Knife-wielding maniac kills British backpacker

■ French kickboxer held after frenzied attack; another Briton is left fighting for life

A 21-YEAR-old British backpacker's trip of a lifetime was cut tragically short this week when she was brutally murdered in an Australian youth hostel by a knife-wielding maniac who had become infatuated with her.

Mia Ayliffe-Chung from Belper in Derbyshire, had studied psychology and childcare before travelling to Surfers Paradise, in the state of Queensland, where she worked as a nightclub waitress. She had more recently moved to a hostel in the quiet town of Home Hill, about 60 miles south of the city of Townsville, where the attack took place on Tuesday night.

Tom Jackson, a 30-year-old British man who rushed to her aid and was also attacked is in hospital in a critical

condition. Police arrested a 29-year-old Frenchman, Smail Ayad at the scene. According to witnesses, Ayad, who was staying at the same hostel and had developed a 'delusional obsession' with his victim, yelled "Allah Akbar" – Arabic for "God is great" – during the attack and after he was arrested.

"terrible scene"

According to a report from the local paper The Townsville Bulletin, Ayad had fawned over Mia for several days and had told other

backpackers at the hostel that the pair were deeply in love and married.

District Superintendent Ray Rohweder said witnesses left investigators in no doubt that any romantic feelings Ayad had for Miss Ayliffe-Chung were not reciprocated.

He said: "Certainly from Mia's point of view, there was no romantic connection. I don't believe there was any romance between them, there's no doubt about that."

Ayad is alleged to have attacked the woman after dragging her from a bunk bed in a shared dormitory and leaving her to die on the floor.

Mr Jackson was stabbed as he tried to rescue Miss Ayliffe-Chung by shielding her from the blows.

Police superintendent Ray Rohweder told reporters: "Police were confronted with a terrible scene when they arrived. There were up to 30 people who witnessed the incident."

Australian officers said they had to use a Taser and pepper spray on Mr. Ayad whose passport lists his profession as kickboxer.

And Australian officers also told reporters that Ayad hit out at cops in a police van as he was being transferred from hospital to the police station for questioning.

Two policemen

suffered bite injuries in an attempt to calm him down before managing to handcuff his hands to his legs, reporters were told.

'gorgeous personality'

Officers said it took several officers to get the suspect into a padded cell.

Miss Chung's identity was confirmed by

local media in Surfers Paradise, where her workmates described her as "bubbly".

She reportedly travelled north from Surfers Paradise ten days ago to work in a rural area to extend her Australian visa.

Farage at Trump rally: 'I wouldn't vote for Clinton if you paid me'

■ Amid faltering campaign, Republican presidential hopeful rolls out former UKiP leader

FORMER UKIP leader found himself at the center of the US presidential race this week, drawing big cheers at a Donald Trump rally.

Farage was introduced by the Republican presidential contender as the man behind the Brexit vote, which Trump has repeatedly praised during his campaign.

Trump described Brexit as a bid for autonomy and drew parallels to his own campaign, declaring a Trump presidency would bring 'American

independence'. The tycoon has sought to freshen up his campaign after a series of gaffes and his faltering popularity in the polls.

'self-respect'

He introduced Farage as the leader of Ukip who stood up to the EU "against all odds". And although most of the crowd clearly had no idea who he was, Farage soon won them over by proclaiming: "We reached those people who have never voted in their lives but believed by going out and voting

for Brexit they could take back control of their country, take back control of their borders and get back their pride and self-respect."

Farage drew loud cheers when he added that Brexit was "for the little people, for the real people".

Farage's involvement is part of Trump's latest strategy that centers on his new campaign chair, Stephen Bannon. Bannon was the head of the Breitbart website before Trump hired him, and is an enthusiastic supporter of Brexit.

wrote: "Skills achieved; the ability to tell the difference between a rock and a clump of mud and throwing stones really far. The sun is too hot. Stupid Australia."

Amy Browne, 19, from the Gold Coast, who worked as a bartender at the Bedroom Lounge Bar where Miss Ayliffe-Chung (pictured, right) was a waitress, told the Press Association: "Mia was honestly the most bubbliest and most caring girl I knew.

"She got along with everyone she met, she just had that gorgeous personality that everyone seemed to enjoy.

