## ■ England goes World Cup crazy ahead of quarter final date with Sweden

**HOT ON THE HEELS** of Tuesday's heart-stopping victory over Colombia, comes another dramatic World Cup chapter as England take on old enemies Sweden in the quarter finals today.

And the mood across the county seemed exultant despite England being forced to face a country which has given us so much trouble in recent years, in a do-or-die battle that raises hope of breaking a string of records.

The last time England reached this stage of the competition was in 2006 when they lost on penalties to Portugal in what was Swedish manager Sven Goran Eriksson's last game in charge. On Saturday an estimated 30 million people will tune in for a match being shown live on BBC One at 3pm on a day when temperatures are tipped to nudge 88F (31C). On Tuesday an incredible 24 million viewers turned into the Colombia

tie. Supermarkets are frantically stocking up on extra food and drink in anticipation of fans spending at least £1billion on the game.

### Supermarket bonanza

Tesco estimates it will sell four million sausages, four million burgers, six million ice lollies, one million tubs of ice cream and 50 million bottles and cans of beer as football fever grips the nation. BBQ foods buyer Natalie Bastow said: "Fantastic weather and the world's biggest sporting event are creating a real carnival atmosphere."

Meanwhile, Asda expects sales of grillable food to rocket and predicted it will sell more than three million litres of

beer for as long as England stay in the competition. A spokesman said: "We're prepared, the England boys are prepared, hopefully our customers are prepared... it's coming home."

After a lukewarm build-up, the World Cup has captured the imagination of the English public, who believe Gareth Southgate's team is on the verge of achieving something that England have not managed since 1966. At Prime Minister's Questions on Monday

Theresa May spoke for a nation when she said: "The country witnessed a very rare and welcome event – the England football team winning a penalty shoot-out. I think the explosion of relief and most of all joy could be felt up and down the country."

"I want to congratulate Gareth and his team on a great performance."

"Last week, I promised to fly the flag of St George above Number 10 for all of England's remaining matches in the World Cup and I know the whole

House will want to join me in wishing the England team the best of luck in Saturday's quarter-final."

On the back of England's success, comedy duo David Baddiel and Frank Skinner's 1990s football anthem Three Lions has topped the iTunes chart. The original version of the pair's collaboration with band The Lightning Seeds, which became the soundtrack to England's march to the semi-finals of Euro 96, went to the top of the hit parade after the win over Colombia. A

dumbfounded Baddiel, 54, tweeted: "Blimey. Again."

Meanwhile, former manager Sven, 70, poured cold water on the feel-good factor sweeping the nation when he suggested England would struggle to beat his native Sweden. He said: "I'm surprised because everybody seems to be happy in England, thinking they are now on the right side of the World Cup draw. In the last 30 years, how many times have England beaten Sweden? Not often – twice."

# Hosepipe ban 'in days' as roasting Britain dries up

## ■ Nation suffering longest heatwave since 1976

**BRITAIN is set to bake in the longest heatwave since the drought of 1976 – raising fears of a hosepipe ban within days.**

Suppliers this week urged people to use water wisely or face a ban this week. United Utilities, which supplies water to north-west England, warned that it was experiencing record levels of demand. A spokeswoman said: "Unfortunately, if demand continues at this level, we will consider imposing a formal hosepipe ban."

As the first ban hit customers in Northern Ireland last Friday, water bosses said demand was outstripping supply, leaving it with no other option. Elsewhere, consumers are being urged to reduce the amount of "precious" water they use. The heatwave has put a strain on water companies pumping millions of gallons into their systems. People have been told to shower for only four minutes, let lawns turn brown and wait for the heatwave to end before they wash their cars. Industry body Water UK warned companies were seeing "extremely high levels of demand", Thames Water has ramped up its supply and

Severn Trent Water asked people to avoid using sprinklers or hosepipes.

The Met Office's heat-health watch alert remained at level two Wednesday, meaning social and health services are ready to combat the effects of a potential heatwave. Public Health England warned that the extreme heat may pose a risk to the most vulnerable who can "struggle to cope". It said: "The over-65s, young children and those with heart and lung conditions can all find normal activities a strain when temperatures get this high."

