# FREEZING BRITAIN!

- Bitter polar air to bring coldest winter for more than FIVE YEARS
- First named storm of winter season brings misery to thousands

**BRITAIN is expected to freeze in the coldest winter for more than five years with unusually low temperatures forecast until February.**

Subtle atmospheric changes will open the floodgates for bitter Polar air to sweep across the country in the coming weeks, according to long range forecasters.

Weathermen have so far struggled on a definitive long-range outlook but now agree this winter could buck the trend of the past few years.

They say temperatures are largely likely to remain below-average for the next three months blaming a "weak Polar vortex" for an imminent freeze.

## Arctic region

Last weekend brought the coldest night of autumn so far after thermometers plunged to -9.8C as Loch Glascarnoch, in the Scottish highlands.

The Polar vortex describes a huge region of cold air which circulates around the Arctic region usually remaining far north of the UK.

When this weakens air sinks southwards towards northern Europe triggering a cold

snap or longer period of winter weather.

It can also give rise to Sudden Stratospheric Warming (SSW) which sparks a change in wind direction high up in the atmosphere driving the cold weather.

## big freeze

The chilly forecasts come after a run of mild winters with Britain escaping a proper big freeze since the last one in 2010/2011, when swathes of the country were crippled by heavy snowfall and record low temperatures with December turning out to be the coldest for a century.

Subsequent years have been unusually mild dominated by storms and floods rather than snow and ice.

The current outlooks come after an largely settled autumn shaken up only with the arrival of Storm Angus at the weekend.

The Storm unleashed near 100mph winds while torrential downpours saw inches of rain fall in a matter of hours.

The cold started to bite

earlier this month with heavy wintry showers leaving northern parts of the country under snow.

## 'exceptional cold'

Experts say this year will be the one to watch as things shape up to be exceptionally cold and snowy with even the chance of a White Christmas.

Exacta Weather forecaster James Madden said the first real taste of winter could be just a few weeks away.

He said: "There is the

risk of a snow event during the final part of November and early December in some parts to the north of the country to start the meteorological winter.

"This will then pave the way for exceptional cold and snowfall in December particularly during the second half of the month.

"It is plausible on our current indications that temperatures will fall suddenly and significantly within this period."

## Storm Angus leaves two dead

**A woman has died after being swept out to sea as strong winds and flooding took hold in many parts of the country on Tuesday.**

A rescue operation for the 39-year-old woman began in Folkestone at 6.45am but Kent police said that she had "sadly passed away despite efforts from emergency services".

The woman was the first known victim of

so-called Storm Angus, the first named storm of this winter season. But another victim confirmed later after search teams failed to find Russell Sherwood, 69, from Cilfrew, South Glamorgan, who left his home on Sunday to drive to Bridgend. Police found his car in the flooded River Ogmore.

passengers and 59 crew spent Monday night on the Irish Sea because it could not dock at Fishguard, Pembrokeshire. Several passengers said that they would never travel by boat again after 26 hours at sea.

Network Rail warned of disruption to many routes, with 16 flood warnings and 102 flood alerts across England and Wales. Flooding fully or partly shut lines running to Exeter St David's and Taunton, between Shrewsbury and Hereford, and the Vale of Glamorgan line to Cardiff airport. There was also disruption between Liskeard and Looe in the southwest and between Newcastle and Berwick-upon-Tweed. The main

rail line to the southwest was washed away in several places.

Parts of Greater Manchester were still under water at press time. In Stalybridge, one of the worst affected areas, two couples were rescued from their homes. Two people were rescued after seven vehicles got stuck

in floods that washed 600 tonnes of gravel down a hill near Whitby, North Yorkshire.

The worst of the weather is now likely to have passed but forecasters are warning of another atrocious winter with frigid temperatures likely to be the norm until the end of February.

