NIGEL TO BORIS: MAKE A DEAL OR IT'S WAR!

NIGEL Farage says Boris Johnson has 10 days to form a Leave election pact with him - or he'll destroy his dream of a majority.

The Brexit Party boss is urging the PM to do a deal with him – offering to give Tory candidates who strongly favor Brexit a clear run in the upcoming election, but warning that if Mr. Johnson does not agree, he will run

Brexit candidates in every constituency and split the Leave vote.

Mr Farage said on Thursday: "There is still a chance of a leave alliance that can be put together.

"There is still 10 days for him to change tack, I hope

he does."

"We are going to score very highly, particularly in Labour Leave areas."

With more than a month to go until the General Election on December 12th, a clear meme has already emerged of the key voter that all parties must bring onside – that of Workington man, the imagined poster boy for "middle England" who likes rugby league and Labour who voted for Brexit and feels the country is moving away from his views. In reality Workington is a former mining town in Cumbria with strong Labour roots and a largely older, working class and white population. Workington Man is the creation of Onward, a center-right think tank closely allied to the Brexit Party, and Farage insists winning him over is the key to the Conservatives building a big enough majority to secure Brexit.

"This idea that Workington man are all going to go to the

Conservatives is, I can promise you, nonsense," said Farage on Thursday.

"They are going to vote Brexit party in big numbers."

Farage himself says he will not stand in the General Election, because he wants to be free to travel the country campaigning instead of being locked into a constituency battle. In a sign of the bitter war to come, Mr Farage – who wants a no-deal Brexit – ramped up the attack on Johnson's withdrawal agreement, describing it as a "gigantic con".

But even close allies turned on him for being "dog in the manger" about the deal and warned the MEP he was increasing the risk of splitting the Brexit vote – threatening the chance of Britain leaving the EU.

Mr Farage, an MEP who has lost seven attempts to win a Westminster seat, had previously hinted he would stand again. But as someone who has demanded a no-deal Brexit in return for an electoral pact with the Conservatives, Farage said he still hoped

an agreement could be reached between the parties. But he claimed the UK will "never achieve independence" if Mr Johnson's deal is ratified. He said: "It doesn't work at any level. It is a gigantic con. "We should not sell out to this, it's a Remainer's Brexit. It's virtually worse than staying where we are, and if we go down this route we will finish up rejoining."

He added: "I promise you one thing, if Boris was going for a genuine Brexit then we wouldn't need to fight him in this election."

PM: No second Scottish vote

BORIS Johnson has slapped down Nicola Sturgeon's latest bid for another Scottish independence referendum as he ruled out permitting a poll while he is Prime Minister.

Mr Johnson said there was no reason to go back on assurances given by former SNP leader Alex Salmond and Ms Sturgeon that the 2014 vote was a "once-in-a-generation" event.

The current SNP leader and First Minister aims to make a formal demand before Christmas for the legal power to hold a second referendum.

Asked if he would ever hand her the powers for a

re-run while he is in No 10, Mr Johnson said: "No, I don't want to have one."

Ms Sturgeon initially said Mr Johnson's "waffling" response stopped short of an outright pledge to block a poll. But she later appeared to concede he would maintain his veto, accusing the media of failing to "subject this unsustainable and undemocratic position to any serious scrutiny". The First Minister insisted the refusal is "not a sustainable position" if the SNP wins a majority of seats in the General Election. She praised Labour leader Jeremy Corbyn's willingness to

Spend, Spend, Spend!

- Labour vows to splash the cash to 1970s levels
- Extra £55bn earmarked for infrastructure

Labour has unveiled plans to take public spending back to the highest level since the 1970s amid warnings that the scale of investment is so high it will be almost impossible to implement.

John McDonnell, the shadow chancellor, has announced plans for an extra £55 billion in capital spending a year to go on hospitals, schools and other infrastructure, funded by borrowing. His plans would see public investment spending almost double.

Labour has pledged £250 billion of investment over the next ten years for a green fund to invest in clean energy and insulation, and £150

billion over five years on a "social transformation fund" for investment in infrastructure.

