# Nation drowns its sorrows as England suffer ANOTHER World Cup heartbreak

- Pubs packed as nearly half the nation watched the vital match in Brazil
- Torment as Luis Suárez put boot into England's campaign with two goals

Despair swept once more through tens of thousands of pubs on Thursday as England all but crashed out of the World Cup after just its second match.

As the motorways emptied and the bars filled, England came to a standstill for a do or die clash against Uruguay in Sao Paulo, Brazil - downing an estimated 37million pints.

But if the 25million fans back home were hoping the joy of the weekend would come early, they were sorely disappointed.

Although England were not technically eliminated until Friday morning with Costa Rica's victory over Italy, on Thursday night the mood of the country positively funereal.

After Luis Suarez's late winner there was nothing left for the millions of fans at pubs and bars across the country but to drown their sorrows - and drown them they did, with record sales expected at many bars and pubs

across the country.

It is the first time England has ever lost both its opening two matches in a World Cup campaign and the first English qualifying side not to make it through the group stage since 1958.

After losing their first match to Italy, England faced being knocked out of the tournament if they were to be beaten by a much-fancied Uruguay team.

## agonizing

As the fateful clash drew towards half time things were not looking good for Roy's boys - with Uruguay leading 1-0 after a 39th-minute header by Luis Suárez.

After an agonising half-hour the lions roared back, with Wayne Rooney bringing the score level to 1-1.

But Suarez struck again in the 85th minute, latching onto an errant header from Liverpool teammate Steven Gerrard to power home the

decisive goal.

## racist

Suarez has proved a controversial figure in England, receiving a long ban for racist abuse and, on another occasion, for biting an opponent.

Now he is sure to be Public Enemy No1 again after breaking English hearts.

After the game, the Uruguay star said: 'I dreamt this. I'm enjoying this moment, because of all I suffered, the criticism I received. So, there you go.'

England manager Roy Hodgson praised Suarez, saying: 'He had two chances and as a top player he took those chances - and ended ours. We're more than disappointed. We're devastated. We fully believed we could do enough to get a result in this game. I don't know what to say at this moment in time.'

The fact it was Suarez who sealed England's

defeat was greeted with derision by some England fans on Twitter. Labour MP Ian Austin said: 'Of all the people, it had to be the dirty, cheating violent racist cheat Suarez.'

Many celebrities turned

the air blue on Twitter when Suarez scored his late winner.

TV presenter Philip Schofield tweeted: 'ARSE!!!!' Well I'm having a bloody drink!!! Damn damn damn and damn

again.'

Chat show host Alan Carr was more concise: 'S\*\*\*, s\*\*\*, s\*\*\*, s\*\*\*.'

pundit Joey Barton tweeted: 'Got bullied tonight. Apart from one or two it's a team of fannies.'

Pop star Rihanna led criticism of England's defending in their World Cup defeat by Uruguay - as former international players likened it to the standard of a Sunday League match.

Despite being from Barbados, the singer gave her backing to England in a running commentary on

her Twitter page.

After seeing the sloppy play which allowed Luis Suarez to score his second, she declared: 'Man they know better than to give Suarez that much room bruh!'

### 'priceless'

Her criticism was echoed by former England striker Gary Lineker, who said: 'Our defending is appalling!'

Earlier in the game, Match Of The Day presenter Lineker feared Wayne Rooney was 'destined never to score' in a World Cup, after a

header bounced off the cross bar.

But was forced to eat his words when the Manchester United player broke his duck for the first time to equalise, describing the goal as 'priceless'.

It was at least a good night for England's pubs, with hostels expecting their biggest night of the year, with an estimated 3.5million people heading to their local bar.

An extra six million pints of beer were expected to be poured around the country as pubs cashed in on an extra £25million of trade, according to the British Beer and Pub Association.

Bookies were also looking forward to a huge increase in trade, with £285 million expected to be gambled over the summer - at least £5million of that on Thursday's game.

Britain's leading TV pundits were unforgiving in their assessment of the night's events, branding England's defending "schoolboyish" and something you see in Sunday league football, according to former England captain Rio Ferdinand.

Ferdinand, speaking on BBC's Match of the Day, said: "The defending was nightmarish, especially for Uruguay's second goal. It came from just a straight ball up the pitch from the goalkeeper and it was schoolboyish from England's point of view. You cannot let that happen.

