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# Clarkson finally goes too far...

- Controversial TV host faces Top Gear axe after 'handbags and pushing' with producer
- Presenter loses the plot after being served cold food after long day's shooting

**JEREMY CLARKSON'S controversial career at the BBC may finally have run out of gas after the broadcaster announced it would scrap the remainder of the current Top Gear TV series following allegations that the presenter punched a producer.**

The Beeb said Clarkson, 54, had been suspended after what it called a "fracas" and has confirmed Sunday's episode of Top Gear will not be shown.

It is understood the two final episodes in the series will also be dropped.

An online petition calling for the BBC to "reinstate" Clarkson has been signed by almost 250,000 people.

It was started on Tuesday afternoon by political blogger Guido Fawkes.

Clarkson has not issued a statement, but has been joking on Twitter about films that could replace Sunday's show.

The Sun newspaper, in

which Clarkson writes a regular column, quotes him as saying: "I'm having a nice cold pint and waiting for this to blow over." It also quotes a "source close to the star" denying Clarkson punched anyone.

The BBC had announced Clarkson's suspension in a statement which said: "Following a fracas with a BBC producer, Jeremy Clarkson has been suspended pending an investigation.

"No one else has been suspended. Top Gear will not be broadcast this Sunday. The BBC will be making no further comment at this time."

Jeremy Clarkson is alleged to have lashed out at a Top Gear

producer because he was told he could not order a sirloin steak after a day of filming.

The 54-year-old was ravenous after arriving at his hotel at around 10pm last Wednesday night but lost his temper out after being told there was no

hot food.

Clarkson told producer Oisin Tymon he fancied an 8oz sirloin with fondant potatoes, pan-fried wild mushrooms, grilled cherry tomatoes and peppercorn sauce.

But a "fracas" erupted

when Tymon, 36, told him the kitchen was closed and suggested a platter of cold meats and cheeses instead.

Witnesses at Simonstone Hall Hotel in Hawes, North Yorks, near where the show was filming on location, told The Sun:

"The staff knew the BBC crew were arriving late so they organised meat and cheese platters. The chef had already gone home.

"Clarkson didn't like the idea. He wanted his own way.

"The producer was

# Nigel Farage: British Muslim 'fifth column' fuels fear of immigration

■ Ukip leader also says he would get rid of 'irrelevant' anti-discrimination laws in interview with former equality commissioner Trevor Phillips

Nigel Farage raised more eyebrows in the UK this week as he warned there is rising public concern about immigration partly because people believe there are some Muslims who want to form "a fifth column and kill us", and that there has never before been a migrant group that wants to "change who we are and what we are".

The Ukip leader also said that race and other anti-discrimination legislation should be abolished, arguing that it was no longer needed in the United Kingdom, in an interview with former equality and human rights commissioner Trevor Phillips for Channel 4.

Farage said the emergence of British-born Islamist extremists was an "especial problem", with some Muslim immigrants who do not want to integrate prompting wider public concern.

During the interview,

the Ukip leader said: "I think perhaps one of the reasons the polls show an increasing level of concern is because people do see a fifth column living within our country, who hate us and want to kill us."

"So don't be surprised if there isn't a slight increase in people's worries and concerns. You know, when you've got British, when you've got people, born and bred in Cardiff, with British passports, going out to fight for Isis, don't be surprised if there isn't an uptick in concern. There has been an uptick in concern, but does it make us a prejudiced people? No."

#### 'especial problem'

In contrast, he said, previous waves of immigration by Huguenots, Jews and Ugandan Asians became integrated in society while often maintaining private observance of their faiths and traditions.

"There is an especial

problem with some of the people who've come here and who are of the Muslim religion who don't want to become part of our culture. So there is no previous experience in our history of a migrant group that comes to Britain, that fundamentally wants to change who we are and what we are. That is, I think, above everything else, what people are really concerned about."

He also indicated that anti-discrimination legislation had become irrelevant.

Pressed on which discrimination laws he would get rid of, the Ukip leader said: "Much of it. I think the employer should be much freer to make decisions on who he or she employs."

Asked whether there would be a law against discrimination on the grounds of race or colour under Ukip, Farage added: "No ... because we take the view, we are colour-blind. We as a party are colour-blind."

Phillips said he made

the programme because he had come to the conclusion that, while much of the equality movement in Britain had changed it for the better, it might also have led to serious and unwanted consequences that could undermine what had been achieved.

