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HELP THE FBI, EPSTEIN FOUR URGE ANDREW

■ Prince urged to help end the "suffering, shame and humiliation" of victims

FOUR of Jeffrey Epstein's alleged victims have pleaded with Prince Andrew to assist with the FBI inquiry for the sake of "his daughters".

They made an emotional appeal to help end the "suffering, shame and humiliation" of victims of the paedophile financier, who was a friend of the Duke of York.

The powerful message came in an open letter by a former model, known only as Kiki, and signed by three unnamed "Jane Doe" victims.

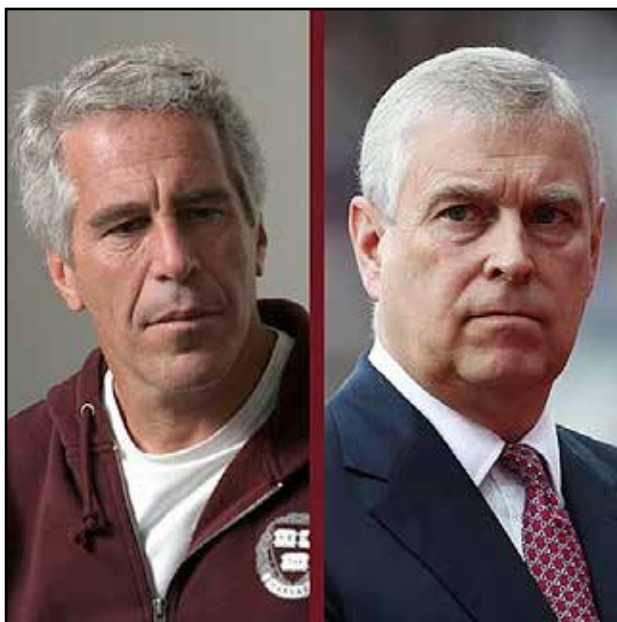
The women accuse Andrew, 59, of "hiding" to protect himself and said it was his "chance to be on the right side of history", warning that "the world is watching".

'make things better'

Kiki addressed Andrew directly in writing: "You have been blessed with a privileged life and with the ability to influence positive change.

"Please help US authorities with anything you may have observed in your time spent with Jeffrey Epstein.

"Do it for the victims

who have lived a life of suffering, shame and humiliation. Do it for your family, so that they may be proud that you have taken the decent and moral path.

"You can make things better for us with your co-operation. Do it for your daughters and their children."

The plea comes days after US lawyer Geoffrey Berman accused the

Queen's second son of providing "zero co-operation" with their investigation into Epstein's offending.

Andrew insists he has been prepared to co-operate but has received no request from investigators and denies having any relationships with any women who allege they are victims of Epstein.

The letter also told the

Duke: "The dilemma we face as victims is not so different from your choice to hide in order to protect yourself. The difference is we are trying to right wrongs, despite crippling fears. You are perpetuating them through apathy, inaction and denial."

'incredible trauma'

Kiki broke down in tears on a US talk show last year as she described being assaulted by Epstein at his mansion in Palm Beach, Florida. She told how she was approached by a "female recruiter" when working in a New York restaurant in 2004. Kiki said she was 19 at the time but was told to pretend she was younger because Epstein "likes young pretty girls". She said Epstein had put her through an "incredible trauma".

All four women are clients of Los Angeles-based lawyer Lisa Bloom. She said they were "outraged and disappointed" at the behaviour of the Duke.

Andrew has come under fire for his

friendship with the convicted sex offender who took his own life in jail last year while awaiting trial on sex trafficking charges.

Rising Scottish pol quits over texts to 'cute' teenage boy

Scotland's finance secretary has quit hours before delivering his budget amid reports that he messaged a 16-year-old boy on social media.

The Scottish Sun said that Derek Mackay contacted the schoolboy over a six-month period, and told him that he was "cute".

Mr Mackay said he had "behaved foolishly" and took full responsibility for his actions.

He also apologised "unreservedly" to the boy and his family.

