

Putin hitman unmasked

- Salisbury poisoner is top spy honored by Russian leader
- Russia "sought to obfuscate through desperate fabrication"

ONE of the smirking assassins involved in the Salisbury nerve agent attack has been identified as a high-ranking Russian secret service agent.

The man, who used the alias Ruslan Boshirov to travel to the UK, was unmasked as Colonel Anatoliy Vladimirovich Chepiga, an officer who has received Russia's highest military award. According to an investigation, Chepiga is a 39-year-old who served in Chechnya and Ukraine and was made a Hero of the Russian Federation by order of President Vladimir Putin in 2014 during a secret ceremony.

The revelation emerged as Prime Minister Theresa May addressed world leaders at the United Nations Security Council in New York. Mrs May said Russia had "sought to obfuscate through desperate fabrication".

She told the gathering: "We have taken appropriate action, with our allies, and we will continue to take the necessary steps to ensure our collective security."

The Government has accused Chepiga and Alexander Petrov, also believed to be an alias, of poisoning former

Russian spy Sergei Skripal and his daughter Yulia with novichok in March. Detective Sergeant Nick Bailey was also hospitalised after coming into contact with the substance at Mr Skripal's home. Local woman Dawn Sturgess, 44, died in June after being exposed to the same weapons-grade nerve agent after it was apparently discarded.

'ordinary civilians'

The Crown Prosecution Service has charged both men for the attempted murder of the Skripals, while an European Arrest Warrant and Interpol red notice have been issued for their detention.

Russia has always denied the allegations and claims the suspects are "ordinary civilians".

But investigative journalist agency Bellingcat has conclusive evidence that Boshirov is actually an officer in the GRU, Russia's military intelligence service. They trawled through old military yearbooks to find a likeness for the

suspects.

Bellingcat told how they analysed a photograph of Far Eastern Military Command Academy graduates who received the Hero of Russia Award. Investigators identified Borishov on the far right of the group, then found his identity through a database listed on a military union website. Bellingcat said it believed that "Boshirov" was in fact Chepiga after obtaining documents relating to his passport. It said: "The passport file contained a photograph - dated approximately in 2003, when this passport was obtained - that strongly resembled a younger "Boshirov" as seen in passport photos released by the UK police, with an even stronger resemblance to the cover identity passport photo published in our previous publication on the Skripal suspects."

A passport application form listed a former residence which matched up with the man they identified on the database. It also

listed his place of birth as "Nikolaevka", further linking Chepiga to the Hero of the Russian Federation with the same name.

military career

Chepiga was born on April 5, 1978 and graduated into the military following a stint at one of Russia's elite training grounds, the report said. His military career reportedly took him into the second Chechen war as part of a unit that played a "key role" in the conflict. The

GRU agent is reportedly married with one child.

Chepiga and Petrov flew to the UK in March, travelling to east London and checking into a hotel where traces of novichok were found. They visited Salisbury twice by train and were caught on CCTV at a petrol station a short walk from Mr Skripal's home. Earlier this month they appeared on Russian-state television and claimed they were tourists in Salisbury to visit its cathedral.

Moscow did not

immediately comment on the development and the Home Office said it could neither confirm nor deny the reporting. But Defence Secretary Gavin Williamson briefly appeared to confirm the story, posting and then deleting a tweet that said: "The true identity of one of the Salisbury suspects has been revealed to be a Russian Colonel. I want to thank all the people who are working so tirelessly on this case."

Scotland Yard declined to comment.

Labour opens door to second EU referendum

■ 'All options on the table' insists leadership ahead of party conference vote

THE LABOUR Party has opened the door to a second EU referendum by approving a motion for delegates at the upcoming party conference pledging to keep "all options on the table" on Brexit.

The motion says: "If we cannot get a general election, Labour must support all options remaining on the table, including campaigning for a public vote."

It adds: "If the government is confident in negotiating a deal that working people, our economy and communities will benefit from, they should not be afraid to put that deal to the public."

And Labour leader Jeremy Corbyn said he would back a second referendum if Labour members voted for it at this week's conference, signalling a major shift in party policy.

Speaking to the BBC's Andrew Marr as the party faithful gathered in Liverpool, Corbyn said he would be "bound by the democracy of our party" were members to vote in favour of a second

referendum, although he added he would wait and see what wording would be put in front of the delegates after a meeting on Sunday evening.

