

Hate preacher faces ten year jail term

■ **Anjem Choudary finally convicted after years-long game of cat and mouse with authorities**

ONE OF BRITAIN'S most notorious hate preachers is facing jail after being found guilty of supporting Islamic State.

Having avoided arrest for years despite his apparent sympathy for extremism and links to some of Britain's most notorious terrorists, Anjem Choudary was convicted at the Old Bailey on Monday after jurors heard he had sworn an oath of allegiance to Isis.

The 49-year-old, who has links to one of Lee Rigby's killers, Michael Adebolajo, and the Islamist militant Omar Bakri Muhammad, also urged followers to support Isis in a series of talks broadcast on YouTube.

Choudary and his co-defendant, Mohammed Rahman, 33, told their supporters to obey Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi, the Isis leader, who is also known as a caliph, and travel to Syria to support Isis or "the caliphate", the court heard.

They were convicted in July but details of the trial, including the verdict, could not be reported until now.

Choudary and Rahman face up to 10

years in jail for inviting support for a proscribed organisation. They will be sentenced on 6 September at the Old Bailey.

influence

Commander Dean Haydon, head of the Metropolitan police's counter-terrorism command, said: "These men have stayed just within the law for many years, but there is no one within the counter-terrorism world that has any doubts of the influence that they have had, the hate they have spread and the people that they have encouraged to join terrorist organisations.

"Over and over again we have seen people on trial for the most serious offences who have attended lectures or speeches given by these men. The oath of allegiance was a turning point for the police - at last we had the evidence that they had stepped over the line and we could prove they supported Isis."

Haydon said 20 years' worth of material was considered in the investigation, with 333 electronic devices containing 12.1 terabytes of storage data assessed.

It can now also be revealed that Choudary was encouraged to support Isis by a notorious British Isis fighter who fled to Syria while on police bail.

influence

The court heard that shortly after Isis was proscribed as a terror group Choudary was in contact with an individual named as Siddhartha Dhar - known on social media as Abu Rumaysah - who was arrested alongside Choudary before he fled to Syria to fight with Isis while on police bail.

Dhar encouraged Choudary to express support for Isis on social media. Following on from Dhar's encouragement, both defendants made their position on the newly declared caliphate clear in the "oath of

allegiance".

Prosecutor Richard Whittam QC said: "The prosecution case is that whichever name is used, the evidence is quite clear: when these defendants were inviting support for an Islamic state or caliphate they were referring to the one declared in Syria and its environs by Ibrahim [Abu Bakr] al-Baghdadi at the end of June 2014.

hated figure

"Terrorist organisations thrive and grow because people support them and that is what this case is about. Do not confuse

that with the right of people to follow the religion of their choice or to proclaim support for a caliphate."

Choudary has become such a hated figure in the UK that both he and his wife have enjoyed taxpayer-funded police protection for the past few months. Not surprisingly, the British media greeted the news with almost unanimous delight.

"From the start, Choudary conducted himself with the cheery, arrogant imperviousness of someone who knows that he can say what

he likes, however abhorrent, because he is protected by the supremely tolerant, culturally sensitive nation he plans to destroy," wrote Allison Pearson in the *Telegraph*. "Try appearing on TV in Riyadh and saying 'Saudi Arabia belongs to Jesus' and see how you get on. Until the British Sharia state came to pass, the father of five was perfectly happy to claim up to £25,000 a year in infidel benefits for his east London household. Asked how he and his burka-clad wife could

Princess Eugenie and Jack Brooksbank to marry in 2017

■ Newlyweds will move into ‘cosy cottage’ at Kensington Palace

PRINCESS Eugenie is to marry her nightclub manager boyfriend Jack Brooksbank.

The Duke and Duchess of York’s 26-year old daughter plans to get engaged “by the end of the year” and will marry in 2017, according to friends who say she is “blissfully happy”.

Prince Andrew and the Duchess of York have both been told of the plans and are said to be “overjoyed” their youngest daughter has found “the one”.

A family friend said: “They have both grown to love Jack and think he is perfect for her. He is a very down-to-earth genuine guy and they have got to know him well over the past six years. As far as they are concerned if Eugenie is happy then so are they.”

