We'll keep UK in single market, pledges Corbyn

- Party Conference: Labour "now the political mainstream"
- Tories blasted for "self-interested Brexit bungling"

Jeremy Corbyn has signalled a major shift in Labour's Brexit policy as he said his party would guarantee the UK "unimpeded" access to the European Single Market.

Mr Corbyn used his keynote speech at the party's annual conference in Brighton on Wednesday to claim that his Labour was "now the political mainstream" as he urged Theresa May to call another general election.

He admitted that Labour had fallen short of victory on June 8 but stressed that the party was "on the threshold of power" and its election campaign machine remained "primed and ready to roll".

The Labour leader launched a savage attack on Mrs May's negotiations with Brussels as he accused the Tories of "self-interested Brexit bungling" and set out his own pitch to be prime minister.

Mr Corbyn was given a rapturous reception by a packed conference hall when he took to the stage and the

pauses throughout his speech were filled with sustained applause and standing ovations from activists.

The address lacked the raft of new policy announcements traditionally associated with a conference speech by a party leader, coming as it did so soon after the last election.

But his intervention on Brexit marked a significant development in Labour's withdrawal policy as he said the party would not give

a "green light" to Tory "recklessness" on the issue.

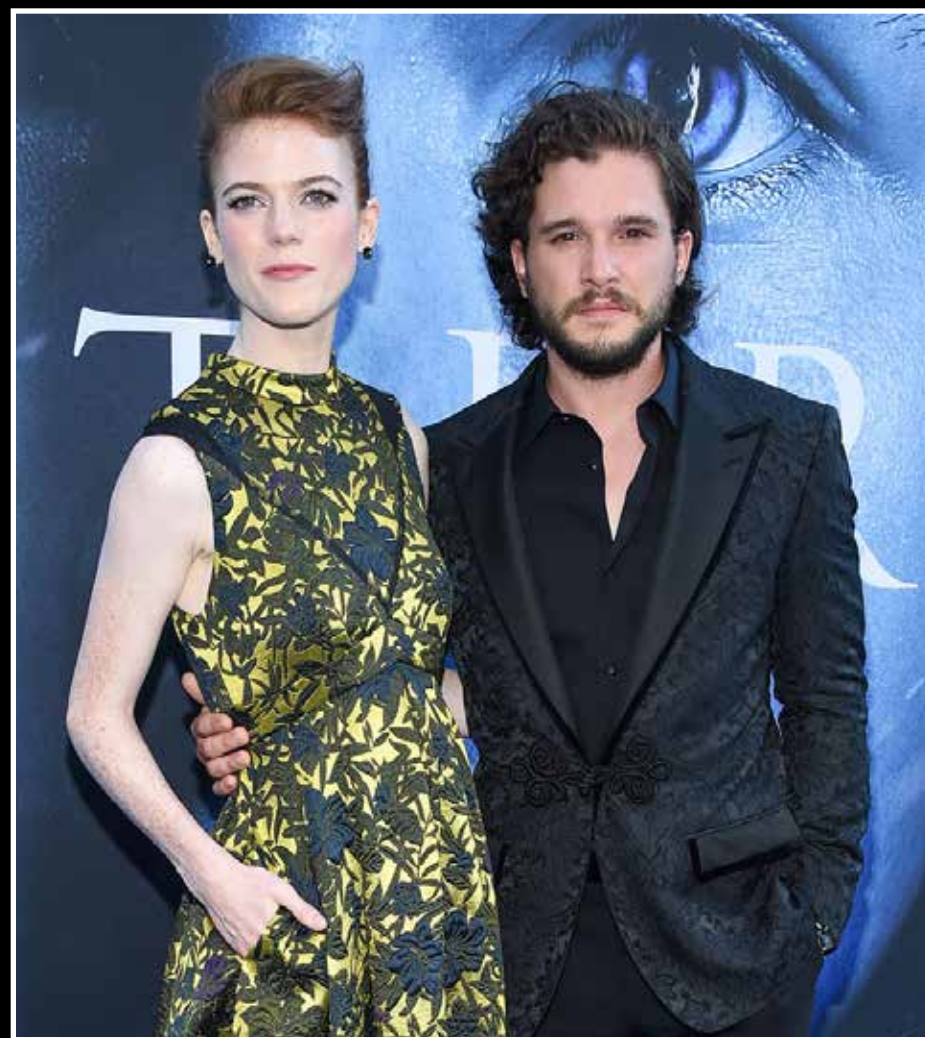
"Conference, the real divide over Brexit could not be clearer," he said.

"A shambolic Tory Brexit driving down standards or a Labour Brexit that puts jobs first, a Brexit for the many, one that guarantees unimpeded access to the Single Market and establishes a new co-operative relationship with the EU."

