Russian fury over royal "Hitler" slur

TENSIONS WITH RUSSIA rose sharply this week after Prince Charles reportedly compared Vladimir Putin to Hitler.

Officials in Moscow reacted furiously to the reports, telling their British counterparts that Charles' words "do not befit" a future king.

Hours after demanding a meeting with the Foreign Office, Russia's foreign ministry said if Charles' reported comments were true, they are "unacceptable, outrageous and low".

Deputy ambassador Alexander Kramarenko met with British diplomats on Thursday, who were keen to defuse any diplomatic row ahead of a planned meeting between the Prince and the Russian President next month.

It is claimed the Prince made his comments in a private conversation with a Jewish museum volunteer whose family fled Nazi Germany during the war during a Royal tour of Canada.

He had been visiting the Museum of Immigration in Halifax,

Nova Scotia, with his wife, the Duchess of Cornwall, to pay tribute to Second World War veterans.

Marianne Ferguson, 78, said that after telling Charles the story of how her family fled the Nazis he replied: "Putin is doing just about the same as Hitler."

At a news conference on Thursday a Russian Foreign Ministry spokesman said: "If these words were truly spoken, then without doubt, they do not befit the future British monarch.

"We view the use of the Western press by members of the British Royal family to spread the propaganda campaign against Russia on a pressing issue - that is, the situation in Ukraine - as unacceptable, outrageous and low."

The Prince is due to meet Mr Putin at commemorations for the 70th anniversary of the

D-Day landings in Normandy on June 6.

Prime Minister David Cameron on Wednesday refused to comment on Charles' remarks, which were reported in the Daily Mail, but said: "Everyone is entitled to their private opinions."

Labour leader Ed Miliband said the Prince of Wales "has got a point" about the Russian President's actions in Ukraine and said many may share his view.

Deputy Prime Minister Nick Clegg said the Prince should be entitled to express his privately held views, while Nigel Farage rejected the Prince's Hitler comparison.

A spokesman for Clarence House said: "We do not comment on private conversations. But we would like to stress that the Prince of Wales would not seek to make a public political statement during a private conversation."

“She liked it” Rolf Harris allegedly told mother of teenage assault victim

Rolf Harris told the mother of a teenage girl he groped in Australia that “she liked it”, a court has heard.

The woman said she called the artist a “disgusting creature” as he had also rubbed himself against her while they had a photo taken at a 1991 art event.

Southwark Crown Court heard Mr Harris laughed as he groped the woman’s daughter, who was 15 or 16 at the time.

Mr Harris, 84, denies 12 indecent assault charges related to four girls aged between seven or eight and 19.

The incidents are alleged to have taken

place between 1968 and 1986.

Speaking via video link, the mother and daughter, from Australia, described the defendant as a “dirty old man”.

The daughter said she was left in shock.

“He put his right hand on my left breast and through my shirt. I had a shirt that was gathered and did not have buttons on the front,” she said.

“He put his other hand on my right butt cheek. His hand was over my bra but through my shirt.

“It was very deliberate. I stepped back and he laughed.”

The alleged assault does not form part of the

formal charges against Mr Harris, of Bray, Berkshire, because it took place outside the UK at a time before foreign incidents could be tried in British courts.

‘Very forceful’

The daughter, now 39, told the court there were about 20 people at the art presentation in Hamilton, which she attended with her mother.

He groped her as she tried to shake his hand when she was introduced to him, she said.

The woman’s mother told the court Mr Harris was “close enough to be rubbing himself against my buttocks” as she and

her daughter posed for a picture with him.

“It was very brief but very forceful,” she said.

‘A creep’

“I put my foot down on his foot and turned around and told him he was a disgusting creature.”

She told the court Mr Harris’s expression

“went from smiling friend to a sneer”.

“He leaned forward right in my face and said, ‘She liked it.’ It was really sinister,” she said.

The woman told the court she knew Mr Harris was referring to her daughter because he looked at her when he spoke.

She said as she and her

daughter left the premises, her daughter said Mr Harris was a “creep” and “very handy”.

“I asked her what had happened. She was reluctant,” the mother said.

“I did suspect he had touched her in the vicinity of her breast.”

The case continues.

Ukip headed for big gains in local elections

THE RISE of the UK Independence Party gathered pace this week with both major parties losing seats to the upstart movement in Thursday’s local elections.

The anti-EU party is on course to show that last year’s breakthrough in town halls was not a one-off, with Labour struggling to make progress and the Tory vote, which has been hit most by UKIP, falling back.

As the British Weekly

went to press Thursday night, Labour has gained 39 seats, the Conservatives had lost 75, UKIP had gained 73 and the Lib Dems had lost 43.

Some 11 councils in Northern Ireland are also up for grabs.

The surge in support for UKIP has sent shockwaves through the main parties at Westminster, with just a year to go before the next general election and is even more alarming in the light of widespread media

condemnation of the party. But the party’s charismatic leader, Nigel Farage, has struck a resonant note with much of Middle Britain which worries the major parties are out of step with their needs and concerns.

