Short honeymoon for new Labour leader

■ Corbyn strolls to victory in party vote - then comes under fire for NOT singing the national anthem at RAF memorial service

Jeremy Corbyn has endured a controversial first week following his overwhelming victory in the Labour leadership contest at the weekend.

The unabashed left-winger cruised to victory with almost 60 per cent in the first round of voting at the weekend, a landslide victory which saw him take 251,000 of the total 422,000 votes cast. He won the most support from members, registered supporters and affiliated members alike.

Yet Corbyn came under fire almost immediately for pointedly refusing to sing the national anthem during an RAF service marking the 75th anniversary of the Battle of Britain on Tuesday, prompting Tory MP Sir Nicholas Soames, Winston Churchill's grandson, to describe Corbyn's behaviour as "very rude and very disrespectful".

In his victory speech, Mr Corbyn said: "During these amazing three months, our party has changed. We have grown enormously, because of

the hopes of so many ordinary people for a different Britain, a better Britain, a more equal Britain, a more decent Britain. They are fed up with the inequality, the injustice, the unnecessary poverty. All those issues have brought people in in a spirit of hope and optimism."

'utterly boring'

Mr Corbyn also revealed he is planning a shake-up of Prime Minister's Questions to allow other Labour MPs to ask questions in his place sometimes. He told the Huffington Post: "I want prime minister's Question Time to be less theatre, more fact, less theatrical, more understandable. I think it's very exciting for political obsessives, it's utterly boring for most of the population, who think it's an utter irrelevance. I will be

trying to conduct my part in prime minister's Question Time on the basis of the questions and also share out a lot more stuff in within the parliamentary Labour party. I'll obviously be there and do all the things that I'm asked to do. But we've got a lot of very talented people within the parliamentary Labour party. They can call ask questions, they can all do things, let's share it all out a bit. It won't all be me everywhere all the time."

"It's a whole party, and a whole movement. We are about bringing people on, not stopping people."

He reasserted his message that Britain does not need nuclear weapons - ahead of a plan to persuade his party to back his controversial stance.

And his refusal to sing the national anthem

found some unlikely backing from James Gray, a Conservative MP and a member of the Defence Select Committee, who said: "The fact he was there properly dressed, wearing a tie, good on him. Well done him."

"He is a pacifist and not a royalist but he has gone along and stood in the front row," he said.

In a statement released

by the Labour Party before the event, Mr Corbyn pair tribute to those who fought in the Battle of Britain.

"My mum served as an air raid warden and my dad in the Home Guard," he said.

"Like that whole generation, they showed tremendous courage and determination to defeat fascism. The heroism of

the Royal Air Force in the Battle of Britain is something to which we all owe an enormous debt of gratitude.

"The loss of life - both civilian and military - should be commemorated so that we both honour their lives and do all that we can to ensure future generations are spared the horrors of war."

BCC to blame for 'no' vote, claims Salmond

■ Former First Minister renews attack a year on from historic referendum

Biased reporting by the BBC in the lead up to Scotland's independence referendum last year was a "significant factor" in the country deciding to remain part of the Union, Alex Salmond has claimed.

In an interview with The Independent exactly a year on from the historic vote, Scotland's former First Minister renewed his attack on the BBC's coverage of the

referendum, saying his "biggest regret" of the campaign was not foreseeing the extent of its "institutional bias".

Mr Salmond also launched an extraordinary broadside against the wider Scottish media, describing the country's right wing press as "prejudicial, short sighted lunatics" who "infect" social media with purposefully slanted articles.

"I think what decided

the referendum was the renewed scaremongering campaign, and the BBC was one of the chosen instruments of that scaremongering," the former SNP leader said. "My biggest regret of the campaign is I didn't anticipate that the BBC would be as biased as they were."

On the prospect of a second referendum, Mr Salmond said the Yes side would win another vote if it were held tomorrow. He added that

the BBC's influence would be lessened because the corporation had "managed to wreck the greatest broadcasting reputation in the world" and was now "in crisis in terms of its relationship with the people of Scotland".

Singling out the Scottish editions of the *Daily Mail* and *Daily Telegraph* for further criticism, Mr Salmond said some of the titles' journalists produced "not just right wing

nonsense" but "mad resemblance to reality as right wing nonsense" a Daily Express weather which "bears as much report".

