WE NEED MORE TIME!

- MPS vote 413 to 202 to ask EU for Brexit delay
- But bid for second referendum rejected
- May survives after latest deal is voted down

MPs have voted by 413 to 202 - a majority of 211 - for Prime Minister Theresa May to ask the EU for a delay to Brexit.

It means the UK may not now leave on 29 March as previously planned.

Mrs May says Brexit could be delayed by three months, to 30 June, if MPs back her deal in a vote next week.

If they reject her deal again then she says she will seek a longer extension - but any delay has to be agreed by the 27 other EU member states.

Most Conservative MPs voted against delaying Brexit - including seven cabinet members - meaning Mrs May had to rely on Labour and other opposition votes to get it through.

Theresa May has long insisted that the UK will leave the EU on 29 March with or without a withdrawal deal.

But she was forced to offer MPs a vote on delaying Brexit after they rejected her withdrawal agreement by a large margin, for a second

time, and then voted to reject a no-deal Brexit.

She has warned that extending the departure date beyond three months could harm trust in democracy - and mean that the UK would have to take part in May's European Parliament elections.

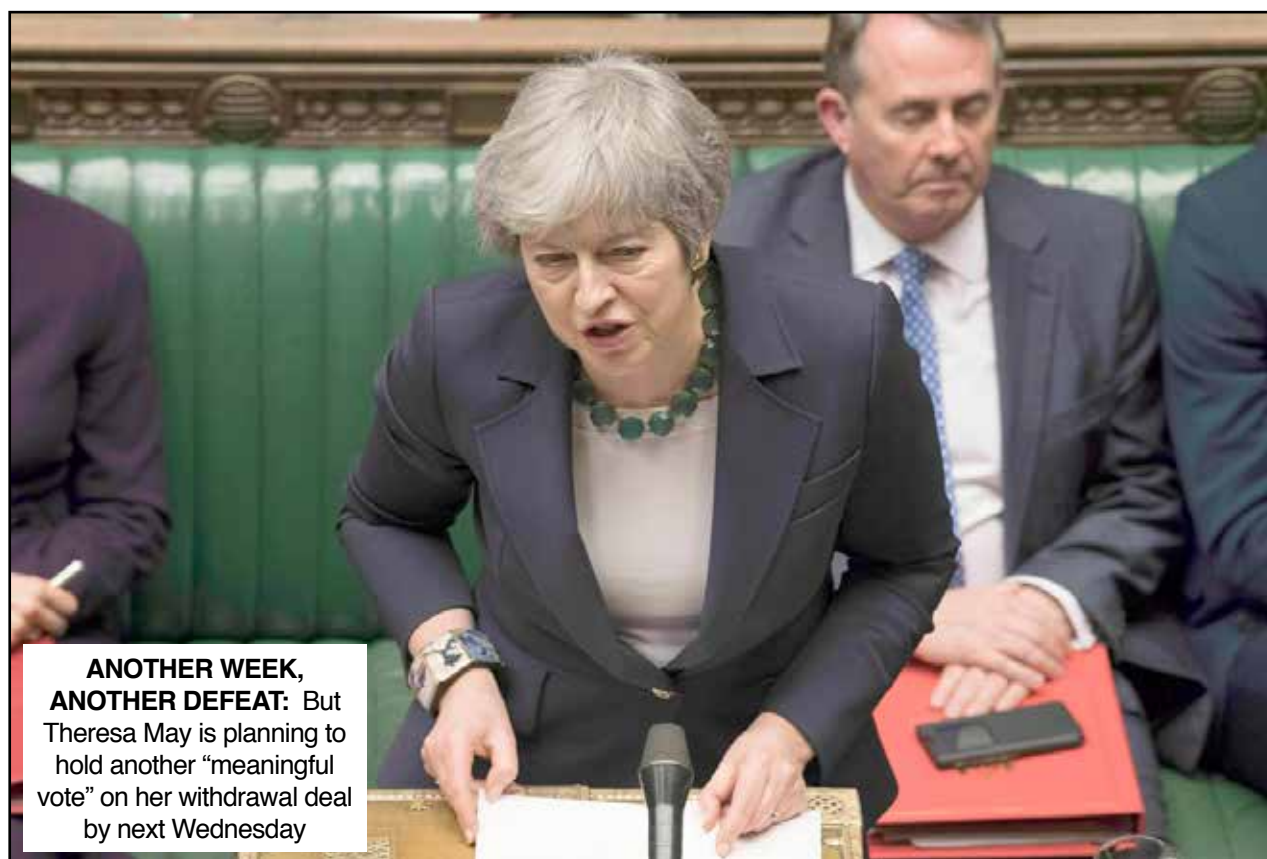
Downing Street said the government was still preparing for a no-deal Brexit.

