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LOCKERBIE: TWO NEW SUSPECTS IDENTIFIED

Scottish prosecutors want to interview two Libyans they have identified as new suspects over the Lockerbie bombing.

They believe the two suspects were involved, along with Abdelbaset al-Megrahi - the only person to have been convicted of the 1988 atrocity.

A total of 270 people died when the Pan Am 103 flight was blown up.

Megrahi was released in 2009 on compassionate grounds after being diagnosed with prostate cancer. He died in 2012, protesting his innocence.

The flight was on its way from London to New York when it exploded above Lockerbie, in southern Scotland, on the evening of 21 December 1988, killing everyone on board and 11 people on the ground.

Scotland's Lord Advocate Frank Mulholland QC recently met the US Attorney General, Loretta Lynch, in Washington to review progress made in the ongoing investigation.

They have now requested permission from the Libyan authorities for Scottish

police and the FBI to interview the two named suspects in Tripoli.

A Crown Office spokesman said: "The Lord Advocate and the US Attorney General have recently agreed that there is a proper basis in law in Scotland and the United States to entitle Scottish and US investigators to treat two Libyans as suspects in the continuing investigation into the bombing of flight Pan Am 103 over Lockerbie.

"The Lord Advocate has today, therefore, issued an International Letter of Request to the Libyan attorney general in Tripoli which identifies the two Libyans as suspects in the bombing of flight Pan Am 103.

"The Lord Advocate and the US Attorney General are seeking the assistance of the Libyan judicial authorities for Scottish police officers and the FBI to interview the two named suspects in Tripoli.

"The two individuals are suspected of

involvement, along with Abdelbaset Ali Mohamed al-Megrahi, in the bombing of flight Pan Am 103 in December 1988 and the murder of 270 people."

The Libyan attorney general declined to comment on whether a letter had been received from the Crown Office and whether the Libyan government would be

assisting in the investigation.

Libya has struggled to stabilise since ousting long-term leader Colonel Muammar Gaddafi in 2011. Elections in 2014 produced two rival governments as Islamist and secular militias fight for control of the country.

Tributes flow as top Tory Geoffrey Howe dies at 88

■ Former Chancellor was a key figure behind the Thatcherite revolution - until his resignation speech triggered her downfall

Geoffrey Howe, the minister whose devastating resignation speech effectively ended Margaret Thatcher's premiership, has been hailed by his former colleagues after his death, aged 88.

Lord Howe was Baroness Thatcher's longest-serving Cabinet minister and their close partnership was crucial to many of her economic reforms.

But tensions over Europe eventually drove him to quit the government in November 1990, famously deploying a cricketing simile in his parting shot in the House of Commons.

In his devastating departure speech in the Commons, he criticized Mrs Thatcher for undermining policies on economic and monetary union in Europe that were backed by her colleagues and the Governor of the Bank of England. "It is rather like sending your opening batsmen to the crease, only for them to find, as the first balls are being bowled, that their bats have been broken before the game by the team captain," he declared.

Lady Thatcher was forced to resign shortly after his speech - contradicting Denis Healey's memorable 1978 jibe that coming under fire from Howe was like being "savaged by a dead sheep".

David Cameron described Lord Howe as a "kind, gentle and deeply thoughtful man" who had "never stopped giving strong and sound advice". Chancellor George Osborne said: "I will miss Geoffrey Howe. He was a great source of advice to me; a quietly-spoken radical, whose bitterly contested budgets rescued Britain."

Former chancellor Lord Lamont said he was "deeply saddened".

He added: "He was a

truly brilliant Chancellor of the Exchequer. Behind the quiet, unassuming demeanour there was steely determination, dogged consistency and a sense of direction."

Another ex-chancellor, Kenneth Clarke, was parliamentary private secretary to Lord Howe in the 1970s Heath government.

He told reporters: "I have regarded myself as an acolyte of Geoffrey Howe throughout my career - free market economics, a social conscience, internationalism, pro-European - and I always admired his pleasant demeanour, his unflappability as well as his steely resolve and his very, very good mind."

Juncker's comments came ahead of a meeting with Prime Minister David Cameron on Thursday, in

which the two will discuss the Prime Minister's renegotiation.

named last month by American TV, including a brother-in-law of Gaddafi.

The Crown Office said it would be inappropriate to confirm any identities to preserve the integrity of the investigation.

Megrahi's part in the bombing has been called into question in a series of books and documentaries.

'better evidence'

And a petition seeking "Justice For Megrahi", backed by politicians and family members of some victims, was raised at the Scottish Parliament in 2012.

Jim Swire, whose daughter died in the bombing, told reporters: "I think there is a need for evidence to be made available as to why these two are suspects.

"We have recently been refused permission in Scotland to have to have a further appeal held into Megrahi's conviction,

and many in this country simply don't believe Megrahi was involved and that this was a miscarriage of justice.

