# MAY READIES BRITAIN FOR ASSAULT ON SYRIA

■ Cabinet gets behind PM as Assad attack grows closer  
■ Tensions mount as US and Russia trade threats

**Cabinet ministers have agreed "on the need to take action" in Syria to "deter the further use of chemical weapons", Downing Street has said.**

Ministers agreed it was "highly likely" the Assad regime was responsible for a suspected chemical attack at a cabinet meeting lasting more than two hours.

They agreed that the use of chemical weapons must not "go unchallenged".

But Transport Minister Jo Johnson later stressed: "There has been no decision to take military action at this point."

No details of UK involvement in any military action in Syria were mentioned in the Downing Street statement.

And Mr Johnson, who was a guest on BBC One's Question Time, said: "I have to stress that no decision has been taken as to the nature of any action."

US President Donald Trump spoke to the prime minister on Thursday evening, and the pair agreed that President

Assad had "established a pattern of dangerous behaviour in relation to the use of chemical weapons".

A statement from Downing Street added: "They agreed to keep working closely together on the international response."

President Trump is also expected to speak to French President Emmanuel Macron later on Thursday about what form action could take, with the White House saying "no final decision has been made".

Sources say the PM is prepared to take action against the Assad regime without first seeking Parliamentary consent, but there have been calls from opposition parties and some Conservative MPs for Parliament to have a vote beforehand.

Labour leader Jeremy Corbyn said: "More bombing, more killing, more war will not save

life. It will just take more lives and spawn the war elsewhere."

Mrs May has said "all the indications" are that the Syrian regime of president Bashar al-Assad, which denies mounting a chemical attack, was responsible for the alleged attack in the formerly rebel-held town of Douma.

During a meeting called on Thursday to discuss the UK response, she described it as "shocking and barbaric" and said it was a "further example of the erosion of international law in relation to the use of chemical weapons, which was deeply concerning to us all".

Downing Street said the cabinet had "agreed it was vital that the use of chemical weapons did not go unchallenged" and "on the need to take action to alleviate humanitarian distress and to deter the further

use of chemical weapons by the Assad regime".

"Cabinet agreed the prime minister should continue to work with allies in the United States and France to coordinate an international response," the statement added.

Senior figures from Russia, which provides military support to the Syrian regime, have warned of a Russian response to a US attack.

On Tuesday President Donald Trump tweeted to warn Russia that a missile

attack on Syria "will be coming".

Mr Corbyn criticised the US president's rhetoric, saying: "I think the whole world should be alarmed at that sort of instant reaction - sending stuff out on social media to make policy."

In a subsequent tweet on Thursday, the US president said an attack on Syria "could be very soon or not so soon at all".

MPs are due to return to Westminster from the Easter recess on Monday. Brexit Secretary David

Davis, one of the MPs to oppose military action against President Assad when it was rejected by the Commons in 2013, said he was assured that evidence and intelligence, as well as a "proper plan", would be provided this time.

The SNP's Westminster leader, Ian Blackford, told the BBC a Parliamentary debate should take place before - rather than after - military action has taken place because Mrs May does not have a majority in the House of

# Good Friday agreement was 'a precious gift' says Clinton

■ Hailing 20th anniversary of historic agreement, former President urges leaders not to let peace slip away

Former US President Bill Clinton has said that the Good Friday Agreement was a "work of genius" and a "precious gift".

Speaking at a conference in Belfast to mark the 20th anniversary of the historic 1998 peace accord on Tuesday, he urged the people of Northern Ireland to "inspire" the world again.

The anniversary of the agreement was marked by a number of events in Northern Ireland this week.

Many of the people who were involved in the Good Friday Agreement negotiations were in Belfast, including Mr Ahern and former British prime minister Tony Blair.

The freedom of Belfast was awarded to Mr Clinton, and the chairman of the successful negotiations in 1998, former US Senator George Mitchell.

