King Richard III finally laid to rest

- Benedict Cumberbatch and Countess of Wessex among those in attendance
- The controversial king's remains were found beneath a Leicester car park in 2012

RICHARD III has finally found a resting place appropriate to his royal status.

The much-maligned final member of the Plantagenet dynasty, whose worldwide image as a cruel and scheming hunchback is almost completely a result of William Shakespeare's rich imagination, was buried at Leicester Cathedral this week in a grand ceremony with Sophie, Countess of Wessex and the Duke and Duchess of Gloucester among the guests.

The Archbishop of Canterbury, The Most Rev Justin Welby, presided over the service with local senior clergy and representatives of world faiths.

Actor Benedict Cumberbatch, a distant relation of the king, read a poem by Poet Laureate Carol Ann Duffy.

During the service, The Rt Rev Tim Stevens, Bishop of Leicester, said: "People have come in their thousands from around the world to this

place of honour, not to judge or condemn but to stand humble and reverent.

"From car park to cathedral... Today we come to give this King, and these mortal remains the dignity and honour denied to them in death."

A procession and commemoration service took place later in the day at York.

The king's remains were found beneath a Leicester car park in 2012.

The archbishop, spiritual leader of the Church of England, delivered a prayer shortly before the reburial took place.

"We return the bones of your servant Richard to the grave," he said.

On writing "Richard", the poem recited by Cumberbatch during the service, Ms Ann Duffy said it was "a privilege".

The service was attended by 200 members

of the public, following a ballot and representatives of those involved in finding and identifying the remains.

In a foreword to the order of service, The Queen said she recognised the "great national and international significance" of Richard's reburial.

"Today, we recognise a king who lived through turbulent times and whose Christian faith sustained him in life and death," she wrote.

Philippa Langley, who spearheaded the campaign to find the

king, led a procession through the city before the morning's service.

Speaking afterwards, she said: "I was thinking about all those years ago when I put the Looking for Richard project together and its ethos, its aim to give Richard III what he didn't get when he died in the field of battle.

"I was thinking 'It's job done'. It really is, we are laying him to rest with full dignity and honour."

Historian John Ashdown-Hill, who worked with Ms Langley, said: "It was good to get the sort of reverence for Richard that he didn't really get in 1485, which Philippa and I and the Looking for Richard team had been saying all along was what we wanted for

him."

The cathedral fully reopened to the public on Friday when the king's sealed tomb was revealed.

In York, a choral evensong was held at the city's Minster, followed by a commemoration service and a procession through the city.

The reburial has not been without controversy. Campaigners who petitioned for Richard III to be reburied in York have described the events in Leicester over the last week as a "pantomime".

While the Dean of York, The Very Reverend Vivienne Faull was addressing the service in the Minster, about six people walked out in protest.

They described it as

with Yorkshire rather than the East Midlands. Richard, the last English king to die in

battle, was killed at Bosworth Field in 1485, at the end of the Wars of the Roses.

Three Britons confirmed as victims of Germanwings plane crash

■ UK Foreign Office name Paul Bramley, 28 and Martyn Matthews, 50, while family of UK resident Marina Bandrés López-Belio confirms she and her seven-month-old baby Julian, a British national, also perished

At least three Britons are among the 150 people who died in the French Alps plane crash, the UK foreign secretary, Philip Hammond, has said.

Paul Bramley, 28, a student from Hull, and Martyn Matthews, 50, the father of two grownup children from Wolverhampton, have

both been named by the Foreign Office as victims.

The family of UK resident Marina Bandrés López-Belio and her seven-month-old baby Julian, a British national, have also confirmed they were on the Germanwings Airbus A320 flight.

López-Belio, who lived in Manchester, had bought

a last minute ticket to visit her family in Spain for her uncle's funeral, her husband, Pawel Pracz, said in a statement.

"My wife Marina Bandrés López-Belio and our son Julian Pracz-Bandrés were on board the plane that crashed in the Alps yesterday. We have been

living in Manchester for seven years. Marina was an editor and colourist, and we were both working in post-production for film and video.

"Marina was visiting her family in Spain for her uncle's funeral. She bought the tickets at the last moment, and decided to return to Manchester quickly as she wanted to return to her daily routine as soon as possible.

"I'm with my closest family in Manchester, and in close contact with our family in Spain at this very difficult time. We are devastated and would like

to request that we be allowed to grieve in peace as a family without intrusion at this difficult time."

It is understood that López-Belio and Pracz, who is from Poland, met while they were studying at Manchester's Futureworks film school, where they graduated in 2009.

Richard Hellowell, her former tutor at the school, described her as an "exceptional student".

"She was the type of person that made the world a brighter place and she will be truly missed."

Danielle Hewitt, 23,

who studied the same course as the couple, said: "They were a lovely couple. They were just really nice, friendly people.

"They were met while they were there and they just seemed to click. They were always together and never on their own. It's such a shame. They were just genuine, lovely people."

Paul Bramley's father said their family was deeply shocked. Bramley had just finished his first year studying hospitality and hotel management at César Ritz college in Lucerne, Switzerland.

Palace outrage as Charles's letters must to be made public

PRINCE CHARLES was dealt a legal setback this week as Britain's highest court ruled a series of memos he wrote to seven separate government departments must be made public.

The so-called "Black Spider Memos" are considered potentially damaging to the Crown because they would appear to breach the long tradition of non-interference from the Royal Family in governmental affairs.