News of the royal wedding comes just a week after it was revealed Eugenie’s older sister Princess Beatrice has split from her long-term boyfriend Dave Clark.

A close family friend said: “Everyone was a bit down about Beatrice and Dave ending it after 10 years but it’s fantastic news about Eugenie and her sister is overjoyed for her.

The Queen has met Jack and is ‘thrilled’ that Eugenie has met such a “thoroughly nice young man”.

The couple are to move into their first home at Kensington Palace where William and Kate and Harry will be close neighbours.

Eugenie and Jack, 29, will be living in Ivy Cottage, a three-bedroom home right next door to cousin Harry’s house Nottingham Cottage.

‘cosy cottage’

Eugenie will move in by Christmas and Jack will join her officially after the wedding.

A Kensington Palace insider said: “It’s a cosy cottage and an ideal first home. It was once lived in by the family of a soldier injured in the First World War and has also been used by staff. It needs some work and so it’s going to take some weeks to do up.

“Harry is right next door so Eugenie will always be able to pop round and get some sugar. But seriously, they get on really well and they will both love being so close.”

When the cottage is ready, Eugenie will move

out of the apartment she shares with 28-year-old Beatrice at St James’s Palace.

The friend added: “She wants her own space and obviously wants to plan ahead for married life.”

One Palace source said: “The Queen is delighted and thinks it’s wonderful that there will be a family wedding in the year when she and Prince Philip celebrate their 70th anniversary!

“Everyone is looking forward to the great day.” Eugenie, who is eighth

in line to the throne, does not have to formally ask the Queen’s permission to marry, but an insider said: “Of course out of respect and courtesy she will consult her before announcing anything.”

‘immediate attraction’

Eugenie and Jack started dating six years ago after they were introduced by friends in the Swiss ski resort of Verbier. At the time Jack was waiter but the difference in their social standing did not trouble

Eugenie. Besides, Jack had the benefit of a good education at top private school Stowe – fees £11,000 a term – and looked like a young man who was going places.

One friend said: “There was an immediate attraction and they have been together ever since.”

While Eugenie furthered her career with a move to New York the two stayed in touch on Skype as Jack worked his way up in the hospitality business, first taking a

job at the famed posh person’s pub the Admiral Codrington in Chelsea before moving on to the nearby Markham Inn.

From there Jack got to know regular Prince Harry and his friend Guy Pelly, who lured Jack to run the trendy Mahiki nightclub where Jack worked 12 hour days.

He said: “I don’t get much time to go out. After work I head home. People think we party a lot but for me it’s a case of going back to watch a DVD.”

'Nothing much has really changed'

■ Lineker keeps his word; presents MOTD in his underwear

■ Twitter users complain his shorts aren't brief enough

Gary Lineker was as good as his word at the weekend, hosting the season's first Match of the Day in only white boxer shorts.

The former Foxes, Everton Spurs and Barcelona striker had promised last season that he would present the venerable show in his underwear if his beloved Leicester City won the Premier League title. Claudio Ranieri's 5,000-1 outsiders went on to finish 10 points clear of second-placed Arsenal and Saturday night Lineker was as good as his word – provoking a Twitter storm in the process.

The show opened with Lineker clad only in the shorts – which featured a large Leicester City logo – with the

host deadpanning that 'nothing much has really changed' and making no reference to his attire – or lack thereof.

Meanwhile pundits and former England strikers Alan Shearer and Ian Wright could be seen giggling away in the background as Lineker read out his introduction to the programme's first game after the Premier League got underway.

'strangely terrifying'

Bit some on Twitter have criticised Lineker, 55, for opting for the large boxers, instead of the expected pair of skimpy briefs. Clearly many fans were expecting something a little more revealing.

Fifteen minutes before the show started on BBC One, Lineker

tweeted 'this is strangely terrifying'.

And fellow Match of the Day presenter Dan Walker joked: '4,000 sit ups a day for 20 seconds on telly. Well played Gary Lineker. Were they pants or shorts though?'

"inside info"

The show's first game was Hull City against Leicester, with the champions losing 2-1.

Lineker changed back to his usual smart shirt and trousers after 30 minutes in his pants.

