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SOMBER MEMORIAL FOR GRENFELL VICTIMS

■ **Royals, politicians and showbusiness stars gather to honor 71 lost in tower block inferno**

THE MOOD at St. Paul's Cathedral was somber Thursday night, as survivors of the Grenfell Towers inferno joined members of the Royal Family and PM Theresa May at a memorial service.

Bereaved families, survivors and rescue workers were joined by the Prince of Wales, the Duchess of Cornwall, the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge and Prince Harry.

Bishop of Kensington Graham Tomlin said he hoped the tragedy would represent a "time we learnt a new, better way".

The fire, on 14 June, claimed 71 lives.

The commemoration, marking six months since the tragedy, also gave thanks to all those who assisted at the time of the fire and since - including the emergency services, recovery teams, the community, public support workers and volunteers.

Archbishop of Canterbury Justin Welby, Labour leader Jeremy Corbyn and singer Adele were also among the more than 1,500 guests.

As the memorial

began, a Green For Grenfell banner adorned with a heart was carried into the cathedral.

Opening the service ahead of a minute's silence, Dean of St Paul's Dr David Ison said: "We come together as different faiths as we remember those whose lives were lost."

'unspeakable tragedy'

"Be united in the face of suffering and sorrow," he added.

He said the UK grieved "at the unspeakable tragedy, loss and hurt of that June day".

Six months on from the Grenfell Tower fire, the grief and anger of those affected is still visibly raw.

Underneath the sadness there was dismay that many of the survivors attending the national memorial service at St Paul's Cathedral are still homeless.

And while those who

died in the fire were remembered, there was also comment on what has taken place since - and what more importantly still needs to be done.

Families held photographs of victims of the fire, while voice recordings from people at the scene of the fire were played to the congregation.

The Al-Sadiq and Al-Zahra Schools Girls' Choir then sang out the words: "Never lose hope."

Graham Tomlin, Bishop of Kensington and organiser of the memorial, told the congregation:

"Today we ask why warnings were not heeded, why a community was left feeling neglected, uncared for, not listened to."

But he said he looked ahead to the New Year with "hope" of change from "a city that didn't

listen".

He said he hoped the word "Grenfell" would change from a symbol of "sorrow, grief or injustice" to "a symbol of the time we learnt a new and better way - to listen and to love".

Before the service, Bishop Tomlin told the BBC: "There was a very strong desire within the local community to have the service here, because

faith is very important to a lot of people in the local area, and that can bring a real sense of strength to people."

'Never forget'

One of those in attendance was Tiago Alves, who escaped the blaze with his family.

He told reporters his thoughts would be with bereaved families during the "emotional"

memorial: "Today is a day not about survivors; today is purely about the bereaved, their families and the loved ones they have lost."

He said the memorial would bring back a lot of awful memories for many people, but added:

"The reason we are doing this today is so that people never forget - we want people to remember."

Adele in tears at Grenfell tribute

The superstar singer has been a hands-on supporter of the survivors' fund

Adele seemed overcome with emotion as she paid tribute to the victims of the Grenfell Tower tragedy at the moving St Paul's memorial service on Thursday.

The superstar singer had tears in her eyes as she joined more than 1,500 people at Thursday's service, including friend Carey Mulligan and the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge.

Sitting alongside survivors, emergency servicemen and women and hundreds of members of the community, Adele listened as the Bishop

of Kensington urged millions of people to reach out to support those affected.

A hands-on supporter of survivors and victims' families, the chart-topper was quick to arrive on the scene after fire ripped through the North Kensington tower block six months ago.

She helped displaced residents in the days following the tragedy and has backed a petition calling on Theresa May to build public trust in the public inquiry.

Last week she tweeted her support for a petition, which has attracted more than

10,000 signatures, calling for the appointment of individuals from a wide range of backgrounds to sit alongside Sir Martin Moore-Bick.

During her sell-out world tour over the summer, Adele asked her fans to donate to the survivors' fund.

"Usually I ask everyone to get their phone out and put their lights on. But before I do that I want you to donate," she told the audience during a London show, just days after the tragedy.

Did anyone watch the video before I came on? I've been down to

Grenfell tower."

She added: "I'm going straight back Monday after my shows," she said. "A lot of the stories

aren't mine to tell now.