The Supreme Court justices in London rejected a challenge by the Attorney General, Jeremy Wright QC, on Wednesday which would have stopped the publication of 27 out of 30 frank and "deeply personal" letters from the Prince between September 2004 and March 2005.

The opinionated Prince is known for his views on a range of topics from the environment and farming to complementary medicine and architecture.

His distinctive handwriting and abundant use of underlining and exclamation marks gave the letters their distinctive nickname.

The Guardian newspaper has been trying since 2005 to obtain the letters from government departments using Freedom of Information requests.

A court ruled the letters could be made public in 2012 but the Attorney General, the Government's principal legal advisor who was then Dominic Grieve, vetoed the decision.

Last year the Court of Appeal said the veto was unlawful so the Attorney General appealed to the Supreme Court in a last-ditch attempt to stop disclosure, saying it could undermine Prince Charles' position.

Canned Clarkson facing police probe

■ BBC axe controversial Top Gear host over assault - and he may face criminal charges

TO THE DELIGHT of many, it's been a miserable week for Jeremy Clarkson.

The controversial Top Gear host was fired by the BBC this week following an investigation into his latest high-profile offence, an unprovoked physical attack on Top Gear producer, Oisin Tymon, at a hotel near Hawes.

And now it has emerged Clarkson is also facing a possible criminal investigation after North Yorkshire police asked to see the findings of the BBC's internal investigation.

According to the BBC, Mr Tymon was subjected to a 30 second physical attack at the Simonstone Hotel in Hawes, which only ended when a witness intervened.

complaint

The findings went on to claim that Mr Tymon was left with a split lip and drove himself to a local hospital for treatment.

He did not make a complaint to the police at the time and Clarkson later reported himself to BBC management over the incident.

But the police have now confirmed they are looking into the matter.

A spokesman for North Yorkshire police said: "North Yorkshire Police is liaising with the BBC regarding the alleged incident in North Yorkshire involving Jeremy Clarkson.

"We have asked the BBC for the report which details the findings of their internal investigation into the matter.

"The information will be assessed appropriately and action will be taken by North Yorkshire Police where necessary."

The alleged assault took place on the patio area of the Simonstone Hall

Hotel, North Yorkshire, on March 4 2015.

The team were on a location shoot there, after travelling from an earlier studio recording of Top Gear which had taken place in Surrey.

It was claimed Clarkson became angry after he was informed he could not have steak and chips because the hotel had stopped serving hot food.

The future of Top Gear remained unclear at press time, after James May indicated that he and Richard Hammond may walk away from the show out of solidarity with Clarkson.

'a package'

May said that he and his two co-presenters were "a team" adding that they come as "a package".

May described Clarkson's sacking as "a tragedy" and said his future involvement in the programme required "thought, deliberation and conversation between many people".

Asked if he would stay with the programme, May replied: "I don't want to talk about that too much but I think we are very much, the three of us, a package.

"It works for very complicated reasons that a lot of people don't fully understand."

May said the BBC's decision to sack Clarkson was "probably within the law and their hands are tied". But he believes the incident has been blown out of proportion.

"I'm sorry that what ought to have been a small incident, sorted out early, turned into something bigger," he said.

Clarkson made his first public appearance after learning his contract will not be renewed at around 8pm on Wednesday evening.

He left his upmarket

west London home on a push bike wearing a black leather coat and a grey beanie hat.

Riding past photographers and TV cameras, he said: "Excuse me gentlemen, thank you."

Combative

Asked by reporters what his reaction was, Clarkson said "I'm off out, sorry" before riding away.

But Clarkson had been in more combative mood in his final column for Top Gear magazine.

He blasted the show's critics and said the brand's success pays to prop up other BBC programmes.

Without Top Gear's foreign sales, there would be even less sport on the BBC, he said.

Writing in the latest issue of the magazine, Clarkson challenged any unhappy viewers to make their own car show and told them to stop leaving "stupid" comments on the Top Gear message board.

He wrote: "Generally speaking, the new series of Top Gear seems to have been rather popular.

"The viewing figures are only about 400 million behind that midwife thing on the other side, the newspaper reviews are generous, we've managed to avoid a Hammond-shaped icicle in Canada,

and May has driven from London to the studio at Dunsfold [in Surrey] every week, without going via Shropshire.

"We've not even crashed to any significant degree.

"However, on Top Gear's website, there's a smattering of people who aren't impressed at all.

"It's hard to be sure as their comments are a mishmash of acronyms and short forms... all wrapped up in a virtually impenetrable parcel of apostrophe abuse and

spelling mistakes.

"Top Gear is about balance.

"It's about a blend of supercars, normal cars, very cheap cars, madcap projects that go wrong... sumptuous photography, excellent music and jokes, some of which are funny."

Despite the BBC's findings about the assault, Clarkson will still receive an estimated £74,000 of licence fee payers' money owed to him from the time he was suspended until his contract expires at the end of the month.

Election boost for Tories as inflation falls to record low

Inflation has fallen to zero for the first time on record in Britain, boosting incomes in real terms and handing the chancellor a pre-election advantage.

The consumer prices index dropped in February from 0.3% in January, bringing the UK to the brink of a spell of deflation that is expected in the coming months.

Economists had forecast a smaller drop to 0.1% but a deep oil price slump and a fierce price war being fought out by supermarkets brought fuel prices down by 16.6% over the year and cut food prices by 3.4%, according to the Office for National Statistics.