## Life term for MP's killer

A Neo-Nazi white supremacist who brutally killed MP Jo Cox while chanting "Britain First" has been jailed for the rest of his life after being found guilty of her murder.

Hitler-obsessed Thomas Mair, 53, shot the 41-year-old mother-of-two three times with a sawn-off rifle and stabbed her 15 times with a British special forces-replica dagger in an ambush outside her

constituency surgery in the quiet village of Birstall, West Yorkshire.

Mr Justice Wilkie handed Mair a whole life sentence for the murder due to the crime's exceptional seriousness.

The murder took place on June 16, just a week before the EU referendum following a bitterly-fought campaign in which Ms Cox had been a vocal Remain supporter.

# Whitehall to DC: we'll choose our own ambassadors, thanks

DONALD TRUMP's outspoken support for Brexit campaigner Nigel Farage to be made British ambassador to Washington, has been politely batted back by Westminster, in a statement that noted pointedly that there is no vacancy for the job.

Trump, who after his election victory met Farage before any EU leaders, said on Twitter that "many people" would like to see the former metals trader turned politician as Britain's ambassador.

"Many people would like to see @Nigel\_Farage represent Great Britain as their Ambassador to the United States. He would do a great job!" Trump said.

### 'no vacancy'

Prime Minister Theresa May, who congratulated Trump on his victory, was swift to reject such an undiplomatic proposal, with a spokesman saying Britain already had an excellent ambassador to Washington and that London would appoint its own envoys.

"We have first rate ambassador in Washington," Foreign Secretary Boris Johnson, who campaigned for Brexit, told the British parliament. "There is no vacancy for that position."

It is highly unusual in the modern era for leaders to publicly suggest to foreign nations whom they would like to see as ambassador, though during strained relations they sometimes reject or expel envoys.

Trump's suggestion provoked anger, support and even hilarity in Britain, with Conservative MP Simon Burns, joking that perhaps Britain should suggest Hillary Clinton as its preferred choice as ambassador to London.

But the apparent public suggestion about who to appoint as ambassador by the man who will lead Britain's most powerful ally puts Prime Minister May in a difficult position just as she tries to build ties with Washington ahead of leaving the EU.

London is trying to gauge whether Trump would support a special trade deal with Britain as it negotiates the complexities of Brexit.

Farage has repeatedly angered EU leaders by

predicting the collapse of the EU, which he says is run by an out-of-touch elite of "idiots".

Farage said Trump's suggestion that he serve as ambassador had come "like a bolt from the blue" but Trump understood loyalty in a way that those in the "cesspit" of career politics did not.

"I am in a good position with the President-elect's support to help. The world has changed and it's time that Downing Street did too," Farage said in an article written for the Breitbart news website.

But Trump's promotion of Farage provoked predictable anger among MPs.

"Many people think you should mind your own business and talk about pussy-grabbing less, but hey, life is a constant disappointment," Labour MP Jess Phillips said on Twitter in a reference to Trump's previous vulgar comments about groping women.

# Using the NHS? Get your passports out!

- Cash-strapped Health Service desperate to recover unreimbursed costs
- Over £500m slated to be lost serving overseas patients in 2017

Patients may have to bring two forms of ID, including a passport, to hospitals because the NHS is failing to recover millions of pounds spent on treating people from abroad each year, the Department of Health's top civil servant said on Tuesday.

Senior health officials admitted that they were "light years away" from securing the £500 million predicted to be spent on overseas patients next year. Some hospital

trusts recovered less than a sixth of what is owed.

Chris Wormald, permanent secretary at the health department, said that it was now looking to hospital trusts that had employed a more radical approach to ensuring their money was repaid.

"We have seen trusts who are looking at more radical approaches. We do have some trusts which are now, either for some services or more generally, asking for

two forms of ID before treatment," Mr Wormald told the public accounts committee.

"Now that is obviously a controversial thing to do, but in terms of how do you get the numbers up, these are the kind of things we are looking at."