His son George tweeted shortly after his father appeared in his pants. He had placed £50 on his dad wearing blue pants with odds at 4/5.

George Lineker tweeted: 'How the f*** did I get this wrong? I had inside info.'

possibly justify living off the state, Choudary explained: 'They give us the money but we attack their system. If I'm given wealth I will take it.'

"More fool us. And Choudary did fool us, again and again, making Britain look gullible and weak when we needed to be ruthless in the defence of our way of life."

Over at the Daily

Express, columnist Leo McKinstry laid the blame firmly at the door of a British state obsessed with multiculturalism, thundering: "Terrified of accusations of Islamophobia, obsessed with the dogma of diversity, desperate to maintain the illusion of multiculturalism's unalloyed success, the state treated him as an eccentric rather than a menace. The same failure to tackle Muslim radicalism and criminality could be found elsewhere, such

as in the protection given to the Finsbury Park Mosque, though many members were anti-Western fundamentalists, or in the effective immunity granted to predatory gangs of Pakistani men abusing white girls in Rotherham..

"A qualified lawyer and cunning operator, Choudary ruthlessly used our tradition of free speech and concern for human rights as a shield to defend himself. It was breathtaking hypocrisy."

Another golden Olympics: what is the secret of British success?

■ The world weighs in as Britain's medal tally inspires envy - and conspiracy talk - around the globe

BRITAIN'S astounding performance at the Rio's Olympics have not just electrified the nation, it has also got the rest of the world asking: how on earth have they done it?

Britain has been winning medals throughout the Games not just in their traditional areas of strength like sailing, rowing and track field, but they have also struck gold in sports traditionally considered off limits, including gymnastics, diving and field hockey.

Our bitter sporting rivals Australia have previously dismissed Team GB's success in the 'sitting down sports' of rowing, sailing and cycling, but the team's astonishing success this time round has finally earned some grudging support Down Under.

The *Sydney Morning Herald* noted this week that compared with Britain, Australia has not done very well in the Games, despite having adopted a similar funding strategy in its search for Olympic success.

"In all, \$340m has been injected into summer Olympic sports using the national lottery funding model adopted by Great

Britain in the lead-up to its home Olympics as an inspiration," the paper says.

"But while Team GB... are still enjoying the afterglow of London by punching well above their weight here, the jury is still out for Australia's program."

In a separate report, the paper said that when Cycling Australia boss Kevin Tabotta was asked what made British cycling so good, he replied: "If I had the blueprint, I'd be using it myself."

direct funding

An article on Sina's Weibo, the popular Chinese microblogging platform, also wonders what the UK's "secret" is, noting that direct funding from the National Lottery was "allocated to sports management and research institutions" for "a 'world-class project'".

French business daily *Les Echos* believes it has the answer. Asking "Why do the British swipe so many medals?", it suggests that "to understand why Britain is doing so well this year", one needs to remember that its "direct competitor, the Russian team, was heavily

penalized".

Raised eyebrows

A Russian sports news website, Sport Express, carries a report headlined "Britain sets medal record for non-domestic Olympics".

The brief report is followed by a somewhat jaundiced comment from a reader identified as "S-E fan", who asks: "What's so surprising about this? The British have seized key posts at Wada, IAAF, the Paralympic Committee. Their people are everywhere, they are securely covered and compete and train without hassle."

Several competitors in Rio have expressed astonishment at Team GB's performance.

'Eycling'

Australia's Olympic team captain Anna Meares was said to have "raised her eyebrows" at Britain's track cycling success, while Germany's champion cyclist Kristina Vogel asked how it was possible that Britain's cyclists could do so well at the Olympics after failing to score any other notable successes in the previous few years.

Anna Meares later took to Twitter to make it clear that she had not intended

to suggest that the British team had been doing anything suspicious.

French ex-cyclist, ex-coach and now columnist Antoine Vayer has been posting a number of provocative tweets aimed at British cyclists, with the latest simply stating: "Eycling".

But the French paper *Le Telegramme* believes the British sprinters' superior muscle power is

what gives them the edge over their competitors.