Mr Clinton said: "The Good Friday Agreement is the work of genius that's applicable if you care at all about preserving democracy.

"Because it called for a real democracy, majority rule, minority rights, individual rights, the rule of law, the end of violence, shared political decision-

making, shared economic benefits, shared special relations, maintained the relationship with the United Kingdom, expanded the relationship with the Irish Republic and then let the future take its course."

### 'profound mistake'

At an event in Queen's University, Mr Clinton shared an hour-long panel discussion with former British prime minister Tony Blair and former taoiseach Bertie Ahern - among the architects of the historic agreement.

He told an audience that included current political leaders, dignitaries and schoolchildren not to underestimate the work done by people of different persuasions.

"These people gave you a gift," he said.

Mr Blair described Brexit as a "profound mistake" and warned of challenging consequences.

He said: "Let me make it clear, we are going to overcome that challenge and we should overcome it because preserving this agreement is really, really important.

"But those people who are either disdainful of the challenge or dismissive, this is going to require

real focus and hard work because we cannot return to a hard border between north and south, it would be a disaster for the agreement and for the relationship between the Republic and the UK, and therefore for the people of Northern Ireland."

Mr Mitchell, former Downing Street chief of staff Jonathan Powell, former Sinn Féin president Gerry Adams and former Ulster Unionist leader David Trimble were also present at the event in Queen's University.

### 'changed history'

Earlier, Tánaiste (deputy Irish president) and Minister for Foreign Affairs Simon Coveney said that the Good Friday Agreement "changed history" between Irish and British relationships on the island of Ireland.

Speaking in Belfast, Mr Coveney said that Northern Ireland is a "changed place" and he urged current political leaders to "reinvigorate" efforts to find a solution to the Stormont impasse.

He added: "To find a way forward through the challenges that our generation now has, whether that is linked to Brexit, to devolved

government, whether it is linked to polarisation and challenges around reconciliation and legacy."

Meanwhile, Northern Ireland Secretary of State Karen Bradley said the signing of the Good Friday Agreement was a "momentous day" and she said progress must not be allowed to slip.

She said: "You cannot underestimate what has been achieved in Northern Ireland since that agreement was signed.

In relation to the current political impasse in Northern Ireland, Mr Ahern said both the British and Irish governments and the Stormont parties need to redouble their efforts and to focus on resolving the issue.

Speaking on RTÉ's Six One News, he said that the issues at the centre of

the stalemate are nothing near as serious as those that needed to be resolved for progress to be made 20 years ago.

### 'widespread fear'

Mr Ahern said that these matters should certainly be out of the way before summer, and that it might be a good idea to impose some sort of deadline for the parties to agree.

Meanwhile, Mr Mitchell said he warned the Northern Ireland parties at the time of the agreement of a return to violence if they failed to reach a deal and that peace still cannot be taken for granted.

In an interview with RTÉ's Morning Ireland, Mr Mitchell said there was a "widespread fear" that if the talks were to fail there would be an "imminent and massive resumption

of violence probably on a scale exceeding what had taken place in the previous quarter century".

He said he told the political leaders that "if you don't make an agreement now there's going to be violence ... and the only thing you will be remembered for is that you let peace slip out of your grasp".

Mr Mitchell said he was "a little premature to think that peace could be taken for granted in Northern Ireland and we have to be very, very careful".

He called for the restoration of power-sharing at Stormont, saying the "paramount objective must be to rekindle the spirit of the Good Friday Agreement and encourage resolution of political problems through democratic and peaceful means".

Commons.

Conservative MP Zac Goldsmith also called for Parliament to have its say before anything is agreed.

But Conservative MP Tom Tugendhat, who chairs the Commons Foreign Affairs Committee, told BBC Radio 4's Today programme that while "politically it may make sense", Mrs May did not need to ask for a vote.

He added that a "very targeted operation" at

Syrian chemical weapons stocks need not trigger a conflict with Russia.