Even before the final results were in the finger pointing began, with Labour MP Graham Stringer, who wants an in/out EU referendum, saying it was clear his party was not going to do as well as it expected in the

European and local elections, with UKIP eating into its vote in traditional Labour heartlands.

The Blakeley and Broughton MP launched an attack on Ed Miliband’s campaign calling it “unforgivably unprofessional”.

He told the BBC “we have not done as well as we should have done in both the presentation of our policies and the organisation of the

campaign”.

Labour’s shadow business secretary Chuka Umunna rejected the criticisms, but said it was now clear the UK was in an “era of four-party politics”.

Some Conservative backbenchers have called for an electoral pact with UKIP going into the general election, with Jacob-Rees-Mogg warning UKIP could split the “small c Conservative vote” and let Labour in.

Shale oil bonanza may push UK closer to fracking

A report published on Friday is expected to say that there are several billion barrels of oil in shale rocks under large parts of southern England.

But getting the oil out of the ground will involve the controversial process known as fracking.

The study by the British Geological Survey (BGS) covers areas including Sussex, Hampshire, Surrey and Kent.

The government is planning to offer more compensation for towns affected by fracking, according to press reports.

Although the BGS study will say that there are several billion barrels of oil in place, it is not yet clear how much would be economically recoverable.

But the report's estimates could still have implications for the UK's long-term energy security and kick-off a drive to start fracking for oil in the region.

By way of comparison, the equivalent of around 45 billion barrels of oil has been extracted from the North Sea over the past 40 years.

Last year, a BGS study of the North of England suggested there could be as much as 1,300 trillion cubic feet of gas contained in shale rocks.

The fracking process involves pumping water, sand and chemicals into rock at high pressure, and it has sparked demonstrations by environmentalists. Some governments have banned the process.

Critics argue that fracking damages water supplies and can cause earthquakes. There have been strong anti-fracking protests at Balcombe, West Sussex, against test-drilling.

However, a government report

published in June 2012 concluded that fracking was safe if adequately monitored.

Prime Minister David Cameron has insisted fracking will be "good for our country" and has blamed a "lack of understanding" of the process for some of the opposition.

Politically sensitive

There were media reports on Friday that the government will release details of additional compensation arrangements for communities affected by fracking, in order to stave off opposition. There have already been promises of one-off payments and a share in the profits.

The fracking issue is also politically sensitive. Tory peer Lord Howell of Guildford - who apologised last year after saying that fracking should take place in the North East because it was "desolate" - recently spoke about the issue again, and said the Conservative Party could lose votes by pursuing plans to frack.

The counties covered by the BGS survey are considered strong Tory territory.

For many years, there have been more traditional exploration and development of oil and gas in the region.

Andrew Austin, chief executive of the onshore energy IGAS, said it had long been known that southern England had extensive resources.

He said: "There's been a long history of oil and gas exploration in this area. We as a company produce oil and gas from around 20 sites across that area. Around 40 million barrels have been recovered from that area to date."

RORY MCILROY was in the news for all the wrong reasons this week after calling off his wedding to Caroline Wozniacki - after sending out wedding invitations.

The golfer said "the problem is mine" after changing his mind about marrying the tennis ace and prompting further speculation on his ability to concentrate on his golf.

"The wedding invitations issued at the weekend made me realise that I wasn't ready for all that marriage entails," McIlroy said in a statement.

"There is no right way to end a relationship that has been so important to two people.

"I wish Caroline all the happiness she deserves and thank her for the great times we've had. I will not be saying anything more about our relationship in any setting."

McIlroy was then asked about the break-up as he prepared for the BMW PGA Championship.

He said: "I think I'm no different than anyone else.

Everyone has been through break-ups and it's obviously very, very difficult.

"I'm not going to lie. It's going to be very difficult. But you know, at least when I get inside the ropes I can just try and concentrate on the shot at hand."

McIlroy, 25, had announced his engagement to the 23-year-old via Twitter on January 1, 2014.

At the time McIlroy tweeted: "I have a feeling it is going to be a great year."

Wozniacki later revealed the golfer asked her parents for permission before popping the question.

She then flaunted her diamond ring - reportedly worth well over £100,000 - at the Australian Open.

There was no hint of trouble in the relationship on Sunday when McIlroy tweeted a picture while the couple were having dinner at Nobu restaurant in Monte Carlo.

Wozniacki, who was born in Denmark to Polish parents, reached world number one in her own

sport in 2012 but has yet to win a Grand Slam.

The couple - dubbed Wozzilroy in some circles after he gave her a golf wedge engraved with the moniker - had reportedly been an item for more than two years.

And they were arguably the most successful and richest pair in modern sport.

McIlroy has a £12m-a-year contract with Nike, while deals with companies like Turkish Airlines supplemented Wozniacki's tennis earnings.

Abu Hamza faces life sentence after New York terrorism conviction

■ Trial of radical cleric marks the end of a 10-year mission by US authorities to bring him to justice on US soil

Abu Hamza al-Masri, the radical Islamist cleric notorious for hate-filled sermons, was facing life in a top-security US prison on Monday after being convicted of all charges after a five-week terrorism trial in New York.

