

They could have killed 30 more, claims Fred West's daughter

■ Speaking on *Good Morning Britain*, Mae West revealed how she would be locked up with bucket at night and the lightbulb would be removed from her room.

THE daughter of serial killers Fred and Rose West has revealed that she believes her parents killed 30 women more than those known to police.

Speaking of growing up in the "House of Horrors" at 25 Cromwell Street, Gloucester, Mae West, 46, said she was haunted by her mother's refusal to make a confession.

Ms West said: "People ask me this, 'Do you think he stopped?' and I don't think he did. I think he stopped using the house."

Asked how many women she believed her parents murdered she said "altogether maybe 30 more".

Ms West told how she was brutally beaten by her mother and sexually abused by her father as she grew up. The second of eight children the couple had together, her older sister Heather, 16, and step-sister Charmaine, eight, were among the 11 known victims of Fred West. Her father killed himself while on remand in prison on New Year's Day 1995. Rose West maintained her innocence, but was convicted of 10 murders and has been told she will never be released

from prison.

Ms West, a married mother-of-two, kept in touch with her mother for 10 years after she was jailed in 1995. At first she convinced herself her mother was innocent, but she eventually faced up to the truth. Speaking to Susanna Reid on *Good Morning Britain*, she said: "I just wish mum said her part in it, confess to what her part is, just to give closure to everybody."

Asked if she ever feared she would be killed by her parents, Ms West said: "I was probably better off if just left on the street... You were not safe in that house."

Of sexual abuse by her

father she said: "If you knew he was coming home you'd make sure you had jeans on, go to bed fully dressed, or we'd get up early in the morning dressed before, because he'd just come into the room and rip the covers off."

Describing life in the house and beatings from her mother who worked as a prostitute, Ms West told how she would be at home when her parents were "doing things" to other girls. She said: "They would lock us in the basement. These must have been times they were doing things."

"They would give you a bucket at night and the light bulb would be taken out and the doors locked. "We had tenants. It was normal to see people coming in and out. With Heather, we thought she had run away."

But she added of growing up in the house: "There was a lot of normality to it. Then there was the other side that wasn't and we didn't obviously see a lot of things."

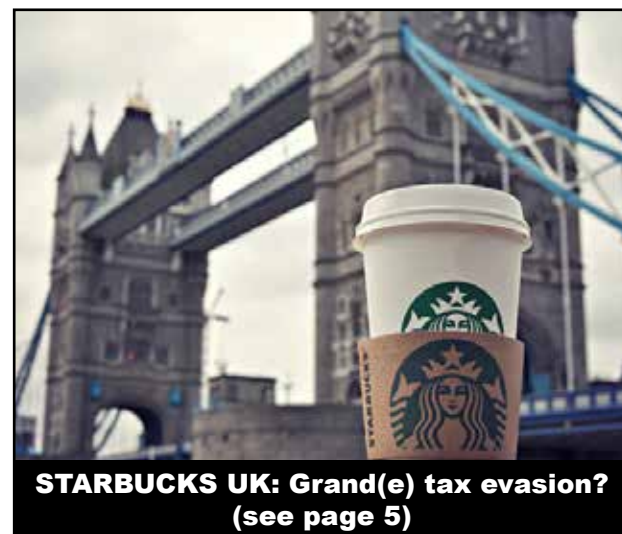
And Ms West said of her father: "Sometimes he was funny and we used to look forward to him coming home from work. I did think he was definitely strange." Ms West said her own son had never asked "Where's your mum and dad?" and that her daughter had "never really talked about it".

She said: "My daughter did go to a Halloween fancy dress ball and they [other party guests] went as mum and dad... they actually dressed as Fred and Rose West."

Gloucestershire Police said it would consider

reopening the case if "new or compelling evidence" emerged. But Assistant Chief Constable Julian Moss

said: "All reasonable lines of inquiry were explored at the time and there are no new ones for us to investigate."

Tottering Theresa swatted down by EU leaders yet AGAIN

■ PM ambushed as Tusk dismisses Chequers plan

Theresa May is battling to salvage her Brexit strategy and facing a fresh Tory revolt after being humiliated by European leaders on Thursday.

In an ambush that blindsided British officials, Donald Tusk, the European Council president, dismissed her Chequers proposals as unworkable after a private meeting of national leaders.

