Jihadi John named

■ The identity of the Islamic State killer, who appeared in beheading videos for Isil, was known to British security services but they chose not to disclose it

The Islamic State killer Jihadi John has been identified as Mohammed Emwazi, from west London.

Emwazi was known to British security services but they chose not to disclose his name earlier for operational reasons, it was claimed on Thursday.

He is believed to have travelled to Syria around 2012 and to have later joined the Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant (Isil), the group terrorising Iraq and Syria.

Jihadi John first appeared in a video last August, when he appeared to kill the American journalist James Foley.

The Isil terrorist apparently studied computer sciences at Westminster University. The Washington Post describes Emwazi as Kuwaiti-born and in his mid-20s.

He was apparently raised in a middle class neighbourhood and occasionally prayed at a mosque in Greenwich.

Emwazi lived in a three-bedroomed flat on the first floor of a contemporary block of flats on Warwick Crescent, Maida Vale,

between 1996 and 1997. The block is sandwiched between the Regents Park canal and the M40, with the maisonettes overlooking both. The flats currently sell for up to £800,000.

Neighbours did not remember the family.

Friends told the Post that Emwazi began to radicalise after a planned safari to Tanzania after he graduated from Westminster.

The Washington Post cite two friends of Mohammed Emwazi as sources who have identified him as Jihadi John. One is an unidentified close friend who says: "He was like a brother to me. ... I am sure it is him."

The other is Asim Qureshi, a researcher at Cage, an organisation which campaigns for the rights of Muslim prisoners. Mr Qureshi said he was in contact with Emwazi after he was arrested in Tanzania while claiming to be going on a safari holiday.

He was released and flew to Amsterdam,

where he was detained again and accused by MI5 interrogators of having intended to go to Somalia to join al-Shabaab, the militant jihadist group fighting there.

Cage has released a statement blaming the British security agency, MI5, for his radicalism. "Mohammed Emwazi is a British citizen who was subjected to security

agency harassment for at least four years.

"He was repeatedly detained at airports, deported, barred from entering countries and even allegedly assaulted by officers. This treatment prevented him from leading a normal life while having no means to obtain redress, even though no evidence was ever presented to

Shock recall for enforcer Prescott

- Return of Labour bruiser confirms disarray in Opposition ranks as General Election looms
- Whispers grow louder of bitter rift between party leader Ed Miliband and shadow chancellor Ed Balls

John Prescott is to make a surprise comeback to the political frontline, after Ed Miliband called on the bruiser to 'bash heads together'.

Despite Lord Prescott frequently criticising Mr Miliband's party handling, he is to become the Labour leader's special adviser on climate change.

The appointment of Lord Prescott, who once punched a voter on the campaign trail, comes just weeks before the general election amid claims Mr Miliband is at 'logger-Eds' with his shadow chancellor Ed Balls.

experience

The decision to call on Lord Prescott ahead of the general will be seen as an attempt to turn the clock back to when Labour used to win elections.

The move was backed by Alastair Campbell, Tony Blair's former spin doctor, who also pledged to join the effort to get Mr Miliband elected.

The involvement of senior figures from the last decade contrast with

Mr Miliband's repeated claims to have moved on from the New Labour era.

The Labour leader said that he wanted to exploit Lord Prescott's experience in negotiating the landmark Kyoto Protocol in the run-up to a crucial United Nations summit in Paris at the end of the year.

Writing in The Observer, he said: 'His abilities and experience, as one of the architects of the Kyoto Protocol in 1997, must be used at this critical time for our future and there is no one better than John at bashing heads together to get a deal.'

However, it raises the prospect of him playing a high profile role during the election campaign.

tensions

Douglas Alexander, Labour's election co-ordinator, told Sky News: 'I fully expect that as well as that policy role, he will continue to support the Labour campaign in the months ahead and I welcome that.'

However, just months

ago Lord Prescott launched a scathing attack on Mr Miliband's 'too timid' approach to winning in May.

The Labour leadership is in the grip of a crisis, amid claims of deep divisions between Mr Miliband and Mr Balls.

Tensions have mounted over how to pay for Mr Miliband's flagship pledge to cut tuition fees from £9,000 to £6,000.