First Minister Nicola Sturgeon said she did not know about Mr Mackay's "unacceptable" behaviour until Wednesday evening, and is "not aware of any further allegations" against him.

In a statement to the Scottish Parliament, she confirmed that he has been suspended by the SNP while further investigations are carried out.

Police Scotland said it had not received any complaint of criminality, but was "assessing available information from media information". The force also asked for anyone with any information to contact them.

Interim Conservative leader Jackson Carlaw called on Mr Mackay to also stand down from the Scottish Parliament, saying his behaviour could "constitute the grooming of a young individual".

And Scottish Labour leader Richard Leonard said Mr Mackay's actions had been "an abuse of power" and "nothing short of predatory".

'truly sorry'

The newspaper detailed allegations that the 42-year-old politician contacted the boy "out of the blue" in August of last year and sent about 270 messages on Instagram and through Facebook.

It has published a list of messages - the most recent of which is from earlier this week - involving Mr Mackay and the boy, in which it says the MSP invited him to dinner and to attend a rugby event.

The newspaper also reported that Mr Mackay contacted the boy several times on Christmas Day, and told him on another occasion that he was "looking good with that new haircut".

In one of the exchanges, Mr Mackay

is said to have told the teenager he was "cute". In another the boy confirmed he was 16 and tells Mr Mackay "not to try anything".

The paper also quotes the boy's mother calling for Mr Mackay to be removed from his post.

In a statement released on Thursday morning, Mr Mackay said: "I take full responsibility for my actions. I have behaved foolishly and I am truly sorry. I apologise unreservedly to the individual involved and his family.

resignation

"I spoke last night with the first minister and tendered my resignation with immediate effect.

"Serving in government has been a huge privilege and I am sorry to have let colleagues and supporters down."

Mr Mackay, who has been widely tipped as a future first minister, came out as gay when he left his wife in 2013.

His resignation came just hours before he was due to present the Scottish government's spending plans for the next year - a major set piece event in the Scottish Parliament.

Mr Mackay would have been putting the

finishing touches to his preparations to his £43bn budget when he was contacted by the Scottish

Sun on Wednesday evening, before the newspaper released the story at 23:20.

The budget was presented instead by public finance minister Kate Forbes.

Third UK case of Coronavirus confirmed

The third person in the UK to be diagnosed with coronavirus caught it in Singapore, it is understood.

He is thought to have tested positive for the virus in Brighton before being taken to hospital in London.

New Department of Health guidance urges anyone who recently arrived in the UK from mainland China or eight other places to seek help if they are ill.

They are being advised to self-isolate if they have come back from countries including Thailand and Japan.

The countries and territories named by the DoH are: Thailand, Japan, Republic of Korea, Taiwan, Singapore, Malaysia, Hong Kong and Macau.

Anyone returning in the past 14 days from those places, or from mainland China, who has symptoms like a cough, fever, or shortness of breath should stay indoors and call the NHS 111 service.

The DoH said they should do so "even if symptoms are mild", adding: "These countries have been identified because of the volume of air travel from affected areas, understanding of other travel routes and number of reported cases. This list will be kept under review."

The third UK patient is understood to be a middle-aged man who was isolated at home, tested positive and was taken to St Thomas's Hospital in central London, where

he is being treated at a specialist infectious diseases unit. It had previously been reported he was at Guy's Hospital in the city.

The NHS was "well prepared" to manage cases, said Prof Chris Whitty, England's chief medical officer. He added: "We are now working quickly to identify any contacts the patient has had."

There have been 28,265 cases worldwide.

Of these, 565 people have died but only two of the deaths have been outside mainland China - one in Hong Kong and one in the Philippines.

Meanwhile, the Chinese ambassador to the UK warned against "panic" and "over-reaction" in response to the virus.

Tusk sparks fury with Scotland offer

DONALD Tusk provoked a furious backlash for suggesting that any break-up of the United Kingdom would have the bonus of allowing Scotland to join the EU.