President Macron of France warned the prime minister that she must come up with "new propositions" if she wanted to rescue a deal.

The rejection at the Salzburg meeting triggered a crisis in government, with some cabinet ministers considering attempting to bounce Mrs May into abandoning Chequers within days.

Sajid Javid, the home secretary, Andrea Leadsom, leader of the House, Penny Mordaunt, international development secretary, and Esther McVey, the work and pensions secretary, are among those who believe a deal closer to that which Canada has with the EU would be preferable to the current

government proposal.

"She needs to drop the language of Chequers," a cabinet minister said.

A pro-European Conservative MP said that the prime minister's domestic "credibility" had been badly damaged. "The question is, how on earth does she survive this? It strengthens the hand of the Brexiters and calls into question her leadership in a way that wasn't the case 48 hours ago."

'positive elements'

David Davis, the former Brexit secretary, is to publish his alternative plan for a free-trade deal before this month's Tory conference in a move designed to further embarrass Mrs May.

Nicky Morgan, chairwoman of the Treasury select committee, said: "Chequers has been in difficulty for some time. We all hoped she would at least get engagement, if not agreement, in Salzburg."

The prime minister had sought to secure warm words from EU leaders about her Brexit vision but was instead warned that she must find a solution for the Irish border issue within three weeks or risk

a no-deal Brexit.

Mr Tusk said: "Everybody shared the view that while there are positive elements in the Chequers proposal, the suggested framework for economic co-operation will not work."

The Chequers plan would keep Britain following EU rules on goods but not services. Its customs arrangement would see the UK collect EU tariffs to avoid a hard Irish border.

Downing Street admitted that Mrs May had been caught off guard. Even in her private meeting with Mr Tusk, he had not given her any indication of the level of criticism he was about to make. "Maybe this was a ploy to get us to move further," a senior government source said. "But it is a mistake because we don't have the political space or inclination to change."

moderate stance

Mrs May was defiant in a tetchy press conference, insisting that her model of a UK-EU free-trade area was the only credible proposal on the table. She flatly rejected a European Commission backstop proposal for Northern

Ireland to remain within the EU customs area after Brexit, arguing that this would draw a border down the Irish Sea. She will bring forward alternative proposals of

her own in the coming weeks.

The tougher EU stance is being seen as a victory for Mr Macron against the moderate stance advocated by countries

such as the Netherlands. Mr Macron went on to attack Brexit as a "choice of the British people pushed by those who predicted easy solutions. . . Those people are liars."

'Pedo' diver sues Tesla boss

THE BRITISH cave diver branded "pedo guy" by billionaire Elon Musk is suing him for defamation.

Mr Musk, 47, has made repeated accusations against Vernon Unsworth, who helped rescue 12 teenagers from a flooded cave in Thailand in July. He claimed Mr Unsworth was a "child rapist" and had moved to Thailand to find a child bride. The lawsuit seeks £57,000 in compensation and an injunction against Mr

Musk to stop further allegations.

The document states Mr Unsworth, 63, was seeking "punitive damages" plus compensation "to punish Mr Musk for his wrongdoing and deter him from repeating such heinous conduct".

It states Mr Musk used Twitter and emails to "publish to the world false and defamatory accusations". The CEO of Tesla and SpaceX has 22.5 million followers. The action was filed in Los

Angeles federal court and a separate suit will follow in London. After the original accusation in mid-July Mr Musk apologized and deleted the tweets. The row between the pair broke out over Mr Musk's offer of a mini-submarine to help with the rescue of the boys and their football coach. Mr Unsworth, who is from Lancashire but lives in Thailand with his girlfriend, 40, dismissed the offer as a "PR stunt". The boys were rescued after 18 days on July 10.

"Croydon cat killer" just cars, insists the Yard

Scotland Yard has closed the case of the so-called 'Croydon cat killer' after detectives concluded the killing and mutilation of cats could be attributed to cars and foxes, rather than humans.

Reports of decapitated cats with their tails hacked off first raised fears of a sadistic serial animal killer terrorising south London, and there were ultimately hundreds of reports around the country.

However, after a three-year investigation the Met said there was no evidence that any of the cats had been killed by a human. Instead, detectives found

CCTV evidence that foxes were responsible for some of the killings, and placed emphasis on expert opinion that wildlife was known to scavenge on-road kill, often removing the heads and tails of dead animals.