'prices are frozen'

Confirmation that prices were flat over the year allowed Chancellor George Osborne to question Labour's claim that the UK is in the midst of a cost of living crisis.

Osborne said zero inflation was "a first for the British economy" and good news for family budgets.

Taking to Twitter to mock Labour, he added: "Prices are frozen and as the recovery from

Labour's Great Recession strengthens, their economic argument has literally come to nought."

Real terms pay fell for six straight years between 2008 and 2014, as inflation consistently outpaced wage growth. However, that trend has been in reverse since late 2014 giving households a boost. The latest figures showed wage growth running at 1.8% including bonuses in the three months to January.

imports cheaper

The consumer prices index – Britain's official inflation measure – has not fallen to zero since comparable records began in 1989. However, unofficial estimates suggest it might have been lower in 1960.

Overall price falls are expected later in the spring as the global oil price slump continues to feed through to lower prices at the petrol pump and cuts in some utility bills. A lower oil price also cuts costs for manufacturers and food producers.

The strength of the pound against the euro, the UK's main trading partner, makes imports

cheaper and could also bring down inflation in the coming months.

Inflation was last close to the Bank of England's 2% target in June 2014, when it registered 1.9% and the latest figures keep any rise in interest rates firmly off the table.

"UK inflation is dead," declared Vicky Redwood, chief UK economist at Capital Economics after the figures were published.

"The UK is now within a whisker of deflation. It looks odds-on that inflation will turn negative in March, when the cut in gas prices by British Gas will show up in the inflation figures for the first time.

'prices are frozen'

"Inflation is then likely to remain around zero/slightly negative for the rest of the year."

She added: "We still think deflation in the UK will be a 'good' development, giving household incomes a welcome boost and supporting the economic recovery this year."

The latest spell of weak price pressures in the UK has triggered a division of opinion at the

very top of the Bank of England.

Mark Carney, the Bank's governor, has argued that while the country should experience overall

falling prices during spring, Britain is not heading for the dangerous deflationary spiral feared in the eurozone.

Deflation can become

entrenched and difficult to escape once businesses and consumers delay spending plans because they expect prices to fall further still.

Government vow benefit crackdown on foreigners who won't learn English

FOREIGNERS who refuse to learn English after coming to Britain will have their benefits taken away under radical new plans.

The Conservatives are reportedly planning to put "rocket boosters" on current sanctions that remove benefits from immigrants who will not learn English.

Officials working for home secretary Theresa May have met with the Department of Work and Pensions to discuss how they could include housing and sickness benefits if the Tories are elected in May.

Doctors and nurses

will also be forced to direct foreigners who cannot speak English to language courses, The Telegraph reported.

Ms May had promised in her manifesto to introduce "new incentives and penalties" to make immigrants learn English.

Almost 800,000 immigrants in Britain admit they struggle with English or can't speak it at all, official figures show.

They can currently claim up to £400 per week in housing benefits.

Last week the home secretary pledged to crack down

on Muslim extremists and it is hoped that the sweeping benefits reforms would drive out home-grown terror.

She said: "We have been clear all along that the Government's counter-extremism strategy must seek to defeat extremism in all its forms, but it's obvious from the evidence that the most serious and widespread form of extremism we need to confront is Islamist extremism."

In May last year Sajid Javid, the UK's first Asian Secretary of state, said immigrants should learn English and respect the British way of life.

Thousands evacuated as Nazi bomb unearthed in London

A Nazi bomb from the Second World War discovered near Tower Bridge in London has been detonated, over seven decades after being dropped on the city.

The 1000lb explosive was uncovered by construction workers in Grange Walk, Bermondsey on Monday.

Homes and businesses were hastily evacuated

and hundreds of schoolchildren were forced to flee their classrooms to safety.

The explosive was discovered in the morning by construction workers, who reportedly cracked the casing of the missile while working at the site of the former Southwark Irish Pensioners' Centre.

A huge swathe of Bermondsey was quickly

sealed off by police, causing traffic chaos across London's roads. Tower Bridge was closed in both directions.

The London Independent reported that army bomb personnel inspected the 5ft long SA-type device to ensure the 250kg bomb was safe to take to a Ministry of Defence facility in Kent for detonation.

Uproar and amusement as Russell Brand is named one of world's great thinkers

■ Intellectual magazine faces ridicule after it votes comedian fourth in list of influential minds

■ Others in the top ten are economists, philosophers and a US surgeon

Russell Brand has been voted as the world's fourth greatest thinker by readers of one of Britain's leading intellectual magazines.

But the magazine is facing ridicule for including the self-style revolutionary on the list of eminent philosophers, economists and writers.

Drayton Bird wrote on Twitter: 'Beyond parody: if this wag is a great thinker, my vote goes to Peppa Pig.'

Tim Walker added: 'A generation or so ago, Bertrand Russell was considered to be a great thinker. Now, comically, it's Russell Brand.'

While writer David Oldroyd-Bolt added: 'It's utterly perverse. Russell Brand? Nothing more than a Dickensian demagogue.'

Television and radio presenter Brand, who lost his Radio 2 slot over prank calls to actor Andrew Sachs, made his name in stand-up.

But the millionaire's attempts to re-brand himself as an anti-capitalist revolutionary have seen him accused of hypocrisy.

Last December Simon Cowell branded him a 'hypocrite' after he accused the comedian of accepting large Hollywood film salaries whilst campaigning against the UK political system.

According to the Mirror, the music mogul told Russell to give up his multi-million pound salary if he is planning to

continue his campaigning streak.

