■ Hundreds died at Hampshire hospital with 'disregard for human life'

More than 450 patients died at a Hampshire hospital because staff gave them opioids without medical justification, according to an independent panel report.

The government and police should "recognise the significance of what is revealed about the circumstances of deaths at the hospital and act accordingly", the report urged.

The Gosport Independent Panel concluded that 456 patients died at Gosport War Memorial Hospital because of "an institutionalised practice of shortening the lives through administering opioids without medical justification" which had "become the norm" at the hospital between 1989 and 2000.

Up to another 200 patients may also have died but records were missing in those cases, they said.

The panel's investigation, launched in 2014, was established to address concerns about the deaths of a number of elderly patients at the hospital. They had not

been admitted for end-of-life care but often for rehabilitation or respite care.

misconduct

The former bishop of Liverpool, the Right Rev James Jones, who previously chaired the Hillsborough Independent Panel, led the inquiry, which cost £14 million and examined one million pages of documents.

In 2010, the General Medical Council ruled that Dr Jane Barton, who has since retired, was guilty of multiple instances of professional misconduct relating to 12 patients who died at the hospital.

The panel report said Dr Barton was "responsible for the practice of prescribing which prevailed on the wards", but that the hospital had "a disregard for human life and a culture of shortening the

lives of a large number of patients".

There was, it said, "an institutionalised regime of prescribing and administering 'dangerous doses' of a hazardous combination of medication not clinically indicated or justified".

Although consultants did not directly treat patients, "they were aware of how drugs were prescribed and administered but did not intervene to stop the practice".

'long shadow'

It also criticised nurses for failing to "challenge prescribing" and for "suboptimal care".

However, some nurses who did attempt to blow the whistle felt "ostracised" at work as a result, it found.

The report says "families were failed" and there were successive failures by authorities, including the healthcare

authorities and police, to recognise what was happening and to "act to put it right".

Police investigations were "protracted" but "limited in their depth and in the range of possible offences pursued". Family were treated as only "stirring up trouble". The "quality of the police investigations was consistently poor".

The report suggested that the prosecution of Harold Shipman in 2000 "cast a long shadow" which meant police only

considered whether Dr Barton could be another Shipman — the doctor who was convicted of murdering 15 patients — and only looked at whether she was guilty of unlawful killing, instead of pursuing a wider investigation. It said police missed chances to treat Dr Barton's managers as suspects.

It also criticises Sir Peter Viggers, the former MP for Gosport, who repeatedly played down what had happened, questioned the need for

inquiries and made clear that he supported the hospital.

The panel was not given powers to ascribe criminal or civil liability. However, Bishop Jones said it was calling on Jeremy Hunt, the home secretary, attorney general, chief constable of Hampshire Police and "the relevant investigative authorities" to "recognise the significance of what is revealed about the circumstances of deaths at the hospital and act accordingly".

I'm no dinosaur, says MP who blocked bill to ban 'upskirting'

A TORY MP savaged for blocking an attempt to outlaw "upskirting" this week claimed he had been "scapegoated".

Sir Christopher Chope was branded a dinosaur by a Tory minister after using Parliamentary delaying tactics to wreck a Commons Bill aimed at tackling intrusive mobile phone snaps. Theresa May had already branded upskirting "invasive" and vowed the Government would ensure it was criminalised.

Upskirting, a practice which has long been a cultural issue in Japan, involves secretly taking pictures of women's underwear, typically in crowded places like rush hour tube trains and buses. The practice has taken off in the UK over the past few years, prompting government action with the aptly-titled Voyeurism (Offences) Bill.

However, Sir Christopher rejected criticism of his role in halting the Bill at the second reading stage in the Commons on Friday. He was heckled with cries of "shame" from his own party colleagues as he deployed his

often used tactic of opposing backbench Private Members' Bills by shouting an objection moments after the Bill is called. One of his constituents, Lorna Rees, later hung three knickers outside his office in Christchurch, Dorset. She tweeted: "No one should be able to photo my pants unless I want them to."

The MP said: "I feel a bit sore about being scapegoated over this."

He insisted he supported banning upskirting but objected to the use of legislation being introduced without debate at their Commons Second Reading.

outcry

"The Government has been hijacking time that is rightfully that of backbenchers," he said. "This is about who controls the House of Commons on Fridays. I actually support the Bills that were before the House. Four of the 26 Bills that fell at the same time were my own."