3,000 homegrown extremists, says MI5 boss

MI5 and anti-terrorism police are monitoring more than 3,000 homegrown Islamic extremists willing to carry out attacks in Britain, security sources have said.

British men and women, many in their teens, are being radicalised to the point of violence within weeks, MI5 warned on Thursday.

Investigators have also detected a significant overlap between Islamist suspects and those suffering mental health problems, leaving them vulnerable to grooming. The NHS now has full-time staff attached to

the anti-extremism Prevent programme who try to identify signs of extremist behaviour. Although more than half of Islamists on terrorist watch lists live in London, especially in the capital's east and west, there are other hotspots in the southeast. The scale of the domestic threat was revealed after Andrew Parker became the first MI5 director-general in

the agency's 106-year history to give a live broadcast interview. Intelligence officials had foiled six plots in the past year, he said yesterday, calling on internet giants to help in the fight.

Mr Parker told BBC Radio 4: "Most of the people who try to become involved in terrorism in this country are people who were born and brought up here, have come through our education system, and have nonetheless concluded that the country — their home country and the country of their birth — is their enemy."

jihadi activity suggests that the number of violent suspects being monitored has risen by more than 50 per cent since 2007, when the security agencies had a list of 2,000 people seen as active supporters of

al-Qaeda. The number has surged in the past two years with the rise of Islamic State in Syria. Most of those under suspicion have never been to Syria but have fallen under the influence of the

organisation's online propaganda.

About 1,000 Britons are thought to have joined jihadist groups in Syria, 300 have returned and 70 have been killed fighting in Syria and Iraq since 2011.

'Thatcher should be on \$10 bill'

US Republican presidential hopeful Jeb Bush has picked former Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher as his choice for the face of the \$10 bill.

The former Florida governor made the surprise suggestion during Wednesday's televised debate for the top Republicans vying for the presidential nomination.

All 11 candidates were asked who they would choose, now the US Treasury has announced plans to put a woman on the redesigned note.

Mr Bush's choice drew applause.

"I would go with Ronald Reagan's partner, Margaret Thatcher," he said, noting it was "probably illegal" and unlikely to happen because she is not American.

But he added: "A strong leader is what we need in the White House, and she certainly was a strong leader that restored the United Kingdom into greatness."

He was not the only Republican to pick a foreigner to grace the new note, which comes into circulation in 2020.

Mother Teresa was the choice of the Governor of Ohio, John Kasich.

Woman convicted for impersonating man to dupe friend into having sex

■ Gayle Newland found guilty of three counts of sexual assault after asking woman to wear blindfold during meetings with 'Kye Fortune'

A woman has been found guilty of sexual assault for pretending to be a man in order to trick one of her friends into having sex with her while wearing a blindfold.

Gayle Newland, 25, protested her innocence from the dock at Chester crown court after being found guilty of three counts of sexual assault on Tuesday.

roleplay

She had admitted using a male alter-ego called Kye Fortune to chat up girls online, saying she was not comfortable with being a lesbian and found it easier to approach women that way. But she denied sexual assault, claiming her accuser, also aged 25, always knew she was pretending to be a man as they engaged in roleplay while struggling with their sexuality.

The pair had sex about 10 times until on one occasion the

complainant took off the blindfold and saw Newland wearing a prosthetic penis, her breasts restrained by bandages under a swimming costume, her long hair covered by a hat.

prosthetic penis

On Tuesday, a jury of eight women and four men convicted the defendant, from Willaston, the Wirral, of three counts of sexual assault by penetration, which took place at the complainant's flat. She was cleared of two similar offences said to have taken place at hotels in Chester: largely after her defence was able to prove she had not purchased the prosthetic penis until after those encounters.

The jurors reached majority verdicts on which 10 of them agreed on each of the three guilty counts after six hours and 11 minutes of deliberation.

Adjourning the case for pre-sentence reports,

Judge Roger Dutton told the court that Newland had "serious issues surrounding her personality".

desperate

He told Newland the consequences of her behaviour "may be serious", prompting her anguished response: "How can you send me down for something I have not done?"

She will be sentenced in November following assessments by psychiatrists and probation.