The Met tweeted on Thursday: "The cats were killed due to major blunt force trauma consistent with vehicle collisions. Scavenging foxes then mutilated body parts — especially heads and tails."

Fears of a serial cat killer were first raised in 2015 after up to 30 cats turned up mutilated in Croydon, some on their

owners' doorsteps.

Martin Clunes, the actor who was educated in the borough, was among a string of celebrities who lent their weight to a public campaign to try to catch the killer.

He wrote in February 2016: "I read with horror that some of the cats had been decapitated and dismembered — this is the stuff of nightmares."

The Met said, however, no evidence of human involvement was found in any of the reported cases, and there were no witnesses, no identifiable patterns and no forensic leads that pointed to human involvement.

Good night for the Brits at the Emmys

■ Newton, Foy, Rhys and Brooker all pick up gongs in glitzy LA ceremony

BRITISH TALENT enjoyed another banner night at this week's Emmy Awards with Claire Foy and Thandie Newton taking top awards with other nods going to Stephen Daldry for directing *The Crown* and Charlie Brooker for *Black Mirror*.

Claire got the lead actress nod for playing the young Queen Elizabeth II in the hit Netflix show *The Crown*. She dedicated her Emmy to co-star Matt Smith, who played Prince Philip. And Thandie won best supporting actress in a drama series for her turn as the rebellious host Maeve in the sci-fi action thriller *Westworld*.

In the best one-liner of the night at the 70th annual Emmy Awards at the Microsoft Theater in Los Angeles on Monday, the 45-year-old accepted the accolade with the quip: "I don't believe in God, but I'm going to thank her."

Welsh actor Matthew Rhys won best actor for his part in the Cold War thriller *The Americans*.

Brooker attended the ceremony with his wife, British TV presenter Konnie Huq, while picking up the prize for a limited series, movie or dramatic special for his subversive Channel 4 series *Black Mirror*. Brooker has established

himself as one of the hottest writers in the entertainment business with the show, whose three series of stand-alone episodes feature misuses of technology in a dystopian future. Brooker,

who won two awards last year for the same show, got his start as a video game reviewer before moving onto the Channel 4 satire *The 11 O'Clock Show* in 2001. He met his current wife Huq, 43, in

2008 when she starred in an episode of his Channel 4 series *Screenwipe*.

Konnie is well known in her own right, having been the longest-serving female *Blue Peter* presenter from 1997 to 2008 and is also a

host of the *Xtra Factor*.

The couple married in 2010 at the Little White Wedding Chapel in Las Vegas after nine months of dating. They have two children - Covey, five, and four-year-old Huxley.

Brucie raking it in right to the end...

TV LEGEND Sir Bruce Forsyth was raking in a fortune to his last breath, accounts revealed this week.

The game show giant died in August 2017, aged 89, but his production company's accounts show that for the 12 months to October last year he had built up £5.56 million in cash.

His wife Lady Wilnelia took over control of Bruce Forsyth Promotions a month before he died. The move was all part of the TV funnyman's plan to have a last laugh at the taxman's expense. Bruce left £11.5 million to Wilnelia in his will while his son and five daughters inherited nothing. That is because money passed from husband to wife is not subject to inheritance tax. Wilnelia, a former Miss World who Bruce married in 1983, was then free to give away £650,000 without paying extra in tax. Bruce, who

hosted *Strictly Come Dancing*, *The Generation Game*, *Play Your Cards Right*, *The Price Is Right* and *Sunday Night At The London Palladium* during a 75-year television career, had spoken out against inheritance tax two years before his death.

He told the *Radio Times*: "I think your inheritance should go to your children more than back to the country that you've lived in."

Bruce left £100,000 in trust to be split between his nine grandchildren when they reach the age of 21 and £20,000 each

to two executors of his estate. Everything else in his £11,718,242 estate, after funeral and legal expenses, went to Wilnelia, 60.

A spokesman for his estate said previously: "All I would say is that I think 99.9 per cent of married people would do this."