Emboldened 'Red Len' vows to defeat 'whingers and traitors'

JEREMY Corbyn's surprising performance in this year's general election has emboldened many on the left in Britain, bringing with it the spectre of a resurgent union movement.

The turmoil surrounding Brexit and what appears to be a generational realignment in British politics may also usher in a new era of union militancy, according to some reports, - fears which were stoked this week by union boss Len McCluskey -swiftly dubbed 'Red Len' by more than one British newspaper - who claimed at the Brighton Labour Party

clear how Mr Corbyn would deliver on such an unequivocal guarantee. Mr Corbyn also claimed that the "real centre of gravity of British politics" had shifted and Labour was "now the political mainstream".

He admitted that the party "didn't do quite well enough" at the last general election but that Labour's message to voters "could not be clearer".

"We have become a Government-in-waiting," he said.

Conference that Corbyn was the real winner of the general election and that his party stood on the brink of power.

The hard-Left Unite general secretary declared the campaign a "triumph" and angrily vowed to defend the Labour leader against coup attempts by "whingers and traitors". He courted ridicule with his claims of victory when the Conservatives won the most seats, although they lost their Commons overall majority.

Mr McCluskey hailed Labour's manifesto for helping to win the party's highest vote this century with its pledge of state investment and renationalization of key

industries. He told the Brighton conference: "Election 2017 was a huge advance for socialist policies. To those merchants of doom, the whingers and the whiners who said we should have done better, we didn't win, I say: We did win."

He added: "Now we are on the threshold of power. In my 47 years in our party I've never looked forward to a Labour government like I'm looking forward to this one." And he wooed activists by adapting a phrase from the party's Red Flag anthem. He yelled: "Let's make it clear today: Though cowards flinch and traitors sneer, we'll keep the Corbyn flag flying here."

Measles eradicated in UK

MEASLES has been stamped out in Britain, the World Health Organization has revealed.

The deadly childhood disease has been eradicated thanks largely to the NHS meeting its targets of 95 per cent of all children getting their first dose of the measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine by their fifth birthday. Elimination of measles or rubella can be verified only once a country has

sustained "interruption of endemic transmission" for at least 36 months.

The UK achieved elimination status for rubella in 2015 with only two confirmed cases of rubella in the UK last year. Dr Mary Ramsay, head of immunisation at Public Health England, said: "We are delighted that the WHO has confirmed that the UK achieved measles elimination in 2016 and that rubella elimination continues to be sustained."

Davis: no excuses for Brexit delay

EU NEGOTIATORS now have "no excuses" for continuing to block a Brexit deal with Britain, David Davis declared this week.

The EU Exit Secretary raised the stakes in the stand-off as the fourth round of talks on the UK's departure kicked off in Brussels on Monday. Mr Davis insisted that the time had come to accelerate progress on agreeing a trade partnership. He told EU chief negotiator Michel Barnier that Britain's detailed offer for a phased exit over two years - set out by Theresa May in Florence last week - should end the deadlock.

Mr Davis said: "We are laying out concrete proposals and there are no excuses for standing in the way of progress."

"We expect this to be a busy week, one that will set us on the important path towards our future partnership," Mr Davis said at a joint news conference with Mr Barnier in Brussels.

"The Prime Minister's speech on Friday set out clearly the leadership and flexibility needed to make a success of these negotiations. This round, for me, will be about

building on the technical work done in previous rounds and the concrete proposals provided by the speech."

And Foreign Secretary Boris Johnson struck a positive note after meeting his Czech counterpart Lubomir Zaoralek in Prague, saying of a potential deal with the EU: "We can do it comfortably in two years."

commitments

Both Mr Davis and Mr Barnier said the issues of settlement rights for EU citizens, the Northern Ireland border and the multi-billion pound divorce bill were the key stumbling blocks to be addressed this week. Britain has offered a payment of about £20 billion to meet the country's commitments under the current seven-year Brussels budget, but the EU is understood to be demanding at least twice as much.

Mr Davis said: "On the financial settlement, as part of a smooth and orderly exit, we do not want our EU partners to worry that they will need to pay more or receive less over the remainder of the current budget plan as a result of our

decision to leave.

"The UK will honour commitments we have made during the period of our membership. "But it's obvious that reaching a conclusion on this issue can only be done in the context of and in accordance with our new deep and special partnership with the EU."

He added: "On citizens' rights we will incorporate the agreement fully into UK law and take steps to ensure consistent interpretation. We both want to avoid changes to the way citizens enjoy their rights and our proposals will deliver that."

'moment of clarity'

"On Northern Ireland and Ireland we made good progress at the last round, with a common desire to maintain the Common Travel Area and to protect the Good Friday Agreement."

