfather' called in as F1 heiress divorce turns nasty

■ Ecclestone's son-in-law leans on ex-gangster in bitter marital split

The head of Britain's most notorious crime family is advising Bernie Ecclestone's son-in-law in a bitter separation from the billionaire's daughter, it has been reported.

Terry Adams, a former gangster whose family "firm" is linked to 25 murders, contacted the former Formula One boss offering to help to negotiate financial and other arrangements.

He is assisting James Stunt, a gold trader, after the collapse of his six-year marriage to Petra Ecclestone, 28. Mr Adams is godfather to Mr Stunt and had been a guest at the £66 million London home the couple shared before their split.

His involvement adds a new dimension to the battle between Mr Stunt,

35, and his wife's family. Mr Ecclestone, 86, whose 40-year reign as the head of Formula One came to an end in January, confirmed that he had been contacted by the former gangster.

"Mr Adams contacted me with advice which he thought would be useful to me in my dealings with Mr Stunt," he said. "I declined to accept that advice. I understand Mr Adams was living in the home with my son-in-law."

Mr Adams uses one of the flats owned by Mr Stunt's family in the Chelsea Harbour development as a pied-à-terre.

This week Mr Stunt posted a video on YouTube in which he responded to Mr Ecclestone's claim that he

compared himself to the American mafia boss John Gotti, who was known as the Dapper Don. Mr Stunt, wearing a white towelling robe in his room at the Jumeirah Carlton Tower hotel in Belgravia, said: "I wish I could be as cool as John Gotti. I'm sadly not. I am not a gangster,

I am nowhere near clever enough or cool enough to be one of those guys. Do I know any figures in organised crime? Alleged ones, yes. Do I know? No I don't because I would never disrespect any person by asking them this."

Mr Stunt, who is said to own 200 classic and luxury cars and artworks including pieces by Monet and Picasso, said he had never confirmed or denied that he was a billionaire.

His statement followed a family court hearing which was told that Mr Stunt was abusive and violent to his wife and took overdoses during their marriage. He denies the allegations. The couple married in a £12 million ceremony in Italy in 2011 and split their time

between a £55 million estate in Los Angeles and their London home before returning to Britain permanently last year.

The Central Family Court was told that Mr Stunt signed a prenuptial agreement worth £16 million. His assets included a wine collection worth £15 million and two properties in Chelsea Harbour worth £4 million each.

The hearing is understood to have boiled over with Mr Stunt banging a table and appearing to make a gun

gesture with his hand and later pointing at Mr Ecclestone.

Mr Stunt is a familiar face on the London society scene and often travels with an entourage of bodyguards in a convoy of luxury cars which have numberplates based on his surname.

His lifestyle is far removed from his conservative middle-class upbringing in Virginia Water, Surrey, with his father, Geoffrey, 67, the director of a publishing company, and mother Lorraine, 65.

'I'm a power drinker, ...he's a lightweight'

Newcastle United owner tells court he can easily down four or five pints an hour - but that the investment banker suing him is 'a lightweight'

Newcastle United owner and Sports Direct boss Mike Ashley has told a High Court judge that he likes getting drunk.

Mr Ashley told Mr Justice Leggatt that he was not a regular drinker but a 'power drinker'.

The 52-year-old tycoon was giving evidence on the fourth day of a High Court trial in London.

The civil trial is adjudicating on a claim of investment banker Jeffrey Blue, who says Mr Ashley promised him a fortune if he increased Sports Direct's share price to £8 a

share.

He says Mr Ashley paid only £1m - so he wants £14m in damages.

Mr Ashley denies the claim and says Mr Blue is 'trying to take me for £14m off the back of some drunk banter'.

He also told the court Mr Blue is talking 'nonsense'.

The judge has heard that the dispute between the pair relates to a conversation in a central London pub.

Mr Blue claims the controversial Newcastle United owner made a

promise during a meeting in the Horse and Groom four years ago.