Brand faced further backlash that month when he joined a protest about rising rents in London even though he lives in a £2million bachelor pad owned by a firm based in a tax haven.

The star, believed to be worth £9million, was helping deliver a petition on affordable housing to 10 Downing Street but flew into a rage when TV reporter Paraic O'Brien asked him whether the super-rich buying up property in London was driving up prices for everyone else.

Prospect admitted that Brand's inclusion on the list had caused 'intense' discussions among staff. But the magazine said that while he was often 'dismissed by his opponents as a clownish opportunist and even a hypocrite due to his own wealth, he is nevertheless the most charismatic figure on Britain's populist left.'

This year's winner was French economist Thomas Piketty, whose Capital in the Twenty-First Century book explored the thesis is that capitalist economies have a natural tendency to incubate highly unequal distributions of income and wealth.

The surprise best-seller, was described as having an 'extraordinary' impact outside the world of professional economists. Greek finance minister Yanis Varoufakis was rated second greatest thinker and US author Naomi Klein came third. Nobel Prize winner Paul Krugman and German philosopher Jurgen Habermas were also in the top ten.

Rated as ninth was British philosopher John Gray, the former Professor of European Thought at the London School of Economics, who was described as 'the West's pre-eminent oracle of catastrophe'.

Prospect said it was 'striking' that several of its top 10 thinkers - including Piketty, Brand, Krugman and Varoufakis, a member of the radical Syriza government, as well as US author Naomi Klein - were 'broadly speaking on the political left'.

RUSSELL BRAND: great thinker or Dickensian demagogue?

Welsh are the 'shyest and most emotionally unstable' of us all...

Welsh people are among the shyest in Britain, according to a new study - and are less emotionally stable than the English, Scots or Northern Irish.

Researchers looked at the personality differences of more than 400,000 Britons, finding marked differences between regions - with Scots proving the friendliest, Welsh the shyest and Londoners the least welcoming.

The study by the University of Cambridge looked at data gathered online about five traits - extroversion, agreeableness, conscientiousness, emotional stability and openness - to assess the personality of residents in different parts of the country. Dr Jason Rentfrow, from the university's Department of Psychology, said the findings were more than "a bit of fun" and could help shape government decisions.

He said: "Geographical differences are associated with a range of economic, social and health outcomes - and hence how important resources are allocated.

"Although

participants in an online test are self-selecting, the demographic characteristics are representative of the British population, so we can develop an accurate snapshot of the psychology of the nation."

The findings included high levels of extroversion in London and Manchester as well as pockets of the South and South East England, Scotland and Yorkshire. In contrast, those living in Wales, Humberside, the East Midlands, the North of England and East Scotland tended to be quiet, reserved and introverted.

The most agreeable people were found in Scotland, the North of England, South West and some parts of the East of England, suggesting disproportionate numbers of residents of these areas were friendly, trusting, and kind. These regions tended to have higher proportions of women, married couples and low-income residents. Other findings included the Welsh, Londoners, and those living in some parts of the North of England, being the least conscientious - suggesting they were "disorderly, rebellious and indifferent". The research found significantly low levels of emotional stability throughout most of Wales and in a number of districts throughout the Midlands.

Scots only slightly more left wing and pro-EU than English, study reveals

A NEW survey appears to have debunked suggestions that people in Scotland are significantly more left-wing and pro-European than those south of the Border.

Only marginally fewer people in Scotland believe Britain should leave the EU, according to the latest UK Social Attitudes Survey. It compares with 25.4 per cent in England and Wales.

However, around 40 per cent both in Scotland and England say they support staying in Europe but want to see the power of Brussels reduced.

The SNP's opponents seized on the findings saying they exposed "nationalist myths" that the two countries had significantly different political outlooks and indicated strong support for remaining in the UK.

Thursday's study also found that beliefs over fees for higher education are broadly in line north and south of the border, with three quarters of Scots against universal free university tuition.

Scots are marginally more comfortable with larger state, with 43.8 per cent saying tax should be increased to spend more on health, education and benefits, compared to 36.4 per cent in England.

Rachel Ormston, co-head of attitudes at social researcher ScotCen, said that while there was a clear difference between Scotland and the rest of the UK, the scale of the disparity was often exaggerated.

She said: "It's true we are a bit more left wing and a bit more pro-European, but the scale of the difference is not as big as you might expect, given the different narratives adopted by our politicians.

"Scotland is to the left of England, but in terms of a general pattern they mirror each other. They tend to drift to the left or the right in tandem."

Hundreds of workers ask for COMPASSIONATE LEAVE as heartthrob singer quits top boy band

HUNDREDS of British workers called employers asking for compassionate leave following Zayn Malik's decision to quit One Direction this week.

The heartbroken workers were convinced they were too distressed to turn up for work after the 22-year-old walked away from the pop band on Wednesday.

Britain's leading employer consultant Peninsula said it had received an astonishing 220 calls from firms seeking advice on what they should do after receiving the requests from staff.

Alan Price, an employment law director at the firm, confirmed he was telling bosses to refuse the request - unless the

workers are of course related to the departing star.

He said: "While I sympathise with One Direction fans, I hardly think this qualified as compassionate leave.

"It's a story you could not make up but I don't think that Zayn Malik's departure qualifies for compassionate leave and this is the advice we have had to give to employers.

"If employees feel strongly about the issue then request that they take days off as a holiday, but compassionate leave is what you allow if a close relative dies.