The Institute for Fiscal Studies said that the level of investment was so high it would be "just physically impossible to get there that quickly".

Sajid Javid also ripped up the Conservatives' fiscal rules as he unveiled plans for an extra £22 billion a year in public investment as part of a "decade of renewal" for the nation.

The chancellor announced a new "fiscal rule" that will enable him to invest 3 per cent of national income in infrastructure projects. He abandoned a

traditional Tory measure of fiscal prudence - that government debt should fall as a share of national income year on year - and another fiscal rule limiting borrowing to no more than 2 per cent of GDP.

However, the chancellor also announced that he would balance his budget, meaning that a future Conservative government would not spend more than it can raise from taxes. It is likely to significantly limit Boris Johnson's ability to make further public spending pledges or tax cuts in the Tory manifesto.

Labour has also pledged to balance the current budget — day to day spending, excluding spending on

infrastructure.

Speaking in Manchester, Mr Javid said: "Today I am announcing new fiscal rules that, if elected, will allow us to take advantage of the opportunity to invest in our future and our public services, but without squandering the hard work of the British people.

"There will be new hospitals, schools, roads, railways, better broadband, new connections and opportunities in every part of our nation. So I can confirm today we will borrow some more to invest."

Mr Javid said that the Tories could still afford

"some" tax cuts under the new fiscal rules, but did not disclose what they would be.

He said: "We can afford to do a lot. We can afford to live within our means. We can afford the infrastructure revolution. We can afford some tax cuts. We have worked out the numbers."

Tom Watson quits as deputy leader of Labour

- MP stands down from Commons after clashes with Corbyn and VIP sex case fiasco

Tom Watson has quit as Labour's deputy leader and will not stand in the general election after a series of clashes with Jeremy Corbyn on antisemitism, Brexit and the party's direction.

Mr Watson, who has been MP for West

Bromwich East since 2001, insisted that the decision was "personal, not political" but he has been increasingly isolated since the 2017 general election tightened Mr Corbyn's hold on Labour.

His resignation comes barely more than a month

after supporters of Mr Corbyn pushed to abolish the role of deputy leader, a move that Mr Watson said at the time was an attempted "drive-by shooting".

Mr Watson had faced intense criticism in recent months over his role in

promoting the claims of a Westminster paedophile ring by the fantasist Carl Beech, who is now serving 18 years in jail for perverting the course of justice.

Beech made false allegations of sexual abuse and murder about a group of MPs, generals and senior figures in the intelligence services. All were innocent, but his claims led to a £2.5 million police inquiry and prompted searches of the homes of the former Tory MP Harvey Proctor, the former chief of the defence staff Lord Bramall and the widow of the former home secretary Lord Brittan of Spennithorne.

The announcement will frustrate and anger some Labour MPs who do not support Mr Corbyn's leadership and had put their faith in Mr Watson to wrench the party back

from left-wing control.

"Serving the Labour Party has been the privilege of a lifetime," Mr Watson said in a letter to the leader. "I joined in 1982 and never imagined that one day a kid from Kidderminster would be the party's deputy leader.

"But now is the right time for me to stand down from the House

of Commons and start a different kind of life. The decision is personal, not political. The last few years have been among the most transformational of my personal life, second only to becoming a proud father of two beautiful children. I've become healthy for the first time, and I intend to continue with this work."

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Queen to go fur-free - sort of

DESIGNERS will no longer dress the Queen in furs, it has been confirmed, earning praise from animal welfare groups.

The move was revealed by Her Majesty's dresser Angela Kelly in extracts from her book published in Vogue magazine.

Ms Kelly wrote: "If Her Majesty is due to attend an engagement in particularly cold weather... fake fur will be used to make sure she stays warm." Ms Kelly said an outfit from 2008 had mink but, she stressed: "The mink trim... will be replaced."

This week a Buckingham Palace spokeswoman said: "As new outfits are designed any fur used will be fake. "We are not suggesting that all fur on existing outfits will be replaced, or that the Queen will never wear fur again.