A lawyer representing Mr Blue asked how much Mr Ashley had drunk at the Horse and Groom on Great Portland Street, near Mr Ashley's London headquarters. He calculated that within an hour he would have drunk four to five pints

'He would never have been able to keep up,' said Mr Ashley. 'He's a lightweight when it comes to drinking.'

Mr Ashley also claimed he has 'never

taken a penny' out of the sportswear firm.

He told the court: 'I have never taken a penny out of Sports Direct - salary or otherwise. 'As a matter of fact, I subsidise Sports Direct.'

He added that he was the 'last person to know'

at Newcastle United, saying: 'They are really not interested in my opinion.'

Mr Ashley told the judge about his forward-looking philosophy as he countered the claims against him.

He suggested that he had particular difficulty

remembering because he did not spend his life looking back.

'I'm a person who spends 99% of my life looking forward,' he told Mr Justice Leggatt.

'Not driving in the rear view mirror.'

The hearing continues.

Nigella's carbonara gets Italians in a stew

■ Social media erupts over saucy chef's 'chin-dripping, love-soaked primal feast'

Beloved British TV chef Nigella Lawson is known for her sumptuous, indulgent yet easy recipes and never shies away from luxuriantly pouring in cream.

But while her taste for indulgence has made her something of a national treasure in Britain, Italians appear to be unimpressed by her excess.

And this week the cook upset Italians to the point of outrage after posting her popular carbonara recipe on her Facebook page.

She has been told that her cookery is a "disgrace" and she may as well "make it with turkey twizzlers" after posting her take on the classic dish, which contains nutmeg, wine and cream on her page.

Ms Lawson wrote: "I think spaghetti carbonara is what Meryl Streep



cooks for Jack Nicholson in the film version of one of my favourite books, "Heartburn", and it is so right, for that chin-dripping, love-soaked primal feast, the first time

someone actually stays through the night."

But there not much love coming from the home of Carbonara, as Italians flocked to her Facebook page to express

their disgust at her choice of ingredients.

One Italian raged: "Nigella you are a wonderful woman but your recipes are the DEATH of Italian recipes, literally! NO CREAM IN CARBONARA NEVER, only eggs."

Another instructed: "Uova, Pecorino, Guanciale, Pepe, Arte.

"L'arte della cucina Italiana non è un modo di pensare.

"The art of Italian cooking is not a way of thinking."

One fan was saddened one of his favourite chefs did not follow the traditional Italian recipe.

He wrote: "I love Nigella more than any Michelin starred chef. I tried almost every recipe of hers. And of course this one also.

"It is dee-licious, really. Heavy but heavenly tasting. But it is not Carbonara. Using a name of a well known recipe, adjusting the original ingredients to

one's own taste and even adding others just creates confusion and wrong taste expectations. Yes, we take food very seriously."

Another Italian fumed: "This is a recipe of yours, it's not Carbonara. No wine, no cream and egg yolks only in Italian real Carbonara".

And another said: "The cream in the Carbonara is an outrage to Italian cuisine".

Nigella Lawson is known for putting a British twist on Italian

recipes; she has said one of her favourite dishes is Marmite spaghetti.

This isn't the first time a British chef has caused outrage with a pasta recipe.

Great British Bake-Off star Mary Berry also recently angered viewers by putting cream and white wine instead of red in her bolognese sauce.

However, it turned out this was actually close to the traditional recipe, meaning some of her critics were forced to, ahem, eat crow.

Mel B has spent it all, lawyer tells divorce court

■ Former Spice Girl has burned through at least \$50m, Los Angeles courtroom hears

Mel B has wiped out her multi-million pound Spice Girls fortune after leading an "extravagant" lifestyle, a court was told as the star appeared at her bitter divorce battle for the first time.

The Leeds-born singer, 42, attended court in Los Angeles on Friday to face Stephen Belafonte, who she says tormented her with years of physical and mental abuse.

Los Angeles Superior Court was told that the pair both had outstanding tax debts after making "improvident" lifestyle choices

Grace Jamra, representing Belafonte, said: "Their lifestyle was

extravagant and affluent. "She wiped out all her Spice Girls money, approximately 50 million if not more.