He added that these trusts noted an increase in the identification of foreign patients who should be charged. Mr Wormald said that passport checks were already taking

place at one hospital in Peterborough that has a high number of immigrants.

## 'controversial thing'

"Individual trusts are doing that and it is making a big difference: they are saying please come with two forms of identity, your passport and your address, and they use that to check whether people are eligible.

"It's quite a controversial thing to do, to say to the entire population you've got to prove your identity," he said.

Peterborough and Stamford Hospitals NHS Trust covers an area that has received a large number of eastern European immigrants in recent years.

The move comes after plans by St George's

Hospital in south London to introduce mandatory passport checks in maternity wards for non-urgent patients as accounts revealed that the trust was losing £5 million each year treating overseas patients. A failure of hospital staff to identify patients means that the NHS invoices for £295 million of the £500 million owed in foreign debts next year, a National Audit Office report shows.

Health officials are accused of allowing political correctness to plunge the NHS into further debt.

"The taxpayer is being taken for a ride not by tourists but by the political correctness and non-charging culture," the Conservative MP Charlie Elphicke said. Last year Homerton University Hospital in

London billed £830,000 for treatments of overseas patients but only £127,000 has been repaid, the committee heard.

Meg Hillier, the committee chairman, said that she was concerned that some British residents might struggle to find the appropriate identification. This was echoed by the head of the British Medical Association, Mark Porter, who said the proposal would save relatively little money at great inconvenience.

"This is little other than a pinprick on the top of the actual problems facing the NHS," he told Today on BBC Radio 4 this morning.

"I think we have mechanisms in place that if used properly will work, rather than having to introduce new ones that apply to everybody."

## Big name tax evaders facing financial ruin

- As many as 700 of the 780 involved could be made bankrupt

Hundreds of celebrities could face 'financial ruin' after the taxman ordered them to repay up to 20 times of what they invested in a massive avoidance scheme.

Former Manchester United manager Sir Alex Ferguson and ex-England boss Sven Goran Eriksson are among the 780 investors spread across 39 partnerships.

Businessmen poured £2.2billion into the film investment schemes, with Revenues & Customs informing advisers it would be demanding sums far in excess of those invested.

The scheme enabled investors to avoid paying tax to the government through buying and renting back Hollywood blockbuster movies to film studios.

Nick Wood, an adviser for hundreds of investors in the Eclipse 35 partnership, told *The Times*: 'I think there will be people potentially jumping off bridges.

'My expectation is, out the 780 people involved, I'd think it highly likely that up to 600-700 would go bankrupt.'

### tax avoidance scheme

An investor to the scheme who stumped up £200,000, for example, could be expected to pay back somewhere between £2million and

£4million.

Revenue & Customs are expected to dish out demands to those involved in the next two months, with recipients given 90 days to pay.

Other big names to invest in the schemes are former England footballer Glenn Hoddle and Sir Peter Davis, who served as chairman of Sainsbury's.

Eclipse 35, one of the 39 partnerships, was deemed a tax avoidance scheme by the Supreme Court back in April.

In order to boost investment in the British film industry, tax breaks were introduced in 1997, leading to £500million investment in UK-based productions by 2000.

However the tax reliefs have been exploited by big money investors who were advised they could shelter their income by pouring money into the industry.

There was no suggestion that the schemes were illegal.

# Low fares to no fares... airline plans free flights

It has long flown the flag for cheaper air travel, but Europe's busiest airline is planning for the day when it doesn't charge its passengers anything at all — and if it has its way, that could be in only five years' time.

Michael O'Leary, chief executive of Ryanair, said on Monday that he was considering moving from low fares to no fares for many travellers as a way of increasing passenger numbers. In return, he argued, airports should share revenues from their retail operations.

He described airports as little more than "shopping malls" and insisted that they should

pay airlines that bring in the greatest number of travellers.