"She always had a smile on her face, so innocent and full of life and love. Our memories will be cherished forever and I know she'd want us all to stay positive in the darkest of times. Rest in peace my beautiful friend, heaven has truly gained another angel."

Her former Australian boyfriend Jamison Stead said she had not wanted to leave her waitress job on the Gold Coast

to work on the farm but wanted to stay in Australia.

Mr Stead said: "She didn't initially want to go but we told her it would be an adventure and experience, so she saw the bright side in the opportunity.

"She had fallen in love with the country and its people. She wanted to get a sponsorship in the Gold Coast or Melbourne and live in Australia after she returned from her farm work.

"It's sad knowing that she won't be able to do those things.

"Mia was a beautiful soul who was always looking out for people. Mia was a girl who lived life as spontaneously as possible. She had a passion for life and it was contagious if you knew her.

"She was a beautiful girl who had her whole life ahead of her. My heart goes out to her and her family. I am truly devastated by her sudden and violent death."

"It's something you hear about but never think that it would happen to someone you were close to."

Golden touchdown for Olympic heroes

■ Stars of Rio fly home as Team GB celebrates best Olympic performance in over a century

Team GB's Olympic heroes arrived home on Tuesday with the promise of even more success at the Tokyo Games in four years' time.

The record-breaking team was welcomed by cheering ground staff as they landed at Heathrow on a specially chartered British Airways jumbo jet.

The Boeing 747, complete with a gold nose cone and a "victORIOUS" livery, carried 320 athletes and support staff who stayed in Brazil for Sunday's closing ceremony, as well as 77 bottles of champagne and luxury three-course meals.

Britain won 67 medals at the games - the country's biggest medal count in more than a century and two more than the remarkable haul in London four years ago, putting Team GB second in the medal table.

'very competitive'

And the country's athletes will be able to perform at Rio levels for the next eight years thanks to an increase in funding, the vice chairman of the British Olympic Association said.

Sir Hugh Robertson said that a 29 per cent increase in funding for elite athletes at the last public spending review, combined with National Lottery investment, would allow similar success in the future.

He said: "The combination of those two things will offer us security through to Tokyo and beyond

and enable us to invest in athletes in the way that we've done in the past to deliver success."

He added: "This is a very competitive business - the time margins that separate success and failure at Olympic sport are tiny - but set against this, nobody ever thought that we would do better in Rio than we did in London and by the same token there is no reason, given the fundamental structure of British Olympic sport and the way it is geared to deliver medal success that we shouldn't have a very, very good games indeed in Tokyo.

'fit for heroes'

Gold medallists Nicola Adams and Max Whitlock were the first to appear at the plane door, before the rest of the athletes emerged, waving and posing for

pictures.

The journey home was extra special for the team's 27 gold medallists, who were given upgrades to First Class.

Among them was world record-breaking swimmer Adam Peaty, 21, and rower Helen Glover, a double Olympic champion - who revealed Team GB's athletes stood up for a rendition of God Save The Queen as it played over the Tannoy before the plane left the tarmac.

There will now be a huge event in London in October as well as a parade through the streets of Manchester to recognise the success of Britain's Olympic and Paralympic stars.

Prime Minister Theresa May said: "It will be a celebration fit for heroes - and rightly so, because that is exactly what they are."

London mayor Sadiq Khan said: "Our athletes have performed heroics in Rio and their exploits

have gripped the entire nation. "My team will continue to work with the

government and sports chiefs to help develop plans for wonderful celebrations."

...and there's more to come, insists Seb

LORD COE believes everything is in place for Britain to continue their medal success in Tokyo and beyond.

The 27 gold medals harvested during 16 days of competition in Brazil is one more than China, which has a population of 1bn.

Four years on from the London 2012 Olympics, Britain became the only host nation to go on to win more medals at the next Games.

Incredibly, of the 366-strong squad, 130 of them have won a medal.

Coe, the president of the IAAF, thinks the

foundations - established after the debacle of Atlanta 1996, when Britain won only one gold medal - are in place to ensure Britain maintains the winning habit.

"I am really bloody proud of the British team," he said. "Though I have been at the athletics, I have been following the British trail of glory this past week and it has been

an absolute delight.

"Yes, we have talked a lot about legacy, but one of the things we wanted to make sure happened after London was that this wasn't just about participation. It was about inspiring another generation to do what Chris Hoy and Victoria Pendleton did.