"Unless the employer is unaware of family ties with Zayn Malik then I hardly think that this qualifies.

"A b u s i n g compassionate leave is

inconsiderate to fellow colleagues who may genuinely need the time off."

Peninsula said it started receiving calls from beleaguered firms at 6.30pm Wednesday night and they continued until 9.30am Thursday

morning.

However, Mr Price said this was not the first time such they had seen such a spike in calls.

Back in 1996, when Take That announced they had split, the employment team also received an influx of calls

about compassionate leave.

And he revealed fans of BBC's Top Gear are seemingly made of sterner stuff.

"It's worth noting that the dismissal of Jeremy Clarkson has not led to calls," he said.

Jackie Trent, Pride of the Potteries, dies at 74

■ Singer-turned-songwriter enjoyed decades of success with husband Tony Hatch

SONGWRITER Jackie Trent, who with former husband Tony Hatch wrote some of the biggest hits of the 1960s and 1970s, has died at her home in Minorca. She was 74.

Trent enjoyed a long career that began as singer when she was courted by the Kray twins before moving into songwriting with husband Tony Hatch. But perhaps her biggest success came from penning the theme song to the long-running Australian soap opera Neighbours.

'single suitcase'

A coal miner's daughter, Trent was originally Yvonne Burgess, born in Newcastle-under-Lyme in Staffordshire in 1940.

She made her mark on local talent shows and by her early teens was singing professionally in local clubs, where she was styled as "the Vera Lynn of the Potteries".

She recalled: "In 1955 I abandoned school, packed a single suitcase and, clutching my precious music case, I caught the train to London - alone, no agent, no contacts and no work."

big break

She was not without work for long. "The Krays would sometimes escort me to the clubs and theatres where I worked, showering me with teddy bears," she said.

Her big break came when Tony Hatch, then riding high with his

smash hit Downtown, which he penned for Petula Clark, gave Trent a new song for which she wrote the lyrics, entitled Where Are You Now. The song was a surprise hit and knocked the Beatles' Ticket to Ride off the Number One spot in May 1965.

Its success led to further collaborations with Trent as composer and Hatch as lyricist, including the follow-up single When Summertime is Over, but it barely scraped into the Top 40.

partnership

Trent said later that she initially disliked Hatch. He was married when they met, but the two became lovers and eventually husband and wife. Their initial affair

inspired the song I Couldn't Live Without Your Love, a hit for Petula Clark in 1966.

It was as a songwriter, in partnership with Tony Hatch, that Trent enjoyed her greatest success. Their songs were recorded by stars of the calibre of Sinatra, Dean Martin and Shirley Bassey.

In the 1970s she and Hatch wrote the stage musicals The Card, which was produced in London's West End, and

Rock Nativity, which was staged at the Royal Lyceum, Edinburgh, during the Christmas 1975-76 season and broadcast by Scottish Television.

Trent and Hatch moved to Australia and then to Minorca. They eventually divorced. In recent years Trent had been working on a musical based on her own life. She is survived by her second husband and by two grown-up children.

Corden wins raves for Late, Late Show debut

James Corden has won huge praise from fans and critics alike this week after his debut appearance on CBS' The Late Late Show.

After weeks of worries about whether American audiences would understand his humour - or his accent - and how US celebrities would take to his full-on style, viewers and reviewers seem to have loved him.

Kicking off the show, the British comedian played to the perception that he is relatively unknown across the Atlantic as he thanked viewers for the honour of being selected for the

position - insisting he will try his best not to let them down.

As well as welcoming guests Tom Hanks and Mila Kunis onto the show: Simon Cowell, Allison Janney, Eddie Redmayne, Shia LaBoeuf and Meryl Streep also appeared in pre-recorded skits as he began his bid to win over the American public.

Afterwards, he told fans on Twitter: 'Well, so many truly lovely messages about the show tonight. I'm blown away, thank you.'

US fans appear to have quickly warmed to the London-born comic's

praise of his family, helped by a shot of his teary-eyed mother Margaret and father Malcolm, who travelled over from High Wycombe in Buckinghamshire to watch the show live.

A group of audience members who spoke after watching his first outing said that Corden 'nailed it'.

The group, mostly made up of women from Orange County, California, told Sky News they liked Corden's humour and warm style.

Brianne McDowell said: 'I have never experienced anything like

it. He was gracious and happy to have everyone there and he was so thankful for the opportunity. He was personable, talking about his family and his kids. He was really funny.'

The fans also praised the idea of having more than one guest on the show at one time, - something which Corden seems to have learned from the BBC's popular Graham Norton show but which has reportedly been resisted by some US stars.

The New York Daily News gushed: 'His easy going manner fit well with his low-key banter,

built more on everyday conversation than showbiz flash.'

E! Online said they were 'already in love with James Corden after just one episode.'

Tim Goodman for The Hollywood Reporter wrote: 'He's different... Corden doesn't put a layer of cool between him and the viewer (or his guests). It's a welcome trait, one that should put guests at ease.'

He added: 'The debut night's standout moment by far, however, was the idea of having Hanks and Corden act out bits from a string of Hanks films... It was very funny, very

creative and played to Corden's strengths as a multi-talented performer.'

But the critic pointed out that, while it might be easy to put on a good show with Tom Hanks and Mila Kunis as guests, Corden will have to work harder further into his tenure, when his guests may not be of the same calibre.