"The Queen will continue to re-wear existing outfits."

It is not known whether the change will include her historic robe of state, which contains ermine and is worn at the State Opening of Parliament. Activists at Humane Society International/UK said the move tallied with its #FurFreeBritain drive to ban the sale of animal fur completely. Executive director Claire Bass said "We are thrilled that Her Majesty has officially gone fur-free. Queen Elizabeth's decision to 'go faux' is the perfect reflection of the mood of the public.

"The vast majority detest cruel fur and want nothing to do with it."

Controversial Seventies TV shows omitted by UK streaming service Britbox

■ Love Thy Neighbour and Till Death Us Do Part among the blacklisted classics

Politically incorrect 1970s television series such as Love Thy Neighbour and Till Death Us Do Part have been left off BBC-ITV's new streaming service because they are deemed unsuitable for modern audiences.

Britbox, which launched in the UK this week, styles itself as the home of British boxsets, offering classic series such as Porridge, Fawlty Towers and Yes Minister as well as more recent hits.

The service has mined the archives of ITV and the BBC, its founding partners, for vintage programming, but some well-remembered series have been overlooked.

Reemah Sakaan, the ITV executive leading Britbox, acknowledged that "changing tastes" were a factor in the selection process, and some material had not aged well.

That means no place for Love Thy Neighbour, the 1972-76 ITV sitcom about a black couple living next to a white couple, or Til Death Us Do Part, the long-running BBC comedy centred on Alf Garnett, a racist bigot.

She added: "We also recompile everything that goes on to Britbox, and the great thing about on-demand is that you're not forcing anyone to watch anything."

Britbox users will also see "bespoke warnings" before some programmes to alert them to potentially offensive content. "It's certainly something we think about and have a process for," Ms Sakaan said.

It was also announced that Channel 4 will provide more than 1,000 hours of programming to the service. The move means that Britbox is a now a true

collaboration between all of the UK's public service broadcasters — Channel 5 signed up in September.

From spring 2020 a selection of Channel 4 shows will move to Britbox after 30 days on All4, the broadcaster's free on-demand platform.

Popular series including The Great British Bake Off will feature, Ms Sakaan said. Film4 will also supply a curated collection of British films.

ITV is investing more than £40 million in exclusive commissions for Britbox, but its launch archive is almost entirely made up of classic and repeats.

All 627 available episodes of Doctor Who from 1963 to 1989 will be released on Boxing Day, including animated recreations of missing episodes.

Britbox subscribers will also be able to stream two new episodes of Midsomer Murders before their broadcast on ITV, in addition to the detective drama's 20-series back catalogue.

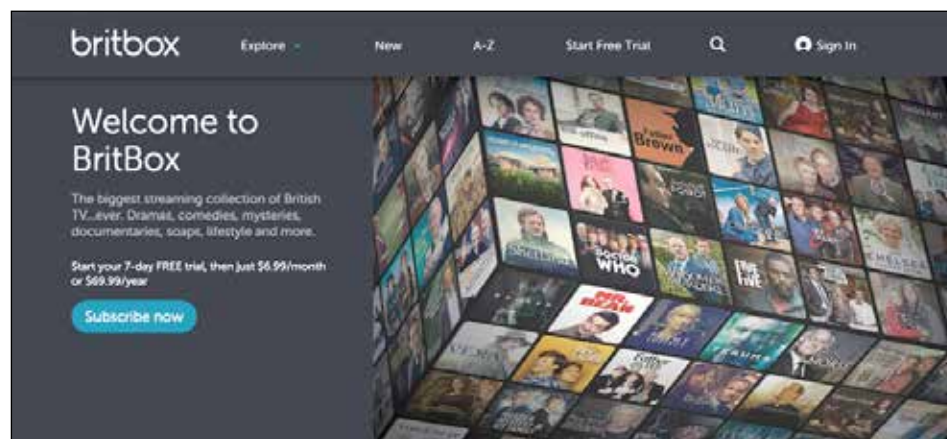
Analysts do not expect Britbox to become a true rival to Netflix, which has 10 million UK subscribers, because of the dearth of exclusive programming.