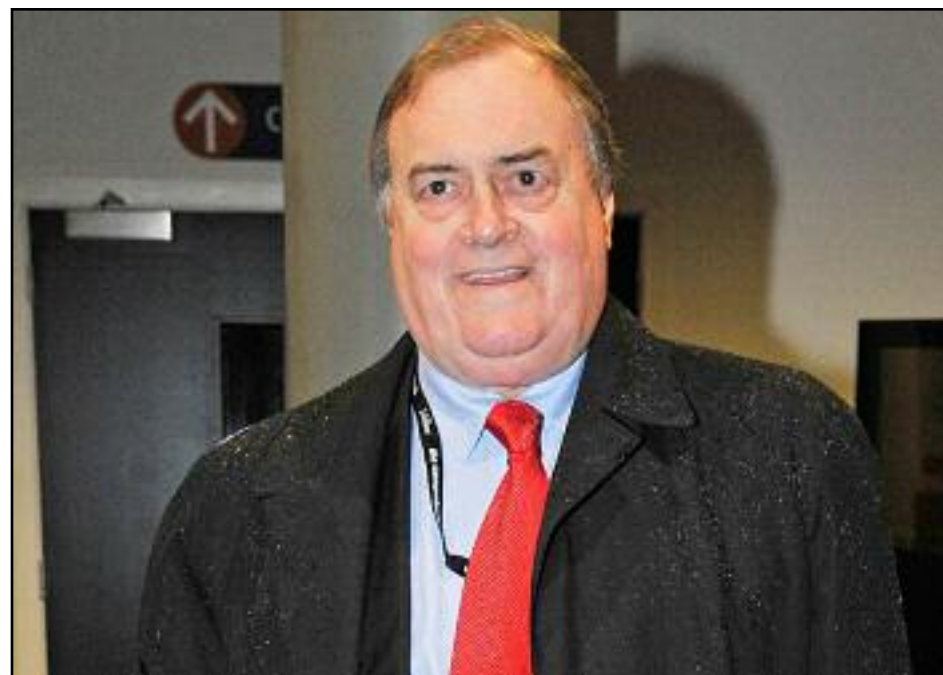
'logger-Eds'

A meeting last week designed to thrash out how to fund the plan 'did not end well', according to a report in the Sunday Times.

Problems at the top are now so bad that Labour MPs refer to "the Ed aches" or the two leaders being "at logger-Eds".

Mr Miliband is now being urged to ditch Mr Balls from the key economic brief if he wins the election to prevent a repeat of the deeply damaging clashes between Tony Blair and Gordon Brown in the last Labour government.

"They don't like each other and they don't

respect each other," another insider said.

Tory hopes of an Election victory were boosted Thursday night as a second opinion poll in under a week put them ahead of Labour.

The survey sees David Cameron's party rise two points to 35 per cent, with Labour on 33.

Ukip are on 15, the Greens on seven and Lib Dems on six.

It's the first time in three years that pollsters Opinion have put them ahead of Ed Miliband's party, and follows an ICM survey last week which gave the Tories a four-point lead over Labour.

Rifkind and Straw caught in cash-for-access scandal

TWO SENIOR politicians were left red-faced this week after appearing to offer cash for access in a classic newspaper sting.

Top Tory Sir Malcolm Rifkind and former Labour foreign secretary Jack Straw were implicated after the Daily Telegraph and Channel 4 revealed the pair had offered to use their positions as politicians on behalf of a fictitious Chinese company in return for thousands of pounds.

Rifkind has announced that he will stand down as Conservative MP for the Tory safe seat of Kensington after making "errors of judgment", while Straw's indiscretion may have cost him a Knighthood of the Garter – an honour in the sole gift of the Queen.

She is said to have developed a liking for Straw, 68, who met her regularly when he was Labour's Home Secretary and later Lord Chancellor.

Rifkind announced that he would not contest the general election and would also stand down as chairman of parliament's intelligence and security committee (ISC) with immediate effect. He will remain as a member of the committee, which is due to publish a report into privacy and security arising from the leaks by the NSA whistleblower Edward Snowden before the dissolution of parliament ahead of the general election in May.

Speaking after a meeting of the committee in Westminster, Rifkind said: "No, I don't think I did anything wrong. I may have made errors of judgment but then we all make errors of judgment. We are all human beings in that sense."

Fast-track Eddie flies home...and takes a detour to the train yard

■ Oscar winner starts work on latest Thomas the Tank engine project

EDDIE REDMAYNE may have become Hollywood royalty almost overnight, but it was back to reality on Tuesday, as the Oscar-winning actor left sunny Southern California behind, jetting back to a damp and grey London to get to work on a slightly less glamorous project - joining the cast of the latest Thomas the Tank Engine project, Sodor's Legend of the Lost Treasure.

Redmayne walked through the arrivals hall at Heathrow on Tuesday holding the arm of his new wife, Hannah Bagshawe, 32. The couple swiftly made their way through the airport in dark jeans, jackets and sunglasses before being driven off in a grey Audi.

Redmayne was carrying a small brown case, doubtless containing the coveted Oscar trophy when he won for his performance as Prof Stephen Hawking in The Theory of Everything.

'very proud'

The actor will be juggling his Thomas the Tank Engine duties with filming his forthcoming drama The Danish Girl, due out next year. In the film, Redmayne plays the painter Einar Wegener, who in 1930 became one of the first people to change sex, a throwback to his days as a schoolmate of Prince William at Eton, when he was often cast in female parts out of necessity.

But one of his priorities is to take his Oscar trophy to Cambridge to show Prof

Hawking.

The cosmologist, who made huge breakthroughs in science while battling motor neurone disease, told of his delight on his Facebook page.

"Congratulations to Eddie Redmayne for winning an Oscar for playing me in The Theory Of Everything movie," he said. "Well done, Eddie, I'm very proud of you."

Prof Hawking was not the only one expressing his pride in the Old Etonian.