### driest months

The rising temperatures have also prompted warnings to be careful near water and in the countryside, where crews have been tackling wildfires. And the RNLI has urged those heading to the seaside to keep to beaches with lifeguards. The threat comes as forecasters say Britain will bake for the whole of July as the fine weather shows no sign of ending. The nation faces a month-long hot blast with weeks of higher-than-average temperatures in what could be the longest heatwave since 1976.

The Met Office's long-

range outlook predicts a "good deal of dry and settled weather across most parts of the UK in the second half of July with very warm or hot temperatures likely at times". Last week was the first time since 2013 that all four UK nations have seen temperatures of 86F or above, the Met Office said. June is also on course to be among the top five driest months since records began in 1910, drawing comparisons with the summer of 1976, when temperatures hit at least 90F for 15 days in a row.

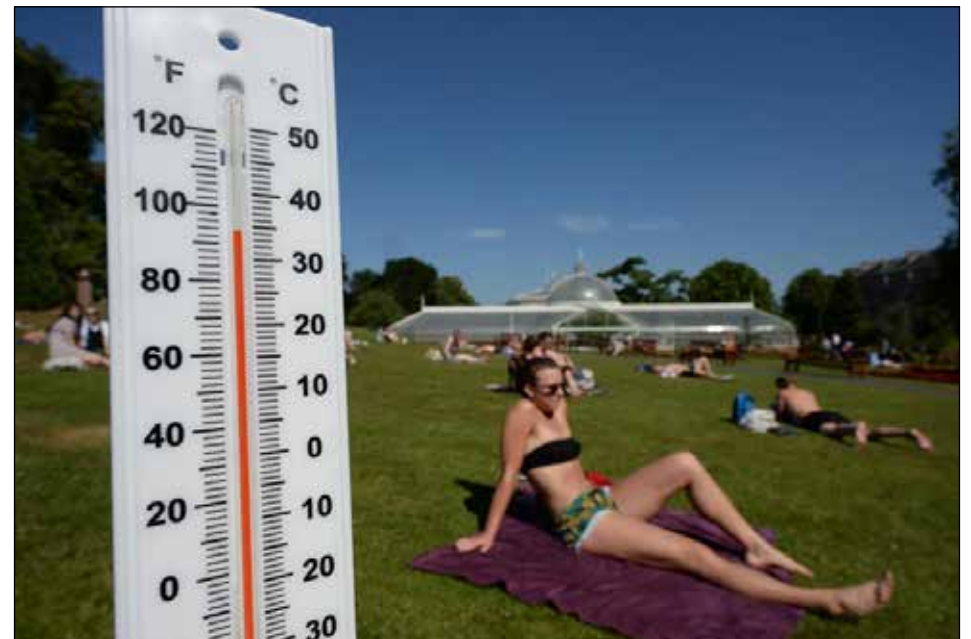
Last week, temperatures hit at least 86F on six out of seven days and this heatwave could last weeks. The Met Office said the mercury reached a sweltering 90F yesterday in Gosport, Hampshire, compared with average temperatures of 62F in the North and 70F in the South.

### drone warnings

UK water companies are "monitoring the situation closely" and regulator Ofwat is watching how firms respond. The North-west's United Utilities said record temperatures were setting new records for water consumption, with three million households and 200,000

businesses tapping into 110 million more gallons than usual. Industry body Water UK said Britain was not facing a "drought" due to "above average rainfall" in the spring, but added: "During the current heatwave water companies are seeing extremely high levels of demand. During these peaks, water is often being used as fast as it's been put into the system."

Thames Water has stepped up production at its treatment works by 17 per cent, enough to supply 800,000 homes. Meanwhile, fire brigade chiefs hit out last night at arsonists seen setting moorland alight as crews battled flames which

have raged for up to a week. Senior officers spoke of "astounding" interference as fires in the North-west merged and also warned drone enthusiasts to stay away, fearing the machines could impede firefighting helicopters.

Crews have battled the biggest blaze, on Saddleworth Moor, for seven days, but a second, at Winter Hill, near Bolton, merged with another. Crews from the North and Midlands have travelled to Greater Manchester to help control fires that have destroyed at least 5,000 acres of moorland in the past week. On Tuesday Lancashire Fire and Rescue Service said

arsonists had struck near Chorley as helicopters were dropping water. Brigade group chief Tony Crook said: "It absolutely astounds me," warning the firebugs: "You will get caught and you will get dealt with."