It will also be competing with new subscription services such as Disney Plus and Apple TV. Britbox costs \$6.99 a month, the same as Netflix's basic plan, and has a 30-day free trial.

ITV and BBC executives hope the service will generate extra revenue and ensure that the burgeoning streaming market is not dominated by US-based players, while attracting older viewers who are not yet Netflix or Amazon members.

Jewels in the Britbox crown include all six series of Downton Abbey, seven series of Only Fools and Horses and past series of Love Island, plus The Office, Happy Valley and Doctor Foster. BBC and ITV have been quietly pulling archive shows off Netflix,

so they will only be available to stream on Britbox. However both broadcasters will still collaborate with international streaming rivals to fund and produce new drama series.

Ms Sakaan said that Britbox would make a virtue of its relatively

small slate of programmes, offering "more time browsing, less time watching". She said that "familiar faces" would be at the heart of the service, allowing members to select shows according to who's starring in them, from Olivia Colman to Michael Palin.

China 'tries to gag UK universities'

The government of China has attempted to curb criticism on British campuses of its regime by pressuring universities into limiting academic freedom, MPs have said.

"Alarming" evidence of Chinese interference has been found by the Commons foreign affairs committee, which says that it appears to be coming from the embassy in London.

The MPs are particularly concerned that the battle for Chinese student fees and other investment "should not outweigh" longstanding international standards of academic freedom. In its report, "Defending Democracy in an Age of Autocracies" the committee found:

- A pro-vice-chancellor at an unnamed Russell Group university cancelled a speaker after contact from the Chinese embassy.

- Evidence that the state-backed Chinese Students and Scholars Association was being used to watch students in Britain. One witness, a Uighur Muslim, said that she was monitored and her family in China harassed after she became politically active.

The MPs accused universities of "not being alive" to the risks to academic freedom that were caused by growing dependence on Chinese revenue. They said that government guidance on the problem was "non-existent".

There are more than 100,000 Chinese students at British universities, a number that has risen sharply in recent years. They are by far the largest group of overseas students, paying annual fees of up to £40,000. There are also many partnerships between British universities and Chinese institutions.

PC charged with murder over Atkinson death

■ Former footballer was 48 when he suffered cardiac arrest after being tasered

A police officer has been charged with murder over the Aston Villa footballer Dalian Atkinson, who died after he was Tasered and restrained.

The West Mercia constable, who has not been named, was charged with murder by the Crown Prosecution Service on Thursday.

A second West Mercia constable has also been charged with assault causing actual bodily harm.

The CPS has declined to name both officers because their lawyers will apply for them to remain anonymous.

Mr Atkinson, who played for Aston Villa and Manchester City, was 48 when he died in 2016.

West Mercia Police said that officers were called to his father's house amid concerns "for the safety of an individual".

He had been outside when he was Tasered and restrained at 2am.

He went into cardiac arrest in an ambulance on his way to hospital

and died at the Princess Royal in Telford later that day.

Relatives said that Mr Atkinson was suffering a number of health issues and had a weak heart at the time of the incident.

Three West Mercia police officers were interviewed twice under criminal caution and served with gross misconduct notices by the Independent Office for Police Conduct (IOPC), the police watchdog which investigates deaths following police contact.

