# British teen planned 'new Columbine' massacre

■ Michael Piggin, 18, 'planned to bomb a school, a mosque and a court'

FROM HIS swastika-adorned bedroom in a quiet Leicestershire town, a Neo-Nazi schoolboy plotted a 'new Columbine massacre', a London jury heard this week.

Michael Piggin, 18, stockpiled homemade bombs, a terrorist manual and an array of weapons as he planned attacks on targets including his former school and the college where he was studying for his A-levels, the Old Bailey was told.

The court heard that police found nine partially-assembled petrol bombs, firework powder and weapons at Piggin's home in Loughborough when he was arrested on two terrorism offences.

Piggin, who denies the charges, was 17 when arrested and could not be named until the start of the trial.

### 'List of targets'

Prosecutor Max Hill said police made a "startling" discovery when they seized nine partially-assembled pipe bombs and ammunition at Mr Piggin's home. The trial is expected to last six to eight weeks.

Mr Piggin, of Shelthorpe, Lough-

borough has admitted three charges under the Explosive Substances Act but denies possession of items for the purpose of terrorism and possessing a document containing information likely to be useful for committing or preparing an act of terrorism.

The court was told he was diagnosed with Asperger's syndrome after his arrest, but the condition was not a defence against the charges, the prosecution

said.

He is also alleged to have possessed petrol bombs, firework powder, partially-constructed improvised explosive devices, a crossbow, a variety of air rifles, a gas mask and stab proof vest.

Describing him as a "would-be terrorist", Mr Hill said: "For an average young man in an average house in Loughborough or any other town... that list is startling."

### 'Nazi swastikas'

The court was told Mr Piggin had a notebook with a list of possible targets in his hometown, including a school, Loughborough Mosque and other individuals and organisations he held a grudge against.

The Che Guevara notebook, which was emblazoned with Nazi swastikas and English Defence League mottos, also discussed tactics to carry out a "new Columbine", in

reference to one of America's worst mass shootings.

### 'too many Muslims'

The Mujahideen Poisons Handbook was also found in Mr Piggin's home along with video and dictaphone recordings in which he discussed an attack, the court heard.

The prosecutor said Mr Piggin claimed to be a member of an EDL branch and wrote in a letter found at his home that there were "too many Muslims" who wanted to "take over Europe and put Sharia law in place".

A voice recording allegedly made by the defendant was played to the court in which he spoke of "rising up" against the "scum, powerful and corrupt".

The jury was asked to consider whether Mr Piggin's plans were "child's play, harmless self obsession, or something more sinister".

A recording was played in court in which he was heard saying he wanted to test making explosives and adding: "I'm going to make a pipe bomb". The trial continues.

**Far right threats shut down UK Legoland**

Legoland in Britain will close its hotel this weekend after far-right extremists made threats against the theme park for agreeing to host a Muslim family fun day. The resort and its hotel had been hired out by a group called the Muslim Research and Development Foundation, and 1,000 Muslim families were due to spend the weekend there.

But Legoland cancelled the private event last week after its Facebook page was bombarded by abusive messages from "right-wing" groups.

Following talks with the organisers and police, it has now decided to shut the 150-room hotel in Windsor to the west of London this weekend.

Legoland has not confirmed which groups had sent the messages.

Before the fun day was cancelled, a blogger from the far-right British National Party said Legoland should be "ashamed of themselves for bowing to these Muslims".

Legoland had already planned to close the theme park to the general public this weekend, the spokeswoman said. It will reopen for the 2014 season on March 14.

**Shell boss urges Scots to remain part of UK**

The chief executive of Anglo-Dutch oil giant Shell has dealt a blow to the campaign for Scottish independence by saying he would like it to remain part of the UK.

Speaking at the company's annual reception in London on Wednesday, Ben van Beurden explained that a vote for independence in the September referendum would introduce greater uncertainty into the North Sea oil industry, a crucial source of income for Scotland and Shell.