Mr Barnier repeated his warning that time was running down in the negotiations, with Britain's exit from the EU scheduled for March 29 2019. He said: "We are getting closer to the UK's withdrawal and I think that this moment should be a moment of clarity."

Tributes flow for Corrie stalwart Liz Dawn

CORONATION Street stars past and present this week paid tribute to veteran actress Liz Dawn, who has died aged 77.

Liz played feisty Vera Duckworth in the long-running ITV soap for 34 years and was hailed a "true Coronation Street legend".

Her character first appeared in the show in 1974 and she was best known for her fiery marriage to Jack, played by the late Bill Tarmey, with the pair becoming one of the most recognisable soap double acts.

In recent years, Liz had battled the lung condition emphysema and was rushed to hospital earlier this month with chronic breathing problems.

A former heavy smoker, she was released from hospital but died at home on Monday night. She was surrounded by her family, husband Don Ibbetson and children Graham, 56, Elizabeth, 49, Ann-Marie, 48, and Julie, 46.

The tributes were led by fellow Street legend Bill Roache, who has played Ken Barlow since the show's first episode in 1960. He said: "Liz Dawn was one of the most beautiful human beings I've ever met. "She was kind. The first to help anybody in trouble. "She was an absolute joy. A very loving and lovable person. And even though she's been out of the Street for quite

a few years, there's this sense of loss that she's gone.

"She was a consummate professional and her comedy timing was brilliant."

Kym Marsh, who plays Michelle Connor, tweeted: "I'm so sad. What a wonderful lady. She will be so missed."

Antony Cotton, who plays Sean Tully, said he was "devastated". He added: "Liz was a wonderful actress, a fascinating storyteller, a hilarious comedian and a brilliant friend."

"For many people of my generation, Jack and Vera WERE Coronation Street."

Kevin Kennedy, who played Curly Watts for two decades, said: "When I think about Liz, I always have a smile on my face. She was brilliant and very humble. She was the one you could go to for advice."

Harry and Meghan go public in Toronto

BESOTTED Prince Harry and his girlfriend Meghan Markle made their first public appearance as a couple this week. Hand in hand, the loved-up pair attended an Invictus Games tennis match in Toronto as speculation mounts about a Royal engagement.

The couple, who have been dating for just over a year, sat huddled up, taking every chance to look into each other's eyes, whispering and laughing. Their show of togetherness comes after Harry, 33, and Meghan, 36, both attended the event's opening ceremony on Saturday night – but sat apart. US actress Meghan appeared relaxed in ripped jeans, a white shirt and dark sunglasses. The Prince wore a polo shirt promoting the Invictus Games – a Paralympic-style sporting event for wounded and injured service personnel and veterans.

Harry put a protective arm around his girlfriend as he guided her to the seats in what was a major milestone for them. With many predicting an engagement within months, Meghan appeared to enjoy her first public outing with

the Prince, talking to children and applauding throughout the Australia versus New Zealand match.

Earlier this month, the star of US TV show *Suits* told how they are "two people who are really happy and in love". She added: "There will be a time when we will have to come forward and present ourselves and have stories to tell, but I hope what people will understand is that this is our time. This is for us. It's part of what makes it so special, that it's just ours. But we're happy. Personally, I love a great love story."

Meghan sat next to close friend Markus Anderson at Saturday

night's event. Harry took up his place next to US First Lady Melania Trump. Speculation that the couple would attend the tennis match together started to grow after the Prince's private secretary, Ed Lane Fox, was seen setting up two fold-up chairs. The Prince earlier gave a speech hailing servicemen and women as "role models for society".

He told delegates at a health research conference that competitors had said to him the Games were "not only changing lives, but saving lives". Speaking at the Canadian Institute for Military and Veteran Health Research forum,

he said: "For the competitors, we know that the journey to the Invictus Games is often not an easy one. "We are dangling a carrot of sporting glory to help reignite qualities which have been worn down by months and often years of fighting – fighting to find purpose, fighting to reconnect with family, fighting to get fit again, fighting to leave the house and in some cases fighting to stay alive."

"Sport, of course, is not the only answer, but it is a hugely powerful tool. Competitors, friends and their families told us that the Games were not only changing lives, but saving lives."

Till Death Us Do Part star Booth dies at 85

■ Lifelong Labour supporter was father of Cherie Blair

TRIBUTES flooded in this week for Tony Booth, the actor who played Mike in the Sixties sitcom *Till Death Us Do Part*.

The 85-year-old father of Tony Blair's wife Cherie died on Monday following a long battle with Alzheimer's. Close family including his fourth wife, Stephanie Buckley, were at his bedside.