"The Government is abusing Parliamentary time for its own ends and in a democracy this is not acceptable. The Government cannot just

bring in what it wants on the nod."

Sir Christopher admitted being taken aback by the outcry after blocking the bill tabled by Lib Dem MP Wera Hobhouse. "I spoke to Gina Martin, the lady who had been promoting the Bill as a victim herself, and she said she understood my reasons."

"We arranged to meet to discuss the matter further so I must admit I was surprised," he said. "My recommendation to the Government is to ensure the fastest, fairest and surest passage to the statute book for a Bill to outlaw upskirting, which I would wholeheartedly support."

The 71-year-old also complained about Tory MPs attacking him. It was Defence Minister Tobias Ellwood who called him "an embarrassment" and "a dinosaur". Sir Christopher said he spoke to Tory Chief Whip Julian Smith about his treatment from MPs. He said: "Why would they want to humiliate one of their own colleagues? I am not a dinosaur. I'm very much alive and kicking."

Get a round in: non drinkers die earlier

Good news for those who enjoy an occasional tittle: new research has revealed light drinkers are LESS likely to die early than teetotalers - even taking alcohol's cancer-causing properties into account, researchers have found.

People who never touched a drop were seven per cent more likely to die or develop cancer than those who drank up to three glasses of wine or bottles of beer a week.

Previous studies have found that light drinking might have a beneficial effect on heart health and cut the risk of dying prematurely. However, even small

amounts of alcohol have been linked to increased risks of cancer.

The researchers said this was leading to mixed messages, with some arguing there was "no safe limit" for alcohol, based on the cancer studies, while others emphasized potential cardiovascular benefits. The new study, from Queen's University Belfast, attempted to resolve the debate by combining data on death and cancers from 99,654 people aged above 55 in the United States. Over about nine years 9,559 patients died and 12,763 developed cancer.

The researchers calculated people's

average alcohol intake over their lifetime from their responses to questionnaires. The combined risk of dying or developing cancer was lowest in those consuming less than a drink per day, but went up for each additional drink per week. People consuming two or three drinks daily had a 10 per cent greater risk; for heavier drinkers it was 21 per cent.

Andrew Kunzmann, who led the research - published in the journal PLOS Medicine - said it backed UK guidelines that both men and women should not exceed 14 units per week, roughly

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21m tune in to England victory

ENGLAND'S victory over Tunisia netted the biggest TV audience of the year so far, making it more popular than the Royal Wedding.

More than 21 million viewers tuned in to watch the Three Lions' opening World Cup match on Monday night. The ratings peaked at 18.3 million during the closing minutes of the match, when captain Harry Kane headed home the winning goal to clinch England's thrilling 2-1 victory in injury time. A further three million football fans watched the action live on the BBC iPlayer and BBC Sport – the highest ever live viewing for any BBC programme online.

'power of football'

Former England striker and BBC presenter Gary Lineker wrote on Twitter: "Astonishing for an opening group game. The power of football and the World Cup."

Almost 18 million people watched Prince Harry tie the knot with Meghan Markle on May 19. The wedding was broadcast on four channels on a Saturday afternoon. Until Monday, the wedding – which was screened live on BBC One, ITV, Sky News and the BBC News channel – had been the year's biggest draw for television viewers.

In the 1990 World Cup in Italy, England's semi-final clash with West Germany was watched by 25.2 million people. This remains the highest ever viewing figure for a World Cup match – 23.8 million saw England play Argentina in 1998.

Calls for Sugar to be fired as World Cup tweet turns sour

The BBC was under pressure to fire Lord Sugar this week after he was accused of "blatant racism" for comparing the Senegal World Cup team to sunglasses sellers at beach resorts.

The businessman, presenter of *The Apprentice* and former chairman of Tottenham Hotspur, posted an image on Twitter of the team beside pictures of fake designer handbags and sunglasses, captioned: "I recognise some of these guys from the beach in Marbella. Multi tasking resourceful chaps."

Lord Sugar, 71, defended the post as "funny" after he was accused of racism and even attacked a BBC journalist who described it as "vile", before eventually deleting his tweet and apologizing.

'racist stereotype'

Others at the BBC condemned the former Labour peer. Trevor Nelson, the Radio 2 and Radio 1 Extra DJ, called him "sad" and said the joke was "totally on him". Osasu Obayiuwana, the British-Nigerian correspondent for the BBC's World Football show, said the tweet "plays to a racist stereotype...I'm afraid no Senegalese or African will see this as funny."