Lancashire and Greater Manchester fire services urged drone users to stay away from the moors after they were spotted in both areas. The Lancashire brigade tweeted: "If you have a drone, please DO NOT fly it over Winter Hill."

"There are helicopters flying in the area to extinguish the fire and the drones are putting firefighters' and pilots' lives at risk."

# Spot on! Agony for fans but England clinch it on penalties

■ Nation goes wild as England lay penalty hoodoo - for now

**ENGLAND dramatically ended their penalty shoot-out heartache this week as they kept their World Cup dream alive by beating Colombia.**

The Three Lions won their first ever World Cup shoot-out after goalkeeper Jordan Pickford kept out striker Carlos Bacca. They now face Sweden on Saturday afternoon, putting to bed their notoriously poor record from the penalty shoot-outs in major tournaments. The drama followed a fiery 1-1 draw, with Colombia snatching an equalizer in the last minute of added time as England had one foot in the Quarter Final. Manager Gareth Southgate tried to rally his troops – despite famously missing a penalty himself in the semi-final of Euro 96 – as coaches offered advice and reassurance to the team. Striker Harry Kane rifled in the opening penalty before Marcus Rashford confidently despatched his spot kick.

## wild celebrations

Liverpool captain Jordan Henderson missed, with Arsenal goalkeeper David Ospina making a fine save. Colombian Uribe dramatically missed, hitting the bar, before Kieran Trippier put England on level terms. Everton goalkeeper Jordan Pickford then heroically saved from Milan forward Carlos Bacca before Eric Dier had the chance to send England through. And he sparked wild celebrations across the country as he slotted home to give England victory.

Kane's second half

penalty appeared to have fired England into their first World Cup quarter final since 2006. But the Colombian equalizer with just seconds to go left millions of fans deflated. Supporters fell to the floor on Brighton Beach and all across the country at fan parks in cities including London, Newcastle, Birmingham and Liverpool. Would-be revellers had their heads in their hands as the South American side celebrated. Some were so distraught after the leveller they decided to head home. World Cup fever had gripped England as fans excitedly left work early to watch the match with family and friends.

## set pieces

More than 7,000 supporters had made the 1,800 mile journey to Moscow for England's first World Cup knockout fixture in eight years. But millions back home flooded to the fan zones to see the match on giant TV screens with others watching in bars, pubs and even gardens. Trains were packed much earlier than usual and some commuters wore England jerseys to work in a show of support for Southgate's men. Flags were hung out of windows as fans dreamed of World Cup glory, singing It's Coming Home in regular intervals. A mixture of excitement and nerves spread across supporters as kick-off approached. Some 2,200 people piled onto Brighton beach while hundreds gathered in South London's Kirby Estate – dubbed the most patriotic in England – to

watch the match. England tried to keep possession early on as the Colombian fans jeered at The Three Lions, wearing their changed red strip. And the travelling band of supporters quickly found their voices as Southgate's side applied pressure, pushing Colombia on to the back foot with a flurry of set-pieces. The nation held their collective breath as star striker Harry Kane and Dele Alli linked up to build the attack. But tension mounted as the men in red pressed the South Americans for an opportunity. And there was controversy when Colombian centre-back Wilmar Barrios escaped being sent off for appearing to headbutt Liverpool midfielder Jordan Henderson.

England came close with a Kieran Trippier free-kick and Manchester United's Jesse Lingard volleyed over from inside the box – the best chance in a cagey first half. Colombia registered the only shot on target but Southgate's side were the better team in the first half. England took the lead early in the second half from the penalty spot after Harry Kane was bundled over by former Aston Villa defender Carlos Sanchez.

## ice-cool

Tension increased dramatically as the Tottenham forward waited while the Colombian team tried to argue the decision with the referee despite video replays showing it was clearly a foul. The South Americans even tried to scuff the penalty

spot up but Kane, the tournament's top scorer, remained ice-cool to spark wild celebrations in the stadium and back home.