"Sprint is fast becoming above all a sport of strength, in which the emphasis is on muscle power - perhaps excessively so for the purists," it says.

Meanwhile, English-language Chinese sources are being magnanimous about Britain's Rio successes but the Chinese-

language papers are not happy about lagging behind Britain in the medals table.

Nationalist newspaper *Huanqiu Shibao* says there is "British media excitement over gold medals overtaking China" but the paper stresses that this is only "temporary".

But then they would say that, wouldn't they?

The Night Tube gets rolling

The first Night Tubes rolled on to London Underground platforms past midnight on Friday - almost three years since the plan was first announced.

Trains will run on the Victoria and Central lines on Fridays and Saturdays.

The plan was announced in November 2013 and intended to begin in September 2015, but strikes over pay delayed the start by nearly another year.

Transport for London said there was a "huge demand" as passenger numbers on weekends had soared by 70% since 2000.

Night Tube services are expected to add £6.4bn to the London economy by 2030, creating 500,000 jobs, TfL said.

Trains will run every 10 minutes on the full Victoria line and on the Central line between White City and Leytonstone. They will run approximately every 20 minutes between

Ealing Broadway and White City and between Leytonstone and Loughton/Hainault.

Unions staged a series of strikes during July and August last year before an agreement was finally reached in March 2016.

Before leaving office, the former mayor Boris Johnson, who had locked horns with the unions on ticket office closures and Night Tube plans, said he hoped services would get underway by July.

The new London Mayor Sadiq Khan plans to travel on the first Night Tube train on the Victoria line from Brixton late on Friday.

He said: "I'm really excited. Lots of people need to get to work late in the night or home from work - doctors, nurses, porters, security guards - but also it will be a massive boost to the night time economy.

"Think of the theatres, the live music venues, the restaurants. I'm really pleased and proud that finally the Night Tube is here.

"Boris Johnson deserves credit for talking about the Night Tube, but it was important to get the details right. I'm really pleased and proud that finally it's going to happen."

I can win over Tory Voters, insists Corbyn

Jeremy Corbyn has insisted he can reach out beyond his core supporters as his leadership rival said Labour was not on a "trajectory to win power".

At a hustings event, he said his policies would win over "some people that have been tempted to vote Tory".

He also would not commit the UK to providing military help to a Nato ally, should it be invaded by Russia.

Challenger Owen Smith said he did not believe Labour would win power under Mr Corbyn's "ineffective" leadership.

At the hustings in Birmingham, Mr Smith said: "I feel right now we are not about to win in Kingswood and Milton Keynes and Cardiff North and all of the 116 seats we have got to win from the Tories."

"And the choice for this generation is: Are we happy to sit back where we are or do we think we need to be a Labour government once more? I think we need to be a Labour government once more and I think we need to be a Labour government very, very quickly."

The former work and pensions spokesman is challenging Mr Corbyn for Labour's top job, after the leader lost a no-confidence vote of his MPs.

But Mr Corbyn said his message appeals "all across the piece, all across the country".

"If you are poor and up against it in Milton Keynes, in Shrewsbury, or anywhere else you are poor and up against it, therefore the message we are putting forward about an economy that doesn't accept the political choice of austerity, instead invests for all, I think is a very powerful one."

Probe launched as former Villa star dies after tasing

Two police officers are under criminal investigation after the death of former Aston Villa star Dalian Atkinson, who died after he was shot with a Taser.

The West Mercia officers have been suspended pending the outcome of the probe by the Independent Police Complaints Commission, the force said.

Mr Atkinson died shortly after being shot following an altercation in Meadow Close, Trench, in Telford on Monday.

A post-mortem examination was inconclusive.

IPCC Commissioner, Derrick Campbell, said the investigation would consider Mr Atkinson's death and the "level and type of force used" against him.

The watchdog said a

"criminal investigation does not mean that criminal charges will necessarily follow".

Police said the Taser was deployed at about 01:30 BST in Telford, Shropshire after officers were called to a report of concern for a man's safety at Mr Atkinson's father's house.

A neighbour described seeing the 48-year-old being Tasered after "stumbling towards" police.

'In shock'

Mr Atkinson went into cardiac arrest on his way to hospital, where he was pronounced dead at about 03:00.