The complainant's case was that she was so desperate to be loved that she suspended her

disbelief during her two-and-a-half year relationship with Newland, whom she truly believed was a man called Kye Fortune. Kye told her he was insecure about his body, having lost muscle tone following treatment for a brain tumour and a car accident. Because of these body consciousness issues, he asked her to wear a blindfold every time they met, even when they watched films together or went out in "his" car.

She agreed. Giving evidence last week, the complainant said: "Every time I met up

with Kye Fortune, I either had the mask on already or he would wait outside the door and I would put it on. I was so desperate to be loved. It's pathetic, so desperate for love, so desperate."

foolish

She was heterosexual, she insisted, and thought Newland was too. She admitted she had been perhaps foolish to have sex with someone she had never seen in the flesh, but insisted she only ever consented to sleeping with a man, not a woman wearing a prosthetic device.

“Depressed” Frank Bruno back in hospital after relapse in long fight against bipolar disorder

Boxing legend tells reporters: “This may well be the toughest fight of my life, but I’ll do all I can to win it”

Frank Bruno has been readmitted to hospital after suffering a devastating relapse in his bipolar disorder battle.

The boxing legend, who has been sectioned three times in the past 12 years, went voluntarily with a “severe bout of depression”.

Just days ago Frank looked happy and relaxed as he posed for pictures with fans after finishing the Great North Run charity event.

‘terribly sad’

But the 53-year-old was hiding the anguish of his continuing struggle against bipolar disorder.

One close friend said: “It is terribly sad but Frank has been struggling for the last few weeks now and needed to get some help.

“He has taken this step in a bid to try to make sure he gets better and back to his best as soon as he can.

“All that matters now is that Frank focuses on getting well and his recovery. Frank’s a fighter and this is a battle he is determined to win.”

His spokesman Dave Davies added: “After a very busy period Frank

decided to seek medical assistance to help with a severe bout of depression.”

Frank was due to talk about his glittering career at a dinner in Lincoln on Friday night but pulled out due to his illness.

Boxer David Haye will host the event.

harrowing detail

Three years ago Bruno told the *Sunday Mirror* he wanted to be out for good after another spell battling the condition on a psychiatric ward.

Speaking in harrowing detail about being sectioned twice in the space of six months following a relapse, he said: “I was in there five weeks but it felt like five years. It is harder than being in the ring.

“At least in boxing it is 12 rounds and then you come out. In hospital I could never see when it was going to end.

“I felt it was a bad place for me. In the end all I wanted to do was get out.

“Now I am out I want to stay out. I take my medicine and I do what the doctors say. I am just working on staying alive.

“After I got out I

remember sitting at home looking at my belts again. I hold my memories of boxing very, very close, in many ways it does inspire me.

much-loved

Frank told how he got through the ordeal by doing 4,000 press-ups a night and by praying to God. But he told how during one hospital stint another patient had tried to stab him.

Last year, the dad-of-four joined Care and Support Minister Norman Lamb in a campaign trying to improve the care offered by the Government to people suffering with conditions such as bipolar and depression.

He was widely credited in helping bring about improvements.

Frank, who remains one of Britain’s most-loved sports stars despite quitting the ring 16 years ago, has openly spoken about his illness in the past and the need to break down mental health stigma.

Brian Close: remembered as ‘one of the bravest cricketers of all time’

Brian Close, the former England, Yorkshire and Somerset cricket captain, has passed away aged 84.

Close became the youngest player ever to represent England at 18 and went on to lead his country seven times in 22 Tests.

He died on Sunday after a long illness with cancer. His death was confirmed in a statement by Yorkshire CCC on Monday morning, who remembered him as “one of Yorkshire and England’s greatest ever captains and one of the game’s most courageous players”.

Retired Test umpire Dickie Bird also paid tribute to Close as an “all-time great”.

“He will go down as one of the bravest cricketers of all time,” he said. “He is Yorkshire’s most successful post-war captain - winning the County Championship on four occasions - and will always be regarded as one of the best skippers in the game.

“He led from the front and never took a back step. He commanded huge respect from his fellow players. He had the ability to get the best out of every player under his stewardship with his fearless and brave approach to the game.”

long career

Born in February 1931 in Rawdon, a small Yorkshire village, Close’s all-round sporting talent soon caught the eye of the professionals, not just at Yorkshire but also at Leeds United, for whom he would make six

appearances as a forward - scoring twice - and twice more for Bradford City. He also played once for Arsenal, and won an England Under-18 cap against Scotland at Pittodrie.