"To try and bolt two more names on top of that is a very difficult situation. It will need to be supported by better evidence than was produced to achieve the conviction of Megrahi."

But Frank Duggan, president of Pan Am 103 Relatives, told a Scottish news show he was not confident there would be further prosecutions.

He said: "I would like to think there would be, but they would have to be indicted by the US government or by the Scottish government and the Libyan government would have to turn them over - the Libyans have always said they are not going to turn over anyone to a foreign government.

"And it's been 26 years. It's too long, people are dead, stories have been forgotten.

"I'd like to think that it will be one small measure of closure but I don't expect the kind of justice that we all hope for."

Jamie Oliver's north London home raided by burglars

Jamie Oliver's £7 million north London home has been raided by burglars after a break-in through a garage door.

Thieves stole thousands of pounds worth of jewellery and electronics after breaking through a door adjacent to the property, according to reports.

The celebrity chef and his wife and children are thought to have been at their Essex home during the raid on October 2.

Mr Oliver, 40, tweeted earlier this week saying he was in Southend filming.

A spokesman for the Metropolitan Police confirmed the

burglary.

He said: "Police were called to an address on Friday October 2 shortly after 9pm after a member of the public reported that a door to the property was open.

"Officers attended and went inside the property and found that the premises had been burgled. Items were removed from the address."

Mr Oliver's spokesman played down the break-in, suggesting thieves had only accessed the basement.

He added there was "nothing really to it".

Police said no arrests have been made.

I'm clear of my pancreatic cancer, says Sir John Hurt

■ Actor tells of joy at being given the all clear and how it 'all looks great for the future'

Sir John Hurt has spoken of his joy at being told he had beaten pancreatic cancer.

The actor, 75, had refused to let the disease stop him working after his diagnosis earlier this year.

And on Wednesday he revealed he had been given the all-clear by doctors.

Speaking at the Man Booker Prize ceremony in London, the Elephant Man star said: 'I had a final scan and it's all gone brilliantly.

'I had the final scan yesterday [Monday] and I saw my oncologist this morning [Tuesday].

'I am overjoyed, I am thrilled. It all looks great for the future, it's fantastic.'

He added that he remains wary of using words such as 'remission' even 'if it's true'.

'optimistic'

The two-time Oscar nominee revealed in June that he had been diagnosed with cancer but vowed to continue working and true to form headed to Northern Ireland on Friday to work on a new project.

Revealing his diagnosis, the father-of-two said at the time: 'I have always been open about the way in which I conduct my life and in that spirit I would like to make a statement.

'I have recently been diagnosed with early-stage pancreatic cancer.

'I am undergoing treatment and am more than optimistic about a satisfactory outcome, as indeed is the medical team.

'I am continuing to focus on my professional commitments and will shortly be recording Jeffrey Bernard is Unwell (one of life's small ironies!) for Radio 4.'

Sir John, who was knighted in July in recognition of his stellar career, underwent a course of chemotherapy. Throughout the battle he said he refused to give in to fear.

prolific

He told The Radio Times: 'I can't say I worry about mortality, but it's impossible to get to my age and not have a little contemplation of it. We're all just passing time, and occupy our chair very briefly.'

He also retained his sharp sense of humour. Of his knighthood, he said: 'I did nothing to encourage it. Some people do, you know. I like being Sir John - it works, doesn't it? Or John.

'The only thing that sticks in my craw is when people say "Mr Hurt". I tell them it's no longer correct.'

About 8,800 people are diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in the UK each year. Lack of symptoms early on means it is often caught late and the five-year survival rate stands at 3 per cent.

Sir John, who married fourth wife Anwen Rees-Myers, 25 years his junior, in 2005, has two sons - Sasha and Nick.

The prolific actor's career has spanned six decades and he has more than 200 on-screen credits, working alongside greats such as Orson Welles, Sir Laurence Olivier and Richard Burton.

His most celebrated roles include Caligula in I, Claudius and Quentin Crisp in The Naked Civil Servant.

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First grammar school in 50 years to be approved

■ Labour blast decision as “a hugely backward step”

England is to get its first “new” grammar school for five decades after ministers allowed a grammar school to build an “annexe” in another town.

Weald of Kent school in Tonbridge will open a site in Sevenoaks, Kent - side-stepping a ban on new grammar schools.

But Education Secretary Nicky Morgan said this would not “open the floodgates” to more schools being allowed to select by ability.

Labour described the decision as a “hugely backward step”.

The decision to allow the new grammar school site, with places for 450 girls, has raised expectations of similar bids in other parts of the country.

But Mrs Morgan said this was a “genuine expansion” of an existing school - describing it as “one school, two sites” - and it “does not reflect a change in this government’s position on selective schools”.