Speaking at the Airport Operators Association conference in London, he said the increasingly attractive deals being offered to his airline by European airports, as well as the possible reduction or abolition of taxes such as air passenger duty (APD), would eventually allow his airline to give away flights.

## 'big traffic growth'

He said: "The challenge for us in the future is to keep driving air fares down. I have this vision that in the next five to 10 years that the air fares on Ryanair will

be free, in which case the flights will be full, and we will be making our money out of sharing the airport revenues; of all the people who will be running through airports, and getting a share of the shopping and the retail revenues at airports."

The Irish airline expects to carry 119m passengers this year and is growing its aircraft fleet rapidly, with capacity to pass 200m by 2024. Most of that growth, O'Leary said, would come from "taking price sensitive passengers off incumbents like Air Berlin in Germany, Lot in Poland and Alitalia in Italy".

He added: "I think it will happen. It just won't happen at Heathrow or those big hub airports. But most of the other airports who are looking for big traffic growth, that process is already starting to happen, lowering airport fees and some of the charges."

O'Leary said: "If [air

passenger duty] is gone: at many airports I'm paying more than £20 already with APD and fees, if I start getting that back, why not? I'm doing seat sales this week at £4 and I'm paying the £13 APD — I'm paying you to fly with me.

"Instead of promotional tickets

being £9 or £5 they will be free."

Average fares on Ryanair last year were €46 (£39), including one checked bag, and Ryanair has said they will fall by 10% to 15% this year. About a quarter of the airlines's income is from add-ons such as car hire and inflight sales.

# New deal eases Brexit fears for British expats

## ■ 'Reciprocal Rights' agreement allows Brits in EU to stay put

Hundreds of thousands of British expats are set to be granted the right to carry on living on the Continent after Brexit after the majority of European Union countries signalled they were ready to do a "reciprocal rights" deal with the UK.

Senior Government figures have told business leaders that only "a few" of the 27 EU member states are left to agree the outline of a reciprocal rights agreement for Britons in the EU, and EU nationals living in the UK for when Britain leaves the

EU.

The Government said no deals had yet been struck, but the closeness of an informal understanding is leading to speculation that any deal will be announced at a key EU summit in Brussels next month.

It came as Michel

Barnier, the EU's chief Brexit negotiator, delivered a significant rebuke to David Davis, the Secretary of State for Exiting the European Union, following their first meeting.

Mr Davis on Monday travelled to Brussels in a bid to help "lay the groundwork" for negotiations before Britain formally triggers Brexit.

However in the wake of the meeting, Mr Barnier, who previously suggested that negotiations should be conducted in French, said it had been a "courtesy visit" which was "at his request".

He said: "No negotiation without notification. My work is now focused on EU27 [countries]."

There are an estimated 3.3million EU nationals living in Britain, and roughly 1.2million Britons living in the 27 other EU member states.

Poland has the most EU nationals living in the UK — 883,000 — followed by Germany — 297,000 — and Romania — 229,000

The EU countries with the most Britons living there are Spain (309,000),

Ireland (255,000) and France (185,000).

Theresa May has refused to say if the rights of EU nationals in Britain will be guaranteed after Brexit, because of concerns that it might damage the UK's negotiating position.

However, twice in the past week she stressed that a deal guaranteeing the rights of EU nationals to remain in the UK after Brexit will be struck quickly.

Mrs May told business leaders at the CBI on Monday: "I want an early agreement on the status of UK nationals in Europe and EU nationals here, so that you and they can plan with certainty."

Westminster sources said Mrs May had raised the issue of reciprocal rights for Britons overseas and EU nationals in this country in her talks with other leaders in recent months.

Earlier this month Lord Bridges, a minister in the Exiting the European Union department, left open the possibility that informal agreements had been struck with other EU countries.

The minister was asked by Lord Green of Deddington, the chairman of MigrationWatch, which other EU governments had "publicly indicated that the existing rights of British citizens resident in their territory will be preserved after the UK has left the EU".