Booth's daughter Lauren tweeted: "The man who taught me to read and above all to fight for what I believe in. God give you peace, Dad." Former Brookside star John McArdle wrote: "My much loved friend Tony Booth passed away today, a lovely actor and a great bloke."

Booth's acting career spanned 40 years and saw him appear in hit shows such as *Coronation Street* and *The Bill*. He was also a political campaigner, joining the Labour party when he was 15. His role

as the "Scouse git" son-in-law of Alf Garnett reflected his real-life views. When his son-in-law Blair became Prime Minister in 1997 he found a new platform.

Born in Liverpool in 1931, Booth had eight daughters. He married actress Gale Howard in 1952 and had daughters Lynsey and Cherie, before leaving her for producer Julie Allan, who bore him two more girls. He had two more daughters with model Pamela Smith. His second wife Pat Phoenix, Corrie's Elsie Tanner, died from cancer a week after they wed in 1986. He married his third wife Nancy Jaeger in 1988 and they had one daughter.

Stephanie, who married Booth in 1998, said: "It is with sadness we announce the death of Antony Booth, actor and political campaigner. "Tony passed away with close family members in attendance."

US to collect social media data on all immigrants entering country

■ Privacy groups alarmed as collection activities to start October 18th
 ■ Green card holders and naturalized citizens included in data sweep

BRITONS currently going through the US visa or immigration process got a sobering reminder of the new political realities in Washington this week when the Department of Homeland Security announced it will soon begin collecting social media data from all immigrants entering the United States.

The move, which will surely give pause to some of those whose posts on Facebook, Twitter and elsewhere are critical of President Trump, is part of what agency officials call an effort to more effectively screen those coming to the country. Not surprisingly privacy advocates see it differently - as an unnecessary intrusion that would do little to protect national security.

The department will begin collecting the information on Oct. 18, the same day the Trump administration's new travel ban on citizens of seven countries and restrictions on those from two others are set to take effect.

Green card holders and naturalized citizens will also have their social media information collected, with the data becoming part of their immigration file. It was unclear whether the monitoring would take place only in the application process or could continue afterward.

The department published the new requirement in the Federal Register last week, saying it would collect "social media handles, aliases, associated identifiable information and search results," which would be included in an applicant's immigration file. It said the data would come from "publicly available information obtained from the internet, public

records, public institutions, interviewees, commercial data providers."

The data collection has alarmed privacy groups and lawyers, who expressed concerns on about how the department would use the information. Advocates say they also worry that the monitoring could suck in information on American citizens who communicate over social media with immigrants.

Faiz Shakir, the national political director for the American Civil Liberties Union, quoted in the New York Times on Thursday, said: "This collect-it-all approach is ineffective to protect national security and is one more example of the Trump administration's anti-immigrant agenda."

Efforts to collect social media information are not unique to the Trump administration. During the Obama administration, the department had begun asking visitors to voluntarily provide social

media information, and had four pilot screening programs.

Following the 2015 San Bernardino shooting many members of Congress, mainly Republicans, began urging the Department of Homeland Security to use data gleaned from visa applicants' or asylum seekers' social media accounts as part of the immigration process.

Congressional Democrats also supported the effort to collect social media data on visa applicants.

"We believe these checks, focused on possible connections to terrorist activity, should be incorporated into D.H.S.'s vetting process for visa determinations, and that this policy should be implemented as soon as possible," Democratic lawmakers said in a letter at the time.

The attackers in San Bernardino, Tashfeen Malik and her husband,

Syed Rizwan Farook, had exchanged private online messages discussing their commitment to jihad and martyrdom, law enforcement officials said. But they did not post any public messages about their plans on Facebook or other social media platforms.

Faiza Patel, co-director of the Brennan Center's Liberty and National Security Program at New York University, said although it was true that the Obama administration collected social media information, the new monitoring put in place by the Trump administration represented an escalation.

"What is different here is that it appears that they are monitoring people who are already in the United States - green card holders, for example," she said. "And there is a lack of transparency of how they are using this data, which does heighten the concerns for this group of people."

Facing jail, daughter who stole holidaying parents' life savings

■ Woman who pilfered nearly £200k told to expect custodial sentence

A WOMAN is facing jail after stealing her parents' £179,000 savings while they were on holiday.

Melissa Humphreys, 33, went on a shopping spree after being left in charge of Elizabeth and Terry Fordham's finances while they toured around Europe in a motorhome between 2006 and 2010. The retired couple's dreams were "shattered" after their daughter siphoned off their savings and "maxed out" their credit cards, a court heard. The couple had to borrow money from a relative to get back to Britain, four years after selling their home in Colchester.

Humphreys, also of Colchester, pleaded guilty to 14 charges of theft, fraud or deception at Chelmsford Crown Court.