Dawn Butler, the Labour MP for Brent Central, said that she would write to both the BBC and the House of Lords commissioner for standards demanding an immediate investigation. She called for "swift action" and said: "It's time the BBC pulled Lord Sugar into the boardroom and told him 'You're Fired'."

Lord Sugar's tweet came minutes after the

BBC published a review of the corporation's treatment of ethnic minority staff, which found that many non-white employees felt a "sense of exclusion and isolation".

Sources said that the corporation had spoken to *The Apprentice* star about his conduct and made it clear that the tweet was unacceptable.

A BBC spokesman said: "Lord Sugar has acknowledged this was a seriously misjudged tweet, and he's in no doubt about our view on this. It's right he's apologized unreservedly."

Lord Sugar initially defended his tweet as a "bloody joke" after receiving hundreds of complaints from social media users. He said: "I can't see what I have to apologize for... you are OTT [over the top]... it's a bloody joke."

Babita Sharma, a BBC World News anchor, called it a "shocking, vile tweet". Lord Sugar responded: "If it is so vile why have you retweeted it? You make me sick."

'misjudged'

The businessman eventually deleted his original tweet about 30 minutes after it had been posted. However, he continued to defend the original tweet as "funny" for another 20 minutes. It was not until an hour after his original tweet that he apologized, saying that it had been "misjudged" and adding: "It was in no way intended to cause offence, and clearly my attempt at humour has backfired. I have deleted the tweet and am very sorry."

Lord Sugar later deleted all the tweets he had written defending

his actions.

Fare, the European football anti-discrimination group, said that Lord Sugar had "deliberately and with racist intent" demeaned the Senegal team. Piara Powar, its executive director, said: "We should now assume that the black candidates on Lord Sugar's TV show that did not advance to becoming the *Apprentice*, all of the African players he didn't sign while chairman of Tottenham Hotspur, and many other decisions he has made in his business life were informed by his view that Africans are no more than beach sellers."

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Legalizing medical marijuana moves a step closer

SAJID Javid this week took a significant step towards the legalization of cannabis for medicinal use.

The Home Secretary on Tuesday announced a review on using the banned plant for treating conditions like severe epilepsy. The move came after Mr Javid gave special dispensation to six-year-old epilepsy sufferer Alfie Dingley to use cannabis oil to stop his life-threatening seizures.

Alfie's mother Hannah Deacon was moved to tears during a live TV interview after the review was announced. She said she was "overwhelmed" by the news after a long struggle. Ms Deacon said she had been waiting three months for Prime Minister Theresa May to fulfil a personal

assurance that Alfie would be allowed to receive cannabis oil.

Mr Javid had also permitted the use of cannabis oil to treat severely epileptic 12-year-old Billy Caldwell. Billy had been admitted to hospital with seizures after supplies his mother had brought from Canada were confiscated at Heathrow Airport. Billy's mother Charlotte described the review as "amazing news" which she "applauded".

therapeutic benefits

Speaking to the House of Commons, Mr Javid stressed that the class B drug would remain banned for recreational use, despite suggestions by former Tory leader Lord Hague that it should be decriminalized. Mr Javid told MPs that the

review would be held in two parts. The first, led by chief medical officer Sally Davies, will make recommendations on which medicines might offer real therapeutic benefits. The second part will see the Advisory Council on the Misuse of Drugs consider whether changes should be made to the classification of these products.

Mr Javid said: "If the review identifies significant medical benefits, then we do intend to reschedule. We have seen in recent months that there is a pressing need to allow those who might benefit from cannabis-based medicines to access them."

Mr Javid said it had become clear to him that the legal position on medicinal cannabis was "not satisfactory for the

parents, not satisfactory for doctors and not satisfactory for me".

But he insisted: "This step is in no way a first step to the legalisation of cannabis for recreational use." And NHS England chief executive Simon

Stevens urged caution, telling a conference in London: "I think it's very important as a country that we don't confuse this debate with a much more generalized debate around the decriminalization or

legalization of marijuana. "In those countries where marijuana is decriminalised, often young people come to think of smoking marijuana as safe. Whereas let's be clear, actually it isn't."