A debate on a second 'People's vote' was called for by over 100 constituencies.

According to a YouGov survey of 1,054 Labour members, commissioned by the People's Vote campaign, 86% wanted a final, public say on the outcome of Brexit negotiations, against 8% who opposed it.

The *Sunday Telegraph* says Corbyn's comments "pave the way for a significant change in Labour's Brexit policy", and came just two days after Theresa May urged the Labour leader to clarify his position on Brexit, "amid concern that a Labour U-turn could jeopardize any deal reached with Brussels and prevent the UK from leaving the EU".

The party has never formally rejected the option of a further vote but both Corbyn and his deputy, Tom Watson, have indicated they would prefer it to be resolved by

a general election.

A YouGov poll conducted last week found the party could win enough extra votes to bring it to the brink of general election victory by backing a second referendum.

Thousands marched in Liverpool over the weekend calling for a second vote on the final terms of the Brexit deal, which has shown steadily growing public support in recent months as the government's negotiating strategy has floundered.

The Labour leadership has been under intense pressure to shift its position on a second referendum, led by a cabal of Remain-supporting MPs and, crucially, a growing number of unions.

Speaking to the BBC on Monday, Len McClusky, the leader of Britain's biggest union Unite which is also Labour's leading donor, threw his support behind a second referendum, but said the option of staying in the EU should not be on the ballot, and rather the public should choose between whether to endorse May's final deal or opt for no deal at all.

Scottish teens call time on drinking

Teenage drinking has declined dramatically in Scotland over the past decade with one of the largest falls in alcohol consumption in Europe.

British teenagers were once among the biggest drinkers but are now among the most abstinent. England had the largest decline in Europe, but there were similar improvements in Scotland and Wales, according to the World Health Organisation (WHO).

Only Malta had a higher percentage of teenage drinkers than England in 2002 and it remained the worst performing country in 2014.

Since 2002, the proportion of 15-year-olds having alcohol every week has fallen from 41 per cent to 11 per cent for girls and from 41 per

cent to 14 per cent among boys. Nearly half (46.7 per cent) of English teenagers drank every week in 2002 but by 2014 this had fallen to less than a tenth.

The WHO report identifies a number of possible reasons including changes in household income, marketing and prevention approaches and shifts in adult norms and teenage culture. It praises "health-oriented pricing policies" such as increases in taxation or minimum pricing, saying that they were effective in cutting consumption among low-income groups including teenagers who tend to have limited budgets.

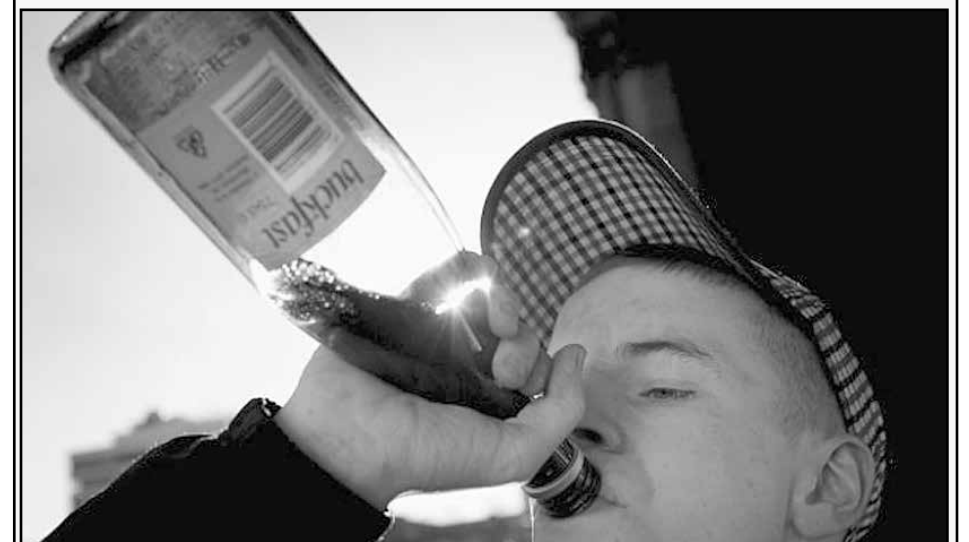
The UK Department of Health said that it would consider introducing minimum unit pricing in England after the

policy was successfully implemented in Scotland in May.