Lib Dem leader Sir Vince Cable did not rule out backing military action but he said Parliament would have to give its approval, with

## Tory calls for chemical castration

The Ministry of Justice is reportedly looking at ways to dramatically increase the use of chemical castration on sex offenders and paedophiles.

releasing certain offenders from prison and back into society.

Dr Lee is keen to find an 'evidence-based approach' to returning prisoners to normal life and is aware that international studies have shown chemical

# May and Trump NOT invited to the big day

■ Couple sidestep controversy by announcing no politicians will be invited to upcoming nuptials

PRINCE HARRY and Meghan Markle have neatly sidestepped any headaches surrounding their wedding guest list by deciding not to invite ANY politicians.

The royal family are hoping to avoid any political scandals and the couple are also keen to prevent their nuptials being turned into a political football by those invited and those overlooked. According to one royal source, key to their decision was the potential minefield over inviting former US President Barack Obama – with whom Harry

enjoys a warm rapport - but not inviting the current occupant of the White House, Donald Trump. "The last thing Harry and Meghan want is for their wedding to be the subject of an early Sunday Twitter storm," said the source.

## intimate setting

The invitations were sent out this week to friends and relations around the world, and their couple's no politicians rule was confirmed by The Daily Mail's royal expert Rebecca English, who said in a series of

tweets that Barack and Michelle Obama won't be invited but also that no politicians have made the cut.

Kensington Palace said in a statement in English: "It has been decided that an official list of political leaders – both UK & international – is not required for Prince Harry and Ms. Markle's wedding. Her Majesty's Government was consulted on this decision, which was taken by The Royal Household." English added that this means that even Theresa May won't be showing up at

Windsor Castle on May 19.

Apart from the desire to avoid controversy, Windsor Castle only comfortably fits 800 people, so the couple are

going to need to keep their nuptials intimate as far as a royal wedding goes. On the other hand, because Prince Harry is soon-to-be sixth in line to the throne when Kate

Middleton gives birth this month, his wedding is not considered a state occasion like his father or brother's, who are first and second in line to the throne respectively.

## Nothern Ireland trio among surprise wedding invitees

A former soldier from Ballymena and a mother and daughter from Londonderry have been invited to the wedding of Prince Harry and Meghan Markle.

They will be among the 1,200 members of the public allowed into the grounds of Windsor Castle on 19 May.

Philip Gillespie, 30, lost a leg in a bomb in Afghanistan and now raises funds for an Army charity.

Catherine Cooke, 53, and Julie-Ann Coll, 35, also received invites because of their charity work.

Mrs Cooke is a co-ordinator at the Foyle Women's Information Network, while Mrs Coll runs a support group for parents dealing with child bereavement.

They received separate invites about 90 minutes apart and Mrs Cooke said she could not believe it when the postman arrived with the news.

She said her husband, who will be on a stag do in Krakow that weekend, was "devastated" that he

could not attend, adding that she will take another daughter Stephanie to the big day instead.

Mrs Coll was nominated to attend for her work with child bereavement support group Life After Loss, having lost her son Mark in 2004 at 22 weeks old.

She will be accompanied by her mother-in-law Marcia Coll.

"I'm just over the moon but I can't picture myself being there to be honest," she said. "I'm just so excited."

Mr Gillespie, who is involved with ABF The Soldiers' Charity, recently took part in rowing and

archery trials for the next Invictus Games.

Prince Harry founded the Paralympic-style competition for wounded service men and women and veterans in 2014.

Mr Gillespie said it was a "massive privilege" to be invited to what will be a "huge spectacle".

The ex-Royal Irish Regiment soldier said he had not told many people yet but expected his friends' reaction to be muted, compared to the feedback his girlfriend Kirsty Crawford was getting.

"I think Kirsty has got more of a reaction, I think it is more of a girl thing," he said.

# Nobody speaks for us, insists Skripal daughter

■ Poisoning victim recovering fast, amid plans to move the pair to live in US under new identities

Yulia Skripal has hit back at 'false information' circulated about her and her father to say that no one spoke for them but themselves.