"In that situation, I am either dropping off and making sure there are no opposition players between me and the goalkeeper, or I am going to attack the ball and win it."

And former England winger Chris Waddle, whose rant on BBC's Five Live call-in show following England's exit from the World Cup in 2010 went viral, also weighed in, saying: "The

## Government to ban 'greedy' council spy cars

The widespread use of static and car-mounted cameras to catch drivers who park illegally in England is to be banned, the government has announced.

It says so-called "spy cars" have been used as a "cash cow" by councils, and it wants to end the "plague" of parking fines being sent in the post.

Instead traffic wardens will have to fix penalty notices to windscreens.

Councils will still be able to use the cameras near schools, in bus lanes and bus stops, and on "red routes".

Currently, some councils can use CCTV cameras or "approved devices" to enforce parking restrictions, under Labour's 2004 Traffic Management Act.

### 'Fairer deal'

The government says nine million parking fines are now issued every year by local authorities in England and wants to rein-in "over-zealous parking enforcement practices".

The ban follows a three-month consultation.

Announcing the measures, Communities Secretary Eric Pickles said the government was taking "urgently needed action to ban this clear abuse of CCTV".

"CCTV spy cars can be seen lurking on every street raking in cash for greedy councils and breaking the rules that clearly state that fines should not be used to generate profit for town halls.

"Over-zealous parking enforcement and unreasonable stealth fines by post undermine the high street, push up the cost of living and cost local authorities more in the long term," he said.

However, the Local Government Association says the cameras stop motorists parking dangerously and protect pedestrians.

Transport Secretary Patrick McLoughlin said the measures would deliver a "fairer deal for motorists, ensuring that parking enforcement is proportionate, that school children are protected and buses can move freely, and that key routes are kept clear".

most disappointing thing was that it felt like a step backwards after the Italy game. This time, England were a little bit subdued.

"Nothing has changed since England went out of the World Cup four years ago. I don't think we are good enough, it is as

simple as that.

"Our defending was atrocious for the Uruguay goals, but, when they pressed us for an hour, we were awful because, when our players were under pressure, they did not want the ball in any area.

"Yes, England showed

commitment and effort and there will always be the odd moment where they are on top for a while, like in the second half, but I don't think we can have any complaints about being beaten again. Uruguay totally deserved to win."

# British jihadist tweets violent message calling for PM David Cameron to be beheaded

A BRITISH jihadist fighting with the savage militant Muslim forces overrunning Iraq has called for David Cameron and Theresa May to be beheaded.

The insurgent, calling himself Abu Rashash Britani, had already threatened to bring terror back to the UK.

Writing on Twitter, the fanatic said: "I think when

we establish khilafah (a Muslim state), a battalion of mujahadeen shud head to UK and capture davidcameron & theresamay n behead them both."

In a sickening call to arms he urged his "brothers" to take to the streets and kill.

He also called for revenge for the killing of a female Muslim student in

Essex this week – although it is not known yet if her murder was religiously motivated.

Dozens of deeply-disturbing messages from Britani are a chilling echo of the tirade spouted by Michael Adebolajo and Michael Adebowale moments after they butchered helpless soldier Lee Rigby in Woolwich in May of last

year.

In one, Britani says: "Pray a revenge attack takes place in the UK against enemies of Islam and Muslims."

Last night the messages were removed from Twitter along with his account. But anti-terror officers were monitoring his hate-filled outpouring.

A Home Office spokesman said: "We do not tolerate the existence of online terrorist and extremist propaganda."

Britani claims to be in Iraq fighting for extremist Sunni Islamist militant group The Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant (Isis), which has swept into

Shia-ruled Iraq from Syria. David Cameron warned this week that the danger from returning British jihadists under the spell of Isis leader Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi is the greatest terror threat the UK currently faces.

Baroness Neville-Jones, 74, former chairman of the Joint Intelligence Committee, repeated the warning saying: "There are many potential threats to the security of the UK

but this is the most serious to our homeland."

Al-Baghdadi has a £6million bounty on his head. Almost 500 Britons are thought to have joined his brutal terrorists.

It also emerged this week that a former Saddam Hussein henchman, dubbed the King of Clubs in the US "Deck of 55" most-wanted Iraqis, is a galvanizing figure in the rise of Isis in northern Iraq.

"As soon as she opened the door, they barged in, four of them wearing masks and holding Stanley knives," he explained.

"She was begging them to stop shouting - she was saying 'I'll open the safe so long as you stop pushing me around and yelling'. They were out of control and hysterical - Nancy was calm."