Lord Bridges replied: "We are not aware of any member state reaching a formal view on this issue."

"At every step of these negotiations we will work to ensure the best possible outcome for the people of the United Kingdom."

Geoffrey Clifton-Brown MP, parliamentary adviser to Conservatives Abroad which has campaigned on voting rights for expats, said suggestions that a deal is close was "fantastic news for them, their family and friends".

He said: "It will allay a great deal of anxiety. It is only right that Europeans who are legally here and doing a good job of work for this country should also have the reassurance they can stay as well."

Madonna's teenage son Rocco Ritchie has been arrested in a drugs bust.

Rocco was caught in possession of cannabis after neighbours reportedly called police on the troubled teen.

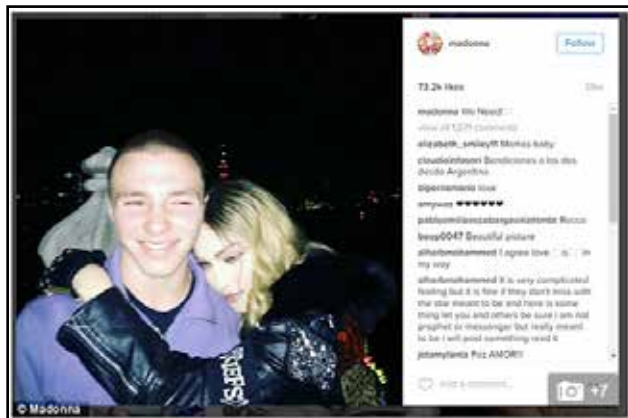
The 16-year-old, whose father is director Guy Ritchie, was seen 'smoking or doing drugs' near his Primrose Hill home in North London.

Sources told the Sun that Rocco was seen tossing something away as police approached him in Steeles Mews North, Camden.

When officers noticed traces of cannabis on his clothes they searched him and found a small quantity of the drug.

He was arrested on September 28, taken to a north London police station and later bailed.

A police spokesman

## 'engage and educate'

'The arrest follows a stop and search by officers from Camden borough at around 5.15pm on Wednesday, September 28 at Steeles Mews North.

'The youth was taken to a north London police station. He was subsequently bailed and dealt with by Camden borough's Youth Offending Team.

'He was dealt with by way of Triage, which uses multiple strands to engage and educate young people in order to prevent re-offending.'

Earlier this year the teenage was at the centre of a bitter custody dispute between his director father and pop icon mother.

## 'way too permissive'

The disagreement began in December 2015 during a falling out between Rocco and his musician mother when he abandoned her Rebel Hearts tour.

He refused to travel with his mother and

she launched legal action in the US and UK demanding custody of her son.

Guy Ritchie's lawyers argued Rocco was settled in school in London and, in September, he won the bitter nine-month battle over where their son should live.

The Sherlock Holmes director reached a settlement with the pop star hours before they were due in court in New York and it was

agreed the teenager would continue to live in London.

Website TMZ claimed that Madonna thought Guy 'had poisoned her son against her' and, 'as the disciplinarian [parent], she felt Guy was way too permissive'.

The terms of the custody agreement remain confidential, but it is understood Rocco is schooled in London, with regular visits from his mother.

## £369m redo for Buck House

Buckingham Palace is to undergo a 10-year refurbishment costing the taxpayer £369m, the Treasury has announced.

The Queen will remain in residence during the work, to begin next April.

Ageing cables, lead pipes, wiring and boilers will be replaced, many for the first time in 60 years, amid fears about potential fire and water damage.

Tony Johnstone-Burt, Master of the Queen's Household, said phased works offered the "best value for money" while keeping the palace running.

The Royal Trustees, who include the prime minister and chancellor, recommended that the works be funded by a temporary increase in the Sovereign Grant.