Mel B, real name Melanie Brown, appeared in court in high-waisted black trousers and a white shirt with a black tie.

She sat clutching a tissue at the far side of the court to 42-year-old Belafonte, who was bald, bearded and suited.

Jacalyn Davis, representing Brown, spoke of their tax problems, saying they were "sustained through improvident lifestyle choices".

They never had money at the end of the year to pay their taxes," she

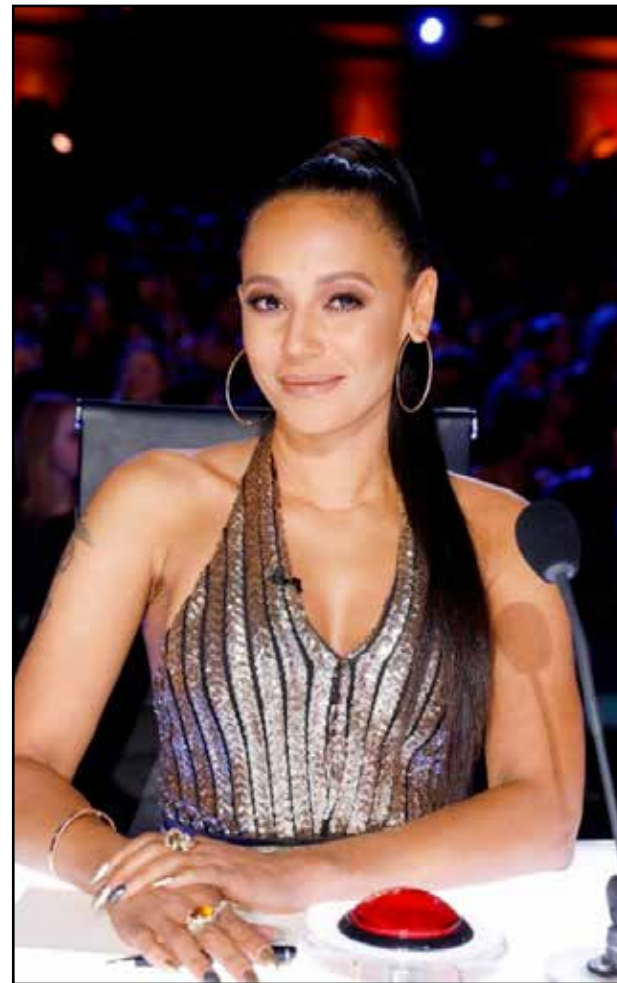
said. "All their community income was being spent and then some.

"In this marriage that would be Miss Brown's income from the Spice Girls."

The court heard arguments over whether Brown should temporarily pay spousal support and 200,000 dollars (£154,000) in legal fees to Belafonte, who claims to have no income.

Larry Bakman, also representing Brown, said it would be "offensive" for her to pay for her alleged abuser to fight the case.

Brown previously won a temporary restraining order after claiming her

Brown, now a judge on America's Got Talent, married the film producer in Las Vegas in June 2007, but filed for divorce on March 20, citing "irreconcilable differences".

Judge Lawrence Riff adjourned the case. The full divorce hearing will begin on September 25.