The former European Council president said Scotland would be welcomed into Europe "enthusiastically" if it won independence. Mr Tusk said he "feels

like I'm Scottish" after Brexit, adding Scotland would be treated with "empathy" if it looked for a place in the EU.

But Foreign Secretary Dominic Raab called the Polish politician's remarks "irresponsible" and "un-European".

SNP leader Nicola Sturgeon has signalled an intention to rejoin the EU should Scotland leave the UK. However,

opponents say there is no guaranteed access to the bloc. Mr Tusk, on BBC One's Andrew Marr Show yesterday, was reluctant to comment on Scotland in Europe, saying he would like to respect the "sovereignty" of the UK. But he then went on to say: "I have no doubt that everyone will be enthusiastic here in Brussels and more

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Patel vows to close release loopholes

PRITI Patel this week insisted "we are safe" as ministers scrambled to close loopholes allowing terrorists back on to the street halfway through their sentences, following the Streatham terror attack on Sunday by a convicted terrorist who had been released from jail just days before.

The Home Secretary said emergency legislation would put more stringent checks on extremists. She said it was wrong that terrorists are being automatically released halfway through their sentence without first being assessed. It comes as senior Cabinet minister Michael Gove said terrorists should be kept in jail indefinitely if necessary.

Ms Patel said: "We are safe. We're changing the supervision, the licensing of terrorism offenders. We're going to make it much more stringent. "It is a fact we are having to use intensive police resources to monitor and supervise these individuals. We're not going to compromise on that.

"We need to change the regime, what goes on in our prisons, the sentencing regime, the licensing regime.



Patel: 'looking at loopholes'

"We're looking at the loopholes there and that is what we are trying to shut down."

Justice Secretary Robert Buckland said on Monday that emergency legislation was needed to make sure offenders serve two-thirds of their sentence before they are considered eligible for release. Ms Patel added: "We simply cannot have individuals halfway through their sentence being released in a way that they are not being supervised and not being assessed. "We need people to serve their full sentences. I think the public would expect them to serve their full sentence."

generally in Europe."

Mr Raab responded by saying: "I think it was frankly un-European and rather irresponsible, given the succession separatist tendencies in Spain, in France, in Italy.

"I'm not sure European leaders, let alone leaders in the UK, would actually welcome that kind of language."

Mr Raab's comments come amid reports that Downing Street is set to launch, on Valentine's Day, a £5million ad blitz to persuade Scottish voters of the benefits of being in the Union.

Knife attack terrorist shot dead in South London

■ Sudesh Amman released from jail less than two weeks before attack

A CONVICTED Islamic terrorist was shot dead in a high street knife rampage this week just days after being released from prison.

Sudesh Amman, who was wearing a fake suicide vest, left a man fighting for his life and stabbed a woman in the back. Whitehall sources said the 20-year-old was released just last week from prison for distributing extremist material. An unmarked police car had driven in front of the terrorist's vehicle in Streatham, south London, before he was chased down by officers.

Witnesses told how the attacker grabbed a £3.99 knife from a budget store. He removed the packaging from the blade, shouted "Allahu Akbar" and then launched into the attack on lunchtime shoppers, who fled in terror from the busy high street.

The Jihadist, feared to be carrying explosives, was chased by plainclothed officers and shot dead.

Apart from the two stab victims, a second woman suffered cuts from glass sent flying from a shattered window hit by a police bullet.

It was revealed officers shouted warnings at the man before he was cornered outside a branch of the chemist chain Boots. Officers fired up to five times and the suspect was declared dead at the scene. Police confirmed that an active counter-terrorism operation was ongoing when the attack happened.

Prime Minister Boris Johnson said: "My thoughts are with the injured victims and their loved ones. "I want to pay tribute to the speed and bravery of the officers who responded and confronted

the attacker – preventing further injuries and violences."

under surveillance

Police said the attacker, said to be "motivated by an Islamist terrorist ideology", was known to the security services. Dramatic footage taken by passers-by showed masked officers armed with high-powered weapons approach the suspect's body before backing away amid fears he had explosives. Images also showed what appeared to be a number of silver canisters strapped to the man's chest as he lay spread-eagled on the pavement with a large knife on the pavement close by. The attack

bore chilling similarities with the London Bridge atrocities in June 2017 and last November when released terrorist Usman Khan left two people dead before he was shot dead by police. Amman had been jailed for three years and four months in December 2018 after being found with a bombmaking manual. The Old Bailey was told he Fanta sised about carrying out a terror attack.

