



ABSOLUTE CHAOS!

- May clinging to power as she loses Brexit vote BUT defeats No Confidence vote
- PM's desperate plea for talks with Corbyn dismissed as a 'stunt'
- Amended Brexit deal due to be delivered to Parliament on Monday

THE DISMAL and farcical pantomime named Brexit which is currently playing at Westminster showed no sign of ending this week, as Theresa May was left clinging to power after her Brexit deal was overwhelmingly rejected by the House of Commons, with her government in chaos as she barely survived a vote of no confidence.

The Prime Minister won Wednesday's no-confidence vote by 325 to 306, as Rebel Tory MPs and the DUP - who 24 hours earlier rejected her Brexit plan by a huge margin - voted to keep her in Downing Street.

Labour leader Jeremy Corbyn argued that Mrs May's "zombie" administration had lost the right to govern.

The PM won the vote by a margin of 19, including 10 votes from the DUP. Had the party voted against her, she would have lost by one.

Giving her reaction to the result, Mrs May told MPs she would "continue to work to deliver on the solemn promise to the people of this country to deliver on the result of the referendum and leave

the European Union".

She invited leaders of all parties to have individual meetings with her on the way ahead for Brexit - calling on the leaders of Labour, the Liberal Democrats, the SNP and Plaid Cymru to approach them with a "constructive spirit".

"We must find solutions that are negotiable and command sufficient support in this House," she added.

'very amenable to talks'

But Mr Corbyn, who tabled the no-confidence motion, said in the Commons that before any "positive discussions" could take place, the prime minister should rule out a no-deal Brexit.

"The government must

remove clearly, once and for all, the prospect of the catastrophe of a no-deal exit from the EU and all the chaos that would come as a result of that," he told MPs.

The party's deputy leader, Tom Watson, told BBC News that it was not "unreasonable" for Mr Corbyn to say: "Are you serious?"

He added: "We're very amenable to talks, but I think the prime minister needs to show us that she's actually serious

about that.

"Is she actually going to concede on some of these red lines? Are they going to be meaningful to us?"

Mr Corbyn's no-confidence motion was backed by all the opposition parties, including the Scottish National Party and the Liberal Democrats.

His party has not ruled out tabling further no-confidence motions - but Mr Corbyn is under pressure from dozens of

his own MPs and other opposition parties to now get behind calls for a further EU referendum instead.

The leader of the SNP in Westminster, Ian Blackford, met Mrs May following the vote to discuss a way forward with Brexit.

After the meeting, he wrote to the PM and called for a "clear gesture of good faith" from her, by confirming that the extension of Article 50, a ruling out of a no-deal

Brexit and the option of a second EU referendum would form the basis of future discussions.

Mr Blackford has also written to Mr Corbyn, along with other opposition leaders, to urge him to back another referendum as Labour's official position.

He added: "We must see concessions from the prime minister, as well as Jeremy Corbyn, to break the Brexit impasse."

Corbyn tells May: no talks until you rule out No Deal Brexit

Jeremy Corbyn has refused to take part in talks with the Prime Minister unless she rules out "no deal Brexit".

In a letter to the Labour leader on Wednesday, the PM wrote that ruling out no deal was an "impossible condition" as it was not within the government's power to do it.

She has been meeting other leaders to try to find a compromise on Brexit after her deal was rejected by MPs.

But Mr Corbyn dismissed the talks as a "stunt".

'get serious'

The PM will publish a new plan on Monday with a full debate and key vote scheduled for Tuesday, 29 January.

Senior politicians on all sides have also been meeting with cabinet ministers to try to find a way forward.

But Mr Corbyn, the leader of the opposition, declined to take part, telling Mrs May to "ditch the red lines" and "get serious about proposals for the future".

He told the Prime Minister the "best outcome" was to call

a general election to "break the deadlock".

His stance has come under fire from Labour MP Mike Gapes, a longstanding critic of Mr Corbyn, who told BBC Radio 4's The World at One: "Jeremy Corbyn has been quite happy in the past to talk to Hamas, Hezobollah... I find it extraordinary he's not prepared to go and meet the prime minister."

the BW went to press Mrs. May was holding meetings with various party leaders as well as Tory Brexiteers and the DUP - both of whom rejected her withdrawal deal earlier this week.