But cricket was his first love and he abandoned his other pursuits to concentrate on the sport, being rewarded with a long career which brought him 22,650 runs and 967 wickets in a 21-year stint at Yorkshire. He played his last first-class match at the age of 55, finishing only six runs short of 35,000 career runs at that level.

UK set for 'coldest winter in 50 years'

BRITAIN is facing the most savage winter in more than 50 years with months of heavy snowfall and bitter Arctic winds set to bring the country to a total standstill.

Sub-zero temperatures and violent snow storms could hit as soon as late October as a freak ocean cooling in the Atlantic threatens to trigger a historic, nationwide whiteout.

Emergency services have been warned to prepare for a repeat of the devastating 1962/63 winter which saw rivers and lakes freeze over across Britain.

The shock warnings have also sparked fears Britain could face fuel and food shortages as roads and transport networks grind to a halt.

Meteorologists and oceanographers warn plunging ocean temperatures in the Atlantic are at the root of the crisis.

Temperatures in the Gulf Stream - the warm ocean current which runs up the east coast of

America - have plummeted over the past year.

The stream merges into the North Atlantic Drift which normally pushes warm water towards the west coast of the United Kingdom.

However a drastic reduction in speed and temperature of the current has left Britain without any buffer to a bitter Arctic influx.

Experts fear a repeat of the worst winter in history which saw temperatures plunge to near -20C in January 1963 causing the sea to freeze off the Kent coast.

James Madden, forecaster for Exacta Weather, said the Gulf Stream has been rapidly winding down over the past 12 months.

He said experts had feared an especially severe winter last year after signs emerged during the autumn.

However a 'lag effect' helped narrowly dodge a crippling whiteout although this winter now threatens to bring the much-feared mega-freeze.

British hero dies after falling 14 storeys trying to save suicidal teenager in Hawaii

A young British man who died after falling 14 storeys trying to save a suicidal teenager has been hailed as a hero.

Thomas Bennett fell to his death from an accommodation block at the University of Hawaii in Honolulu.

The 24-year-old, who came from Plymouth, Devon, but lived in Hawaii, had been attempting to rescue a teenager from a window ledge.

But the rescue mission ended in tragedy as both men fell.

Mr Bennett was killed, while the 19-year-old survived the incident but was left in a critical condition.

The teenager is understood to have sustained serious injuries

in the fall, including two broken legs, a broken arm, a collapsed lung, a partially broken back and internal bleeding.

The Honolulu Medical Examiner said British-born Mr Bennett died as a result of injuries from the fall.

'second chance'

Mr Bennett's mother Lesley Heard, 50, of Plymouth, said: "The word 'hero' is banded about too freely, but what my son did was heroic.

"Wherever he went, he

made friends with his cheeky grin, distinctive red hair and piercing blue eyes and his caring personality. He was full of life.

"I hope that young man [he saved] will put his second chance at life to good use and in time, pay forward the caring and kindness that my Tommy gave to him so my son will not have died in vain.

"We are all so immensely proud of Tom for his unselfish act in helping someone else."

Mr Bennett was born in the UK, but was brought up in Philadelphia, where he lived for 14 years. Three years ago he moved to Hawaii, where he worked as a landscaper.

He is believed to have been attending the party of a friend, Ted Guillory, at the Hale Wainani dormitory on 16 August shortly before the start of the new university term.

Neither Mr Bennett nor the man he attempted to save were students at the university, reports said.

Mr Guillory told local news organisation Kaleo.org: "Tommy cared about - and loved - a lot of people in his life, and he proved to me that night that he cared about other people more than he even cared about himself.

"He is a hero.

"What he did that night was the most heroic thing I've ever seen anybody do and the fact that my best friend Tommy did it, it doesn't surprise me."

Mr Bennett's family and friends paid tribute to him at a funeral service in his home town of Plymouth this week.

He leaves behind his mother Lesley, father Chris and siblings Annaliese, Emily, Ross and Isabelle.

THE BRITISH PRESS was rife with speculation this week that Prince Harry has rekindled his on-again, off-again relationship with society beauty Cressida Bonas.

Prince Harry spent his 31st birthday with ex-girlfriend Cressida on Monday just HOURS after it emerged that she had split with her boyfriend.