"I promise any money that we raise will get to them. I am not leaving them."

Trump undermines democracy with media attacks, says Cameron

■ Former PM says US president should focus on threat from Russia rather than attacking CNN and BBC for 'fake news'

David Cameron has accused Donald Trump of undermining democracy by attacking the media, saying the true threat posed by fake news lay with Vladimir Putin, his Twitter bots and Russian efforts to use corruption as a weapon of foreign policy.

The former British prime minister also accused Russia of winning the right to stage the 2018 Fifa World Cup via corruption.

Giving his first British public lecture since his resignation in the wake of the Brexit referendum defeat in 2016, Cameron also defended multilateral

institutions such as the European Union, warning isolationism driven by anti-globalisation endangered the world's security.

Giving a lecture in London to Transparency International, he said: "Just as with all our biggest challenges – on

trade, on terrorism, on climate change, on global poverty – we need to work with other nations if we want change. We cannot do this alone."

Cameron warned that Trump's attacks on news organisations such as CNN and the BBC were not just tactically wrong but dangerous. He accused the US president of "an attempt to question the whole legitimacy of organisations that have an important role in our democracy".

Cameron said: "Let me put it like this: President Trump, 'fake news' is not broadcasters criticising you, it's Russian bots and trolls targeting your democracy pumping out untrue stories day after day, night after night.

"When you misappropriate the term 'fake news', you are deflecting attention from real abuses. Ignoring

what's happening on social media is facilitating a form of corruption that is undermining democracy."

He then directly challenged the way in which Russia won the right to stage the 2018 World Cup describing the event as a fiasco.

"President Putin actually boycotted the whole thing because he said it was riddled with corruption," Cameron said. "He was right – it was."

Adding he was putting it as diplomatically as he could, he said: "I am sure he wasn't completely surprised when Russia

actually won the bid. You couldn't make it up. In the years since, 10 of the 22 members of that Fifa executive committee were

indicted or punished."

In his lecture Cameron warned that the fight against corruption needed international cooperation and institutions to succeed.

Returning to some of the themes that lost him his premiership, he insisted: "I am not some starry-eyed Davos-devotee who thinks there is nothing wrong with globalisation. Of course we need to help those left behind economically, with better skills, more apprenticeships and higher minimum wages."

But he urged: "Don't throw the baby out with the bathwater, including market economics, institutions with rules and openness to the world. These are things that make us strong."



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TRIBUTES flowed from across the British showbiz world this week following the death of Keith Chegwin at aged 60.

The former child actor and stalwart of several BBC shows in the 1970s and 1980s, - most notably the groundbreaking The Multi Coloured Swap Shop with Noel Edmonds - had been suffering from the lung disease idiopathic pulmonary fibrosis. Chegwin passed away at his home on Monday with his family by his side.

In a statement, his family said he had endured a "long-term battle with a progressive lung condition" which "rapidly worsened towards the end of this year".

Tributes have been paid from the world of entertainment for the "true telly legend". His former wife, fellow TV presenter Maggie Philbin, whom he had met on Swap Shop, said: "It is incredibly sad. Keith was a one-off. Full of life, generous and with a focus on things that mattered - his family."

'life and soul'

"I saw him two months ago at his sister Janice's wedding, where he was still attempting to be life and soul of the party despite being on portable oxygen and made sure he knew how much he meant to us all."

"Our daughter Rose flew home from San Francisco to be with him over the last few weeks and I know he was surrounded by so much love from his second wife Maria, their son Ted, his sister Janice, his twin brother Jeff and his father Colin."

Fellow Swap Shop presenter Noel Edmonds said in a statement: "I've lost my first real telly chum and I'm certain I'm not alone in shedding tears for a true telly legend."

"The greatest achievement for any TV performer is for the

viewers to regard you as a friend and today millions will be grateful for Keith's contribution to their childhood memories and like me they will mourn the passing of a friend."

Cheggers Plays Pop

Ricky Gervais, who created the series Extras which Chegwin starred in, described him as a "national treasure".

The Liverpool-born star began his career as a child actor, starring in films such as Roman Polanski's Macbeth and TV shows including The Liver Birds, The Adventures of Black Beauty and Z-Cars. But he came to national

prominence as a cheeky Scouse youth alongside Noel Edmonds in the Saturday-morning show Multi-Coloured Swap Shop, which ran for six series from 1976 to 1982.