Judge Emma Peters told her: "You have pleaded guilty to most of these offences and stolen tens of thousands of pounds from your parents, just short of £200,000.

"I don't want you to be under any doubt at all that the most immediate sentence will be one of custody." Judge Peters added: "Bail is no indication of the sentence you might receive."

An investigation was launched after Elizabeth, 70, and Terry, 79, were unable to withdraw cash. The court was told that Humphreys took the money in 2006 and 2007 after her parents retired, sold their house and bought the motor home to travel around Europe. The final amount stolen could be higher because

Humphreys, who did not live with her parents, had been siphoning off money undetected for months.

Prosecutor Barry Hargreaves told a hearing at Colchester magistrates court in July: "In 2010 things began going wrong and they couldn't get money out.

"Eventually it transpires that the accounts had no money in them. Credit cards were maxed out and they had to borrow money from a relative to get back to the UK. Their dreams have been shattered by these offences. They have been left in a dreadful financial position."

Humphreys denied a further three charges of obtaining property by deception, for which prosecutor Christopher Baxton said there will be no trial. Steven Levy, defending, called for an eight-week adjournment for a psychiatric report.

He said: "Clearly this matter was not one that was easy to assimilate because of the age of some of the offences and [the fact that] the defendant's parents went away some time ago.

"That has had a big impact on her, and her mental health."

Judge Peters added: "Given the breach of trust here and the extended period of dishonesty, the terrible fact that her victims were her parents is clearly an aggravating factor in my view."

Humphreys is due back at Chelmsford Crown Court in November for sentencing.

Lady Lucan 'died happy' after telling all

LADY Lucan died "happy" that she had given her side of the 43-year murder mystery sparked by her runaway aristocrat husband, it emerged this week.

The former society beauty, 80, found dead by police on Tuesday, gave her fullest account of the 1974 sensation just months ago. She told documentary maker Michael Waldman how her husband, Lord "Lucky" Lucan, attacked her after bludgeoning nanny Sandra Rivett to death in their home in an exclusive London street.

Mr Waldman became friendly with the reclusive widow, who was estranged from her children, after interviewing her for ITV's *Lord Lucan: My Husband, The Truth*. He said: "It took a lot to get her to talk. "But once we were under way she was happy to tell her story and, I think, was glad that her story had been told." He added: "Her death came as a sad surprise. I saw her four weeks ago in St James's Park. She was full of life and gave me a big smile."

Lady Lucan – born Veronica Duncan – was recalled as "courageous and, at times, outrageous" by the family she refused to speak to. She lived alone in Eaton Row,

Belgravia, after a rift three decades ago with children Frances, George and Camilla, now 52, 50 and 47. But the family said: "To us she was and is unforgettable.

"Although Veronica severed relations with her family in the 1980s,

all of them remember her lovingly."

The family added that she was "beautiful but also fragile and vulnerable. Veronica married the-then John Bingham, an ex-Guards officer and gambler, in 1963 and they split

in 1972. Lucan had racked up huge debts and lost custody of the children by the time of his disappearance. Hundreds of sightings were reported from all over the world but he was declared dead last year.

Game of Thrones pair to marry

URNS OUT Jon Snow really DOES know something, after all.

Following a huge amount of speculation, an official announcement has been published in the *Times* newspaper confirming that *Game of Thrones* stars Kit Harington and Rose Leslie have got engaged.

The couple met on the fantasy show in 2012, where they played on-screen lovers Jon Snow and Ygritte.

'very easy'

Leslie left the cast two years later - after being shot by Jon Snow with a bow and arrow - while Harington has become one of the show's biggest stars - appearing in all seven series of the popular TV drama.

They only made their public debut as a couple at last year's Olivier Awards.

Harington told *L'Uomo Vogue* last year it was "easy" to fall in love with

He said his best ever memory of the show were the three weeks in Iceland when they filmed the second season in 2012. "Because the country is beautiful, because the Northern Lights are magical, and because it was there that I fell in love," he said.

Leslie is currently starring in US television series *The Good Fight*.

Harington will next be seen in the BBC's drama *Gunpowder*, about the gunpowder plot, before he starts filming the next and final series of *Game of Thrones*.

Meet Nick Hardcastle, originally from 'Summer Bay' Australia who moved to LA from London five years ago to pursue the sunshine!

Was there a particular reason you chose LA?

I had been living in London for 5 years when I won the Diversity immigrant (Greencard) Lottery. I was working in commercial theatre in London's West End and everyone assumed that I would go to New York but I was desperate to get back near the beach and in the sun. So in spite of not knowing LA very well, or having any clue about what I might do, I got my Green Card sorted and packed two suitcases and left a very grim London

winter behind.