**'investment stability'**

For similar reasons, he also said that he wanted

Britons to vote to stay in the European Union during a possible referendum in 2017.

"We're used to operating in uncertain political and economic environments. But, given a choice, we want to know as accurately as possible what investment conditions will look like 10 or 20 years from now," he explained.

"That's the chief reason we're in favour of the UK maintaining its long-established place at the heart of the European Union: it provides greater investment stability and certainty.

"It's for similar

reasons that we'd like to see Scotland remain part of the United Kingdom," he added.

"Shell has a long history of involvement in the North Sea - and therefore in Scotland - and we continue to invest more than a billion pounds there every year."

JAMES Bond star Sir Sean Connery has issued a rallying cry for Scots to vote for independence, saying it is too good an opportunity to miss.

The 83-year-old actor (pictured, right) claimed a vote in favour of leaving the UK in September's referendum would "capture the world's attention".

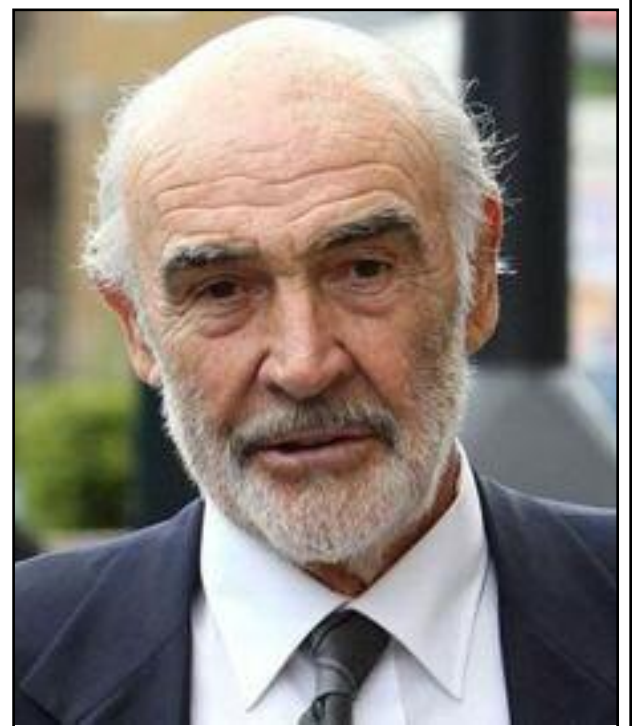
Sir Sean, who lives in the Bahamas, accepts the decision should be made by "the people who choose to live and work there".

# The Miracle Machine: astonishing new device can create wine from water

From the reflecting telescope to the toothbrush, from the jet engine to the ATM, the British have a long and proud tradition for producing world-changing inventions.

But a new device from the West Country may just prove to be the greatest of them all.

The aptly-named Miracle Machine offers to make a 750ml bottle of wine, including Cabernet Sauvignon and Chardonnay, within three days.

Working in a vaguely-similar style to a Soda Stream, the user adds water and some ingredients and lets the device do the work.

As with most modern marvels, a smartphone app is involved to guide you through the winemaking process whilst monitoring progress. The app allows you to select from a list of pre-defined wine types, each listing the grape concentrates and recommended type of yeast as well as other ingredients that are required.

## industry veterans

Its makers claim the results "rival some of the best wines on the planet" and will "change the face of wine production forever".

The developers say the Miracle Machine will produce a quality wine for £1.20 that would normally cost at least £12.

Described as the world's first affordable accelerated winemaking device for the home, the £300 device is the brainchild of two wine industry veterans: Philip James, British founder and former CEO of the wine website Lot 18, and his sommelier friend Kevin Boyer.

They say the idea came after "one too many glasses of wine over dinner", and a casual remark by Philip that 'Jesus made water into wine; with all the technology we have available today why can't we do the same?' The very next day they began the process of investigating whether it could be done. They spoke to their friends in Silicon Valley and explored the possibility of accelerating the winemaking process using a low amount of heat and a computer controlled environment.