Problem drinking is more prevalent among low-income teenagers in Scotland while in England it affects more affluent teenagers.

The report said: "The largest declines in prevalence among boys were found in England, Wales and Denmark. For girls, the largest declines were seen in England, Scotland and Denmark."

"Declines in weekly drinking were observed among both genders and the gender gap narrowed over time in a number of countries and regions, but in most the decrease in weekly alcohol use was greater among boys, particularly in the Netherlands, Switzerland, Ukraine and Wales."

Concerns grow as Benny the Beluga goes upriver

Conservationists were on standby on Thursday to assist a beluga whale after it was spotted swimming in the River Thames for a third day.

The whale, nicknamed Benny, was first spotted in the Thames estuary near Gravesend, Kent, on Tuesday, "swimming strongly and feeding normally".

On Thursday, it was sighted slightly upstream of its previous location.

Experts said the whale appeared to be a sub adult - an older juvenile but not a fully formed adult.

Medics from the British Divers Marine Life Rescue (BDMLR) said it had been exhibiting foraging behaviour, likely feeding, as well as surfacing and diving consistent with a

healthy animal.

The BDMLR and the Port of London Authority (PLA) have urged river users, including shipping companies, to steer clear of the beluga whale, which is thousands of miles away from its Arctic habitat.

BDMLR director Gavin Parsons said: "While this whale is visiting, both organisations will continue to monitor and plan for possible assistance scenarios and then will work cooperatively to ensure the best outcome."

The conservation charity said there were currently no concerns for its well-being and it would respond to any further sightings, but did not have enough

volunteers to monitor the whale 24 hours a day.

Julia Cable, national co-ordinator, said: "It's possible that it lost its way after a navigational error, that it has taken a wrong turn."

Beluga whales can grow up to 20ft in length and are usually at home in the icy waters around Greenland, Svalbard or the Barents Sea.

Beluga whales were last spotted in the UK three years ago off the coast of Northumberland and Northern Ireland, but sightings were "extremely rare", the British Divers Marine Life Rescue said.

In 2006, an 18ft (5m) northern bottle-nosed whale died after becoming stranded in the Thames.

UK's first air-cleaning bus launches

■ Diesel-powered prototype will filter polluted air as it drives around Southampton

The UK's first air-filtering bus has been launched as part of a nationwide campaign to combat harmful pollution.

Unveiled in the southern coastal city of Southampton on Thursday, the "Bluestar" bus features a filtration system installed on the roof that will filter and clean the air as the vehicle drives along its route, The Guardian reported. The bus is being pioneered by Go-Ahead, one of Britain's largest public transport operators.

The firm's chief executive, David Brown, said that if the trial is successful, the idea could be rolled out to Go Ahead's entire fleet of more than 5,000 buses up and down the country.

"We are going a step further in the potential for our buses to actively clean the environment," he added. "It's a huge development in our environmental leadership

and we are also proud to be pioneering the prototype in the UK."

The success of the scheme will be measured by weighing the filter on the bus before and after the completion of the trial, to see how many

particles of pollution have been trapped.

The filter's manufacturer, Pall Aerospace, said the device is designed to remove 99.5% of particles, the news site adds.

THE Duchess of Sussex looked relaxed on her first solo royal engagement Sunday night as she sparkled in a £2,500 black Givenchy dress.

Just over four months after becoming a member of the Royal Family, Meghan passed a royal milestone when she attended the opening of a major art exhibition. And she even exchanged a Maori nose-rubbing greeting with a delegation of guests from New Zealand.

Her sister-in-law, the Duchess of Cambridge, waited for almost six months after her wedding before she went to a function without Prince William accompanying her. She stepped in for Prince Charles at a fundraising dinner in October 2011. But Meghan, 37, who married in May, is a more experienced performer on the world stage than Kate. She joined guests at the opening of an exhibition of works from the Oceania region, at the Royal Academy of Arts in London. The exhibition celebrates the art of Melanesia, Micronesia and Polynesia, and the Pacific region, including New Guinea, Easter Island, Hawaii and New



Zealand.

Meghan, who is due to tour Australia, New Zealand and the Pacific nations of Fiji and Tonga next month with the Duke of Sussex, was shown art from all four

countries on the visit. The exhibition marks the 250th anniversary of the Royal Academy, which was founded in 1768, the year Captain James Cook set out on his first Endeavour expedition.