A Whitehall source said: "He was under surveillance, that is what allowed police to do their job so quickly. It could have been much worse than it was.

"There had been concerns when he was in prison but there were no

powers for any authority to keep him behind bars.

"He had served half of his sentence, which was more than three years, so had to be released despite concerns over his conduct.

"The public will look at this case and say why was this individual not kept behind bars – and the Prime Minister shares that view.

"This shines a light on something that clearly needs addressing."

But the PM's plans to crack down on early release which would mean terrorists would serve their whole sentence would not have applied to this individual because the current plans only apply to more violent offences.

MP gives cold shoulder to snide dress critics

AN MP who wore an off-the-shoulder jumper dress during a Commons debate has hit back at internet trolls who branded her a "hangover tart".

Labour MP Tracy Brabin launched a furious attack after the "vitriolic" online abuse. The shadow culture secretary, who replaced her murdered friend Jo Cox as MP for Batley and Spen in West Yorkshire, demanded people pay attention to "what women say, not what we wear" and angrily slammed "everyday sexism".

She revealed her shoulder-baring £35 dress slipped down because she is nursing a broken ankle and had to lean on the despatch box after racing to Parliament from a meeting with music executives. Critics including TV presenter Piers Morgan described the outfit as "inappropriate for the Commons", while hitting

out at the torrent of abuse. The online trolling was sparked by a Twitter user who shared a photograph of the former actress's outfit, asking: "Is this really appropriate attire for Parliament?"

Ms Brabin, 58, said: "I was startled by the vitriolic nature of the messages. They are anonymous people often, keyboard warriors sat in their mum's back bedroom eating Pot Noodles and having a pop at people they don't know anything about."

The rebuke came after Ms Brabin responded on Twitter: "Sorry, I don't have time to reply to all of you commenting on this. Who knew people could get so emotional over a shoulder."

Ms Brabin, who is currently using crutches and has her ankle in a cast after a fall last month, added: "I always show the House respect. If there was a problem, I'm sure Mr Speaker would tell me."

'Greatest Yorkshireman? Not me, says Palin
Sir Michael Palin has dismissed a much-publicized poll naming him the "Greatest Ever Yorkshireman".

Long based in London and privately educated in Shropshire at Shrewsbury School,

Sheffield-born Palin said this week: "That made me so many enemies, from Geoffrey Boycott down. I can imagine him thinking: 'He doesn't even live in Yorkshire and he talks posh too!'"

'My polite lovely boy' was brainwashed to become a killer, weeps mom

THE mother of Streatham terrorist Sudesh Amman broke down in tears this week as she described him as a "polite, kind, lovely boy".

Haleema Faraz Khan said her son was "brainwashed" by online videos and spending time inside one of Britain's highest security prisons.

The 41-year-old revealed she spoke to Amman just hours before the attack on Sunday afternoon.

Meanwhile, a former friend told how Amman boasted as a schoolboy of his desire to be a terrorist "when I grow up" and threatened to "blow up" classmates.

Amman, 20, was shot dead by plain-clothes police officers after stabbing two people with a 10-inch knife while wearing a fake suicide vest on Streatham High Road on Sunday.

He had been released from Belmarsh prison around a week before, according to Justice Secretary Robert Buckland, after being jailed for more than three years for terrorism offences.

Ms Khan said: "He wasn't even a very devoted Muslim.

"He became more religious inside prison, that's where I think he became radicalised. He was watching and listening to things online which brainwashed him.

"Before he went to prison he was not that religious. After he came out he was really religious.

"He was a polite, kind, lovely boy. He was always smiling. I'm so upset, he was only 20 years old."

