Tory hopeful: I 'won't blink' in EU showdown

■ Jeremy Hunt vows he will not allow EU to "turn the screws on our country"

JEREMY Hunt fired a warning shot to Brussels this week as he vowed to walk away from Brexit talks if the EU does not give ground by the end of September.

Mr Hunt said he would then immediately order the Government to go full throttle for a no-deal exit on October 31. Going toe-to-toe with rival Boris Johnson, the Tory leadership contender said Britain "won't blink" and would face down any attempts from the European Union to "turn the screws on our country".

Setting out a robust 10-point exit plan, the Foreign Secretary said preparations for leaving without a deal would be ramped up from day one if he beat frontrunner Mr Johnson into Downing Street on July 24. Mr Hunt also said he would, if necessary, cancel August leave for Whitehall officials involved in Brexit preparations.

His tough talk comes as he attempts to woo the Conservative Party's 160,000 members, who begin voting for Theresa May's successor next week. Rival and leadership favourite Mr Johnson has

promised to leave the EU on Halloween "come what may". Mr Hunt has said he is prepared to delay Brexit beyond October if a deal looks likely, but will accept a no-deal with a "heavy heart".

"realistic chance"

Speaking in central London, he said he would first seek Parliament's approval for his new Brexit plan before heading to Brussels with a clear mandate to renegotiate. The discussions, he said, would last for three weeks, but would be cancelled if, by September 30, it became apparent a fresh offer stood no "realistic chance" of being ratified by Parliament.

Mr Hunt said: "It is important that the EU knows that we will do what it takes to make a success of a no-deal Brexit. "We won't blink as a country. A no-deal Brexit is not going to be an opportunity for them to successfully turn the screws on our country."

He added: "There is a hard deadline in what I have said, by the end of September, I, as Prime Minister, will make a judgment as to whether there is a realistic prospect of a deal that can get through Parliament in the short-term.

"And, if my judgment is that is not the case, talks will stop and we will put our heads down and focus on no-deal."

Mr Hunt said German chancellor Angela Merkel told him she was willing to look at a Brexit package put forward by a new prime minister. In an hour-long interview with Sky News, he said: "I've had a conversation with Angela Merkel and [she said] 'of course we will look at any proposals made by a new UK prime minister' because she wants to solve this problem.

"open mind"

"And providing we're sensible, and I think the approach that I've laid out is a sensible approach and

a fair approach, I think it's in Germany's interests as well.

"What she has said is she will look at the package and I think she will look at it with an open mind."

Mr Hunt's blueprint includes a £6billion relief package for farmers and fishermen, forecast to be among the hardest hit by no-deal, and a £13billion corporation tax cut to kick-start the economy. Attempting to appeal to Eurosceptics, Mr Hunt also indicated he was ready

to withhold half Britain's £39billion divorce bill if no Brexit deal is reached. In a clear break from Mrs May's plan, he said he would pursue a Canada-style free-trade deal - "not Chequers".

But Mr Johnson said: "What you can't do is keep saying that we're going to have a deadline of October 31st and then say it's actually not really a deadline at all and we can delay beyond October 31st." Top Brexiteer Jacob Rees-Mogg said: "Only

Boris Johnson understands the seriousness of the situation. If we kick the can, then we kick the bucket."

Chancellor Phillip Hammond on Monday warned both leadership rivals there will be no extra cash to meet their spending pledges if there is a no-deal Brexit. He said: "The 'fiscal firepower' we have built up in case of a no-deal Brexit will only be available for extra spending if we leave with an orderly transition."

Uproar as former top Tory compares EU leavers to 'slaves'

Brexit Party MEP Ann Widdecombe has been criticised for comparing the UK leaving the EU to "slaves" rising up "against their owners".

She made the remarks during her maiden speech in the European Parliament on Thursday, which critics branded "disgusting" and "offensive".

Labour MP David Lammy described her words as "ahistorical".

But Ms Widdecombe said it was "entirely appropriate to liken [Brexit] to slavery and servitude".

The former Conservative MP and shadow home secretary was one of 29 Brexit Party candidates who won European Parliament seats in May.

She began her first speech to fellow MEPs by attacking the EU for the way it appoints its leaders. This followed heads of member states nominating five candidates for the top jobs in Brussels - including the presidents of the European Council and the European Commission - earlier this week.