## Genesis back together after nearly 40 years

**Genesis have reunited for the first time in almost 40 years for a BBC documentary about their career.**

Five members of the band - Peter Gabriel, Steve Hackett, Mike Rutherford, Phil Collins and Tony Banks - found themselves in the same room for the first time since 1975.

They reunited for Genesis: Together and Apart, a feature-length documentary to be broadcast later this year on BBC Two.

Gabriel left the band in 1975 and other members later went on to solo projects.

Three of the members

- Banks, Rutherford and Collins - played a farewell gig in Rome in 2007, to a crowd of 500,000.

There have been many rumours of the reformed five-piece playing together again.

Gabriel said last year: "It's never been ruled out. I'm trying to picture a time when it would top my priorities list though.

"Actually, I was thinking about that the other day. We're quite lucky. Looking back at other bands of our generation, there's usually one or two missing now. So you do get a sense of the clock."

Hackett has said a full-blown reunion is "possible but unlikely". And Rutherford told the Daily Telegraph earlier this year that there would be no new material from the band.

"Older artists have had their time," he said.

"People who like you have got a bunch of your songs on the iPod and that's enough. If they're going to buy new stuff, they're going to buy

something else."

Missing from the line-up is Anthony Phillips, another founder member of the band who left in 1970 after suffering from stage fright.

## Drugs bust after 999 call blunder

■ An accidental 999 call led police in Crewe to a cannabis farm

A man with an £18,000 cannabis farm in his front room was arrested after accidentally dialling 999 from the house.

The 42-year-old suspect somehow rang the emergency number from a landline at the property in Haweswater Avenue, Crewe, Cheshire, at around 2pm yesterday.

The call was logged as an abandoned emergency call - and police officers were dispatched to check on the welfare of the caller.

### 'Epic fail'

But when they knocked on the door and went inside they found 18

mature cannabis plants being grown in the front room - each with an estimated street value of £1,000.

After the unusual drugs bust, Crewe Police tweeted: "Epic fail of the day goes to the man in Crewe who rang 999 by accident. We arrived to check he was safe... and found his cannabis farm!"

Local beat manager Pc Shelley Woods, of Cheshire Police, said: "The circumstances around this call being made beggars belief. We don't often find people in this position as accommodating to police inquiries."

A spokesman for the

Cheshire force said: "Shortly before 2pm yesterday police received an abandoned emergency call originating from the Crewe area.

"As a result, local officers attended an address on Haweswater Avenue to carry out a concern for welfare check on the caller.

"On arrival, it emerged that the occupant of the property had dialled in error; however, a large number of suspected cannabis plants were discovered in the front room of the house.

"A 42-year-old local man has been arrested in connection with the discovery."

# Pippa Middleton takes a spin down in Oceanside...

KATE MIDDLETON's much-photographed little sister Pippa made a surprise appearance in California this weekend, helping to launch the 3,000-mile, 12-state Race Across America charity bicycle race in Oceanside.

Pippa sported an eye-catching red, white and blue Union Jack-patterned cycling jacket and tight blue shorts, as she set off on the race's first leg with 27-year-old brother James.

"On 14th June, my brother and I, along with six friends will be setting off on a West to East Coast

Race Across America (RAAM)," she said in a statement posted on her fundraising page on Saturday. "This relay cycling event spans 3,000 miles, 12 states and 88 counties. We are aiming to complete this non-stop challenge in eight days, riding between 350 and 500 miles a day."

The two siblings of the Duchess of Cambridge are riding with six other cyclists and are taking part in the challenge to help benefit the British Heart Foundation, of which Pippa serves as an ambassador, and the Michael Matthews Foundation, a children's

charity named for youngest-ever Briton to summit Mount Everest, who then died on the way down in 1999. His brother, also named James, is one of the Middletons' team mates.