In Brighton Kane's 57th minute conversion triggered wild celebrations, with groups hugging one another, climbing on top of tables and chairs and flooding on to the streets in delight. Plastic beer cups were thrown into the air, leaving many drenched in

beer as fans chanted. Beer was also sprayed high into the blue Tyneside sky as supporters in the fan zone erupted when the penalty tucked away.

England goalkeeper Jordan Pickford made a heroic save with just two minutes to go as Colombia desperately searched for a winner. But centre-back Yerry Mina scored at the death to force an extra 30 minutes and penalties, prompting disbelief and

deflation among England fans as they had one foot in the quarter finals. The South Americans had the better of extra-time as England struggled to find the composure and keep possession of the ball. Southgate's men struggled to get Kane and their influential midfield playmakers into the game and fans' anxiety levels grew but the relief was palpable after victory from the agony of the shoot out.

# 'Moped Muggers 'use crime sprees to fund trips to party islands'

■ **Helmeted villains splash proceeds on boozy holidays in locations including Ayia Napa, expert claims**

BRITAIN'S recent crime epidemic has become a staple of TV and print news over the past few months, and no part of the worrying trend has received more attention than the so-called moped muggers – a new breed of opportunistic metropolitan criminals who use the fast and maneuverable vehicles to launch daring snatch raids on unsuspecting pedestrians.

And according to a new report into the phenomenon, the perpetrators often use the proceeds of their crimes to fund exotic summer holidays. They have been selling snatched watches, mobile phones and jewellery to pay for trips to party islands in the Mediterranean said Peter Williams, who runs private security firm

LCS Security. Williams claimed police had told him that the robbers – typically in their late teens and early 20s – head to the hotspots in July and August. He said: "Between May, June and July the moped criminals become very active. Then around mid-July it goes quieter.

"A flying squad officer told me they are all in Ibiza, Spain or Ayia Napa in Cyprus partying.

"Then it all starts up again from September in time for Christmas."

Statistics show the number of robberies using mopeds increases in spring. There is then a dip in high summer. Two moped muggers told recently how they were able to holiday in exclusive resorts after netting up to £2,000 a day. One, aged 20, said:

"The money is for good times. It's for enjoyment, silliness, to buy yourself stuff and go on holiday."

The revelation comes as the Daily Express launched a campaign to highlight the misery caused by the muggers. Attacks have soared in recent years. The number of moped-related offences increased from 827 in 2012 to more than 23,000 in 2017. High-profile victims this year include comedian Michael McIntyre, Home Secretary Sajid Javid and children's author Annabel Karmel.

Last week, Britain's Got Talent judge Amanda Holden launched an appeal for information after a mother and child were threatened near her home. Posting shocking video footage of the attempted robbery on social media,

she condemned the "scumbags" and praised workmen who chased them away.

Last month, a senior judge warned of an "alarming increase" in moped crime after putting two murderers behind bars for nearly 50 years. Judge Richard Marks QC jailed Nathan Gilmaney, 19, for life with a minimum of 27 years and Troy Thomas, 18, for 22 years. They stabbed 28-year-old charity worker Abdul Samad to death after pouncing on him in west London during a four-hour spree of violence.

## Bay City Rollers founder Alan Longmuir dead at 70

BAY City Rollers guitarist and co-founder Alan Longmuir has died at the age of 70, it was revealed this week.

Longmuir had recently returned to his native Edinburgh after reportedly falling ill while on holiday. His death was confirmed by the journalist Liam Rudden whose musical I Ran With The Gang features hits by the 1970s supergroup. He tweeted a statement from Longmuir's family which said: "We are devastated to share the news that Alan has passed away peacefully surrounded by family.

"He was an extraordinary man with

an extraordinary heart.

"He would humbly say he was 'just a plumber from Edinburgh who got lucky'. However, we are the lucky ones; the ones that were lucky enough to have Alan as part of our lives."

Longmuir formed the band that would become the Bay City Rollers with his brother Derek at the age of 17 in 1965. Dressed in their distinctive tartan outfits, the Rollers had a massive teen following, selling more than 100 million records with upbeat pop tunes like Bye Bye Baby and Shang-A-Lang.

Longmuir left the band in 1976 but later joined

his former band-mates on several occasions for reunion gigs and tours.

He died three weeks after being flown home from Mexico by air ambulance. He fell ill after contracting a virus while on holiday with his wife, Eileen.