Profits from the independent property business Crown Estates go to the Treasury, which in turn gives 15% of the

sum to the monarch in the form of the Sovereign Grant, which this year totalled nearly £43m.

The trustees say the grant should rise to 25% of the profits for the repairs. This would require MPs' approval.

Away from the splendour of the state rooms, Buckingham Palace shows its age.

It is striking while walking through the back corridors that the overall look is a little shabby. The refurbishment is clearly long overdue and it appears the building is now at risk from electrics, plumbing and heating barely updated since the 1950s.

One royal observer commented: "Questions will be asked over why the palace has been allowed to get to such a state and whether the enormous estimated costs could have been reduced if services had been regularly updated."

## Shocker! Only one in eight think UK is best place to live

ONLY one Briton in eight believes the UK is the best country in the world, an international survey claims.

The table was topped by the USA, where 41 per cent say they live in the world's greatest country.

In the national pride rankings, the UK came behind India, Australia, Thailand, Saudi Arabia, the Philippines and Indonesia.

Bottom of the list was France, where four per cent said it was the world's worst country.

Only one per cent of Britons said the UK was the worst place to live.

Almost half of UK people questioned said globalization was a force for good, against one in five who thought the opposite.

Most other countries were more enthusiastic than Britain about globalization, with only

the USA and France recording less positive scores.

There was a close divide on immigration, with 32 per cent of Britons regarding it in a positive light and 29 per cent saying it had a negative impact.

But the British outlook was more positive than in many other nations.

In European countries, including Norway, Germany, Finland and Denmark, more people thought immigration was having a negative effect on their country than a

positive one.

In France the margin was more than three to one.

The YouGov poll involved 1,690 adults in the UK, as part of a survey involving more than 21,000 people from 19 countries.

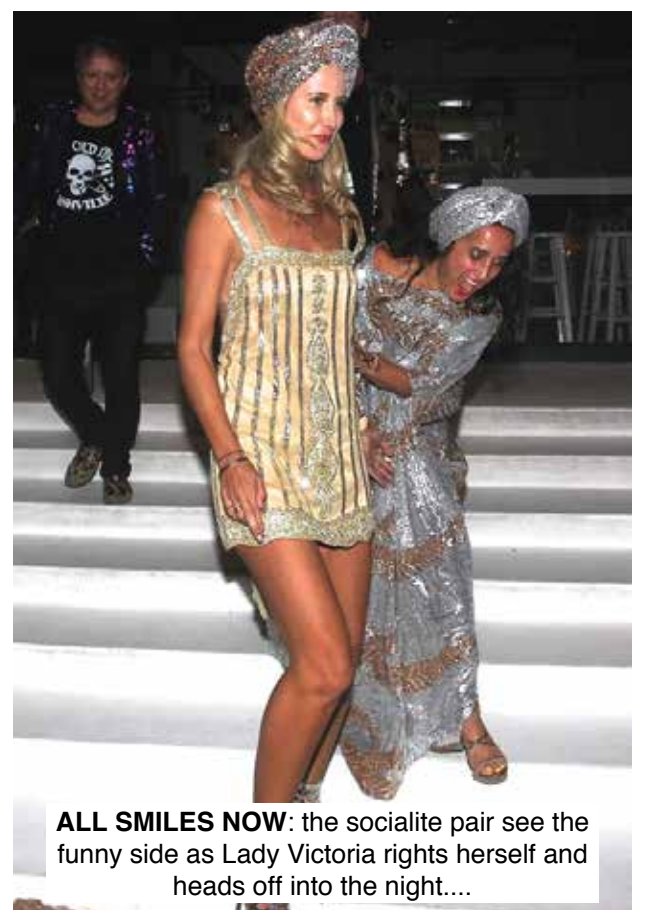

# SPURS: Monte Carlo and bust

■ **Spurs dumped out of Champions League as classy Monaco end their dreams**

**Champions League**  
AS Monaco.....2  
Tottenham H.....1

Tottenham were knocked out of the Champions League as they were comprehensively outclassed by Monaco at Stade Louis II on Tuesday night.