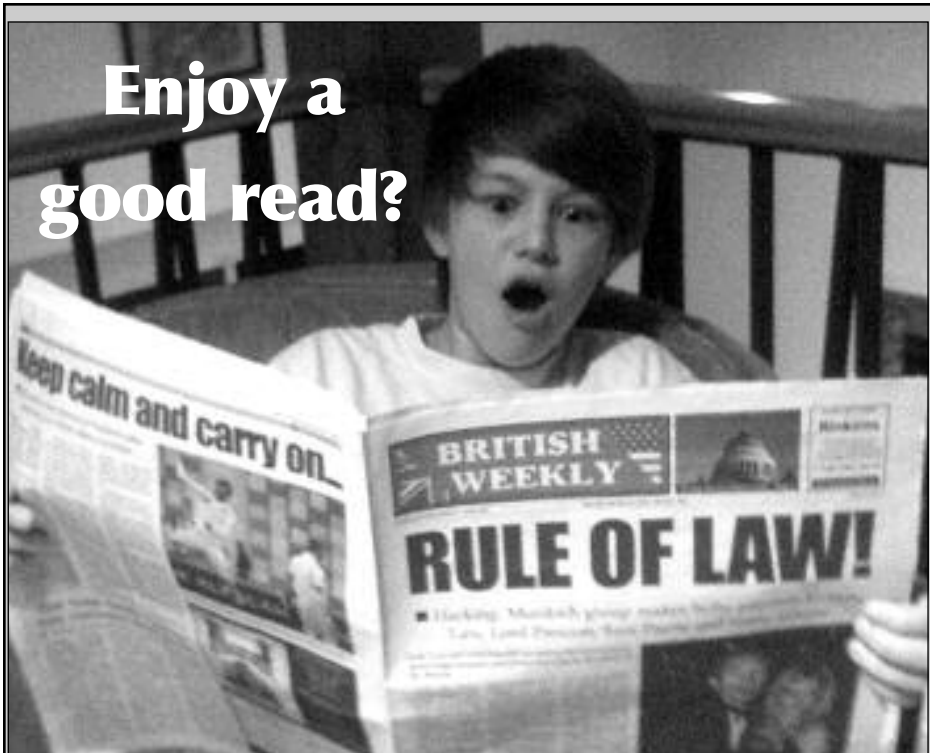
Participants have a maximum number of nine days to complete the Race Across America and some parts are pretty rough—they will end up climbing more than 100,000 feet during the journey. The route starts in Oceanside, California, and goes through states including Utah, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, Illinois, Ohio and West Virginia before

ending in Annapolis, Maryland, located about 30 miles south of Baltimore. Pippa's team reached Congress, Arizona at Sunday, June 15, around noon, according to the official website.

After completing the Race Across America challenge, Pippa's bike is set to be auctioned on eBay, according to the British Heart Foundation website. Pippa also plans to fly to Istanbul, Turkey, to compete in the 4-mile Bosphorus Cross-Continental Swimming Race, swimming from Europe to Asia, on behalf of the charity.

# Great British people, film festivals...and a certain World Cup

Hey Breeps -

I always say to people that it takes a certain kind of British person to pack up, say goodbye and move 6000 miles away to start a new life. 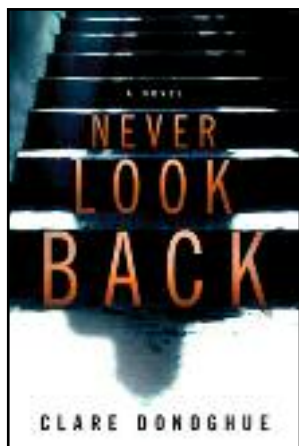
## Never Look Back: this stalker's a keeper...

■ Exclusive Interview with author Clare Donoghue and a review of her new crime fiction novel

Rating: ★★★

"The surprising part about writing the book was that it became a crime novel at all," says *Never Look Back* author Clare Donoghue. "It had started out as a psychological thriller. I began by putting together scenes, embellishing scary things that had happened to me or people I knew. In the original plot, Sarah Grainger was the lead character. However, I soon realized I needed a narrator or perspective other than hers: that's when DI Lockyer was born.

Detective Inspector Mike Lockyer is head of



homicide on the South London police force. There's a bold killer on the loose. Three young women have been found brutally murdered in his precinct. Their bodies discarded in plain sight, people only yards from where the murders took place. A London photographer Sarah Grainger realizes she has a stalker following her every move and it paralyzes her with fear. Lockyer needs to find the murder. Helping him is DS Jane Bennett. As

Lockyer struggles to find the killer, he realizes that his estranged daughter matches the victim profile. Will he find the killer before the killer targets his daughter?

This new series is quite menacing. If you really like to be scared you will enjoy this book. The story is broken down by days as you follow DI Lockyer and his fellow officer Jane. The subplot that collides with the main plot is just as suspenseful as Sarah's life spins out of her control and she becomes more paranoid. Donoghue's writing is clear, precise and disturbing, leaving you asking at the end, what's next?