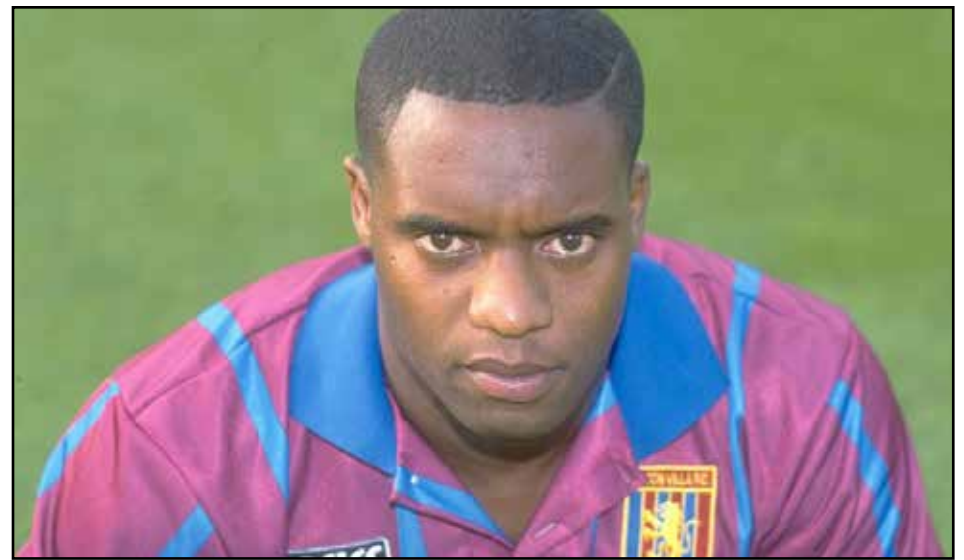
After a 16-month long criminal investigation the case was referred to the CPS last month.

Mr Atkinson's family criticised the delay.

Speaking on behalf of the family of Mr Atkinson, Kate Maynard, a solicitor at Hickman and Rose, said:

"Dalian's family welcomes the decision to put the conduct of police officers before a jury but regrets that already more than three years have passed since Dalian died.

"They ask for their

privacy to be respected and press for the criminal proceedings to progress without delay or obstruction."

Although police officers have been charged with murder or manslaughter in relation to deaths involving police contact, none have been found guilty of either charge.

There have been ten murder or manslaughter charges against police officers in the past decade. In all cases, trials have collapsed or officers

have been acquitted by the jury, according to Inquest, the charity.

Jenny Hopkins of the CPS said: "Following the death of Dalian Atkinson in Telford on 15 August 2016, the Crown Prosecution Service has today authorised a charge of murder against a West Mercia police constable. A second police constable, from the same force, has been charged with assault causing actual bodily harm. Mr Atkinson's family has been informed.

"This decision was made following a careful review of all the evidence presented to us by the Independent Office for Police Conduct following an investigation.

"Criminal proceedings against the two police officers are now active and they have a right to a fair trial. It is extremely important that there should be no reporting, commentary or sharing of information online which could in any way prejudice these proceedings."

Scot suspected shark victim at Indian Ocean resort

A Scottish tourist is suspected to have died in a shark attack after his dismembered hand and wedding ring were found inside the animal.

The 44-year-old man was last seen snorkelling off the French island of Reunion, near Madagascar, over the weekend.

It is believed he was on a week-long holiday with his wife in Saint-Gilles.

His hand, identified by his wedding ring, was found inside a tiger shark which was caught for research purposes.

Local resident Erick Quelquejeu told BBC Scotland the man had left his wife for just "a

few minutes" to go for a swim.

Mr Quelquejeu said: "It's an area enclosed by a reef, there's a very slight passage where it goes deeper into the ocean but actually it's really well protected by the reef."

He added: "His wife was really scared by what happened. Many helicopters, many planes, swimmers and boats went to try and find the guy in the ocean but couldn't find him for a few days.

"Apparently they found a shark a few days ago with his hand so we are really not sure how it happened."

Mr Quelquejeu said

that many beaches on the west coast of the island were well signposted, warning people against swimming because of previous shark attacks. There were also warnings at the airports.

"There are a lot of shark attacks on Reunion island but we are quite aware about that now," he added.

"It's something we don't hide from anybody. All the places around the island where you can't swim - where there's not a natural reef - there are signs in front of the beach to warn people.

"Even at that you have a few boats that go around the west area of the island - because that's

where all the beaches are - to protect them, to watch if anyone makes that mistake anyway."

The shark was among several caught on Monday and Tuesday in the Indian Ocean by the Centre de Securite Requin (CSR).