He was invited to join the programme after having his idea for a children's chat show turned down by the BBC. In a live broadcast, Edmonds presented a mix of cartoons, celebrity interviews and a children's phone-in to swap their toys, while Chegwin honed his interviewing style by leaving the studio to chat with the public in the Swaparama element of the show.

Within two years, he had landed his own programme, Cheggers Plays Pop (1978-86), in which two schools competed against each other. Questions about contemporary music were interspersed with physical It's a Knockout-style tasks involving balls and inflatables, plus a studio performance by a chart act.

His star waned in the late 80s and 90s before enjoying something of

a comeback in a series of reality TV shows including Celebrity Big Brother and more notoriously, Channel 5's Naked Jungle, a one-off gameshow featuring an assault course format wherein all the contestants - including Chegwin - were naked. It was part of a special season of programs on the channel to mark the 50th anniversary of British naturism.

In 2006 he was perfectly

happy to make a fool of himself on the Ricky Gervais BBC sitcom series Extras. His autobiography, Shaken But Not Stirred, was published in 1995.

Chegwin and Philbin - whom he married in 1982 - were divorced 11 years later after Chegwin fell for the family nanny, Maria Fielden, whom he married in 2000.

He is survived by Maria and their son, Ted, as well as Rose, the daughter from his first marriage.

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MPS win right to final vote on Brexit

Tory rebels leave May red-faced as coalition edges closer to collapse

THE PRIME MINISTER was left reeling this week after 11 Tory rebels joined the Opposition to defeat the government in a key vote on its Brexit bill.

In a development which has further stripped away Theresa May's fast-eroding authority, MPs voted to give Parliament a legal guarantee of a vote on the final Brexit deal struck with Brussels.

The government had argued this would jeopardise its chances of delivering a smooth departure from the EU.

Despite a last-minute attempt to offer concessions to rebels, an amendment to the bill was backed by 309 to 305 on Wednesday.

Ministers said the "minor setback" would not prevent the UK leaving the EU in 2019.

Of the Conservative MPs who voted against the government, eight are former ministers.

One of them, Stephen Hammond, was sacked as Conservative vice

chairman in the aftermath of the vote.

"Tonight I put country and constituency before party and voted with my principles to give Parliament a meaningful vote," he tweeted.

Labour leader Jeremy Corbyn said the defeat was "a humiliating loss of authority" for Mrs May on the eve of an EU summit where leaders will discuss Brexit.

It's the first time that Theresa May has been defeated on her own business in the Commons and underlines just how divided her party is on the biggest issue facing Britain for several generations.

The defeat came after opposition parties joined forces with Conservative rebels during a heated debate in the Chamber on the amendment.

Critics accused those behind the amendment - which was authored by former attorney general Dominic Grieve and

championed by other pro-Remain campaigners

- of trying to "frustrate" Brexit and tying the government's hands.

After the result was announced, one of the rebels, former cabinet minister Nicky Morgan, tweeted: "Tonight Parliament took control of the EU Withdrawal

process."

But other Conservative MPs reacted angrily, with one, Nadine Dorries, saying the rebels should be deselected.

Dorries, Tory MP for Mid-Bedfordshire, wrote: "Tonight, the Tory rebels have put a spring in Labour's step, given them a taste of winning,

guaranteed the party a weekend of bad press, undermined the PM and devalued her impact in Brussels.

"They should be deselected and never allowed to stand as a Tory MP, ever again."

The Tory rebels were Mr Grieve, Heidi Allen, Ken Clarke, Jonathan

Djanogly, Stephen Hammond, Sir Oliver Heald, Nicky Morgan, Bob Neill, Antoinette Sandbach, Anna Soubry and Sarah Wollaston.

Another Conservative MP, John Stevenson, abstained by voting in both lobbies.

Two Labour MPs, Frank Field and Kate Hoey, voted with the government.

The UK is due to leave the EU in March 2019, and negotiations are taking place on what their relationship will be like in the future, and the EU Withdrawal Bill is a key part of the government's exit strategy.

Its effects include ending the supremacy of EU law and copying existing EU law into UK law, so that the same rules and regulations apply on Brexit day.