The Egyptian-born cleric, 56, who was an imam at the Finsbury Park mosque in north London in the 1990s, was found guilty by a jury in a Manhattan federal court near the scene of the 9/11 terror attacks on the World Trade Center.

global reach

The jury of eight men and four women took just 11 hours over two days to reach their verdict on the complex case.

Hamza was accused of being a terrorist of global reach, and was charged with providing material support to terrorist organizations by enabling hostage-takers in the Yemen kidnapping to speak on a satellite phone, by sending men to establish an al-Qaida training camp in Bly, Oregon, and by sending at least one man to training

camp in Afghanistan.

His conviction, on all 11 charges, marks the end of a 10-year mission by American authorities to bring him to justice on US soil.

It is the second major terrorist-related conviction for federal prosecutors in two months. It follows that of Sulaiman Abu Ghaith, a son-in-law of Osama Bin Laden, in March. Ghaith, who was also tried in a New York federal court, was found guilty of charges related to his work as chief spokesman for Al Qaida in the days after the 9/11 terror attacks.

'trainer of terrorists'

After the guilty verdict on Monday, officials from the US justice department said it proved that such cases could be tried in civilian courts, rather than sent to military trials at Guantanamo Bay.

"Once again, our civilian system of justice has proven itself up to the task," said the U.S. attorney for the Southern District of New York, Preet Bharara. "As we have seen in the Manhattan

federal courthouse in trial after trial ... these trials have been difficult, but they have been fair and open and prompt."

Hamza, who was tried under his real name of Mustapha Kamel Mustapha, was finally extradited in 2012 from the UK, where he led the Finsbury Park Mosque, reportedly attended by both 9/11 conspirator Zacarias Moussaoui and shoe bomber Richard Reid. Hamza denied that he ever met them.

Hamza looked straight ahead as the verdict was

read.

The jury at Manhattan's federal court agreed with the prosecution claims that Hamza was a "trainer of terrorists" who recruited and indoctrinated young men at the London mosque as part of his global empire.

In his opening statement, Edward Kim, assistant district attorney for the southern district of New York, also said that Hamza used the cover of religion to "hide in plain sight" under the noses of the British authorities for years.

Hamza was convicted of 11 counts of criminal conduct related to the taking of 16 hostages in Yemen in 1998 that left three Britons and an Australian dead. He was also found guilty of advocating violent jihad in Afghanistan in 2001 and conspiring to establish a jihad training camp in Oregon between June 2000 and December 2001.

During the trial Hamza's defence team tried to claim that the prosecution case, which included videos of his

sermons, was just about "words, not deeds". They described him as an "independent thinker" and "his own man". His defence team argued that the jury may not have liked the views he espoused, but that they did not amount to crimes.

His defence lawyer Joshua Dratel told them: "These are views, not acts. This is expression, not crimes."

9/11 'a good thing'

For much of the past five weeks, jurors watched videotapes and heard audio clips of sermons and interviews in which Hamza ranted at his followers, telling them non-Muslims could be treated like animals "like cows, like pigs" and women and children who were not Muslim could be taken captive.

Hamza, who testified for four days, insisted that he did not take part in acts of terror or support al-Qaida. But he also insisted that, even today, he loved Osama bin Laden and that he thought 9/11 was a good thing.

Racing legend Sir Jack Brabham dead at 88

Sir Jack Brabham, a near legendary racing driver and car designer who was one of the key figures in the development of Formula One, has died at 88.

Brabham was one of motor racing's great practical heroes, a tough Australian who applied a down-to-earth attitude to his craft. Not only did he gain three world championship titles, in 1959, 1960 and 1966, but the third was at the wheel of a car bearing his own name. This was a unique achievement in Formula One history and it was made all the more satisfying by the fact that he was 40 when he took that third title crown and regarded as being over the hill by many motor-racing commentators.

During a Formula One career that ran from 1955 until 1970, Brabham competed in 126 grands prix, winning on 14 occasions. For the first six years he drove for the Cooper team, and then set up as a constructor in his own right. Brabham is recalled by all who worked with him as someone who never wasted words. He was shrewd to the point of cunning, a great mechanical improviser in the days when racing drivers still got their hands dirty helping on the mechanical front and an all-rounder prepared to turn his hand to any chore.

highly competitive

Jack was born in Hurstville, 10 miles south of Sydney and joined the Royal Australian Air Force at the age of 18, very much wanting to fly, but by then it was 1944

Search for missing British sailors may be called off, says US Coast Guard

The search for the four British sailors believed to have abandoned a Southampton-based yacht was set to be suspended if nothing is found by Friday night, the US Coast Guard has said.

Captain Anthony Popiel said he had spoken to the yachtsmen's families to tell them that the search could be suspended.

The Cheeki Rafiki, based in Southampton, was sailing back to the UK from Antigua when it went missing two weeks ago.