Environment Secretary Michael Gove, Cabinet Office Minister David Lidington and Brexit Secretary Steve Barclay were also holding talks with senior opposition politicians, including Labour MPs Hilary Benn and Yvette Cooper, as the various Leave and Remain factions in all parties continued to maneuver in an attempt to find a way out of the impasse - and doubtless grab some power in the process.

Momentum grows for second EU vote

A poll conducted after the crushing defeat of Theresa May's Brexit plan gives a 12-point lead for remaining in the European Union — the largest margin since the 2016 referendum.

The YouGov survey of more than 1,000 voters on Wednesday found 56 per cent would now vote to stay in the EU, against 44 per cent who wanted to leave.

In a three-way choice, voters split 52 per cent for Remain, 39 per cent for no-deal and 9 per cent for a softer Brexit known as Norway-plus.

Peter Kellner, the former president of YouGov, said that the 8 per cent swing from Leave to Remain since the 2016 referendum was significant. "No longer can it be said that opinion has not moved significantly since the referendum."

YouGov questioned 1,070 people on January 16.

Mrs May faces being sidelined in the coming days as formal talks are likely to stall over questions of a no-deal exit and her demands that a deal must allow the UK to

control immigration and conduct an independent trade policy.

official backing

Instead, the focus is likely to shift to informal discussions being held in parallel among MPs on all sides determined to prevent the UK from crashing out of the EU without agreement.

Andrea Leadsom, the leader of the House, set Tuesday January 29 as the next crucial moment, confirming that MPs

would be given the chance to seize control of the process.

Having snubbed Mrs May, Jeremy Corbyn travelled to Hastings on Thursday in his latest attempt to force a general election, despite having lost yesterday's no-confidence motion.

Labour supporters of a second referendum say that the defeat should trigger the next stage of the party's Brexit policy, which allows for official backing for another

nationwide vote.

Mr Corbyn appears determined to resist that course of action, however, and insists Labour can still force an election.

A "Right to Vote" campaign for a second referendum was launched by the Conservative MP Phillip Lee, who claimed support for a so-called People's Vote was growing fast among his colleagues on the Tory benches.

Liberal Democrats, Vince Cable said it would be "silly not to talk" to the government, but agreed with Mr Blackford that no deal had to be taken off the table, as well as the PM having a "willingness" to discuss another referendum - which is the party's preference.

Sir Vince also reiterated his calls for Mr Corbyn to get behind the "People's Vote" too now that he had lost his no-confidence motion.

"He has now got to change his position

and come behind the 'People's Vote' or he will just be seen, and will be, a handmaiden of Brexit," he told BBC News.

Former Green Party leader Caroline Lucas made a similar call on Twitter, saying: "The leader of the opposition was right to try to bring down this toxic, failing government.

"But now MPs have had their say on the Brexit deal, he needs to give the people a say over our future relationship with our nearest neighbours."

Plaid Cymru's Westminster Leader, Liz Saville Roberts, and the party's Brexit spokesman, Hywel Williams, confirmed they would meet Mrs

May but their view is the "only way to break the deadlock" is for another referendum.

The leader of the DUP in Westminster, Nigel Dodds, said the result showed the importance of the confidence and supply arrangement between his party and the Conservatives.

After the 2017 election, the Tories agreed a financial package with the DUP in exchange for support on certain issues, giving them a working majority in Parliament.

He said the agreement was "built on delivering Brexit" and that he was looking forward to "working in the coming days to achieve that objective".

Prince Philip, 97, 'shocked and shaken' after road accident near Sandringham

The Duke of Edinburgh was "conscious but very shocked" after his Range Rover was involved in a crash on Thursday afternoon close to the Queen's Sandringham Estate.

The 97-year-old's vehicle ended up on its side after it was in collision with another car in Norfolk at around 3pm. Local police attended the scene.

The duke was pulling out of a driveway on to the busy A149 when the accident happened. An eyewitness who helped the duke out of the car told the BBC that he was "conscious but very very shocked".