They also looked at the precise chemical breakdown of some of the finest wines in the world and realised that just as the scent industry is able to simulate smells, it is possible to replicate the delicate flavours of highly sought-after vintages.

Fast forward 12 months, and many experiments, and the Miracle Machine was born.

Kevin Boyer told Wine-Searcher.com: "Our Kickstarter campaign will launch in a couple of days in which we hope to secure funding for the

building of the first 2000 Miracle Machines. We hope to have those completed and in market by May.

At the heart of the miracle machine lies the fermentation chamber. Philip James explains: "Obviously we're keeping the exact science under wraps, but we can tell you the chamber uses an array of electrical sensors, transducers, heaters and pumps to provide a controlled environment for the primary and, as needed, secondary fermentation stages.

"You'll be able to buy the grape concentrate, yeast, and the final sachet of ingredients through our website, and Amazon, once we launch. Each kit will make a different type of wine. We plan on creating a low cost monthly "wine" club, where for under £6 per month you receive several kits, enough to make a bottle of wine a week.

"Initially we have sourced six wine types that The Miracle Machine and its app will help you make. These are a full-bodied Cabernet Sauvignon and rich

Chardonnay from Napa Valley, a cool climate Pinot Noir from Oregon, an aged Tuscan blend from Italy, Sauvignon Blanc from Sonoma, and a delicate red and a steely white from Burgundy. We expect to add 5-10 more over the next 3 months."

Because the wine will be produced and bottled under air, not an inert gas, the wine will only keep for 1-2 weeks. However, the wine will be made to taste pre-aged so there's no need to age it any further.

Now that's progress.

## Rolls Royce reveals corruption probe on both sides of the pond

Rolls-Royce revealed on Thursday that it is facing a corruption probe in the United States as well as Britain.

"The group is currently under investigation by law enforcement agencies, primarily the Serious Fraud Office (SFO) in the UK and the US Department of Justice (DoJ)," the company said in its annual report.

"Breaches of laws and regulations in this area can lead to fines, penalties, criminal prosecution, commercial litigation and restrictions on future business."

### bribery concerns

The famed engine maker revealed late last year that Britain's SFO had launched a formal investigation into alleged bribery linked to the group's overseas operations.

The company had warned in 2012 that it might be prosecuted over alleged "malpractice" in Indonesia and China after passing on information related to bribery concerns to the office.

The London-listed firm stressed on

Thursday that it was cooperating with the investigations but has yet to receive official notice of a formal DoJ probe.

"Rolls-Royce has been cooperating with regulatory authorities on both sides of the Atlantic in regard to allegations of bribery and corruption," it added.

"The SFO in the UK has launched a formal investigation. The DoJ is also investigating these matters, however we have received no notification of a formal enquiry being launched in the United States."

Earlier this week, meanwhile, India's defence ministry ordered an investigation into the purchase of jet fighter engines from Rolls-Royce in a deal reportedly worth \$1.6 billion, an official said on Monday.

The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) will probe allegations of kickbacks over the deal for Rolls-Royce to supply engines to state-run Hindustan Aeronautics Ltd (HAL) between 2007 and 2011, a defence ministry official told wire services.

## Essex teacher awarded £230,000 compensation after slipping on a ketchup sachet causing 'severe injury'

■ Payment was part of £1m in compensation paid out in past three years

A teacher has been awarded £230,000 after he slipped on a sachet of tomato ketchup in a school corridor.

He suffered severe injuries in the fall as he was walking out of the staff room at a secondary school in Essex.

The personal injury claim was settled outside court by council chiefs who believed they may have been forced to shell out up to £500,000 including legal fees if the case had gone ahead.

And it has emerged that the payout was one of 34 handed to injured teachers in the county between 2011 and 2013 – and who received a total of £1.05million.