"We have seen it across the sports you would

not have dreamt seeing medals in 10 years ago.

"And it has been a journey from 1996, where we won one gold medal in Atlanta, and we have started to see it all bear fruit.

"We have a massive debt to the largesse of National Lottery payers, who are the architects of what we have seen the past few days."

Prince William has revealed how much he misses his mother, Princess Diana, during an emotional conversation with a young man who lost his own mum recently.

While visiting a hospice in the UK town of Luton, William sat down with 14-year-old Ben Hines and told him, "Time makes it easier", as he rested a hand on the boy's shoulder.

According to the *Daily Mail*, after Ben delivered a tribute to his mother, William empathized by telling him, "I know how you feel. I still miss my mother every day - and it's 20 years after she



died," he said of Princess Diana, who died in a car accident in Paris on August 31, 1997.

During William's encounter, said to evoke memories of Diana's ability to make emotional connections with strangers, the Duke asked Ben, his brothers Richard and Thomas, and their father, Gary, to promise him that they would keep talking to each other. He told them men are not "great sharers."

While William interacted with Ben and his family, who lost their mother to cancer last year, Kate was making her

Giving a hug to a six-year-old boy who lost his brother two years ago, she

Ofsted's chief forced out after Isle of Wight slur

The chair of Ofsted, David Hoare, who caused uproar when he described the Isle of Wight as a poor ghetto where there has been inbreeding, is to stand down.

The former City businessman agreed to resign with

immediate effect from his £50,000-a-year role after a meeting with the education secretary, Justine Greening, on Monday.

It is understood pressure to step down was put on Hoare at the meeting, where the Isle of Wight comments

were discussed. He will receive no severance pay, Ofsted confirmed on Tuesday.

Office is the official government schools watchdog. The acronym stands for The Office for Standards in Education, Children's Services and Skills. It reports directly

to Parliament and is both independent and impartial. By law it must inspect schools with the aim of providing information to parents, to promote improvement and to hold schools to account.

The Ofsted senior non-executive board member James Kempton will take on the role of chair on an interim basis while Greening starts the process of making a permanent appointment.

Hoare told a teaching conference three weeks ago that the Isle of Wight was blighted by a "mass of crime, drug problems, huge unemployment" and underperforming schools.

His comments were made during a discussion about raising educational standards for the most disadvantaged communities.

Hoare, who has a home overlooking the island, told teachers

that it was often a topic of conversation with his dinner party guests. "They think of it as holiday land. But it is shocking. It's a ghetto. There has been inbreeding."

His comments prompted outrage from Isle of Wight residents, with the council leader, Jonathan Bacon, describing them as "an insult to the proud and hardworking Isle of Wight community".

Authorities baffled as five die at 'safe' beach

■ "There are no massive rip currents, it's all very much unexplained"

AUTHORITIES were searching for answers this week after the tragic death of five men in the waters off Camber Sands.

The deaths came on the hottest day of the year and shocked beachgoers at the popular East Sussex seaside town, which is famous for its calm seas and shallow waters.

It was the culmination of a deadly week on British beaches, with seven other people dying around the UK coastline since Friday.

The first alert came just after 14:10 when coastguard helicopters, a lifeboat, rescue teams and an air ambulance were sent to the scene after reports three men were in need of urgent medical assistance.

The beach was cleared and the public were asked to stay away while the emergency services dealt with the incident. The three men, later identified as Nitharsan Ravi, Kenigan Nathan and the latter's brother Kobi Nathan, were pronounced dead at the scene.

And in a macabre twist, the receding tide revealed the bodies of two more men stuck in the sand some hours later. This led to suggestions the pair may have caught in quicksand, and other reports suggested that all five deaths may be

linked to jellyfish.

The other two were later named as Kurushanth Anna and Inthushan Sri. All are believed to be good friends from Sri Lankan communities in the capital.

Kenigan Nathan was 19 and his brother Kobi Nathan was 22 years old, and their friend Nitharsan Ravi was also aged 22.

The sea around Camber Sands has no especially dangerous features and the deaths remain "very much unexplained", said an RNLI worker positioned further up the coast.

"There are no deep shelves there and the beach is known to be very, very safe," they told *The Independent*.