Two people in the other vehicle - a people carrier - were treated for minor injuries. Prince Philip was seen by a doctor as a precautionary measure

Green' Jamie defends £5m deal with oil giant shell

JAMIE Oliver sparked anger this week after trying to defend his £5million deal with oil giant Shell, despite years of campaigning for action on climate change.

On Monday the chef launched a food-to-go range for the company's petrol stations saying he had "thought a lot" before agreeing to the tie-up, adding: "There are pitfalls working for any client and they all have their own baggage."

But campaigners poured scorn on his argument, which comes as the chef recently told of a cash crisis at his company. Shell, which made profits of £4.3billion last year, is in the top 10 global carbon emitters and is also currently embroiled in a

A HITMAN grinned in the dock on Wednesday as he was convicted of the double murder of an underworld Mr Big and a mob enforcer.

Gangland assassin Mark "The Iceman" Fellows, 38, blasted Paul Massey with an Uzi submachine gun outside his home. Father-of-five Massey, 55, a notorious crime figure, dived for cover but died within minutes after being shot five times in Salford, Greater Manchester, in 2015.

Three years later his friend and associate, "Scouse John" Kinsella, 53, a martial arts expert and mob enforcer from Liverpool, was murdered by Fellows too. Kinsella - who once allegedly helped soccer star Steven Gerrard scare off a gangster demanding money - was killed in a "coldblooded" execution as he walked his dogs with his

corruption trial over its dealings in Nigeria.

"Jamie Oliver has earned trust over the last 20 years and that's exactly why this partnership is so disappointing," said Ava Lee, senior anti-corruption campaigner at Global Witness.

"Shell are on trial for bribery and corruption as we speak.

"Trust takes a long time to build and is very quickly lost, which Shell knows all too well.

"It's a shame that Jamie is willing to burnish the oil giant's reputation, while tarnishing his own."

Greenpeace said that it would "love it if [Oliver] kept dishing out the truth about climate change, but there are better places to do so than a Shell forecourt".

pregnant partner Wendy Owen. The couple were strolling near their home in Rainhill, Merseyside, last May when Fellows cycled up and shot Kinsella twice in the back with a Webley revolver - then twice more in the head.

'spotter'

Miss Owen, 41, told Liverpool Crown Court she escaped and watched the killer finish off her partner "like in a film".

During both killings Steven Boyle, 36, was said to have acted as "spotter" to ensure the victims were in place and to provide backup if needed - a charge he denied.

Both men were sentenced to life in prison by Justice William Davis on Thursday.

Massey and Kinsella were murdered as a result of a deadly feud between rival gangs in Salford known as the A-Team and the Anti A-Team. Fellows, of Warrington, was convicted of both murders but found not guilty of the attempted murder of Miss Owen. Boyle, of Rochdale, was found guilty of Kinsella's murder but cleared of Massey's and the attempted murder of Miss Owen. Both defendants smiled as the jury foreman returned the verdicts after 31 hours of deliberations.

The case had been turned on its head half-way through after Boyle grassed on his co-accused. Fellows said they met through cocaine dealing and chose not to give evidence, which prosecutors said was because he would be "exposed as the killer". However Boyle told the jury Fellows had "duped" him into being

handed the six-shot Webley used to execute Kinsella. The victims' relatives gasped in relief in the public gallery, holding hands and wiping away tears, as the case came to an end. Police in combat gear carrying Heckler and Koch machine guns had patrolled the corridors of the court during the seven-week trial. Both defendants had tried to break out of a court building at a previous hearing.

Victory is sweet for 'upskirt' victim who sees new legislation enacted

■ Gina Martin, targeted by an upskirter at a music festival, was outraged after learning act was not already a criminal offence

A woman who launched a campaign against upskirting after being targeted at a festival 18 months ago has said "we did it!" after legislation was passed to make it a crime in England and Wales.

The new legislation, approved in the House of Lords on Wednesday and now only awaiting the formality of Royal Assent, will see offenders face up to two years in jail.

Gina Martin, 26, said the decision was "politics and society at its best".