The education secretary said that the ban on new grammars would remain. “I don’t want to fight the

battles of selective and non-selective... This is one particular application with one particular set of circumstances. Why would I deny a good school the right to expand?”

symbolic

“I don’t think this will open any kind of precedent or floodgates.”

Any bids from other grammar schools would still face the “statutory prohibition” on new selective schools and would need to “meet the criteria for being a genuine expansion”, said the education secretary.

The school in Sevenoaks is due to open in September 2017, after a long campaign by supporters.

This will be seen as a symbolic reversing of the tide, after many decades in which grammar schools were seen as a receding emblem of the educational past, rather than an expanding destination for the future.

While this decision will be warmly welcomed by traditionalists in the

Conservatives’ ranks, it will be a double-edged sword for the government. Their education reforms, promoting academies and free schools, have made a prime virtue of raising standards for all, rather than focusing on the academically most able. That policy sits uneasily beside a rejuvenated 11-plus exam.

Labour passed laws in 1998 banning the creation of new grammars but existing schools are allowed to expand if there is sufficient demand.

‘social mobility’

Andrew Shilling, of the Sevenoaks Grammar School Campaign, said the decision was a “victory for parent power”.

“Today’s news is overdue recognition of the fact that a Sevenoaks grammar school is supported by the vast majority of local parents.”

In last year’s GCSE results, 99% of pupils at the Weald of Kent Grammar School achieved five A*-C grades. The national

average for England is 63%.

London mayor Boris Johnson has described the decline of the grammar school system as a “tragedy”.

Prime Minister David Cameron has previously said that “all good schools” should have the right to expand, including grammars, an assertion echoed by Mrs Morgan.

But Shadow education secretary Lucy Powell has described it as a “backwards step”.

She said: “Having made social mobility the centre of his conference speech, David Cameron should look at the clear evidence on grammar schools: They do not increase equality of opportunity, they make it worse.”

“Tiny numbers of

children from disadvantaged backgrounds pass their tests because they are the preserve of the privately tutored. That’s why Ofsted and educational experts are against their expansion.

“This is a hugely backward step from a Prime Minister who we see once again saying one thing but doing the opposite.”

Boffins baffled by Ebola relapse

The case of Pauline Cafferkey, the first person known to have recovered from Ebola and then suffer an apparently life-threatening relapse, is taking scientists into uncharted territory.

The Scottish nurse’s situation, described as “staggering” by one British virologist, signals just how complex and formidable a foe the Ebola virus may turn out to be now that scientists have the chance to study its survivors.

Previous studies and preliminary data from research in survivors of the vast West African outbreak have detected Ebola virus in semen, breast milk, vaginal secretions, spinal fluid and fluids around the eyes.

But scientific literature has never documented an Ebola relapse case before, meaning Cafferkey’s is likely to generate great fear and anxiety for the 17,000 or so other Ebola survivors across West Africa.

“This is totally unprecedented. We’ve never seen this, and there’s so much uncertainty,” said Jeremy Farrar, a specialist in infectious diseases and director of the Wellcome Trust, Britain’s leading biomedical research charity.

“Is this a one off? A very rare event? Or is this going to be quite common? The honest answer is we don’t know.”

“The closer we look at the Ebola virus, the more complicated it becomes,”

Derek Gatherer, a virus expert at Britain’s Lancaster University, said when asked to comment on the relapse.

Doctors at the London Royal Free hospital where Cafferkey is in a high level isolation unit say she is “critically ill” and is being “treated for Ebola”.

Her condition has deteriorated since she was readmitted to the hospital last week with what doctors described then as “an unusual late complication”.

“We know Ebola can linger for many months after visible symptoms have cleared ... But this is frankly staggering,” said Jonathan Ball, a professor of molecular virology at the University of Nottingham.



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Glaswegian accent is Britain's sexiest, say Americans

■ Survey of Americans also finds that Geordies sound the most intelligent, while Britons struggle to identify Canadians

And here we were thinking the American's love of the British accent was down to the likes of Hugh Grant and Prince William.

But according to a new survey it is not the dulcet, shuffling tones of the home counties that makes the Yanks weak at the knees, but rather the gravelly melodies of the Glaswegian tongue.

British Airways polled 1,000 Americans and 1,000 Britons on their opinions on different regional accents, as well as asking

them to identify varying twangs from their opposite country, and one of the resulting headlines was that a quarter of American respondents found the Scottish dialect the sexiest (this despite a fifth thinking it was actually scouse). Cockney came second, with 16 per cent of votes.

favorite American

In another victory for the north of the country, the pitch shifts of the typical Geordie earned them the title of "most

intelligent accent", with 36 per cent of Americans thinking so. An Essex accent was deemed to be the least intelligent.