"I have always been fascinated, puzzled, by stalking and the motivations behind it," says Donoghue. "My own interest became Sarah's fear and developed into something

more sinister. The idea for *Never Look Back* developed over time. I started writing in 2006. I had the basics, but the story was missing something. The rest of the plot came to me while I was walking on the Cornish coast. A killer preying on young women was the element I needed to bring the whole story together."

"I've discovered that writing, crime fiction particularly, is perfectly suited to my personality," says Donoghue. "I am a very organized and ordered person which comes in very handy when I'm plotting, keeping all the threads of a story together. I'm also happy in my own company, so hours and hours in my living room writing is a dream come true for me. I'm also somewhat phobic of alarm clocks and early

mornings, so being able to make my own schedule is brilliant. And finally, I love a glass of cold white wine so the social occasions, lunches and chatting to writers and readers alike is enjoyable too. In essence, I'm very lucky."

Donoghue uses the Internet for much of her research. "Researching, checking the weather, social media, maps, timetables...anything and everything I might need is only a few clicks away. Modern writers are certainly very lucky in that respect. You can find out pretty much everything without ever leaving the comfort of your writing room."

Donoghue consulted a pathologist, a coroner and several police officers. "My main contact now is a retired Detective Chief Inspector who actually worked in the murder squad in London," says

Donoghue. "I'm able to talk through my plots with him and discuss how the police would react and deal with each situation."

Donoghue was born in the Cotswolds and is based in Somerset.

# Hodgson 'not resigning'

England manager Roy Hodgson insists he will not resign, despite his side being eliminated from the World Cup at the group stage.

Luis Suarez's double for Uruguay condemned England to their second successive defeat in Group D and Costa Rica's 1-0 win over Italy on Friday means a humiliating early exit.

"I don't have any intention to resign," he

said. "I've been really happy with the way the players have responded to the work we've tried to do."

Hodgson took over shortly before Euro 2012, where England were eliminated on penalties by Italy in the quarter-finals, while they qualified unbeaten for this World Cup in Brazil.

"I'm bitterly disappointed, of course, but I don't feel I need to

resign, no," he added.

"On the other hand, if the FA think I'm not the right man to do the job, that will be their decision not mine."

"I'm really bitterly disappointed," added Hodgson. "We came with such high hopes and have not been able to deliver. It is a major sadness for me."

He added: "I'm numb really - numb with disappointment and sadness that so many hopes and dreams and so much work has been blown away."

Hodgson bemoaned the stop-start manner of a contest that was decided by Suarez's 84th-minute winner.

"Uruguay are very different to Italy. They allow you more chance to play, the game is broken up less," he said.

"There were a few challenges that went unpunished; the referee allowed the game to flow but sometimes to our detriment."

"Although I don't think anyone could question the players' desire, we haven't been good enough to win the two games."

"We thought after the equaliser if anyone would get a winner it would be us but, unfortunately, one kick down the field and a flick on came through to Luis Suarez and he doesn't miss those chances."

A desperately disappointed England captain Steven Gerrard paid tribute to his Liverpool teammate Suarez after the game:

"Luis Suarez is deadly in front of goal. He is very clever and cute. He nearly scored off two corners and he hasn't played for five weeks but everyone was very aware of his ability."

He added: "Roy Hodgson is a fantastic

England were looking nervous at the back and were fortunate to survive when Phil Jagielka's sliced clearance fell to Cristian Rodriguez, whose rising drive from the angle just cleared the bar with goalkeeper Joe Hart beaten.

Uruguay were the more ordered side and the goal arrived from the most inevitable source seven minutes before half-time as Suarez marked his return in style.

Gerrard conceded possession in midfield and when Edinson Cavani delivered the perfect cross, Suarez pulled away from Jagielka to head across Hart before running to celebrate with the Uruguayan medical team who have nursed him back to fitness.

England, as they did against Italy, responded strongly and Uruguay keeper Fernando Muslera needed to be alert to block Sturridge at his near post.

In a chaotic start to the second half, Suarez was wasteful as England appealed for offside and Cavani was guilty of a bad miss as he ran

through on Hart.

Rooney was almost the beneficiary of that escape when he found room in the area only eight yards out, but his shot was straight at Muslera.