Had the entertainer left his fortune to anyone other than his wife or charity, 40 per cent inheritance tax would have been due on everything over £325,000. That could have handed the taxman £4.57 million - reducing the amount Bruce's family would have inherited to £7.13 million. Bruce earned £650,000 a series while hosting *Strictly* and he continued to earn cash from re-runs of his old shows around the world. He once described hosting game shows as "money for old rope", adding: "You can do a series in two weeks then take as much time off as you like."

'It was awkward not to'

■ New book reveals why the Queen shook hand of ex-IRA chief Martin McGuinness

When the Queen shook hands with the former IRA commander Martin McGuinness during a visit to Northern Ireland in 2012, it was a historic moment that symbolized the progress towards peace that had been made since the dark days of the Troubles.

Now, six years later, the Queen's thoughts on that symbolic gesture of reconciliation have been revealed.

Did she consider it a defining moment in history? An image that summed up the triumph of hope and understanding over hatred and violence? A touching rapprochement between former foes?

No, she just thought it would be awkward if she did not shake his hand.

Her thoughts are revealed by David Cameron in a new book about the Queen by the journalist and broadcaster Robert Hardman. Mr Cameron, who was prime minister at the

time, said he told the Queen that her encounter with McGuinness, then Northern Ireland's deputy first minister, at a charity event in Belfast during her Diamond Jubilee tour had been a great milestone of modern diplomacy. As he told the author: "I think it was the most transformative bit of diplomacy I have seen. It was amazing."

faintly embarrassed

However, the Queen's reply to Mr Cameron, wrote Hardman, summed up her "modest, no-nonsense approach" to a job she has been doing longer than most people can remember. "What was I meant to do?" she said. "Of course I shook his hand. It would be awkward not to."

Mr Cameron also disclosed that the Queen was faintly embarrassed by the adulation she received after her handshake with the man Hardman described as "the leader of an

organisation that had once been hell-bent on exterminating her entire family".

Mr Cameron said: "She was, as ever, not sure what all the fuss was about."

The book, *Queen of The World*, reveals how McGuinness was the one who was anxious to meet the Queen, with Sinn Fein making a specific request for him to be included in the official line-up. His enthusiasm was in contrast to Sinn Fein's attitude during her state visit to the Irish Republic the previous year - the first time she had ever been to the south - when its policy was to have nothing to do with the Queen.

When the Sinn Fein mayor of Cashel, Michael Browne, who was terminally ill in 2011, shook hands with the Queen as she passed through the town on her way to Cork, the Sinn Fein hierarchy was so furious that he was suspended from the party.

Gerry Adams, who was

the leader of Sinn Fein, was sceptical at the time about the state visit, suggesting that Irish people were "disappointed" that the Queen had not fully apologised for Britain's role in Irish affairs.

Sir Julian King, then the ambassador to Dublin, told Hardman: "Sinn Fein recognised that they hadn't caught the mood because there were some huge approval ratings for the visit - 80 or 90 per cent. Among Sinn Fein supporters there was a massive majority too." There was often cynicism about big state occasions "but this definitely caught a moment. An Irish friend

said to me that it was 'OK to feel good about the Brits'".

In 2012 Sir Julian had become director-general of the Northern Ireland Office. Shortly before the Queen's visit to Belfast, he received an extraordinary phone call. Sinn Fein, it turned out, would not be hostile to the visit: in fact, they wondered if there might be any chance of a royal introduction.

"They realised they had misread the public mood," he said. "Gerry Adams and Martin McGuinness reached out - to say would it be possible to meet the Queen at some point?"

After the meeting

was agreed Mr Adams said that it was about "moving beyond rhetoric to reach out" to unionists as a "gesture of respect". He said: "It is a very significant step and I think it may bring us into a different phase, into a new platform which can be built upon."

Years later McGuinness, who died last year, told a BBC documentary: "I liked her courage in agreeing to meet me. I liked the engagements that I've had with her. There's nothing I have seen in my engagements with her that this is someone I should dislike - I like her."

British man 'murdered wife at sea to collect inheritance'

A British man murdered his wife and deliberately sank the couple's catamaran near the Bahamas in a bid to inherit her estate, prosecutors claimed this week.

Lewis Bennett, 41, was charged with second-degree murder on the high seas in the May 2017 disappearance of Isabella Hellmann, 41, of Delray Beach, Florida, in February. Bennett and his wife were on a delayed honeymoon to St. Maarten, Puerto Rico and Cuba.