Les McKeown told the BBC News Channel that he had visited his former bandmate in hospital to offer "moral support".

"Alan was a true gentleman and a brilliant musician," he said. "He was a brilliant guy, never had a bad word to say about anyone. We are all going to miss him so much.

"We have been in tears...

the last 48 hours have been really bad emotionally."

Mr Longmuir's friend and biographer, Liam Rudden, described him on Twitter as "one of the most gentle, generous and kind-hearted people I've ever known".

He added that he

"touched the lives of all he met with a smile that made them feel special".

Longmuir was always a down to earth sort, and he returned to working as a plumber after his Rollers' earnings had dwindled. From 2000 until retirement he was a bylaws inspector.

He viewed his global success in the 1970s with wry humour, saying in 2008: "I remember sitting at the bar of the Beverly Hills hotel – there was Patrick Magee, Barbra Streisand, David Soul – and Alan Longmuir, the plumber from Edinburgh."

# Puppet legend behind Bagpuss and The Clangers dead at 89

■ Peter Firmin also created Basil Brush, Noggin and Nog and Pogles' Wood

**TRIBUTES** flooded in this week for Peter Firmin, the creator of TV classic *The Clangers*, who has died aged 89.

Firmin created several children's favourites – including Bagpuss, Basil Brush and Ivor The Engine – with skilfully-crafted characters such as the Soup Dragon and Iron Chicken. He died at his Kent home on Monday following a short illness.

The Clangers' production company Coolabi said: "During a career spanning six decades Peter worked with great skill in a remarkably wide variety of creative disciplines as a fine artist, craftsman and author."

During a productive three decade spell Firming

created the cheeky fox Basil Brush with Ivan Owen and worked with business partner Oliver Postgate on Bagpuss, *The Clangers*, *Ivor The Engine*, *Noggin The Nog* and *Pogles' Wood*. Bagpuss was voted the most popular BBC children's programme ever in 1999 and Firmin was honoured with a Bafta Lifetime Achievement Award in 2014. Bafta credited him as having helped "lay the foundations" of today's television industry. Play School presenter Baroness Floella Benjamin said he "created magic to stimulate kids' minds through his creative vision".

The world Firmin and Postgate created during their 30-year partnership involved a crude but

innovative animation system. Characters were moved by magnets positioned under a table that acted as the set – in a studio established inside disused cowshed at firmin's farmhouse in Blean, near Canterbury. Postgate came up with programme ideas, wrote the scripts, directed and produced them, and provided the narration, while Firmin designed the characters – whether drawings, models or puppets – and sets.

Their first major success, *Ivor the Engine* (1959-64), the story of a Welsh steam engine that wanted to sing in a male-voice choir, was Firmin and Postgate's first series made by their own production company, Smallfilms.

The 32 black-and-white episodes commissioned by ITV were so popular that, a decade later, *Ivor the Engine* was revived by the BBC for 40 colour films (1976-77).

An even bigger hit was Bagpuss (1974). It featured a pink-and-white-striped "saggy, old, cloth cat, baggy and a bit loose at the seams" in just 13 episodes that were repeated regularly

for 13 years – but one of the secrets of its success was the result of an error. "I drew a picture of a marmalade cat," Firmin told the journalist Richard Webber. "I then asked a company in Kent to produce some marmalade-striped material, but a mistake with the chemicals left it pink!"

The cat's owner, Emily (based on one of Firmin's daughters), collects objects for her "shop", Bagpuss & Co, but nothing is for sale. She puts them in the old-fashioned window alongside Bagpuss, who sleeps there on a cushion until woken from his slumber by Emily's magic words, spoken entrancingly by Postgate at the start of every

episode: Bagpuss, dear Bagpuss / Old, fat, furry cat-puss / Wake up and look at this thing that I bring / Wake up, be bright / Be golden and light / Bagpuss, oh hear what I sing.

One of Firmin's own favourites among the programmes he made with Postgate was *The Clangers* (1969-74), featuring small, pink, knitted, mouse-like creatures living on a blue moon, with neighbours including the Soup Dragon and the Froglets – and the first of their productions to be made in colour. Firmin designed the characters and his wife, Joan (nee Clapham, whom he married in 1952), knitted them.