German Defence Minister Ursula von der Leyen was nominated to replace the current European Commission President Jean-Claude Juncker - becoming the first woman to take the role - and Belgian liberal Prime Minister Charles Michel was nominated to replace European Council President Donald Tusk.

Critics of the selection process say the European Parliament's own contest for the main job - the "Spitzenkandidaten" (lead candidate) process - was ignored, and that four of the main jobs went to western Europeans, with no nominees from eastern Europe.

'bankrolled by elites'

Most of the roles must now be ratified by the European Parliament.

Ms Widdecombe, one of six MEPs representing the South West of England, said the process of choosing the leadership of the EU had convinced her that "the best thing for Britain is to leave here as soon as possible".

She went on to say:

"There is a pattern consistent throughout history of oppressed people turning on the oppressors - slaves against their owners, the peasantry against the feudal barons, colonies... against their empires, and that is why Britain is leaving.

"And it doesn't matter which language you use - we are going and we are glad to be going."

She added: "Nous allons. Wir gehen. We're off!"

In response, EU Brexit co-ordinator Guy Verhofstadt said Ms Widdecombe was giving her party leader, Nigel Farage, "stiff competition as chief clown".

Meanwhile, Labour MP Dr Rosena Allin-Khan tweeted: "It is disgusting that Ann Widdecombe would reference slavery and colonisation to describe our relationship with the EU.

"Her and Farage are bankrolled by elites - she's part of the establishment which has created such a divide in this country."

Liberal Democrat MEP Martin Horwood called

for Ms Widdecombe to withdraw her comments and apologise.

"Ann Widdecombe has not only embarrassed herself, but she has embarrassed the nation she represents," he said.

But Ms Widdecombe defended her speech.

"We are currently part of a political union which makes us subservient to laws made by others in Brussels," she said. "It is entirely appropriate to liken this to slavery and servitude.

"Of course we don't bear shackle marks, but just ask the good people of Greece how EU-induced poverty and unemployment feels, and you'll quickly find out how their democratic votes were ignored by their real masters in Brussels."

A Brexit Party spokesman added: "Those who have raised this hue and cry seem to desire nothing more than a cleansing of our language of historical

perspective and even metaphor.

"Ms Widdecombe was right to talk about the great sweep of history, and the simple fact that those who are oppressed will always strive for freedom."

Her critics "desire nothing more than a cleansing of our language of historical perspective and even metaphor", he said, adding: "Would they also ban Rule Britannia? The Last night of the Proms?"



"I feared for my life"

■ Inquest hears how armed officer in London Bridge terror attack shot dead ringleader

The firearms officer who shot dead the ringleader of the 2017 London Bridge attack thought he would be killed when he challenged him, a jury

has heard.

On Thursday the officer told the Old Bailey inquest into the deaths of the attackers that he feared Khuram Butt would "stab

me, kill me and get hold of my weapons".

Butt and two other men had just driven at pedestrians on the bridge cont. on page 4, col. 1

and attacked people with knives in Borough Market - killing eight and injuring 48.

All three were shot dead by police.

The inquest is expected to go on for three weeks and, under law, must be heard by a jury.

In just 10 minutes, Khuram Butt, 27, Rachid Redouane, 30, and Youssef Zaghba, 22, ploughed down pedestrians on the bridge and brought chaos to Borough Market, carrying knives and wearing fake suicide belts.

Addressing the court anonymously, the officer identified only as BX46 said that as he arrived at the scene in an armed response vehicle at the end of a 12-hour shift, he was armed with a Glock 17 pistol, a Taser and a G36 Carbine rifle.

'use the knife'

He said he "feared the worst" when the call came in, and that as he approached with his window down, he could hear people saying "they're stabbing people".

He said he then saw an Asian man in a blue Arsenal top holding a large knife in a threatening manner.

Although he couldn't recall the exact words he used, he said he believed he would have shouted: "Armed police, stand still, drop the knife".

He said the attacker did not obey the command, so he moved back to create some space between them. But the attacker - later identified as Khuram Butt - came towards him, raising his knife.

"I believe his intention was to use the knife and stab me, kill me and get hold of my weapons. The knife was in a raised position, which gave me great concern," he said.

The officer said he

then noticed Butt was wearing what looked like an improvised explosive device.

"They looked like vertical tubes, grey, around his chest. He was one to two metres away, a threat to me. Detonation would be fatal," he told the court.