MPs have been making hundreds of attempts to change its wording - but this is the first time one has succeeded.

Jail for terror couple who plotted UK killing spree

A JIHADI husband-to-be who vowed to slaughter innocent people as a wedding gift to his bride was jailed for 16 years on Monday.

Ummar Mirza, 21, told his intended Madiyah Taheer to hand over a list of people she wanted him to stab to death.

Blood-thirsty Taheer, also 21, promised Mirza she would join in the plot.

She fantasised about beheading leading English TV personality and newspaper columnist Katie Hopkins and named the writer on her death list.

The fanatical couple, from Birmingham, even practised on a lifesize training dummy slashing its throat, abdomen and

forehead.

Photographs also emerged of each of them posing with guns. Searches of Mirza and Taheer's home after their arrest also discovered a training knife and a steel hunting blade attached to a cord so it could be concealed under clothing and body armour, the court heard.

In one message Taheer told Mirza: "Can we get married? I want you to kill for me. I have a list."

He replied: "The day of the nikah [marriage] I'll kill them all. Give me the list.

"The only thing that stops me is we are not married."

Mirza admitted preparing terrorist

acts and two counts of possessing information useful to a terrorist.

Detectives discovered how he researched potential targets including a Birmingham military base on his phone.

Taheer denied any involvement but was found guilty of the preparation of terrorist acts at London's Woolwich Crown Court in October.

Judge Christopher Kinch jailed Mirza for 16 years and Taheer for 10.

Mirza's sister Zainub, 24, of Birmingham, was jailed for 30 months after she admitted sharing Islamic State propaganda with the couple. She sent him a number of

videos, including some that showed IS militants beheading hostages, the court heard.

Another featured "American spies" having their throats slit before being hanged upside

down from meat hooks in what appeared to be an abattoir.

Handing down the sentences, Judge Kinch said: "There is an inexorable move from interest and enthusiasm

through research and studying to training, sourcing and acquiring equipment to obtaining targets for action.

The harm which might have caused is undoubtedly high."

SNP hikes tax on high earners

The Scottish government has announced income tax changes that will see higher earners pay more than elsewhere in the UK - and lower earners pay less.

The country's finance secretary, Derek Mackay, announced a new tax band of 21p for those earning more than £24,000 on Thursday.

The higher rate of tax will be increased from 40p to 41p and the top rate from 45p to 46p.

But a starter rate of 19p in the pound will also be introduced, Mr Mackay confirmed in his draft budget.

Mr Mackay said the move to a five-band income tax system will mean no one earning less than £33,000 in Scotland will pay more tax they do now.

And he told the Scottish Parliament that those earning above that figure would only pay a "proportionate amount more" than they currently do.

His figures showed that 55% of Scottish taxpayers will pay less compared to south of the border under the new system - with 45% of people paying more.

Someone in Scotland earning £150,000 will pay £1,774 more than if they lived elsewhere in the UK, with someone earning £40,000 paying £140 more.

Accountancy body ICAS calculated that, of the 2.2 million basic rate taxpayers in Scotland, 1.4 million will be marginally better off than those in the rest of the UK whereas the remaining 800,000 will have a slightly increased tax bill.

All 346,000 higher and 20,000 additional rate taxpayers will pay more.

'Inspirational' Meghan Markle and Prince Harry love praised by Archbishop of Canterbury

PRINCE Harry and Meghan Markle's divine love affair got the blessing of the Archbishop of Canterbury.

Justin Welby said the couple's obvious love for each other and "profound sense of commitment" provided a "model" for the nation.

The couple's wedding next year will be "no tick-box exercise", he added.

Speaking on BBC Radio 4's Today programme, Dr Welby said: "I am very, very sure after conversations that this is no tick-box exercise, 'we ought to get married in a church'."

Dr Welby has already given his approval for divorcee Miss Markle to marry Harry in a church.

Justin Welby said the couple's obvious love for each other provided a 'model' for the nation.

The couple are due to

tie the knot at St George's Chapel, Windsor Castle, in May.

Dr Welby continued: "There is a profound sense of commitment, of seriousness, both about faith and their lives together, which is quite inspirational.

"It's important because people look at it and see a model of how two people commit their lives to one another before God in the presence of millions of people.