As far as Britain's best accents go, the Americans voted Sean Connery, born in Edinburgh, as top, with Hugh Grant and Keira Knightly in second and third. The Britons reciprocated by judging Morgan Freeman, from Tennessee, to have the most favourable American tones, with Dolly Parton and Reese Witherspoon in second

and third.

The airline's survey also raised concerning questions about the one of the nation's grasp of geography as it was revealed that only 40 per cent of Americans could

locate London on a map, and a third thought Bristol was in Northern Ireland.

Britons fared better with nearly half correctly placing North Dakota and Georgia on a map, and

three quarters picking out Texas.

The UK's respondents did not do quite as well when it came to recognising accents – 97 per cent thought the Canadian accent was from somewhere within the US, with 40 per cent reckoning Texas.

The tones of New Yorkers were the most recognised with a quarter of Britons identifying them.

After hearing an Australian accent, nine out of ten Americans thought it hailed from somewhere within Britain.

London police to abandon costly Assange operation

Police will no longer be stationed outside the Ecuadorean embassy in London where Wikileaks founder Julian Assange has sought refuge since 2012.

Met Police officers had been there since Mr Assange sought asylum to avoid extradition to Sweden over a rape allegation, which he denies.

The Met said it had cost £12.6m and was "no longer proportionate" - but it would still try to arrest him.

Wikileaks said the decision did not change Mr Assange's situation.

'Overt and covert'

Scotland Yard said that "resources are finite" and there were "so many different criminal, and other, threats to the city".

"The Metropolitan Police Service has to balance the interests of justice in this case with the ongoing risks to the

safety of Londoners and all those we protect, investigating crime and arresting offenders wanted for serious offences, in deciding what a proportionate response is," it said.

However the force also said it would be deploying "a number of overt and covert tactics to arrest him".

Wikileaks spokesman Kristinn Hrafnsson said he had spoken to Mr Assange about the Met decision, and he agreed it did not change his situation.

"They will still arrest Julian if he steps outside the embassy so there is no real change to the situation, other than the removal of uniformed police officers," he said.

The Australian sought asylum to avoid extradition to Sweden, because he feared he would then be sent to the US and put on trial for releasing secret US documents.

The UK has paid for policing around the embassy in Knightsbridge, central London, for the past

three years. The Met provided a breakdown of the round-the-clock policing costs, which it estimated to be £12.6m - £7.1m in normal pay, £3.4m in overtime and £2.1m

indirect costs.

Mr Assange was granted political asylum by Ecuador in 2012, under the 1951 Refugee Convention.

Swedish officials said recently they were

optimistic about reaching an agreement with Ecuador which could pave the way for the questioning of Mr Assange in London on outstanding accusations against him.

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Drone hits Wallace memorial

A GROWING DEBATE in the UK about the need to regulate drone activity intensified over the weekend after a drone crashed into the Wallace Monument in Stirling (pictured, above).

The incident happened at about 16:30 on Saturday. No one was hurt.

Police said they were attempting to trace the operator of the remote aircraft, who was within the grounds of the 67m (220ft) high monument at the time.

Officers said the incident was an example of the risks of flying drones in crowded or built-up areas.

Insp Cheryl Cowan said: "While the use of drones is becoming more popular for members of the public when filming and photographing scenic areas or places of interest, it is essential that they are utilised responsibly so as not to cause alarm or injury to other members of the public.

"I would advise that drone operators familiarise themselves with all the appropriate legislation so as to ensure they adhere to existing aviation laws and regulations, and be aware of the areas in our community where drone activity may pose a particular sensitivity."

University lecturer quits in disgrace after slapping policewoman on Ryanair plane

■ Court hears mother-of-three Leah Wild, 44, and friend Reuben Crowe, 23, got angry when they were kicked off a Ryanair flight for being drunk

A lecturer at a top university has quit in disgrace after slapping a policewoman in the face as she was kicked off a plane for being drunk.

Mother-of-three Leah Wild, 44, who taught sociology at the University of Bath, started downing duty free Jack Daniels and brandy when her holiday flight was delayed.

The Ryanair plane, carrying 184 passengers to Faro in Portugal, was stuck on the tarmac at Bristol for three hours because of a strike by French air traffic controllers.

A court heard that Wild and friend Reuben Crowe, 23, became "clearly drunk" and were talking loudly and listening to loud music.

The cabin crew told the

captain and he gave them 10 minutes to calm down and told them they would be removed from the aircraft if they failed.

When the pair refused, police were called and two female officers boarded the plane and told them to stop drinking or face arrest.

But they started shouting and swearing and another passenger got so distressed they had to leave the plane.

Crowe had to be restrained in his seat and handcuffed as he was guzzling from a bottle of brandy.

She was grabbed from behind by a police officer and as she was marched down the aisle to the exit, she slapped the arresting officer in the face.

prosecutor, said: "When the policewoman asked what was wrong she was answered with abuse.

"They were waving their arms around, tossing their heads, swearing and were clearly drunk.