Critics have now complained of a 'compensation culture' in schools after it was revealed that other staff had claimed for slipping on wet floors or being injured by a cupboard door.

The teacher in the ketchup incident was hurt

on March 18 2008, but did not file a claim until March 10 2011 – just eight days before the three-year legal time limit for making personal injury claims.

### 'duty of care'

A Freedom of Information request revealed that the council agreed a final settlement of £230,000 in April last year, including £90,000 in damages for pain, suffering and loss of amenity as well as damages for losses such as those relating to earnings and pension.

The payout also included £120,000 for the teacher's legal fees and

£20,000 in other costs.

Other claims to emerge include a £110,000 settlement to a member of staff who suffered a spinal injury after slipping on a wet floor on two separate occasions on the same day.

Jonathan Isaby of the TaxPayers' Alliance said: "The compensation culture appears to be more common in the school yard than a grazed knee.

"Wasting taxpayers' money on unnecessary payouts leaves less money available for teaching and higher tax bills for everyone else.

"It's time schools resisted unscrupulous

claims before teachers are unable to leave the staff room for fear of the school being sued.'

However, Jerry Glazier, the National Union of Teachers representative for Essex, said there is no compensation culture in schools.

He said: 'We need to see these claims in context.

'As a union we will support members who pursue claims for personal injury when we feel they have been poorly treated by management in schools.

'Schools are generally very safe environments but employers have a duty of care to protect both teachers and pupils.'

# Royal Couple in Maldives sunshine getaway

## ■ Kate and William make surprise visit to Indian Ocean paradise

Last month the Duchess of Cambridge nipped off for a Middleton family holiday on the Caribbean island of Mustique. Now she and Prince William are on holiday in the Maldives.

It is not yet known whether the royal couple has been joined by baby George, who at seven months is already becoming quite the jet-setter. They have recently hired a new nanny for the royal baby.

Local Maldivian newspaper Hareevu Daily reported that the couple arrived at 9.45 Wednesday morning and are holidaying on the Noonu Atoll, home to the five-star Sun Siyam Iru Fushi resort,

for one week.

In January this year, Kate was photographed playing with Prince George on the beach as they visited the island of Mustique, part of St Vincent and the Grenadines.

The trip coincided with the 59th birthday of Carole Middleton, Kate's mother, and the Middleton clan celebrated in lavish style with a Caribbean break in a villa which was previously a favourite holiday haunt of Princess Margaret and is said to be worth £5 million.

For Prince William, the holiday will doubtless come as a welcome break. The heir to the throne has been taking a

10-week agriculture course in wet and windy Cambridge designed to help him manage the royal estates.

Don't feel too worried for Will, though - he still managed to slip in a cheeky getaway to Spain last month, for a shooting holiday which saw him come under fire for going hunting after speaking as an advocate for protecting wildlife.

The couple will likely be keen to relax and take it easy in the Indian Ocean islands - famous for their turquoise waters and white, sandy beaches - ahead of their upcoming royal tour of Australia and New Zealand, which begins next month and will last for three weeks

## Peace at last for the Queen's cousin

Katharine Bowes Lyon, the mentally handicapped niece of the late Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother, has been laid to rest. She died peacefully last month at the age of 87.

A Buckingham Palace spokesman declined to make any comment on the matter. Miss Bowes Lyon's death took place on February 23, but her relatives and courtiers made no announcement at the time because of the sensitivities involved. Katharine and her sister Nerissa, who died in 1986 and was also mentally handicapped, had often been subjected

to intrusion from both media outlets and obsessive royal watchers.

Two years ago, Channel 4 in Britain broadcast a documentary, emotively entitled *The Queen's Hidden Cousins*, that suggested the Royal family had behaved uncaringly towards the daughters of the late John and Fenella Bowes Lyon, who were the older brother and sister-in-law of Queen Elizabeth. In a rare insight into the Queen's feelings, Lady Elizabeth Anson, her cousin, told a leading royal reporter that the programme had

"hurt" the monarch.