Redmayne's 93-year-old grandmother, Mary Burke, from Gracemount, Edinburgh, said: "We're just delighted. We're a very close family. We're thrilled. He still pops up from time to time."

peace of mind

Mrs Burke's daughter is the actor's mother Patricia, who studied at the University of Edinburgh before moving to London.

His aunt, Karen Burke, said from her home in the city's Kirk Brae: "We just want to say very well done, we're very proud of him."

Despite receiving critical acclaim for his portrayal of Prof Hawking, Redmayne admitted that he had always feared being out of work.

The self-deprecating 33-year-old joked that the best actor win will give him some peace of mind about his future career.

"I've never really had much choice work-wise, I've always had to fight for the jobs and fought

pretty hard for them, certainly for The Theory Of Everything," he said.

"So as far as where you go from here, just retaining employment will keep me very happy."

Despite the global acclaim, he insisted he remains grounded, adding: "I'm not someone that dreams big."

Redmayne has said of The Danish Girl: "We're

looking at everything from a feminine perspective. How to sit, to walk, to pose, roll on a pair of stockings. How to put on a pair of heels and how to walk in them. Everything."

Britain's brightest leaving in brain drain and replaced with low skilled migrants

One in ten of Britain's best workers have been lured from the UK in a brain drain and been replaced by low skilled migrants, research has found.

The country's most highly skilled workers are emigrating because they can earn more money and enjoy better standards of living overseas, according to University College London.

But in their place the UK has attracted more than two million migrants with low numeracy skills, the report concluded.

The news was seen as an embarrassment to David Cameron, whose "no ifs, no buts" election pledge to slash immigration during his time in power is coming back to haunt him.

The Prime Minister promised to cut net migration to the "tens of thousands" by the 2015 General Election but official figures published on Wednesday are way off that mark.

The UCL study also found that migrants in the UK are six times more likely to have never worked than those born there.

Migrants are also more likely to be unemployed, with unemployed female

migrants almost double the rate of British born.

Dr John Jerrim, of the UCL Institute of Education, said: "Immigrants account for one in four of the 9.6 million working age adults living in the United Kingdom with low level numeracy skills.

"Immigration has therefore had its biggest impact upon the bottom end of the numeracy skill distribution; it has led to a significant increase in the supply of low skilled workers."

There are now an estimated 4.7 million Britons living abroad and, on average, more than 300,000 a year leave the UK, the report said.

Dr Jerrim said around "one in ten highly skilled British citizens now lives overseas".

The academic calculated that immigration added some 2.4 million people to the UK population with low numeracy skills.

Newest VC Hero 'Took On 20 Taliban' In Helmand Battle

■ Dodging bullets, Joshua Leakey saved the life of a US Marine and single-handedly regained the initiative in a fierce gun battle

A British soldier who showed "complete disregard" for his own safety has won the Victoria Cross for his role in a gun battle in Afghanistan.

Lance Corporal Joshua Leakey will receive the honour following a combined US/UK assault on a Taliban stronghold in Helmand Province in 2013.

His group came under attack from around 20 insurgents armed with machine guns and rocket propelled grenades.

Under heavy fire he ran to the top of a hill where he realised two friendly machine gun teams had been surrounded.

He then moved back down the hill to give first aid to a US Marine Corps captain and began casualty evacuation.

Despite being the most junior member of the group, he returned to the top of the hill to take

control of a machine gun, before moving position to fire on the enemy.

Again Lance Cpl Leakey ran 200 metres down the hill, this time to pick up a second machine gun. In 45 degree heat he clambered back up again with 60lbs of equipment on his back, drawing fire.

The troops around him were inspired by his actions and started fighting back.

During the battle, 11

insurgents were killed and four wounded.

According to his citation, his "gritty leadership" well-above his junior rank, "single-handedly regained the initiative and prevented considerable loss of life".

On hearing the news he was to receive the British armed forces' highest military honour, he said: "Why me? Why on earth have they picked me out for this.

"It's amazing to receive this, it's outrageous really. But it represents something more than just me, my mates who were there with me at the time, the rest of that tour, all the other tours the battalion has done and the regiment as well."

The Head of the Army, General Sir Nicholas Carter, clearly moved when announcing the honour, said he was "humbled to award him the Victoria Cross".

“Sex Pest” Jimmy Savile abused 60 people at Stoke Mandeville hospital, inquiry finds

■ Late BBC DJ was subject of at least 10 formal and informal complaints by victims going back to 1972, but none were taken seriously, report says

Jimmy Savile was given free rein to sexually abuse 60 people, including seriously ill eight-year-olds, over two decades at Stoke Mandeville hospital due to his gold-plated status as a celebrity fundraiser, an inquiry has found.

The late BBC DJ was the subject of at least 10 complaints going back to 1972, but none were taken seriously or raised with senior managers, according to the NHS investigation.

The victims included a girl aged eight or nine raped 10 times by Savile when she visited the hospital where her relatives worked.

A total of 177 people, mainly women or girls, say that Savile - one of the BBC's top presenters in the 1970s and 1980s, known for his eccentric dress sense and love of cigars — abused them from 1954 onwards.