Upskirting has been covered by legislation in Scotland since 2010.

Speaking after the bill was approved, Gina said: "Eighteen months ago I was upskirted at a music festival and I decided I wasn't going to brush it off.

"I was tired of 'ignoring it'. I felt this was wrong and I was astounded to learn that upskirting wasn't a sexual offence. I wanted to change this for everyone, because the least we deserve is to be able to wear what we want without non-consensual photos being taken of us."

Gina was waiting to watch the band The Killers perform at British Summer Time music festival in London's Hyde Park when a man put his phone between her legs and took pictures of her crotch.

After informing the police, she was shocked to discover upskirting was not a specific offence.

A few days later she posted a status update on Facebook detailing her experience. Her post went viral with other women sharing similar experiences.

Soon an online petition to get her case reopened with the police had received 50,000 signatures

and she wrote a feature for the BBC News website explaining her battle. It recalled the dramatic moment when she chased after the man who had taken the unwanted photo.

Isn't long before the campaign was picked up by Lib Dem MP Wera Hobhouse.

Encouraged by government ministers, she brought a private members' bill backing the creation of an upskirting offence.

Her bill was expected to sail through the Commons, but parliamentary rules meant it only required one MP to shout "object" to block its progress.

And one MP did just that. Conservative MP Sir Christopher Chope had a track record of objecting to private members' bills on a point of principle, because he does not agree with legislation being

brought before Parliament on a Friday without enough time for a full debate.

By shouting "Object", he stopped this bill in its tracks - even though he later insisted he actually backed what Gina Martin was doing.

The Christchurch MP's intervention was immediately met with shouts of "shame" from other MPs and a few days later an anonymous protester showed a more visible sign of dissent by hanging four pairs of knickers across the MP's office door at the Commons.

But there was still hope for Gina and her campaign. Theresa May said she was "disappointed" and vowed that the government would take on the job of pushing the law change through parliament.

She said it was

necessary, describing upskirting as a "hideous invasion of privacy which leaves victims feeling degraded and distressed".

Gina's campaign secured government backing on 15 July last year and the Voyeurism (Offences) (No. 2) Bill was put before Parliament only days later.

For Gina, it has been a "steep learning curve" in how the political system works.

She said: "To the outsider, the ordinary person, law and politics are complex and daunting. But both are penetrable if you believe in yourself and find the right support."

Until the law is passed specifically naming and banning upskirting, victims and police in England and Wales are currently only able to pursue offences of outraging public decency

or as a crime of voyeurism.

Voyeurism only applies to filming actions taking place in private while outraging public decency usually requires someone to have witnessed the action but upskirting is often unobserved.

Unlike other sexual offences, people don't have automatic right to anonymity.

Upskirting has been an offence in Scotland since 2010 when it was listed under the broadened definition of voyeurism.

Meghan's bodyguard joins staff exodus

THE Duke and Duchess of Sussex were "saddened" this week after Meghan's police bodyguard quit only a few months into the job.

Her departure is the latest in a series of resignations among staff working for the royal couple, fuelling speculation that the former actress has proved a difficult employer.

The police officer, an inspector in charge of the team handling Meghan's protection, is understood to have only been in the role for around six months and has been closely involved in overseeing security arrangements at their new official residence, Frogmore Cottage at Windsor. The couple are expected to move in time for the arrival of their baby, due in the spring, after refurbishment work - set to cost the taxpayer

between £2million and £3million - is completed.

At least one source suggested that the change from being based at Kensington Palace, where Harry and Meghan currently live, to Windsor was behind the police officer's decision to quit. There were also claims that part of the reason for the bodyguard's departure is that Meghan, 37, has found it hard to adjust to the restrictions of royal life, including being shadowed everywhere by a personal protection officer. Even those born into the Royal Family can find it difficult at times - bodyguards need to be told even if they just want to nip out somewhere. Restaurants need to be checked for emergency exits and discreet tables booked. Security considerations can cause tensions when

the royal wants to do something spontaneous.