The tough public statement was her first since she and Sergei Skripal, the former Russian double agent, were poisoned with a nerve agent in an attack blamed on Moscow. Released by the Metropolitan Police, it addressed her cousin Viktoria, who lives in Russia. A recording of a phone call between the cousins was released to Russian media.

The British authorities blocked a request for the cousin, 45, to receive a visa to travel to Britain. Ms Skripal asked her cousin to stay away and not to contact her for now. She also confirmed that she did not want to accept the offer of consular assistance from the Russian embassy, while thanking Russian officials for their offer of support.

Ms Skripal, 33, who was released from Salisbury district hospital on

Monday and is now in a safe location, supported by the police, said her father was still seriously ill and she was still suffering from the effects of the poison.

## trespassing 'journalists'

"I want to stress that no one speaks for me, or for my father, but ourselves. I thank my cousin Viktoria for her concern for us, but ask that she does not visit me or try to contact me for the time being," she said.

"Her opinions and assertions are not mine and they are not my father's."

Her statement came after two Russian journalists were caught trespassing early Tuesday at the hospital where Mr Skripal is still being treated.

The television reporter and his cameraman entered without permission and ambushed two medical staff with the camera rolling to ask about him. Hospital security told the journalists, who work for REN TV, a Russian television channel, to stop filming and threw them out. The pair were asked to delete their footage but managed to retrieve it



and later posted it online. A hospital spokesman described their conduct as "appalling".

British officials believe that much of Russia's media show state-controlled propaganda as part of an information war. REN TV is controlled by National Media Group, the biggest private pro-Kremlin media holding in Russia.

"This footage shows appalling behaviour on the part of these Russian journalists, approaching staff in the middle of the night with no warning and without asking for any permission," the

hospital spokesman said. "We would like to reiterate that any attempt to harass, intimidate or cause distress to any of our staff or patients is absolutely unacceptable and will not be tolerated."

Journalists are expected to gain permission from a hospital before entering for the purposes of work, and before interviewing staff and patients.

REN TV accompanied its online footage with an article complaining that it had been "attacked" in articles by UK media who called its journalists' "visit" to the hospital a "storming".

Sergei Naryshkin, head of Russia's foreign intelligence service, said on Tuesday that only three of the 152 Russian diplomats kicked out by foreign states in the wake of the Skripal poisoning were under his command. He claimed that the ejection of his officers was "an act directly aiding and abetting international terrorism". Britain and its allies said that the ejected envoys were spies working under diplomatic cover. Theresa May described the 23 Russia diplomats sent home as "undeclared intelligence agents".

# Instant fines mooted for air rage flyers

Drunk passengers could be hit with on-the-spot fines for causing trouble on planes as part of a crackdown against air rage.

The government is considering a series of options to deter abusive and violent travellers on flights. This could include the introduction of a system of instant penalties up to hundreds of pounds.

A new aviation strategy published by the Department for Transport suggested that all alcohol bought from duty free shops could be placed in sealed bags so that passengers cannot drink it on the plane.

The suggestions come after the publication of

figures from the Civil Aviation Authority showing that 417 flights were endangered by abusive and violent travellers last year - more than double the total five years ago. Airlines say that the true number of incidents may be far higher as only the most serious cases are logged by the CAA.

At present, passengers found to be drunk on an aircraft can be taken to court for breaching air navigation orders, with the possibility of a £5,000 fine and two years in jail.

The aviation strategy said that the government was considering "tougher measures such as introducing stronger

penalties" to act as a bigger deterrent.

Ministers are also investigating the possibility of instant fixed penalties which can be levied by police officers in the airport without having to go through the courts. These would be modelled on penalties introduced in other countries such as Germany, whose civil aviation authority, the Luftfahrt Bundesamt, can issue fines for disruption.