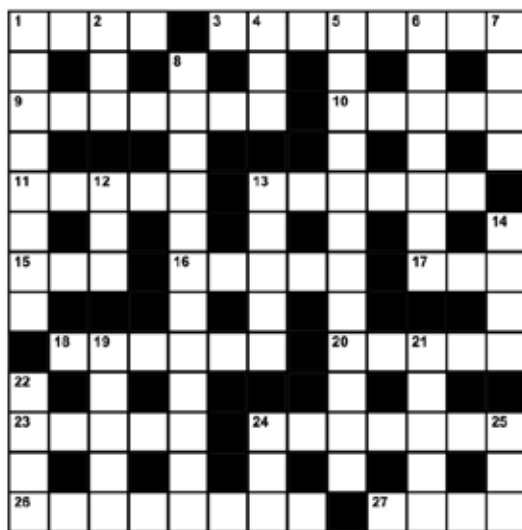

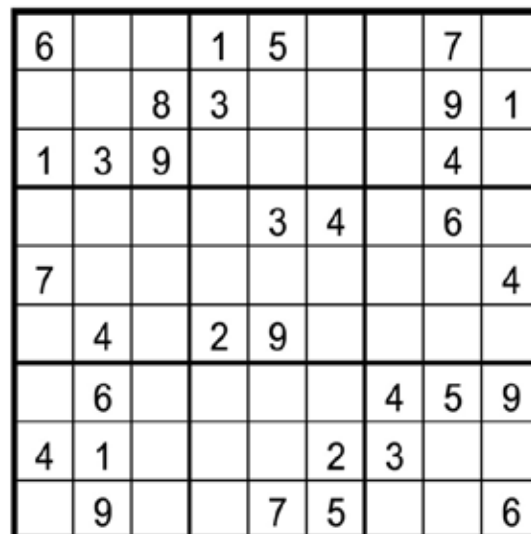

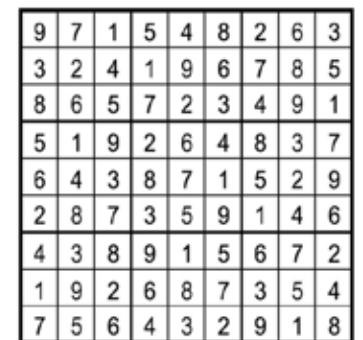
SUDOKU by Myles Mellor and Susan Flanagan

Was there a particular reason you chose LA?

From the very first time I visited Los Angeles on tour I felt at home here. I'd lived in London for over 12 years before moving to LA, so when I was on tour with my band The Duke Spirit we couldn't wait to get to LA and the sunshine. Even though when we'd pass through New York it felt like a slice of home and being back in London for a few days, when we'd hit Los Angeles it felt like I could stay forever. This city has everything I love about London and the Isle of Wight, where I grew up from the age of eight-years-old. It can have the urban hustle and bustle of London when you want it in downtown and Hollywood, but it also has all this greenery, like Griffith Park, the mountains, and the beach, which remind me of the best things about growing up on the Isle of Wight. So when I had a chance to move here for my new music projects, The Bulls and The Saint James Society, I grabbed that opportunity and I haven't looked back. I've even started a new record label, Blank City Records, with my Saint James band mate, which we're currently growing into a community for artists at a new space in Echo Park. I don't feel like I could've had these same opportunities back in London any more with how the scene's changed there.

What do you miss most from home?

Apart from my family and friends, I have to say "real" chips! I just can't find anywhere that does

real fish 'n' chips! How hard is it to cut up a potato and deep fry it British fish'n'chip shop style? Maybe that will be my next venture here in LA, setting up a rock'n'roll fish'n'chip shop and call it "Rock'N'Roe".

What was your first impression of LA and has it changed since?

LA has always had that reputation for being "laidback", but I have to say that from the moment I got here I've never seen people work harder than they do in LA. They might not "play as hard" as they do in New York and London, but they certainly know how to make things happen, so long as you're working your arse off constantly to achieve it.

What do you find the biggest difference is living here versus London?

Everyone in LA talks about traffic in the same way we obsess about the weather back in London. And I have to pronounce "water" as "war-der" when I order it here or no one understands me here!

Do you have a hidden gem in LA that you want

to share with us?

I have a couple of "foodie" hidden gems, like the secret off-menu burger at Café Stella in Silverlake, which you can only order in the back bar in the evening. Just ask for it with the truffle fries! And there's the Old Place up in the Agoura Hills, which is a real fun place to hit at the weekends. There's even a winery next door, so you can go do a tasting whilst you wait for your table. And where do I even start with my favourite taco trucks... and escaping to the desert and Pappy & Harriet's in Joshua Tree at the weekends (or, even better, during the week!) is a must.

What would you suggest to others who are thinking about making the move here?