"And there are no massive rip currents. It's all very much unexplained. If you see photographs of the sea at the time, it's very calm.

"It might be they had medical conditions, or they were very hot and got cold water shock – we just don't know."

Eyewitness Natalja Taylor, 30, said she saw three people being pulled out of the water, apparently by "regular people, not emergency personnel".

"There were so many people there. They were still on the

beach when we left," she said.

She said police drove on to the beach with a loudspeaker telling people not to go into the water until further notice, and also taped off "a huge chunk of the beach so no-one could get near it".

She said: "It's pretty scary. I'm not sure how it happened. We decided not to go into the sea after seeing warning signs about some kind of fish.

"It wasn't particularly windy down there, it was just a hot, sunny beach day."

Charlotte Frederick, from London, who saw the rescue operation take place, said: "One was taken away on a rescue truck and the other two were left behind."

She said she realised later that the other two men had also died.

"We saw them take up a blanket and then after that we saw them taken in a body bag. It was really distressing," she said.

Camber Sands is a popular destination for beach-goers and Rother District Council provides beach patrols there throughout the summer.

A council spokesman said: "While it's very upsetting to see two similar, tragic incidents this summer, over the years these kind of incidents are

extremely rare and on a fine day around 25,000 people use the beach safely."

He said the beach patrols were able to advise people of potential dangers, reunite lost

children with their families and deal with incidents on the beach.

Police Scotland approves hijab as official uniform to boost number of Muslim women joining force

■ Move comes 15 years after Metropolitan police introduced optional hijabs for officers in London

Police Scotland has announced that the hijab will become part of its official uniform as it aims to create a more diverse force.

The force said they hope the move will "encourage women from Muslim communities, who may previously not have seen policing as a career option, to reconsider".

In the past, Muslim police officers in Scotland were allowed to wear the hijab, but only once it was approved by senior staff members.

The Metropolitan Police introduced the hijab as an optional part of the force's official uniform in 2001 as part of a similar

drive to recruit a more diverse mix of officers. In a statement, chief constable Phil Gormley said: "I am delighted to make this announcement and welcome the support from both the Muslim community, and the wider community, as well as police officers and staff.

"Like many other employers, especially in the public sector, we are working towards ensuring our service is representative of the communities we serve. I hope that this addition to our uniform options will contribute to making our staff mix more diverse and adds to the life skills, experiences and personal qualities that our

officers and staff bring to policing the communities of Scotland."

The announcement was welcomed by the Scottish Police Muslim Association (SPMA), a group that aims to build links between Muslim communities in Scotland and the police.

Fahad Bashir, chair of the SPMA said: "This is a positive step in the right direction, and I am delighted that Police Scotland is taking productive steps in order to ensure that our organisation is seen to be inclusive and represents the diverse communities that we serve across Scotland.

"No doubt this will



encourage more women from Muslim and minority ethnic backgrounds to join Police Scotland."

Police Scotland's diversity drive follows statistics from the Scottish Police Authority released earlier this year which showed just 127, (2.6

per cent) of the 4,809 applications to join the force were from people with ethnic backgrounds.

In a statement, chief constable Phil Gormley said: "I am delighted to make this announcement and welcome the support from both the Muslim