The officer said he was not aiming for a particular part of the body when he pulled the trigger. He fired a number of shots and stopped when the attacker fell to the ground.

The court also heard from a second officer, identified as BX44, who told jurors that the incident at London Bridge was his first firearms incident.

He said he had been tasked with handing out weapons from the Armed Response Vehicle, but that as he got out of the car, he saw three Asian men coming towards the group, carrying knives.

He said he fired first at Butt because he thought he was about to kill BX46.

"The red dot [from the gun's sights] was on him but there was very little reaction and I was surprised he was still coming."

He said he continued to track him with his weapon, but he had to break away because he feared another of the attackers, Rachid Redouane, was about to kill another colleague, codenamed BX45.

"The red dot was on him. I fired shots and there was no immediate reaction. I carried on firing until I had to deal with the third threat of Youssef Zaghba.

"I was backing away trying to create a reactionary gap when I fired and fell backwards, and as I fell backwards I fired, and from the floor I fired through my legs up to his chest.

"I thought he was about to kill me."

Afterwards, he kicked Zaghba's hand away from his chest, because he assumed he was about to detonate what he thought was an explosive belt, before moving on to support BX46, he said.

The inquest continues.

Royal baby Archie's christening to be private

THE Duke and Duchess of Sussex are to keep the media and public away when their son Archie is christened. Eight-week-old Archie will be christened in the private chapel in Windsor Castle's upper ward on Saturday, with fewer than 25 people expected to attend. The Queen, who has a prior commitment, will be absent.

The chapel has seating for around 30 people, compared with St George's Chapel, which can accommodate 800. Harry, 34, and Meghan, 37, will release official pictures the following day to the UK media and on their Instagram account. In sharp contrast, the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge have let cameras capture the arrivals of their children and family members and godparents at their christenings, while keeping the service itself private. Friends have said

Harry is keen to protect his son's privacy.

But Royal biographer Penny Junor said the decision was a mistake, especially after it emerged that taxpayers footed a £2.4million bill towards renovating their new

home, Frogmore Cottage, on the Windsor estate. She also suggested it was further evidence that although Archie will have the right to become a prince when his grandfather Charles is king, he will not take

titles and remain Archie Mountbatten-Windsor. Ms Junor said: "They can't have it both ways. Either they are totally private, pay for their own house and disappear out of view, or play the game the way it is played."

Blackadder set to go forth one more time?

BLACKADDER star Rowan Atkinson is reportedly "extremely excited" about plans for a new series of the hit sitcom.

The 64-year-old is believed to be on track to reprise his role as the scheming Edmund Blackadder alongside co-stars Stephen Fry, Tony Robinson and Hugh Laurie. It was claimed plans for a fifth series were agreed after a meeting at London members' club Soho House. A source said: "They are all old friends, so they just said, 'Yes, let's do it'."

"It is being written now. Rowan has been saying he is extremely excited."

The BBC show ran for four seasons in the 1980s, each set in a different historical period.

They followed antihero Blackadder and his dogsbody Baldrick, played by Robinson, 72. When the fourth series, Blackadder Goes Forth, ended in 1989, co-writers Richard

Curtis and Ben Elton said there would be no more. However the show has been revived twice - for a Comic Relief skit and a Christmas special. The new show will reportedly

see Blackadder in the 21st century as a university lecturer. The source added: "Blackadder will be a lot older, so they've come up with the ageing university lecturer idea."

Six years on, beloved dog is returned to owners

A family have been reunited with their pet dog - six years after she was suspected to have been stolen.

On 28 April 2013, sprocker spaniel Fern went missing from her owner's driveway in Chessington, Kingston-upon-Thames.

Fast forward 2,272 days and the Ferrier family have got their beloved dog back, after she was handed in to a vet near Reading.

A microchip implanted in Fern, now seven, enabled her to be returned to her owners.

Receiving a phone call while cooking for her three children - two of whom weren't born when 13-month-old Fern went missing - Jodie Ferrier said she could not believe what the vet was saying.

"I said to them 'it cannot be - are you sure?'" she told the BBC.

The family jumped in the car and headed for the ferry from their current home on the Isle of Wight. Arriving at Twyford Veterinary Practice hours later, the family's wait to see Fern was finally over.

"From the second the door opened I knew it was her," Mrs Ferrier said.

The mother of three said Fern - a cross between a cocker and a springer

spaniel - had "probably had more than one litter" during her six years away.