Don't even consider moving here if you can't drive! I moved here before Lyft and Uber, which has made a massive difference in the last few years, but it's such a vast city you'll miss out on opportunities, both business and social, if you can't drive yourself around. Also, if you're used to the lunchtime

drinking culture of London and New York, forget it!

Lots of our members join our group Brits in LA seeking out words of wisdom - what is the best piece of advice you've been given?

If you find yourself in Santa Monica after 5pm (or even 4pm these days) and need to drive back to the Eastside, just make plans to stay until at least 8pm or later as it'll take you the same amount of time to get home if you miss the gnarly rush hour(s) traffic on the 10 and 110 freeway.

Lastly, how can we find out more about you? Are you working on anything at the moment?

As I mentioned, I've got a number of projects on the go right now, including two bands and a record label. 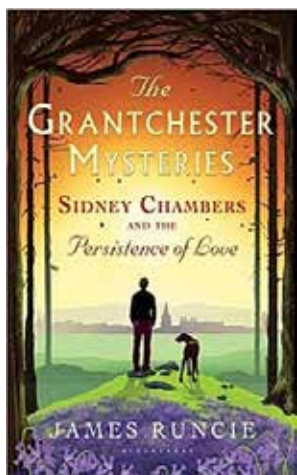

Grantchester: morality and murder in the country

■ Exclusive interview with author James Runcie on his latest Grantchester mystery



"I am continually amazed at the success the series has garnered," says *Sidney Chambers and The Persistence of Love* author James Runcie. "Season three of *Grantchester* premieres in the U.S. next month. I think what is startling is how rapidly and radically British society has developed since the 1950s. I thought it might be interesting to combine that changing British social history with murder."

"It was very important to me that the ensuing

television series *Grantchester*, an adaptation of the first book, *Sidney Chambers and the Shadow of Death*, that the central character should be sexy," says Runcie. "So, the producers cast rising star James Norton, a tall, charming man with plot-loads of personality, a degree in theology for goodness sake, and cheekbones so burnished he needs Brasso to polish them. One of my favorite moments after the first episode was a tweet that said simply: Just take your top off and tell us who did it, vicar."

The book is set in May, 1971. In the Cambridgeshire countryside, archdeacon Sidney Chambers is walking with his daughter Anna and their Labrador Byron. They stumble upon a body. Another murder investigation for Sidney. This time he encounters the world of hippies and psychedelic plants. The

diocese has secrets and Sidney's nephew goes missing.

"I was born in Cambridge in 1959 and am the son of a clergyman, so it's not hard to work out the source of inspiration," says Runcie. "The central character is very loosely based on my father, Robert Runcie, the former Archbishop of Canterbury. He didn't go round solving murders, but when I began to write a series of six crime novels, intended as a moral history of post-war Britain, it seemed almost obvious to make the central character a clergyman. The only alternative would have been a doctor."

"He would be a fictionalized version of my father," says Runcie. "Sharing his love of humanity, his ability to think the best of people, while sometimes fearing the worst, his cheerfulness and his

love of the ridiculous, as well as his sadness and disappointment in the face of human failing."

Robert Runcie fought in the Second World War with the Scots Guards, and so has the character Sidney Chambers. He became a clergyman shortly after the war. At the beginning of his ministry he lived in Cambridge and was eventually chosen to become Archbishop of Canterbury in 1979.

Runcie wrote four novels prior to the *Grantchester* series: *The Discovery of Chocolate*, *The Color of Heaven*, *Canvey Island*, and *East Fortune*. He's also produced many documentaries including *Hilary Mantel: A Culture Show Special* and *J.K. Rowling: A Year in the Life*. The *Grantchester* series is adapted for television by ITV and PBS. *The Great Passion*, a play based on Bach's *St. Matthew Passion*, was recently broadcast on BBC Radio. Alexandra

Pringle at Bloomsbury is Runcie's editor.

With actual crime at an all time low, the surge in popularity of crime fiction may seem strange. However, Runcie has a theory.