'possible extension'

Theresa May is planning to hold another "meaningful vote" on her withdrawal deal by Wednesday - after it was overwhelmingly rejected on two previous occasions.

She then plans to go to an EU summit on Thursday, where she would ask for a one-off extension to get the necessary legislation through Parliament.

A spokesman for the European Commission said extending Article 50, the mechanism taking the

UK out of the EU on 29 March, would need the "unanimous agreement" of all EU member states.

And it would be for the leaders of those states "to consider such a request, giving priority to the need to ensure the functioning of the EU institutions and taking into account the reasons for and duration of a

possible extension".

Downing Street said this was a "natural consequence" of Mrs May's decision to offer a free vote on an issue where there are "strong views on all sides of the debate".

Chief Secretary to the Treasury Liz Truss tweeted: "I voted against a delay to Brexit. As a

delay was passed by Parliament, I want to see deal agreed ASAP so we can minimise to short, technical, extension."

Seven cabinet ministers - Ms Truss, Brexit Secretary Stephen Barclay, International Trade Secretary Liam Fox, International Development Secretary Penny Mordaunt,

Commons leader Andrea Leadsom, Transport Secretary Chris Grayling and Defence Secretary Gavin Williamson - voted against the government motion.

Health Secretary Matthew Hancock said it would be "extremely difficult" but "still possible to deliver Brexit on 29 March with a deal".

Former paratrooper facing charges for Bloody Sunday deaths

- but victims' families are left unhappy at the news

A former British soldier faces murder charges over the killing of two people on Bloody Sunday in Londonderry in 1972.

The Public Prosecution Service said there was enough evidence to prosecute the man known as Soldier F for the murders of James Wray and William McKinney.

The sole prosecution is seen as a "terrible disappointment" by some of the families of the 13 people killed.

They were shot dead at a civil rights march on 30 January 1972.

The day became known as Bloody Sunday - one of the darkest days of the Northern Ireland Troubles.

On the same day as the funerals were held for 11 of the Bloody Sunday victims, the British Embassy in Dublin was burned to the ground by an angry crowd.

'Heartbroken' families

Soldier F also faces charges for the attempted murders of Patrick O'Donnell, Joseph Friel, Joe Mahon and Michael

Quinn.

The former paratrooper is being referred to only as Soldier F because all military witnesses were granted anonymity through the Saville Inquiry into the circumstances around the killings.

The PPS said there was insufficient evidence to prosecute 16 other soldiers and two Official IRA men.

James Wray's brother Liam said he was "very saddened for the other families" of those killed on Bloody Sunday.

"Their hearts must be broken," he said. "It has been a sad day but the Wray family are relieved."

He added: "There are a lot of sad and heartbroken people today."

William McKinney's brother Michael said it was "disappointing" for families who had not received news of prosecutions.

Director of the PPS Stephen Herron said: "It has been a long road for the families... and today will be another extremely difficult day for many of them."

"We wanted to meet them personally to explain the decisions taken and to help them understand the reasons."

Linda Nash, whose brother William was shot dead, said she feels "let down by a law and a justice system that's supposed to protect people".

'perjury'

"I'm feeling devastated. The most difficult thing I had to do today was to call my children and tell them that there are no prosecutions for their granda and uncle."

Her sister Kate said they would appeal the decision.

Soldier F gave evidence anonymously to the Saville Inquiry in 2003 and admitted firing 13 rounds on Bloody Sunday.

His assertion that there were "gunmen and bombers killed" was rejected in Lord Saville's report.

The Saville Inquiry stated that there was "no doubt" Soldier F had shot father-of-six Paddy Doherty, who was unarmed.

Saville also found there was "no doubt" Soldier F had shot an unarmed Bernard McGuigan on Bloody Sunday as he went to the aid of Patrick Doherty, waving a white handkerchief.

At the Saville Inquiry, Soldier F admitted he had shot 17-year-old Michael Kelly - but he said that he had only fired at people with bombs or weapons.

However, Saville concluded Mr Kelly was unarmed.

The Saville Inquiry found that both William McKinney and James Wray could have been shot by Soldier F and three other soldiers.

The inquiry report also stated Soldier F had changed his story over the years.

Mr Herron said the decisions to prosecute announced on Thursday "relate only to allegations of criminal conduct on Bloody Sunday itself".