He refused to confirm whether he would be conducting the ceremony.

But he made it clear he was at their disposal, saying "I think that's up to them."

He revealed he was looking forward to the big event, saying it would be "fun".

The Prince and Miss Markle, who divorced her first husband film

producer Trevor Engelson in 2013, will marry at St George's Chapel in the grounds of Windsor Castle because it is a place "close to the couple".

The Church of England agreed in 2002 that people could remarry in church

under strict conditions.

Divorcees are asked questions to ensure their previous marriage has been fully resolved and "past hurts" are healed.

The last time a senior royal wanted to marry an American divorcee, it sparked a constitutional

crisis.

Edward VIII - Prince Harry's great-great-uncle - had to abdicate in 1936 to wed American socialite Wallis Simpson.

But members of the Royal Family are no longer barred from marrying divorcees.

Manchester Panto 'too smutty' for children, complain parents

A mum has called for a "lewd and offensive" pantomime starring the Krankies, and former Doctor Who star John Barrowman, to be axed.

Natalie Wood has made an official complaint about Dick Whittington at Manchester Opera House, saying it was "too smutty" for children.

During the show, she said, Barrowman fondled co-star Janette Krankie's breasts, and also invited audience members to chant "Alice loves Dick".

The venue said no offence was intended.

Ms Wood, who attended the show with 10 family members - including six children aged three to 12 - told the BBC the show crossed the line from innuendo to "raw" vulgarity.

Among the moments she took issue with was one where Wee Jimmy

Krankie, played by Janette Krankie, poked her finger out of her trousers, emulating a penis.

"The main issue for us was the actual fondling of Jimmy Krankie's breasts and all the different cheap smutty jokes," she said.

"Normally we share the jokes from the show afterwards - these kind of jokes you would have to discourage the children from repeating and or acting out," she said.

A local primary school teacher, who wants to remain anonymous, told the BBC she was also concerned about the play after seeing it with her class.

'Really rude'

"I've seen a lot of pantos in my time but this was a step too far - all the staff agreed it was wholly

inappropriate," she said. "I felt really uncomfortable watching it with my class."

"They were all gasping and saying 'this is really rude'."

In her letter to the theatre, Ms Wood said her children had copied some of the jokes in the show.

"My children were repeating Alice loves Dick and sticking their fingers out of their trousers for a pretend penis throughout the evening."

"This is not acceptable and my children required far too much explaining about adult humour for a family show."

Promoters Qdos Entertainment said: "In-keeping with the tradition of pantomime, the script does make use of double entendre and part of that is a play

on the names of the characters.

"None of the humour within the show is intended to cause offence of any kind."

Pantomime authority Roy Hudd, who has starred, written or directed in more than 50 festive productions,

said there was a place for innuendo but they "should not be aimed at the children".

"You cannot do rude jokes, my yardstick for writing gags is Laurel and Hardy or Dad's Army who made adults and children laugh," he said.

What do you miss most from home?



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Is love story in the stars for Jedi's Boyega and Nyong'o?



The Middlesex left-hander, playing in his eighth Test, was watched by his parents and embraced by his mother as he left the field.

"To do it front of them, after the sacrifices they have made to get me here, is great. It's nice to repay them," he added.

With England 2-0 down in the series, their hold on the Ashes looked in

huge danger when they slipped to 131-4 after winning the toss.

But Malan added a 238-run stand of 174 with Jonny Bairstow, who notched an impressive century of his own.

The tourists' encouraging day comes after a weekend when Ben Duckett was suspended from the rest England Lions' tour games for pouring a drink over James Anderson, the

Chelsea and Barca to go at it again

CHAMPIONS LEAGUE LAST 16 DRAW

Chelsea have been drawn against Barcelona in the last 16 of the Champions League, while Tottenham will face Italian champions Juventus.

Premier League leaders Manchester City will play Switzerland's Basel, Manchester United face La Liga side Sevilla and Liverpool take on Portugal's Porto.

Holders Real Madrid will face Paris St-Germain.

A record five English teams progressed from the group stage this season.

Chelsea were the only English team to make it through as runners-up, with the other four sides all topping their respective groups.

The Blues have arguably been handed the most difficult tie, and it comes days after boss Antonio Conte conceded that their Premier League title defence was over following their defeat by West Ham, which left them 14 points adrift of Manchester City.