It was found just over four miles (7km) from the lagoon where the man was last seen. The shark was examined on Wednesday morning.

It is not yet known whether the man drowned and was subsequently eaten by the shark, or whether he was attacked by it.

A spokesman for the Foreign and Commonwealth Office

said: "We are providing support to the family of a British man who died while snorkelling in La Reunion and are in contact with the local authorities."

There have been two fatal shark attacks this year at Reunion, which is in the Indian Ocean.

Local authorities have implemented a ban on swimming and water sports across almost all of the island's beaches following attacks in 2013.

French President Emmanuel Macron said last month that he would like to see water sports reintroduced by 2022, but added that he wanted "to be sure" that it would be safe to do so.

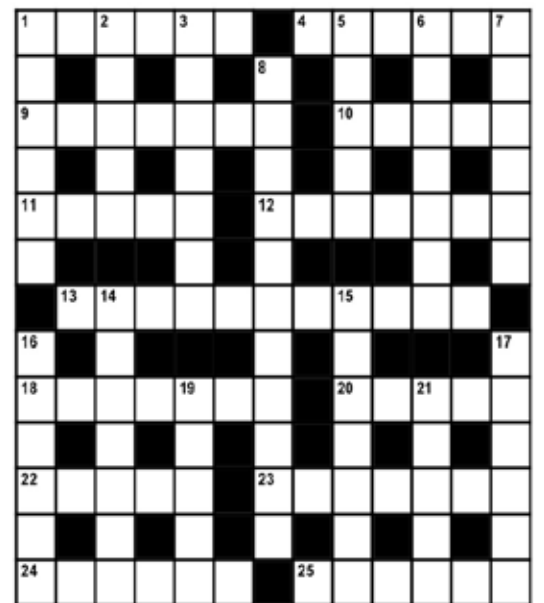

Michael Enright: the British expat who left Hollywood to fight Isis. Now the USA won't take him back...

SAN IGNACIO, Belize: Michael Enright is finding this sleepy town south of the border to be a long way from Hollywood. A very long way.

If the name – and the face – seem familiar, it's because for more than two decades Michael Enright was a colorful local figure among the British expat community in Los Angeles. But through a series of events that seem more Hollywood than real life, Michael left his comfortable life on these shores to fight alongside Kurdish forces against Isis in Syria, risking his life on countless occasions, only later to find himself unable to get back to America, the country he loves, and the country for which he said he would gladly have died to fight Islamic terrorism.

Michael first came to

our attention on the set of *The Brit Pack* – 1993's best-forgotten, low-budget soccer hooligan movie which featured a cast of mostly local British expats. Michael was running a hostel in Venice at the time, and although he projected the image of a spiky, outspoken Mancunian jack-the-lad, he had a thoughtfulness about him that set him apart from his mostly non-actor cast mates.

Over the next two decades Michael found regular work as an actor, appearing in movies including the Tom Cruise vehicle *Knight and Day* and snagging a guest starring role on the television series *"Agents of S.H.I.E.L.D."* As the product of a tough working class background he considered himself to be living the dream, he was

then, as he remains, very patriotic and very pro-American.

So the events of September 11, 2001 affected him deeply. He became fascinated with the battle against Islamic terrorism, frequently considering taking up arms in order to, in his words, 'give something back to the country that gave me so much.'

The tipping point was the 2014 beheading of journalist James Foley by Mohammed Emwazi – the Kuwait-born but British raised terrorist better known as Jihadi John.

"That video filled me with so much horror, so much fury," Enright told the BW this week. "The fact that a British person could do so such a thing was unbelievable. It made me, also a British man, determined to do what I could do to fight back against that kind of mindless evil."

A few months later Enright flew to Heathrow and from there to Sulaymaniyah in Iraqi Kurdistan. Arriving at 3am with no friends and no idea what lay in store, he checked into a low-budget hotel and tried to reach the one contact he had made before departure, a shadowy Facebook figure who claimed to be part of the YPG – the Kurdish militia at the forefront of the battle against Isis in neighboring Syria.