"Consideration will now be given to allegations of perjury in respect of those suspects reported by police," he said.

UK Defence Secretary Gavin Williamson said the government would offer full legal support to Soldier F - including paying his legal costs and providing welfare support.

"We are indebted to those soldiers who served with courage and distinction to bring peace to Northern Ireland," he said. "The welfare

of our former service personnel is of the utmost importance."

He said the the Ministry of Defence is working "to drive through a new package of safeguards to ensure our armed forces are not unfairly treated."

"And the Government will urgently reform the system for dealing with legacy issues," he said.

"Our serving and former personnel cannot live in constant fear of prosecution."

Following Mr Williamson's statement, lawyers acting on behalf of the family of William Nash said they had contacted the Northern Ireland attorney general accusing the defence secretary of contempt of court.

'hung out to dry'

But Bob Seely, the Conservative MP for the Isle of Wight and a former soldier, has railed against the prospect of prosecution.

"Rules of war are there to be obeyed," he said. "But I am bemused by how on earth the decision to prosecute members of the Parachute Regiment - if that is what is now planned - serves peace in Northern Ireland today.

Prosecution does not send a signal of justice. It is without a semblance of equality. UK soldiers are being hung out to dry whilst those they fought are treated by different rules. There is a natural and obvious injustice. I

do not argue that all the Paras behaved as they should. Some didn't, and people died as a result, but the purpose of the peace process was to accept that while bad things happened in the past, they should stay there. Gavin Williamson is said to be planning legislation to introduce a 10-year limit on alleged historic abuses. Such a law can't come soon enough."

A public inquiry conducted by a senior judge in 1972 was branded a whitewash by victims' families.

After decades of campaigning, a fresh inquiry was eventually ordered by then prime minister Tony Blair in 1998.

Lord Saville's 5,000-page report stated none of the casualties was posing a threat of causing death or serious injury and that soldiers had lost their self-control.

The prime minister at the time of the report's publication, David Cameron, apologised for the soldiers' conduct, saying the killings were unjustified and unjustifiable.

A police investigation into Bloody Sunday followed Lord Saville's 12-year, £200m public inquiry.

A file was sent to the Public Prosecution Service (PPS) in November 2016.

In total, police reported 20 suspects to the PPS - 18 of them former soldiers, one of whom died last year.

Hard time for “Easy Cash” gang

VICIOUS raiders known as the Easy Cash Gang have been jailed for a total of more than 40 years.

During a two-month reign of terror, the robbers, riding motor scooters and armed with zombie knives, samurai swords, axes and sledgehammers, targeted exclusive stores.

Seven gang members aged 17 to 21 were jailed in a two-day sentencing hearing at Blackfriars Crown Court. They included ringleader Miguel St Martin, who was handcuffed in the dock after lashing out when he was found guilty. As women relatives sobbed in the public gallery, Judge Ian Darling told three of the youngest robbers: “In real terms, you are all children.

“What on earth it was that made you think this sort of conduct is worth the risk, I shall never know.”

St Martin, 21, led five gang members in the raid on Boodles in Sloane Street, Knightsbridge, last March, where CCTV cameras filmed them trying to smash a Land Rover Discovery through the front window.

A month later, St Martin and three accomplices returned to Sloane Street and raided the Yves Saint Laurent shop, snatching handbags worth £100,000.

Detectives tracked St

Martin to a hotel in Kings Cross, central London, later that day and found a ‘zombie’ knife, -so named for its large serrated edge - four stolen mobile phones and two Saint Laurent handbags, each worth £5,000. Scotland Yard linked the gang to 10 smash-and-grab raiders who were jailed for 110 years in 2017 for a £1.2million series of raids on mobile phone shops, the court heard.

Last year, the Flying Squad identified five suspects, including St Martin, after discovering a garage in Islington, north London, that was being used by mobile phone thieves.

Judge Darling said the gang’s name “could not be more apt”, adding that it was “a gang who appears to regard itself as above the law and who behave with a total disregard for honest members of the community”.

St Martin, of King’s Cross, was jailed for 12 years, Alfie Warry, 21, of Camden, north London, for nine. Henry Histon, 19, also Camden, received six years as did Harry Doyle, 18, of Islington. Reece Salmon, 20, also of Islington, was jailed for three years and nine months.

A 17-year-old received six years and a 16-year-old two years. A second 17-year-old will be sentenced later this month.

Bereaved father pays tribute to daughter lost in 737 crash

■ Seven Britons among the dead in Boeing 737 Ethiopia accident

A FATHER has paid a heartbreaking tribute to his environmentalist daughter, who was one of 157 people killed when a plane crashed minutes after take off.