However, one leading newspaper claimed that the inspector - who has not been named for security reasons - gets on well with Meghan. She is said to be leaving not only her protection job but the Metropolitan Police as a whole, mainly for reasons to do with her private life. She was at the Kensington Palace office Christmas party and has told colleagues she is sad to be leaving her job working for Meghan. Harry and Meghan have also appeared upset to be losing her and are said to be "saddened" by it. Friends have pointed out that if police bodyguards do have problems with their bosses, they tend to be moved to other duties rather than leave the force altogether.

Film ratings in UK tightened amid concern over sex and violence

Under-15s will no longer be able to go to see films that depict rape and other sexual violence under new rules set by Britain's film ratings body.

The British Board of Film Classification (BBFC) surveyed more than 10,000 people and found it to be among parents' main concerns.

Any film showing sexual violence will now get at least a 15 rating rather than a 12 or a 12A.

The BBFC also wants its ratings to appear on all

streaming services.

BBFC chief executive David Austin said a film like Keira Knightley's 2008 drama *The Duchess*, which was classed as a 12 at the time, would be made a 15 today because it included a rape scene.

"What parents told us was, that's too much for 12-year-olds," he told BBC News. "It's enough that a 12-year-old knows that a rape has taken place. They do not need to see it, no matter how discreetly it's filmed."

In the survey, parents

said they were worried about the "sexualisation of society and what they called the pornification of society", according to Mr Austin.

"They are worried about children growing up being exposed to too much too soon, and they want to hold onto their children's childhood as far as they can," he said.

"That's another one of the reasons why from now on we will not be classifying any depiction of sexual violence at 12. We will limit it to 15."

The BBFC also looked at other "real life" scenarios like self-harm, mental health and suicide, but said its existing rules were in line with the public's views.

For example, viewers were happy that Netflix's *To The Bone*, about a young woman dealing with anorexia, was given a 15.

"Parents and children said we were right to do this because that issue is not suitable when it's shown in that way for

12-year-olds," Mr Austin said.

Viewers were less worried about less realistic action violence, such as that seen in James Bond or Marvel films, the survey found.

Meanwhile, 95% of teenagers surveyed said they want online streaming services to

carry the same age ratings as cinemas and DVDs.

They already appear on many Netflix shows and films, but Mr Austin said they were working with Netflix to make it 100% - as well as working with other services.

He said: "We are going to be working in 2019 with some of the big platforms

to fulfil what the public has asked us to do, which is to ensure those ratings are consistent when you view something at the cinema, whether you view it on DVD or whether you view it on a tablet in your bedroom."

The new guidelines will come into effect on 28 February.

who confirmed he was not injured, the palace said.

The Queen and Prince Philip have been staying in Sandringham since Christmas. The duke did not join the royal family for their Christmas Day church service.

The duke decided to retire from royal duties in August 2017 to avoid his growing frailty being exposed in public. He came to the decision after a busy run of engagements which included the Queen's 90th birthday.

The duke carried out 219 engagements in 2016, and more than 22,000 since 1952.

In 2013 he spent 11 days in hospital for what was described as an exploratory operation on his abdomen.

Although sources have suggested that it was more serious, he has had no significant medical problems since.

He has in the past received hospital treatment for bladder infections and a blocked coronary artery.

A Buckingham Palace statement said: "The Duke of Edinburgh was involved in a road traffic accident with another vehicle this afternoon. The duke was not injured. The accident took place close to the Sandringham Estate. Local police attended the scene."

Norfolk police said officers were called to the Sandringham Estate shortly before 3pm "following reports of a collision involving two cars". A police spokesman said police and ambulance crews attended, and two people in one of the vehicles suffered minor injuries.

Kevin and the Oscars: time for a 'Hart-to-Hart'?

THERE'S OUTRAGE everywhere you look these days, and for those of you suffering a bit of outrage fatigue, my sympathies. But as an actor and a gay man I have to address one issue that has really hit home for me: that of Kevin Hart and the Oscars.