#### key plank

Farage has previously issued warnings in the wake of the French terror attacks, which Theresa May, the home secretary, called irresponsible and Labour grandee Tessa Jowell said she thought were sickening.

With Ukip polling at

around 15% and immigration consistently cited as one of the top concerns of voters, the Channel 4 programme interviewed Farage to explore whether the UK's "attempt to embrace a multi-ethnic Britain has led directly to the rise of the party".

During the interview, Farage acknowledged that in all honesty he used to see Phillips as "the enemy" and "very, very much as being part of a new Labour project ... the politically correct brigade that wouldn't want these things discussed."

Phillips said he had got on well with Farage during the interview and they had a good conversation, but he declined to elaborate at this point on what he thought of the Ukip leader's position. A Ukip aide also said the two men had got on very well.

Farage has made immigration a key plank of his election campaign, saying the party would reduce numbers by leaving the European Union, banning unskilled migrants for five years and bringing in an Australian points-style system.

being blamed. Clarkson didn't hit him — but he did use every possible swear word you can imagine. He had to be held back."

Another source, who said Clarkson had been drinking rosé wine, added: "It was more like a scuffle. The producer stood looking quiet and embarrassed."

"He was being blamed for not arranging hot food. The general manager ended up cooking for the presenters."

Clarkson's co-stars were said to have looked on in shock as someone tried to calm the star, who eventually got his own way and tucked into a £21.95 8oz cut in a private room.

The host has admitted there was "handbags and pushing" over the incident but denies claims that he punched Mr Tymon.

**gaffes**

His relationship with key BBC executives, including head of television Danny Cohen, was already at breaking point before he was suspended over the latest controversy, and Clarkson may simply decide to walk away rather than try to patch things up yet again.

One senior executive reportedly said: "Everyone is convinced he will now go. Clarkson is widely despised and there are a lot of people who would be thrilled."

Among Clarkson's many previous gaffes were referring to an Asian person as a 'slope' in 2012, suggesting that cars made in Mexico were liable to be 'lazy and flatulent' a year earlier, and describing former Prime Minister Gordon Brown as a 'one eyed Scottish idiot' in February 2009.

# Top cop admits Hillsborough lie

■ Gasp at inquest as Duckenfield admits police ordered opening of exit gate  
■ Officer in charge of fateful semi-final says he will regret lie 'to his dying day'

**The match commander on the day of the Hillsborough disaster has admitted he lied about fans forcing an exit gate open to enter the ground.**

Relatives of the 96 fans who died gasped as David Duckenfield told the new inquest this week: "I apologise unreservedly to the families."

He said: "Everybody knew the truth, the fans and police knew the truth that we'd opened the gates."

Mr Duckenfield, 70, said he would regret the lie "to his dying day".

He was in charge of policing at Sheffield Wednesday's stadium on 15 April 1989 when a fatal crush developed in terraced pens allocated to Liverpool fans.

The court heard that on the day Mr Duckenfield told Graham Kelly, of the FA, that some fans had got in themselves through gate C, when the truth was that he had ordered the gate to be opened.

Christina Lambert QC, counsel for the inquests, said some witnesses have spoken of having a "clear recollection" that Mr Duckenfield "made reference to gates having been stormed".

Ms Lambert asked: "Did you appreciate that what you said and indeed, what you did not say, could or might bear that meaning to Mr Kelly and others?"

He replied: "Yes ma'am. I didn't give him sufficient information to appreciate the situation as it occurred."

Mr Duckenfield went on to say: "It was a situation I was totally untrained for, totally unprecedented, and I make no excuses. I was the man who did it. But I faced a difficult situation."

"I said something rather hurriedly, without

considering the position, without thinking of the consequences and the trauma, the heartache and distress that the inference would have caused to those people who were already in a deep state of shock, who were distressed. I apologise unreservedly to the families."

Earlier, Mr Duckenfield said it was "one of the biggest regrets of his life" that he did not consider the consequences of opening the gate.

He said he was unaware that turnstiles at the Leppings Lane end fed into an inner concourse and that gate C was opposite a tunnel into the terraces.

**'Open the gates'**

The inquests heard he had not been aware that at 14:30, some 5,700 fans were still trying to enter the ground outside the Leppings Lane turnstiles because he did not know the club had a system for monitoring the supporters.

It meant 800 fans would have to go through each turnstile in 30 minutes to get in for kick-off.

Mr Duckenfield said he "accepted" this was "not going to happen".