## 'Shock' split for Cheryl and Liam

A source told *The Sun*: "At the end of the day, they're totally different people who don't have loads in common."

"Liam wants to make his pop career work, so he's happy to fly all over the world and keep in



touch by FaceTime.

He's obsessed with social media and putting his life on there – he loves being famous.

"Cheryl on the other hand, is very private and her number one priority

is Bear."

The insider continued: "She always puts him first, and loves to stay at home with him. In the end, they just didn't have much in common."

The pair announced their break up on earlier this week, a source confirmed to *The Sun* that while Liam was still regularly seeing their one year old son Bear, he had moved out of the mansion they owned together in Surrey.

Posting to his 33 million Twitter followers, Liam said: "Cheryl and I are sad to announce that we are going our separate ways."

"It's been a tough decision for us to make. We still have so much love for each other as a family."

"Bear is our world and we ask that you respect his privacy as we navigate our way through this together."

While Cheryl echoed his words, sharing the same message with her 6.42 million fans.

Check everything out thoroughly before you sign anything. Things often appear a lot more tempting than they should be. Also you very much get what you pay for here.

# Exclusive: BW Interview with Shetland Star Douglas Henshall

As popular for its stunning scenery as its suspenseful mysteries, British crime drama series "Shetland" is back with all new episodes.

Returning to US screens on KCET from July 9, the show stars Douglas Henshall as Detective Inspector Jimmy Perez who solves crimes in the beautiful but remote Shetland Islands in Scotland.

The 52-year-old Scottish actor, known for a string of roles from Primeval to Outlander, talks to our Sandro Monetti about the series becoming so popular on both sides of the pond and why he fancies being the next UK star to crack America.

**How much does your show's unique setting contribute to its success?** I love that people all over the world are getting to see how beautiful the isles are through our stories and may get encouraged to visit and explore for themselves. It's safer than it looks in our show! I think it's interesting how people interact with their landscape and our stories are all anchored in where they take place and the benefits and challenges that presents. It may surprise you to know that Shetland isn't as Scottish as you would think. Both Orkney and Shetland

were Danish until the mid-15th century and were mortgaged to Scotland as part of a marriage treaty between James II of Scotland and Princess Margaret of Denmark. A lot of the people there now still think of themselves as more Norse than Scots. They're Vikings!

**Do American audiences respond to the show differently than British fans?**

The support that the show has had both online and personally has been quite overwhelming from audiences worldwide. I suppose the main difference is that Americans seem to pay more attention to the scenery than Brits do which I guess is natural.

**Where do you stand on the debate of which is better between British and American TV?**

There are great merits in both British and American TV. I guess what people tend to like are those things that seem different or exotic to their own experience. Also we only see maybe the top 5% of each other's tv and judge each other on that, ignoring the enormous amount of stinkers we both make.

**You are in an enviable space as an actor to have done so many different**

roles, and been great every time, without ever being typecast. Has this been a deliberate strategy?

First of all thank you. I wanted to explore myself as much as possible through acting and the only way I saw of doing that was to play as many different types of people as I could. The benefits of that were that to a degree I avoided being typecast but the downside to that was that some people didn't know where to place me so I maybe missed out on some things that I could've done. Having said all that I seem to have played a lot of policeman lately, however given how much crime drama is commissioned these days I suppose it's unavoidable and I'm lucky in that I really like the one I'm playing.

**What are both the challenges and opportunities of playing a nice guy detective?**

The challenge is to try and make being a decent guy trying to do the right thing interesting. And I think the opportunity is to show that those qualities are difficult to maintain and come at a cost.

**In this era of Me Too and Time's Up, is DI Perez a good role model for men?**

I could say a lot about this.



HENSHALL: "Shetland is not as Scottish as you would think..."

Jimmy Perez is a feminist in the basic sense that he genuinely likes women and I think one of the things that #MeToo has highlighted, is that there are a disturbing number of men who don't.

**What ambitions remain**

**for you in your career and are there any particular roles you long for out here in Hollywood?**

To keep working and to remain relevant as an actor is about all I wish for. I would love to work in America. I think Deadwood was probably

my favorite ever American tv show so if David Milch is reading this can I please come and work with you?