Last month, a passenger was taken off an easyJet flight at Tegel airport in Berlin for drinking a bottle of vodka on a plane and abusing other passengers before being handed a €528 (£460) fixed penalty by officers based at the

airport.

Other measures being considered by the government include bringing airside bars within the scope of the Licensing Act 2003 for the first time. This would give councils the power to license and inspect bars in airports, restricting the timing of alcohol sales and potentially shutting them down.

Last month an Easyjet flight from Manchester to Paphos in Cyprus was diverted to offload four women after a group was drinking, swearing and threatening passengers. In August a mid-air brawl involving men and women broke out on a Ryanair flight from

Newcastle to Alicante in Spain.

Baroness Sugg, the aviation minister, said: "Disruptive behaviour can ruin flights for both passengers and crew. Airports and airlines have made good progress in addressing this behaviour, but with incidents on the rise we want to examine

the existing prevention work and penalties to see what more can be done.

"We will use our recently published document to work with the aviation industry to tackle this issue so that passengers can enjoy their flights without being affected by the unacceptable behaviour of a small minority."

**MOUNTED** police patrolled in pensioner Richard Osborn-Brooks's neighbourhood this week as tensions continued to mount over a shrine to the burglar he stabbed to death.

The police joined patrol cars after residents clashed with the grieving family of serial villain Henry Vincent. Neighbours of Mr Osborn-Brooks repeatedly tore down flowers, messages and balloons posted on a garden fence opposite his burgled house.

One 29-year-old man who cut down the memorials said: "If those scum came at me I'd get a screwdriver and do what Richard did."

But the Vincent clan – who are part of a traveller community – hit back, branding the 78-year-old householder a "lowlife" and demanding he apologize for killing the armed intruder.

The flare-up came as Mr Osborn-Brooks and his wife Maureen remained at a police safe house after last week's drama at his south-east London home. Vincent's aunt attacked the retired RAC office manager, saying: "He's got no remorse. Have you

ever heard that man say, 'I'm sorry for his kids?'"

The aunt, who declined to give her name, defended her nephew and his accomplice who broke into Mr Osborn-Brooks's home, saying: "They shouldn't have been there, fair enough, but somebody has actually died here and they have left a family of three little daughters.

"There's burglaries every five minutes and I don't see anybody else getting condemned. Why rip all his flowers down? Why do that?"

Another family member said: "He did not hurt the old man and he did not hurt the old woman, and they never had intentions to do that.

"Yes, they've gone there to get a bit of money and they had no rights to be in the old man's place. I will say that the old man did have rights to stick up for himself but he has killed him. So why are people going and taking all his flowers and chucking them away?"

#### memorial

The memorial sprang up on Monday near the spot where Vincent bled to death in Hither Green, after fleeing from Mr

It comes after the scandal surrounding convicted rapist John Worboys, who was due for release by a parole board until the High Court overturned their decision.

Worboys was on an indeterminate sentence, a status that applies to over a thousand other inmates who will soon be due for parole.

# Tit-for-tat battle at the burglar shrine

## Family tributes torn down then put back up

Osborn-Brooks's home. Mr Osborn-Brooks was at home with his wife in the early hours of last Wednesday when he was confronted by Vincent and an accomplice, who police believe is Billy Jeeves, 28, from Kent. Vincent threatened the homeowner with a screwdriver but was stabbed as his victim fought back. After Vincent died, Mr Osborn-Brooks was arrested on suspicion of murder but released with no further action taken, after an outcry from senior politicians and members of the public.

Jeeves's white Vauxhall Astra van was found burnt out on Saturday evening. About 20 bouquets appeared on a fence in the road in Hither Green on Monday evening but they and other items were ripped down overnight, with one furious vigilante even posting an online video of himself dismantling it. Vincent family members returned Wednesday to reassemble the shrine – only for it to be ripped down again within an

hour.

Local resident Nikita Hill, 39, said: "They should not have put it right in front of the house. It is going to touch people's nerves."