Hodgson, knowing what defeat would mean, made his first change after 64 minutes by sending on Ross Barkley for Sterling, who had struggled to impose himself on Uruguay as he had against the Italians.

England were moving into desperate times as the clock ran down - and it was Rooney who produced the goods with the equaliser 15 minutes from time, tapping in from close range from Johnson's perfect cross.

Just as the momentum looked to be shifting towards England, Suarez was the tormentor again, latching on to a long punt from Muslera after Gerrard had inadvertently headed into his path. He then steadied himself before rifling an unstoppable finish high past Hart.

It was the final word on this game - and on England's World Cup hopes. For Roy Hodgson and those not-so-wise men in the England set-up, it's very much a case of back to the drawing board.

Yet again.

## Suarez snaps back at his critics

**MAGNAMITY was in short supply from Luis Suarez after he guided his team to a 2-1 World Cup win over England, claiming the win brought him retribution against his critics in England.**

The Liverpool striker, 27, scored in both halves to condemn England to their second successive loss in Group D and leave them close to a World Cup exit.

"Before the game too many people in England laughed about my attitude over the last few years."

"This is a very good time for me. I want to see what they think now."

Suarez, who missed Uruguay's opening World Cup defeat by Costa Rica after a month out following knee surgery, has been subjected to heavy

criticism since signing for Liverpool from Ajax in 2011.

He was banned for 10 matches after biting the arm of Chelsea's Branislav Ivanovic in a Premier League match in April 2013 and was given an eight-match suspension for racially abusing Manchester United's Patrice Evrain October 2011.

### 'amazing moment'

"It has been like a dream. It is something I have dreamt about very often," he said. "It was one of the best games I've played. It's an amazing moment for me."

"Maybe a few days ago I thought this wouldn't be possible."

Suarez's late winning goal, a powerful strike after Liverpool team-mate Steven Gerrard had miscued a

header, came just nine minutes after Wayne Rooney had cancelled out the Uruguayan striker's headed opener. It took the striker's tally to five goals in seven World Cup matches.

### 'one of the best'

"I had to keep calm, keep my cool and when I got the ball I just kicked it with my whole heart thinking of all those who have supported me."

"I would like to say thank you to my wife and my two children, my physiotherapist Walter Ferreira and my team-mates."

Amid his job, Suarez had some sympathy for Gerrard.

"I told him to keep going," he said of his Liverpool team-mate. "He's the best player I've played with."

- Another World Cup fiasco as England tumble out in less than a week

ENGLAND.....1  
URUGUAY.....2

**SEVEN DAYS.** That's how long it took England's World Cup dreams to evaporate in the unrelenting heat of their Brazilian campaign.

But it wasn't the weather that did for England, but rather the team's inability both to find the net at one end and to keep a clean sheet at the other.

Ahead of their do-or-die showdown with Uruguay on Thursday Roy Hodgson's men were in buoyant mood, despite losing their opening match 2-1 to Italy at the weekend.

But as so often has been the case in major tournaments in recent decades, English optimism soon gave way to despair, with Luis Suarez striking twice to give Uruguay a gut-wrenching 2-1 win in Sao Paolo, and on Friday those soccer giants Costa Rica put the nation of out of its collective misery, delivering a gentle coup

de grace by dispatching Italy 1-0 to ensure their date with England in Belo Horizonte next week will be rendered meaningless for those wearing the Three Lions on their shirt.

Liverpool striker Suarez was making his return after a month out following knee surgery - and it proved to be bad timing for England and manager Roy Hodgson as his brilliance was the difference in a fiercely-fought encounter.

Suarez put Uruguay ahead with a first-half header then scored a superb winner six minutes from time after Wayne Rooney's first goal at a World Cup gave England hope of avoiding a second successive Group D loss.

Uruguay coach Oscar Tabarez claimed Suarez would not be fully fit after missing their opening defeat against Costa Rica and he did not look it, but he still possessed too much guile and menace for an England team who never built on the promise they showed even in

losing to Italy.

Rooney struck the bar and was England's main threat but Uruguay - or to be more precise Suarez - produced the quality and clinical finishing that decides games such as this.

As expected, Hodgson played Rooney in a more central role and moved Raheem Sterling wide - but England struggled to find the same energy levels that fuelled such a positive performance against Italy.

Daniel Sturridge and Sterling could not pose

the same threat as they had in Manaus and it was Rooney who came closest

with a free-kick just inches wide and then against the bar at the far

post from Steven Gerrard's free-kick.