Mr Campbell said: "Two police officers will be interviewed under criminal caution by IPCC investigators."

"We will keep Mr Atkinson's family updated, and our thoughts remain with all of those

affected by his death."

In a statement, Mr Atkinson's family said they were "still in shock".

"We are determined to get justice for him which means getting to the truth," it said.

"We are looking to the IPCC to carry out a thorough and robust investigation that will ultimately provide transparency and

accountability. Dalian's memory requires nothing less."

Mr Atkinson was a top-flight striker in the 1990s, starting his career at Ipswich Town then playing for Sheffield Wednesday and Spanish side Real Sociedad before moving to Villa.

He scored 23 goals in 85 appearances for the Birmingham side between

1991 and 1995.

West Mercia Police Chief Constable Anthony Bangham said: "I wish to express my deepest sympathies to the family and friends of Dalian who are going through this traumatic time."

"I would like to reassure his family and the community that we will fully co-operate with the IPCC."

■ Punch and Judy booth to close after 130 years because puppeteer is fed up with kids throwing rocks at him

One of Britain's last remaining beach Punch and Judy shows looks set to end after 130 years as the puppeteer has become fed up with unruly audiences.

The traditional slapstick show has been a regular summer feature on Dorset's Weymouth beach since the 1880s but now Mark Poulton has had enough of children throwing rocks at his stall.

He claims the children's bad behaviour during shows, which also includes verbal abuse, often goes unpunished by the parents and performances are interrupted.

Mr Poulton, 43, has

also cited members of the public not paying for their children to watch his shows as another reason to end the resort's long-standing tradition permanently.

Mr Poulton, one of only half-a-dozen Punch and Judy performers left in the country, said: "I have had kids throwing rocks at the show, and the parents just sit there and let them do it."

"We've always had people refuse to pay, but now they will argue with us and say 'you can't make us, this is a public beach'."

"We even get large groups of people sunbathing in front of the show, so people who want

to watch can't sit there. It just destroys your faith in humanity."

Glyn Edwards, of the Punch and Judy College of Professors and who runs Brighton's regular show, said there are less than six of the traditional beach performances still on offer in the UK.

He said: "It would be very sad to see the

Weymouth show come to an end.

"It is always the case when you are out as a street performer that you are going to get some problems with drunks and yobs, but they tend to be the same drunks and yobs who cause problems for everyone in the town."

"I am very surprised that he has had a problem with

children."

Cllr Jason Osborne, Weymouth and Portland council's tourism portfolio holder, said the council will do everything it can to help Mr Poulton turn the business around.

He said: "It would be devastating to see the show go. Punch and Judy is a key part of Weymouth beach."

It wasn't all bad...

On the island of Lundy, the puffin has come back from the brink. The bird (pictured, right) has been breeding on Lundy, 12 miles off the coast of Devon, for centuries. But when its population was devastated by rats, who ate the puffins' eggs and chicks, it looked as if the population might be wiped out. In 2000, there were just five pairs left on the island. But following a cull of rats by the Lundy Seabird Recovery Project, the island was declared rat-free in 2006, and the bird is now thriving. Wildlife experts recently counted more than 300 puffins there, and about 100 are currently breeding.

Long liver

A woman is about to celebrate the 101st birthday of her kidney, 43 years after



it was transplanted from her mother. Sue Westhead, 68, from Wearside, received the organ in 1973 after being diagnosed with kidney disease. Her late mother was 57 at the time, and would have turned 101 this November. Transplants from living donors rarely last longer than 20 years, but Westhead has defied doctors' expectations, and is thought to have the world's oldest transplanted kidney.

Meet Olympia LePoint, with family from the U.K. and France, who moved to LA over 20 years ago to pursue a career in Science and Science Entertainment.

Was there a particular reason you chose LA?

What do you miss most from home?

I enjoy my close friendships with friends in London. And my aunts, uncles and cousins now live in New Zealand. I am a person who values relationships.

What was your first impression of LA and has it changed since? If so, why?