Mother-of-six Ms Khan, from Harrow, north-west London, claimed Amman seemed "normal" when she visited him at his bail

hostel in Streatham, south London on the day of the attack, asking her to cook his favourite meal.

Fighting back tears, Ms Khan said: "I regularly took food to him at the hostel and on Thursday, I asked him what he wanted.

"Mum, I would really like a mutton biriyani" – so I cooked one and took it over to him." She said she learned of her son's death on the news. She said: "I saw that there had been something in Streatham, and I got worried.

"Then I saw the police and what was happening. A short while later they gave his name on the television. The police came to see me yesterday and told me too. I can't believe this has happened to my son. He was a lovely boy. I was very close to him."

A family source added: "Haleema is disgusted by what he has done and his beliefs, but she is a mother and has lost a son so she is very upset and sad.

"But they are relieved that he wasn't able to kill anyone. It has hit them very hard, but now they are trying to get his body from the police as soon

as possible and bury him. This is done as quickly as one can for Muslims as is custom and prayers for him will begin shortly."

Meanwhile, a former school friend revealed Amman had boasted of wanting to be a terrorist when he was younger. She said: "He kept on saying, 'I

am going to bomb you'. He said, 'I have got a grenade in my pocket and if you take one step closer to me I am going to set it off'.

"We thought he was joking but he kept on saying it.

"He said, 'When I grow up I am going to be a terrorist'."

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Boxer auctions medal he won for rescuing Princess Anne

A former heavyweight boxer who thwarted the armed kidnap of the Princess Royal is reluctantly selling the George Medal awarded to him by the Queen as his health fails.

Ronnie Russell, 72, punched Ian Ball twice in the head as he tried to kidnap the princess at gunpoint in central London in March 1974.

For his bravery he was awarded the George Medal by the Queen, who told him: "The medal is from the Queen, but I want to thank you as Anne's mother."

Mr Russell, who now lives in Bristol, has suffered several strokes and wants to be able to pay for his own funeral.

He said that selling the medal was "something I said I would never, ever do" and he was "proud and honoured" to have been involved. "What I would like is whoever does eventually buy the medal, I would hope they might invite me somewhere to tell them an after-dinner

story about what happened on the night," Mr Russell said.

The medal is to be sold at Dix Noonan Webb in central London next month with an estimate of between £15,000 and £20,000. It will be sold with a letter from No 10 informing Mr Russell of the award, a telegram from Princess Anne and a letter from the commissioner of the Metropolitan Police.

former boxer

Ball blocked the princess's car with his own as she was driven along The Mall to Buckingham Palace. He fired a series of shots through the rear window as he tried to kidnap her.

The princess and Captain Mark Phillips, her husband at the time, were unhurt during the late-night ambush. Her personal detective, chauffeur, a police constable and a journalist were all shot and wounded by Ball, who was armed with two revolvers.

The Crown's creator Peter Morgan this week confirmed it will conclude sooner than originally planned after series five reaches the turn of the century. But his actress girlfriend Gillian Anderson has already jumped the gun. More than a week before Morgan's official statement, Gillian, who plays Margaret Thatcher in the upcoming series, told BBC TV's The One Show in matter of fact fashion that The Crown would be "finished a long time before today".

Mr Russell, then aged 28, was a 6ft 2in, 17-stone former boxer who trained at a club in east London. He was heading home to Kent when he saw the incident unfold and rushed to help. He was shot at and stopped Ball dragging the princess out of the car, before landing a punch on the attacker's chin which allowed police to arrest him. Ball was later sent to a psychiatric hospital.

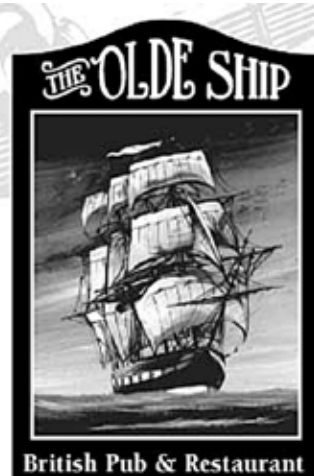
It was the penultimate stop on

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Presidential primaries: a brief explainer

IT'S AN ELECTION year and for many of us Brits the primary process is pretty bewildering.