The search was originally called off on Sunday after the yacht was found capsized by a passing container ship with no sign of the sailors, but resumed again on Tuesday after an internet petition gathered more than 200,000 signatures.

Capt Popiel said: "I

informed them [the families] that the search would continue throughout the night and into tomorrow.

"If by midnight tomorrow [05:00 BST Saturday] there are no further developments to indicate search efforts would locate the crew alive we will suspend the search."

planes and boats

He also said he had "sincere compassion" for the families of the four men, and that his "thoughts and prayers" were with them.

Several leading mariners, including round-the-world veteran Sir Robin Knox-Johnston, said the four crew could survive for 'several weeks' in a properly-provisioned life raft.

The crew members are

Paul Goslin, 56, from West Camel, Somerset; skipper Andrew Bridge, 22, from Farnham; Steve Warren, 52, from Bridgwater; and 22-year-old James Male, from Romsey.

The search has so far been focused on an area some 1,000 miles east of Cape Cod, Massachusetts, and about 17,500 square miles of ocean have been covered by planes and boats working on behalf of the US Coast Guard.

Capt Popiel also said that his team's focus remained on "this very active and very dynamic search".

Hopes were briefly raised on Thursday when debris was found in the ocean near to where the Cheeki Rafiki is thought to have gone missing, but the US Coast Guard later confirmed that this debris could not have come from

the 40ft yacht.

The decision to resume the initial search followed an official request from the UK government. An online petition, set up to put pressure on the US Coast Guard to resume its search, also attracted more than 200,000 signatures.

gratitude

On Thursday the relatives of the sailors visited the US Embassy later and delivered letters addressed to US President

Barack Obama, the US Coast Guard and the US ambassador to express their gratitude for the resumption of the search.

At the time of going missing coastguard officials predicted the yacht would have been facing 15ft waves, 50mph winds and sea and air temperatures of 15C (60F).

Earlier in the week the coastguard predicted that the "estimated survival time" of any crew members was about 20

hours after the last distress call was made.

Locator beacons activated by the crew indicated they were in a position 1,000 miles east of Massachusetts on the morning of Friday 16 May.

A yellow and orange 12-person life raft was believed to have been on board the yacht at the time, and it was thought that the men may have inflated it and climbed on board, but this vessel has also yet to be spotted by rescuers.

and such was the progress of the second world war that there was more demand for mechanics than aircrew. He was demobbed in 1947 and then succumbed to the lure of motor racing.

After proving highly competitive on the Australian national racing scene, Brabham left for Britain in 1955 and became involved with the father-and-son racing-car builders Charles and John Cooper, making his Formula One debut in the 1955 British grand prix at Aintree in a central-seater Cooper sports car. Thereafter Brabham rode the crest of the Formula One

wave as Cooper rewrote the parameters of contemporary car performance, their rear-engined models superseding all their traditionally front-engined rivals.

world championships

Although Stirling Moss won the first Cooper victory in the 1958 Argentine Grand Prix, once Brabham hit his stride in the summer of 1959 there was no stopping him. With their rivals Vanwall and Maserati having dropped out of the scene, Ferrari still wrestling with their outdated front-engined Dino 246 and Colin Chapman's Lotus team yet to come to full flower, Cooper enjoyed a spectacular two-year run of success, winning seven races and two world

championships.

Brabham left Cooper at the end of the 1961 season, by which time their star was fading, and gave the first Brabham Formula One car its race debut in the following year's German grand prix. With the advent of the new three-litre Formula One engine regulations at the start of 1966, Brabham pulled another masterstroke by arranging for the Australian Repco company to build him a Formula One V8 engine to power his car.

calling time

Brabham scored his first victory at the wheel of his own vehicle in the 1966 French Grand Prix at Reims and followed this up with wins in the British, Dutch and German races. Although a taciturn personality,

Brabham memorably projected some dry humour just before the Dutch race at Zandvoort by hobbling out on to the grid wearing a false beard and leaning on a stick. It was the wry Australian's reply to those who

thought he was past it.

Brabham switched to the newly-dominant Ford Cosworth V8 engine in 1968, and won his final grand prix victory in South Africa at the start of 1970 and at the end of it called time on his career.

In that final year Brabham's chief mechanic was a 22-year-old from Surrey – Ron Dennis – today the multi-millionaire chairman of McLaren, one of Formula One's most successful racing teams.

News from Britain

Prince Rupert, Bavarian toff and longtime financial advisor to the Rolling Stones, fades away at 80

Prince Rupert Loewenstein, the man credited with making the Rolling Stones rich, has died.

The Bavarian aristocrat, who was 80 when he passed away on Tuesday, was the financial advisor and manager of the band for almost 40 years from 1968 until 2007.

He was dubbed "the human calculator" and turned the near-bankrupt Stones into a billion-pound machine before parting company on good terms, in 2007.

His unlikely alliance with Mick Jagger arguably shaped the band just as much as the singer's partnership with Keith Richards.

Without his guiding hand, it is believed the Stones may have folded years ago instead of being

multi millionaires.