BBC bosses wiped old Caine show 'to save a few quid'

SIR Michael Caine has revealed that the BBC no longer has a recording of one of his earliest TV outings that helped launch his career.

The actor (above) recently tried to get hold of a copy of the 1961 television play, *The Compartment*, but was told the corporation had taped over it to save money. The 85-year-old Oscar-winner who has starred in more than 100 films including *Zulu*, *Alfie* and *The Italian Job* is not best pleased with the BBC's penny-pinching ways. Caine said the missing film, co-starring Frank Finlay, was a "great little drama" about a suspicious-looking young man sharing a train compartment with a nervous businessman. It was written by playwright Johnny Speight who went on to create the classic sitcom *Till Death Do Us Part*. *The Compartment* was lauded by critics and Caine credits the play with raising his profile in the industry.

But he told this week's *Radio Times* that not everyone was a fan. "You know what the BBC did with it?" he said. "I was writing an autobiography and rang them and said that I'd forgotten about it and could they let me have a tape of it. 'I was told, 'We don't have one. We don't have anything on the show'. They were going through an economy drive and had re-used the tape. I just thought, 'Bloody hell - taping over a great little drama just to save a few quid'."

Beckham swerves speeding charge

"Mr Loophole" blames tardy post office for failing to deliver charge notice in time

David Beckham will not be prosecuted over a speeding charge, a district judge has ruled.

Celebrity lawyer Nick Freeman, known as Mr Loophole, successfully fought the allegation for him on a technicality.

The former England football captain, 43, was accused of driving a loaned Bentley at 59mph in a 40mph zone on the A40 in Paddington on 23 January.

However, Mr Freeman had argued a speeding notice arrived one day too late.

Beckham, who did not attend the hearing at Wimbledon Magistrates' Court on Thursday, had previously entered a not guilty plea.

Mr Freeman said Beckham was "very relieved with the verdict".

The lawyer previously helped Beckham overturn an eight-month driving ban in 1999, after

successfully arguing he was trying to escape a paparazzi photographer.

Mr Freeman suggested the more recent matter could have been a case of poor postal service, citing a subsequent letter sent first class by Bentley to Scotland Yard which took eight days to arrive.

He said: "Unfortunately and sadly some post attracts problems. There might be nobody at fault here."

District judge Barbara Barnes said a Notice of Intended Prosecution (NIP) was sent on 2 February and should have arrived at Bentley Motors Ltd, the registered keepers of the vehicle, by 6 February.

However, she was satisfied on the evidence heard it did not in fact arrive until 7 February - one day outside the statutory 14-day window.

Summing up, she said the law allowed for the "vagaries" of the postal

system to be taken into account.

She said: "What I find is the fact it did not arrive in the post room of Bentley Motors Ltd until 7 February and therefore was one day outside the legal limit.

"The defendant in this case cannot be convicted." Solicitor Nick Freeman

has been dubbed Mr Loophole for his success at using legal technicalities to get celebrity clients acquitted of driving offences.

His clients have in the past included cricketer Andrew Flintoff, explorer Sir Ranulph Fiennes and golfer Colin Montgomerie.

In 1999 Mr Freeman successfully defended former Manchester United manager Sir Alex Ferguson, who had been accused of driving down the hard shoulder of a motorway.

His defence? Sir Alex was simply looking for a toilet because he had an upset stomach.

How happy is your town?

■ New poll reveals most cheerful - and saddest - places in Britain

THE happiest place to live in Britain has been identified as a rural district fewer than 50 miles from London.

An area of north-east Hampshire which is home to around 95,000 people scored 8.35 out of 10 compared to a national average of 7.7. The Conservative-run borough of Rushmoor includes Aldershot, famed for its Army connections, and Farnborough, home to an international air show.

Britons rated their life satisfaction at 7.7 out of 10 and happiness at 7.5 out of 10. Anxiety scored 2.9 out of 10. The lowest rating was given by residents of Fenland in Cambridgeshire, which

scored just 6.7.

Northern Ireland reported the highest average life satisfaction, worthwhile and happiness ratings, and the lowest anxiety ratings, compared with the other countries of the UK.

Silvia Manclossi, head of Quality of Life Team at the Office for National Statistics, which conducted the survey, said: "For the first time, we have identified how factors such as health, access

to services and crime levels may affect how people rate their well-being.