My first impression of Los Angeles was that there was a huge financial disparity between

American groups of people despite it being in "The Land of The Free". In one area, groups of people were living in poverty. And merely 16 kilometers away, people were also living in extravagant Beverly Hills homes. This shocked me. As a result, I am passionate about educating people through my career.

What do you find the biggest difference is living here versus London and Paris?

Three things are different in here: the entertainment opportunities, the educational cost and dating as a single woman. There are more TV and film opportunities here. There are more independent producers and writers allowing entertainers to become their own international brands. As I teach as a mathematics professor, I find the university education to be great.

However, there is a high price tag associated with it. Lastly, dating in the U.S. is much different than in Europe. I typically find I enjoy gentlemen and European men like my late grandfather, whom I loved deeply.

Yes. In Los Angeles, I LOVE watching polo games. I truly enjoy visiting Will Rogers State Park on the weekend and the California Polo

The experience alone is worth it. Word of caution: it is different than being in the U.K. And it takes strength to adjust. However, if you don't like it, you can always move back.

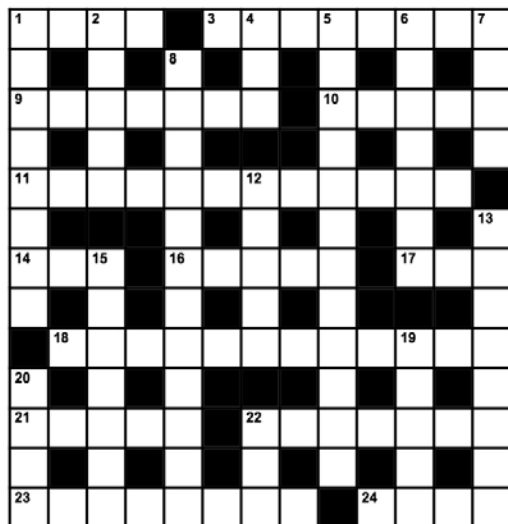
Lots of our members join our group Brits in LA seeking out words of wisdom - what is the best piece of advice you've been given?

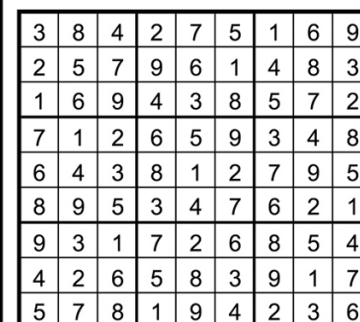

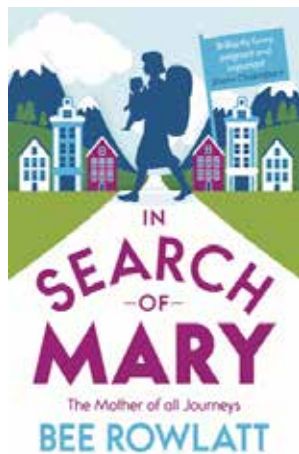
In Search of Mary: history's first feminist?

Exclusive interview with author Bee Rowlett and her journey to follow in Mary Wollstonecraft's footsteps

Rating: ★★★

"In Search of Mary has taken me around the world, meeting audiences from Glasgow to Moscow," says author Bee Rowlett. "People regularly say they can't believe they'd never heard of such an extraordinary and influential woman. As a student I had marvelled at her courage and pioneering spirit. But, now the inspiration lay in the fact that she travelled and wrote with a baby in tow. She was the world's first treasure-hunting, single-mum philosopher on the high seas."

Rowlett goes on many trips of self-discovery. She writes about her experiences



travelling with her son and compares it to Wollstonecraft's travels with her child. Critical of herself, Rowlett compares her life to others who are less fortunate. She takes the same journeys and some trips that Wollstonecraft never got to take. Rowlett gains insights into her own life and a deeper appreciation of her family.

Wollstonecraft is considered to be one of history's leading proto-feminists. She caused something of a scandal in the 18th century as a woman

travelling without male protection. An early advocate of women's rights, Wollstonecraft travelled with her maid and her baby daughter to Scandinavia and authored *A Vindication of the Rights of Women* and *Letters Written During a Short Residence in Sweden, Norway and Denmark*. The book became a bestseller, an inspiration for Romantic writers and poets. But she suffered terribly after moving to Paris by falling in love with the rakish Gilbert Imlay, who betrayed her repeatedly.