In his memoir, *A Prince Among Stones*, Loewenstein revealed how the band used to receive paper bags stuffed with cash at their gigs; how they became tax exiles in France, and how they became embroiled in a long legal battle with their ex-manager.

Explaining how he got the job in his book, Prince Rupert explained how he met with Mick Jagger and clicked at a time when he was bored working for a merchant bank.

He said: "At the end of our conversation it was clear to me that Mick and I had clicked on a personal level. I certainly felt that Mick was a sensible, honest person. And I was equally certain that I represented a chance for him to find a

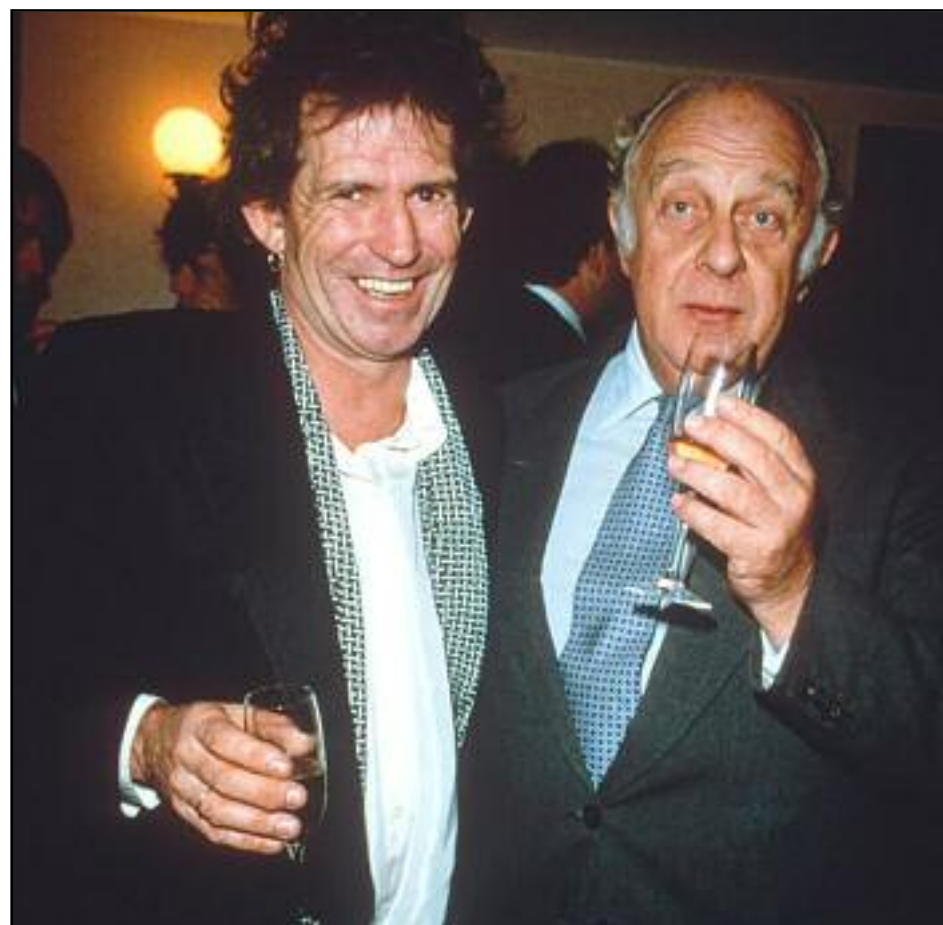
way out of a difficult situation. I was intrigued.

"So far as the Stones' music was concerned, however, I was not in tune with them, far from it. Rock and pop music was not something in which I was interested. I had heard some of The Beatles' music. Their music was sufficiently harmonic to be acceptable to people such as me. I only really took against rock 'n' roll when I heard the Stones.

"But the offer to look at the Stones' financial situation had come at a very good time for me both professionally and psychologically."

Prince Rupert's funeral is thought to be next week and could be attended by members of the band.

Prince Rupert is also credited with introducing

the Stones to promoter Michael Cohl who manufactured the lucrative Steel Wheels tour in 1989.

"Prince Rupert was my mentor and was uniquely

Police probe Moyes assault claim following wine bar scuffle

Police are investigating an allegation that ex-Manchester United manager David Moyes assaulted a man at a wine bar.

Officers were called to the upmarket Emporium bar in the rural market town of Clitheroe, Lancashire, Wednesday night following a report that Moyes was involved in an altercation with a 23-year-old local man.

It is understood Moyes, 51, had been socialising with his friend, Blackburn Rovers managing director Derek Shaw, a local businessman in the Ribbles Valley who was on the board at Preston North when the Scotsman was in charge at Deepdale.

Police said the

23-year-old man did not require hospital treatment following the incident at about 10pm.

A spokesman said: "Inquiries are ongoing and we are speaking to a number of people to try to establish the circumstances.

'differing accounts'

"There are a number of differing accounts which we need to work through to try to establish exactly what has happened. No-one has been arrested at this stage."

It is believed that police will also view any available CCTV footage to try and shed further light on the incident.