"This can help local authorities and other organisations to better understand where

services could be targeted to help to improve the well-being of people in their area."

One reason why Rushmoor may be the happiest place in the UK could be because of its life expectancy - even though it does not top the charts.

Baby girls born today in the Rushmoor area can expect to live until they are 83.4 years old, compared with England's average of 83.1. Baby boys there are expected to reach 80.2 years old - above the 79.5 average for England. In comparison, Fenland scored worse than the average for England in both life expectancy charts. Rushmoor also has lower rates of preventable deaths than average, alongside very low rates

of unemployment and good wages.

The most recent Government figures from March show just 2.5 per cent of people living in the authority were unemployed. The overall rate for Britain is 4.3 per cent. Full-time workers there can expect to earn in the region of £551.40 each week - similar to the UK average of £552.7. A total of 67.7 per cent of teenagers in Hampshire leave school with five GCSEs graded at least a C. England's average is 64.9 per cent. Kensington & Chelsea was the second unhappiest place across the home nations. People living in the exclusive London borough had an average happiness of 6.82 out of 10.

Tributes flow for John Cunliffe, creator of Pat the Postman, dead at 85

John Cunliffe (pictured above), the creator of the popular children's television character Postman Pat, has died aged 85.

Cunliffe's agency confirmed the news after an obituary for the author, who also created the ragdoll characters from ITV series Rosie and Jim, appeared in the *Ilkley Gazette*.

"John left his Ilkley home in a deluge of rain on Thursday, 20 September, never to return," the tribute read. "Even the skies wept for John the gifted creator of Postman Pat, Rosie and Jim and author of many earlier published collections of poetry and picture storybooks for children."

'generations of children'

"John's last poetry collection, significantly entitled *Dare You Go*, has now come to fruition for John has dared to go and he has gone."

Cunliffe was also the author of about 190 books for young children, including five volumes of poetry, as well as picture books and collections of stories.

Cunliffe created Postman Pat in 1981 and it went on to become a cultural phenomenon, with almost 200 episodes made, a spin-off series and a film in 2014.

His famous creations

"were loved by generations of children, who grew up on the tales of Pat and his black and white cat, Jess, in the fictional village of Greendale", said Sky News.

Cunliffe wrote the show on an old Triumph typewriter in the back bedroom of a house in Kendal and teamed up with the animator Ivor Wood, who had worked on the *Magic Roundabout*, *The Herbs*, *The Wombles* and *Paddington Bear*.

He also appeared in *Rosie and Jim* as the rag doll pair's narrowboat driver, who they referred to as "Fizzgog".

Director of BBC Children's Alice Webb said Postman Pat's enduring popularity speaks to the genuine charm and warmth that John imbued in the characters that populate Greendale.

"It's a world you'd like to be part of - a community that cares, is full of heart and full of fun - and that is a lovely thing to show audiences, both young and old."

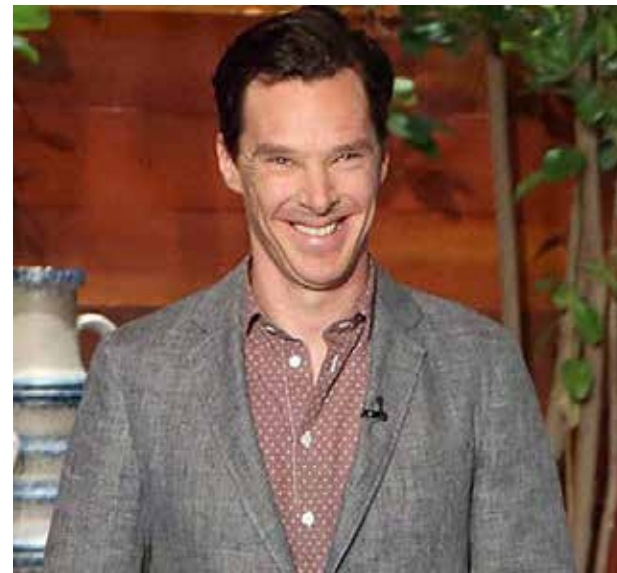
"John created a real and relatable world that will continue to entertain our audience for a long time to come and I count myself lucky to be one of millions of children whose childhoods were enriched by John's creations."

Robbery hero? I just got in the way says humble Cumberbatch

ACTOR Benedict Cumberbatch has told how he did not think twice about intervening to save a delivery man from being mugged.