Lady Elizabeth considered it to be "an intrusion of privacy" and accused its makers of "capitalising on the royal connection and ignoring the facts, as the sisters have always been looked after by that family". Of Katharine she said that, contrary to what was claimed, the Queen's cousin was well looked after in a care home that was suited to her needs. "She has regular visits, too," she added.

The programme claimed that John Bowes Lyon never visited his daughters as they grew up, but failed to mention that he had died in 1930.

## Maori ruler refuses to meet Wills and Kate

### ■ King "not some carnival act to be rolled out..."

The king of the Maori people has refused to meet the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge during their tour of New Zealand next month.

King Tuheitia said the 90 minutes he was allocated with the royals was not enough to do justice to their status.

His office also said the king was "not some carnival act to be rolled out at the beck and call of anyone".

Kensington Palace said the tour would include several events "to recognise the significance of Maori culture".

William and Catherine were due to meet King Tuheitia - who ascended to the

Maori throne in 2006 - at his official residence, Turangawaewae, on the country's North Island.

But a statement from his office said that while he had "agonised" over the decision, the monarch was not prepared to meet the royal couple for only 90 minutes.

### 'No negotiation'

It blamed "faceless bureaucrats" for "a grave error of judgement", and said the full reasons for the refusal were "conveyed to the royal couple in a personal letter... several weeks ago".

"The government-appointed committee overseeing the visit never met with any

officials from this office and when we did seek to contact them, they were not willing to be negotiable or flexible in their approaches to the king," the statement continued.

"A senior rangatira [official] noted that the king and the kiingitanga [the royal line] are not some carnival act to be rolled out at the beck and call of anyone, and nor should we be prepared to compromise our tikanga [customs] to fit into a pre-determined schedule."

It added: "The king wanted to give his best to this couple to reflect their status, he was being prevented from doing that."

# Army commander bans sandwiches in attack on 'barbaric habits'

Sandwiches have been banned from an officers' mess after a commander noticed many soldiers were eating them with their hands as he insisted "a gentleman or a lady uses a knife and fork."

Major General James Cowan issued the note after he noticed officers were eating sandwiches with their hands and failing to stand when commanders entered the room.

His three-page letter

criticized standards at Bulford Camp in Wiltshire where he said he had seen many "frankly barbaric" techniques and habits displayed by soldiers and officers.

The note, addressed to 'Chaps', said: "Quite a few officers in the divisional mess seem to be under the impression that they can eat their food with their hands. The practice of serving rolls and sandwiches must stop," the Sun reported.

The letter penned by Maj Gen Cowan, who is in charge of 20,000 soldiers and 2,500 officers in 3 UK Division, mostly based at Bulford, also criticised poor grammar and writing, advising against the "wanton use of capitals, abbreviations and acronyms" because they can leave the reader exhausted.

Maj Gen Cowan advises on the correct way to use a knife and fork, saying "holding either

like a pen is unacceptable."

On the subject of marriage he is equally direct, advising officers never to sit next to their spouse at dinner or risk showing insecurity. He also clearly outlines that

he expects a junior officer to "make an effort at conversation" with one of their superiors.

A spokesman for the Army insisted the three page note, where Maj Gen Cowan also suggested soldiers should stand up

when commanders enter the room, was meant to be taken as fun.

They said: "This note was part of a light-hearted correspondence between a commander and his officers about an expected code of behaviour."

## Maj Gen Cowan's six tips on etiquette:

### ■ SANDWICHES

"Quite a few officers in the divisional mess seem to be under the impression that they can eat their food with their hands. The practice of serving rolls and sandwiches in the mess is to stop. A gentleman or lady always uses a knife and fork."

### ■ DINNER PARTY

"A good party relies on good conversation. This requires you to come prepared to be free, funny and entertaining. Thank you letters are an art form not a chore. It is generally considered better manners if the spouse is the person who writes."