When Fern vanished from the family's driveway as she played with their three other dogs, police told the Ferriers there had been a spate of dog thefts in the area.

The black spaniel, who boasts a white stripe down her chest, was taken to the veterinary practice on Wednesday after being found at the side of the road in Bracknell.

Mrs Ferrier said her eight-year-old son Ethan "burst into tears that his dog was coming home".

"There were times where you think, 'is this a lost cause?' as the years go by," she added.

"People tried to kindly say to me, 'you just need to stop hoping, you need to stop sharing on Facebook'.

"We have just always said we won't, we never will, and there you go - here's my little miracle."

Mrs Ferrier said Fern's return was "proof of the power of a microchip".

She added: "I religiously updated my details on that chip and checked several times a year it was up to date.

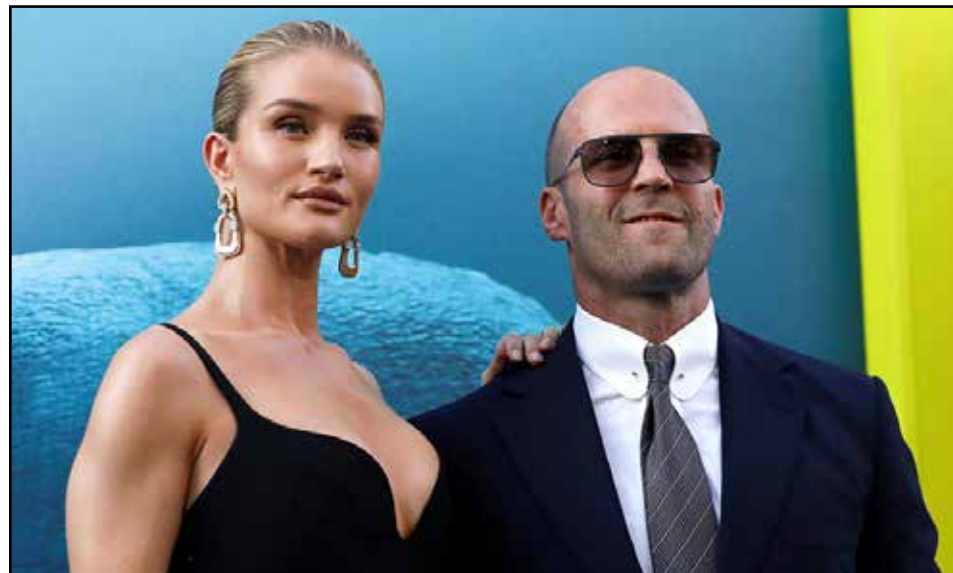
"That tiny bit of technology - if you use it right, it works."

My career is a joke, admits action movie star Statham

ACTION movie star Jason Statham has made the disarmingly honest revelation that he considers his career as one giant joke and he would never be offered the role of a "mathematician going through a divorce".

The British hard man has ridiculed his career, which has seen him appear in movies which have made almost £1 billion at the box office, but he insists he is not really an actor. The Londoner, 51, who is engaged to the actress and model Rosie Huntington-Whiteley, 32, said that his many famous fight scenes are "stupid", adding he worries more about a sore muscle than actually getting injured on set in fist fights and martial arts rumbles. He is weeks away from appearing in a Fast And Furious spin off Hobbs And Shaw, opposite Dwayne "The Rock" Johnson.

Reflecting on his own skills, Jason said: "I am not an actor really - I used to work jewellery and pinch jewellery

on the streets; I was a sportsman for years and I am not really some thespian that can adopt and chameleon himself into different roles.

"I just got into this by being at the right place at the right time.

"I got plucked from obscurity into the movie industry - so it is not like I have spent years honing how to do different accents or 'working on my craft' - whatever that stupid line is.

"That doesn't apply to me. I accept what I am good at - although I

might not be good at any of it, I accept what I feel I am confident at and try and go with the flow in that direction."

While all of his hit films have been action flicks, Jason says he is not planning on changing anytime soon - as he would be useless at other drama. Jason laughed: "A mathematician that is going through a bitter divorce - I do not get offered those."

"I only want to do things that I think I can do a good job at - and I don't think I would

be no good at that. He continued: "A lot of the characters I play are pretty similar in some ways, because I can do all that. So there tends to be a physicality with those roles and I tend to stick to it.

"I try and do things that aren't always bashing people up.