What do you miss most from home?

Well, Sawtell in New South Wales is my 'home' and there are a lot of things that I miss - but I do think of London as my spiritual home. I miss the British sensibility. I've been back to the UK an average of four times a year since I left so I have managed my withdrawals and I'm lucky to have some great British friends here to give me a fix when I need it. From London I miss black cabs, the tube, walking across Waterloo bridge, Pret-A-Manger's bacon, cheese and tomato pastries, Waitrose, PROPER pubs, the Christmas lights, electric kettles, The Groucho and being able to see an incredible show at the theatre any night of the week!

What was your first impression of LA and has it changed since?

My first visit here was in 2003. I was thinking about moving to LA, New York or London after I'd finished the next season of the TV show I was hosting at the time in Australia. I arrived and pretty much hated it. I thought it was a wasteland. I didn't know many people and I stayed most of the time down in Long Beach so my experience of coming in to Hollywood was mostly the freeway. It felt closed off to me. The city feels more culturally diverse now - it's not just a Film and TV town. The tech, fashion and business growth here has been incredible and great people from all over the States and the world have been arriving in droves which has been awesome.

What do you find the biggest difference is living here versus London?

The weather. That's easily the biggest difference. LA is on the Pacific and California has a lot of similarities in the climate and lifestyle of Australia so I've found those elements really comforting. Although LA can be really tough though - just like London, at least in LA if you're having a hard time you can get outside under the blue sky and sunshine and go for a hike up the canyon pretty much any day of the year or throw yourself in the ocean.

Do you have a hidden gem in LA that you want to share with us?

There's so many hidden gems in the city - every neighborhood has them. But get out of Weho and Hollywood occasionally and go east to find the best ones. If you haven't been to Chapman Plaza in Koreatown then you're missing out big time. I also really love the kitschy nautical themed

bar HMS Bounty around the corner in the Gaylord Apartments.

What would you suggest to others who are thinking about making the move here?

Come and spend some time here first and be sure you want to live here - not just visit. Developing and nurturing your personal and professional relationships here is so important because it can otherwise be a very isolating, fractured and lonely city due to its vast,

sprawling landscape.

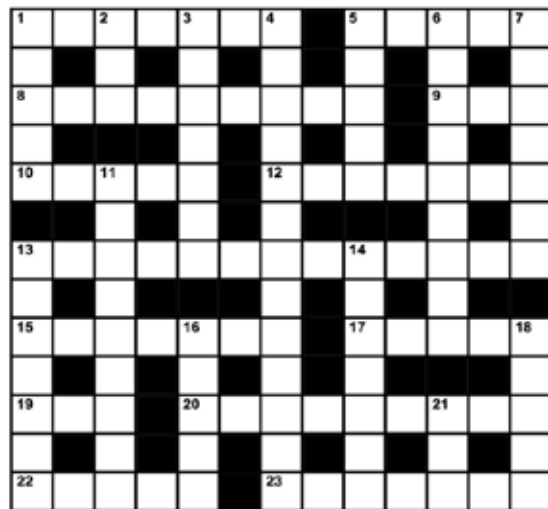

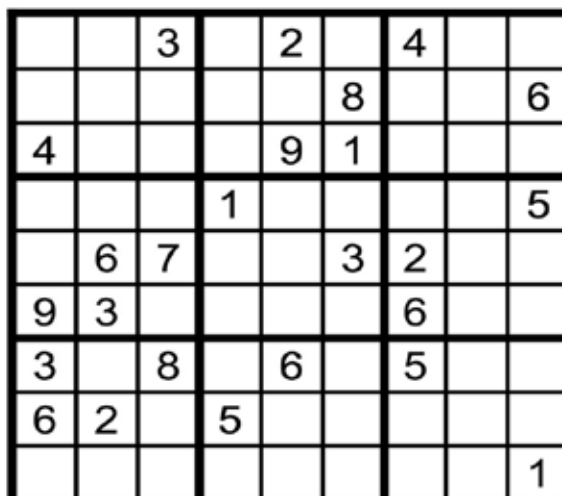

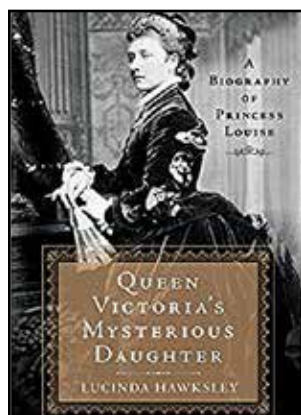

Princess Louise: clearing the mystery

Exclusive interview with author Lucinda Hawksley, discussing her new biography of Queen Victoria's scandalous artist daughter



"Princess Louise is my third biography," says *Queen Victoria's Mysterious Daughter* author Lucinda Hawksley. "The idea for writing about her grew out of writing the first two. My first was on the Pre-Raphaelite model and artist, Lizzie Siddal. When I was researching her life story, the name Princess Louise arose for the first time and I wondered who she was. At first I assumed she was a foreign princess,

as I couldn't believe an English princess would have been allowed to hang out in artists' studios and attend bohemian parties. But, on finding out more about her, I realized she was one of Queen Victoria and Prince Albert's daughters and a professional sculptor."