Joanna Toole, 36, was one of seven Britons killed while travelling to a UN conference when an Ethiopian Airlines Boeing 737 Max-8 plunged from the skies on Sunday.

A fellow passenger killed in the crash was Joseph Waithaka – a 55-year-old Kenyan and British dual national. On Monday his son Ben Kuria, from Croydon, near London, also paid tribute.

The jet crashed just six minutes after taking off from Addis Ababa on a flight to Nairobi, Kenya. The aircraft had only been operational for four months. It was the same model as a Lion Air jet which crashed shortly after take off in Indonesia last October, killing all 189 people on board.

‘loving young woman’

Joanna’s father Adrian Toole described his daughter, who was an oceans environmental expert, as a “loving” young woman. He said: “Joanna’s work was not a job – it was her vocation. “She had never really wanted to do anything else but work in animal welfare since she was a child. Somehow that work took her into the international sphere and for the last 15 years she has been working for international animal welfare organisations.

“That involves a lot of travelling around the world – although personally I never wanted her to be on a single one of those planes.

“I’m an environmental campaigner myself – so

partly it was because of the damage to the environment, but also because it’s a dangerous occupation to be flying. Up until now she had been lucky.”

Joanna, one of three sisters, from Exmouth, Devon, worked for the UN’s Food and Agriculture Organisation and lived in Rome, Italy, with her partner.

‘generous man’

Ben Kuria said he was still in shock after hearing that his father Joseph was on board the flight.

Mr Kuria described his father, who had moved to the UK in 2004, as a “generous man who loved justice”. Mr Waithaka lived in Hull before returning to live in Kenya in 2015. He had three children.

Like many passengers on the flight, Joanna was travelling to Nairobi for the UN Environment Assembly which began on Monday and was attended by world leaders including French President Emmanuel Macron.

Manuel Barange, a UN director, said he was “profoundly sad and lost for words” over Joanna’s death. He tweeted: “A

wonderful human being, who loved her work with a passion. Our love to her family and loved ones.”

Prime Minister Theresa May said she was “deeply saddened” to learn of the disaster. “At this very difficult time my thoughts are with the families and friends of the British citizens on board and all those affected by this tragic incident,” she

said.

A woman who knew her wrote on Twitter, “Jo was a wonderful young passionate campaigner. So much accomplished in a life that was too short. This news is so terribly sad and former colleagues at WSPA are all so shocked. Thoughts and love to all those who knew @JoannaToole at this terrible time.”

Three die as avalanche sweeps away Ben Nevis climbers

THREE climbers died on Sunday and another was seriously injured after they were "swept away" by an avalanche on Britain's highest mountain.

The men, believed to be Swiss, were caught up in the snow slide on Ben Nevis's North Face. The alarm was raised just before noon. But a Coastguard helicopter from Inverness and an air ambulance were forced back by winds gusting at more than 70mph. The treacherous conditions meant the recovery operation in Number 5 Gully on the 4,411ft peak had to be undertaken on foot.

Donald Paterson, deputy team leader of Lochaber Mountain Rescue Team, said: "It was strong winds, snow, thunder and lightning – you name it. I was forced on to my knees four times. It was brutal."

The four climbers were hit "by a massive, massive avalanche," he said. "It must have fallen from 4,000ft at the top and fell 1,500ft on to them. It swept them away."

"One of the climbers died pretty instantaneously. Another had CPR for half-an-hour but sadly did not respond and the other died while being taken down the mountain."

The fourth is listed as being in serious condition in hospital in Glasgow.

"We did all we possibly could," said Mr Paterson. "We had every available person we could get hold of. We carried the bodies all the way down. It is a terrible tragedy. They just got wiped out by the avalanche."

Wake-up call for the 'woke' generation?

■ How a satirical Twitter account captured the PC zeitgeist

When a former Oxford University postgraduate student set up a satirical Twitter account in April 2018 under the name of Titania McGrath, he had no idea of the social media storm that was to follow.

Aiming to poke fun at the "identitarian left" who use "vicious tactics to push identity politics above all else", the parody account quickly amassed over 180,000 social media followers.

After months of speculation, the individual behind it can finally be revealed - as a 40-year-old former private school teacher with a doctorate in Early Renaissance Poetry from Wadham College, Oxford.

Dr Andrew Doyle created the account to mock today's "woke culture" that is obsessed with gender fluidity, identity politics and hates freedom of speech.