However, Chelsea did beat Barcelona in the semi-finals before lifting the Champions League trophy in 2012.

Real Madrid, who are aiming for a 13th title and third in a row, were given a tough draw against big-spending PSG after finishing behind Tottenham in Group H.

The group winners will be away in the round of 16 first legs on 13/14 and 20/21 February, and at home in the return matches on 6/7 and 13/14 March.

The final will take place in Kiev on 26 May.

Toon sale inches closer as financier Staveley ups bid for club to £300m

Newcastle's owner Mike Ashley and British businesswoman Amanda Staveley have met for the first time to discuss the sale of the Premier League club.

The duo met in an Indian restaurant in London last week after the investment firm run by Staveley - PCP Capital Partners - made a fresh offer of around £300m.

Newcastle are yet to comment, but they have not denied the meeting took place.

Ashley said in October he wanted to sell after 10 years in charge.

The businessman has been in America but is now back in England as talks continue between the two parties.

Any deal would need Premier League approval, which takes 30 days.

Staveley helped broker the purchase of Manchester City by Sheikh Mansour in 2009 and it was reported she led Dubai International Capital's £400m bid for Liverpool in 2008.

Ashley, 53, has been a divisive figure at St James' Park, with some supporters regularly

protesting about the way the businessman has run the club.

He bought Newcastle for £134.4m in 2007. Their latest accounts - up to 30 June 2016 and before the club's relegation to the Championship - showed a profit of £900,000 and turnover of £126m in 2015-16.

And a return to European football should be the minimum of the club's ambitions, according to Magpies legend Alan Shearer.

The Premier League's record goal scorer said this week: "Newcastle is a huge football club - 52,500 turning up every other week and it was the same crowd even when they were in the Championship; not many clubs will be able to beat that."

"The current owner doesn't want to be there so sooner the better the takeover happens for everyone. Rafa needs investment in that team; I thought it was going to be a long, hard season anyway but he needs new players in January and for that to happen there needs to be investment."

Salah 'becoming a boss', says Drogba

Newly crowned BBC African Footballer of the Year Mohamed Salah is growing into a real leader, says former Ivory Coast captain Didier Drogba.

Drogba, who won the BBC award in 2009, says Salah has improved since the two were team-mates at Chelsea in 2014.

"He's becoming a boss and a leader - we've seen it in the national team and seen it at Liverpool," he said.

"I can tell by his celebrations that he

knows what he's doing now, he's not going crazy but just sticking his tongue out to say, 'yeah it's me'.

Drogba believes Salah's qualities will be key for Egypt at next year's World Cup in Russia.

"He can bring a lot of his leadership and his experience, that he is learning at Liverpool and with the national team [to the team in Russia]," he said.

"You know for him playing in a lot of big competitions will help

him to be among the best players in Europe and during the World Cup.

"Mo Salah on his own cannot win the World Cup but if all his teammates are at the level the continent expects them to be, then Mo Salah can be a fantastic player and be one of the stars in this competition."

Drogba, who is now part-owner and player at Phoenix Rising in the second tier of professional football in the USA, has been impressed with the 25-year-old's

development in recent years.

"He's unpredictable he can dribble past you easily and he has got stronger and he can score goals," Drogba added.

"There was time when he was texting me: 'I don't score, I don't know why.' I said: 'It is just a matter of time and confidence.'

"When you have the confidence, everything can happen and you can see now that he is scoring goals."

"I saw how he

improved through the years. He had to go to Italy to perform and then come back to England show that he is the player we always believed he was."

"What he has done with the national team as well being able to qualify the country in a very difficult game I think he deserves it."

Salah clinched the BBC award in a public vote ahead of Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang, Sadio Mane, Victor Moses and Naby Keita.

Another impressive point leaves spoiler Moyes smiling

West Ham manager David Moyes said he is "really enjoying" life with the Hammers after his side earned a valuable point in their fight against relegation by holding Arsenal 0-0 in midweek.

The Gunners are without a Premier League win in three games and are now down to seventh in the table as West Ham continued their revival under new manager Moyes.

They followed up Saturday's win over champions Chelsea by holding Arsene Wenger's side at London Stadium.