The book centers on about Princess Louise, who was Queen Victoria's sixth child. Her life was beset by secrets, rumors, scandals and her fight to be free of her mother's controlling ways. Louise really wanted to be an artist, not a princess. She wanted to study the art of sculptures at college which at the time was considered primarily a man's art, but Louise managed to get her mother to agree. She was the first British princess to attend a public school and also campaigned

for women's rights and health reform.

Some of Louise's friends included Josephine Butler, the British feminist and social reformer, and the novelist George Eliot, who was actually Mary Anne Evans, a poet, journalist, translator and one of the leading writers of the Victorian era. There were rumors of an affair with her sculpting tutor Joseph Edgar Boehm and Liko, husband of her sister Princess Beatrice.

When Princess Louise did eventually marry, it was to John, Marquess of Lorne, the heir to the Duke of Argyll, who was named Governor-General of Canada. Louise suffered an unhappy time in Ottawa, and returned to Britain in 1883, where she lived until her death in 1939.

Hawksley spent six

years searching through archives and letters and diaries, recording interviews with people who had family connections or memories and traveled in the UK and to the U.S. and Canada.

"While writing the book, I was lucky enough to be permitted a summer residency as a Fellow of the Newberry Library in Chicago," says Hawksley. "So, I was able to research there too. I also visited historic houses all over Britain, including Windsor Castle, Kensington Palace, Osborne House and Inveraray Castle, and I drove around the UK to discover many of the places she lived in and visited, including her honeymoon cottage on the Isle of Mull, in Scotland."

Louise's previous (second) biography was

about the portrait painter Katey Perugini, the artist daughter of Charles Dickens. Katey knew a lot of the same people as Lizzie Siddal, including Princess Louise. Other books by Hawksley include, *The Writer Abroad, Bitten by Witch Fever, Charles Dickens and his Circle, Moustaches, Whiskers & Beards, March, Women, March, and What Makes Great Art. Queen Victoria's Mysterious Daughter* has yet to be optioned for film or TV.

Hawksley's next book, *Dickens and Christmas*, is being published by Pen and Sword books, available in the U.S and UK in November 2017. She is currently updating her biography of the portrait painter Katey Perugini (née Dickens), re-releasing in 2018.

Hawksley lives in London. She will be appearing at the

Dickens on the Strand festival in Galveston, Texas from December 1-3. A great-great-granddaughter of Charles and Catherine Dickens, this will be her ninth year at the festival.

A place in the Cotswolds: Posh and Becks splash the cash on rural retreat

David and Victoria Beckham – the showbiz power couple known as 'Posh & Becks' are constructing a two-tiered rural retreat outdoor space at their new \$7.5m (£5.5m) Oxfordshire home



The pair are spending thousands building an intruder-proof fortress garden in the grounds of the mansion in south-west England, forking out plenty of cash on their orchard, which will feature 23 different types of tree.

The Beckhams will hire a team of gardeners who will spend three days a week looking after the trees, including nine apple trees, eight cherry trees, and a plum tree, which could be ideal if their celebrity chef pal Gordon Ramsay fancied popping round to cook up a crumble....

England brawlers set to lose tour places

Ben Stokes and Alex Hales will not be considered by England for international cricket until further notice after they were involved in an incident near a Bristol nightclub.

Stokes, 26, was arrested on suspicion of causing actual bodily harm and video footage emerged which allegedly showed him in a brawl in the early hours of Monday.

On Wednesday, the Test vice-captain was named in England's squad for the Ashes tour of Australia this winter.

The all-rounder and Hales, who was with him when the incident happened, will miss Friday's final one-day international against West Indies at Ageas Bowl, Southampton.

Stokes was released without charge but remains under investigation while Hales, 28, returned voluntarily to Bristol on Tuesday to provide further evidence to police about the incident.

The England and Wales Cricket Board (ECB) announced it is investigating the pair and will not consider selecting them, after the governing body saw footage published by **The Sun** newspaper which allegedly shows Stokes throwing punches at two men.

But no timeframe has been given on their potential availability, with England due to play their first Test against Australia in Brisbane on 23 November. Hales was not named in the Ashes squad.