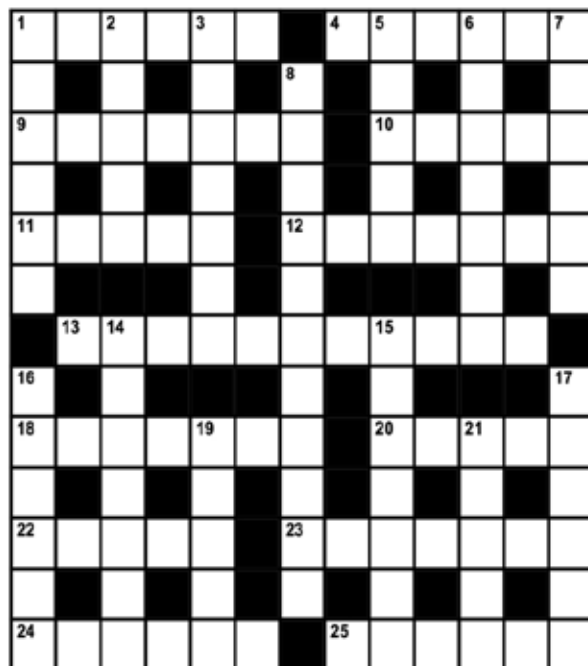

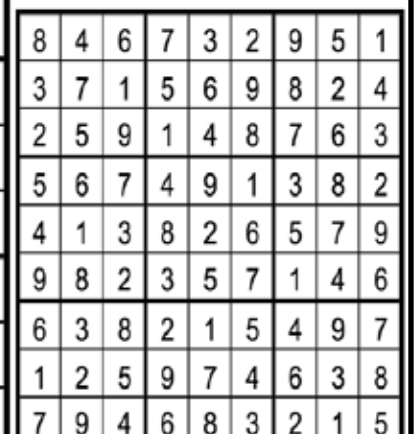

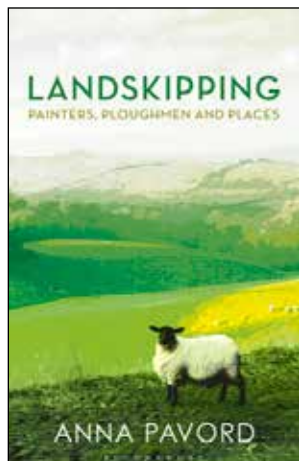
An absorbing look at Brits and their land

Exclusive interview
with author Anna
Pavord about her
book exploring
remote locations in
the UK

"Walking is the only way to understand the detail of a country as diverse and complex as Britain," says Landskipping author Anna Pavord.

"So I take the reader to my birthplace in the border country between England and Wales, to the Lake District where I explore the beginnings of the tourist industry in this country, to the Highlands of Scotland where much of Landskipping was written, in a cottage I have rented for years on the Attadale Estate. The final section of the book explores the sense of place and is very much based in West Dorset where we have lived for nearly fifty years."



Pavord's knowledge of the British landscape and her observations of the Brits' love of their land is inspiring. Her descriptions of plants and the seasonal changes to the landscape paint a vivid picture. She explores Britain's most iconic landscapes through artwork and literature, past and the present. A personal story, she has a connection to the places she's writing about. A book to keep for years that you can pick up and put down as you become interested in different places. Makes you think

about what home really is.

Thirty years as the gardening correspondent for *The Independent* prepared Pavord for writing *Landskipping*. She had a weekly column that began with the founding of the paper in 1986 and finished with the last print edition on Easter Saturday of this year.

"Landscape as a theme for a book has been in my mind for years," says Pavord. I began with the notion that I would just explore the subject more deeply for my own pleasure, not necessarily for a book. But after four years of fairly intense and fascinating work, I decided there might be a book in the material I had, if I could organize it to my satisfaction. It took me another year to isolate the three themes...another year to actually write the book. It's the most personal book I've ever written, with much of it based on my own experiences and

memories."

During her research on the first section of the book, about the first British artists to paint British landscapes, three places: the Lake District, the mountains of North Wales and the Highlands of Scotland, quickly emerged as favourite subjects.

The second section of the book drove Pavord to research the way that farming has shaped the land, the activities of agricultural "improvers" at the end of the 18th century. "I got hold of most of the reports commissioned by the Board of Agriculture which the government of the day set up to find out about how Britain was farmed and how things might be done more efficiently," says Pavord. "Reports came in from each of the 54 counties of England and Wales. Buying antiquarian books is a great weakness. I think I can justify it because I need them for research,

but actually it's because I just love to have them on the shelf and be able to go back to them frequently. A real book on your own shelf is a much quicker and more satisfying way to research than trawling around on the Internet."

For the third part of the book, based in West Dorset, Pavord turned to her local library. "Our magnificent Dorset History Centre," she says. "Researching the background of one village, Powerstock, through tithe maps, which were commissioned in 1839 and the first census which happened in 1841. Through these documents, you can discover people and the landscape, and know what was being grown, how people earned a living."

Pavord has written twelve books, the most notable of the others being *The Tulip* (1999) and *The Naming of Names* (2005). "Because of my book *The Tulip*,

a best seller, I came on four book tours in the U.S. which I loved. On book tour, you have an opportunity to meet so many people."

Pavord has a home in West Dorset. She born in Abergavenny, a small market town in Monmouthshire, on the border between England and Wales.