"There's a good spirit at the moment, they're all at it together," said Moyes, whose side remain in the relegation places but are level on points with Crystal Palace and West Brom, who are above the drop zone on goal difference.

"I want them to be more robust and we're still a bit easy to play against. We're trying to improve that and we want to make our football better."

"There's a lot to improve but the first thing was to stop conceding goals. I'm really enjoying it here."

Arsenal's Nigeria

forward Alex Iwobi struck the outside of Adrian's post as Wenger's side failed to score in the Premier League for the first time in three months.

West Ham also hit the woodwork in the closing stages through substitute Javier Hernandez after the Gunners failed to clear.

Arsenal could have climbed to fourth with a win, but the draw leaves them a point behind Tottenham, who are in the final Champions League place.

"There's always concern about the table as we are here to win games," said Wenger.

"We had so much of the ball, but it was very frustrating because we could even have lost it at the end."

This is the first time the Gunners have gone three league games without a win since April.

The statistics demonstrate that Wenger's side predictably dominated possession but they did not create enough chances as France forward Giroud, starting in place of leading scorer Alexandre Lacazette, failed to mark his first league start of the season with a goal.

Wenger named three

academy graduates in his starting line-up - Jack Wilshere, who was making his first league start for the club since 15 May 2016, Iwobi and Ainsley Maitland-Niles.

Yet Arsenal, who are closer in terms of points to the bottom of the table than they are the top, lacked the quality, composure and ideas to unlock the second worst defence in the Premier League.

The Gunners managed just three shots on target despite enjoying 70% possession - including Sanchez forcing Adrian into a full-stretch save from a free-kick - but, in truth, West Ham were rarely troubled.

Wilshere blazed another good opening over as Arsenal failed to find a solution to their poor away form.

Wenger's side have won just two of their nine top-flight games away from the Emirates this season, with eight different clubs earning more points away from home in the league than Arsenal.

It will therefore perhaps be a relief to the Frenchman that Arsenal's next three games are all at home.

Key man Toby crooked until February, Poch confirms

Tottenham defender Toby Alderweireld will be out until February with a hamstring injury, manager Mauricio Pochettino has confirmed.

The Belgium centre-back, 28, has not played since limping off with the problem in the 3-1 win over Real Madrid in the Champions League on 1 November.

In that time, Spurs have only won twice in six Premier League games.

Alderweireld has been among the league's best defenders over the

past two seasons and without his presence at the back the Spurs defence has not looked quite so impregnable. But Pochettino is adamant he will not rush the player's recovery.

"We cannot change the reality. The reality is he is injured and cannot play until February," said Pochettino.

Spurs have 10 matches in all competitions between now and February, including Premier League meetings with both Manchester

City and Manchester United.

The next north London derby of the season is on 10 February at Wembley, with the Champions League last-16 first leg against Juventus three days later.

"You miss the players who are not fit but football is a collective sport about the team, not individuals," Pochettino added.

"Some players have more influence on the team. But we have squad enough and players who can play."

City are winning the Barca way, says Pep

Manchester City boss Pep Guardiola said his side are proving playing in the same style as Barcelona can work in England after they won for a Premier League record 14th successive game.

City went 11 points clear at the top after Nicolas Otamendi's winner secured a 2-1 win at Manchester United at the weekend.

"People said we couldn't play the way we did in Barcelona in England," said Guardiola, 46, who won three La Liga titles in four years at the Camp Nou.

"But it is possible and we did it."

Guardiola also won two Champions League titles and two Copa del Reys while in charge of Barcelona between 2008-2012.

But City finished third in the table, 15 points behind champions Chelsea, in Guardiola's first season in charge

as the Spaniard tried to implement the same possession-based philosophy that served him so well at Barcelona.

However after a summer recruiting players who fit Guardiola's template and a year of working under his methods, City are now well placed to win their first league title since 2013-14.

Their relentless winning run has included a commanding 1-0 win away at reigning champions Chelsea as well as Sunday's victory at Old Trafford.

"The personality to play here is what I want," added Guardiola after a fourth successive 2-1 win in the top flight.

"We can play this way in England. I knew that last season.

"Always I believed we could do it. Everyone can play how they want, that's why football is so beautiful.

"I'm happy to go to Stamford Bridge and


11-point advantage.