For those of you who don't take an interest in such things, here's a brief explainer: The black comic actor Kevin Hart signed on to be the host for this year's Oscars and at first I was excited. He's a funny guy and I figured he'd bring some much-needed laughter to the show. But then some tweets from his past surfaced that were somewhat homophobic. The Academy said he needed to apologize for these tweets and other quotes from his past and he refused to do so,

announcing publicly that he wouldn't be hosting Hollywood's biggest night, after all.

Well I have a bit of a bee in my bonnet about this and more than one friend has asked me why I am 'so angry and militant' about gay rights. So I thought I'd try to explain myself in a forum that requires more than 140 characters.

A few year's back as part of his comedy routine Hart said that if his son were to come home and tell him he was gay, he would beat him. Kevin apologized and I respect him for that, and I think he meant it - after all it was part of his comedy routine. If we go back in history, especially in the '70s, British comedy was full of homophobia, women-hating and not-so subtle racism. But that was of a time right? Growing up in a working

class midlands town it was considered fun to be offensive, and if I'm honest I laughed too.

Some ask if this PC thing has gotten out of hand. Has the whole world gone crazy, people often ask? Straight white men (SWM) seem to be alienated by anyone that's not them. I hear SWM actors complaining that they aren't getting them breaks anymore, because they are now going to people of colour or women, or they are now 'going gay' on the role. And all this talk and upset And now the focus has turned to Hart, who in 2015 said he would never play a gay role because of his own insecurities, revealing that he turned down a spot in 2008's Tropic Thunder because the role was for a "flagrant" gay character.

So is it all fear? Insecurities?

I was born into a very "straight" neighborhood as but I was bit 'flagrant' as a little kid. I loved dressing up, putting on make-up and wearing mum's stockings on my head and running out the front door in her high heels, to the laughter of the neighbours. I used to like to play with the girls, I wasn't into football and the lads scared me. And I became an excellent sprinter at school, because of all the times I was chased home by bullies wanting to beat me up.

Things changed when I was about 11 and sifting

through the 7" singles stalls at the local market. Uncle Stewart, my dad's best man from his wedding, came up to me and said "In order to survive out there Craig, you're gonna have to butch it up. Play the part, become a man." This stuck with me. I really listened to that advice and took it to heart. I started got into football, computer games and started hanging around with the bad boys. I get into fights and I started to bully others. The taunting of me stopped because I was no the queer ... and I liked it. I even started dating girls. We had one older gay man on the estate, named Martin and I'd join in and throw stones at him, one night we painted his house pink. Looking back I'm mortified at my behaviour. But the further I removed myself the more protected I was.

So what's my point? I often wonder what my life might have been like if I hadn't received those words of advice from my Uncle. Would I have ended up like the guy in the village? Or the bigger question... would I even still be here? Research has found that attempted suicide rates and suicidal thoughts among lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT) youth is significantly higher than among the general population. LGBT adolescents have the highest rate of suicide attempts, which scientific research indicates is

linked to homophobic attitudes and heterosexist discrimination, including political attacks on the civil rights of LGBT people, such as in the contemporary efforts to halt the establishment of same-sex marriage.

Today I'm an out man and have been in a long term relationship with Michael, the love of my life. But it took me a hell of a long time to accept myself and get past the self-loathing I used to pray to god to make me straight, I wouldn't let people get close to me for fear of them "finding out" about me. Even today I think its funny when I hear comments of "what a waste" and "who's the man in the relationship"?

Which brings me back to Kevin Hart. He was offered the chance to become an ally. To do more

than just apologize. To teach other straight young people that their words have consequences. That bullying, even though it seems funny, can really hurt and change lives and sometimes end them. But he chose not to, he said no. "To be come an LBGT ally is not my priority," he said.

So yes this is why I have a bee in my bonnet about Kevin Hart. He had an opportunity. He had a choice. And that's fine, but I am also allowed to have an opinion about it.

So next time you wonder what straight privilege looks like, ask yourself if you have had to live my life, or that of millions others around the world who had it so much worse than me. Maybe you'll get it. Or maybe, like Kevin you just don't care.

Federer leads Murray tributes

ROGER FEDERER, Novak Djokovic and Rafael Nadal were among the first to pay tribute to Andy Murray after he announced his retirement this week.