‘too intimidated’

The latest allegations emerged in a new series of reports which help lift the lid on the full extent of his crimes, which only emerged after his death in 2011. This has prompted questions about why they were not detected earlier.

“People were either too dazzled or too intimidated by the nation's favourite celebrity to confront the evil predator we now know he was,” Health Secretary Jeremy Hunt told the House of Commons in a statement.

It is thought that Savile abused people in 41 acute hospitals - nearly a quarter of the total number in England.

Sixty of the allegations centre on Stoke Mandeville hospital northwest of London, where Savile was “given the run” of the facility, including his own flat, after being appointed as a fundraiser by Margaret Thatcher's government in 1980.

nine complaints

It is claimed he committed offences against patients, staff and visitors there ranging from rape to sexual touching between 1969 and 1992.

Victims of Savile, who worked as a voluntary porter at the hospital, included some young patients with spinal injuries, which the hospital specialises in treating.

While staff there saw him as a “sex pest”, nine complaints made against him were not referred to senior management, the report into what happened at Stoke Mandeville found.

His youngest victim was aged eight and the oldest was 40 and they included patients, staff and visitors.

“Because of his celebrity and useful fundraising skills, the right questions, the hard questions, were simply not asked,” Hunt said.

Liz Dux, a lawyer representing 44 of the victims, said it “beggars belief” that the report

found no evidence of senior managers knowing about the abuse.

‘whitewash’

“Those people who did know what Savile

was up to and to whom direct reports were made will get away scot-free,” she said. “It's simply, I'm afraid, a whitewash.”

Savile is also known to have abused patients at facilities including

Broadmoor, a high-security psychiatric hospital west of London, and the main hospital in his home city of Leeds, northern England.

An investigation into the culture at the BBC facilities.

when Savile is accused of committing abuse there is still gathering evidence, along with other probes into his actions at National Health Service (NHS) facilities.

The 56-year-old queen of pop was closing Wednesday's ceremony in London with a performance of her song “Living For Love.”

Madonna entered with a troupe of male dancers and appeared to fumble with a long, flowing cloak she was wearing. A member of the troupe yanked on the garment, which was tied at the neck, but rather than come off it pulled Madonna backward down three steps while her dancers looked on, seemingly in shock.

In a post on Instagram after the performance,

Madonna said she was doing OK.

“My beautiful cape was tied too tight! But nothing can stop me and love really lifted me up!” she wrote. “Thanks for your good wishes! I'm fine!”

The song includes a lyric about stumbling, then continues “I'm gonna carry on” - and Madonna did, continuing the m a t a d o r - t h e m e d routine.

The fall drew an instant, and mostly sympathetic, reaction from ceremony attendees and television viewers.

“I feel for her,” singer Ashley Roberts told ITV news. “She's a pro, though, and she kept

Latest abuse probe is 'absurd' claims furious Cliff Richard

■ South Yorkshire's Chief Constable has revealed David Crompton says the "expanding nature" of the investigation meant he could not give a date when it would be concluded

Sir Cliff Richard this week angrily denied he has sexually abused anyone after police revealed they are widening their current investigation into the pop veteran's past.

Detectives said more alleged victims have come forward to accuse the 74-year-old of attacking them.

But Sir Cliff, who has already been quizzed over allegations he targeted a young boy in the 1980s, said: "I have never, in my life, assaulted anyone.

"I have no idea where these absurd and untrue allegations come from. The police have not disclosed details to me. I have never, in my life, assaulted anyone and I remain confident that the truth will prevail.

"I have co-operated fully with the police and I will continue to do so.

"Beyond stating that the allegations are completely false it would not be appropriate for me to say anything further

until the investigation has concluded, which I hope will be very soon."

He added it had been an unbelievably difficult period" and also claimed he had not seen details of the fresh allegations.

'regular contact'

But officers insisted the star was not being kept in the dark about the probe. They said it was up to his lawyers to keep him informed of proceedings.

South Yorkshire Police Chief Constable David Crompton, whose force is carrying out the probe, said in a February 10 letter to chairman of the Commons Home Affairs Select Committee Keith Vaz: "This investigation has increased significantly in size since its inception.

"Sir Cliff Richard's lawyers are aware there is more than one allegation.

"Police are in very regular contact with Sir Cliff Richard's lawyers. Typically this involves a verbal update about once

a fortnight. We have not written directly to Sir Cliff Richard.

"It is the responsibility of his lawyers to ensure he is fully briefed on the conversations which have taken place."