Describing Titania McGrath as "a militant vegan who thinks she is a better poet than William Shakespeare", Mr Doyle told The Telegraph this week: "Woke is the concept that everything must be inclusive, inoffensive, that you always use the correct language and that you must be hyper aware of other people's sensitivities."

"This social justice

movement is full of people who are arrogant, narcissistic and very certain in themselves. The very idea that they could be wrong doesn't even cross their mind. That to me is incredibly funny. I thought Titania could embody all of that.

"The majority of people are desperate for this culture to be mocked. The account has become so popular because people are sick of feeling that they can't say what they want. It used to be the case that if someone spoke out of turn, you would say that's a bit much, apologise and everyone would move on. Now you post a screenshot on Twitter and try to get someone fired."

"Titania is staying the stuff that most people want to say."

Named after Titania, the queen of the fairies, in William Shakespeare's *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, Mr Doyle drew on

his academic thesis when setting up the parody Twitter account.

"She is named after the queen of the fairies because I think all of this 'woke culture' is an utter fantasy world," he said. "The people who promote this hyper inclusive culture are fantasists."

"They believe that racial boundaries must be strictly policed, so any cultural appropriation is completely off bounds. But gender is totally 100 per cent fluid and you can pick and choose as you please. This stuff is completely incoherent and the stuff of fantasy. So I think it's quite appropriate that she is named after the queen of the fairies."

Titania McGrath's jokes are often labelled as offensive by Twitter and have resulted in the account being banned four times.

"What really kicked it off though was when it

was banned by Twitter, said Doyle.

"It got to about 40,000 followers and then it was banned. There were a lot of people complaining and within 24 hours the account was reinstated. She got 20,000 that day when she was back. That's when I knew that it was

going to be something big. After that it has just gone up and up. It's been very rapid.

"The best thing that happened to her was that she was banned by Twitter. If she gets banned again, which I am sure she will, then it will really help."

Honours Committee 'warned Thatcher against Savile knighthood'

The committee that recommends people for knighthoods received allegations of child sexual abuse against Jimmy Savile in 1998, an inquiry has heard.

The head of the Honours Committee also resisted pressure from Margaret Thatcher in the 1980s to knight Savile, according to letters seen by the probe.

Savile sexually abused at least 72 people, including eight who were raped.

The Independent Inquiry into Child Sexual Abuse is investigating both institutions and public figures.

Savile, who died in 2011, was ultimately knighted in 1990 in recognition of his charity work.

The Westminster strand of the inquiry heard civil servants were wary of Savile as early as 1984.

In letters exchanged with then prime minister Mrs Thatcher's secretary, committee head Lord Robert Armstrong cited

interviews with Savile published in the Sun the previous year in which the BBC DJ boasted about sleeping with hundreds of girls, having people assaulted, and telling a suicidal man how he could take his own life.

"My committee did not feel that sufficient time has elapsed since Mr Savile's unfortunate revelations in the popular press in April of this year," Lord Armstrong wrote.

"He is much in the public eye and it is

unlikely that the lurid details of his story will have been forgotten. I fear it would be best if Mr Savile were to wait a little longer."

He later refused to include him in the birthday honours list, saying time had "served only to strengthen the doubts felt about a knighthood for Mr Savile".

He had been advised awarding a knighthood to Savile would bring the honours system into "disrepute", he wrote.

In 1998, the committee received an anonymous letter that said "reports of a paedophilia nature" could emerge about Savile and allegations about his involvement with boys.

It said: "While within limits and bounds homosexuality can be rationalized in a modern society, we must not lose sight that paedophilia goes beyond any boundaries which right-minded people of whatever political persuasions find cont. on page 5/

abhorrent.”

Giving evidence to the inquiry, senior civil servant Helen MacNamara - who currently heads the Honours and Appointments Secretariat - said such a letter would now be passed to police immediately.

She added that she did not know how the letter was dealt with at the time or if any concerns were raised with authorities.

The Independent Inquiry into Child Sexual Abuse in England and Wales is investigating claims against local authorities, religious organisations, the armed forces, and public and private institutions - as well as people in the public eye.

The inquiry is being led by Prof Alexis Jay, a former director of social services who headed the inquiry into child sexual exploitation in Rotherham.

The inquiry's public hearings consist of 13 separate investigations, which are expected to last until 2020.