"It hits us top guys hard because we know Andy very well," said Federer. "We like him. He's a good guy, Hall of Famer, legend.

"He won everything he wanted to win. Anybody would substitute their career with his.

"It's a tough one, but one that down the road he will look back on and be incredibly proud of everything he has achieved.

"I was disappointed and sad – a little bit shocked – to know now that we're going to lose him at some point.

"But we're going to lose everybody at some point. It's just now that it's definite."

Djokovic could see Murray was near the end when they played a practice match in Melbourne last Thursday. The 31-year-olds have long been rivals and have played against each other in four finals at the Australian Open. The Serb said: "You didn't need to be on court to notice he's struggling, that he's not moving as well.

"To see him struggle so much and go through so much pain, it's very sad and it hurts me as his long-time friend, colleague, rival. He's a great champion. He's a legend of this sport.

Nadal, whose career has been blighted by injury, said: "It's bad news. "But when somebody like him – he achieved almost everything in his career – is suffering like he's doing for such a long time already and you feel that you are not competitive for the thing that really makes you wake up every morning to go on court with the passion to practice, to improve and with a goal, then it's so difficult."

Injuries prompt Dembele China move

Injury-hit Spurs sorry to lose midfielder Pochettino dubs 'a genius'

Tottenham have confirmed the £11m departure of Mousa Dembélé – a player that the manager, Mauricio Pochettino, describes as a "genius" and one the club's supporters held dear during his six and a half years with them – to Guangzhou R&F in the Chinese Super League.

Dembélé, 31, has long considered China as his next destination and he thought that a deal had been agreed for him to join Beijing Guoan last summer only for nothing to materialise. This time, Spurs have been happy to take the money for a player who had six months to run on his contract, no desire to sign a new one and well-documented fitness issues.

Dembélé, who has not played since 3 November because of a foot problem, was well aware that his body's capacity to keep up with the remorseless demands of the Premier League was in doubt and he wanted a move to a lower-tempo league.

The Belgian joined

Spurs in August 2012 from Fulham for £15m and he made 250 appearances in all competitions for them, scoring 10 goals. With Dembélé, though, it was never about the numbers, rather the admiration he drew with his uncommon mixture of brute strength and velvet-soft touch. At his best, he could dictate Spurs games from central midfield and virtually all

of his teammates at various times described him as the best player at the club.

"I always say to him: 'Mousa, when I write my book, you will be one of my genius players that I have been lucky enough to meet,'" Pochettino said in March 2017. "One was Maradona; also Ronaldinho, Okocha and Iván de la Peña – he was a genius, too – and then

Mousa. We always tell Mousa that if we had taken him at 18 or 19, he would have become one of the best players in the world."

Dembélé described Spurs as "part of my family now, 100%". He added: "Sometimes you separate in a bad way but I don't feel that way. I go away with an unbelievable feeling and with a certain love for the club."

Cech to hang up his gloves at end of season

Arsenal keeper Petr Cech will retire at the end of the season.

The 36-year-old (pictured, right) joined Arsenal in June 2015 from the London rivals Chelsea, where he spent 11 years.

"Having played 15 years in the Premier League and won every single trophy possible, I feel like I have achieved everything I set out to achieve," said the ex-Czech Republic international.

"I will continue to work hard at Arsenal to hopefully win one more trophy this season."

Cech's career was in doubt in October 2006 when he required surgery for a skull fracture after a collision with Reading's Stephen Hunt.



The keeper was out for three months and has since worn a protective headguard during games.

He added: "This is my 20th season as a professional player and it has been 20 years since I signed my first professional contract, so it feels like the right time to announce that I will retire.

"I am looking forward to seeing what life holds for me off the pitch."

Cech arrived in England when he was signed by Chelsea from French club Rennes in July 2004.

He went on to win 13 trophies with the Stamford Bridge club, including one Champions League and four Premier League titles.

He also set a club record of 228 clean sheets in all competitions, beating the previous mark of 208 set by former

England international Peter Bonetti between 1960 and 1979.

Cech eventually lost his place to Belgian Thibaut Courtois before joining Arsenal and helping the Gunners win the FA Cup in 2017.