Naked rowers take on Insta – and win - over nude gender bias

Instagram has been accused of taking a stricter line on male than female nudity after suspending an account used by a university rowing club to promote their risqué charity calendars.

The Warwick Rowers have raised hundreds of thousands of pounds for good causes over the past decade by posing in the buff, their dignity preserved by artfully placed oars. Their efforts have won the backing of celebrities including Sir Ian McKellen, Kylie Minogue and Stephen Fry, and have twice been voted UK charity calendar of the year.

Although most of the models, all drawn from the University of Warwick men's rowing team, are heterosexual, the calendars have built a large gay following and much of the money raised goes to LGBT-friendly campaigns.

Last month, however, the group's

Instagram account was removed after being found in breach of its nudity guidelines. The rowers challenged the decision to deactivate the account, which had nearly 180,000 followers, insisting that all their photos were non-explicit and abided by the site's rules. They received no response.

Instagram, which is owned by Facebook, forbids pictures of "sexual intercourse, genitals, and close-ups of fully nude buttocks", none of which feature in the rowing club's shots. The rowers complained that more provocative pictures of women on other accounts remained online.

"Accounts that feature similar levels of female nudity, often presented in a far more sexualised and exploitative manner than the images featuring the Warwick Rowers, are left alone to post whatever they like," they said in an open

letter. "We believe that keeping men's bodies hidden is an expression of heterosexual male power."

Angus Malcolm, creator of the Warwick Rowers, added: "Both men and women are less accustomed to the idea of men being seen without their clothes, and therefore subjective personal opinions creep into the process." He also accused Instagram of taking a priggish approach to male body hair. Instagram was less censorious of "airbrushed, sanitized" photos, he claimed.

After fending off a flurry of media requests, Instagram hurriedly announced that the account had been restored. Staff occasionally misinterpreted nudity guidelines and the account was removed "in error", it said. "We apologize for any inconvenience caused," a spokesman added.

'Simple' plan for EU citizens who want to stay

EU citizens will have to answer three "simple" questions online if they want to continue living in the UK after Brexit, the home secretary has said.

Sajid Javid said the government's "default" position would be to grant, not refuse, settled status.

People will be asked to

prove their ID, whether they have criminal convictions and whether they live in the UK.

Their answers will be checked against government databases and a decision given "very quickly", said Mr Javid.

The scheme will operate online and via a smartphone app, Mr

Javid said, and would be "as simple as people can reasonably expect", with most decisions turned around within two weeks or sooner.

Speaking to a House of Lords committee, Mr Javid said there would have to be "a very good reason" why an application would be refused.

After 25 years, Dimbleby to quit Question Time

BROADCASTING legend David Dimbleby is stepping down from the BBC's flagship political show Question Time after 25 years at the helm.

The veteran presenter, who turns 80 later this year, said it was the "right moment" to leave and revealed he planned to return to reporting.

Mr Dimbleby said: "At the end of the year I will have been chairing Question Time for a quarter of a century and I have decided that this is the right moment to leave.

"It has been a privilege

to work for a programme which brings voters face to face with those in power.

"I am grateful to the production teams and to the BBC who have made this possible. It has been exhilarating following the twists and turns of British politics from John Major in 1994, through the Blair and Brown years to Cameron and May.

"I am not giving up broadcasting. Instead, after years in the studio, I now plan to return to my first love, reporting."

Mr Dimbleby is the longest serving presenter of Question Time – his

first broadcast was on January 13 1994. His final one will be on December 13.

BBC director general Tony Hall described him as a "titan" in British broadcasting.

Paying tribute to him Tuesday night, he said: "David has been at the helm of Question Time for over 25 years – a brilliant champion of the public and the audiences' friend, getting the answers they want on the big and difficult issues of the day. David may be stepping down from Question Time, but he isn't stepping down from broadcasting.

He is a titan in British broadcasting.

"The BBC and the public are extraordinarily lucky to have him in what are, to say the least, interesting times politically and socially. We look forward to working with him on other projects in the future."

BBC's director of content, Charlotte Moore, said: "Under his tenure,

David Dimbleby has made Question Time his own, ensuring that the nation's most popular public political debate programme is at the very top of its game."