Another local resident,

who gave his name only as Peter, said: "It is not very nice for the pensioner involved. You would not like it in your face."

The dispute came as the burglar's body was cleared for burial at an

inquest into his death. Sarah Ormond-Walsh, assistant coroner for Inner London South, told two female relatives: "I know you are having a dreadful time – I am releasing the body now."

castration is effective.

A source within the MoJ told a British tabloid: 'Dr Lee knows this is controversial but the medication is voluntary although it can be linked to an increased chance of getting parole.'

"There is a debate over the effectiveness of the courses but very little doubt that chemical castration works.

'Essentially, libido suppressing medications in tandem with psychological therapies are more effective than what is generally being attempted currently.'

The source added that the treatment is especially important for paedophiles because

In recent years I started up my own business Mobile Spray Tanning LA as a sister



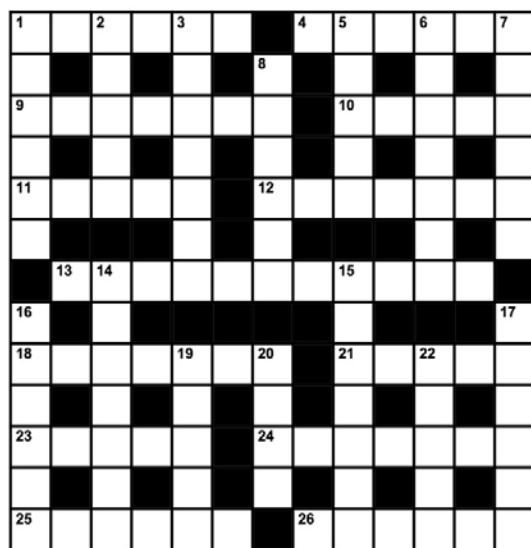

## Modern British classic Noises Off makes welcome return to local theatre scene

FANS of hilarious British theatre will not want to miss a new production of *Noises Off*, Michael Frayn's classic comedy, which opens at the A Noise Within repertory theatre in Pasadena on Saturday, April 21st, and will run through May 20th.

Directed by Julia Rodriguez-Elliott and Geoff Elliott, the play pays tribute to the art of theatre-making itself as chaos reigns onstage and off.

Born in London, playwright Frayn cut his teeth as a reporter for the Guardian and the Observer before moving onto novels and plays in the 1970s, and was inspired with the idea for *Noises Off* when he was

watching from the wings a performance of the farce *The Two of Us*, which he had written for Lynn Redgrave and Richard Briers. Frayn said, "It was funnier from behind than in front and I thought that one day I must write a farce from behind."

*Noises Off* debuted in 1982 at the Lyric Theatre in Hammersmith starring Patricia Routledge, Paul Eddington, and Nicky Henson. It opened to universally ecstatic reviews from audiences and critics. The play would go on to win the 1982 Olivier Award for Best Play and the 1982 London Evening Standard Award for Best Comedy. Since then it has continued to play to delighted audiences around the

world, managing to strike a universal chord with its story about actors struggling to put on a perfect show.

Frayn said of his creation's enduring success, "I think it's connected to the fear we all have inside ourselves that we might be unable to go on with the performance... We all feel we might break down - and sometimes we do. So when we see it happening to those idiots on the stage in a farce, it's a release of the tension."

## Martial seeks Mou assurances

Anthony Martial will seek assurances from José Mourinho about his Manchester United future after becoming disillusioned at his failure to hold down a regular place in the first team.

United offered Martial a five-year contract this season but he is refusing to sign it until he is told he will play more often. His present deal expires in the summer of 2019,

although United have the option to extend it by one year.

Martial has scored 11 goals and provided eight assists this season, but the 22-year-old has started just four games since United signed Alexis Sánchez from Arsenal in January.

Mourinho has preferred to use the Chilean on the left-hand side of United's attack, which is Martial's favoured position. The Frenchman is now effectively third choice for that position behind Marcus Rashford as well as Sánchez.