Kane can become best Spurs' best-ever striker, says Hoddle

Tottenham's Harry Kane can become the club's "greatest striker", says White Hart Lane legend Glenn Hoddle.

Kane scored a hat-trick Tuesday night as Spurs beat Apoel Nicosia to maintain their 100% Champions League record this season.

The England international, 24, has now scored six trebles in 2017 and 11 goals in seven games this month.

When Kane was asked about Hoddle's comments, made on BT Sport, he said: "It's great praise. I've just got to keep doing what I'm doing."

Midfielder Hoddle played 490 times for Spurs between 1975 and 1987, scoring 110 goals, before returning to the club as manager in 2001.

Kane is 14th in Tottenham's all-time list with 108 goals in 173 games, 158 behind the club's record scorer Jimmy Greaves.

Bobby Smith (208) is the only other player to score more than 200 goals for the north London club, while Martin Chivers' 174 goals between 1968 and 1976 places him third on the list.

Jermain Defoe, Teddy Sheringham and Robbie Keane are all ahead of Kane, but he has passed the totals of other big names - such as former England striker Gary Lineker and German World Cup winner Jurgen Klinsmann.

Kane made his Tottenham debut in 2011 and has scored at least 20 goals in each of the past three Premier League seasons, including 29 goals in 30 games last term.

Spurs manager Mauricio Pochettino, who joked earlier this week that he was "in love" with Kane, said after Tuesday's hat-trick that the striker has "unbelievable skills" in front of goal.

Michy Batshuayi scored a 94th-minute winner as Chelsea snatched a dramatic 2-1 victory against Atletico Madrid to maintain their 100% start in Champions League Group C on Wednesday.

Substitute Batshuayi tapped home from close range with the last kick of the game from Marcos Alonso's cross.

The Blues fell behind to a 40th-minute Antoine Griezmann penalty despite having the better of the first half when David Luiz needlessly pulled the shirt of Lucas Hernandez at a corner.

But Chelsea, who hit the post through Eden Hazard in the opening stages, again impressed after the interval and were rewarded when Alvaro Morata equalised with his fourth goal in five days.

The Spaniard deftly flicked Hazard's accurate left-wing cross into the far corner for his first Champions League goal for Chelsea.

Batshuayi's winner came after missed opportunities for Cesc Fabregas and Morata as Chelsea became the first English team to win away at Atletico and condemn them to defeat in their first European game at their new stadium.

Reds left frustrated

Liverpool boss Jurgen Klopp says his side need to be more "clinical" after the Reds were held to a frustrating 1-1 Champions League draw despite dominating Spartak Moscow in Russia.

Spartak went ahead against the run of play when Loris Karius was easily beaten by Fernando's free-kick after Philippe Coutinho's foul just outside the area.

Klopp fielded forwards Roberto Firmino, Mohamed Salah, Sadio Mane and Coutinho in the same game for the first time, and the latter two combined for Coutinho to equalise with his first Champions League goal.

Firmino, Mane and substitute Daniel Sturridge spurned good chances as Liverpool were forced to settle for a second successive draw in Group E.

"We have to be more clinical - 100%," said Klopp, whose side are two points behind group leaders Sevilla, who beat Maribor 3-0 in Spain.

"To create all those chances and only score one goal feels average. It was a crazy game.

"What can I say? We created, created and created. We tried with all we had. The effort was great."

Just what we needed, says Griffiths

Leigh Griffiths described Celtic's Champions League win at Anderlecht in midweek as the ideal way to come back from a painful loss to Paris St-Germain. "We wanted a reaction from the boys to avenge that result and tonight was the perfect reaction - a clean sheet away from

home," said the striker. "It was a great team performance."

Griffiths was on target for the first time in the group stage, with Patrick Roberts and Scott Sinclair also scoring in a 3-0 success in Brussels.

It was Celtic's first Champions League group victory since October 2013 and only their second ever victory away from home in this phase of the tournament.

The only other win on the road came five years ago against Spartak Moscow.

In nine previous group

campaigns Celtic had never kept a clean sheet on their travels.

Everton manager Ronald Koeman said his team were "afraid to play football" as they conceded a late equaliser against Apollon Limassol in the Europa League on Thursday night.

Koeman said: "The feeling is a defeat today, not even a draw. It is really disappointing. We started poorly without any confidence and making a lot of mistakes but we had a good reaction.

"The second half was much better, we controlled the game and had big chances to score a third. It is football and sometimes when you are struggling maybe we are too afraid to play football. That is difficult when your body is not full of confidence.

"I cannot say they are not running or fighting, but they are scared to play forward. A win today makes it different."

winning goal as the £10m summer signing from Hajduk Split latched on to Gylfi Sigurdsson's clever pass and converted a cool finish past Vale - his first for the club.