"Because the hero is something I have done a lots of, with things like The Expendables and Transporter 1, 2 and 3; where you have this indestructible physical side."

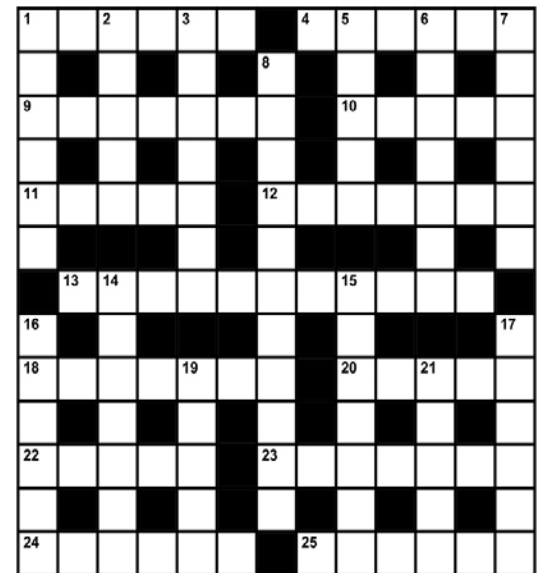

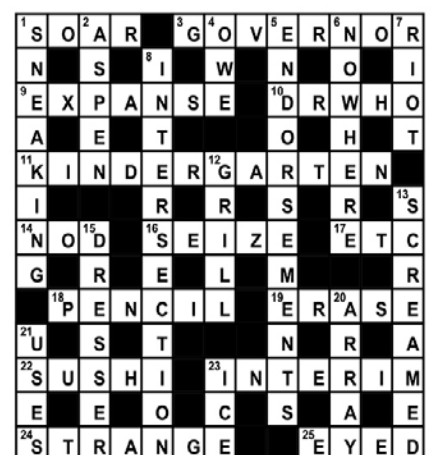

The scammers never sleep.....

It seems almost every day I get a suspicious call or email from someone alerting me that my credit is in jeopardy or my social security number has been compromised or my PayPal password needs changing.

If I wasn't so wise to all this fraudulent activity I'd be a fool to it as they all seem so damn convincing.

So please please, please never give your social security number, your bank details or passwords to anyone over the phone - and always check the email address.

Most scammers have an unrecognizable email (you can find this out by actually hitting the respond to button. And you'll more than likely see something like fjshehdjeheh47@edu.ga, even though it comes into your mail box and reads something like: Chase Bank, Paypal, American Express, etc. and

in the body of the email it will look very legitimate.

And then there are the phone calls. The people calling will ask you to stay on the line or press one to speak to an agent (agent will likely have a foreign accent, which is a dead giveaway. They will know your name and address. Usually because they found it in your trash, or someone else did and sold the info. They will ask you to confirm your Social Security number - DO NOT do this!

The phone companies are getting wise to these fraudulent artists and have started alerting people with the caller ID stating "Scan Likely" I never bother to answer these calls, but today I got a call from 888 724 6512. It was an automated voice. "THIS IS A VERY IMPORTANT MESSAGE - regarding your social security number. Please press 1 to

speak to an agent."

I thought I would play along so pressed 1.

"Hello, is this Mister Young?" An African-0accented man asked.

"Yes it is" I replied in a slightly Worried tone.

"Do you live at...." he went on.

"Why, yes I do."

"Can you please confirm your social security number?"

I responded with a fake one.

"Thank you please hold the line while we verify that information..."

I held.

"Well sir, have you been in Texas recently?"

I actually had.

"Yes," I replied.

"Well sir it appears there is a warrant out for your arrest. There was blood found in a car in Corpus Christi and some paperwork with your name on it was found"

"Wow, that's crazy... I rented the car in Fort-Worth and returned it to the rental company."

He continued reading his script. "Yes sir and a 22lb bag of cocaine was also found"

"Jesus Christ on a stick...I left that behind? I wondered where that went" I said.

"Are you admitting that it's yours sir?"

"Sir, you are in a lot of trouble."

What a shame he hung up I was having so much fun.