But several newspaper reports suggested the man had been heckling Moyes repeatedly and

abusing him for his failed tenure at Old Trafford.

A spokesman for the Emporium said: "There was an incident outside the building. However, it did not affect any of our customers or staff and has been dealt with by the police."

The Love Punch: British cast in top form delivers knockout comedy

I don't know about you, but when the opening shot of a film boasts Emma Thompson hoisting a very large and very shaken martini immediately followed by Pierce Brosnan sidling into frame and elegantly sipping the same, you've more than got my attention.

Add a beautifully intimate and colorful garden wedding and crisp, sharp sunlight cinematography to the mix, and I'm hooked. Then garnish with some

quick-witted snappy dialogue, and I know I'm in for a treat. And a treat is exactly what The Love Punch delivers. Writer/director Joel Hopkins adds a little more mature rope-a-dope to the production with Celia Imrie and Timothy Spall, as the four gallivant on the French Riviera for the heist of the \$10.8 million dollar "Rainbow Diamond". Although some of the silliness that

ensues requires a suspension of disbelief, The Love Punch harkens back to the screwball antics of Cary Grant and Katharine Hepburn in "The Philadelphia Story".

Richard (Brosnan) and Kate (Thompson) are happily and amicably divorced. Their son, Matt, is already in college while daughter Sophie is now joining him in academia, leaving Kate to suffer through her days and nights with a very empty nest. Meanwhile, Richard, a successful

investment banker, seems to have been filling his empty hours with partners young enough to be his daughter, something that always gives Kate fuel for comedic fodder. For best friends and neighbors, Jerry and Penelope, the solution to Kate's newfound loneliness is simple - get back together with Richard. As anyone can see, the love, disguised as sparring foreplay, is as sizzling as ever.

outrageous plan

But, life is about to be upended for Richard and Kate thanks to Richard's selling of his company to a shady Frenchman Vincent Kruger who has absconded with all of the company assets, including the employees' pension fund. With everyone looking to him for answers, and feeling his own pangs of guilt at having been so easily duped, Richard has only one place to turn. Kate.

At first annoyed by the situation, it's not until Richard explains, "no pension, no houses, no college, no retirement" that Kate jumps into action with the two developing an outrageous plan. Having just seen the news that Kruger bought his fiancé Manon a \$10.8 million diamond, the solution to recovering everyone's retirement money is simple - steal the

diamond and sell it on the Black Market. And with Manon announcing she'll be wearing it at her upcoming nuptials on the Cote d'Azur, it seems the perfect time and place for Richard and Kate to make their move.

charmingly funny

Calling on Penelope and Jerry for assistance, who leap at the chance for adventure, the four come up with a plan that requires disguises, perfect timing, gate crashing and, uh, scuba gear.

At this stage of his career, Brosnan uses the wealth of his life experience both on and off screen to develop textured, flawed, very human and this case, charmingly funny characters. And while Brosnan stands tall on his own as Richard, it's when he and Emma Thompson get in the ring together where emotions heighten, barbs get wittier and timing is rapier. Thompson is a firecracker. As Kate, she's bright, funny and dazzling. No matter with whom she shares the screen, it's Thompson that commands center stage.

Spall and Imrie are more than fitting second bananas as Jerry and Penelope with Spall stealing the show every chance he gets thanks to matter-of-fact non-expressive delivery of surprising tidbits of

Jerry's past. Fueling the funny is Celia Imrie's wifely kvetching and bumbling burbling at the most inopportune moments.

Written and directed by Joel Hopkins, the premise is smart and antics are fun. One of the most successful gags comes with Timothy Spall's seemingly bumbling Jerry who keeps surprising everyone with paramilitary super-spy skills, serving as a means to poke fun at one of Brosnan's most famous characters, Bond. Although predictable, the romantic sub-plot of the rekindling of feelings for Kate and Richard, while enjoyable to watch the chemistry and physical antics of Brosnan and Thompson, falls short with some of the dialogue which often feels hackneyed or not in keeping with either character.

While it doesn't land every punch, The Love Punch is a winner by decision. It comes out swinging with laughter, love and Pierce Brosnan and Emma Thompson. And that's tough to top.