Pair face court over Jodie park murder

TWO people appeared in court on Monday, accused of the murder of 17-year-old Jodie Chesney. Manuel Petrovic, 20, of Collier Row, east London, who appeared via video link from prison, was remanded in custody at the Old Bailey and ordered to stand trial on September 2. Ten miles away, a 16-year-old boy, who cannot be named for legal reasons, appeared at Barkingside magistrates court. Jodie, from Dagenham, east London, died from a single knife wound at a park in Harold Hill, near Romford, on March 1.

your goals and read them. When you feel down write the positive things you have in your life and be grateful, like health, family, friends etc.

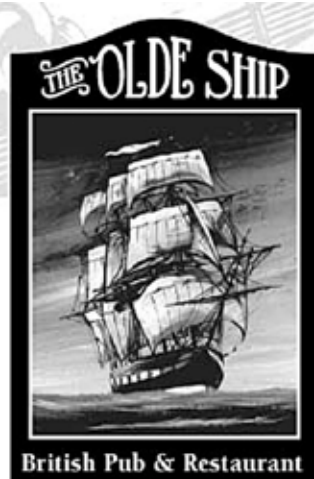
Lots of our members join our group Brits in LA seeking out words of wisdom - what is the best piece of advice you've been given?

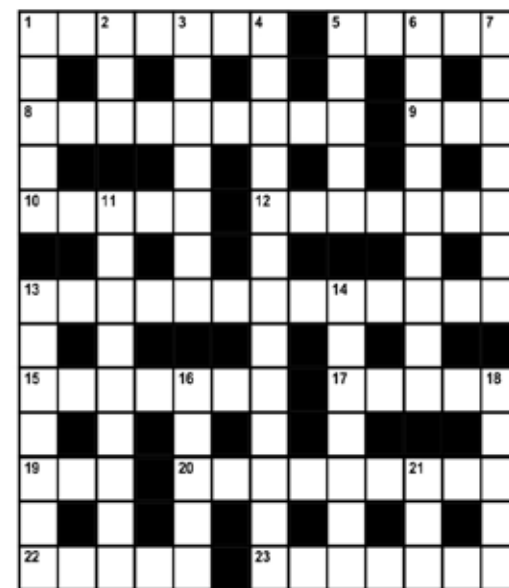

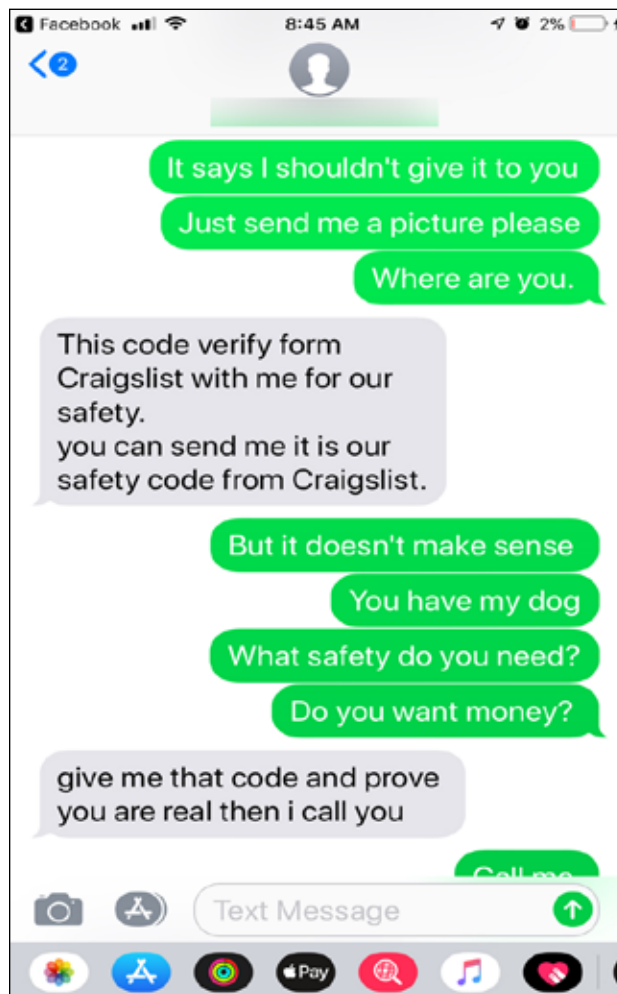

Scholes out at Oldham

Former Manchester United and England midfielder Paul Scholes has left his role as Oldham boss after just 31 days.

The 44-year-old took on his first managerial job on 11 February and was only in charge of the League Two club for seven games, winning one.

Scholes said in a statement that he had decided to resign with "great regret".