The Sun newspaper has reported that after taking part in an official engagement in Sussex, the fifth in line to the throne met with the 26-year-old actress and friends at a private party in Chelsea, west London.

Pictures showed Cressida arriving at the party wearing a dark grey coat over jeans and a frilled white shirt.

The couple dated for two years before breaking up last March after an alleged row over attending the wedding of Harry's good friend, Guy Pelly.

Harry was introduced to Cressida by his cousin Princess Eugenie in May 2012 and started dating a month later, however their romance was reported to have hit trouble when the Prince was pictured naked with a woman at a party in Las Vegas.

Harry and Cressida were reunited after his four-month deployment

to Afghanistan as an Apache pilot and were spotted kissing on the ski slopes in Verbier in February 2013. They were also seen together at an England rugby match in March last year, but were reported to have split in the following month.

Cressida is the youngest daughter of socialite Lady Mary Curzon and Old

Harrovia businessman Jeffrey Bonas.

In all, Lady Mary has five children by three of her four husbands, including Isabella, married to Virgin heir Sam Branson, who are all hugely protective of 'Smalley', as Cressida is known in the family.

■ Auntie aims to boost revenues by £150m over next five years

The BBC is to launch a rival to Netflix, with a new subscription streaming service to offer British programmes to US viewers from next year, it was announced on Thursday.

The move is part of the corporation's plans to boost its commercial revenues by more than £150 million over the next five years. It also signals the BBC's intention to compete more aggressively in a global market dominated by online giants such as Netflix and Amazon, with the director-general

warning that the "Britishness" of broadcasting in the mother country is under threat.

The BBC said it will launch an "over-the-top" service — a video service provided over the internet — in America next year, allowing US viewers to pay to watch a mixture of "fresh and favourite" programmes.

Shows such as Sherlock and Doctor Who will still be shown on the BBC America cable channel, but US viewers will be able to pay for other BBC and independently produced programmes, which is

likely to include a range of comedy, drama, documentaries and entertainment.

No details have been finalised about the brand name or pricing for the service, but it is

understood that it will build on lessons learned from the trial of the Global iPlayer, which charged users in Europe, Canada and Australia up to to £4.30 per month to access 2,000 hours of

BBC programmes such as Top Gear and Blackadder.

Lord Hall of Birkenhead, the BBC director-general, said: "Next year, we're launching an over-the-top video service in America, offering BBC fans programmes they wouldn't otherwise get — showcasing British actors, our programme-makers and celebrating our culture."

A report this summer from the market research company Global-WebIndex said that there was "clear potential" for the BBC to make

millions from foreign viewers after finding that more than 60 million people abroad currently exploit internet loopholes to watch BBC programmes without paying the licence fee.

Lord Hall said that the BBC's plans to expand Worldwide - including the new online streaming service - would boost returns by 15 per cent per year, to a total of £1.2 billion over the next five years. "We need to raise commercial income to supplement the licence fee so we can invest as much as possible in content for UK audiences," he said.

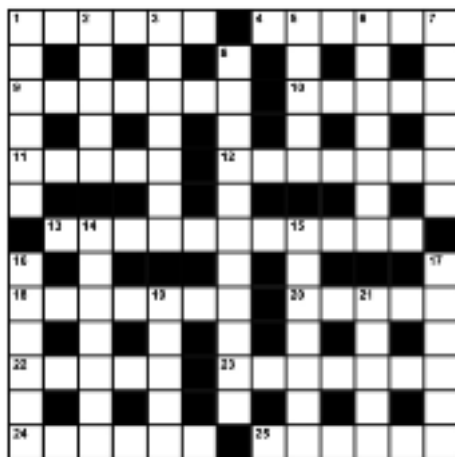

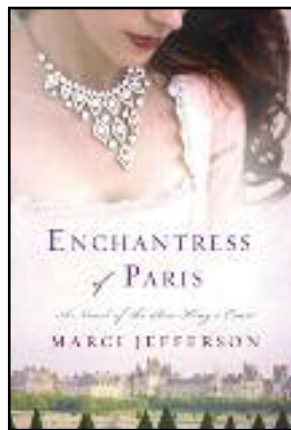
Enchantress of Paris: something quite magical...