The narrowness of the result belied the superiority of the hosts, who missed an early penalty before Djibril Sidibe's header early in the second half sparked a stunning sequence of three goals in just five minutes.

Harry Kane's penalty, awarded when Dele Alli was pulled back, put Spurs on level terms but, just 39 seconds later, Monaco had the ball in the net again through Thomas Lemar.

Victory takes Monaco through to the last 16 as deserved winners

of Group E ahead of Bayer Leverkusen, who earlier drew 1-1 at CSKA Moscow.

Spurs, who have won just one of their five group matches, are three points behind Leverkusen with one game to play, against CSKA on 7 December, but cannot overhaul the German side because of an inferior head-to-head record.

Lloris saved a Radamel Falcao penalty in the first half, produced a truly world-class stop to keep out Kamil Glik's thumping first-time effort from a free-kick, and thwarted Falcao a second time after the break.

Spurs spurned the first clear chance of the match when Son Heung-min broke clear only to overrun the ball as he tried to round the goalkeeper, but from that moment there was only one team in it - and

only one man standing in their way.

The Ligue 1 title hopefuls cut through the Spurs midfield with ease, with full-backs Sidibe and Benjamin Mendy in particular a threat, peppering the visitors' area with crosses that tested the unfamiliar centre-back pairing of Kevin Wimmer and Eric Dier.

Lloris had saved heroically from both Mendy and Germain in the first half, but was left with no chance when the deadlock was broken just after the break, Monaco again working the ball with ease to the left flank, from where Mendy crossed for Sidibe to head in unmarked six yards out, although Wimmer should have stepped in to clear.

Kane's penalty four minutes later came out of the blue, the England striker scoring after Alli

was unceremoniously hauled down in the area after latching on to Kieran Trippier's hopeful long ball forward.

But Spurs could not defend their barely merited equaliser and

straight from kick-off Monaco were ahead once more, just four passes required as they worked the ball seamlessly into the area, where Lemar drilled low past Lloris.

Only a quite incredible

save from Lloris to keep out Glik's thunderous strike kept Monaco within touching distance, but a third goal - or indeed a fourth - would not have flattered Leonardo Jardim's hosts.

## ...but the Foxes ease through

Leicester City's remarkable debut Champions League campaign continued as they reached the knockout stages with one game to spare by beating Club Brugge on Tuesday night.

The Foxes needed a point to make the last 16, yet secured three to ensure they will finish top of Group G.

A smart finish into the top corner by Shinji Okazaki, after a fine cross by Christian Fuchs, set Claudio Ranieri's side on their way.

Riyad Mahrez doubled the lead from the penalty spot - for his fourth goal in five Champions League games - after Marc Albrighton was fouled by Dion Cools before

Jose Izquierdo hit a wonderful consolation after a 40-yard run.

Leicester were unrecognisable from the side who have struggled in the Premier League this season.

They are the second English team, after Arsenal, to secure a place in the draw for the knockout stages on 12 December.

## Second again for Gunners?

Arsenal face a struggle to finish top of their Champions League group after they were held to a draw by Paris St-Germain at Emirates Stadium Wednesday night.

The Gunners were seeking the win that would put them in pole position in Group A after years of finishing second

and six consecutive eliminations in the last 16 in the knockout phase.

And it looked like Arsenal were on their way despite going behind early on to Edinson Cavani's sliding finish from Blaise Matuidi's cross.

Olivier Giroud scored from a penalty just before half-time after

Grzegorz Krychowiak fouled Alexis Sanchez. And Arsenal were ahead on the hour when a penalty-box rebound struck Marco Verratti and flew in.

PSG were always dangerous and Lucas' header, which took a touch off Alex Iwobi, gave them a fully-deserved equaliser 13 minutes from time.