Brian Lowry, TV critic for Variety, made a similar point. After watching the show, he wrote: 'Corden comes across as natural and likable, including the self-effacing little song with which he closed the show.'

Tears all around: next season of Downton will be the last

The next season of ITV's period drama Downton Abbey will be its last, its makers have announced.

"Inevitably there comes a time when all shows should end and Downton is no exception," said the programme's executive producer Gareth Neame.

Created by Julian Fellowes, the show follows an aristocratic family's fortunes from 1912 to the mid-1920s.

Hugh Bonneville and Elizabeth McGovern have played the Earl and Countess of Grantham since the show began in 2010.

The drama has won a string of awards since its inception, including two Baftas, three Golden Globes and 11 Primetime Emmys.

'Unique experience'

Its success both at home and abroad was recently demonstrated when the Duchess of Cambridge went to see it being filmed at Ealing Studios in west London.

"We wanted to close the doors of Downton Abbey when it felt right and natural for the storylines to come together and when the show was still being enjoyed so much by its fans," said Neame.

"We can promise a final season full of all the usual drama and intrigue, but with the added excitement of discovering how and where they all end up."

Peter Fincham, ITV's director of television, said the nine-episode sixth series would come to an end with a "concluding special" on Christmas Day.

"The Downton journey has been amazing for everyone aboard," said Lord Fellowes, whose next project will be The Gilded Age, a period drama set in New York.

"People ask if we knew what was going to happen when we started to make the first series and the answer is that, of course we had no idea.

"Exactly why the series had such an impact and reached so many people around the world, all nationalities, all ages, all types, I cannot begin to explain."

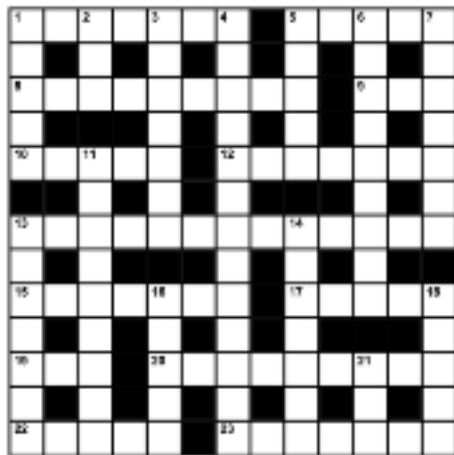

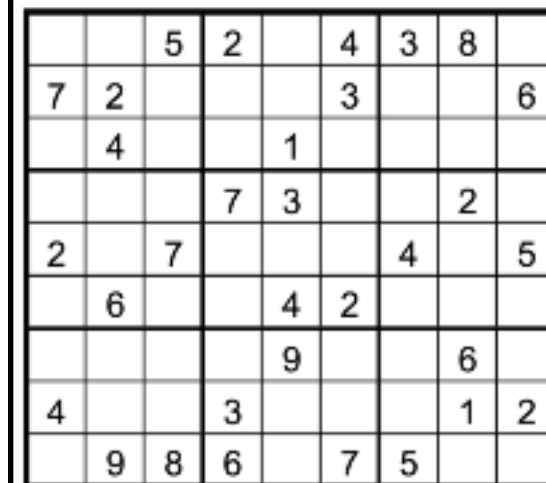

■ The fiercely funny 66-year-old punk poet from Salford, who performs for the first time at the El Rey Theatre, in May (2nd), shares his love of LA, the Arctic Monkeys and Zorro.

John, how are you?
I'm at home in Essex. We've all got flu but I've got nothing else to do, so this interview will probably last about five hours. You'll be looking at your watch yawning and I'll be going 'Don't go!' I'll be fine for the El Rey though, don't you worry, although I'm starting the tour in Las Vegas so anything could happen.

When was the first time you visited Los Angeles?

In 1982. I'd done a couple of shows in San Francisco and Palo Alto but I didn't perform in LA, I just had a look around so that's why this show is so important to me. I love Los Angeles, it's a special place – there's not a day that goes by where you don't see footage of Sunset Boulevard on the TV, so it's good to see the city with your own eyes. I'm particularly fond of the low buildings and lavish fenestrations.

Why do you love it so much?

Romantically, I'm an American. Everything I've ever loved has come from Los Angeles in particular. I love the music and the mythology of the place, going back to the Raymond Chandler books, and then all the way back even further to Zorro and old Spanish California.

And I was big on Zorro as a child. I still am.

You should move here and join our ex-pat community.

It's too late for me now I'm afraid. At my age I really need socialised medicine!

Good point. You started out as a punk poet in the late 1970's and now you're a bona fide legend. Who do you think will be at your gig?

I did a small gig at La Cita bar in downtown LA before Christmas and thought 30 disgruntled old punks would be there but they were turning people away. There's no age group for my fans. I get anyone from 16 to 95 in my audience and I guess that's a lot to do with being on the GCSE syllabus, being featured on *The Sopranos* and also being spotted by the likes of the Arctic Monkeys.

Yes, let's talk about how cool you are. Your poem Evidently Chickentown was used as the outro on the penultimate episode of The Sopranos.

I was so proud of that. They did it very much under the radar but I don't care I was honoured to be on it. It was my favorite show on the TV after the *Simpsons*. My mouthpiece is Homer Simpson, if you want to know what I think, ask him!

And then the Arctic Monkeys turned your poem, I Wanna Be Yours, into a gorgeous

ballad.