Mr Duckenfield, who had been stationed in the police control box with a bank of TV monitors, said he was "shocked" at the request from Supt Roger Marshall to open the Leppings Lane gates after police became "overwhelmed" by the number of fans.

The witness continued: "I was shocked and taken aback by it and thinking, 'Where are these people going to go if I open the gates?'"

He said another message then came through on the police radio from Mr

Marshall saying: "If we don't open the gates someone's going to get killed."

Mr Duckenfield said: "That really was a shocking, terrifying moment to feel you had got to that situation."

Another officer in the police box, Mr Bernard Murray, then said to him: "Are you going to open the gates?" the jury heard.

Mr Duckenfield said: "I

remember saying to him quite clearly, Mr Murray, if people are going to die I have no option but to open the gates. Open the gates."

He said he thought fans would feel "relief and comfort" in being released from the crush of the turnstiles on to the concourse.

"I think it is fair to say it is arguably one of the biggest regrets of my life that I did not foresee where the fans

would go when they came in through the gates," he continued.

"I was overcome by the enormity of the situation and the decision I had to make and, as a result of that, this is probably very hard to admit, as a result of that I was so overcome probably with emotion of us having got into that situation that my mind for a moment went blank."

The inquests continue.



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## Fit for a Queen: Her Maj cracks open the bubbly as new Britannia makes her debut

THE HIGH SEAS once again has a Britannia worthy of the name, with this week's Royal launch of P&O's latest floating palace, a £473 million liner boasting 15 passenger decks, 13 bars and 13 places to eat, a 936-seater theatre, four swimming pools, and a multi-million pound art collection.

The Queen officially named the new cruise ship in a lavish ceremony on Wednesday, as the 3,600-passenger vessel made its debut at its home port of Southampton.

The ceremony, which Prince Philip also attended, started at about midday and marked the fifth official naming of a cruise ship by Her Majesty.

Captain Paul Brown, who gave the Queen a tour of the ship, said: "It is my great honour after 33 years at sea to show the Queen around.

"I will be showing her the atrium and the bridge then heading down to the restaurant for lunch."

Britannia bears the same name as the Queen's former Royal Yacht Britannia, which was

decommissioned in 1997 after more than 40 years of service.

The 141,000-tonne ship features a 94m (308ft) union jack on its bow and will make its maiden voyage to Spain, Italy and France on 14 March.

In style this latest liner looks and feels veddy, veddy British, even though the parent company is American and the ship itself has been built in Italy.

And P&O are expecting the bulk of its passengers to come from Britain's middle-classes, now that the days of cruising as a holiday exclusively for the rich are long gone.

One in nine British people cruise - and that makes it more popular than skiing.

The monarch was known to deeply regret the decommissioning of her beloved Britannia, and seemed to be thoroughly enjoying herself, chatting nineteen to the dozen with other VIP guests as she toured the vessel.

She was heard telling TV chef James Martin, one of a number of celebrity chefs who will be offering classes for passengers:

"The first time I ever saw white bread was on board the old Queen Elizabeth. It was rather fascinating."

The former Britannia was decommissioned in 1997 under the orders of then Prime Minister Tony Blair.

Berthed in Edinburgh's Port of Leith, the ship is now a static tourist attraction but sailed more than 1,000,000 miles during its 40 years in royal service.

The new Britannia is expected to rack up a similar number of miles during its own career, although unlike the Queen's yacht, it will host tourists rather than dignitaries.

The Queen is no stranger to cruise ships in any case, having become godmother to no fewer than five - now six, including Britannia.

First of the liners launched by the Queen was Cunard's QE2, which was christened in 1967 and made her maiden voyage in 1969.

Now permanently moored in Dubai after retiring in 2008, its owners plan to turn it into a floating luxury hotel,

substantial impact on a destination.

"If the initial reviews are anything to go by, Poldark looks set to be a massive hit, and with 12 novels in the Poldark series there is potential for it to run and run.

## Richard Branson sued for 'stealing cruise ship idea'

■ Former chief executive of Norwegian Cruise Line seeks more than \$300m from billionaire Sir Richard Branson

The former chief executive of Norwegian Cruise Line is suing British billionaire Sir Richard Branson and his Virgin Group conglomerate, claiming that Virgin stole his ideas and business plans to enter the luxury cruise industry.