Titus Andronicus: lessons for the modern world at the Theatricum Botanicum

America is approaching a crossroads.

In November, her citizens will decide which direction they will take politically and socially. Will they hold onto the current political structure, though it's in need of refurbishment, or will they follow a course based on one person's self-interest, personal gratification, prejudices, and sense of shotgun justice, regardless of the consequences to the greater whole? Worse than that, are you suffering from Game of Thrones withdrawals, and don't think you can survive without beheadings, mass

killings, and graveside humour until Spring 2017? There is a remedy!

As part of the Summer Repertory Season, **Will Geer's Theatricum Botanicum** are staging Shakespeare's tragedy *Titus Andronicus*. General Andronicus (Sheridan Crist), returns to Rome with his captives, Queen Tamora (Marie Françoise Theodore), her three sons (Nima Jafari, Kelvin Morales, Miebaka Yohannes), and her Moorish lover Aaron (Michael McFall), after a 10-year war against the Goths. He mercilessly demands the sacrifice of Tamora's eldest son as tribute for the sons he has lost in the war, which starts a terrible cycle of revenge. At the same

time, Rome is in need of a new Emperor, and the sons of the old one, Saturninus (Christopher W. Jones) and Bassianus (Turner Frankosky), are vying for the throne. The people of Rome want Titus to rule, much to the anger of Saturninus, and though Titus refuses the honor, he takes this as a personal insult, and a hatred for Titus and his family is born. When Saturninus takes Tamora as his queen, she is free to have her revenge unconstrained, which make this the bloodiest of all Shakespeare's plays.

Titus is a cautionary tale about abuse of power, and examines what happens when personal desire and

self-interest supplant the agreed-upon socio-political structure. Though lacking dragons, the deadly creatures that inhabit this world are of the human kind - murderers, rapists and filicides- and in total they manage to cause 14 killings, two beheadings, five amputations, one multiple-rape, one live burial, one case of insanity, and an act of cannibalism.

Set in a near future, Ms. Geer has created a Rome where politics is not far from a game show, where the citizens' cheers and applause are demanded on cue cards, and the music and fanfare of the court sound like cheap advert jingles. She has dressed oppression in a shiny suit, and given it an ultra-white smile. Even before the start of the play, the long strains of fraught violin strings, part of

an outstanding original music score by Marshall McDaniel, evoke a sense of epic foreboding.

Sheridan Crist plays Titus with great energy and agility, easily tackling emotional shifts from prideful rage to deepest loss. His vocal command and use of the language is a delight, and his Titus is deeply inventive and entertaining in his journey from hubris to madness. It's obvious he is enjoying the role. Michelle Wicklas is heartbreaking as poor Lavinia, dragged away powerless, to be viciously used by Tamora's two sons. One feels real injustice when her father in the name of family honour ultimately kills her. Michael McFall, like a beefier Samuel L. Jackson, takes no prisoners as Aaron the Moor, Tamora's lover. The delight he takes in his

vengeful and villainous acts is gripping.

Besides the obvious brutal goings-on, this riveting production is deeply moving and surprisingly funny, which will have you shocked one moment and laughing the next at some very dark situations. Under director Ellen Geer's expert hand the effect on the characters of these extreme situations gives rise to some very comic moments amongst the bloodletting, while ensuring her excellent cast is well grounded in the reality of the situations.

Not for the squeamish, it's not to be missed!

Two more new signings on the way for Gunners

Arsenal have agreed a deal to sign Deportivo La Coruna striker Lucas Perez and are close to reaching an agreement with Valencia for centre-back Shkodran Mustafi.

Spaniard Lucas, 27, scored 17 goals in 37 games last season and Arsenal will meet a 20m euro (£17.1m) buyout clause.

Germany international Mustafi, 24, is set to join for a fee in excess of £35m.

It would take Arsenal's spending to almost £100m since last season.

They have added midfielder Granit Xhaka, defender Rob Holding, forward Takuma Asano and midfielder Kelechi Nwakali to their squad this term.

Everton were closing in on a deal for Lucas before Arsenal declared their interest.

Arsenal boss Arsene Wenger has said he is not reluctant to spend money in the transfer market after being criticised by fans. He is currently in the final year of his contract with the Gunners and has endured a difficult start to the season, with only one point after two games.