The *Sherlock* star, 42, was travelling in the back of a cab with his wife Sophie Hunter, 40, when he saw an employee of British online food delivery company Deliveroo on a bicycle surrounded by a young gang. Cumberbatch was hailed a hero as he stopped the car and rushed out to calm things down. He even asked his Uber driver to block the road and stop traffic so other people would witness the incident in London last year. But he did not think about how events could have escalated with "knives or acid or any of the other things that can be part of that situation".

Cumberbatch told how the victim "looked like he was about to fight for his life". But he refused to take credit for stopping

the mugging. "I don't know, I literally just got in the way," he told US chat show host Ellen DeGeneres on Sunday.

He said: "I saw a Deliveroo guy on a bicycle getting surrounded by some guys on a very cold November night and I just stopped the Uber that we were in and got out and tried to calm the kids down. And I tried to calm him down."

But driver Manuel Dias

has previously told how the actor was "courageous, brave and selfless" and, if he hadn't stepped in, the cyclist could have been seriously injured.

But referring to comments by Mr Dias, 53, Cumberbatch told DeGeneres: "This is where it gets a bit embarrassing," adding details had been "exaggerated". He said: "I feel weird about this because I haven't talked about it at home."

I remember looking out

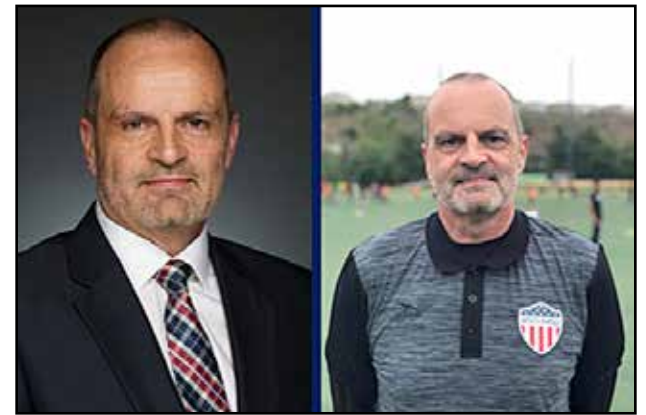

The answer my friend, is blowing in the wind...

After after 19 years of living here it recently dawned on me that most folks in these parts don't possess a washing line.

What? I hear you ask, well it's true, most households or apartment units have a washer/dryer. That got me delving into asking why people wouldn't be more eco-friendlier here. I mean why wouldn't the place that sells more electric cars per capita air dry their clothes? I'd heard through the grapevine that it was in fact illegal to line dry your clothes al fresco.

So I decided to investigate... the first thing I found was a 2009 LA Times article titled: "Is Your Clothes Line Legal?" in which Alexandria Abramian Mott examines a move to bring air drying back in vogue, revealing that that tumble drying

accounts for at least 6% of all electricity usage. And real estate broker Margaret Goedeke of Newport Crest, a cluster of beachfront condominiums where open garage doors, flag poles and clothing lines are all prohibited, chimes in: "We're not even allowed to hang a towel outside... Once in a while we'll dry something on our deck, but we hide it. We're very controlled."

These kinds of rules drove British film producer Steven Lake to make "Drying for Freedom," a documentary on line-drying in the U.S. that he said is in pre-production.

"The matter of wasted energy is something that draws my attention to this topic," he said. "But mostly it's the fact that in America, which to the rest of the world is considered

to be the land of the free, citizens are banned from something as simple and silly as hanging out their washing."

If you own a house with a yard you can do pretty often what you want, unless you belong to a gated community with strict homeowners association guidelines. Condos and apartment buildings are much touchier and routinely ban air drying, forcing some renters and condo owners to post tips about undercover line-drying on websites such as laundrylist.org. A deeper dive led me to discover Project Laundry List, a grass roots organization whose mission statement is 'making air-drying and cold-water washing laundry acceptable and desirable as simple and effective ways to save energy'. Believe it or not, in 2014 a resolution was passed at the California State Grange convention in San Luis Obispo to legalize air drying laundry across the state. On the basis that, "The clothesline is an easy and cost effective way to

bring down energy use and lower the carbon footprint of the individual household".

The result was that Governor Jerry Brown signed a bill back in 2015 that gave Californians the right to hang their laundry on clotheslines. On Jan. 1, 2016, California became a "right to dry" state.