"I was intrigued by the possibility that one of the reasons for the popularity of crime fiction in the last fifty years might be due to the decline of traditional Christian worship," says Runcie. "A hundred years ago people would recite the Book of Common Prayer on a daily basis and attend church regularly to contemplate the moral implications of birth, love, sin and death. Now, attendance has fallen and human beings search for meaning in alternative places. Readers can contemplate their fears and their mortality within the pages of a reassuring narrative of justice, rather than reach for the comfort of a loving God in whom they find it hard to have

faith."

Terry seals Villa switch

Aston Villa have signed former Chelsea and England captain John Terry.

The 36-year-old defender, whose contract at Stamford Bridge expired on 30 June, has signed a one-year deal with the Championship club.

Terry (pictured) said he turned down offers to carry on playing in the Premier League for more money because he did not want to play against Chelsea.

He won 78 caps for England, played 717 games for the Blues and won his fifth Premier League title in May.

Villa finished 13th in the Championship last season but Steve Bruce's side are among the favourites to win automatic promotion to the top flight in 2017-18.

Birmingham City manager Harry Redknapp said in June that his club had made an offer to Terry, who announced in April that he would be leaving Chelsea.

Terry has played for only two other English clubs - Chelsea and Nottingham Forest, with whom he had a short loan spell in 2000.

'A new chapter'

Terry, who made his debut as a late substitute in a League Cup tie

against Villa in 1998, said he had lots of offers to play abroad as well as remain in the top flight.

But he said: "The mental side of playing against Chelsea was too much to get over for me. I was there for 22 years at the football club. I am very proud of that but this is a new chapter in my life and career."

"My thoughts are 100% here and the ambition is to get us back to the Premier League. It's a huge club. Villa Park is one of the finest stadiums in the country and there's a good group of players here."

"I can't wait to get started now and look to help the squad achieve something special this season. It's a club that deserves to be in the Premier League and I still

want to continue playing.

"I am hungry to still play with a team and manager that has the same ambition as me to get promoted."

'City striker to Foxes'

Manchester City striker Kelechi Iheanacho is close to making a £25m move to Leicester City.

The 20-year-old Nigerian is in advanced talks with the Foxes and is thought to be keen to make the switch.

Iheanacho has scored 21 goals in 64 games in all competitions since making his debut for Manchester City in 2015.

Last August, he signed a new contract until 2021, but saw his playing time limited by the January arrival of Brazil forward Gabriel Jesus.

Wimbledon: record year for fines?

This year's Wimbledon has seen some of the worst behaviour by players in recent years, figures for fines imposed so far during the championships have shown.

Tournament officials have handed out the second highest recorded financial penalty in Wimbledon's history, imposing a \$15,000 (£11,500) fine on Bernard Tomic for "unsportsmanlike conduct".

It came after the Australian admitted in a post-match Press conference that he had faked an injury during his straight-sets loss to the German Mischa Zverev in the first round, and that he was "bored" with Wimbledon.

And Daniil Medvedev was handed three individual fines totalling \$14,500 (£11,200) - the third highest amount since records began in 1991 - for unsportsmanlike conduct, when he threw coins at the umpire's chair on Wednesday.



Henman: 'players under greater scrutiny'

In just the first three days of this year's championships a total of \$33,500 (£25,900) in fines has been handed out for unsportsmanlike conduct.

That compares to the total \$93,500 (£70,700) handed out during the whole of last year's tournament and the \$62,500 (£40,000) levied against players in 2015.

The fines highlight the pressure players are competing under at what is regarded as the world's greatest tennis tournament, with Grand Slam officials quick to crack down on any offence deemed to be against the rules and the spirit of the

game.

Tim Henman, the former British number one and four times Wimbledon semi finalist, said: "Players are under greater scrutiny because the prize money has gone up."

He added: "I think one thing for sure the club have done a good job is really protecting the court. You smash your racquet on a grass court there'll be some unhappy groundsmen and you'll get some pretty big fines."

The money will be docked from the players' prize money, with Tomic losing a third of the £35,000 he earned for his first round appearance.

Root makes glittering debut as Test captain

Joe Root scored a brilliant unbeaten 184 on his first day as England Test captain to put his side in control against South Africa on Thursday.