Hellmann's family allegedly bugged her apartment in Delray Beach to listen to Bennett's conversations because they believed he was involved in her disappearance. The

Guardian reported, citing court papers.

A Miami federal judge was asked to admit conversations between Hellmann and her family, which they are believed to have discussed arguments over a potential move to Australia, financial struggles and the raising of their daughter, the newspaper reported. Prosecutor Benjamin Greenberg said the conversations show the couple were constantly arguing.

"Hellmann's murder would remove the marital strife from the defendant's life, allow the defendant to live his life as he pleased, and would enable him to inherit money from Hellmann's estate, all

of which provide strong circumstantial proof that the defendant had a strong motive to murder Hellmann," Greenberg said.

life raft

Bennett would inherit Hellman's apartment and bank account should she be declared dead, according to The Guardian. Her body has yet to be found.

The FBI said in an affidavit in February that financial greed was the likely motive behind Hellman's murder. The document also noted that Bennett did nothing to search for his wife, but he did rescue a tea set.

Bennett told investigators the night Hellman disappeared he had gone below deck

on their boat near Cay Sal Bank, Bahamas, to sleep around 8 p.m., activated autopilot and left Hellmann to keep watch. The FBI said he falsely stated she disappeared after the supposed accident. Investigators said they found evidence Bennett intentionally tried to sink the boat.

Bennett almost immediately got into a life raft with luggage and other items and took no actions to find his wife, the FBI said.

Prosecutors also said Hellman may have discovered he was in possession of rare coins stolen from a former employer in St. Maarten, which may have made her an accomplice to a crime. An argument over



Lewis Bennett with his late wife, Isabella Hellmann the coins "potentially led to an intense argument resulting in Hellman's murder," Greenberg said.

Bennett admitted to

transporting the coins and was sentenced to seven months in jail.

Bennett is set to go to trial in the murder case in December.

Huge rise in sex change requests

A DRAMATIC rise has been seen in the number of girls asking for a sex change to become boys.

Requests for female to male gender reassignment have increased by 4,000 per cent in the past decade.

Now a probe has been ordered by the Cabinet Equalities Minister Penny Mordaunt.

New official figures reveal the number of children referred for gender "transitioning" treatment – including hormone injections – has risen from 97 in 2009/10 to 2,519 in 2017/18. The biggest increase has come among girls with numbers up from 40 to 1,806 – a rise of 4,415 per cent – compared with 57 to 713 for boys. Forty-five of the children involved were under six.

A source in the Government Equalities Office said at the weekend: "There has been a substantial increase in the number of individuals assigned female at birth being referred to the NHS.

"There is evidence that this trend is happening in many other countries as well. Little is known, however, about why this is and what are the long-term impacts."

Another source said: "Is it, to put it crudely, that young girls simply think modern life would be easier to bear if they were boys?"

The issue of making it easier for children and teenagers to transition has come as the Government considers plans to reform the Gender Recognition Act. This will allow people to self-identify as a sex different to the one they were identified as at birth.

Who's bitter now? Village pub becomes first in UK to ban cash

A VILLAGE pub has become the first in the UK to ban cash, with drinkers having to pay for drinks and meals by card or on smartphones. But while many locals welcome the move, others say it is unfair to older people who prefer cash or don't have bank cards.

The Boot in Freston, near Ipswich, has reopened as a trendy gastro pub after it was derelict for nine years. Landlord Mike Keen this week insisted the cashless policy – which will slash business costs – has been "a huge success". But villager Tom Young, 25, said: "The general consensus is that it is a bit of a ridiculous move.

"It is no problem for me – but some older people were saying before the pub reopened that they did not have cards so they would not be able to go in.

"I heard of a family

going for a grandfather's party and he didn't have a card so the people he was with had to sort out payment."

Parish council chairwoman Elizabeth Aldous, 72, welcomed the refurbished pub, which dates back to the 16th century. But she said there was concern that the card-only payment system may result in people drinking more.

She said: "One mother did comment on social media that it might tempt young people going out with £20 in their pocket and then spending far more on their cards."

But retired solicitor Tim McNeill, 69, of Sudbury, Suffolk, dining with his wife Kathleen, 68, said: "I use cards everywhere these days, so it is no inconvenience. In fact, I prefer using cards to cash."