Which brings me back to the real head-scratcher: why do so many people still prefer the smell of a febrile drying sheet to the scent of the fresh and clean great outdoors? Could it

be that LA still has one of the biggest air pollution problems? Maybe that clothes or towels especially tend to stiffen more here in California? Perhaps its the critters like squirrels, raccoons are likely to steal or chew that nice new Gucci t-shirt of yours.

A new search sent me to quora.com where I found the following question..."Why do Americans use clothes dryers to dry their clothes, even in the middle of summer?"

Michael Sidney Timpson, Composer, Music Professor answered "I may be one of the best people this question, because I have a lot of experience in this. As someone who has lived in multiple countries in east Asia and am originally from the US, I can tell you there are three appliances that Americans really want: 1) Clothes Dryer, 2) Dishwasher and 3) Garbage Disposal (#4 may be Oven since that is not everywhere too.) Why?"

Mou vs Pog: looks like they're stuck with each other...for now

José Mourinho and Paul Pogba will be forced to keep working together with Manchester United determined that both should stay at the club.

The pair's escalating feud reached new heights when footage of an argument at training on Wednesday went viral on the internet.

Ed Woodward, the United executive vice-chairman, has no plans to get rid of the club's manager nor their record signing, despite their frosty exchange at Carrington.

Sky Sports cameras captured the conversation between Mourinho and Pogba, and by press time the original clip, which is two minutes long, had been viewed almost ten million times.

In the footage,

Mourinho confronts Pogba about a video he posted on Instagram of himself, Andreas Pereira and Luke Shaw laughing in the stands at Old Trafford during United's Carabao Cup defeat by Derby County on Tuesday.

Pogba, who was rested for the match, shot the footage during the game but it did not go online until 10.30pm. It is believed that the delay owed to the fact that the France midfielder's phone was not connected to the Wi-Fi and 4G reception at the ground is bad on match days because tens of thousands of people are using their phones there. It was only when the crowds had left that Pogba's video went live.

Mourinho brought the Instagram post to Pogba's

attention at the start of training, when the Sky cameras were present. United did not comment but the video appears to show that after Pogba had shaken the hands of the assistant manager Michael Carrick and John Allen, one of the club's communications officers, Mourinho went to quiz him about why he had posted the video after the defeat.

Despite the surprise defeat by Derby, it is understood that Mourinho retains the support of Woodward, who has no objections to the decision to strip Pogba of the vice-captaincy. Only if United's form deteriorates drastically over the next few months will he consider sacking

Mourinho, who has 18 months left on his £15 million-a-year contract.

It is understood that Pogba has serious concerns about some of Mourinho's man-management methods and would be open to a move to Barcelona. The clubs reportedly spoke in the summer but Barcelona were told that he was not for sale.

Despite Woodward's backing, the manager's worsening relationship with Pogba is causing concern in the United boardroom.

Some senior figures feel it was unedifying for the club to have footage of a training-ground spat seen around the world. Members of the hierarchy want Woodward to organise a meeting between Pogba and Mourinho so they can settle their differences.

Joshua: Wilder needs the payday

BOXING: ANTHONY JOSHUA is confident he will eventually fight Deontay Wilder because the American wants the "payday".

The WBA, IBF and WBO heavyweight champion retained his belts with a seventh-round stoppage of Alexander Povetkin at Wembley on Saturday night.

Joshua, 28, posted a poll on Twitter on Monday asking fans to vote for his next opponent.

Wilder faces Tyson Fury on December 1 but both Joshua and his promoter Eddie Hearn want the American to agree to an April 13 date at Wembley before he faces the self-styled Gypsy King.

And Joshua believes Wilder will step up at some point even if their fi

ght is not in April.

"It will happen sooner or later for sure, that fight will happen. We'll find out who the best is sooner or later," said Joshua.

"I don't think he wants to avoid me for too long because he's getting towards the end of his career.

"What age is he? Thirty-two? What has he got left? Two or three years? This payday is his legacy.

"I don't want to wait until December for him to win the Fury fight, have his rest and then start negotiating, because I'll start training for the fight in early January."

Hearn claimed they would be happy to agree terms for the fight "subject to Wilder beating Fury".

Arsenal midfielder Aaron Ramsey is likely to leave the club next summer after the Gunners withdrew the offer of a new deal.