Colin Veitch, who oversaw Norwegian from 2000 to 2008, and his VSM Development company is seeking more than \$300m in damages and has asked a judge to

stop Virgin from going forward with its recently announced Miami-based cruise line.

The lawsuit, filed in Miami federal court, alleges Virgin reneged on a May 2011 agreement with Mr Veitch over how estimated profits would be split. Mr Veitch would get nothing if the 4,200-passenger "ultra" ships were not profitable but could earn \$315m if projections were met.

A Virgin spokesman said: "Richard Branson

and the Virgin Group first looked at the cruise market in the late 1970s, and our current team has been exploring the opportunity for more than a decade. Over the years, we have been in discussions with a number of parties including the plaintiff, and those discussions ceased in 2012. We strongly believe the claim has no merits."

Sir Richard said at the weekend that he will commission the

construction of two giant ships as part of ambitious plans to gatecrash the cruise liner market.

The ships are likely to be built in a German or Italian shipyard and will take four to five years to complete, at the cost of

around \$1.7bn (£1.1bn).

"We're in the final throes of those negotiations," Sir Richard said.

Financial backing for Virgin Cruises, which will be based in Miami, South Florida, has been

secured from private equity firm Bain Capital. Sir Richard has brought in Tom McAlpine, part of the management team that founded the Disney Cruise Line in 1996, to head up the new company.

## Spider that can give men four-hour erections found in Tesco bananas

■ Essex shopper says 'Tesco were a bit useless' when she found a Brazilian Wandering Spider in a bunch of bananas

A mother was scared stiff after opening a bunch of supermarket bananas and finding rare spiders whose bite can give a man a painful four-hour erection.

Maria Layton, 43, of Basildon, Essex, spotted the arachnids after opening the bag of yellow fruit she bought from Tesco.

She found the bananas, shipped from Costa Rica, were infested with eggs from the Brazilian Wandering Spider - the most deadly in the world.

As soon as she discovered the cocoon they started to hatch so she quickly put them in a sealed container in the freezer and called Tesco customer services.

The species is deadly and its venom can kill a human in just two hours - but can also give male victims a four-hour erection.

Its venom is currently being studied for use in erectile dysfunction

treatments.

Mother-of-two Ms Layton went to open the bag for her eldest daughter Siri, six, but noticed there was something funny on the side of one of the bananas.

The full-time mother said: "My husband bought the bananas from Tesco, they had been in the house a whole day before I ripped the bag open.

"Siri asked for a banana. The first banana had a funny bit on it, so I got another one for her and that was when I found the massive spider cocoon.

"There was a spider web on the other bananas too.

"I recognised it because I remembered seeing a news story about them, so when I saw the cocoon it rang a bell and I thought I should check it so I googled it.

"I was so scared - I don't like spiders at the best of times, but have read about the Brazilian Wandering Spiders - and was very

frightened about the potential threat.

"The spider cocoon started to unfurl so I put it in a sealed box and put it in the freezer as I read that that is supposed to kill them.

The Brazilian Wandering Spider are mainly active during the night, and walk across the jungle floor.

But during the day they hide inside banana plants hence the nickname "banana spider".

Shocked by her discovery, and the threat to her and her children - Siri, six, and Phoebe, three, Ms Layton contacted Tesco customer services.

Tesco said she should bring the bananas, deadly spiders and all, back to the store so that the bar code could be scanned and her money refunded.

Ms Layton said: "Tesco were a bit useless, I was really concerned about the possibility of this dangerous spider and spider eggs in my house

and really wanted some helpful advice on how to act.

"I was shocked, they failed to see the potential threat to me and my

family and thought I was only interested in having a pound or so back.

A spokesperson for Tesco said: "Our policy is for the customer to take

the product to the store where it can be investigated.

"We don't have a service whereby someone can go out to the home."

# Beloved fantasy author Terry Pratchett dies at 66

Sir Terry Pratchett, fantasy author and creator of the hugely popular Discworld series, has died aged 66, eight years after being diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease.

"The world has lost one of its brightest, sharpest minds," said Larry Finlay of his publishers Transworld.

The author died at home, surrounded by his family, "with his cat sleeping on his bed", he added.

Sir Terry wrote more than 70 books during his career and completed his final book last summer.

He "enriched the planet like few before him" and through Discworld satirised the world "with great skill, enormous humour and constant invention," said Mr Finlay.

"Terry faced his Alzheimer's disease (an 'embuggerance', as he called it) publicly and bravely," said Mr Finlay.