## Sweden 'more difficult than Brazil' - Sven

**Former England manager Sven-Goran Eriksson says Saturday's World Cup quarter-final against Sweden will be "their most difficult game so far".**

The 70-year-old Swede (above), who led the English to the last eight of the 2002 and 2006 World Cups, believes his home nation possess similar attributes to England's Euro 2016 conquerors Iceland.

And Eriksson warned that Gareth Southgate's side may have been better off facing tournament favorites Brazil rather than Sweden.

"England have a great chance to make a World Cup semi-final," Eriksson said in quotes reported by the Mirror. "But, if anyone in the squad thinks they have an easy game on Saturday, they're wrong.

"It'll be the most difficult game they'll have played so far, they can bet on that.

"It would be easier for England to beat Brazil than to beat Sweden, in my opinion.

"Sweden will be more or less the same as Iceland in Euro 2016 - they don't have the best footballers in the world, and none of our players would play in the first team of the biggest clubs in the world since Zlatan (Ibrahimovic) has left."

Eriksson added that Janne Andersson's side - who eliminated Holland and Italy in qualifying and topped the group which defending champions Germany finished bottom of - would be hard to break down despite the threat of tournament top-scorer Harry Kane.

"As a team, the way they work together, they are one of the best," he added. "Sweden today are a very hard team to break down.

"Their strikers are defenders when it's time to defend, and they can defend in their own box as well.

"You won't find a better team - Sweden are world champions of team spirit.

"Harry Kane will be a tougher challenge than they're used to,

but Sweden won't be impressed by Kane - or whoever is in the England team. Not at all.

"I can see a draw and extra-time. England have set-pieces, Sweden will make some chances, but the game will come down to luck - the team that makes the most of their luck will win. It will be very tight.

"Many teams have tried to break down Sweden. Italy couldn't score in 180 minutes in the qualifying play-offs. Germany struggled in the group stage and needed Toni Kroos' free-kick to save them. Switzerland could have played for a week and still not scored against Sweden.

"The defence is a great strength. Especially from set-pieces. Sweden are a tall team at the back and very well organised.

"Both teams will have the problem of scoring. It's a good thing that England are scoring from corners, penalties and free-kicks, and they look very dangerous from these all the time."

## Sterling reveals extent of Colombia provocation

**RAHEEM STERLING has revealed the full extent of Colombia's unscrupulous campaign aimed at unsettling him and his England teammates, on and off the pitch.**

The Manchester City striker was targeted for some rough treatment not only by the South American players but also one of Jose Pekerman's back-room staff at half-time in an often bad-tempered last-16 tie. As Sterling jogged towards the tunnel to the dressing room at the break he was barged by a Colombia coach who had been giving him verbal abuse every time he came across to the touchline for a swig of water.

"There were a couple of times when I went over for a drinks break and he kept saying something," he said. "Obviously I don't speak Spanish so I didn't

understand but then there was half-time too. I just remember running in and someone stepped in front of me. I just kind of looked back at him.

"But we knew their game plan and exactly what they were trying to do. We knew what would get thrown at us and that was kind of silly from him. We just kept going, blacked that out and focused on the football.

"They're a physical team. They were trying to do everything they could to get into our heads but we kept cool heads and that's the most important thing."

At one point in the first half, Colombia's 6ft 5ins central defender Yerry Mina climbed on Sterling's back. And another defender gave him a dig in the ribs which sent him sprawling in the penalty area - an incident missed by referee Mark Geiger

and his assistants. Jordan Henderson was butted in the chest and chin by Wilmar Barrios, who escaped with a yellow card, while an angry pack of Colombia players tried to unnerve Harry Kane before his 57th-minute spot-kick by protesting to the referee for nearly four minutes, raking the penalty spot with their studs and shouting taunts into his ear. But Sterling revealed that Gareth Southgate had warned his players exactly what to expect and ordered them not to react. Colombia ended up with six cautions, England two.

"We knew it would be a battle," said Sterling. "South American teams are really passionate and they give their all for their country, same as we do.

"It's up to the ref to clamp down on it and we can't really get involved in it. I thought we dealt with the situation really well."

## Football's most famous cheat whines about England win

**England committed a "monumental robbery" in beating Colombia in the last 16 at the World Cup, according to Argentina legend Diego Maradona.**

Colombia captain Radamel Falcao also accused referee Mark Geiger of bias towards England, calling the American's performance "shameful".