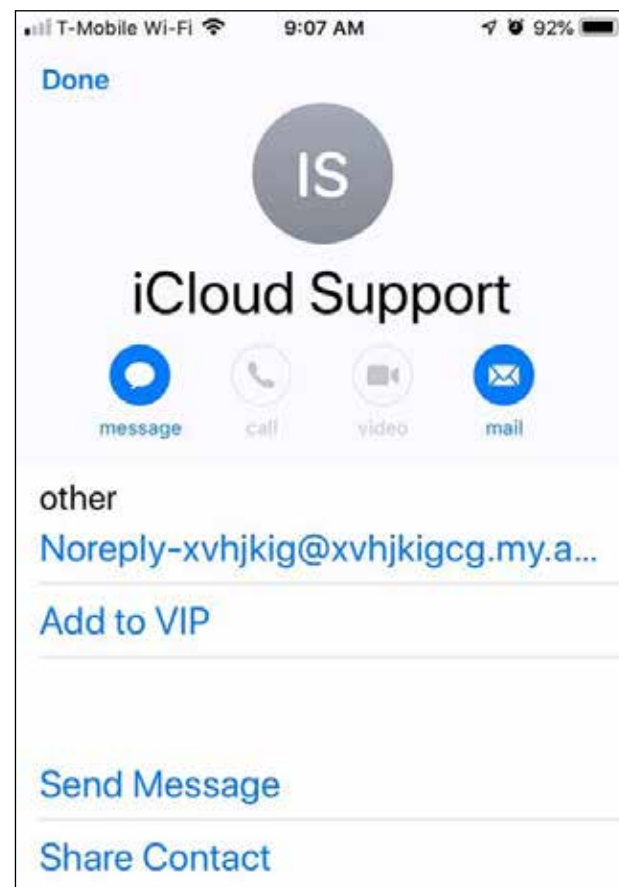
But jokes aside. This is becoming a greater problem and they are thinking of craftier ways in which to get at us.

England surged into their first World Cup semi-final since 1992 with a comprehensive 119-run defeat of New Zealand at Chester-le-Street on Wednesday.

The hosts are set to finish third in the group and will meet India or Australia at Edgbaston next Thursday for a place in the final.

Needing to defeat the Black Caps to be sure of progressing, England were led by Jonny Bairstow's dominant hundred, his second century in the space of four days.

Though they were checked as the New

Zealand bowling improved, the England total of 305-8 seemed imposing on a pitch that gradually got harder to bat on.

And they were boosted by the run outs of both Kane Williamson and Ross Taylor - Williamson unluckily undone when backing-up - that left New Zealand 69-4.

From there, the Black Caps sucked the life from the spectacle with a limp attempt to defend their net run-rate, eventually being bowled out for 186 with Mark Wood taking 3-34 on his home ground.

Williamson's men

have now suffered three successive defeats and slipped to fourth in the table.

They will be caught if Pakistan beat Bangladesh on Friday, though it would need an almost impossible swing in run-rate to deny them a place in the semis.

"We have played well,

played terribly, then played good again," said England captain Eoin Morgan after the match.

"The group games have been inconsistent but the last two games have been some of our

best."

England began the tournament as favourites yet came in for criticism following the setbacks from Sri Lanka and Australia.

"I don't think we are

trying to prove anybody wrong or prove a point - we're out to enjoy ourselves," Morgan told Test Match Special. "It's a World Cup and we are trying to make the most of it."

Foxes snaffle Magpie striker Perez

Leicester City have signed striker Ayoze Perez from Newcastle United for £30m on a four-year deal.

Perez, 25, leaves St James' Park after five years. The Spaniard was the club's top scorer in 2018-19 with 12 goals.

He is Foxes manager Brendan Rodgers' second signing of the summer, following the arrival of defender James Justin from Luton Town.

"Ayoze will be a wonderful addition to the squad. He's a player who will excite our fans," Rodgers said.

"He's quick, has a good eye for goal and he's experienced in the Premier League too."

Perez, who was bought from Tenerife for £1.5m in June 2014, has scored 48 times in 195 appearances for Newcastle and got the winning goal on each of his previous two visits to King Power Stadium.

"I'm very happy and very pleased. I'm very proud to be part of the

Leicester family and I can't wait to get started," said Perez.

The Magpies are currently without a manager following the departure of Rafael Benitez at the end of June for Chinese Super League side Dalian Yifang.

ARSENAL have

completed their first transfer of the summer with the signing of Brazilian teenager Gabriel Martinelli.

The 18-year-old forward has signed "a long-term contract", the Gunners have confirmed.

Martinelli has joined from Brazilian side Ituano,

where he had scored 10 goals in 34 games after making his debut in 2017.