"Over the last few years, it was his writing that sustained him. His legacy will endure for decades to come."

Sir Terry leaves wife Lyn and daughter Rhianna.

Terence David John Pratchett was born on 28 April 1948 near Beaconsfield in Buckinghamshire.

An only child, he spent his early years in a house with no running water or electricity but he said that the family never felt deprived.

"It was right after the war, so that if you had a house with a roof on it you were ahead of the game," he said.

Pratchett later remembered an idyllic childhood spent playing with other village children

in the local fields and woods.

He vividly recalled a visit to London in 1954 when his mother took him to the Gamages department store in Holborn.

The small boy was overcome by the bright lights and vast range of toys. "Lots of my future writing started to happen on that day," he later said.

An early interest in astronomy was sparked when he began collecting a series of cards in Brooke Bond Tea packets entitled Out into Space.

## whimsical style

Pratchett was also an avid reader and *The Wind in the Willows* became a major influence on his later writing, together with his growing collection of sci-fi books.

He left school at 17 and got a job as a trainee reporter on a local newspaper where, among other things, he wrote children's stories under the pen name Uncle Jim

Out of one of these columns, written in what would become his trademark whimsical

style, came the characters that eventually populated his first book.

His breakthrough came in 1968. While interviewing a publisher, Peter Bander van Duren, he casually mentioned he had been working on a manuscript.

Van Duren and his business partner Colin Smythe read the draft and *The Carpet People* was published in 1971.

According to Smythe, the book received few reviews, but they were ecstatic, with one describing it as "of quite extraordinary quality".

Pratchett followed this up with his only two purely science-fiction novels, *The Dark Side of the Sun*, published in 1976, and *Strata* five years later.

The latter work introduced the concept of a flat world, something that would surface again in Pratchett's most popular series of novels.

In 1983 Pratchett published *The Colour of Magic*, the first in what would become the Discworld series of books.

It was more a collection

of short stories than a novel but, boosted by a serialisation of the story on the BBC's *Woman's Hour*, the paperback edition, released in 1985, established Pratchett's reputation.

"The nature of Discworld gave me the opportunity to do all kinds of things," he said. "I could fit more or less anything into it. By about book four, I discovered the joy of plot."

By the time that fourth Discworld book, *Mort*, was published in 1987, Pratchett felt confident enough to become a full-time writer.

While Discworld remained at the centre of Pratchett's output, by 2013 he had published 40 novels in the canon while also writing some horror fiction and a number of children's books.

Fellow author and friend Neil Gaiman was among those paying tribute to Sir Terry, writing on his website: "There was nobody like him. I was fortunate to have written a book with him, when we were younger, which taught me so much."

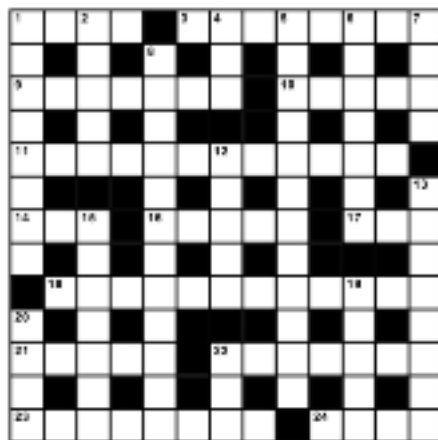

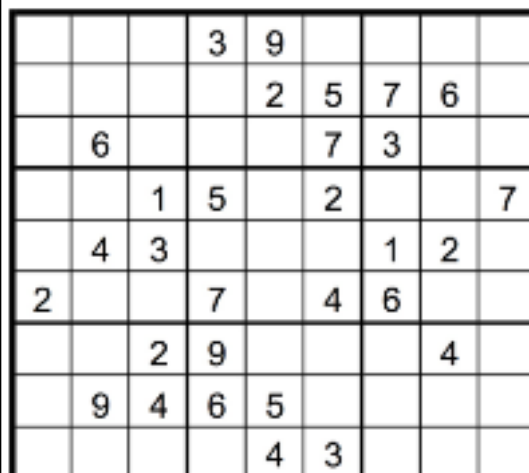

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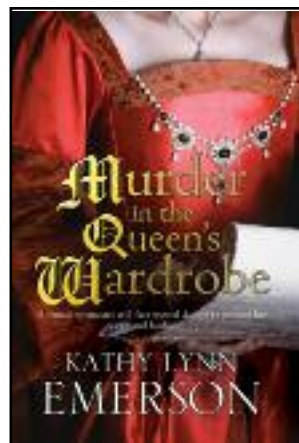
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## Clothes, Espionage and Murder in the Queen's Wardrobe

Exclusive interview with author Kathy Lynn Emerson and a review of her new novel about a murder mystery in the court of Elizabeth I

"I had been thinking for some time that it would be interesting to write about the true story of a sixteenth century attempt to find an English bride for Ivan the Terrible of Russia," says author Kathy Lynn Emerson. "This was part of trade negotiations with the Muscovy Company and involved several political factions at the court of Elizabeth I of England, all of whom spied on and plotted against each other."