Juventus, Paris Saint-Germain and Tottenham Hotspur are among a number of clubs interested in Martial, who signed from Monaco for an initial fee of £36 million three years ago.

## Nervy Arsenal go through

Arsenal reached the Europa League semi-finals with a 6-3 aggregate win over CSKA Moscow on Thursday night despite a nervy 2-2 draw in Russia.

Arsene Wenger's side were trailing 2-0 and under pressure when Danny Welbeck's second-half goal gave them breathing space.

The hosts, who led through Fedor Chalov and Kirill Nababkin, went close to drawing level on aggregate and leading on away goals as Petr Cech saved Aleksandr Golovin's free-kick and Sergei Ignashevich shot narrowly wide.

Arsenal, the leading scorers in the competition, did not have an effort on target in the first 70 minutes, and Laurent Koscielny wasted a glorious chance before Welbeck struck.

# KLOPP: my boys 'came through the whirlwind'

■ Reds boss salutes team after riveting Champions League victory over City

Liverpool boss Jurgen Klopp says his side "came through the whirlwind" as they beat Manchester City at the Etihad to seal their place in the last four of the Champions League Tuesday night.

Leading 3-0 from the first leg, the Reds fell behind at the start of a first half dominated by the home side.

But the visitors battled back to win 2-1 and claim a 5-1 aggregate win.

"We scored five against

Man City and only conceded one. These numbers are usually not possible," said the German.

"The boys found a solution in the second half. We had two or three opportunities in the first half already, so it was easy for me and the boys to see the development of the game. We had come through the whirlwind."

Gabriel Jesus' early goal hinted at a Manchester City fightback, but it never materialised as

they struggled to find that clinical edge in the final third.

Instead, Mohamed Salah's 39th goal in a sensational season put Liverpool in control before Roberto Firmino's composed finish secured Liverpool's first Champions League semi-final appearance in a decade.

Liverpool last reached the final in the 2007-08 season and their hopes of going all the way in this year's competition have

perhaps been raised by the shock elimination of Barcelona.

The Spanish giants lost 3-0 in Italy on Tuesday night, with Salah's former side Roma progressing on away goals following a 4-4 aggregate draw.

Klopp said of

Barcelona's exit: "I walked up the stairs and somebody told me. I thought it was a joke."

"Not to disrespect Roma. They lost Salah and are in the semis. That's something else."

"This competition is quite fair and I really think a normal final

would have been Manchester City against Barcelona, and now they are both out.

"But there will still be two other really strong teams in there plus Roma and us. We will see what happens but that's not the thing I have to think about right now."

## Pep facing UEFA charge

Manchester City boss Pep Guardiola has been charged with improper conduct and being sent off during Tuesday's Champions League defeat by Liverpool.

European governing body Uefa has also charged Liverpool after fireworks were set off and objects thrown inside Etihad Stadium.

Guardiola was sent to the stands after confronting referee Antonio Mateu Lahoz on the pitch at half-time during the quarter-final second-leg 2-1 defeat.

The case will be heard on 31 May.

The improper conduct charge against Guardiola is for communicating with the bench during the second half.

Article 69 of Uefa's disciplinary regulations states that any manager or coach who is sent off may not communicate "directly or indirectly

with the team's players and/or technical staff during the match".

Guardiola went on to the pitch to challenge Lahoz after Leroy Sane had a goal disallowed for offside, despite replays showing Liverpool midfielder James Milner got the final touch through to the City winger.

Liverpool were already facing four Uefa charges over the setting off of fireworks, throwing of

objects, acts of damage and crowd disturbances after City's team bus was attacked at Anfield prior to the first-leg on 5 April. That case will also be heard on 31 May.

Having won the first-leg 3-0, Jurgen Klopp's side completed a 5-1 aggregate win to reach the semi-finals for the first time in 10 years.

The semi-final draw is on Friday at 12:00 BST in Nyon, Switzerland.