"It unfortunately became clear that I would not be able to operate as I intended and was led to believe prior to taking on

the role," he continued. Scholes took over with the Latics 14th in the table, nine points off the play-offs, and leaves with them in the same position.

He began his reign with a 4-1 win over Yeovil Town, but three draws and two defeats followed prior to his final match, a 2-0 defeat by league leaders Lincoln City on Tuesday.

"I hoped to at the very least, see out my initial term of 18 months as the manager of a club I've supported all my life," he said.

"The fans, players, my friends and family all knew how proud and excited I was to take this role.

"I wish the fans, the players and the staff - who have been tremendous - all the best for the rest of the season and will continue to watch and support the club as a fan."

Scholes made 718 appearances for Manchester United, including 499 in the Premier League, and scored 155 goals in all competitions.

He initially announced his retirement at the end

of the 2010-11 season, but made a comeback at the start of 2012 before finally calling time on his career in 2013, having won 11 Premier League titles, three FA Cups, two League Cups, five Community Shields and two Champions Leagues. He also played 66 times

for England, retiring after Euro 2004 to focus on his club career.

Scholes resigned as a director of National League side Salford upon taking over at Boundary Park, but he retained his shareholding and could now return.

The Ammies could be

promoted to League Two this season and EFL rules prevent a person holding roles with two clubs at the same time without prior consent, although a holding of 10% or less in a club is disregarded providing it is held "purely for investment purposes".

Brum charged over Grealish attack

Birmingham City have been charged by the Football Association with failing to control their spectators after a fan attacked Jack Grealish during the Second city derby against Aston Villa at the weekend.

Supporter Paul Mitchell invaded the pitch in the 10th minute of Sunday's Championship fixture and struck the Villa captain from behind.

Mitchell was jailed for 14 weeks on Monday after admitting assault and encroachment on to the pitch. Blues have until 22 March to respond.

Mitchell's attack came after both sets of players had been involved in a melee when Blues midfielder Maikel Kieftenbeld fouled Grealish in the fifth minute of the game.

"It is alleged the club failed to ensure that its spectator[s] conducted themselves in an orderly fashion; refrained from improper or violent conduct and refrained from encroaching onto the pitch during the EFL Championship fixture against Aston Villa on Sunday," an FA

The FA has also charged both clubs

City stroll into quarters

Manchester City thrashed Schalke 7-0 in the second leg of their Champions League last-16 on Tuesday night tie to confirm their passage to the quarter-finals.

Sergio Aguero opened the scoring from the spot and added a second three minutes later when Raheem Sterling's backheel set him up from six yards.

Leroy Sane drilled in the third and picked up a hat-trick of assists after the break as City ran riot. Sterling, Bernardo Silva, Phil Foden and Gabriel Jesus also scored.

After slotting into the far corner in the first half, Sane set up Sterling with a wonderful curling cross that the England forward smashed into the top corner.

Silva pounced on Sane's cut-back to make it 5-0 before substitute Foden rounded the goalkeeper

after he was played in by the German winger. Jesus made sure he had a slice of the pie with a late curling strike.

City, who came from behind in the first leg in Germany to win 3-2, were knocked out in the quarter-finals of last year's competition by Liverpool and have never won the Champions League.

Manager Pep Guardiola said before this match that City were only "teenagers in the competition" but they were ruthless in this tie and displayed the confidence of seasoned European veterans.

Schalke never looked like scoring and the tie was as good as over the moment Aguero nonchalantly chipped the ball down the middle from the penalty spot.

City were full of creativity and flair - traits epitomised by the fourth

goal created by Sane, whose delightful, curling cross was smashed home by Sterling.

The only impediment to City's progress was a number of time-consuming VAR reviews, which were met with boos from fans inside the Etihad.

Aguero's second goal was reviewed for over two minutes but Sterling was comfortably onside when Ilkay Gundogan fed a lovely ball in down the right.

Sane had a goal ruled out after he rounded the goalkeeper only to be deemed offside by VAR, and Sterling's thunderous fourth goal was also reviewed but the correct decision stood.

It was a performance that underlined why City are considered among the favourites to win the competition for the first time.

Bale wants to stay at Real, says agent

Gareth Bale wants to "play all his career" at Real Madrid despite the return of Zinedine Zidane as manager, says his agent Jonathan Barnett.

The Frenchman's appointment is "bad news" for the Welsh forward because Zidane "does not want to work with Bale", according to Spanish football expert Guillem Balague.

The 29-year-old has been booed by home supporters this season.

Barnett said Bale is "very happy at the moment" but "we will see what goes on".