Exclusive interview with Marci Jefferson about her novel set in the Sun King's French court

Rating: ★★★★★

"In most sources, Marie is mentioned as King Louis' first love, someone he might have married if not for his duty to his country," says *Enchantress of Paris* author Marci Jefferson. "But deeper study revealed a story far more complex, full of conspiracy, corruption, passion. I couldn't resist writing about her. I actually learned about Marie Mancini while doing research for my debut novel, *Girl on the Golden Coin*."

The Mancini sisters



dabble in the dark arts and are vivacious and witty. Marci Jefferson brings the French court to life. There's politics, intrigue, and secrets more than romance. In the vein of Alison Weir or Philippa Gregory, this a book for anyone who loves reading about history involving royalty.

According to the stars, Marie Mancini would be gifted and destined to disgrace her family. Her uncle Cardinal Mazarin brings her to the French

court where her older sister Olympia already holds the Sun King in thrall. Marie is there in case the king tires of Olympia. The king shifts his attention to Marie and the girls' uncle pits the sisters against one another. When Marie faces danger and the king can't protect her she calls on the dark arts to shield her family and defend France.

Jefferson says she had to research extensively. "*Enchantress of Paris* has around sixty characters, and all of them are historical figures. I read, I read, then I read some more. There are lots of historical resources out there related to King Louis XIV, and I tried to get my hands on as much of it as possible. I read books on architecture, music, drama, fashion, cookery, politics, religion, the occult, and too many biographies to count. My

poor, wonderful librarians delivered cartloads of books to me over the course of writing this novel." She turned to French-speaking friends to translate court theatricals and astrological almanacs that have not been translated into English.

"I needed to know which courtiers acted in which palace ballets, and what those ballets were like," says Jefferson. "I needed a few obscure astrological almanacs. I could have gone without such documents, but I wanted to make the novel as accurate as possible. So when Marie Mancini portends doom in the alignment of the stars, it is because the world's leading astrologer at the time did, too."

"Marie's family members were involved in the arts of divination, so it naturally fell into my

research," says Jefferson. "I found myself drawn to the herbal lore of the day. Because people in the seventeenth century lacked a scientific understanding of herbal properties, some considered their potency to be magical, even related to astrological predictions. Religion often blended with superstition, and all sorts of beliefs about herbs and prayers sprang into existence."

"Prayer was not just an expression of faith, it was considered a powerful sort of magic," says Jefferson. "I hadn't studied these things before, and I realized my own matriarchs had subscribed to similar beliefs. When I was a child, my great grandmother taught me a few whispered chants to help heal wounds."

Jefferson has a short story to be published in

March, 2016, in the anthology *A Fall of Poppies, Stories of Love and the Great War*, with her story of a WWI Belgian rebel who hides, only to find an ally in the enemy.

Jefferson lives in the Midwest United States with her husband and two children. She was born in New Mexico.

Plus most parking garages have a charging deck and the best thing is the car comes with a home charging kit that plugs the car straight into a 240 volt outlet (same kind as your washing machine). There is also an SOS button, so if you happen to run into trouble or run out of charge, BMW will provide a complimentary roadside assistance.

Which only leaves the question of whether to buy or lease. There are pros and cons to both but if, like me, you use your

car primarily for business the lease payments can usually be deducted at tax time, (check with your accountant).