Emerson writes a story

intertwined with interesting historical facts. Her description of London is very different than we would see it today. The lead character Rosamund has to really think and figure things out. She only has one close relationship, with her maid. Her maid is Polish, which is unusual. Pretty intrepid to begin with, the heroine's growth is to try to think more before she acts.

A lady-in-waiting to Lady Mary, a cousin of Queen Elizabeth, Mistress

Rosamond has been separated from her husband for two years. She's been recruited against her will to spy on her mistress by Sir Francis Walsingham. To save the life of her husband who's in Russia she must help him. Lady Mary is chosen to be the wife of Tsar Ivan. Not all the nobles at court want this alliance to happen. There is a murder. Rosamond realizes that she and Lady Mary are in danger. Can Rosamond save their lives?

Emerson says she found plenty of material for a story involving espionage and murder in the court of Elizabeth I, but still needed a believable fictional protagonist. "I found what I was looking for in the *Face Down Mysteries*, a series I wrote some years ago. It was published in the U.S. between 1997 and 2007. The sleuth in those novels

is Susanna, Lady Appleton, an Elizabethan gentlewoman who is an expert on poisonous herbs, but by the time I stopped writing the series she was getting on in years, at least for someone who lived in the sixteenth century. For this new series, I wanted someone younger. I found her in Lady Appleton's husband's illegitimate daughter, Rosamond."

"Rosamond is the Mistress Jaffrey of these *Mistress Jaffrey Mysteries*," says Emerson. "And to my mind, she is the ideal sleuth...young, wealthy, clever, opinionated and at odds with nearly everyone in her family, including her husband Rob Jaffrey. When the story opens, she's come to regret burning so many bridges. All it takes is a threat to Rob's life to pull her into the intrigue surrounding the alliance

with Tsar Ivan. Since they've been estranged, he's gone adventuring in Muscovy [the old name for Russia]."

Russia was a new country to Emerson and it took more research. Emerson read everything she could find on Moscow and Muscovy during that era. Fortunately, several Englishmen left accounts of the time they spent there and recorded their impressions in minute detail.

*Murder in the Queen's Wardrobe* is the author's 51st published book. The first one, published in 1984, was a nonfiction look at sixteenth century women. "These days I maintain *A Who's Who of Tudor Women* online, adding to it and updating entries already there on a regular basis. I call this my hobby. My husband calls it my obsession. There are currently over 2,000

Emerson lives in the mountains of western Maine, on a Christmas tree farm. She was born in Liberty, New York, in the foothills of the Catskill Mountains.

'Cheerio chaps: Poms are bangers and mashed' was the back-page headline that greeted the England squad when they landed in Sydney on Tuesday.

If coach Peter Moores and his team dared pick up a copy of the Daily Telegraph they were certainly reminded, in no uncertain terms, how well an English failure is regarded in the Antipodes.

'England have been utterly embarrassing,' the story opined before

throwing thoughts ahead to this summer's Ashes, adding: 'Australian fans now can't wait to face

cricket's minnows - that's England - in the Ashes.'

Back at the scene of England's exit the

Adelaide Advertiser focused on the prospect of Moores being replaced by Yorkshire coach Jason

Gillespie, who grew up in the South Australian capital.

'England's demise will now have Yorkshire and incoming England and Wales Cricket Board chairman Colin Graves sending an SOS to 71-Test paceman Gillespie.'

England's 'catalogue of Adelaide disasters' was also broken down since the unlikely last-day Test defeat in 2006 when it was suggested then captain Andrew Flintoff had been 'turned to drink to soothe the pain'.

England's poor record at World Cups was also underlined in the brevity of one statistic which read: 'While the British Empire has faded so has its cricket machine, winning just five matches against top-eight ranked rivals in World Cups since 1996.'