"Under the heading "other places lived" she had put Fanny, West Virginia and Bald Knob, Arkansas"

"The pilot was not

happy to take them."

Bristol Crown Court heard that Wild, who had been at the University of Bath since 2003, quit her post as director of studies immediately after the incident in April last year.

Before that she was a visiting lecturer at the University of the West of England and taught social theory courses at undergraduate and

postgraduate level.

Wild pleaded guilty to being drunk on a plane and assaulting a police officer.

Crowe admitted being drunk on a plane and obstructing a police officer.

They were each sentenced to four months in prison, suspended for 12 months, and ordered to complete 80 hours community work.

A third of Britons 'could not go 24 hours without the internet'

Millions of UK technology users wouldn't be able to go 24 hours without the internet, with the most common excuses being that it is part of modern life, and needing a way to speak to friends.

According to new research from leading cell service provider Vodafone as part of its Digital Behaviours study, more than a third of Britons said they did not think they could make it a full day in a digital switch-off challenge, with 69% saying boredom would be the main reason for not switching off.

According to regulator Ofcom, 69% of UK adults now use a smartphone,

and the rise of technology in modern life was the most common excuse offered by those surveyed, with 87% saying "it's the way things are nowadays".

'tools and services'

Other excuses offered by users included needing digital products to manage their home, staying coordinated, work and to motivate themselves to work out.

Vodafone's consumer director Cindy Rose said: "Internet enabled devices bring a range of great tools and services right to your fingertips, and it's natural that people tend to use them more and more for work and play."

She went on to suggest that it was important for families to try and strike a balance, particularly with regards to children using the internet.

difficult to control

"Despite this, it's still important for families to be able to balance online and offline from time to time," she said.

"Our aim is to provide our customers with the tools they need to easily manage that balance."

As part of the research, Vodafone also monitored the technological habits of families from around the country, and found that 34% said it was difficult to control the time their children spent with digital devices.

The network provider now offers a broadband service that via a companion app, offers controls on when WiFi access is available on certain devices.

More than one in 10 parents also said they were worried others may judge them for allowing their children so much time online.

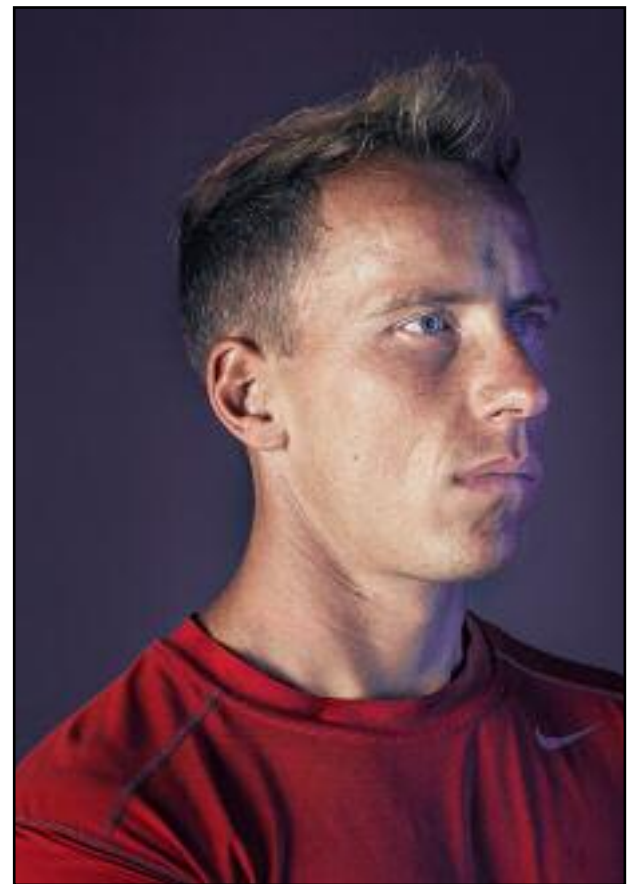

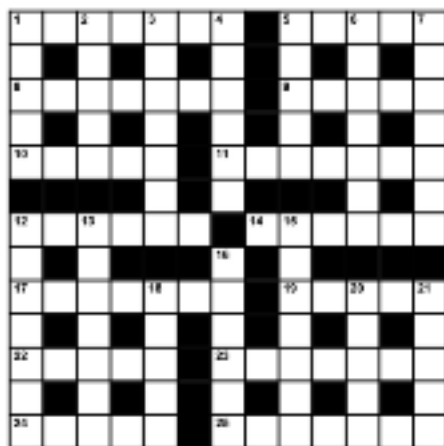

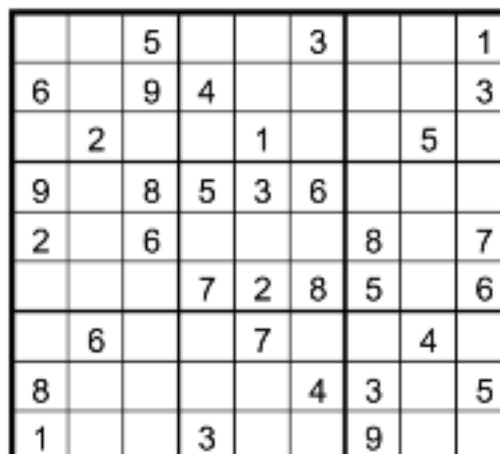

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Game of Queens: fleshing out the Book of Esther