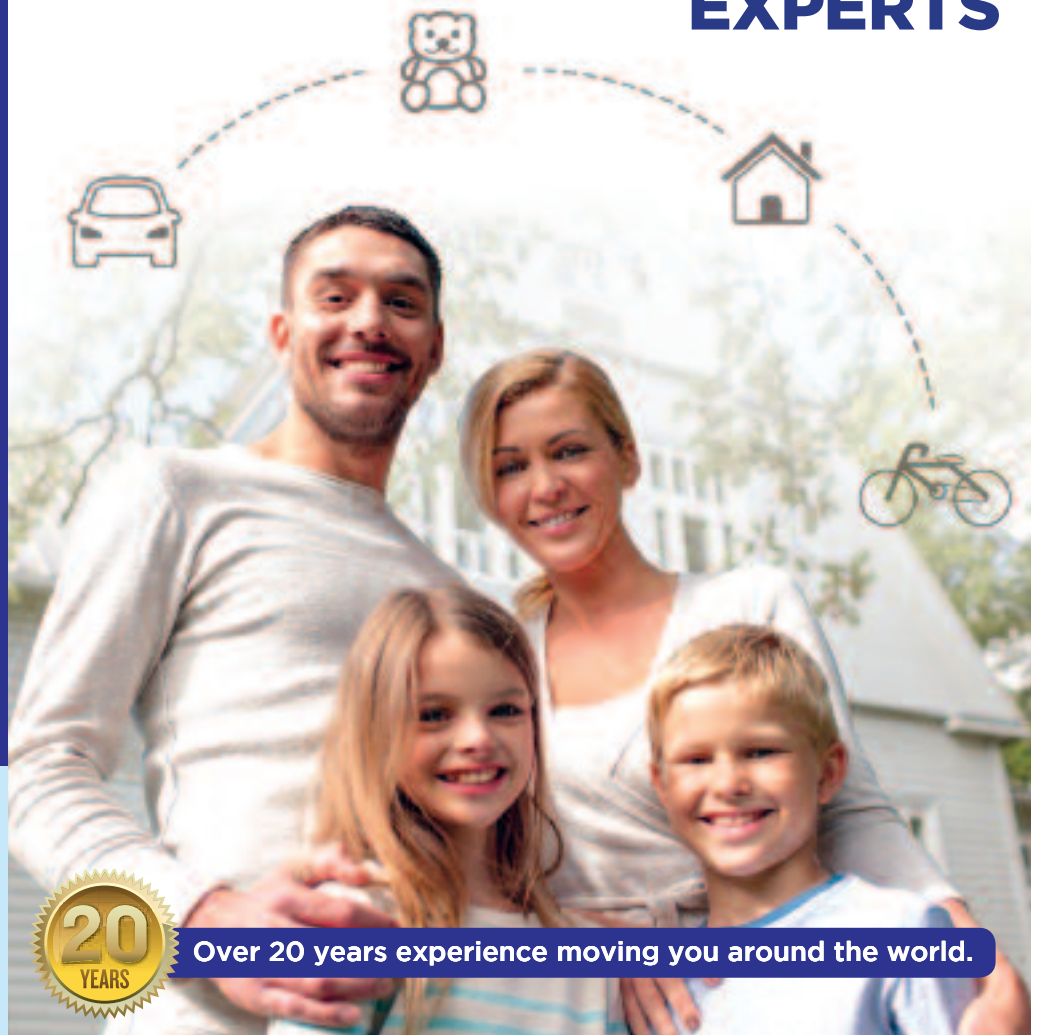

'Hakarena' leaves All Blacks fuming

■ Rugby World Cup favourites fail to see the funny side of former England international's video

WORLD CUP favorites the All Blacks were left seething this week after Matt Dawson, England's World Cup-winning scrum-half, released a video ridiculing their famous haka.

With the tensions rising ahead of this week's tournament

opener, a New Zealand camp insider disclosed that the players were deeply unimpressed with Dawson's mocking display, believing that it denigrated the profound cultural significance of the Maori war dance to New Zealanders. They had hoped, according to the source, that their

English hosts would show proper respect.

Dawson's self-styled 'hakarena', reducing the haka to a series of disco moves and setting it to the tune of Los del Rio's 'La Macarena', did anything but. The 42-year-old, now a television personality, produced the video for

the clothing company Jacamo and was swiftly condemned by a leading Maori politician for "shameful" behaviour.

Sir Pita Sharples, former co-leader of the Maori Party in New Zealand, said: "The haka is done as a way of honouring the enemy. It's recognising the worth of the other side. If they're doing something to mock the haka, I think that's pretty shameful. The haka is very meaningful to us. To mimic it and bring it into ridicule deliberately is, to me, insulting. The Maoris and New Zealanders in London could react to that, big time."

In public at least, the All Blacks were diplomatic in the sanctuary of their leafy compound in Teddington, south-west London. But they are

understood to be seething privately at Dawson's crass production. While the New Zealand and England camps have been scrupulously polite to each other ahead of this World Cup, certain former players seem intent on ratcheting up the psychological warfare.

The 'hakarena' video followed a scathing broadside by Ali Williams, the ex-All Blacks lock, who claimed

it would be a "dark day" if England won the Rugby World Cup and described Twickenham as the "most hostile ground there is". Dawson's intervention was received with anger in New Zealand, with one Kiwi accusing him on Twitter of "ignorance, bigotry and cultural insensitivity".