Geiger often struggled

to control a feisty encounter in Moscow, which England won on penalties.

"This situation was undermining us," said Falcao.

Former drug addict Maradona, who is best known for the most famous piece of cheating in World Cup history, felt Geiger should have penalized Harry Kane for a foul on Colombia's

Carlos Sanchez instead of awarding the penalty that allowed the England captain to open the scoring just before the hour mark in Moscow.

"Here's a gentleman who decides, a referee who, if you Google him, shouldn't be given a match of this magnitude... Geiger, an American, what a coincidence," Maradona added.

# England 'write their own stories'

■ **SOUTHGATE: "We don't have to be bowed by the pressure of the past"**

England's players will not be "bowed by the pressure of the past", said manager Gareth Southgate after they beat Colombia on penalties to set up a World Cup quarter-final against Sweden.

The nailbiting round of 16 victory saw England's first shootout victory in a World Cup after defeats in 1990, 1998 and 2006.

Eric Dier scored the winning spot-kick after Jordan Pickford saved Carlos Bacca's effort in Moscow.

"Today was a special night for every Englishman," Southgate said.

"The fans that were here were outnumbered but I'm delighted for them and everyone at home.

"We're trying to write our own history, and I've talked to the players about that. They write their own stories. We don't have to be bowed by the pressure of the past.

"This was special but I want us to go on. I don't want to go home yet."

Before the game, England had won only two World Cup knockout matches since 1990 and looked to be making it three when captain Harry Kane gave them the lead from the penalty spot.

But in the third minute of stoppage time at the Spartak Stadium, Colombia defender Yerry Mina headed home to take the game into extra time and then to penalties.

Jordan Henderson's effort was saved by David Ospina, but Colombia's Mateus Uribe hit the crossbar before Pickford dived to his right to deny Bacca with his left hand.

England will play Sweden, who beat Switzerland 1-0 earlier on Tuesday, at 15:00 BST in Samara on Saturday.

"Fantastic," said Southgate. "We deserved

it as well. We played so well in the 90 minutes.

"We showed resilience to come back from huge disappointment and kept calm. It's huge credit to all our players and staff.

"Shootouts are tough. We had talked long and hard about owning the process of a shootout. They kept calm. The players have taken it all on board. It's a special moment for us.

"We looked at technique, how we needed to be as a team, the goalkeeper's role.

"But now I'm thinking about Sweden. They are another team we have a poor record against. We have underestimated them for years."

England have their best chance to reach this sport's most prestigious occasion since the despair of losing to Germany on penalties in the semi-final in Turin at Italia 90.

Sweden's recent record confirms that complacency will be folly, but there is also no escaping that this group of England players - who survived the hothouse of Moscow's Spartak Stadium as the massed ranks of Colombian fans virtually took over the arena in a blaze of sound and fury - have been presented with what may just be a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity.

The next 10 days in Russia could be a case of now or never.

England have still not hit top form in Russia - an observation some might find churlish, but one that is supported by the evidence of the four games they have played.

Tunisia were stubborn but limited and England only won in injury time. Panama were appalling. Belgium faced England's shadow squad - and there were still times when they drifted in what was an

attritional, argumentative meeting with Colombia.

England now face a familiar foe in Sweden - a team which one long-time Sweden follower described this squad as humble, hard-working, superbly organised under the astute coach Janne Andersson and fully united as the charismatic Zlatan Ibrahimovic offers his observations from the sidelines.

Sweden are defensively sound and usually operate a 4-4-2 formation. Andreas Granqvist is their captain and central defensive foundation alongside Victor Lindelof, who has belied his struggles at Manchester United with his performances in Russia, demonstrating why Jose Mourinho was so keen to acquire him.

They also have creativity from Emil Forsberg, but base camp for Sweden is a well-drilled and disciplined approach that England will find difficult to break down.

They have the confidence of eliminating the Netherlands in qualifying and beating Italy in a play-off to reach Russia. This is a

team without fear of playing the elite names of international football.

As ever, though, Sweden's strength is the collective and, under

Andersson, will present England with the toughest of challenges in Samara.