Mr Dimbleby started as a news reporter at the BBC in Bristol 57 years ago after leaving Oxford University. Since then he has presented programmes, like

Panorama and has filmed documentaries. He has also been the BBC's anchorman for all general elections since 1979, which he is likely to continue. Possible contenders to take over his role include Newsnight presenter Kirsty Wark, Radio 2 presenter Jeremy Vine, Desert Island Discs' Kirsty Young and 5Live presenter Emma Barnett.

equivalent to six pints of beer.

He added: "This study helps to provide robust evidence about the health impacts of various levels of alcohol consumption so that individuals can make informed, healthy decisions."

However, he said, teetotallers should not start drinking alcohol to improve their health, as researchers could not be sure that alcohol was responsible for lower death rates in light drinkers. He said: "It is possible that light drinkers may be at a lower risk of death [for] other reasons, such as better access to healthcare, or may have other healthy behaviours that we could not account for."

The starstruck comic, 39, whose son Max McCartney is named after the singer, said working with his idol was "kind of insane". He said: "He's the most respected musician on the planet. That he would come to do a segment on our show is mind-blowing. "He told

the 45th President of the United States.

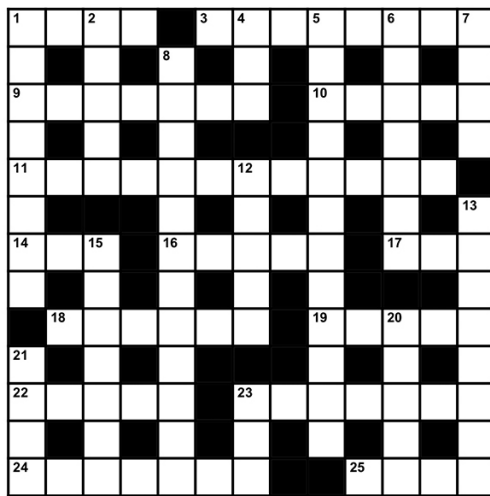
Dollar to Sterling Exchange Rate

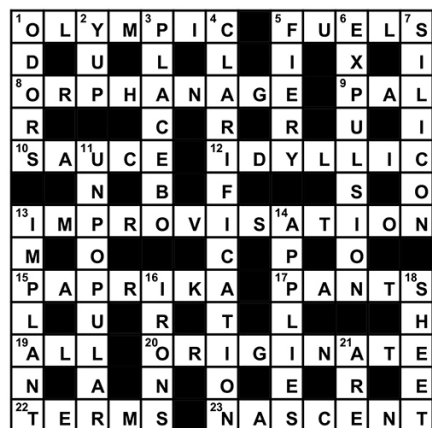

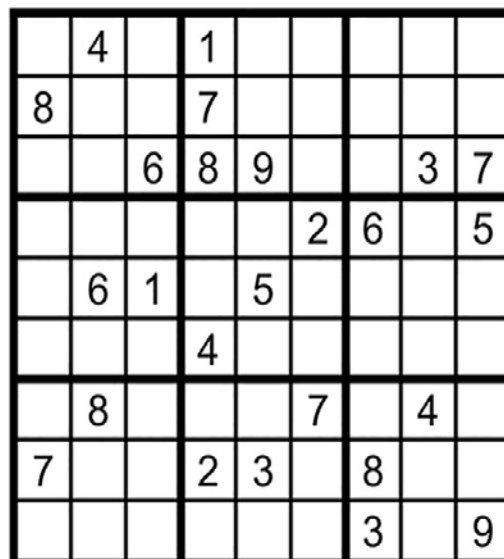

I put that together with a Brian Patten book I found on a pavement, by a bin in 1990...and was mulling about writing about bookshops. Then I was watching a TV

show in which there was someone called Loveday and I thought, what if your name was Loveday but you hated everyone? And I was off."

Loveday Cardew prefers books to people. Loveday is a name that originates in Cornwall and is fairly uncommon outside the England's southwest. She works in a used bookstore and has a tattoo of the first lines of her favorite novel. She hides from the world among the books to forget her childhood trauma. Then a poet named Nathan visits the bookstore looking for a lost book. Loveday is intrigued. Then she starts to receive suspicious packages that bring up past hurts she needs to deal with. Can Loveday's change her story to get a happy ending of her own?

The Lost for Words Bookshop is a love story for those who love books.

"Apart from that little postcard I found, it's the sense that every book in there has a story separate to the story it tells," says Butland. "Who owned it, who loved it, who decided to give it away? Was it a gift, and if it was, was it appreciated? Are there books here that people cannot bear to look at anymore because they bring back painful memories of the person who gave it to them?"