This week's Iowa caucuses may have you scratching your head. Or asking questions like: what the heck is a caucus? How come Bernie got the most votes but lost to mayor Pete? Why don't they just have one polling day? What the heck is Super Tuesday? And how does one become a delegate?

Basically US politics is an infernal web of arcane rules, strange practices and Kabuki theatre.

But here's what I know: come January in

an election year all the candidates spend most of their time campaign in the snowy small towns of Iowa. Which is the first stumping ground and first place to vote in the primaries (primary elections or often just primaries, are the process by which voters can indicate their preference for their party's candidate, or a candidate in general, in an upcoming general election, local election, or by-election, with the goal of narrowing the field of candidates.)

Usually you will see some candidates drop out after these results, as the rest continue on to New Hampshire.

Where the candidates try to impress the delegates with their vision and once again a vote takes place.

But what the heck is a delegate and how are they chosen? A delegate is a person sent or authorized to represent others, in particular an elected representative sent to a conference who pledges to support one particular candidate. Which they usually (but not always) do.

The Caucus

Caucuses are simply meetings, open to all registered voters of the party, at which delegates to the party's national convention are selected. When the caucus begins, the voters in attendance divide themselves into groups according to the candidate they support. The undecided voters congregate into their own group and prepare to be "courted" by supporters of other candidates.

Voters in each group are then invited to give speeches supporting their candidate and trying to persuade others to join their group. At the end of the caucus, party organizers count the voters in each candidate's group and calculate how many delegates to the county convention each candidate has won.

As in the primaries, the caucus process can produce both pledged and unpledged convention delegates, depending on the party rules of the various states.

How Delegates are Awarded

The Democratic and Republican parties use different methods for determining how many delegates are awarded

to, or "pledged" to vote for the various candidates at their national conventions.

Democrats use a proportional method. Each candidate is awarded a number of delegates in proportion to their support in the state caucuses or the number of primary votes they won.

For example, consider a state with 20 delegates at a democratic convention with three candidates. If candidate "A" received 70% of all caucus and primary votes, candidate "B" 20% and candidate "C" 10%, candidate "A" would get 14 delegates, candidate "B" would get 4 delegates and candidate "C" would get two delegates.

Are you still with me?

Not all states use this method. Some have open or closed primaries.

Help? I hear you say. Okay let's just concentrate on California. This is where those of us who can get to vote on Super Tuesday (called so because this is where the most states vote and the most delegates are awarded to a candidate). Once again after this day (March 3rd) you may

see some candidates drop out because the California primary is a semi-closed primary, with the state awarding 494 delegates, of which 415 are pledged delegates allocated on the basis of the results of the primary. And you'll tend to know by now who the real contenders are.

Bonus delegates

The 416 pledged delegates to the 2020 Democratic National Convention will be allocated proportionally on the basis of the results of the primary. Of the 416 pledged delegates, between 4 and 7 are allocated to each of the state's 53 congressional districts and another 54 are allocated to party leaders and elected officials (PLEO delegates), in addition to 90 at-large pledged delegates. Bonus delegates will be allocated as California shares a primary date with numerous other states on Super Tuesday; these numbers do not yet account for these delegates.

So after we have all voted the contest continues:

The national convention delegation meeting will

subsequently be held on May 17, 2020 to vote on the 54 pledged at-large and 90 PLEO delegates to send to the Democratic National Convention. The 416 pledged delegates California sends to the national convention will be joined by 79 un-pledged PLEO delegates (30 members of the Democratic National Committee; 48 members of Congress, including two Senators, notably Kamala Harris, as well as 46 U.S. Representatives, notably Eric Swalwell; and the governor).

Hopefully you are still with me. Once the nominee is decided and the party is all untied (hopefully) he/she will go on to compete against Donald Trump in the general election.