Asked if Bale will stay at Real, Barnett replied:

"Yes, why not? He wants to play all his career for Real Madrid and if it does not work out, we will talk again.

"He will talk with Mr Zidane, take it from there and then see at the end of the season."

After scoring twice and beating Liverpool in last season's Champions League final, Bale said he was considering his future having been named as a substitute for the match.

Bale was not a regular under Santiago Solari either, who was sacked on Monday after replacing Julen Lopetegui in November, while

sections of the Bernabeu crowd jeered the Wales forward when he was substituted during the 1-0 El Clasico defeat by Barcelona earlier this month.

Barnett said: "We speak a lot. The closest person to him is my son Joshua who is really his agent and he looks after him, he has done a good job.

"Gareth wanted to

play one way and Zidane wanted to play another. That was the cause of it and over a period of time it got worse.

"If you let Gareth play the way he wants to play, having a run of games in a row not in and out, he can be right up there with Cristiano Ronaldo. He still has a great talent.

"Gareth is very strong. He is a very strong-willed person and does not care what the press say. The jeering is not something that bothers him, he does not understand what he has to do.

"Look at his record, what he has won and how he has played. In years to come, these people who are booing him, their children will be looking at the goals he scored and will be saying, 'what a wonderful player'."

Bale's record at Real is superb, winning four Champions League titles, one La Liga, one Copa del Rey and three Uefa Super Cups and Club World Cups.

Reds 'back among the elite'

Klopp hails team after dominant display at the Allianz Arena

LIVERPOOL'S sensational 3-1 win over Bayern Munich on Wednesday is proof the club are back among Europe's elite, says manager Jurgen Klopp.

Two goals from Sadio Mane helped the Reds beat the German champions at the Allianz Arena on reach the Champions League quarter-finals for the second successive season.

Liverpool's win means there are now four Premier League sides in the last eight, following victories for Tottenham, Manchester United and Manchester City.

Barcelona, Juventus, Porto and Ajax make up the rest of the quarter-finalists.

Klopp added: "Whoever we get as an opponent we will take. The boys love the competition, they really dig in in these moments.

"The attitude was outstanding. The front three were outstanding, the boys who came on helped a lot.

"We've laid down a marker tonight that LFC is back on the top level of European football."

Neither side created many clear opportunities on a wet night in Munich and both sets of players were guilty of giving away possession too easily and too often.

However, the Reds carried more of a cutting

edge and took the lead in the tie in the 26th minute when Mane displayed an exquisite touch to bring down Virgil van Dijk's raking pass before firing into an empty net after Manuel Neuer had rushed from his goal.

Bayern now needed at least two goals and pulled one back when Joel Matip turned into his own net from close range.

However, the expectant waves of attack from the German champions never materialised after the break, and Van Dijk all but ensured Liverpool's spot in the last eight when he powered home James Milner's corner.

Mane capped off an excellent display when he headed in his second six minutes from time. It was his 10th goal in the past 10 games.

The match ended on a slight sour note for Liverpool when full-back Andrew Robertson picked up a yellow card in stoppage time which means he will be suspended for the first leg of their quarter-final.

The Reds' win means there will be four representatives from the Premier League in the last eight for the first time since 2009.

Bayern's starting XI contained six players aged 30 and older and they lacked energy and ideas

in attack. Liverpool, on the other hand, never needed to exert themselves too much bar a 15-minute period at the end of the first half.

The second half was very mature," said Klopp.

"In the moments we did play football we immediately destroyed the organisation of Bayern. It's absolutely deserved."

It was an impressive defensive display from Liverpool who limited Bundesliga champions Bayern to only two efforts on target.

"We haven't defended like we usually defend in our away Champions League games so far, today we did," added Klopp.

Giroud hat-trick as Blues ease through

Olivier Giroud scored a hat-trick as Chelsea thrashed Dynamo Kiev 5-0 to move into the Europa League quarter-finals with an 8-0 aggregate win on Thursday.

The France forward's early effort from Willian's corner set the tone for the Blues, who arrived in Kiev with a commanding 3-0 lead from the first leg.

Giroud swept in his second of the night from Marcos Alonso's sublime cross to register his eighth goal in the competition this season.

With the visitors in total control, Alonso tapped in a third goal from Callum Hudson-Odoi's cross before the break.

Kiev captain Serhiv Sydorchuk went close

to a consolation for the hosts in the second period, hitting the post from close range.

But Giroud completed his hat-trick with a header from another Willian corner, before Hudson-Odoi's placed effort put the gloss on a dominant display.

The quarter final draw took place on Friday after press time.