Arriving at the crease with England 17-2, the 26-year-old then saw them slump to 74-4.

But Root (right) steadied

the ship with Ben Stokes and then made hay with Moeen Ali as England closed on 357-5.

Root was fortunate to be dropped in the gully on 16 and was later reprieved by a no-ball when stumped on 149.

Vernon Philander impressed for South Africa,

removing both England openers and Jonny Bairstow cheaply.

It was Root's day, however, as he hit the highest score by an England captain in his first game in charge.

He also follows in the footsteps of his three immediate predecessors

- Alastair Cook, Kevin Pietersen and Andrew Strauss - in marking his Test leadership debut with a ton.

At press time England will resume on Friday looking to push on towards 500 and then hope the wicket dries up to assist their two spinners.



United agree £75m Lukaku deal

■ Belgian striker headed for Mou reunion

Manchester United have agreed a fee of around £75m with Everton for striker Romelu Lukaku, senior club sources confirmed on Thursday.

The 24-year-old Belgium international scored 25 Premier League goals last season.

United, who have been chasing Lukaku for most of the summer, will not now be pursuing their interest in Real Madrid's Alvaro Morata.

Everton sources say no deal or agreement has been reached.

The move for Lukaku is not connected to talks aimed at taking United

forward Wayne Rooney to Everton.

Jose Mourinho's side are hopeful of concluding a deal in time for Lukaku to join the squad before they depart for a pre-season tour to the United States on Sunday.

The striker was on a list of forward options Mourinho gave to executive vice-chairman Ed Woodward before the end of last season.

It had been thought Lukaku would return to his former club Chelsea, who he joined from Anderlecht in 2011.

The striker was sold

to Everton for £28m by Mourinho during the Portuguese manager's second spell in charge of Chelsea in 2014.

Lukaku is a client of agent Mino Raiola, who also looks after Paul Pogba, Zlatan Ibrahimovic and Henrikh Mkhitaryan - three players all signed by United last summer.

The Belgian turned down the most lucrative contract offer in Everton's history in March and later said: "I don't want to stay at the same level. I want to improve and I know where I want to do that."

Alex Lacazette joins Arsenal for club record £46.5m from Lyon

Arsenal have completed the signing of France striker Alexandre Lacazette from Lyon for a club record £46.5m fee on a five-year deal.

The fee - up to £52.6m with add-ons - will surpass the £42.4m Arsenal paid Real Madrid for Mesut Ozil in 2013.

"Arsenal are the club that plays the best football in England so I really wanted to come here," said Lacazette (pictured, right).

The 26-year-old is expected to travel with the squad this weekend for two friendly matches in Sydney next week.

Those games will be followed by a match against Bayern Munich in Shanghai the following week.

The player added: "Throughout my childhood and thanks to Arsenal's former striker Thierry Henry and other French players, I always dreamed of playing for



this club so that dream has been fulfilled.

"I like clubs with a history and the fact that the manager has been here for a while shows that it is a stable club. There are quite a few French players at the club which will make it easy to settle in."

Lacazette, who has won 11 caps for France, was the second-highest scorer in Ligue 1 last season with 28 goals. He netted 129 goals in 275 matches in all competitions for Lyon after breaking into the first team in the 2009-10

campaign.

His league tally last season was bettered by only Paris St-Germain's Edinson Cavani, with 35.

Manager Arsene Wenger said: "We are very happy to have Alexandre join our group. He has shown over a number of years that he can score goals and that he is a very efficient finisher.

"He has very interesting technical qualities and a strong character. So he is a guy who is a great addition for us, and someone who will help us challenge at

the top level this season."

Lacazette has been linked with several top clubs and looked set to join Atletico Madrid before their transfer ban was upheld by the Court

of Arbitration for Sport.

Last week Arsenal chief executive Ivan Gazidis promised fans "top-quality" summer signings during a question-and-answer

session.

Left-back Sead Kolasinac, who joined from Schalke, is Arsenal's other recruit since the end of last season.