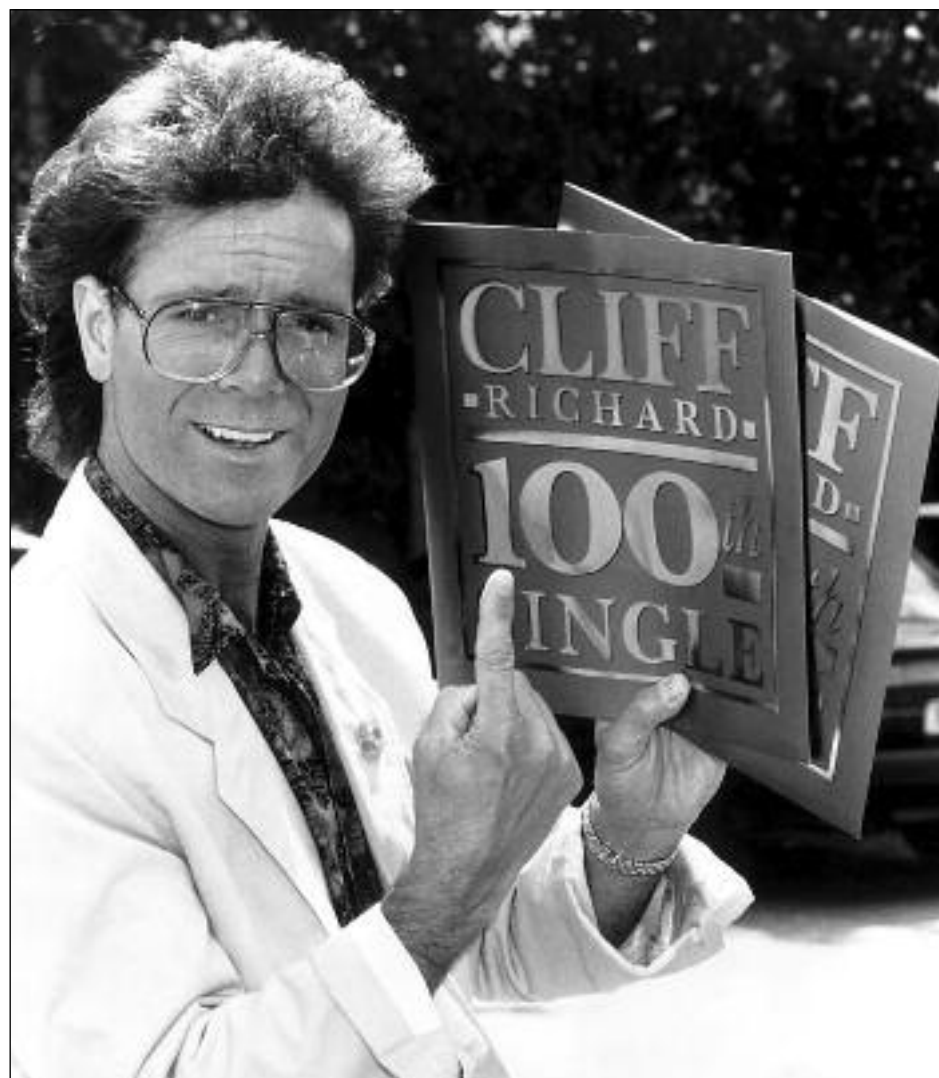
And the singer's hope for a swift conclusion to the probe appeared to be dashed by Mr Crompton.

His letter, which had two paragraphs blacked out before it was released, said: "In view of the expanding nature of the investigation it would be premature and potentially misleading to predict a conclusion date. We are progressing as swiftly as possible."

inquiry

Officers began investigating Sir Cliff last August after a man claimed the star attacked him at a Sheffield rally given by evangelist Billy Graham in 1985. He was interviewed under caution but not arrested or charged.

The search of Sir Cliff's £3.5million home in

Sunningdale, Berks, last August was covered live by the BBC - sparking an inquiry into how the corporation knew about the raid.

A report this week cleared South Yorkshire Police of publicity-seeking but said it should not have released details of the raid which breached the star's

privacy and left him "unnecessarily distressed".

South Yorkshire Police refused to comment on the latest allegations. Prosecutors have not been presented with a file for a charging decision.

Sir Cliff, whose career has spanned seven decades, has recently

been staying in Barbados. He attended a charity event in aid of severely brain-injured children on Saturday.

He said on his Facebook page he had a "wonderful evening".

A week before he performed at a gala to raise cash for a young people's sports complex on the island.

Australia strips shamed Rolf Harris of his honours

DISGRACED former entertainer Rolf Harris has been stripped of his Australian honours after he was convicted of sexually assaulting for young girls.

The children's presenter was jailed in July last year for five years and nine months for 12 counts of indecent assault on four girls - one of which was thought to be as young as eight.

The offences took place between 1968 and 1986

and his other victims include an autograph hunter and two girls in their early teens.

The 84-year-old has now had his Officer and Member of the Order of Australia honours removed.

A statement from the secretary of the order of his native Australia read: "It is notified for general information that the Governor-General has terminated the appointments of Officer

and Member of the Order of Australia in the General Division, made to: Mr Rolf Harris."

Australia operates a separate honours systems to that of the UK.

But calls have been made for Harris to be stripped of his CBE in Britain.

The decision to revoke an honour must be approved by the Queen.

Australia-born Harris was a popular singer,

artist and television presenter for decades.

He was first honoured by the Queen - who he painted in 2005 - in the late 1960s with an MBE, followed by an OBE a decade later, and a CBE in 2006.