"For your consummate professionalism, for being the perfect role model, for the 50 clean sheets, for your honesty, your integrity and for your inspiring work with the Arsenal Foundation, we want to say - thank you Petr Cech," tweeted Arsenal.

In a statement on their website, the club added: "Petr recently informed us of his decision. Like all football fans, we are sad about this, but completely understand and support Petr."

Kane out till March

Tottenham striker Harry Kane will be out until March after injuring ankle ligaments in Sunday's 1-0 Premier League defeat by Manchester United.

Spurs say the England captain, 25, will return to training in early March.

Kane, Tottenham's top scorer this season with 20 goals, is likely to miss both legs of the Champions League last-16 tie with Borussia Dortmund.

He will also be unavailable for the second leg of the Carabao Cup semi-final against Chelsea on 24 January.

Kane injured his left ankle when he was caught between United's Phil Jones and Victor Lindelof late in the game at Wembley.

Tottenham manager Mauricio Pochettino said after the match: "It was a clear foul on Harry Kane, a big hit. [Referee] Mike Dean said he didn't see it."

Spurs, who are third in the Premier League - nine points behind leaders Liverpool - look set to be without Kane for the games against Chelsea and Arsenal on 27 February and 2 March respectively.

Tottenham forward Son Heung-min is currently on international duty with South Korea at the Asia Cup in the United Arab Emirates.

Son, who has scored 12 goals, could be unavailable until February depending on how far South Korea progress. The final is on 1 February.

France midfielder Moussa Sissoko was replaced in the first half against United with what appeared to be a hamstring injury.

Tottenham's back-up strikers are Fernando Llorente, who has scored four goals in 13 appearances this season, and Vincent Janssen, who has not played for the first team since August 2017.

End of the road for Sir Andy

Chronic hip pain forces great Scot to call time on career

SIR ANDY Murray fought back tears this week after crashing out of the Australian Open this week, signaling an end to his glittering career.

The Scottish star has suffered from a chronic hip problem in recent years and had indicated that this tournament would likely be his last, which he confirmed shortly after the loss, but insisted: "If this was my last match, it was an amazing way to end."

After mounting a thrilling fightback before his hopes of a fairy tale swansong were ended in a five-set epic, the former world number one tennis ace told how he had "given everything I had".

Sir Andy, 31, was

cheered on by mother Judy and brother Jamie as he fought a four-hour battle with Spain's Roberto Bautista Agut, the number 22 seed. He lost 4-6, 4-6, 7-6, 7-6, 2-6.

Later the proud father hinted at his heartache that his two daughters, Edie, one, and Sophia, two, would never see him play a professional match as he faces quitting the sport due to injury. Addressing the crowd the Scot, who reached five Australian Open finals, said: "Thanks to everyone for all of the support - my team, my family, and everyone who has contributed to my career. Maybe I'll see you again. I'll do everything possible to try."

There was a standing

ovation for the three-time Grand Slam winner as he waved farewell to the 10,000-strong crowd days after announcing he will retire this year because of his hip. He said: "It was an amazing atmosphere. I gave literally everything I had on the court and performed a lot better than what I should have done with the amount I've been able to practise."

Tennis stars Rafael Nadal, Roger Federer and Novak Djokovic paid tribute to him in video messages on the big screen in the Melbourne Park arena. Judy, 59, also posted a mock-up image of her "warrior king" son, as medieval monarch Henry V. Sir Andy

O'Neill has succeeded Aitor Karanka at the City

Ground and is Nottingham Forest's 11th manager since June 2011.

The length of the former Celtic, Aston Villa and Leicester manager's contract has not been disclosed.

After finishing 17th in 2017-18, they invested heavily during the

summer, with Joao Carvalho arriving from Benfica for a club record fee of £13.2m and striker Lewis Grabban joining in a £6m deal from Bournemouth.

The Forest job is the Northern Irishman's first return to club management since a mixed spell with Sunderland, which saw him guide the Black Cats away from relegation from the Premier League in his first season but then struggle again the following campaign prior to his sacking in March 2013.