The four-year agreement was in place but before a final contract was drawn up, Arsenal pulled out with neither side being willing to go public as to the reasons.

Ramsey's existing contract expires on 30 June 2019 which means the 27-year-old will become a free agent next summer - unless he is sold in January.

As things stand, the Welshman will also have the option of signing a pre-contract agreement with a foreign club from 1 January.

Ramsey joined the Gunners in 2008 in a £4.8m move from hometown club Cardiff City.

He is Arsenal's longest-serving player and scored the winning goals in the 2014 and 2017 FA Cup finals.

Ramsey was an 84th-minute substitute in the Gunners' 3-1 defeat of Brentford in the Carabao Cup on Wednesday.

Hazard hailed as one of world's best

■ Belgian star the difference as Blues upset Reds at Anfield

Eden Hazard is "one of the best in the world", Chelsea assistant manager Gianfranco Zola said after the forward scored a stunning late winner against Liverpool in the Carabao Cup Wednesday night.

The Belgium international's finish into the far corner with five minutes remaining sealed victory as Chelsea came from behind to end Premier League leaders Liverpool's perfect start to the season and reach the fourth round.

Hazard was introduced as a substitute in the second half and although he was quiet for much of it, he burst into action by beating Alberto Moreno and smashing home.

"It's a fantastic goal. Not only the beauty of it but for the time he scored it," Zola said.

"Not only is Hazard one of the best in the Premier League - if not the best - but he is one of the best in Europe and the world.

"In my opinion we haven't seen the best of him yet. He is remarkable."

The Blues had been the better side in the first half with striker Alvaro Morata somehow striking a shot across the goalline and the Spaniard also nodded a free header over the crossbar.

Liverpool, who had won all seven games this season, took the lead through Daniel Sturridge's well-executed hooked finish, just minutes after the England international missed a completely open net.

Chelsea levelled the contest through Emerson Palmieri's close-range finish which needed intervention from the

video assistant referee (VAR) to check for offside before being awarded.

Liverpool will be looking for revenge when the two sides meet again in the league on Saturday, while the fourth-round draw takes place on the same day at 21:00 BST.

Despite winning the FA Cup last season under Antonio Conte, Chelsea replaced the Italian with compatriot Maurizio Sarri, who left Serie A side Napoli for Stamford Bridge.

The Blues were way off the pace in the league last term, finishing fifth, but have begun the new campaign in impressive style under Sarri.

They lost the Community Shield with a poor performance against Premier League champions Manchester City, but have shown

quick progress by being unbeaten after six games in the top flight and lie two points adrift of leaders Liverpool.

Midfielder Cesc Fabregas controlled the play in the middle of the park early on and fellow Spaniard Morata - who

looks bereft of confidence - should have taken one of his chances.

Having fallen behind, the Londoners did not panic and turned the game around with two goals in six second-half minutes, the second of which was an unstoppable strike by

Hazard past goalkeeper Simon Mignolet.

Hazard, who has five league goals so far, collected the ball wide on the right before drifting into the box, nutmegging Moreno and arrowing a thunderous shot into the net.

New £12m deal for Southgate

Gareth Southgate is close to agreeing a new four-year contract with the FA worth at least £12 million which would take him through to the end of the 2022 World Cup finals.

The proposal was due to be put before the FA board for approval after press time, but given the England manager's feat in guiding them to the World Cup semi-finals in Russia, it would be surprising if there were dissenting voices. Losing Dan Ashworth, who has resigned as FA technical director to take up a similar role with Brighton & Hove Albion, is likely to make the board even keener to put Southgate on a longer contract.

While the FA has previously been criticised for extending deals which led to costly pay-offs for

Sven-Goran Eriksson and Fabio Capello, there is a belief among the hierarchy that it is necessary to give Southgate a substantial pay rise or risk losing him after the 2020 European Championship finals, or even before. The hope that 2022 is when many of England's brightest young prospects will be at their peak is another reason for tying Southgate to a new contract and seeking continuity.

Southgate has been earning a basic salary of around £1.8 million a year since his

permanent appointment in November 2016. That is less than half what English managers in the Premier League such as Eddie Howe at Bournemouth are paid. The new deal, which would replace Southgate's contract that runs until 2020, is expected to include an increase of at least £1 million a year to around £3 million, and take him to the end of December 2022 when the World Cup is staged outside the summer for the first time in Qatar.