During sentencing last year, Mr Justice Sweeney told Harris: "Your reputation lies in ruins. You have been stripped of your honours and you have no one to blame but yourself."

Harris's Bafta fellowship, which he was awarded two years ago, was removed almost immediately after his conviction.

Harris was the second

person to be convicted under Operation Yewtree, a Metropolitan Police operation set up in October 2012 in the wake of the Jimmy Savile sex abuse scandal.

They even succeed in boldly staging a game of Quidditch with the help of the audience, who are divided up into rival teams, without anyone becoming airborne. There are many priceless moments when things on stage don't quite go as rehearsed, resulting in much laughter from Dan and Jeff as well as the audience, and it is a delight to watch how they brilliantly ad lib their way out it.

The show managed to lure Monty Python's Eric Idle into the audience, and from his obvious enjoyment of the evening's playful antics it would be fair to say Clarkson and Turner continue to proudly fly high the flag of Great British comedy.

Dazzling new exhibit at the Getty showcases later works of JMW Turner

Extraordinarily inventive and enduringly influential, the great British artist J. M. W. Turner (1775-1851) produced many of his most important and famous pictures after the age of sixty, in the last fifteen years of his life.

A dazzling new show at the Getty Center demonstrates the ongoing radicalism of his technique and ever-original subject matter, bringing together over sixty key oil paintings and watercolors, making this major international loan exhibition is the first to focus on the unfettered creativity of Turner's final years.

Despite his fame, wealth and ailing health, Turner was never content to rest on his reputation. He continued to travel extensively, depicted novel subject matter, experimented with different canvas formats, and pioneered free and spontaneous techniques in both oil and watercolor. He developed new ways of rendering atmospheric and coloristic effects to convey the awesome and emotive powers of the elements, pushing the boundaries of expression in any media he used.

Yet even as he experimented with form and technique, Turner maintained a firm commitment to narrative

and meaning in his compositions. Paintings that at first sight appear to solely illustrate effects of light and color frequently provide opportunities for contemplation on humanity's role in history and place in the natural world.

Resisting the lure of romantic medieval subject matter favored by his contemporaries, Turner's later work reflects his interest in the sea, in dramatic or poetic landscapes and cityscapes such as he found in Continental Europe, and in current events, including the modern

state of Italy, the legacy of the Napoleonic Wars, and spectacular fires at the Palace of Westminster and the Tower of London.

Turner employed gestural brushwork and quasi-abstract subject matter to explore states of consciousness and the emotional power of color. These last paintings shocked and mystified his audience, many of whom thought them the products of senility or madness. While such works were often misunderstood and mocked by contemporary critics, they are now appreciated as a coda to

Turner's career, representing a synthesis of his innovations in technique, composition, and theme.

Turner died in 1851 at age seventy-six, leaving a trove of his work to the English nation. While popular and scholarly ideas about his work have evolved, he has emerged as a titan of nineteenth century art whose paintings retain their initial poetry and power.

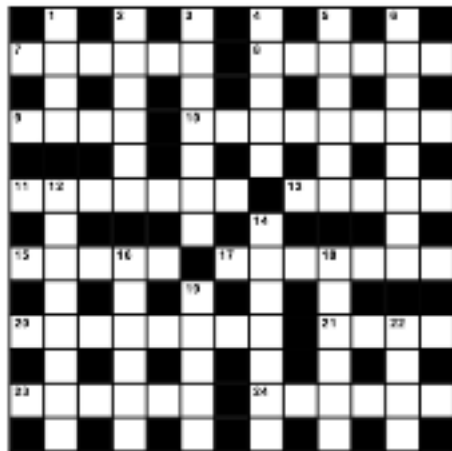

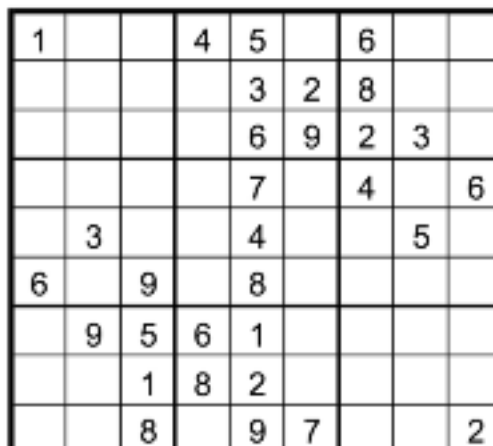

The real drama behind the revolution....

Exclusive interview with author Donna Thornad and a review of her new novel about a heroine of the American revolution who is a playwright and actress

Rating: ★★★

“Most histories of the Revolution that mentioned the theater at all referred to Congress closing the playhouses,” says *Mistress Firebrand* author Donna Thornad. “A few talked about British theatrical productions in New York and Philadelphia and Washington’s fondness for camp theatricals at Valley Forge. It was Congress’ ban that struck me as interesting, because no one bans something that isn’t happening...a lot.”