"I model my game on Cristiano Ronaldo," Martinelli said.

"He is a player who works hard, pushing himself to the next level.

Lampard seals Blues return

■ Former Chelsea great inks three year deal

Chelsea have appointed former midfielder Frank Lampard as their manager on a three-year deal.

Lampard, 41, has left Championship side Derby County to take over at a club where he spent 13 years as a player.

He succeeds Maurizio Sarri, who left Stamford Bridge in June to take charge of Italian champions Juventus.

Lampard led Derby to the Championship play-off final, where they lost to Aston Villa, in his first season as a manager.

The former England international made 648 Chelsea appearances, winning 11 major trophies with them.

He takes over with Chelsea under a transfer embargo after the club were given a two-window transfer ban by world governing body Fifa - a decision they are appealing against at the

Court of Arbitration for Sport.

"I am immensely proud to be returning to Chelsea as head coach," said Lampard.

"Everyone knows my love for this club and the history we have shared. However, my sole focus is on the job in hand and preparing for the season ahead.

"I am here to work hard, bring further success to the club and I cannot wait to get started."

'fantastic knowledge'

The appointment comes nine days after Derby gave Lampard permission to talk to Chelsea and 18 days after Sarri left Stamford Bridge.

Lampard is the 10th full-time manager appointed by Roman Abramovich since he bought the club in 2003.

Chelsea director Marina Granovskaia said Lampard's

Championship play-off final appearance with Derby demonstrated that he was "one of the most talented young coaches in the game".

"It gives us great pleasure to welcome Frank back to Chelsea as head coach," she said. "Frank possesses fantastic knowledge and understanding of the club."

Derby assistant manager Jody Morris and first-team coach Chris Jones have also joined Lampard at Stamford Bridge, while former team-mate Petr Cech was appointed as technical advisor last month.

Lampard joined Chelsea from boyhood club West Ham for a fee of £11m in 2001.

He won a Champions League and a Europa League at the club, while also helping them to win three Premier League titles, four FA Cups and

two League Cups.

Chelsea's title win in 2004-05 was their first in half a century and Lampard scored 13 league goals that season, including both in a 2-0 victory at Bolton that sealed the top-flight crown.

He scored 10 or more Premier League goals in 10 successive seasons for Chelsea and is the club's all-time record goalscorer with 211.

Lampard left Stamford Bridge in June 2014 and had a stint at Manchester

City, where he scored six goals in 32 appearances.

He then joined New York City in Major League Soccer in the US, making his debut in August 2015, before ending his 21-year professional playing career in 2017.

Lampard won 106 England caps after making his international debut in 1999 and went on to score 29 goals for the Three Lions.

He appeared in three World Cups and one European

Championships.

The former midfielder said he did not want to be a "clone" of any of the club's previous managers despite "rising expectations" on and off the pitch.

"Expectations at Chelsea will always remain, because of what the club has done in the last 15 years and I like that, I enjoyed that as a player," he said.

"I enjoyed my first year on this side of the fence and I am determined to keep on going."

Spurs break club record with £53.8m Ndombele deal

Tottenham have signed France midfielder Tanguy Ndombele from Ligue 1 side Lyon for a club record 60m euros (£53.8m).

The 22-year-old has signed a deal until 2025 and the fee could rise to 70m euros (£62.8m) with incentives.

Tottenham's previous transfer record was the £42m paid to sign defender Davinson Sanchez from Ajax in August 2017.

Ndombele joined Lyon in 2017 and helped them finish third in the French top-flight last season.

He also twice played against Manchester City in Champions League group games.

In total Ndombele, who has six caps for France, made 96 appearances for Lyon

and registered 16 assists. Lyon thanked the player for his time at the club, praising his "professionalism and his performances".

Ndombele is Tottenham's second signing of the summer following the arrival of Jack Clarke from Leeds United.

The winger, who was Brazil forward Lucas Moura joined from Paris St-Germain in January 2018, was immediately loaned back to the Championship side for the 2019-20 season.

■ Manchester City are set to sign Spain midfielder Rodri from Atletico Madrid for a club record £62.8m after paying his release clause, say the La Liga side.

Atletico said the

player's lawyers and representatives from City paid the release clause to La Liga on Wednesday.

Rodri, 23, has therefore terminated his contract with Atletico, which was due to run until June 2023.

It will beat City's previous record of £60m in signing Riyad Mahrez in 2018.