So for now if you are a Democratic voter make sure you are registered and vote for whomever speaks more to your values and you think will do best to represent you and the future generations and will be able to beat the sitting president.

Good luck and may the best drag queen win. Oh wait this isn't a reality show!! Or is it???

Bruce hails 'significant' Cup win for Toon

Newcastle United boss Steve Bruce believes it was a "significant" moment for the club to reach the fifth round of the FA Cup for the first time in 14 years.

The Premier League side survived a huge scare in Tuesday's fourth-round replay against League One Oxford United, who came back from two goals down to draw 2-2 and take the game to extra time.

Neither side could then be separated and it looked like penalties would be needed until Allan Saint-Maximin's spectacular strike secured the win.

"I know what it means for the city and the supporters, who have come a million miles to get here tonight, a couple of thousand of them," said Bruce.

"We are into the next round. We have made hard work of it against Rochdale and now Oxford but I think we thoroughly deserved to get through.

"I think it is significant for the club to get into the fifth round for the first time since 2006."

Newcastle had looked to be cruising to victory as they protected a two-goal lead given to them before half-time courtesy of Sean Longstaff's rising 15th-minute drive and Joelinton's composed

finish for only his third goal of the season.

Oxford gave themselves hope with seven minutes left when Liam Kelly's 20-yard free-kick eluded the grasp of Newcastle keeper Karl Darlow before Nathan Holland's crisp volley deep into stoppage time set up the prospect of a shock.

The unpredictable Saint-Maximin was the difference and a huge threat in extra time, finally winning it for Newcastle and setting up a fifth-round tie at West Bromwich Albion with a magnificent finish that ripped beyond Simon Eastwood into the top corner after 116 minutes.

"It was a hairy cup tie, great for the neutral but awful for myself and the fans," added Bruce.

"It wouldn't be Newcastle without a story and if that's the story let's go to West Bromwich Albion and carry it on.

"When you look back and put your slippers on the FA Cup final is still a huge moment in this country. It was rekindled for me when I got there as manager of Hull City against Arsenal in 2014 and I vowed that I would never play weakened teams.

"A club like Newcastle can win five games and get to Wembley."

Maestro Rooney books emotional United date

WAYNE Rooney ran the show as Derby brushed aside Northampton 4-2 on Tuesday to ensure the Rams will meet Manchester United in the FA Cup fifth round.

"They never had any answer to us," said Derby manager Phillip Cocu. "Playing United will be a special game for Wayne and for us, something to look forward to. We will try and win it - nothing is impossible."

The player-coach was behind all that Derby did well. Rooney, 34, played his last game for the Red Devils in their Europa League final win over Ajax in April 2017. He played 559 times for United, scored 253 goals - and could now knock them out of the cup.

Rooney made his first decisive contribution when his 28th-minute corner troubled goalkeeper David Cornell and Andre Wisdom banged in his first goal for nearly eight years. The Cobblers were hurt again when Duane Holmes got Derby's second 10 minutes before half-time.

Northampton pulled one back through Nicky Adams two minutes into the second half but Jack

Marriott's 51st-minute header restored the lead. Then Rooney saw it

through with a 77th-minute penalty, despite Northampton's Sam Hoskins also putting away a penalty with six minutes left.

Threats and violence cannot be tolerated, says Hammers boss

Threats and violent fan protests against football executives "cannot be tolerated", says West Ham co-chairman David Gold.

It comes after the home of Manchester United executive vice-chairman Ed Woodward was attacked by a group chanting that he was "going to die".

Gold has previously been targeted by fan protests.

"I know exactly what Ed's experienced. I've experienced it four or five times myself," he said.

"What you've got to understand is that it is by a minute percentage, a couple of hundred people."

Gold added: "In my mind you've got a couple of hundred belligerents who want to, metaphorically, burn your house down. And those 200 will gather people who are listening, or walking by and wonder what it is all about."

On Thursday it was announced that fans who behave in an "unacceptable" manner towards players, supporters, club employees or referees will face a Premier League-wide ban.