It was an unbelievable tribute. The poem was always a heartfelt little Valentine in the first place but Alex (Turner) converted it into a tender love ballad by not doing very much, that's why it's so good. He's got a place in LA so if he's around hopefully I'll be popping in for a cup of tea.

Do you still enjoy performing?

More than ever. It's a sensational job. I love being in a car and I love touring. I've got that beatnik gene. Really, I love arriving somewhere where people are going to say really nice things about me. Who could hate that?

What would you say to anyone who wants a career in poetry?

I would say to them that most poets in history have never been professionals. Even Philip Larkin was a librarian. I'm quite unique that I'm a professional poet. My living standards stand or fall on the ability to write poetry that people like. Also, don't expect to start earning the big money straight away. Nobody outside of a lunatic asylum said, "I need money quick. I know I'll write some poetry!"

You're a national treasure. Are you happy to still be known as a "punk poet"?

I don't mind it really and it's understandable because that's what I was first known as, and you can't fight the

mythology. It doesn't keep me awake at night, so you know what, punk poet it is!

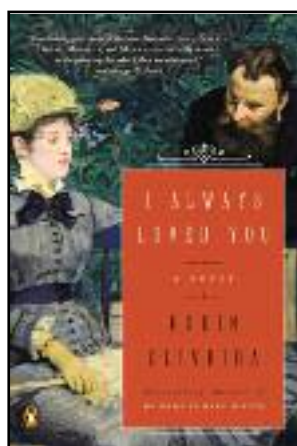

The private lives of Mary and Edgar....

Interview with author Robin Oliveira and a review of her new novel about the lives of artists Mary Cassatt and Edgar Degas

Rating: ★★★★★

"I have always loved ballet and Edgar Degas's paintings of the ballet," says *I Always Loved You* author Robin Oliveira. "But the true inspiration for the book came when I learned that at the end of her life Mary Cassatt had not only burned all the letters that she had ever received from Degas, but that upon his death, she had retrieved from his studio all the letters that she had ever written to him and later burned them too. Because of this



the nature of their relationship has always been a puzzle to biographers and historians. Were they in love? What happened between them? Had they ever been lovers? This type of gap in the historical record is the entry point for historical fiction, at least it is for me."

Engaging. The details of artists' personalities, how

they paint and the intersections of their art and personal lives will draw you in. Oliveira traces the personal lives of Mary Cassatt and Edgar Degas. She also shares insights into the lives of artist Édouard Manet and his lover Berthe Morisot. Other famous people in the book include Abigail May Alcott, sister of Louisa May Alcott, author Émile Zola and impressionist artist Claude Monet.

It is 1907. Mary Cassatt meets Edgar Degas. Mary is an American trying to conform to the style of art of the times. Edgar changes her painting style. Mary lives most of her adult life in Paris. The story Oliveira weaves is filled with their shared love of painting and Impressionism. We feel their love of art and their

despair in disappointments. The book is a love affair of art, not physical love. A must-read if you're passionate about art.

When Oliveira started, she knew nothing about Paris in the Belle Epoque. "Before I even began writing, I read a great deal of art history, art technique, exhibition catalogs, diaries, and biographies of the impressionists to educate myself," she says. "Fifty books, perhaps, in total. After I began writing, when I knew which paintings I needed to see in person, I visited many museums: the Metropolitan Museum of Art, the Morgan Library and Museum, the Philadelphia Museum of Art, The National Gallery, the Phillips Collection, the Louvre, and the Musée

d'Orsay. I spent time in the library of the Musée d'Orsay in search of unpublished letters and documents of the artists, including exhibition catalogs of the Salon and the impressionists. I also read old French newspapers at the Library of Congress." A theme that runs through each of Oliveira's books is a strong woman fighting for a place in a man's world. "Many people have asked me whether or not I have encountered prejudicial obstacles that have led me to this theme," says Oliveira. "I have not. I've been extraordinarily lucky. I was raised with four sisters and no brother to compare us to, so I was always told that I could do anything I wanted.... But women as a whole have always had to fight for a place among men. It

is one of the unifying conflicts across cultures. It continues to astonish me how tenacious this prejudice remains worldwide. I like to showcase women who have successfully fought the good fight and shown us how it is done."