The Continental Congress ban on all theatrical entertainments in 1774 was motivated by Puritan moral disapproval of the stage. Politicians saw the stage was a threat to them, yet plays were still written by American playwrights and distributed in pamphlet form as political propaganda.

Mistress Firebrand is the third book in Thorland’s *Renegades of the Revolution*

series. Thorland gives the heroine the unusual occupation of being a playwright. It’s surprising how she helps with the American Revolution. The book is filled with rich historical detail. The romance between her and a British officer grows slowly.

It’s 1777 Manhattan, the British have taken over the town. Jennifer Leighton is a struggling playwright. Severin Devere is a British intelligence officer whose job is to ensure the safety of General John Burgoyne, not only a military man, but also a successful playwright. When a letter arrives from Jennifer for the general asking for his help as a playwright, Severin goes to investigate what she really wants. Severin is half Native-American. Jennifer doesn’t get

anywhere with the British and starts writing plays for the Rebels under the pen name Cornelia, in which she undermines the British Army. The pseudonymous Cornelia is put on the hanging list, bringing Severin into contact with Jennifer again.

“The theater is barely mentioned in most histories of the American Revolution,” says Thornad. “But when you look closely at the participants, so many of them, particularly on the British side, had one foot in the world of the playhouse. Burgoyne wrote for Drury Lane. After the war Banastre Tarleton would become the lover of actress, novelist, and early feminist Mary Robinson. Robert Rogers, who is currently enjoying some notoriety on television as

a villain in AMC’s *Turn* wrote a play about Pontiac’s Rebellion. People on both sides of the Atlantic from all walks of life frequented the playhouse. Trying to paint a picture of the Revolution without the theater is like trying to explain the 20th century without the cinema.”

Mistress Firebrand is Thornad’s third stand-alone book in the *Renegades of the Revolution* series. She also writes for television and is currently working on the WGN drama *Salem*. As a TV writer she spends time in Los Angeles, where the Huntington is a great resource, and Salem, where she has access to the Boston and Salem Athenaeums and the Boston Public Library. She says she has spent a lot of time looking at notices of theatrical performances



and descriptions of 18th century American theaters.

Thornad is currently writing her next book in the *Renegades of the Revolution* series in which a Dutch patrol, a highwayman who preys on the Hudson River Valley, and a schoolteacher find romance.

Cricket World Cup 2015: Vaughan blasts 'predictable' England

Former captain Michael Vaughan says England are too predictable and need to adopt more aggressive tactics to succeed at the World Cup.

After heavy defeats by co-hosts Australia and New Zealand, England won their first game of the tournament by beating Scotland by 119 runs in Pool A in midweek.

"After the [Scotland] game [captain] Eoin Morgan said they are flexible," Vaughan told BBC Radio 5 live.

"No, they're not. They are set in stone the way they are going to play."

England scored only 131 runs in the final 20 overs against Scotland and Vaughan wants to see Nottinghamshire's Alex Hales - the first England player to score a Twenty20 century - given a chance to bat at number three rather than Yorkshire's Gary Ballance, to improve the scoring rate.

Speaking on the Tuffers and Vaughan show, he added: "England are very, very predictable and if they're not careful this World Cup will be like most pundits have said with a predictable outcome.

"They will get to the quarter-finals - just - and then play a powerhouse like India at the MCG and it will be same old, same old, same as the last World Cup and same as the one before."

He said England were

struggling to keep up with other teams.

"One-day cricket has moved on. It's almost like they are swimming with armbands on," he said,

"Everyone else is taking on a different leap, with more power, more aggression and more freedom.

"I know it's hard when you've just been beaten badly. You just want to win, you want those two points and they got them and that's a huge credit.

"But they aren't going to go far if they don't change their approach, particularly with that number three. They need a Hales type to give it a good old launch."

England are fifth in their group after three matches with the top four going into the quarter-finals.

Their next game is

against Sri Lanka in Wellington on Saturday and former England spinner Phil Tufnell also wants to see a more positive approach.

"I just think there's muddled thinking about how to progress this England side in one-day cricket because's it changed vastly," Tufnell said.

"England haven't gone forward. I just don't see where they are moving forward. Where has all this preparation got them? It's got them nowhere.

"They just seem a little bit dull when they play one-day cricket."

England were not the only home nation side to be licking their wounds at the Cricket World Cup this week. Scotland found themselves stunned by an upstart Afghanistan team

on Thursday - a shock defeat which will take time to get over, according to captain Preston Mommsen.

Afghanistan recovered from 97-7 to overhaul 210 in the final over and deny Scotland a first World Cup win.

"It's a very difficult day," Mommsen told the BBC's Test Match Special. "There was a lot riding on this, a huge opportunity to get that first win.

"Regrettably, it wasn't to be. It will take a couple of days to get over it."

Scotland, who have never won a World Cup match, had earlier slumped to 144-8, only to be taken to their highest score in the tournament by a ninth-wicket partnership of 62 between Majid Haq and Alasdair Evans.

Guarin wonder strike ends Celtic's hopes

Celtic's European campaign was finally snuffed out in Milan on Thursday, as the Glasgow club succumbed to a stunning late strike from Inter's Fredy Guarin.