The Premier League said anyone banned by a single club will be banned by all 20 clubs.

Spurs through as Son goes down

■ Dreams of silverware still alive as Mourinho methods begin to bear fruit

Tottenham battled past Southampton 3-2, in a thrilling FA Cup fourth-round replay on Wednesday to set up a home tie against Norwich City.

Spurs went ahead when Tanguy Ndombele's shot deflected in off visiting defender Jack Stephens, before Shane Long made it 1-1 after Nathan Redmond's effort had been parried by Hugo Lloris.

Danny Ings curled a shot past Lloris to put the Saints ahead, but Lucas Moura equalised with a strike from 18 yards.

Spurs won the tie when Son Heung-min converted an 87th-minute penalty.

He had been fouled by Southampton goalkeeper Angus Gunn after a fine pass from substitute Dele Alli had created the opportunity.

For the Saints, midfielder James Ward-Prowse was carried off on a stretcher in the first half with a knee injury.

Spurs will host Norwich, bottom of the Premier League, in round five in a midweek match to be played on 3, 4 or 5 March.

The FA Cup represents Tottenham's best chance this season of winning their first trophy since 2008 - as they sit fifth in the Premier League, went out of the Carabao Cup at League Two Colchester in September and face a tricky Champions League last-16 tie against an RB Leipzig side second in Germany's Bundesliga.

They had to come from behind in the third round to force a replay against Middlesbrough before going through, and had to dig deep again, with two goals in the final 12 minutes to see off a gallant Southampton side.

Unlike Liverpool - who beat Shrewsbury 1-0 with their Under-23 side in a fourth-round reply on Tuesday - Tottenham named a strong side for a match taking place

during their two-week mid-season Premier League break.

Boss Jose Mourinho was, though, without the injured Giovanni Lo Celso and Erik Lamela, plus the ineligible Steven Bergwijn, while Alli was only on the bench after he picked up a knock during last Sunday's 2-0 league win over Manchester City.

Despite having 24 hours less to prepare than Southampton, the hosts went ahead when Ndombele's effort, which appeared to be going wide, took a big deflection off Stephens to wrong-foot Angus Gunn. Mourinho would have been unhappy with Lloris as he could only parry the ball into Long's path for him to equalise from eight yards out.

But the France goalkeeper made amends in the second half with an excellent reflex stop to turn Jannik Vestergaard's close-range header over the bar as both sides

pushed for a winner.

The Saints looked as if they had it when Ings scored following a fine run from Nathan

Redmond but the lead only lasted six minutes before Moura made it 2-2.

Alli's excellent pass released Son - and after

he was brought down by Gunn, the South Korean converted the penalty to take Spurs into the last 16 in dramatic fashion.

Klopp 'delighted' as young guns down Shrews

Absent Liverpool manager Jurgen Klopp was "delighted" as the youngest team in the club's history beat Shrewsbury to reach the FA Cup fifth round.

Klopp decided to miss the fourth-round replay because it fell during the Premier League's winter break.

A Reds side with an average age of 19 years and 102 days set up a tie at Chelsea with a 1-0 win.

"There was a message at half-time and at full-time [from Klopp]," said under-23s boss Neil Critchley.

"There was a message before the game that Chelsea away could be

"He trained with us yesterday and he asked whether he could come along," added Critchley,

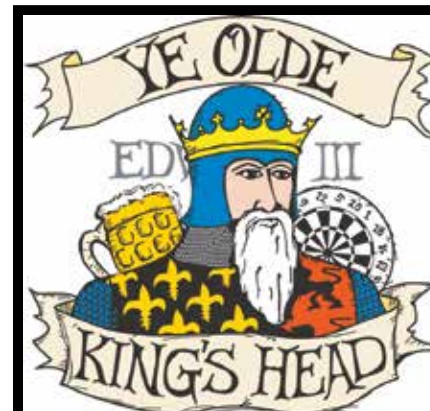
who oversaw the game for Liverpool.