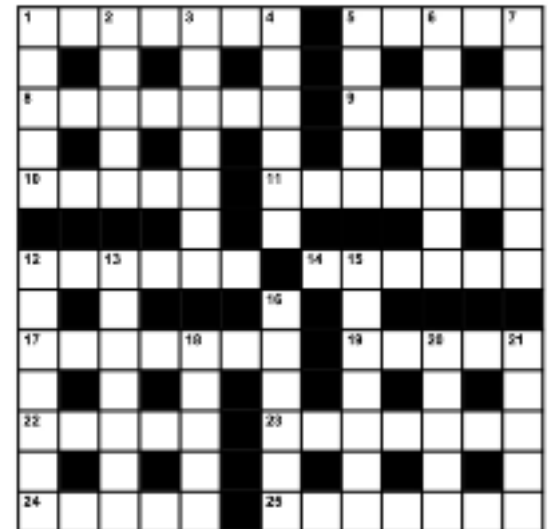

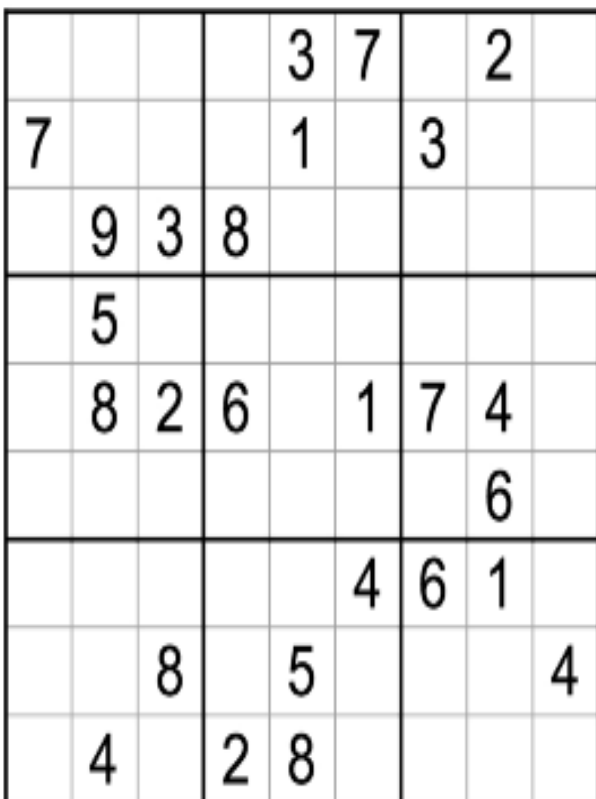

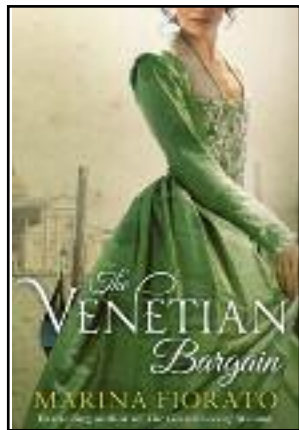

Venetian Bargain: a plague on their houses?

■ Exclusive interview with author Marina Fiorato and a review of her novel about fighting the plague in sixteenth century Venice
Rating: ★★★



"The whole book was inspired by Palladio's church of the Redentore, which was built in Venice to thank God for saving the city from the plague," says The Venetian Bargain author Marina Fiorato. "I hadn't realized that there had been such a massive outbreak in Venice in the sixteenth century. I knew about the plagues in Europe in 1348 and 1666 but did not know that Venice had been so badly hit between those times. Once I had Palladio and his church as the 'stone spine' of the book, I hit on

the idea of having the two doctors, one eastern and one western, one male and one female, fighting the plague too in their very different ways."

The book opens in 1576, five years after the defeat of the Ottoman Empire at the Battle of Lepanto, as a ship slips unnoticed into Venice. A very ill man staggers off the ship more dead than alive. This deadly gift from the Turkish Sultan carries the bubonic plague. Feyra is fleeing Constantinople to

avoid becoming a concubine of the Sultan. She becomes very ill and barely manages to stay alive on the voyage. The Doge, concerned about the people of Venice, commissions architect Andrea Palladio to build a church to save Venetians from the plague. Palladio falls ill. Feyra becomes a member of Palladio's household and under his protection, but can she save him?

"I was allowed access to the plague island in Venice, the Lazzaretto Novo, a truly evocative place," says Fiorato. "The inside of the hospital is covered with amazing and detailed artwork drawn by the plague victims. It's as if these men and women thought they would never see home again, so they drew and wrote about things that meant something to them. They created their own

vistas, as they had no view from the hospital. It's very moving, but strangely hopeful and peaceful."

"I had a wonderful time researching this book, because as well as the plague island of Venice I got to go to Istanbul and visit the harems of the Topkapi palace. The harems had a remarkable, all female society, presided over by the Sultana. A strange dichotomy existed. Although the women could be seen as subjugated prisoners, they were also emancipated, because the absence of men meant that they had a certain amount of freedom to embrace masculine roles. For example, there were women there who were well practiced in medicine. One of these women, a harem doctor called Feyra, became my heroine."

In a tiny museum in what used to be the plague hospital on the Lazzaretto Novo, Fiorato discovered some very interesting artifacts. "I was able to view some primary documents, such as letters from Venice's council of health. The paper was very sepia colored, with white bars cutting across the text. I asked what the markings were and was told that all the mail was smoked using tongs before it was allowed to enter the city. So many methods of dealing with the pestilence were quite sophisticated, but others, such as wearing a dead frog about your neck, were very primitive."

The Venetian Bargain is Fiorato's fifth book. Her other works are The Glassblower of Murano, The Madonna of the Almonds, The Botticelli Secret and Daughter of

Siena. Since The Venetian Bargain she has written a sixth book, Beatrice and Benedick, a prequel to Shakespeare's play Much Ado About Nothing.