### ■ KNIFE AND FORK

"The fork always goes in the left hand and the knife in the right. Holding either like a pen is unacceptable, as are stabbing techniques. The knife and fork should remain in the bottom third of the plate and never be laid down in the top half."

### ■ OFFICERS

"Ten years ago, officers would stand up when the commanding officer walked into the room. This doesn't happen any more. I expect a junior officer to make an effort at conversation. Start by introducing yourself and talk on any civilized subject outside work."

### ■ SUCCESSFUL MARRIAGE

get. LA is a dynamic city big, but also be ready to with a myriad of work to make a dream opportunities. Dream come true.

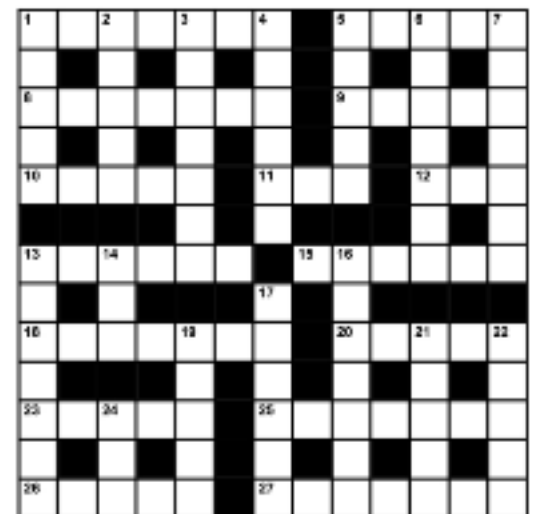

## Warm hearts glow In Falling Snow

■ *Exclusive interview with author Mary-Rose MacColl about her novel set in a hospital in WWI France*

"I was in the wrong aisle of a university library when I came upon a book, **Women of Royaumont: A Scottish Women's Hospital on the Western Front,**" says *In Falling Snow* author Mary-Rose MacColl. "I sat down and started reading Eileen Crofton's history of the sixteen women who took a hospital to France from England in 1914. Their story really intrigued me. The hospital, in Royaumont Abbey, was staffed entirely by women. Oh, I thought to myself, wouldn't this make a great setting for a novel? And



how come no one's ever heard this story?"

*In Falling Snow* takes us back and forth through the life of Iris Crane as she moves from wartime to marriage, motherhood, then onto being a widow and grandmother. What she remembers brings her joy and immense pain. This novel will make you cry, so have some tissues handy. I do wish the story didn't hop around so much though – in particular the character

of Iris' granddaughter Grace seems so well developed, that it distracts from the story of Iris herself.

When we first meet Iris she is 81, and in failing health. She receives an invitation to a ceremony honoring Les Dames Ecosais de Royaumont (The Scottish Ladies of Royaumont) the hospital in which she worked during the Great War. We see her travel to France at 21, following her brother from Australia to front lines in Europe determined to get him home. Instead she stays in France and becomes a nurse at the field hospital on the outskirts of Paris in an old abbey. The staff is entirely women. The ceremony marks first time Iris has returned in 60 years. Grace, Iris' granddaughter is asked by Iris to do something for

her as her last wish.

"I found out that not only is Royaumont, the abbey which was made into a hospital, a real place that still exists, it's a cultural centre for France where I was able to spend two weeks researching the novel," says MacColl. "It really is extraordinary what they achieved, establishing a first-class hospital in a rundown abbey at a time when women weren't allowed even to vote. When they arrived, there was no power, no heating, junk in all the rooms and within two months, they had a working hospital."

"I write by hand, filling notebook after notebook with little scenes and character sketches until I feel ready to pull the novel together. For *In Falling Snow*, I did most of this work on a long residency at the Banff Centre in

Canada," says MacColl.