Moores' own apparent liking for statistics was not missed, and his post-match claim that he would need to 'look at the data' raised a Aussie

smirk or two with one internet headline reading: 'Analyse this data; One win, four losses' before offering a link to 'England's worst cricket disasters'.

In The Australian one of the country's pre-eminent cricket writer's Gideon Haigh was more nuanced, but no less scathing, as he wrote of the fear that was visible on the England players' faces whenever the television cameras panned to them waiting in the dugout to bat.

'They were as cheerful as boys awaiting the cuts from their headmaster. At the centre of it all, Peter Moores, grey hair seeming to whiten at each wicket.

'And at the last, a tiny glimpse of Joe Root, seated next to his coach as James Anderson fell, blowing a little bubble of gum. Pop - that was all it took.'

Haigh finished by adding: 'Moores wanted people to wait to judge him until after the World Cup ended. They're ready, coach.'

## Lukaku inspires Toffees to narrow win

Romelu Lukaku's late penalty gave Everton a vital lead to take to Dynamo Kiev after the first leg of their Europa League last-16 tie on Thursday.

A bad week for English clubs in Europe seemed to be getting worse when Oleg Gusev swept the Ukrainian side ahead.

The home side had started slowly but Lukaku's brilliant run teed Steven Naismith up to level before the break.

And the striker converted from the spot after Danilo Silva handled in the area to give the Blues a slender lead.

If they can hold it in Ukraine on 19 March,

Everton will set up a first European quarter-final in 30 years, an achievement set against the backdrop of a woeful league campaign.

Manager Roberto Martinez has conceded his side - six points above the relegation zone - face the harsh reality of a scrap for league survival but European commitments continue to offer respite.

Lukaku - much maligned for his league form in recent weeks - became the club's record European goalscorer with seven goals when his penalty squirmed under 40-year-old

goalkeeper Oleksandr Shovkovskiy with eight minutes remaining.

The Belgian impressed throughout, completing 86% of his passes and the visitors - who have never won in England - were often stretched by his runs into channels.

Martinez will hope this hard-earned win can provide a platform for just a second league victory of 2015 against Newcastle at Goodison on Sunday, while more optimistic fans may have one eye on a Europa League final appearance in Warsaw on 27 May.

Everton have made light work of sides well positioned in their own domestic leagues in the

competition, including German side Wolfsburg and Swiss team Young Boys, but it was not until Lukaku became heavily involved after half an hour that they started to trouble Ukraine's league leaders.

Gusev's near-post volley after he lost marker Ross Barkley saw Kiev notch a crucial away goal and only when the sides meet again will it become clear if Everton's slow start proves decisive over two legs.

It was not until Lukaku shot wide from 40 yards with Shovkovskiy out of his goal did Everton find any momentum and his presence quickly grew in significance.

The 21-year-old saw a powerful volley graze the crossbar and showed strength beyond his years to fend off several challenges before passing for Naismith to curl home from 12 yards.

Everton did not look back and missed chances in the second half as they attacked the Gwladys Street End

through Gareth Barry's miscue from 12 yards and Lukaku's own blunder from a Naismith flick in the six-yard box.

And their pressure was rewarded late on when substitute Leon Osman crossed against the hand of Silva, to allow Lukaku to net the goal his performance deserved from the spot.

twice from corners, that team doesn't deserve to win," he said.

"When a team cannot cope with the pressure of being with one player more, playing at home...we deserved to be punished."

Mourinho said that he was "surprised" by his team's fragility and, after a full week to prepare, believes that the issue was mental.

"Obviously it's not a physical situation," he said. "I always think that your nervous central system is the most important thing. For me, the players felt too much the responsibility of the game, especially when the opponents went down to 10. Instead of being in the game, enjoying the game, expressing themselves, clearly some of the players couldn't cope with that pressure. It's about a lack of concentration, a lack of responsibility to cope with the markers and the space you have to control."

Mourinho then challenged his players to make up for the disappointment by winning the Premier League.

"I'm disappointed but I try always to be pragmatic," he said. "We must have pride because we hurt and we need to react. We have a Premier League to win. I told that to the players. There's no time to cry. No time also to laugh. Winning the Premier League and the Capital One Cup: that would still be a fantastic season for us. We move forward."

Ancelotti tipped to replace Van Gaal

NOT A WEEK goes by without some outlandish rumor gaining currency in the fevered atmosphere of

the English Premier League, but perhaps the most unlikely one of the season aired this week as speculation grew that Manchester United were seeking secret talks with Carlo Ancelotti with a view to bringing the Italian in to replace Louis Van Gaal over the summer.