Retired publisher Anne Ryland, 78, of Ipswich, said: "It is not a problem

at all. I would have used a card to pay for lunch anyway."

Mr Keen, 49, added: "There are massive benefits in going cashless as it saves a lot of money.

"We do not actually have a till so people cannot pay us cash even if they want to, but there has been a positive reaction

from customers.

"We have only had a handful of instances where people have found themselves unable to pay as they do not have a card with them."

Figures from UK Finance reveal that only 40 per cent of payments in the UK were made with cash in 2016, down from

62 per cent in 2006. The number is expected to fall to 21 per cent by 2026.

Scandinavian countries have been at the forefront of a cashless society a year or more, with a number of leading coffee houses in Sweden – including the market leader Espresso House – adopting a strict 'cash only' policy in 2017.

Brits in a froth as Starbucks pays just £4.5m tax on £162m profits

HIGH street coffee giant Starbucks was embroiled in a fresh tax row this week, amid new accusations it was not paying its fair share. The coffee chain's British-based business paid tax at a rate of just 2.8 per cent last year, it was claimed. Its UK-based European operation made a £162million profit and paid £4.5million in tax – but the UK corporation tax rate is 19 per cent.

But Starbucks Coffee Company (UK), which has four subsidiaries, said it had paid an effective rate of 25.3 per cent, equal to £13.7million. Critics say its mind-boggling business structure makes it almost impossible to work out if the correct amount of tax is being paid.

Tory MP Charlie Elphicke, a member of the Treasury select committee, said: "Shameless tax avoidance by big corporations leaves a bitter taste in the mouth.

"It's incredibly unfair on hardworking small business owners in high streets up and down the land who work tirelessly to make ends meet – and pay all their taxes."

Accounts to the end of October 2017, filed three months late, showed Starbucks' profits fell from £166million to £162million. The figure was boosted by a £114million dividend from a related company on which tax had already been paid. Filings for its main British business, Starbucks Coffee

Company (UK), showed a turnover of £372million but pre-tax profit was just £4.5million, which it blamed on "challenging" conditions and low consumer confidence. This part of the business paid £3.3million tax on the profits, effectively 73 per cent.

John O'Connell, chief executive of the TaxPayers' Alliance said: "Politicians need to stop waffling about tax evasion and simplify the law to make it easier to spot. The only way is radical reform."

Starbucks faced a huge backlash in 2012 after it paid just £8.6million corporation tax in Britain over 14 years, despite racking up £3billion in cumulative sales. As a result, it moved

its European HQ from Amsterdam to London. Earlier this year Starbucks boss Howard Schultz defended the low tax payments, claiming it was "very hard to make money in the UK".

The gulf between profit and tax for the company's European arm – 3,000 stores in 40 countries – is partly explained by tax breaks

from paying employees in shares and deductions on other expenses. A company spokesman said it met "all international tax standards and regulations", adding: "Starbucks' UK-headquartered businesses paid £13.7million of corporation tax in the year to October 2017, an effective tax rate of 25.3 per cent."

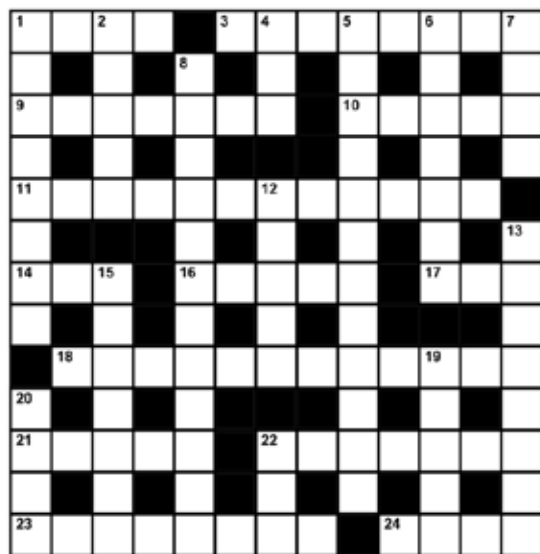

Battling those beastly robocalls...

My phone has not stopped ringing recently. Nine times out of ten it is one of those horrid robocalls.