Exclusive interview with author India Edghill and a review of her novel of the Babylonian queens Vashti and Esther

“*Game of Thrones*, I'd never read the books, and I only started watching the series because Sean Bean and Jason Momoa were in it,” says *Game of Queens* author India Edghill. “Then this lovely young woman with long flowing white-blonde hair showed up. I stared at the screen and shrieked, that's her! I started *Game of Queens* in 2008 and handed in the first version in 2010. Like many writers, I put up pictures of people who I think look like my characters to stare at while I'm writing. I'd based Queen Vashti's coloring and character on my best cat ever, Vashti, a silver Persian with

chatoyant opal eyes.” (For the uninitiated, chatoyant means having a changeable luster or color with an undulating narrow band of white light).

In the Bible, the Book of Esther is set in the Persian capital during the reign of king Ahasuerus, about 483 B.C. After drinking too much at a banquet, the king sends for his queen, Vashti, with the command that she display her beauty to the guests, an order which she interprets to mean she'll be nude. Vashti refuses to come, which

sets the king to replace her with Esther, who is secretly Jewish. As queen, Esther thwarts a plot to exterminate the Jews.

The backstory is that Ahasuerus became king of Babylon as a boy on his father's death. His mother Queen Amestris rules for him and picks 10-year-old princess Vashti as his queen. Meanwhile Esther is raised like a boy by her indulgent father Abihail. After casting Vashti aside, the king regrets his actions and proclaims her to be his sister and still a princess. Vashti will help him find a new wife. She and head eunuch Hegai search the land for the most beautiful woman, which is Esther.

In the Old Testament the story of Vashti is just one paragraph, so Edghill expands the story with strong female characters who use their wiles to achieve what they want.

An engaging storyteller, Edghill may

remind readers of Phillipa Gregory with her female-centric stories that explore the inner feelings and thinking of protagonists. However, where Gregory would chose one character's point of view, Edghill head-hops between Vashti, Esther and even Hegai. And, there are a hundred pages of set up at the beginning of *Queens*. A slow start is the main reason this is a three-star instead of four-star read.

“Queen Vashti is the character who actually sets the story in motion when she refuses the king's command to display herself in public,” says Edghill. “Once I realized that, I had my idea for the book. Who can resist that empire-wide beauty contest?”

Edghill has written two books for St. Martin's, one about Michal and one about the Queen of Sheba. When Edghill signed a

follow-on two-book deal, her first book was to be about Delilah and the second was untitled. She needed another Biblical woman for that book and ultimately wrote *Book of Queens*.

Edghill says she started as a writer of *Star Trek* and *Star Wars* fan fiction. “Later I wrote fantasy short stories and historical novels... *Queenmaker*, *Wisdom's Daughter*, *Delilah*, as well as a mystery, *File M for Murder*.” *Queenmaker* won the *Romantic Times* award for Best First Historical Romance in 2002, despite the author's mild protest that it isn't really a romance. *Wisdom's Daughter* was nominated for RT's Best Historical Fiction in 2004. *Book of Queens* has yet to be optioned for film or TV. Edghill is currently writing epic-length romantic historical novel set in 1879 India.

While researching dog breeds for a novel Edghill

became interested in the Cavalier King Charles Spaniel. She now has four Cavaliers, is active in Cavalier Rescue, and shows her dogs in Obedience and Rally competitions. Born in Shreveport, Louisiana, Edghill now lives in the MidHudson Valley in New York State.

Although The Voice originated on BBC1, it is made by production company Talpa Media, which is owned by ITV.

And a computer error meant that ALL The Voice hopefuls were rejected after their auditions, leading to a frantic scramble to get some contestants back.

And last season's grand finale pulled in just 6.3m viewers — the lowest since the show launched in 2012.

Cook thrives in the heat

Pakistan v England: First Test, Abu Dhabi, day three. Pakistan 523-8 dec: Malik 245, Shafiq 107; Stokes 4-57. England 290-3: Cook 168, Bell 63*

Captain Alastair Cook led England's reply to Pakistan's daunting 523-8 declared with a fine unbeaten 168 in the first Test in Abu Dhabi on Thursday.