Meanwhile insiders at Stamford Bridge insist Jose Mourinho's position is safe, despite Chelsea's disappointing Champions League exit this week to PSG. The club are reportedly preparing a new contract for the Portuguese manager, but will keep everything on ice until (or if), the Blues seal the domestic title.

Mourinho is said to be desperate to strengthen his squad following this week's European exit, with Real Madrid and France defender Raphael Varane, 21, at the top of his summer transfer targets.

Manchester United will be offered the pick of four Paris St-Germain players as the French champions look to sign Angel Di Maria, according to the Daily Express, while Liverpool are hoping to start contract talks with Brazil right-back Dani Alves, 31, who is expected to leave Barcelona when

his deal runs out in the summer.

Ukrainian side Dynamo Kiev want to keep hold of 24-year-old defender Aleksandar Dragovic, who is reportedly being targeted by Arsenal.

Manchester City skipper Vincent Kompany did not "have a fight" with team-mate Fernandinho at half-time in their Premier League defeat at Liverpool, says the Brazilian midfielder, amid growing rumors of unrest at the Etihad stadium.

Southampton have offered a new long-term contract, worth £45,000 per week, to England right-back Nathaniel Clyne.

And former Rangers' favorite and Italian World Cup winner Gennaro Gattuso has applied for the vacant manager's job at League One side Oldham Athletic.

defender James Tomkins suffered a suspected dislocated shoulder in training.

Tomkins was due to have scans on the injury on Friday, but the 25-year-old could struggle to play again this season.

West Ham manager Sam Allardyce must now travel to Arsenal on Saturday with only one fit centre-back in James Collins.

Winston Reid is already out with a

hamstring injury, which means Allardyce will have to move midfielder Cheikhou Kouyaté back to play as a makeshift partner for Collins.

Allardyce is also without first-choice right-back Carl Jenkinson, because loan cannot play against his parent club.

Alex Song could step back into midfield to replace Kouyaté against his former club having been for West Ham's defeat by Chelsea.

# Ibra blasts Blues for red card antics

PSG star Zlatan Ibrahimovic has slammed Chelsea's players for acting like 'babies' in getting him red-carded in Wednesday's bad-tempered Champions League clash.

PSG eliminated Jose Mourinho's team from Europe's premier club competition despite being a man down, securing a 2-2 draw after extra time.

But the Swedish star was far from conciliatory after the final whistle, blasting his opponents after Chelsea's entire outfield team team pressurized referee Bjorn Kuipers before his sending off, while Mourinho was visibly taken aback by how the team then failed to capitalise on playing against 10 men for the vast majority of the

match.

"When the red card happened the worst thing was the Chelsea players - I felt there were 11 babies around me," said Ibrahimovic.

Graeme Souness, the former Liverpool pundit, then also accused the Chelsea players of "pathetic" behaviour that went against the best British traditions of fair-play. Ibrahimovic had seemed to try to pull out of a tackle with Oscar but the Chelsea forward went down in apparent agony and then all nine remaining outfield players rushed towards the referee.

Chelsea, though, could feel equally aggrieved with two other particularly contentious

incidents. Diego Costa was denied a blatant first-half penalty after being tripped by Edinson Cavani and was also elbowed off the ball by David Luiz. Costa might still have been sent off himself for a late tackle on Thiago Silva and then a shove on Marquinhos.

Mourinho suggested that Uefa should consider banning Luiz rather than Ibrahimovic for the quarter-final but agreed that Kuipers had been poor. "He [Ibrahimovic] is always honest," said Mourinho. "He would tell me if it

was a reason for a red card. If that's the case, I hope they can minimize the mistake and let him play the quarter-final. But the other situations, it was a clear penalty on Diego Costa and, once more, I think it's a waste of time and money to have the officials on the side of the goal.

"If he cannot see a penalty 10 metres in front

of him when it's completely clear in front of him, it's a waste of time and money. The official does absolutely nothing. The David elbow I didn't see but when Uefa give him the man of the match, I have to believe there's no suspend David (retrospectively) and take

Ibra into the quarter-finals, which maybe he deserves."

Mourinho was still candid about his own team's failings and had no complaint at Chelsea's ultimate exit despite having twice led in the match. "When a team cannot defend two corners, and concedes