I am registered on the Do Not Call Registry (donotcall.gov) but that doesn't seem to help very much, as they can only try to stop legitimate businesses from contacting you. But they can't prevent the scam calls which seem to be drastically on the rise. This summer, it was mostly the 'IRS' threatening legal action and telling me that if I didn't pay immediately I would be arrested. I smelled a rat straightaway, especially as I had just filed and paid my taxes. I can imagine it could be quite believable and scary if you were fairly new to the USA, or you actually did owe a big chunk in back

taxes.

Telemarketers are definitely getting craftier and it doesn't help that the advances in technology have given them the capability to make millions of autodialed calls daily. They can mask their identity too, so it appears on the caller ID as the official number of whoever they are claiming to be! These tricksters once phoned me from my own number! This month's top nuisance caller is claiming to be 'Apple Support'. So far I have let them go to voicemail even though it is very tempting to answer and give them a piece of my mind. The worst thing about these masquerade artists is that you can't block them as their real number is usually hidden

It got to the point where

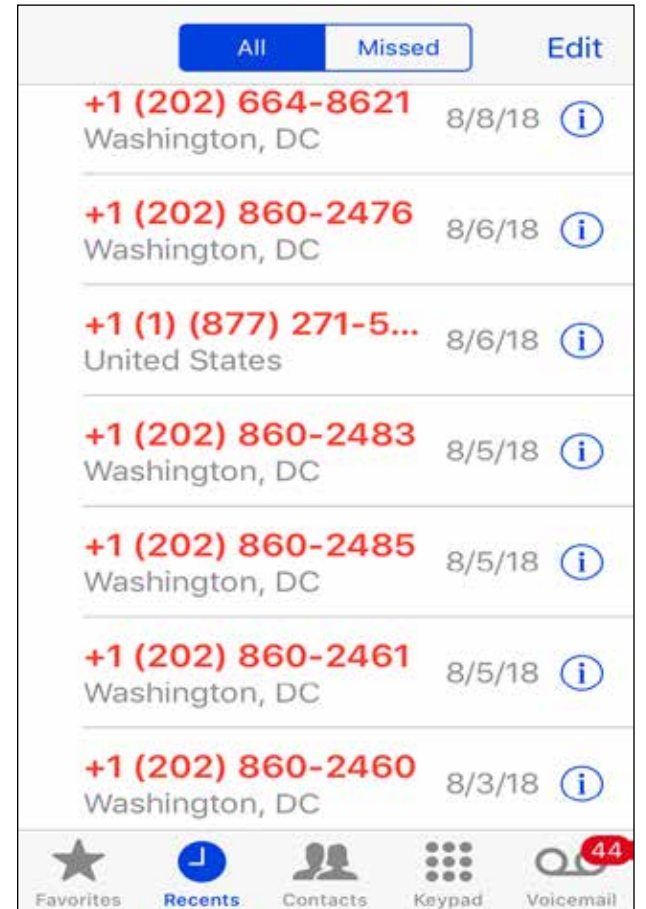


I usually kept my phone on silent unless I was expecting a call. But it turns out that there are a few things you can do to combat these swindlers. Firstly, try not to answer as this then confirms that the line is active and in use. If you do, just make sure to never give out any personal information. When in doubt just hang up. And always use the company's website to find an official number if you need to call them back. One of our members recommended nomorobo.com. This is a paid service but apparently works very well. But do make sure to check with your provider first as I just found out that mine (AT&T) offers the free fraudulent call blocker 'Call Protector'. Also worth checking out is the free app 'Hiya' (hiya.com).

If you find yourself receiving a lot of spam text messages, you can forward the message to the number 7726 (spells SPAM on you dial pad). It won't block the number from texting you right away, but it will allow your carrier to look into where it came from and put eventually put an end to it.

I'm not sure that it will override the 'Presidential Alert' texts that FEMA (fema.gov/emergency-test-alert) are due to be testing out on us on October 3rd either. The small print on their website says "Users may opt out of receiving alerts in the imminent threat and AMBER categories but cannot opt out of receiving Presidential alerts."

These messages are in



theory a great idea as it will quickly notify us of national emergencies, but of course lots of people are speculating that Trump may get a bit trigger-happy. Which isn't that far fetched if his Twitter account is anything to go by.

Let us know if you have any tips, or if you have heard of any new scams we should be on the look

out for. It is very easy to fall for them these days, so don't be too embarrassed if you do become a victim. Just make sure to report it, in the hope that you can help stop it happening to anyone else.