"I'm a write first, ask questions later kind of writer," says MacColl. "Having said that, I read everything I could about Royaumont as a hospital, the published books, accounts from the women who worked there. I read other war novels and memoirs of war, as well as diaries of nurses, doctors and soldiers. Visiting Royaumont abbey as a guest of Fondation Royaumont was really helpful. I also had access to the Royaumont archives, which are held in several UK libraries."

MacColl has written three novels and one non-fiction book, *The Birth Wars*, about the state of maternity care in Australia. MacColl was runner-up in the 1995 Australian Vogel Literary Award for her first novel *No Safe Place*. *The Birth*

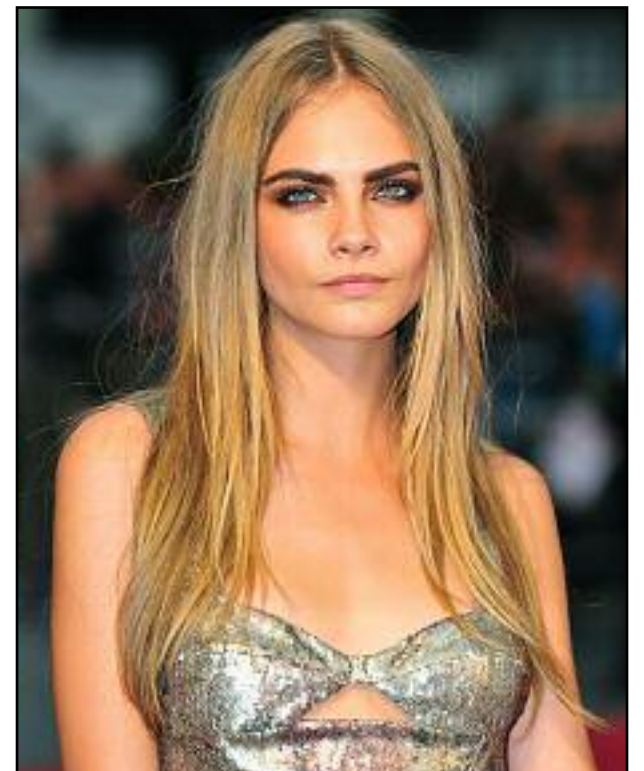

# Pellegrini eyes treble

Manuel Pellegrini hopes Manchester City's Capital One Cup final victory over Sunderland can inspire his players to complete a historic domestic treble.

City won 3-1 at Wembley on Sunday to give Pellegrini his first trophy in England.

They face Wigan in the FA Cup quarter-finals and are also in the thick of a battle for the Premier League title.

"To win the first trophy is important for us all. For the players, for me and for the staff,"

said Pellegrini, who replaced Roberto Mancini in the summer.

"We are the only club with the chance to try to win all the competitions. We are going to try although we know it is not easy."

City face Wigan in a repeat of last season's FA Cup final, which the Latics won 1-0, in the quarter-finals of this year's competition at Etihad Stadium next Sunday.

They are fourth in the Premier League and six points behind leaders Chelsea, but have two games in hand on Jose Mourinho's team plus Liverpool and Arsenal in second and third respectively.

No club has ever won all three domestic trophies in one season, and Pellegrini thinks winning the Capital One Cup will give his side "a lot of confidence".

# Strachan plays down Poland victory

Scotland manager Gordon Strachan said his side's 1-0 friendly victory over Poland will have no effect on either team's Euro 2016 qualifying campaign.

Captain Scott Brown scored the only goal in

Warsaw's Stadion Narodowy, where the two sides will meet again in October in a European qualifier.

"It meant absolutely nothing, because there will be changes," said Strachan. "These two

teams won't be the same.

"But what it does, for the next couple of months, is give us confidence."

Scotland's next friendly is likely to be at Fulham's Craven Cottage in May, with Nigeria having invited Strachan's side to play them in London.

Wednesday was Scotland's third successive away win, and they have gone five

matches unbeaten, the past four without conceding a goal.