He batted throughout the third day but England lost two wickets in three overs late on as they closed on 290-3, needing 34 more to avoid the follow-on.

Cook added 116 for the first wicket with Moeen Ali (35) and 165 for the second with Ian Bell.

Bell fell for 63 to Wahab Riaz, who also removed nightwatchman Mark Wood.

Those two wickets for four runs boosted Pakistani spirits on another day when bat dominated ball, on a soporific surface which has been widely criticised.

Cook's 28th Test century

was typical of so many of his previous 27, founded on patience, discipline and excellent shot selection.

He dominated his first Test opening stand with Moeen Ali, tucking the ball off his pads with customary ease and capitalising on any width afforded outside off stump.

His approach was unaffected by the departure of Moeen, who was caught behind for 35 pushing at Rahat Ali shortly before lunch to end a patient first innings as a Test opener.

Cook had made 147 by the time he offered a chance, substitute fielder Fawad Alam dropping a tumbling effort at backward square-leg off a top-edged sweep.

Bell spent the early part of his innings batting like a man who had contemplated retirement following a miserable Ashes this summer.

Knowing that his dropped attempts to catch Mohammad Hafeez and Asad Shafiq cost England

188 runs in the field, Bell himself was reprieved on one when Shan Masood grassed a sharp bat-pad chance at silly point off Zulfiqar Babar.

He managed only one run off the first 33 balls he faced and saw a couple of edges fall short of slip before finally finding something approaching fluency as he compiled a 134-ball half-century.

He perished five overs before the close when he drove the persevering Riaz, who regularly touched 90 miles per hour, to Hafeez at point.

Wood, sent in to protect Joe Root, was dropped at second slip on nought before playing on as he attempted to force off the back foot.

While the departure of Bell and Wood in 14 balls raised the prospect of an England collapse on Friday, a fourth draw in nine Tests on this ground remains the most likely result.

Alastair Cook has scored 10 Test centuries as England captain.

Fitness battle for Long

Republic of Ireland striker Shane Long faces a race to be fit for his country's Euro 2016 play-off next month because of injured ankle ligaments.

Long was injured in the Republic's 2-1 defeat by Poland last Sunday and carried off on a stretcher.

Southampton manager Ronald Koeman has revealed that the Tipperary man will be ruled out for two to four weeks.

The draw for the play-offs takes place on Sunday, with the two-legged ties taking place from 12-17 November.

The Republic are among the four unseeded nations for the draw, so will face Bosnia-Herzegovina, Hungary, Ukraine or Sweden home and away.

Long scored a memorable winner in Ireland's 1-0 victory over world champions Germany last week.



DANNY INGS: suffered an ACL tear during training

Klopp Injury crisis mounts as Ings faces lengthy recovery

Danny Ings will almost certainly miss the rest of the season after becoming the second Liverpool player in the space of 24 hours to suffer an Anterior Cruciate Ligament (ACL) knee injury.

Ings sustained the injury in a challenge during training at Melwood on Wednesday in a devastating blow to both himself and Jurgen Klopp, the new Liverpool manager, who was already coming to terms with being without Joe Gomez for the rest of the campaign after the defender suffered a similar setback while on international duty with England under-21s.

Ings was able to walk off the training pitch and was unaware as to the seriousness of the injury until he underwent a scan Thursday morning. He initially thought he had damaged his meniscus, an injury that would have resulted in him being out for between six to eight weeks, because he was not in serious pain but the severity of his diagnosis means he will

be unable to play for at least six months.

Ings, who made his full international debut for England against Lithuania on Monday night, must now be considered a major doubt for next summer's European Championships in France with the expectation being that he will be out for between six to nine months.

The most immediate concern for Klopp is the mounting injury crisis he is facing with Jordan Henderson likely to be unavailable for a further six weeks as he recovers from foot surgery and Christian Benteke and Roberto Firmino battling to overcome a hamstring strain and a back problem respectively.

Klopp's mood was not helped by what he believes was a failure by the Football Association to relay what he described as "the perfect information" about the full extent of Gomez's injury after the 18-year-old limped off in the second half of England under-21s 3-0 win over Kazakhstan.

Northern Ireland's qualification for Euro 2016 is an achievement that may not be beaten, says Michael O'Neill.

Manager O'Neill, 46, led the country to their first major tournament since the 1986 World Cup in Mexico.

"I got a text from Wales manager Chris Coleman saying 'it does not get better than this' and I have to agree with him," O'Neill told BBC Radio 5 live.

His side ended top of Group F, the first fifth-seeded team to win a European qualifying group, losing once.

Northern Ireland fans had endured 14 unsuccessful qualifying campaigns, before beating Greece 3-1 on Thursday to spark wild celebrations.

The team won just

once in O'Neill's first 18 games in charge, before turning their form around with six victories in their next 12 games. A 1-1 draw against Finland on Sunday allowed them to claim top place.