Rodri joined Atletico in May 2018 after three years at Villarreal and made 34 league appearances as they finished second in Spain's top flight.

He made his international debut in a friendly against Germany last year and has made six senior international appearances.

City had made Rodri

one of their main targets this summer, with manager Pep Guardiola keen to sign a defensively minded player to bolster the Premier League champions' squad.

On Wednesday City also announced that they have brought full-back Angelino back to the club from PSV Eindhoven.

The 22-year-old

Spaniard left City for PSV Eindhoven in 2018 after failing to make a Premier League appearance in his six years with the club.

City inserted a £5.35m buy-back clause in the deal, a figure far below the Spaniard's market value given his form at PSV last season.

Guardiola has decided to activate the clause

in order to bolster his options at left-back, which also include Oleksandr Zinchenko, who signed a long-term contract earlier this summer, and Benjamin Mendy, a £52m arrival from Monaco in 2017.

Angelino has signed a four-year deal which will keep him at Etihad Stadium until 2023.

“I couldn’t ask for more” says Neville

Women’s World Cup: more semi-final heartbreak for England as Lionesses lose 2-1 to USA

England’s players left “their hearts and souls on the pitch” in their Women’s World Cup semi-final defeat by the USA, said boss Phil Neville.

The Lionesses lost 2-1 in Lyon Tuesday night, with Ellen White having a goal ruled out by the VAR for offside and captain Steph Houghton having a late penalty saved.

“I’ve told them no tears tonight,” said Neville. “I’m proud. They have touched the hearts of the nation.”

“I couldn’t ask for more. We had the time of our lives.”

England must now shrug off the heartbreak of a third consecutive semi-final defeat in a major tournament to face either Sweden or the Netherlands in Saturday’s third-place play-off.

“We’ll have to allow 24 to 48 hours for this to sink in and for them to get over this disappointment,” added Neville, who said beforehand anything other than reaching the final would be a “failure”.

“Nothing I can say will make them feel better. Elite sport and being on top of the world means that on Saturday in Nice we have to produce a performance.”

“It will tell me a lot about my players. I’ve moved on from this already and now I’m looking forward to Saturday’s game.”

The USA, who are the world’s top-ranked team and defending champions, led within 10 minutes from Christen Press’ header. Ellen White equalised for England with her sixth goal of the tournament, a tally matched by Alex Morgan when she put

the USA back in front.

The real drama came after the break as White had a goal disallowed and was awarded a penalty after she was tripped by Becky Sauerbrunn, with both decisions made by the VAR.

Houghton’s spot-kick was saved by Alyssa Naeher, and Millie Bright was sent off late on for a second booking as the game drifted away from England.

“It’s about winning,” said Neville. “I can’t say to my players: ‘Unlucky.’ That’s white noise to them, because they wanted to win. That tells me that we’re closer than we’ve ever been. We came here to win and we didn’t do that.”

“Football can be cruel. We have had a fantastic ride. When we got the penalty I turned to my bench and said ‘we are going to win it’ but it wasn’t to be.”

“We knew it was going to be an open game and I felt they were starting to run out of steam in the second half.”

“We only had a 10-minute period in the first half where we played with the belief that we talked about. We stood off them too much. We will learn massively from this.”

Neville accepted the offside decision against White was correct but said Bright should not have been shown her first yellow card and he thought “the referee wasn’t really in control of the game”.

Neville says he is already looking to the future as England look to win a major tournament for the first time. His contract runs until the end of Euro 2021, which is being held in England - with the final at Wembley.



“I’ve told them no tears tonight,” said Neville. “I’m proud. They have touched the hearts of the nation.”

Prior to that, the former Manchester United player will also take charge of the Great Britain team at the 2020 Tokyo Olympics - they qualified as a result of England’s run to the World Cup semi-finals.

“The minute the game finished my first thought was ‘how do we win on Saturday?’ and my second thought was ‘how do we win Olympic gold?’” he said.

“I was looking at them and that was my motivation. And then I looked at them and thought, ‘how do we win the Euros in 2021?’ I won’t wallow or go back to my room and feel sorry for myself.”

“It’s now making us be better and getting the next two or three percent that will make us become the best team in the world. The aim is to become the best like America. We’ve still got a way to go. I won’t stop until I get there.”

“I’ve started already. I was actually in my room this afternoon planning the next two years. It’s the way I work. It’s fast.”