"When do you arrive?" came the response.

"I'm already here!" Enright wrote back.

That afternoon, a man called the hotel asking for

him.

"You want to join the YPG?" the voice on the other end of the line asked.

"Yes."

Then, a familiar query: "Are you willing to die?"

"Yes."

From the hotel Enright was whisked across the Syrian border to a training camp where he spent six

weeks learning how to fire an AK-47 and many other arts of war. With his Hollywood background he was soon appointed his unit's cameraman, having a Go-Pro fixed to his helmet to capture his two harrowing tours of duty in the war-torn region. His days alternated between firefights with local Isis units to humanitarian

work and intelligence gathering. In the course of his time there Michael gained a good working knowledge of Arabic and abiding affection for the people of the region.

Yet when it was time for him to go home, Michael found he could not. His visa overstay three decades ago led

to him being flagged by US immigration on the Southern border, and despite his demonstrated services to his country and what he claims is a treasure trove of intelligence gathered on the front lines, so far his attempts to navigate the byzantine pathways of the U.S. immigration system has met with failure.

Because he fears returning to the United Kingdom, where some British volunteers with

the Kurdish militia have been arrested and accused of consorting with terrorists, Michael finds himself, essentially, a man without a country. As the Washington Post put it in a recent, extensively fact-checked profile, 'now he wanders, flopping ... in slum apartments or couch-surfing in Belize and elsewhere in Latin America in the homes of people he meets in the streets or online. He hauls a thin pad to sleep on, a backpack, a handful of tank tops and shorts, and a clunky, old laptop, hoping against hope that

someone, anyone, will help him get back to Los Angeles.'

Despite his frustration, Enright, now 56, his hair cropped short and graying, has repeated the same phrase over and over in hours of interviews with The Post: "I don't regret a thing, mate. I'd do it all over again."

Jones at a loss to explain England's final loss

Eddie Jones says he cannot explain why England came up short after his side failed to achieve their goal of winning the World Cup in Japan.

England were beaten 32-12 by South Africa in the final in Yokohama on Saturday.

It came a week after England knocked out three-time champions New Zealand in the semi-final in one of the best performances in Jones' tenure as coach.

"I'm not sure why we came up short today, sometimes you never know," said the England head coach.

"Sometimes you can investigate but you'll never know why it happened. We're going to be kicking stones now for four

years, we're massively disappointed."

Captain Owen Farrell kicked four penalties for England, but Handre Pollard replied with six for South Africa before tries from Makazole Mapimpi and Cheslin Kolbe put the game beyond Jones' side.

The Australian has a contract with England until 2021 but said it was "not the time to discuss" his future after the defeat.

"We are the second best team in the world," added Jones, who lost the 2003 final to England while coaching the Wallabies but was a consultant to South Africa the last time the Springboks won the trophy in 2007.

"We didn't meet our goal to be the best team

in the world, but we are the second best team in the world, so I think that's how we should be remembered.

"The players prepared tremendously well for this World Cup. I thought they played with a lot of pride and

passion, and we got caught short today.

"These things happen, but we can't doubt the effort of the players. I thought they were extraordinary.

"The only thing I am worried about now is having a few beers, and

that's the only thing we will worry about.

"And then after we have a few beers today, we will probably have a few more beers tomorrow and maybe Monday, and then maybe we will have to pull up stumps."

Serie A's top scorer Ciro Immobile had given Lazio the lead with an unopposed back-post volley, but James Forrest

lashed in his 11th goal of the season just before the break to level.

Neil Lennon's side had to defend stoutly after the break and looked like they would earn a point until Ntcham ran on to an Odsonne Edouard pass to secure Celtic's first win in Italy.

It is the second time in two weeks that the Scottish Premiership side have stunned Lazio with a late winner, Christopher Jullien's header earning victory in Glasgow two weeks ago.

It also means that their games with Rennes at Celtic Park and against Cluj in Romania will now only decide whether they win the group or not.