The Rugby World Cup kicks off Friday, Sept. 18th at 8pm GMT as England take on Fiji at Twickenham.

Chelsea boss Jose Mourinho said he had forgotten the winning "feeling" after his team reacted to their worst start to a Premier League season with a 4-0 victory over Maccabi Tel Aviv in midweek.

The Blues entered the Champions League opener with one win from five matches.

"I forgot the feeling. For so long we don't win a game, so good, a good feeling," Mourinho said.

"I am a fantastic manager when I win matches and I

am a fantastic manager when I lose matches."

Despite an early missed penalty by Eden Hazard, goals from Willian, Oscar, Diego Costa and Cesc Fabregas ensured Chelsea had no problems in seeing off their Israeli opponents.

"The penalty we missed was a big test for us," Mourinho added. "When

you start a game you have to win and after five minutes you miss a penalty, it is an extra negative episode and our reaction was very good.

Mourinho had been the centre of attention building up to the match after his side's worst start to a domestic season since 1986.

Moreno 'sorry' for Shaw tackle

■ Horrific double break leaves United defender's career in the balance

PSV Eindhoven defender Hector Moreno has apologised after making a tackle that broke Manchester United full-back Luke Shaw's leg.

Shaw, 20, had surgery on Tuesday after suffering a double fracture of his right leg during the Red Devils' 2-1 Champions League defeat in Eindhoven.

The England international will stay in

hospital to continue his recovery.

Moreno, 27, said: "I just feel really bad because I was involved in the accident. I feel really sorry."

Shaw was given oxygen while being treated on the pitch for 10 minutes after Moreno's 15th-minute challenge, and was in tears in the dressing room.

United executive vice-chairman Ed

Woodward visited Shaw at St Anna Ziekenhuis hospital before flying back to England on Wednesday.

Shaw, who signed from Southampton in June last year in a £31m deal and made 20 appearances in an injury-interrupted first season, is said to be in a positive frame of mind.

Uefa has no plans to review the tackle, which was not penalised by the officials, and will not

take any further action.

Moreno said he did not think his challenge was a foul, despite United boss Louis van Gaal describing it as "very bad".

"I think I played the ball, but in this kind of

situation I don't care if it was a foul," said Moreno, who broke his leg during last year's World Cup. "I feel bad for him, for his family."

Shaw has started all of United's eight games this season, as well as

playing in England's European Championship qualifiers against San Marino and Switzerland.

But with just nine months to go until Euro 2016, he has broken both his tibia and fibula.

City millionaires are mugged by Old Lady

Manchester City's Champions League campaign got off to a disappointing start this week with a 2-1 home defeat by last season's runners-up Juventus.

City, who have struggled to make a serious impact in the Champions League and have never won their opening home game in the group stage, looked to be on course for victory when Juventus defender Giorgio Chiellini headed into his own net under pressure from Vincent Kompany.

The Italians protested furiously that Chiellini had been fouled but then produced an impressive response to come from behind and close out the win.

Paul Pogba's superb ball allowed Mario Mandzukic to steal in behind Eliaquim Mangala for the equaliser, then Alvaro Morata pulled substitute Nicolas Otamendi - on

for Kompany - out of position before curling a precise left-foot finish beyond City keeper Joe Hart for the 81st-minute winner.

Raheem Sterling had two big opportunities for City but wasted both as Manuel Pellegrini's side find themselves on the back foot once more in the Champions League.

Once again this was a night where City, dominant domestically with five wins out of five in the Premier League, still looked like they are struggling to convince themselves they belong in the exalted company of the Champions League.

Juventus' pedigree is clear - they reached last season's final - but they had not won a game all season until beating City, whose cast-iron confidence in the league looks to be somewhat stripped away here and opponents like the

experienced Italians are only too happy to expose those flaws in self-belief.

This even seems to extend to City's fans, anxious throughout and streaming out in droves even before three minutes of stoppage time, clearly not convinced their team would rescue a point.

City missed striker Sergio Aguero, not fully fit after picking up an injury at Crystal Palace and restricted to a brief appearance as a substitute, and they have learned the hard way that chances do not come along as often in the Champions League as they do in the Premier League - and the price for not taking them is an expensive one.

There is still plenty of time to recover but City need to win games such as this if they are to finish top of the group and avoid the potentially hazardous last-16 draw.