For her research, Butland interviewed people who own and work in second-hand bookshops.

"Many years ago I worked as a bookseller, so I drew on that too," says Butland. "I got to spend even more time than usual in bookshops and

libraries. I spent time in the locations for the book, photographing, walking, and thinking. I talked to foster parents and social workers. And, I learned how to be a performance poet. It's an addictive outlet for creativity and I still do it now and then."

Butland has written two non-fiction books, memoirs about her experiences with cancer, *How I Said Bah!* to Cancer and *Thrive: the Bah! Guide to Wellness after Cancer*. She then turned to fiction. Her first two novels are *Letters To My Husband*, published as *The Secrets We Keep* in the U.S. and *The Other Half Of My Heart*. The *Curious Heart of Ailsa Rae* released in the UK in April, *The Lost for Words Bookshop* has yet to be optioned for film or TV.

Butland is a master

trainer in Dr Edward de Bono's tools for systematic, creative and lateral thinking. She hosts workshops all over the world for organizations to solve problems, brainstorm ideas and work more effectively together.

Butland's process working with her editor is simple although not always easy.

"I write a book and hand it over to my editor, who will read it and come back with questions and suggestions," says Butland. "This first pass is usually about structure and character. Once we've agreed ways to improve the manuscript, I rewrite. We repeat the process, but this time it's closer to a line edit, we tweak, and the manuscript goes to copy editors then proof readers. The process takes about six

months."

Butland is currently writing her next novel, which doesn't have a title yet. She lives in the northeast of England, near the sea and near where she was born. England smash ODI record to clinch series

ENGLAND smashed their own one-day international record total on Wednesday with a scarcely believable 481-6 against Australia to seal victory in the series at Trent Bridge.

On a flat pitch which offered next to nothing for the bowlers, Eoin Morgan's men surpassed the previous high water mark for ODI cricket of 444-3, against Pakistan on this ground two years ago. Alex Hales and Jonny Bairstow helped themselves to big centuries – the former landing a haymaker of a nudge to wavering selectors – while the captain weighed in with the quickest 50 ever scored in England colours. England now lead the five match series 3-0 after a night

when numbers almost overshadowed the more visceral elements of a one-sided bat and ball dynamic. Faced with such overwhelming numbers Australia were simply unable to keep within touching distance of an ever-escalating run rate. The win by 242 runs, confirmed with the last ball of the 37th over, was both a record margin of victory by England and a record margin of defeat for Australia. It was in many ways a strange match to witness – statistically memorable but not a contest that will live long in the memory. Despite a stream of boundaries – England hit 21 sixes, a number bettered only once in ODI history and a record 62 boundaries – there may be a small part of this knowledgeable

crowd who covet a low-scoring thriller.

Two years ago on this ground England posted a then record 444 against Pakistan – a mark that the visitors fell 169 runs short of reaching. This time it was a smash-fest from the moment Australia captain Tim Paine won the toss and said he thought it would be a good to “have a bowl”. What followed was carnage, with Jason Roy (82) and Bairstow (139) getting England off to a flier at 159-0 inside 20 overs before the former was run out going for a second to D'Arcy Short's rifle arm from the square leg boundary. The breakthrough provided no respite. From the moment Hales entered the fray, the pace picked up if

anything. Sixes seemed to mark most of the significant milestones. Roy had brought up England's 100 with one, Bairstow his own century (a fourth in his last six ODI innings) with another. Both men

hit five maximums but when Bairstow holed out at midwicket, skipper Morgan eclipsed them both with six as he raced not only to the fastest 50 in just 21 balls but also overtook Ian Bell as England's

leading ODI run-scorer. Hales, Jos Buttler and Morgan were all out to Jhye Richardson, who finished with 3-92 from 10 overs – the third-largest number of runs conceded by an Australian in an ODI.

Wilshere to leave his beloved Arsenal

■ Injury-prone midfielder has been on club's books for 17 years

ARSENAL midfielder Jack Wilshere has announced he will leave Arsenal at the end of the month.

Wilshere, 26, believes he was left with “little choice”. He joined the Arsenal academy as a nine-year-old in 2001 but his involvement in the first team has been beset by injuries. In a lengthy statement Wednesday night, Wilshere said: “I can confirm that I will be leaving Arsenal when my contract expires at the end of June.