Hammers tumble out

West Ham failed to reach the Europa League group stage as Astra Giurgiu knocked them out in the qualifying round for the second year in a row on Thursday.

After a 1-1 away draw last week, West Ham went behind when Filipe Teixeira precisely finished a swift counter-attack by the Romanian champions.

After the break West Ham's Jonathan Calleri and Winston Reid missed good chances and Ashley Fletcher went close.

But West Ham could not avoid a first competitive

loss at the London Stadium.

The home fans left the Premier League club's new 60,000-seater ground within seconds of the full-time whistle, although the small pocket of Romanian supporters remained to celebrate with their jubilant players. The result leaves Manchester United and Southampton as the only English sides in Friday's draw.

Pep's going back to Barcelona!

■ City draw Catalan giants in Champions League group stage

Manchester City will meet Scottish champions Celtic and manager Pep Guardiola's former club Barcelona in the Champions League group stage.

German side Borussia Monchengladbach will be the other team in Group B.

Premier League champions Leicester will play Porto, Club Brugge and FC Copenhagen in their debut campaign.

Arsenal have been drawn alongside Paris St-Germain, Basel and Ludogorets, with Tottenham facing Monaco, CSKA Moscow and Bayer Leverkusen.

Spanish side Real Madrid beat neighbours Atletico on penalties in last season's final, becoming European champions for a record 11th time.

Zinedine Zidane's side meet German outfit Borussia Dortmund, Portugal's Sporting Lisbon and Legia Warsaw of Poland.

Guardiola, who replaced Manuel Pellegrini at the end of last season, is Barcelona's most successful boss, leading the Spanish club to 14 major trophies between 2008 and 2012.

He helped the Catalans, who are five-time European champions, win the Champions League in 2009 and 2011.

After leaving the Nou Camp, the former Spain midfielder took charge of German side Bayern Munich and lost to his former side in the 2014-15 Champions League semi-finals.

City, who lost to champions Real Madrid in the semi-finals last season, qualified for the group stage thanks to a 6-0 aggregate win

over Romania's Steaua Bucharest.

As well as facing Barcelona for a third time in four seasons, City also return to Monchengladbach, whom they beat home and away in last season's group stage.

"It is not a nightmare draw because we are in a wonderful competition - but it is a very tough group," City director of football Txiki Begiristain said.

"Pep knows the group very well - obviously Barcelona but also Borussia Monchengladbach from his time in Germany."

Leicester produced one of the great sporting shocks to win last season's Premier League title and qualify for the Champions League for the first time.

The Foxes' last involvement in European football saw them knocked out of the Uefa Cup in the first round by Red Star Belgrade in 2000.

Claudio Ranieri's side could have been drawn in a group with last season's beaten finalists Atletico Madrid, Dutch champions PSV Eindhoven and Turkish league winners Besiktas. Although they face Portuguese champions Porto, who have reached the group stage for a sixth successive season, Belgian title winners Club Brugge and Danish champions FC Copenhagen have shown little Champions League pedigree in recent years.

Brugge are competing in the group stage for the first time since 2005-06, while Copenhagen are 81st in Uefa's club rankings.

"With the history of all the clubs we could have

been drawn against, it was always going to be an interesting draw," said Foxes director of football Jon Rudkin.

"These are three very established European football clubs and strong teams."

Russian side Rostov - the only other Champions League debutants this season - face Atletico and German champions Bayern Munich.

Return for Spurs

Tottenham mark their return to European football's top competition for the first time in six seasons, while Arsenal will aim to qualify for the knockout stages for a 13th successive year.

Spurs, who reached the quarter-finals in 2010-11 with wins over both Milan clubs, have avoided the European heavyweights despite being drawn in pot three.

With White Hart Lane's capacity reduced as work begins on a new stadium, Tottenham will play their Champions League games at Wembley this season.

Their toughest test is likely to come against Russian champions CSKA Moscow, the 2005 Uefa Cup winners.

"We know very well that Russia is always difficult and CSKA are sure to have a very good team," said Spurs manager Mauricio Pochettino.

Arsenal, who reached the last 16 last season, and PSG will be favourites to progress from Group A.

French champions PSG knocked Chelsea out in the last 16 before losing to Manchester City, but have not met Arsenal since the 1993-94 Cup Winners' Cup semi-final.