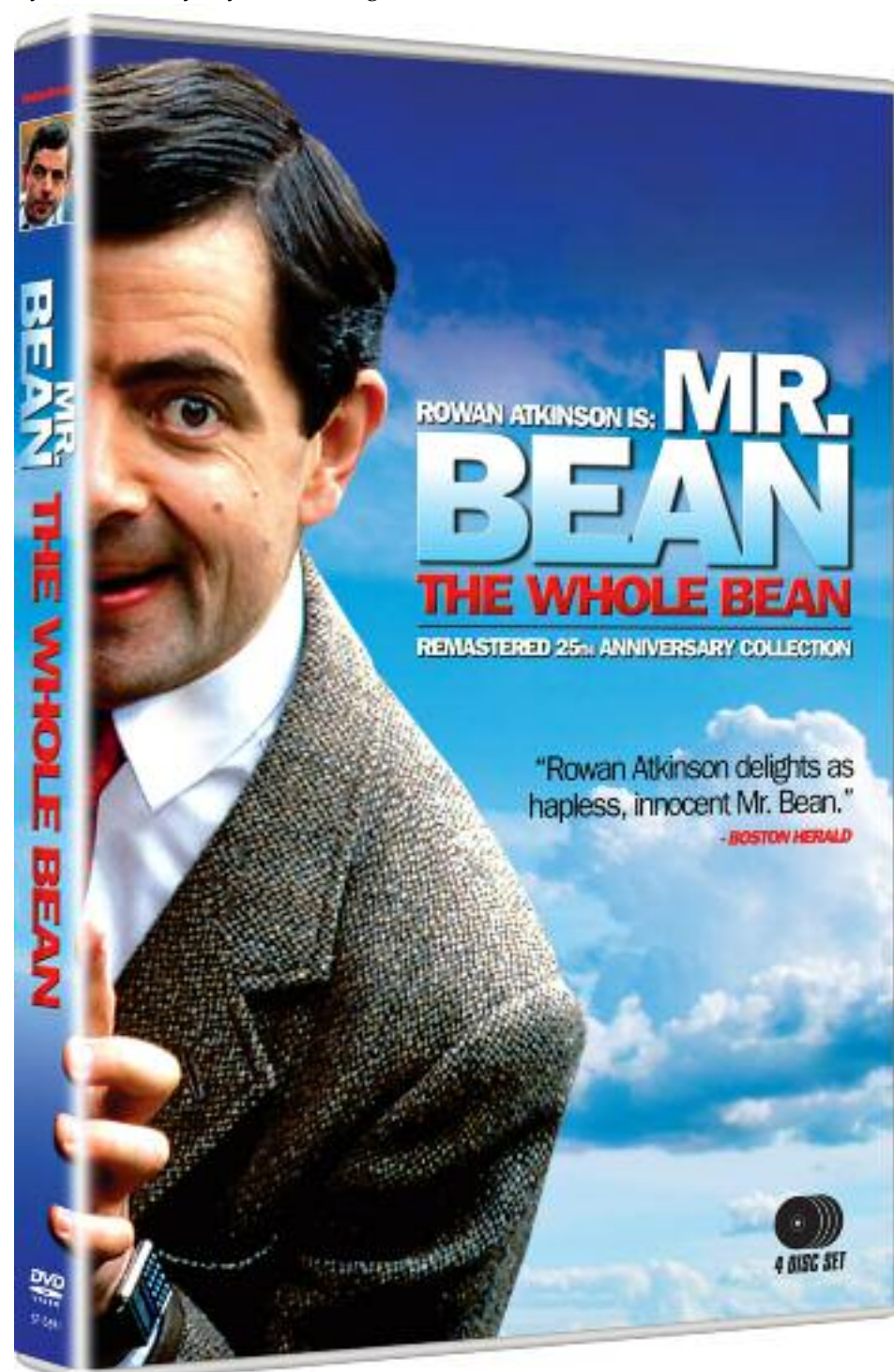

Terry has won 13 major honours with the Stamford Bridge club since making his debut in 1998, winning the Champions League, Europa League, three Premier League titles, five FA Cup trophies and three League Cup victories.

He captained Chelsea to two top-flight titles in Mourinho's first spell at Chelsea but was not always selected by interim boss Rafael Benitez during an injury-troubled 2012-13 season.

new contract after a season where he has already played 40 matches," added Mourinho.

Harry Kane scored 79 seconds into his England debut and Wayne Rooney moved a step closer to Sir Bobby Charlton's all-time goalscoring record in a routine 4-0 Euro 2016 dismissal of Lithuania at Wembley on Friday.

Kane - with 29 goals for Tottenham this season - emerged as a substitute after 70 minutes with England already on the way to a fifth win from five qualifiers with goals from Rooney, Danny Welbeck and Raheem Sterling.

The stage was set for the 21-year-old but even the man with the Midas touch in front of goal this season would have struggled to believe he would score with his third touch as a full England international, heading in Sterling's cross at the far post.

It was the final flourish on an England win that was little more than a formality in a group that surely provides the safest of passages to France next summer.

Rooney got the night off to the perfect start when he headed his 47th goal for England after only six minutes, leaving him just two adrift of Charlton's tally ahead of Tuesday's friendly against Italy in Turin.

England's captain also hit the woodwork twice before man of the match Welbeck, who deservedly kept his

place despite public clamour for Kane's inclusion, headed a deflected second just before half-time.

Sterling was rewarded for a lively performance with his first England goal - but it was Kane who did what he has been doing all season and stole the show with a predator's effort as part of a confident cameo.

Hodgson refused to rush Kane into his England starting line-up despite his golden run of form but he will be delighted that he has demonstrated, albeit briefly and against desperately poor opposition, that he is an added weapon in his attacking armoury.

In the wider context of Euro 2016, Lithuania provided further proof of how England have been handed a gloriously favourable group in which to continue their rehabilitation following the World Cup debacle in Brazil. There could never be any excuses for not reaching France.

Rooney started the night with Charlton's record firmly in his sights - and could have equalled it by the interval.

He was put through by Fabian Delph in the third minute but slid a low shot against the post with Lithuania keeper Giedrius Arlauskis beaten.

Rooney was not to be

kept at bay for long, and he took another stride towards that landmark three minutes later with a simple header from six yards after Arlauskis blocked Welbeck's shot.

A looping header against the woodwork and a low free-kick clutched by Arlauskis continued Rooney's efforts - but it was Welbeck who ended any fanciful suggestion that this might develop into a serious contest with England's second from a deflected header right on half-time.

It was little more than a procession and Arlauskis distinguished himself again with a superb save from Delph's volley and a Welbeck snapshot as England resumed the siege.

The gallant keeper was powerless to stop England adding a third just before the hour, Sterling's simple tap-in the perfect conclusion to