“Following a number of extensive conversations with those at the club – and in particular a recent meeting with the new manager Unai Emery – I

felt I was ultimately left with little choice but to make the decision that I have due to purely footballing reasons.

“As has widely been reported I, along with my representative, have been in talks with the club for a number of months with the view to signing a new contract to extend my stay at the Emirates.

“My intention throughout these discussions has always been to remain an Arsenal player. I have been on the books at Arsenal for 17 years and have always felt part of the fabric of the club.

“Such was my desire to stay that I had in fact recently agreed to sign

a financially reduced contract in order to commit my future to the club.

“However, following my meeting with the new manager I was made aware that although the reduced contract offer remained, it was made clear to me that my playing time would be significantly reduced.

“I'm sure everyone can understand that at this point in my life and career I need to be playing regular first-team football.”

There was at least some positive news for Emery, with Arsenal announcing the signing of goalkeeper Bernd Leno from Bayer Leverkusen – having

earlier confirmed former No1 Jens Lehmann would not be part of the new manager's backroom staff.

“It's a dream,” said Leno.

“In Germany, Arsenal are so famous and when I heard it [the transfer], I was a little bit nervous, but at that moment it was clear for me.

“I'll try to help the team to come back to the Champions League and to win some trophies. “Arsenal belong in the Champions League. Now it's a new chapter for the club. I spoke to Unai Emery and he said that he believes I'm a good goalkeeper and that he wanted me to join.”

Freak injury for Southgate

England manager Gareth Southgate dislocated his right shoulder while running on Wednesday.

The players had a day off from training and Southgate suffered the injury near the squad's World Cup base in Repino.

“The doc has made it clear punching the air is not an option,” said Southgate, who jumped in the air celebrating the injury-time winner in

Monday's 2-1 opening victory over Tunisia.

“I might not be celebrating any goals as athletically in future,” he added. Southgate, who had to wear a protective sling, was treated at a nearby hospital with the assistance of team doctor Rob Chakraverty.

England face Panama in their second Group G game of Russia 2018 at 13:00 BST on Sunday in Nizhny Novgorod.

“I want to prove myself at a major tournament,” says England’s two goal hero

HARRY KANE says he puts “no limits” on what he can achieve after firing England to the verge of the knockout stages.

Provided Belgium do not lose to Tunisia on Sunday, England just need to beat Panama to be sure of progressing. Kane, left, also has his eye on winning the Golden Boot competition – a feat that seemed unlikely when Cristiano Ronaldo scored a hat-trick in Portugal’s opening game against Spain.

But after scoring two himself against Tunisia on Monday night, Kane said: “To be the best player in the world you have to aim high and you can’t aim low.

“Put no limits on yourself, nobody should. I worked hard to get where I am, I have a lot of determination and I enjoy being here and it is about stepping it up. “I want to prove myself at a major tournament, I want to be up there with the best in the world and the only way to do that is to perform on the big stage and in the big moments.

“It gives me confidence doing that and I want to do that in the games ahead.

“I had to prove people wrong throughout my career and I love proving to myself I can do it. Ronaldo is the best in the world, up there with Lionel Messi, but the challenge is there to be with them.” With Panama next up for England – the Central American nation were beaten comfortably by Belgium 3-0 in the opening game of their campaign – Kane has a chance to add several more goals to his tally after breaking his tournament duck on Monday.

But he may have to do so without the ammunition supplied by his Tottenham club-mate Dele Alli, above.

Alli was substituted in the Tunisia match having suffered a minor strain to a quad muscle. He had been nursing the injury through training since he

arrived in Repino but is now not expected to train for the next few days, making him a doubt for Sunday’s match against Panama.

500 would have been better, says Morgan as he savors crushing win

EOIN MORGAN said England “missed an opportunity” to reach the magical 500 mark but insisted he was proud of the best performance by England under his captaincy as his team hammered Australia by a massive 242-run margin on Wednesday to take an unassailable 3-0 lead in the five match ODI series.

England fell 19 runs short of the landmark

in reaching 481-6 – itself a record score by any country in an ODI – to notch their best ever margin of victory and Morgan said his side are putting themselves in a great position ahead of the 2019 World Cup.

“It is a very proud day for this group. We showed an unbelievable attitude,” he said. “It was an opportunity missed but it was the best performance in my time by a stretch.”