Rowlett's book begins with Bee Rowlett feeling in a rut. Happily married and a mother of four, she talks to her husband about going on a journey to find herself. She will take the same journey that Wollstonecraft took and with her youngest, who is about the same age of Wollstonecraft's baby. Rowlett travels first to Sweden, Norway and Denmark.

Rowlett has a

wonderful time with her son Will on her trip, and plans two more, one to Paris and then to California in search of herself and her feminism.

"Several years ago I rediscovered my old copy of Mary Wollstonecraft's 1796 travel book *Letters from Norway*," says Rowlett. "So, I took up the challenge to recreate her travels."

Rowlett read all she could about Wollstonecraft's life and legacy. "I found a lot of help in the brilliant biographical writings of Lyndall Gordon and Charlotte Gordon...no relation. I combined this with actually going to the places that she wrote about, and trying to channel her words and her feelings in the same locations. I'm a journalist not an academic, and my goal was to bring Wollstonecraft to new audiences and make her more accessible to the reader. Perhaps the most ridiculous part of this

was to attempt to retrace her footsteps with my own baby. That took the adventure to a whole new level."

Rowlett co-wrote the best-seller *Talking about Jane Austen in Baghdad* which was dramatized by the BBC. She's regular feature writer for the BBC and other print media. She's published in the Virago anthology, *Fifty Shades of Feminism*. *In Search of Mary* was recently awarded the UK Real Life Reads 2016 prize.

Adrian Sington is Rowlett's agent. "I love her voice," says Sington. "It's funny, observational and intelligent. When I met her a first thought was that I could sell her first book, which I did to Penguin."

"It's been a huge joy to see Mary Wollstonecraft finding so many new friends," says Rowlett. "I'm part of a campaign to promote her legacy and raise a statue of her in London, where over 9 out of 10 statues are of

men."

Rowlett is currently in the early stages of writing a novel, plus doing her usual BBC journalism.

She lives in London, and is currently based in New Delhi, India, where her husband is the BBC's correspondent for the region. She was born in Yorkshire.

Henry Cavill may be Superman, but IRL (in real life), he's just a regular guy - albeit, a very, very in shape regular guy...

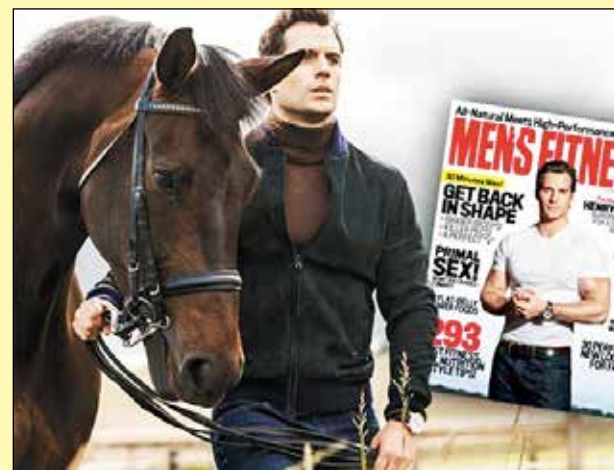

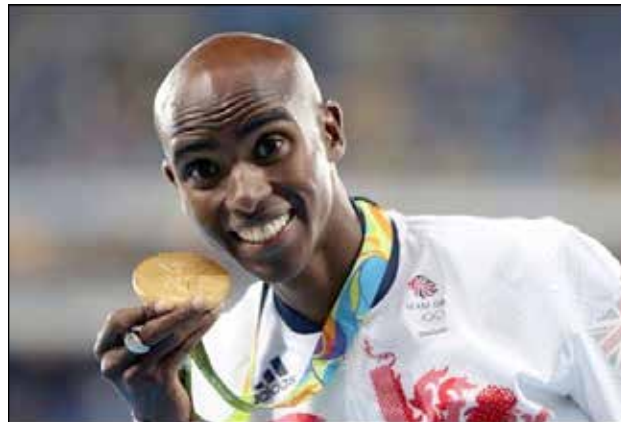

Benteke moves to Palace

Crystal Palace have reached an agreement with Liverpool to sign Belgium striker Christian Benteke for an initial £27m fee.