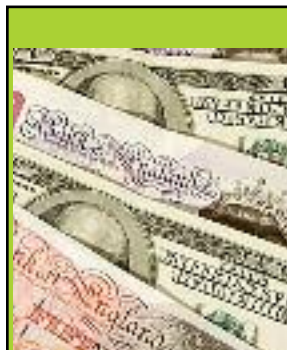
FRUITY SUMMER AHEAD: thanks to those clever Woolly Pockets

He later became the Under-18 Academy coach and led the Canaries to FA Youth Cup victory in 2013, beating Chelsea in both home and away legs of the final.

Wilshere handed No. 7 shirt

England midfielder Jack Wilshere could be set for a key role at the World Cup, despite an injury-hit season, after being handed the number seven shirt.

The Football Association announced England's squad numbers for the finals in Brazil on Thursday.

Wilshere, 22, has only played twice for Arsenal since March, but could be in line to start England's World Cup opener against Italy on 14 June.

There were few other surprises, with Daniel Sturridge taking number nine.

The 24-year-old striker has been rewarded for his fine season with Liverpool and could start along with Manchester United striker Wayne Rooney, who has been handed the number 10 shirt as expected.

Fellow United forward Danny Welbeck will wear number 11, hinting at a three-man attack for England manager Roy Hodgson.

Liverpool midfielder and England captain Steven Gerrard retains his number four shirt and veteran Chelsea midfielder Frank Lampard takes the number eight.

Wilshere, who is coming back to fitness after suffering a hairline fracture in his foot playing for England on 5 March, could make up a three-man central midfield, according to the squad numbers.

Hodgson confirmed Everton's Phil Jagielka and Chelsea's Gary Cahill as his likely first-choice centre-half pairing, with the number five and six shirts respectively.

Wenger promised £100m war chest

■ Arsene to cash in on FA Cup glory with bumper summer transfer kitty

ARSENE WENGER has been told to spend £100m this summer to dominate domestically and in Europe next season.

The Arsenal boss guided his side to their first trophy in nine years last weekend when they defeated Hull 3-2 in a dramatic FA Cup Final.

He will now be handed a bumper transfer war chest to ensure the Gunners can keep up with Manchester City, Chelsea and Liverpool.

Toulouse right-back Serge Aurier and Real Sociedad winger Antoine Griezmann are both on

Wenger's radar, as are former Gunners Carlos Vela and Cesc Fabregas.

Long-term Emirates Stadium director Lord Harris of Peckham reckons three or four signings will ensure Arsenal challenge for top honours.

"We want to win the Premier League and the Champions League. If we buy two or three players then I think we can," Lord Harris said in the London Evening Standard.

"We want to win. We don't want to be second, we don't want to be third and we don't want to be

fourth.

Arsene Wenger said the FA Cup final comeback against Hull City on Saturday can be a turning point towards a successful new era for the club.

"It was an important moment in the life of this team," said Wenger, who confirmed he will sign a new contract.

"To lose would have been a major setback but to win will be a good platform to build on."

Wenger's contract is due to expire at the end of the season but he has repeatedly expressed his desire to continue in the

role he has held since 1996.

Asked whether he would now sign a new deal, he said: "That should normally happen yes, and we are in very normal circumstances. It was never a question of leaving. It was a question of doing the right job for this football club."

James Chester and Curtis Davies put Hull two up inside eight

minutes but Santi Cazorla pulled a goal back before half-time. Laurent Koscielny equalised to send the game into extra time, when Aaron Ramsey scored the winner.

Wenger, who won the FA Cup for the fifth time in his Arsenal career, said: "It was more important today than all the others.

Twice we had won the double, so we had already won something and were

not under the pressure we were under here.

"It is a feeling of relief and happiness as we were under severe pressure to win and we didn't start well of course. Hull started stronger and you could see we were hesitant.

We demonstrated how to respond to being 2-0 down but we also demonstrated how not to start an FA Cup final."

Van Gaal ready to dump £27m flop Fellani

Manchester United are keen to offload flop signing Marouane Fellani - if they find someone willing to splash out £15m to buy him.

The Belgian man mountain (right) was brought in as David Moyes' first big signing as United boss.

However, he has endured a torrid eight months at Old Trafford.

New boss Louis Van Gaal is not a fan of the midfielder and sees him as surplus to requirements, according to the Daily Express.

United spent £27.5m on prising Fellani away from Everton last season.

But despite his decent goalscoring record for the Toffees, he's failed to score in his 16



appearances in all competitions for the Red Devils.

His Old Trafford career has been blighted by a wrist injury, which kept him out for three months of the season.

Van Gaal has told reporters he is keen to replicate his feats at Barcelona and Bayern Munich by winning the league in his first season.

The Dutchman won

the 1997-98 La Liga title at Barcelona before securing the 2009-10 Bundesliga with Bayern Munich.

Three managers have won the Premier League at the first go - Chelsea duo Jose Mourinho and Carlo Ancelotti and Manuel Pellegrini at Manchester City.

"I would be proud if it works right away," said 62-year-old Van Gaal.