First peek at Coogan and Reilly as Stan and Ollie!

British comic Steve Coogan has had what most would consider a hit or miss career... But after seeing the first trailer for *Stan & Ollie*, do Oscars beckon?

Oo-er! The trailer for *Stan & Ollie* was unveiled earlier this week – and it offers a sneak peek at Coogan and Academy Award Nominee John C. Reilly in their portrayal of the legendary “black and white” comic duo. The film is directed by John S. Baird, best known for his 2013 Irvine Welsh

adaptation *Filth*, and written by Bafta-winner Jeff Pope.

It reunites Pope with Coogan for the first time since they co-wrote the Oscar-nominated screenplay for 2013’s *Philomena*.

Set for release in January next year, the biopic follows Stan Laurel (Coogan) and Oliver Hardy (Reilly) as they embark on a tour of Britain during the later stages of their career.

And I have to say, after watching it, the trailer definitely captures the magic of Laurel and

Hardy. I loved it!

The story follows the duo on the tour that soon became known as the beginning of the end

for the pair as it was far less successful than they had anticipated—with the comic legends being forced to confront some of their oldest gripes with each other as they play at half-empty venues.

In the first trailer, we’re given a brief look at their arrival in Britain, before

it focuses on the eventual turmoil that follows.

Laurel and Hardy made more than 100 films together from 1921-1951, before abandoning the screen for the stage, touring music halls around Britain and Ireland.

The film is set to debut at the closing night

premiere of the London Film Festival next month, before a wide release on January 11 2019.

Meanwhile, it was confirmed earlier this year that Coogan will reprise his most famous comic creation, returning to the BBC in 2019 with *This Time With Alan Partridge*.

City mauled by Lyon

Manchester City's Champions League campaign got off to a poor start as the Premier League champions suffered a surprise 2-1 defeat against Lyon at the Etihad Stadium on Wednesday night.

Maxwel Cornet drilled the French visitors ahead after Fabian Delph failed to cut out Nabil Fekir's cross.

City, who are favourites to win this season's competition with some bookmakers, fell further behind before half-time - Lyon captain Fekir finding the net from 25 yards after Fernandinho gave the ball away inside his own half.

Bernardo Silva gave the hosts a lifeline after being picked out by Leroy Sane, but City - lacklustre for long spells - were unable

to avoid a first defeat of the season.

With Group F rivals Shakhtar Donetsk and Hoffenheim drawing 2-2 in Ukraine earlier on Wednesday, City are bottom of the group.

They also became the first English side in Champions League history to lose four consecutive matches in the competition having also been beaten in last season's last-16 second leg by Basel, as well as both legs of the quarter-final against Liverpool.

French defender Aymeric Laporte headed against the outside of the post from Ilkay Gundogan's cross, while Gabriel Jesus and Sergio Aguero were denied by excellent saves from Anthony Lopes.

City, however, appeared to miss Pep Guardiola's direction from the sidelines.

The City boss watched his side's wretched performance from a seat high in the stand as he served a touchline ban following his sending-off in last season's Champions League quarter-final defeat against Liverpool.

Assistant coach Mikel Arteta took over duties in the dugout but the former Arsenal midfielder oversaw a disjointed performance which was as flat as the atmosphere inside the ground.

Silva's goal, after Sane had glided past ex-Manchester United defender Rafael midway in the second half, reinvigorated his side.

However, City now find

themselves playing catch up in a group they were expected to dominate. Guardiola's side made it to the last eight of the Champions League last season and have never gone beyond the semi-finals.

Europa League: Aubameyang double, Chelsea and Celtic win

Pierre-Emerick Aubameyang scored twice as Arsenal opened their Europa League Group E campaign with a comfortable win over Ukrainian side Vorskla Poltava on Thursday.

Until Aubameyang's opening goal it had been a laboured performance from the Gunners, who had struggled to break through well-drilled opponents.

However, the Gabon striker - the club's record £56m signing last January - changed the dynamics of the contest by steering Alex Iwobi's pass into the bottom left corner after the visitors overcommitted in attack. It was only Aubameyang's sixth touch of the game, and Arsenal's first shot on target but it allowed them to cut loose after the break.

England forward Danny Welbeck doubled Arsenal's lead three