The 25-year-old travelling to London on Thursday to have a medical and finalise terms.

Benteke, who joined the Reds for £32.5m in July 2015, would be Palace's record signing, with the deal potentially rising above £30m with add-ons.

Winger Andros Townsend was the Eagles' previous record signing, having joined from Newcastle for £13m in July.

Palace had an offer worth £23m up front, plus £7m add-ons, for Benteke rejected on Tuesday.

GB GOLD RUSH!

■ Stunning week in Rio leaves British team eyeing historic medal tally - again!

THE BRITISH OLYMPIC team have enjoyed another golden week in Rio, notching one astonishing success after another to leave them perched in **SECOND** place in the table at press time, having amassed a jaw-dropping 55 medals.

The official target in Rio was 48 medals, one more than its previous best at an overseas Olympics, in Beijing in 2008. But British athletes passed that target in the middle of the week, and set themselves the more ambitious target of bettering the 65 medals they won in London in 2012.

Sunday went down in history Britain's best-ever day at the Games, even eclipsing the memories of 'Super Saturday' in London four summers ago when Team GB won three gold medals in an hour. This time round, the team romped home to five gold medals and three silvers, with victories for gymnast **Max Whitlock**, who won gold in both the men's pommel horse and men's floor event, **Mo Farah**, who survived a tumble on the track to get a gold in the 10,000m, **Justin Rose** in the golf and **Andy Murray** in the men's tennis.

And the success continued as the week wore on, with Britain enjoying gold and silver in the triathlon courtesy of the Brownlee brothers, Alistair grabbing the gold ahead of brother Jonny, while compatriots **Hannah Mills** and **Saskia Clark** triumphed in the 470 dinghy sailing.

Victory for **Alistair Brownlee** meant the 28-year-old became the first athlete to win successive Olympic triathlon titles, while brother Jonny, 26, improved on the bronze medal he won at London

2012.

The Yorkshiremen were close throughout the swim and cycle stages before Alistair pulled away halfway through the 10km run and finished six seconds ahead.

He said: "I was pretty confident we would get first and second but I didn't know which way round it would be."

'best feeling ever'

Mills and Clark needed only to finish Thursday's medal race to win gold in the women's 470 sailing event.

They duly did so - finishing eighth to improve on the silver medal they won at London 2012.

"I can't believe it," Mills said. "It has actually been the best feeling ever."

"We have forgotten all about London. We are so proud to come back after it and we've worked so hard to get the upgrade to gold."

Liam Heath and Jon Schofield won silver in the men's 200m kayak double while Marcus Ellis and Chris Langridge took bronze in the badminton men's doubles.

Elsewhere, Nicola Adams reached the women's flyweight final as she attempts to become the first British boxer to retain an Olympic title for 92 years.

Great Britain's **Justin Rose** became golf's first Olympic champion since 1904 by seeing off Henrik Stenson in a thrilling final round at Rio 2016.

Rose, 36, was level with Stenson on 15 under par

after 17 holes but the Swede bogeyed the last while Rose sank a birdie putt to win by two shots.

The 2013 US Open champion hit a four-under-par 67 to win on 16 under.

"That felt better than anything I've ever won," said Rose.

"It was the best tournament I've ever done. Hopefully we've shown Brazil what golf is about. I'm glad it was close. Not for my nerves, for golf."

Andy Murray made history on Sunday by beating Juan Martin del Potro to become the first ever tennis player to win two Olympic singles gold medals.

Defending Olympic champion Murray overcame Del Porto in Rio de Janeiro in a four-set thriller to cap a stunning 2016 in which he has also won Wimbledon title and finished runner-up in two other Grand Slams.

Gymnast **Max Whitlock** made history after being crowned a double Olympic champion in Rio.

Max, 23, had already made history when he became the first British gymnast to medal in the men's all-round competition, earning a bronze.

However, he surpassed this achievement with two fantastic routines within a couple of hours of each other - first on the floor, and then edging out teammate Louis Smith on the pommel horse.