"That's good and it's not easy to do that," Strachan told BBC Scotland, though he is not getting carried away with his side's improvement.

"It wasn't a great game. I don't think you could expect anything other than that at this time of the season in a friendly."

# Daniel lifts the Lions

Daniel Sturridge scored a late winner as England marked their final match before Roy Hodgson names his provisional World Cup squad with a deserved victory over Denmark Wednesday night.

Sturridge was one of five Liverpool players named in Hodgson's starting line-up and the striker carried his rich vein of club form on to the international scene, heading in Adam Lallana's cross for his 12th goal in as many games to give England a first win in three matches.

This was a last chance for Hodgson's players to impress their manager at international level if they are to be included in his travelling party for Brazil, and Sturridge will have done his chances no harm.

His Reds team-mate Raheem Sterling was named man of the match for an encouraging display, while Lallana again pressed his case for selection after coming off the bench.

It was only the Southampton captain's third cap, but he looks comfortable on the big stage.

Saints colleague Luke Shaw, 18, replaced Ashley Cole at half-time and justified suggestions he will be England's future first-choice left-back, showing ambition and composure on his debut.

For all the

encouragement, however, there was also cause for concern in the way England struggled to convert their possession into chances and looked vulnerable to the counter-attack.

There was a general lack of urgency and Denmark, who failed to qualify for the World Cup and lacked genuine quality, still came close to opening the scoring on more than one occasion.

Hodgson will select a 23-man squad and seven standby names on 13 May ahead of a friendly against Peru at Wembley on 30 May. England then travel to Miami for a warm-weather training camp, where they will play Ecuador and Honduras, before flying to Brazil.

The early signs were positive as Glen Johnson and Sterling combined well on the right, Gerrard and Jordan Henderson orchestrated proceedings from central midfield, and Sturridge probed for an opening alongside Manchester United's Wayne Rooney in attack.

But too often a touch was poor, passing was slow and movement was disjointed.

Rooney was agonisingly close to connecting with a low cross from Sturridge and then combined with Cole to tee up Sterling, only for his effort to rebound off a post.

Between those chances, however, England's defence was sliced open by a Krohn-Dehli pass that Jakob Poulsen failed to

finish.

England ended the half well to at least raise the flat atmosphere inside a stadium some way short of its 90,000 capacity, Sturridge thwarted by Kasper Schmeichel from close range after Rooney's corner.

As expected, Shaw came on for Cole, allowing Hodgson to assess his back-up options to Leighton Baines, and Lallana soon followed in place of Wilshere.

A third substitution saw Welbeck replace Rooney and England now showed greater hunger and urgency, Lallana's first touch an outstanding Cruyff turn that set the tone.

There was another defensive lapse when indecisiveness from Smalling and Henderson enabled Morten Rasmussen to race clear, only for Joe Hart to burst off his line and save well. However, the rest of the night belonged to England.

Schmeichel was twice called upon to prevent Welbeck breaking the deadlock - the second time after superb link-up play with Henderson - and the Leicester City goalkeeper displayed fine reactions from a spectacular Sturridge strike.

The pressure told when Lallana found Sturridge with a perfectly weighted cross and the 24-year-old controlled his header back across Schmeichel to send England's fans home happy.



## Wilshere out for six weeks

Jack Wilshere suffered a broken foot in England's friendly win over Denmark and has been ruled out for around six weeks.

In a devastating blow to Arsenal's hopes of ending their nine-year trophy drought, Wilshere was diagnosed with a

hairline fracture of the left foot by the club's medical team.

The midfielder appeared to sustain the injury following a crunching early tackle by Daniel Agger at Wembley on Wednesday night, but despite hobbling off for

treatment, he returned to play until just before the hour mark.

A six-week lay-off would rule him out of all but Arsenal's last four Premier League games of the season and would see him miss a crucial run of fixtures in league and cup.