"It is a fantastic achievement. What we have now is a squad full of belief and who will continue to improve. They deserve their place in the tournament," added O'Neill.

"We have a really good bunch of lads and have been the best team in the group. We are very effective, we know how to play and do the right things. That will stand us in good stead in France.

"I don't know how long I will be as a manager but I may never top this. How I am feeling, the bond I have with the players, how the country and supporters feel, we just want to keep building on that."

Strachan likely to keep Scotland job

Gordon Strachan is expected to stay on as Scotland manager, according to reports from Scotland.

The 58-year-old's contract expired following the Scots' unsuccessful qualifying campaign for the Euro 2016 finals in France.

Scotland finished fourth in Group D and missed out on the play-offs, with the Republic of Ireland securing third.

The Scottish Football Association were expected to make a formal announcement before the end of the week.

Strachan (pictured, above right) would then be trying to lead the side to the 2018 World Cup in Russia, with England in their qualifying group.

Lithuania, Malta, Slovakia and Slovenia are also Group F with the Scots' first game away to the Maltese on 4 September 2016.

Scotland have not

Bale: Cookie restored pride

Forward Gareth Bale says Wales boss Chris Coleman has restored Welsh football's "passion and pride" by leading the national side to Euro 2016.

Wales last week qualified for their first major tournament since 1958.

Bale, 26, also praised Coleman's predecessors - the late Gary Speed and John Toshack - but said much of the credit had to go to the current boss.

"He's been amazing. All the players love him. I think he's created such a great atmosphere in the camp," he said.

The Real Madrid forward said all of the players "enjoy going away with Wales" and

Appointed in January 2012, Coleman started his Wales reign with four losses, and considered resigning after the 6-1 defeat by Serbia in September 2012.

Bale said: "He's been incredible. He's really brought that passion and pride back for Wales. Even just at lunchtimes and meetings there's always that bit of banter."

Mou: FA fine 'a disgrace'

■ Blues boss makes headlines again as ref row rumbles on

Chelsea manager Jose Mourinho says his Football Association fine is a "disgrace" after being ordered to pay £50,000.

Mourinho had claimed officials were "afraid" to award his team penalties after Robert Madley denied the Blues a spot-kick in a 3-1 loss to Southampton.

It was announced on Wednesday that the 52-year-old had also been given a suspended one-match stadium ban.

"I'm happy I don't have an electronic tag," said the Portuguese on Thursday.

"£50,000 is a disgrace. The possibility of getting a stadium ban is astonishing."

Mourinho also had another dig at Arsenal manager Arsene Wenger - without naming the Gunners boss.

He felt aggrieved Wenger went unpunished for calling referee Mike Dean "weak" and "naive" following

Arsenal's 2-0 defeat by Chelsea last month.

Mourinho claimed the FA had set a dangerous precedent by rescinding a red card given to Arsenal's Gabriel, who had been sent off for kicking out at Chelsea striker Diego Costa.

Wenger also faced no action after pushing Mourinho in the Stamford Bridge technical area in October 2014.

"Afraid costs £50,000. Weak and naive - you can do it," added Mourinho, who signed a new four-year deal at Chelsea in August.

"We can push people in the technical area. We can, no problem."

In a later interview with the BBC, Mourinho reiterated his unhappiness with the FA.

When asked if his relationship with English football's governing body could be fixed, he said: "It's not my relationship with

the FA, it's their relationship towards me.

"You should analyse what's happening with me, compare it with other managers. Do you think a word is comparable with a push in the eyes of everyone?"

England wrap up perfect campaign

England completed a perfect 10 wins from 10h games in their Euro 2016 qualifying campaign with an uneventful victory in Lithuania on Monday.

Manager Roy Hodgson fielded an England team with an experimental look - but it still had far too much class for the very limited Lithuanians, whose manager Igoris Pankratjevas resigned immediately after the match.

Ross Barkley's deflected shot gave England the lead before Harry Kane's effort rebounded in off the back of Lithuania keeper Giedrius Arlauskis after striking the post to make

the outcome a formality even before half-time.

Alex Oxlade-Chamberlain's powerful shot rounded off a comfortable night for England that was only marred by brief skirmishes between rival groups of fans that had to be broken up by riot police.

England, who qualified for next summer's tournament in France with two matches to spare, are only the sixth team ever to reach the finals with a 100% record.

England's flawless

record in qualifying has often been damned with faint praise shaped by the standard of opposition they faced.

But the bottom line is that England have done everything asked of them and a flawless record in qualifying - in which they scored 31 goals and conceded just three - must not be dismissed lightly.

Hodgson will be particularly pleased with the emergence of Ross Barkley as an assured presence at international level, the Everton star scoring two goals and providing two assists in his five appearances in the qualifiers.

It was Barkley who broke the deadlock on