Any chance the Scottish champions had of progressing looked to have been extinguished when Virgil van Dijk was shown a first-half red card.

But Celtic did not crumble and remained in the tie until Guarin's fine finish.

Despite the disappointment of their exit, Ronny Deila can take comfort from his side's ability to compete with the Milanese over two legs, especially in the pulsating 2-2 first leg tie at Celtic Park.

Jason Denayer and Nir Bitton were defensively outstanding for the Hoops as Celtic spent most of the second half camped around their own box.

But neither they nor keeper Craig Gordon could resist Guarin's blistering drive from 22 yards.

Celtic's most famous victory on foreign soil was against Inter Milan in the 1967 European Cup final and hopes of a first win on Italian soil were high before Van Dijk's sending off.

However, there was a

first-minute scare when the Dutchman allowed Mauro Icardi in behind him, only for the striker to scuff his shot at Gordon.

In an open, end-to-end first half Gary Mackay-Steven had Celtic's best opportunity but struck his shot straight at Inter keeper Juan Pablo Carrizo.

Two Celtic penalty claims went unheeded by Slovakian referee Ivan Kruzliak, who took a harder line as Van Dijk caught Rodrigo Palacio from behind and shortly afterwards picked up a second booking for a foul on Icardi.

That changed the balance of the match, with Celtic forced largely onto the defensive as centre-half Denayer blocked Xherdan Shaqiri's goalbound shot and Gordon kept out Danilo D'Ambrosio on the rebound.

The Celtic goalkeeper also made an absolutely stunning one-handed save to claw away Mauro Icardi's header from a free-kick moments after Van Dijk's dismissal.

Celtic's organisation and stout defending meant the goalkeeper was largely unworked after the break until having to pick Guarin's shot out of the net, the moment the tie was sealed.

Italian lesson for Spurs

TOTTENHAM'S profligacy in front of goal and shakiness at the back cost them dearly in Florence on Thursday night, as the hosts ended the North London side's European campaign with an efficient 2-0 victory and a 3-1 aggregate win.

Mario Gomez raced clear after a second-half mistake by Federico Fazio and slid the ball under Hugo Lloris.

Chelsea loanee Mohamed Salah sealed the win after a blunder by Jan Vertonghen.

Spurs needed to score in Florence, but were unable to make a breakthrough, with striker Roberto Soldado wasting a golden first-half opportunity.

The Spanish striker was played clean through by Erik Lamela's swept pass after Spurs broke quickly from a corner, but he scuffed his attempt to square the ball to Nacer Chadli and keeper Neto gathered.

Pochettino brought on Kane - who had scored six goals in his five previous games - and the in-form striker almost made an immediate impact, but he was denied a goal after Ben Davies, who squared the ball to him, was correctly flagged offside.

The result is a blow for Spurs before their biggest game of the season so far - the Carling Cup final against Chelsea on Sunday.

A similar fate was never likely to befall Roberto Martinez's side after their exploits in Bern last week but a slow start to this encounter gave Young Boys a glimmer of hope and left the Goodison Park crowd frustrated.

It was the visitors who took the early lead after Tim Howard saved Milan Vilotic's header from Raphael Nuzzolo's shot and Sanogo reacted quickest to put in the rebound.

It could have been worse for Everton moments later with Scott Sutter heading against the bar from Gonzalo Zarate's corner.

However, the Toffees were soon level after Young Boys goalkeeper Marco Wolfli fouled Steven Naismith in the area, following Lukaku's delightful back heel.

Lukaku confidently slotted home the penalty and Everton soon had the lead on the night as the striker netted his 15th of the campaign. The Belgian volleyed home after he had been picked out by full back Luke Garbutt.

Darron Gibson, who was making his first start since November, set up number three before the break with a slide-rule pass that found Mirallas, who coolly sidefooted home.

Penalty heartbreak brings end to Europa campaign

Liverpool lost their first European penalty shootout Thursday night as Besiktas knocked them out of the Europa League.

When centre-back Dejan Lovren missed the crucial spot-kick after Tolgay Arslan's 20-yard curler forced extra-time in the round of 32 second leg it marked the end of a sad return to the site of one of Liverpool's greatest triumphs – the city on the Bosphorus where they beat AC Milan to win the 2005 Champions League final.

Things might have been different had Liverpool made their first half superiority tell, but after Daniel Sturridge's shot was beaten out by Cenk Gonen Besiktas began to assert themselves and almost sealed the tie in 90 minutes as Demba Ba hit the crossbar.

Slaven Bilic's side deserved to go through after recovering from a dreadful opening 45 minutes to dominate the game, meaning that Liverpool are left with the FA Cup as their last realistic hope of a trophy this season.

Liverpool were missing a number of injured key players - including captain Steven Gerrard, vice-captain Jordan Henderson, centre-back Mamadou Sakho and playmaker Philippe Coutinho.

But they should have made more of a number of first-half chances, as Raheem Sterling had a shot beaten away somewhat theatrically by keeper Cenk Gonen, then saw a shot on the turn
